NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the month of August the 3d Force Service Regiment fulfilled its mission to provide sustained Logistical support to FNF WestPac Forces:

a. The Baggage Facility received 4,954 pieces, and released 8,793 pieces. A total of 72,907 pieces of personal baggage remains in storage.

b. Shipping and Receiving receipted for 10,962 measurement tons and 268 short tons of incoming cargo; 8,266 measurement tons and 569 short tons were shipped.

c. Total incoming and outgoing Message Center Traffic was 11,709 Narrative Messages and 3,589 Card Messages.

d. 3d FSR vehicles traveled 195,442 miles, and hauled 13,446 short tons of cargo and transported 12,245 personnel. This includes Commercial vehicles and vehicles moved for SGR.

e. Maintenance Operations for the month of August commenced with 3,232 work requests on hand. There were 2,589 work requests received during the month and 1,602 work requests were completed. The month ended with 4,219 work requests on hand.

f. The Fleet Stock Account processed 22,703 demands and made 16,525 Issue/Obligation releases. There were 6,831 receipts processed during August.

g. Supply Operations Issues for August commenced with 2,596 documents on hand. There were 22,191 documents received during the month and 17,621 documents were processed, leaving a balance of 6,381 on hand at the end of the month.

h. Supply Operations Receipts for August commenced with 335 documents on hand. There were 6,403 documents received during the month and 5,900 documents were processed, leaving a balance of 510 on hand at the end of the month.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the month of August, Headquarters and Service Battalion continued its daily activities in support of the regimental logistics mission.
  - a. The Baggage Facility received 4,954 pieces of personal baggage for storage and released 8,793 pieces. A total of 72,907 pieces of personal baggage remained in storage.
  - b. During the month of August, 22 vessels discharged 8,139.4 M/T's of Marine Corps Cargo. This included 4,302.0 M/T's of retro grade cargo. As of 1 September 1969, there is a backlog of 4,553.3 M/T's of cargo offered and scheduled for shipment. Forecasted shipping available by MSTs is sufficient for our existing backlog.
  - c. Air shipments during August totaled 550 S/T's. This has been the lowest air cargo shipment month since October 1965, when 404 S/T's were moved. Our present air backlog, as of 1 September 1969, is 197 S/T's with sufficient aircraft available via normal sources to handle this amount.
  - d. Thirty-six (36) inoperative LVT's were loaded on the ALAMO for shipment to CONUS. Third Force Service Regiment received excellent support from the Army Transportation Corps by providing 4 low-boys with operators for movement of the LVT's to White Beach.
  - e. During August 1969, Shipping and Receiving moved 103 RO/RO Trailers to RVN. This is well above the monthly average shipping for the past three months which was 78 trailers per month.
  - f. Headquarters and Service Battalion Vehicles traveled 142,482 miles, hauling 13,446 short tons of cargo, and transported 12,245 personnel.
