

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the month of September the 3d Force Service Regiment fulfilled its mission to provide sustained Logistical support to FMF WestPac Forces:
  - a. The Baggage Facility received 9,447 pieces, and released 5,670 pieces. A total of 76,771 pieces of personal baggage remains in storage.
  - b. Shipping and Receiving receipted for 6,929 measurement tons and 268 short tons of incoming cargo; 11,264 measurement tons and 711 short tons were shipped.
  - c. Total incoming and outgoing Message Center Traffic was 12,131 Narrative Messages and 3,842 Card Messages.
  - d. 3d FSR vehicles traveled 182,663 miles, and hauled 12,141 short tons of cargo and transported 11,530 personnel. This includes Commercial vehicles and vehicles moved for S&R.
  - e. Maintenance Operations for the month of September commenced with 4,219 work requests on hand. There were 2,634 work requests received during the month and 2,274 work requests were completed. The month ended with 4,559 work requests on hand.
  - f. The Fleet Stock Account processed 19,076 demands and made 16,894 Issue/Obligation releases. There were 14,294 receipts processed during September.
  - g. Supply Operations Issues for September commenced with 6,381 documents on hand. There were 14,648 documents received during the month and 17,257 documents were processed, leaving a balance of 3,772 on hand at the end of the month.
  - h. Supply Operations Receipts for September commenced with 510 documents on hand. There were 15,584 documents received during the month and 15,262 documents were processed, leaving a balance of 1290 on hand at the end of the month. In addition 458 documents were pulled.







1. The battalion performed functions during the period relative to stock accounting, commercial contracting, receipt, storage, care-in storage, and issue incident to supplying classes I, II, III, IV, V, V(A), VII, VIII and IX to MAF WestPac Forces. These functions included:

a. Receiving, storing, assembling, inspections and issuing ordnance to ground and aviation elements.

b. Providing ration support to on-island and certain off-island units.
