NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the month of October the 3d Force Service Regiment fulfilled its mission to provide sustained Logistical support to FMF WestPac Forces:
 - a. The Baggage Facility received 8,917 pieces, and released 7,628 pieces. A total of 75,713 pieces of personal baggage remains in storage.
 - b. Shipping and Receiving received for 6,013 measurement tons and 143 short tons of incoming cargo; 8,273 measurement tons and 751 short tons were shipped.
 - c. Total incoming and outgoing Message Center Traffic was 11,098 Narrative Messages and 3,608 Card Messages.
 - d. 3d FSR vehicles traveled 174,340 miles, and hauled 13,016 short tons of cargo and transported 11,806 personnel. This includes Commercial vehicles and vehicles moved for SGR.
 - e. Maintenance Operations for the month of October commenced with 4,559 work requests on hand. There were 2,078 work requests received during the month and 2,260 work requests were completed. The month ended with 4,377 work requests on hand.
 - f. The Fleet Stock Account processed 28,905 demands and made 17,533 Issue/Obligation releases. There were 14,840 receipts processed during October.
 - g. Supply Operations Issues for October commenced with 3,772 documents on hand. There were 18,685 documents received during the month and 17,687 documents were processed, leaving a balance of 1,713 on hand at the end of the month.
 - h. Supply Operations Receipts for October commenced with 1,290 documents on hand. There were 18,615 documents received during the month and 17,896 documents were processed, leaving a balance of 1,713 on hand at the end of the month.
 - i. A Radio Voice Circuit was provided between 3d FSR and Force Logistics Command with a phone patch capability for use by this command.
 - j. Marines from this command visited the island of Hama Higa and helped the Okinawans clean generators, repair and repaint seats on swings and build a rock wall around a play ground. Our marines also continued to participate in a Conversational English Teaching Program at Chubu High School, teaching approximately 30 hours per week.

PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the month of October, Headquarters and Service Battalion continued its daily activities in support of the Regimental logistic mission.
 - a. LtCol J. B. HARRIS Sr. assumed command of Headquarters and Service Battalion on 8 October 1969 relieving Major DUPONT who was reassigned within the Regiment as a staff officer in charge of the S-2/3 shop.
 - b. The Baggage Facility received 8,917 pieces of personnel baggage for storage and released 7,628 pieces. A total of 75,713 pieces of personnel baggage remained in storage. There were 1,934 pieces of baggage shipped aboard the USS WASHBURN for troops returning to CONUS during Operation Keystone Cardinal.
 - c. Shipping and Receiving received for 6,013 measurement tons, and 143 short tons of incoming cargo. There was 8,273 measurement tons and 751 short tons of cargo shipped. On 2 October 1969, the Traffic Management Officer received a commitment from Commanding General, Marine Corps Base, Camp Butler to ship a large quantity of support equipment to erect a 1000 man tent camp at Camp Fuji, Japan to support FMF units scheduled to commence training with a reporting due date of 8 October 1969. The supply sources encountered some difficulty in identifying and staging some of the equipment, however, through the joint effort, supervision and coordination of the Traffic Management Officer with VMGR-152 at MCAF Futema, the required equipment was displaced in time to meet the deadline date.
 - d. Headquarters and Service Battalion Vehicles traveled 149,907 miles, hauling 13,016 short tons of cargo and transported 11,806 personnel.
 - e. Truck Company continued its support by providing an average of 163 vehicles on a daily basis. Increased requirements for vehicle support continued to rise during the month due to the returning elements of the 3d Marine Division to Okinawa.

2. The Battalion S-4 coordinated through the Regimental FLSS section the truck and forklift commitments in response to needed support by 9th MAB, for movement of men and equipment of the 3d Marine Division from White Beach to various Camps on Okinawa.
