## PART II

1. Mission Assigned. At the beginning of the report period RLT-3 Headquarters was activated for planning as the number one surface RLT. On 4 April, the RLT was activated for operations and directed to load aboard 4 LSTs and proceed to DA NANG, Vietnam. Upon landing and assuming operational control of the 3d Marines (-) (Rein), the Regiment was directed to occupy and defend key terrain at DA NANG/HUE PHU BAI and provide security for the airfields at HUE PHU BAI and DA NANG, the 8th BRU at HUE PHU BAI and the Hawk Missile Battery situated on Hill 327 at DA NANG. On 20 April, the mission was expanded to include undertaking aggressive combat patrolling within TAORs and being prepared to conduct offensive operations as a mobile reaction force.
2. Movements Made. RLT-3 Headquarters loaded aboard assigned shipping during the period 5-7 April and sailed for DA NANG, Vietnam. Commencing 12 April, the RLT Headquarters off-loaded at DA NANG and occupied the present command post location.
3. Terrain and Weather. Terrain and weather had little effect on training. However, when deep patrols were authorized within the enlarged TAORs, an average of six heat casualties per day resulted. Because of the heat and humidity, the wearing of body armor on patrols and operations was made optional in order to reduce the number of heat casualties.
4. Training Conducted. In spite of the mission assigned and the increased tempo of operations on 20 April, a significant amount of training was conducted by all units. Training was orientated along the lines prescribed in 9th MEB orders. Additional details as to training conducted are contained in Part III (Supporting Documents).
5. Morale and Discipline. The morale of this command during this period was extremely high. The movement from Okinawa and the prospect of combat ~~was~~ a large contributing factor. The prompt arrival of mail, the hot meals, adequate shelter and the establishment of clubs has helped maintain this state of morale.  
There have been exceptionally few disciplinary problems for a command of this size noted during this period. It is felt that the low rate of disciplinary problems is directly related to the high morale of this command.
6. Summary of Events  
On 040825Z, RLT-3 was activated for operations. A Movement Report, Troop List and Weapons Density was submitted to CG, 3dMarDiv. Preparations were made to embark the major portion of 1/3 and 2/3 rear echelon and their remaining personnel, supplies and field equipment with RLT-3. Loading Plans were prepared for USS WHITFIELD COUNTY (LST-1169) USS VERNON COUNTY (LST-1161), USS WINDHAM COUNTY (LST-1170), USS WASHOE COUNTY (LST-1165). Troop Commanders and Embarkation Officers were assigned to each ship, and a tentative loading time was set at 051800L. Blocks of supplies were assigned to each ship. Concurrently, all personnel accounting cards of the attached units were submitted to the S-1 and then rearranged by ship for the preparation of embarkation rosters.

Data Processing Platoon and Division Reproduction compiled and printed the embarkation rosters. Immediate distribution was made to the Commanding Officer of Troops assigned to each ship for correction of errors and updating. All corrected embarkation rosters were delivered to the Officer-in-Charge of 3d Marines Sub-Unit for distribution.

By 051100I April, rough loading plans for all ships had been completed. Current information was not available concerning the following three items: (1) composition of ammunition blocks; (2) composition of assigned encampment/garrison block; and (3) composition of additional 1/3 and 2/3 supplies. This lack of information precluded the preparation of accurate loading plans until the ships were actually loaded. Supplies continued to arrive at NAHA PORT and WHITE BEACH during loading. Beach support included fork lifts, cranes, and dunnage. POL cribs were constructed on the main decks of two ships at NAHA IST Ramp by personnel from 3d Engineer Battalion. At 051600I, the majority of vehicles and personnel departed from their various camps for embarkation points at NAHA PORT and WHITE BEACH. Supplies, rations, vehicles, and the assigned encampment/garrison blocks continued to arrive throughout the night. Loading continued in an orderly and efficient manner. By 060800I, the VERNON COUNTY completed loading at NAHA and sailed to WHITE BEACH to load ammunition. The WHITFIELD COUNTY and WINDHAM COUNTY moved to POL piers at NAHA and commenced loading POL.

The arrival of a Japanese tanker that required immediate berthing, resulted in a six hour delay in loading the USS WHITFIELD COUNTY and the movement of rations by stake bed trucks to another loading area. By 070500I, rough drafts of corrected loading plans were delivered to OIC, Sub-Unit No. 1, HqCo, 3dMar, for delivery to the Division Embarkation Officer. At 0830I, the WHITFIELD COUNTY, WINDHAM COUNTY and WASHOE COUNTY had completed loading and departed NAHA PORT for DA NANG. By 071400I, the VERNON COUNTY had completed loading ammunition at WHITE BEACH and sailed for DA NANG. Sailing reports were made from each ship via Navy communications in accordance with 3dMarDiv SOP.

At 071055I, CO, RLT-3, and a party of four departed FUTEMA via flight 5 for DA NANG to conduct liaison and initiate planning prior to the arrival of the remainder of the RLT Headquarters. Close coordination with 9th MEB was established and a detailed reconnaissance of the area was made on the 11th. Additionally, the Commanding Officer visited HUE PHU BAI on the 10th. During this visit a reconnaissance of the area was made, American advisors and units were visited and initial coordination was made with the CG, 1st Vietnamese Army Division, concerning the introduction of American forces into the area. That same day BLT 2/3 was briefed aboard the USS MT MCKINLEY concerning the arrangements that had been made.

The Regimental Headquarters chopped to CG, 9th MEB at 121200H and the four ISTs commenced off-loading personnel, vehicles and supplies, utilizing lighters and the IST ramp at TIEN SHA PENNINSULA adjacent to DA NANG. All POL, MCIs and "B" rations were delivered to HLSG. Supplies belonging to RLT-3 Hq, BLT 1/3 and BLT 2/3 were staged at RLT-3 CP site at coordinates 983743. The Command Post was officially opened the following morning at 0800H. Off-loading of all four ships was completed at about 131700H April, and all supplies were delivered to their destination by 2200H that night. Construction of the Camp area proceeded rapidly and efforts to improve it continue.

At 140832H, 3/4 landed two reinforced rifle companies, a command element, 81mm mortar platoon and two sections of the 106mm RR platoon over Red Beach 2 and reported to this Headquarters for operational control. This force relieved Task Force ALPHA at HUE PHU BAI, which was returned to join 2/3 in their assigned TAOR at DA NANG. The exchange was effected by helicopters on the 14th. Task Force ALPHA was dissolved upon return to DA NANG.

On 15 April, Gen THROCKMORTON visited PHU BAI. A live fire demonstration was conducted on Hill 268 by 1/3 for Assistant Ambassador JOHNSON on 16 April. Additionally, he toured all 3d Marines areas. Gen WESTMORELAND visited 3d Marines positions on 17 and 18 April.

By 181200H, 3/4 had unloaded all Class III, personnel and vehicles. 96% of Class II, 99% of Class V and 50% of "L" Form supplies were on the beach. 3/4 completed unloading and closed PHU BAI on 20 April, several days earlier than had been anticipated.

Additional emphasis was placed on security as intelligence indicated an increased probability of VC attempts at infiltration and sabotage. Numerous incidents were reported on 18 April concerning incoming small arms fire. At 180920H, a large explosion inside the DA NANG Airfield resulted in 3/9 being placed on 100% alert and being directed to unilaterally search all Vietnamese vehicles on the Airfield for explosives and fire arms. Investigation revealed that the explosion was caused by a bomb falling off a Vietnamese ammunition truck resulting in a sympathetic detonation of other bombs and napalm. 3/9's alert status was terminated.

In an effort to improve the effectiveness of the 81mm mortar platoons in the Regiment, this Headquarters launched a program of firing for all battalions on 17 April. A two-day FIREX for each platoon was scheduled with a test administered by Regiment as the final phase.

At 190800H, RLT-3 was task organized as 3d Marines (-) (Rein) and a new Regimental task organization was published. Tanks, Antitanks, and Reconnaissance Platoons in the DA NANG area were detached from the infantry battalions and placed in direct support under the parent company administrative control. The first of several 3d Marines OPs was established at coordinates 922738 and there are currently four in operation.

9th MEB, in coordination with I Corps, negotiated a greatly enlarged TAOR. Similarly, a TAOR was established at PHU BAI for 3/4 in coordination with CG, 1st Division. On 20 April, the Regiment was authorized to commence daylight patrolling within this expanded TAOR. Consequently, on that day, Co D, 3d Reconnaissance Battalion, attached to 1/3, sallied forth beyond the immediate area of hill masses 327, 268 and 368, 271. Initial objectives included route reconnaissance, limited hinterland reconnaissance and to see and be seen by the local populace. The first day's patrol was completed without incident as was another on 21 April. Valuable information of the area to an immediate front was obtained. 3/9 also began patrolling around the perimeter of the airfield on 20 April.

On 22 April the Regiment engaged the VC in combat for the first time. The engagement began in the vicinity of BINH THAI when the Reconnaissance

Company was fired on by an estimated 150 VC. In order to capitalize on the situation, 1/3's quick reaction company was helilifted into the area. They became engaged and the enemy was pursued to the west and south. The firing continued throughout the early afternoon and when contact was finally lost both units were helilifted back to the battalion CP area. As a result of this action there was one VC KIA and two probable WIA. We also suffered our first battle casualties. Two Marines were wounded, neither seriously. A lesson learned during this day's operation was the impracticallity of fighting in the climate of SVN while wearing standard Marine Corps body armor. There were six heat casualties during the operation. Upon the completion of the 23 April patrol and effective 232400I, the Reconnaissance Company was detached from 1/3 and placed in general support.

By 24 April all elements of the Regiment had commenced daylight reconnaissance patrolling. Patrols around the airfield proceeded without incident as did 2/3's early patrols. However, in 1/3's TAOR patrols continued to receive intermittent sniper fire and harrassment resulting in several casualties, most of which were minor. 2/3 provided an ambush force to attempt to apprehend persons who had been harrassing Battery 1, 4/12. The ambush remained in position all night but there was no activity in the area. LtCol JONES, CO of 3/4, apparently suffered a heart attack and was evacuated. LtCol TAYLOR assumed command.

The Commanding General, 9th MEB, inspected 3/9 on 23 and 24 April.

On the night of 23 April, 3/4 established a listening post on Hill 161, manned by elements of the attached Reconnaissance platoon. The post was attacked at 240101H. A sharp fire fight at close range ensued involving automatic weapons and hand grenades. The enemy was repulsed leaving two KIA on the battle ground and evidence pointed to two more WIA. 3/4 casualties included 2 KIA and 4 WIA.

Traffic control points were established at either end of the village of HOA PHAT by Marine and Vietnamese MPs, at 3d Marines request. Traffic flow has since noticeably improved. A People-to-People Officer has been appointed and plans are being drawn regarding a possible medical aid project in HOA PHAT.

On 26 April, patrols continued to be conducted within assigned TAORs including a company size road and area reconnaissance around Hill Mass 368. Significant contact was not noted. Fortification materials continue to be in short supply.

Light and scattered sniper fire was encountered during 25 April by 1/3 and 2/3 while engaged in aggressive patrolling. Two VC captives were taken but no organized resistance was noted.

During 28 April, 2/3 patrolled north and west of Hill 393 with 1/3 initially following in trace. No contact except an isolated sniper or two. 2/3's patrol swept to the northwest towards HOA MY. High grass, thick brush and rough terrain provided little circulation of fresh air and proved hard going. Company D, 3d Reconnaissance Battalion, supporting 2/3, set in drop-off ambushes behind and to the flank of the patrol. This action paid dividends as two VC were surprised by one of these ambushes and taken under fire. One was killed and the other captured. 3/4 conducted daylight patrols and established night ambushes.

This Regiment was honored by the visit of the Commandant of the Marine Corps on 28 April. He ate lunch in Company D, 1/3, mess hall on Hill 327. Following lunch, the Commandant flew over the Regimental positions and, after landing at 2/3 CP, was briefed on their disposition and plans. Additionally, the Commandant visited 3/4 at HUE PHU BAI.

At 290700H, 1/3 patrol departed by truck to their selected Point of Departure, dismounted and continued by foot. After reaching Check Point 26, the patrol's leading elements flushed two VC and took them under fire. No further incident occurred on this day. 3/9 conducted two reconnaissance patrols in the vicinity of the airfield. The Regimental Commander visited the 3/9 CP area and inspected the defensive perimeter. Also, Company D, 3d Reconnaissance Battalion made an aerial reconnaissance of the extreme western portion of the TAOR as the initial stage in establishing several observation posts to provide advance warning of the enemy approaching the DA NANG area. Resupply of patrols with water was accomplished by helicopter. Additionally, nine boxes of medical supplies for stock pile purposes were airlifted to HUE PHU BAI.

Late the 29th, a report was received that a VC regiment was massing in PHU LAC. The report was never confirmed. However, at 300025, 2/3 CP reported seeing 200-300 people about 2000 meters north of their CP. As a precautionary measure, 2/3 deployed a reinforced company to a blocking position vicinity 955778. Additionally, Co A (-), 3d Tank Battalion and one company of 1/3 were placed on a ten minute alert. No further reports of sightings were received and the regiment secured from the alert at 0608.

All units engaged in aggressive patrolling on the 30th. 1/3 was helilifted to a LZ west of Hill 393. All other patrols were foot patrols. Except for sniper fire near BINH THAI there was no enemy activity reported. All patrols returned prior to dark.

During this period, the Regiment suffered two KIAs, 17 WIA, twelve of which were only slightly wounded. We inflicted on the Viet Cong five KIA, two WIA with four more probable WIA and five captured.

1. In accordance with reference (a), this Headquarters intends to commence patrolling the area to the west of our present TACR's on 20 April. Enclosure (1) depicts the patrol routes for 20 April. The mission of the initial patrol is to conduct route, bridge and limited hinterland reconnaissance; to be seen and to create favorable impression on the Vietnamese people in the area.

2. Company "D", 3d Reconnaissance Battalion will conduct the patrol. Two platoons will cover the routes depicted in enclosure (1). The third platoon, mounted in vehicles, will generally be operating between the other patrols and will be prepared to move rapidly to assist either of the foot patrols if necessary, as well as act as a communications link. The foot patrols will cross their IP's at 0700H and will return by 1700H. The motorized patrol will displace from the vicinity of the northern IP in time to insure continuous positive communications between the foot patrols and the company headquarters.

3. It is requested that the following support be provided for this operation:

- a. Four H-34's on 15-min stand-by. Pick-up point LZ CUVE.
- b. Vietnamese civil affairs personnel, or if not available, English speaking Vietnamese liaison personnel.
- c. A battery of artillery tracking the patrol from time of departure to time of return.

- d. An OE overhead as an additional communications link. Considering the distances involved, this coverage should not be required. However, the training derived will stand us in good stead when longer range reconnaissance missions are assigned the company and an airborne relay station is actually required.

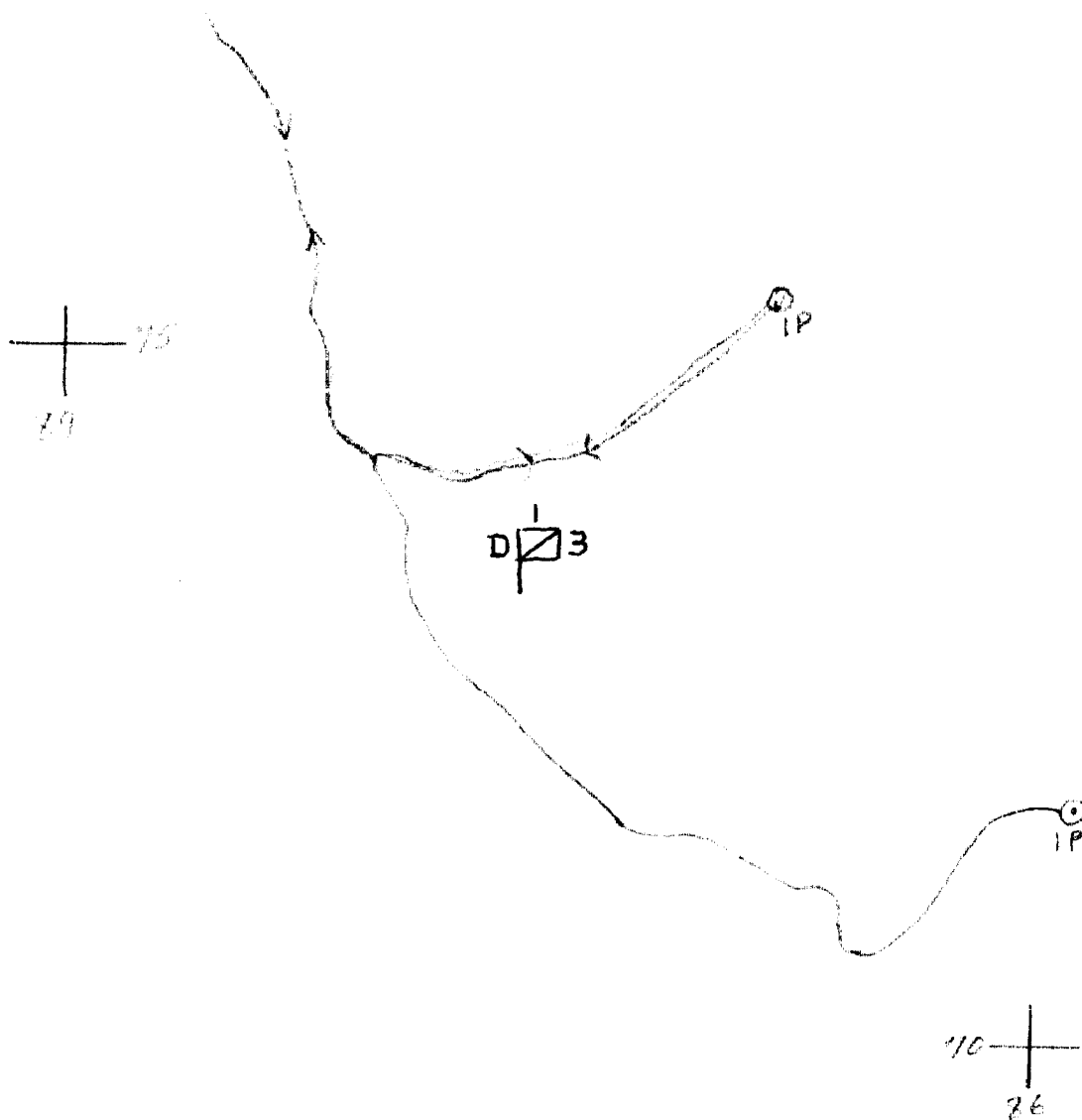

REPORT OF PATROL INCIDENT OF 162100H APRIL

1. At dusk on 16 April the 1st Battalion, 3d Marines located a listening post at 947722. This listening post was manned by two members of the 3rd Reconnaissance Battalion attached to the infantry battalions. These men were:

WHITE, Kenneth H	PFC	2056369
LACLE, Charles D	PFC	1987780

Pfc WHITE was in charge of this patrol.

2. The men were assigned a general location to establish their listening posts and were transported to the general area by vehicle along the south side of Hill 327. While on the vehicles the men observed about fifteen to thirty men and two women watching over a herd of approximately nine head of cattle in the vicinity of grid square 9471. They also observed an unusually large number of young adult males in one of the small villages in this area. The men were taken about one and one half miles past the spot that they would establish their listening post where they dismounted and doubled back by foot along the road to their assigned areas. It was still daylight when these two Marines arrived at the general position of their listening post. At dusk they moved to a more favorable position.

3. At approximately 2100, while trying to establish radio contact, small arms fire was received at their position. They immediately hit the deck and returned the fire. The first round hit their water can which was near by. The round shattered the handle and overturned the can. The VC were not using automatic weapons. The men have previously heard carbines fired and compared the firing to this type weapon, also, one of the weapons may have been an M-1. The flashes from the enemy rifles appeared to be about forty to eighty yards away, covering a frontage of about forty to fifty yards. The Marines returned the fire immediately with their two modified M-14 rifles. About 20 rounds were fired by the Marines. Then one of the Marines, Pfc WHITE, threw a hand grenade at the center of the group. They heard an agonizing scream and assumed one of the VC had been wounded. The VC began to withdraw in a southerly direction firing sporadically. During this period, Pfc LACLE was hit in the face with a fragment of splintered wood that apparently resulted from a round hitting a nearby tree. This man lost his vision and kept down while the other one continued to fire at the enemy. After the enemy withdrew, the Marines reestablished radio contact. Pfc WHITE did not consider that he could return Pfc LACLE to the lines, so the Commanding Officer, 1st Battalion directed that a patrol be sent out to bring him back. A two squad patrol from "D" Company was sent to their aid and returned the two men patrol to the battalion area about 0300. The larger patrol did not make contact with any enemy.

Pfc LACLE received a blow near the eye that caused his vision to blur. He also received superficial scratches on the face and wood splinters in the eyes. He is being x-rayed to see if he has a fracture of the facial

ocnes that caused the sight blurring. He has not been evacuated.

A patrol from "D" Company is returning to the location of the action today to look for additional evidence of the enemy.

Pfc WHITE was debriefed by the Regimental Commanding Officer at 0400.

OPERATION SUMMARY NO. 1

PERIOD COVERED 110000H - 172400H APRIL

1. OPERATIONS AND TRAINING. THE REGIMENTAL HEADQUARTERS CHOPPED TO CG 9TH MEB AT 121200H, COMMENCED UNLOADING AT THE MONKEY MOUNTAIN 1ST CAMP AND MOVED PERSONNEL, VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT TO THE SELECTED CP SITE AT COORDINATES 983743. THE COMMAND POST WAS OFFICIALLY OPENED THE FOLLOWING MORNING AT 0800H AND OFF LOADING WAS FINISHED DURING THE EVENING OF THE SAME DAY. THE CONSTRUCTION TO THE CAMP AREA PROCEEDED RAPIDLY AND EFFORTS TO IMPROVE IT CONTINUE.

AT 130800H OPERATIONAL CONTROL OF 1/3, 2/3, TASK FORCE ALPHA AND 3/9 WAS ASSUMED. IN ADDITION, RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE DEFENSE OF THE DA NANG AREA AND UNITED STATES INSTALLATIONS IN THE PHU HAI AREA WERE ASSUMED.

3/4 LANDED TWO REINFORCED RIFLE COMPANIES, A COMMAND ELEMENT, 81MM MORTAR PLATOON AND TWO SECTIONS OF THE 106MM RR PLATOON OVER RED BLACH 2 COMMENCING AT 140832, AND REPORTED TO THIS HEADQUARTERS FOR OPERATIONAL CONTROL. THIS FORCE WAS THEN TRANSPORTED TO PHU HAI BY HELICOPTER TO RELIEVE TASK FORCE ALPHA. TASK FORCE ALPHA PERSONNEL WERE RETURNED TO DA NANG AND MOVED INTO THE TACH WITH THE REMAINDER OF 2/3. TASK FORCE ALPHA WAS DISSOLVED AND THE BATTALION EXPANDED ITS OPERATIONS IN ITS TACH.

ON 15 APRIL, THE DAY FOLLOWING THE LANDING OF 3/4 AT DA NANG, THE REMAINDER OF THE BATTALION COMMENCED OFF LOADING OPERATIONS AT RUE. THIS INVOLVED A SEVEN MILE MOVEMENT BY LANDING CRAFT UP THE SONG HUE AND THEN MOVEMENT TO PHU HAI VIA HIGHWAY 1. OFF LOADING OPERATIONS AT RUE CONTINUED AND ARE STILL IN PROGRESS, AS THE REPORTING PERIOD ENDS. THE BULK OF THE BATTALION AND ITS EQUIPMENT ARE CURRENTLY AT PHU HAI AND THE BATTALION HAS ESTABLISHED CONTROL OVER ITS ASSIGNED TACH.

3/9 AND 1/3 CONTINUE TO PROVIDE SECURITY FOR THE AIRFIELD AND CONTROL THEIR ASSIGNED TACH, RESPECTIVELY. CONSIDERING THE SITUATION, THESE TWO UNITS CONDUCTED A GOOD DEAL OF TRAINING WITH EMPHASIS ON TYPES PARTICULARLY APPROPRIATE FOR THE AREA OF OPERATIONS AND LIKELY WAYS OF EMPLOYMENT.

DURING THE NIGHT OF 16-17 APRIL, A RECONNAISSANCE LISTENING POST ENGAGED IN A BRIEF FIRE FIGHT DURING WHICH ONE MAN WAS SLIGHTLY INJURED. DURING THE VISIT OF ASSISTANT AMBASSADOR JOHNSON ON 16 APRIL, 1/3 CONDUCTED A LIVE FIRING DEMONSTRATION ON HILL 268. ORGANIC RIFLE COMPANY WEAPONS AND THE 106MM RR WERE DEMONSTRATED AND FIRED.

ONE PLATOON FROM 1/3 WAS ALERTED AT 180000H, PREPARED TO ASSIST ONE OF THE ARTILLERY BATTERIES, THAT APPEARED TO BE UNDER ATTACK. ALERT SECURED AT 180010H.

#### 4. COMMUNICATIONS

THE SINGLE SIDE-BAND FAMILY OF EQUIPMENT HAS HELD UP VERY WELL DURING THIS OPERATION, ESPECIALLY IN AN OPERATIONAL COMPLEX WHICH INCLUDES TWO NEAR BATTALIONS, ONE BATTALION MASKED BY TERRAIN, AND A DISPERSED BATTALION 60 MILES DISTANT. NO OTHER EQUIPMENT COULD HAVE SERVED THIS PURPOSE.

THE NATURE OF THIS OPERATION CALLS FOR INSTANT AND CONSTANT COMMUNICATIONS. IN ORDER TO HANDLE THE DAILY TRAFFIC, THIS REGIMENT IS UTILIZING A COMMUNICATIONS COMPLEX OF LAND WIRE LINES, RADIO RELAY, AND RADIO NET, EACH PARALLELING THE OTHER. THIS GIVES THE UNIT THE CAPABILITY OF COMMUNICATIONS WITHOUT TOTAL RELIANCE ON ONE MEDIA.

PERIOD COVERED: 180000H TO 242400H APRIL 1965

1. OPERATIONS AND TRAINING. DURING THIS REPORTING PERIOD, INCREASED EMPHASIS WAS PLACED ON SECURITY, SPECIFICALLY DESIGNED TO PREVENT INFILTRATIONS OR ATTACKS ON KEY INSTALLATIONS BY INDIVIDUALS OR ORGANIZED VC UNITS. INCREASED DAYLIGHT PATROLLING WAS AUTHORIZED IN THE ENLARGED TAC ON 20 APRIL. REGIMENT TESTED TWO BATTALIONS ON MORTAR PROFICIENCY WITH EMPHASIS ON RECEIVING FIRE MISSIONS DURING AN APPROACH MARCH. NUMEROUS INCIDENTS WERE REPORTED ON 18 APRIL CONCERNING INCOMING SMALL ARMS FIRE. ADDITIONALLY, AT 180920H, A LARGE EXPLOSION INSIDE THE DA NANG AIRFIELD RESULTED IN 3/9 BEING PLACED ON 100% ALERT, AND DIRECTED TO UNILATERALLY SEARCH ALL VIETNAMESE VEHICLES ON THE AIR FIELD FOR EXPLOSIVES AND FIRE ARMS. THE EXPLOSION WAS CAUSED BY A BOMB FALLING OFF A VIETNAMESE AMMUNITION TRUCK RESULTING IN A SYMPATHETIC DETONATION OF OTHER BOMBS AND NAPALM.

AN/TP-21 RECORDED NUMEROUS GROUPS OF PERSONNEL MOVING IN GRID SQUARE 9575 THE NIGHT OF 19 APRIL. ISOLATED INCIDENTS OF SNIPER FIRE WERE NOTED.

DURING 20-24 APRIL, 1/3 CONDUCTED DAYLIGHT RECONNAISSANCE PATROLS EMPLOYING THE ATTACHED RECONNAISSANCE COMPANY AND ORGANIC RIFLE COMPANIES. THE FIRST TWO PATROLS PROCEEDED WITHOUT INCIDENT AND WERE WELL RECEIVED BY THE LOCAL POPULACE. HOWEVER, ON 22 APRIL, THE PATROL MADE CONTACT WITH VIET CONG FORCES NEAR BINH THAI AND A FIRE FIGHT ENSUED WHICH LASTED FOR SEVERAL HOURS. THE QUICK REACTION COMPANY WAS FLOWN IN BY HELICOPTER TO REINFORCE CO B, 3D RECONNAISSANCE BATTALION. CONTACT WAS LOST DURING THE AFTERNOON AND ALL PERSONNEL WERE RETURNED TO THE CP AREA BY HELICOPTER. TWO MARINES WERE KIA AND VIET CONG CASUALTIES INCLUDED ONE KIA AND TWO PROBABLE KIA.

1/3 PATROLS ON 23 AND 24 APRIL WERE HARRASSED BY SNIPER FIRE WHICH RESULTED IN ONE KIA. OTHERWISE THEY PROCEEDED WITHOUT INCIDENT. THREE HUNDRED VIET CONG WERE REPORTED OPERATING IN THE VICINITY OF MY SON ON 23 APRIL. IN AN EFFORT TO LOCATE AND FIX THEM THE QUICK REACTION COMPANY WAS FLOWN IN AND SEARCHED THE AREA SOUTH OF AND PARALLEL TO THE PATROL ROUTE WITH NEGATIVE RESULT.

CO B, 3D RECONNAISSANCE BATTALION WAS ATTACHED TO 1/3 FOR THE PURPOSE OF INITIATING THE PHASE OF DAYLIGHT RECONNAISSANCE ON 20 APRIL. UPON COMPLETION OF THEIR MISSION, AND EFFECTIVE 232400H, THE COMPANY WAS DETACHED AND RETURNED TO GS OF THE REGIMENT.

2/3 PATROLLED THE AREA NORTH AND EAST OF THEIR COMMAND POST ON 24 APRIL AND 3/9 CONDUCTED TWO RECONNAISSANCE PATROLS DURING THE PERIOD AROUND THE DA NANG AIRFIELD. CONTACT WAS NOT MADE BY ANY OF THESE PATROLS. 2/3 PROVIDED FORCES FOR NIGHT SECURITY CP ARTILLERY POSITIONS ON 21 APRIL AND ESTABLISHED AN AMBUSH NEAR L BATHRY AND THE 8<sup>TH</sup> PLATOON ON 20 APRIL IN AN ATTEMPT TO CAPTURE UNIDENTIFIED PERSONNEL WHO HAD BEEN HARRASSING THESE UNITS AT NIGHT. THE AMBUSH REMAINED IN POSITION ALL NIGHT BUT THERE WAS NO ACTIVITY.

1. In compliance with reference (a), the detailed concept of the subject operations is contained herein. Enclosure (1) sets forth patrol routes and enclosure (2) the fire support plan.

2. Background. Pursuant to instructions received from CG, 9th MEB, the TAOR of 1/3 was expanded to include the dominant terrain immediately west of their present positions. Extensive planning, study, coordination, rehearsal, and necessary modifications were effected preparatory to the employment of the first terrain and route reconnaissance patrol in this area on 20 April. The same detailed planning has been accomplished concerning the patrols scheduled for 21 - 23 April. Plans for the period 24 - 25 April are being reviewed and will be completed and submitted on 22 April.

3. General. The conduct of patrol operations necessitated detailed control measures, plans for communication with interested units, and plans for the employment of the reaction forces, as well as analysis of terrain, supply routes and information of the local populace and its activities. In clarification of the concept of patrol operations, and in answer to your specific questions concerning the same, the following is submitted.

#### 4. Concept of Patrol Operations

##### a. Control

(1) The mission of the Reconnaissance Company was to conduct a route reconnaissance in the western sector of 1/3's new TAOR, with an additional mission of effecting friendly overtures with indigenous personnel encountered enroute.

(2) The reconnaissance units carried out their assigned mission with two foot patrols, followed in trace by one mobile patrol to provide immediate reaction capability if necessary, and designated a series of checkpoints as shown in enclosure (1).

(4) Call signs utilized by all patrols are those of the organic unit in accordance with current standard communications operating procedures.

c. Landing Zones and Reaction Force

(1) Landing Zones. The battalion made an extensive map reconnaissance and visual reconnaissance from there present TAOR to select tentative LZs. The patrol on 20 April used this information to further develop their knowledge of possible LZs and their suitability. In the battalion the FAC controls the helicopters with a tactical air request to proceed along known routes to a point where the FAC can assume visual control, for vector to selected LZs.

(2) Employment of Reaction Force. The Battalion reserve, Company B (Rein), was designated as Reaction Force for the patrol operations 20 - 24 April 1965. The Company Commander was included in all planning conferences conducted at Regiment/Battalion. The concept for employment and control of the reaction force, previously coordinated with Brigade air element, is as follows:

(a) 20 April 1965 one reinforced rifle platoon on 30 minutes alert/standby at LZ DOVE. Four UH-34D and four F4B on 15 minutes strip alert for tactical troop movement and close air support of the reaction force.

(b) 21 April 1965 one reinforced rifle platoon occupies positions vicinity 912745 by 0730 and supports Company D, 3d Recon Bn. Two reinforced rifle platoons on 30 minute alert at LZ DOVE. Four UH-34D and four F4B on 15 minutes strip alert for support of reaction force.

(c) 22 April 1965 one reinforced rifle company on 30 minutes alert/standby at LZ DOVE. Four UH-34D and four F4B on 15 minute strip alert for support of reaction force. Ten UH-34D on helo assistance stations within 30 minutes LZ DOVE directed by helo recall plan, emergency guard channel.

(d) 23 April 1965 same reaction force employment as 22 April 1965.

d. Rules of Engagement. All patrols have been operating under the rules of engagement promulgated by 9th MEB, and as such have been instructed to fire only when fired upon. To preclude engagement with friendly forces two interpreter/liaison personnel are assigned to the patrols. In addition, one platoon ARVN troops and a civil affairs team were also attached.

e. Patrols. To effectively carry out the mission of conducting route reconnaissance, the patrols must necessarily pass through villages and other inhabited areas, where the additional mission of gaining the

b. Communications

(1) Dependent upon the situation and the terrain to be covered the following plan for communications was developed.

Plan 1 - (a) Stationed for relay from FAC, were 3 men with one PRC-47 and one PRC-10 at LZ BUZZARD (other stations to be used are dependent on the situation as it develops).

(b) The FAC, attached to the Reconnaissance Company Commander had 3 men with one PRC-41 and one PRC-10.

(c) On duty in the 1/3 CP (FSCC) were 2 men equipped with a PRC-47 and a PRC-10.

(d) On duty in the Regimental S-3/FSCC was 1 man equipped with a PRC-10.

(e) For relay purposes one team from 2/3 (adjacent to 1/3) is utilized with a PRC-10.

Coordination of frequencies used is effected via normal channels prior to any patrol operation.

(3) Communications with Artillery includes a Forward Observer Team (consisting of 3 men) attached to the Recon Company, with an AN/PRC-9 and 48 hours supply of batteries. The FO Team on Battery A 1/12 conduct of fire net, frequency 34.4 FM, is capable of executing rapid fire missions in the event of enemy contact on preplanned concentrations in the area of operations (see enclosure 2). An alternate means of communications for Artillery will be through the Reconnaissance net, monitored continuously by the FSCC during all patrol operations.

3. Results of Recon Operations 20 April 1965. Reconnaissance operations were conducted by the Reconnaissance Company, 3d Recon Bn in the Battalion's expanded TAOR, and included a reaction force drill with a platoon from Company B. A separate and detailed report was submitted to 9th MEB.

a. Results of this reconnaissance operation were significant in that the Regiment was able to gain important information regarding routes in the new TAOR, areas of recent and anticipated enemy activity, and a workable knowledge of the characteristics of terrain in that area. The contact with indigenous personnel left favorable impressions where they were encountered, with no noticeable aura of hostility.

b. In conjunction with the Reconnaissance operations, a reaction drill was conducted utilizing two helicopters and one platoon from Company B, to test the procedures, timing, and coordination necessary for the employment of a reinforcing unit. The reaction platoon "secured" the LZ within 10 minutes from the time the request for the helicopters was called in.

c. The missions of the reconnaissance patrols and the reaction force were accomplished and considered successful.

1. Men were observed working in fields. They appeared to be farmers; however, the men were armed with rifles.

2. As the reconnaissance patrol approached the areas in which contact was made, an unnatural quietness prevailed. No dogs, women, or children were observed in the streets or engaged in civilian activity. This is in contrast to friendly areas where laughing children would run up to patrols, women would jabber, and an atmosphere of interest and friendliness was prevalent. In the villages sympathetic to the Viet Cong, villagers that were questioned would deny knowledge of the Viet Cong's activity, locations, or very existence in an abrupt, quick, and brusque manner. This type of denials would in effect confirm the protection that the Viet Cong were enjoying either through sympathy or coercion.

3. At check point #47 the RVN advisor was informed by the villagers that the VC had been working the night before on mortar positions and were also working on the river beds on the west side of the river. No information as to what the VC were doing in the river beds was obtained. The villagers reported that two VC platoons had been seen that morning and had traveled west. At Binh Thai the advisor was informed that there were 150 VC in the immediate area and had moved slightly west. ARVN advisors made every effort to seek out information from indigenous personnel. Many villagers spoke freely and important intelligence was gathered in this manner. It is recommended that all patrols take these ARVN personnel with them and integrate them with their units. They were invaluable. The importance of Civil Affairs Teams and ARVN Translations and Interrogators is paramount to all operations of this type.

4. An ingenious ambush was set wherein there were three directions : able to the enemy without masking each others fire. (DIAGRAM)

5. Drums were heard continually as the patrol moved towards the area where contact with the enemy was made. Once contact was made, the drums ceased. Whistles were used to signal when the VC broke contact and immediately all contact was lost as the VC immediately effected a very definite organized dispersal in all directions and apparently just melted into the surrounding area.

6. 7.62mm and .30 cal. brass was found at various positions where the VC had been firing. Some of this was turned over to the 3d Counter-Intelligence Team. At the initial point of contact, the sniper fire was received directly at the radio sets, apparently to knock out communications.

7. Two VC were observed being carried out of the positions they were abandoning. Two blood spots were also observed from VC positions that had been abandoned.

8. At many different places holes were dug. These holes gave the appearance of being unfinished and could be used for either "PANJI TRAPS", mortar positions or trenches.

9. In the village that had been harboring the VC, "PANJI TRAPS" were employed throughout the entire village, along with "Spider Traps", "Molotov Cocktails", and ammunition. As the Viet Cong village burned, explosion after explosion could be heard, indicating ammunition that was either being hidden or stored in the individual homes. Many of the "PANJI's" were old and rotten while many appeared to be of recent vintage.

10. The high temperature and humidity caused two heat casualties that were evacuated. One ARVN had been wounded by a "PANJI TRAP" <sup>160</sup> was also evacuated.

11. When fire was returned at snipers, the VC would invariably withdraw. Danger of ambushes exists for pursuers of snipers.

12. The VC would shoot from shielded positions behind women and children. When the enemy village was being burned the women and children would fall on their hands and knees as if in prayer asking not to burn their village.

13. A mine field was found at coordinates 988718.

14. In some farm areas, one farm house would be heavily fortified while others would not be.

15. Villagers informed a patrol that the VC informed them not to go up a specific hill, coordinates 899715. The patrol intended to do so but were called back from their area of operations.

16. In the enemy village there were old and new "PANJI TRAPS", one every 1 yards down the main thoroughfares. There were no Marine casualties caused by the "PANJI TRAPS". Proper precautions and procedures were sufficient to expose the "PANJI TRAPS".

17. Three women were brought in as prisoners. The senior ARVN adviser suggested that they were presumed to have been VC agents or wives of VC. They were interrogated by the Third CIT.

18. An extensive amount of documents, books, leaflets, coins, clothing, and personal effects were brought in and turned over to the Third CIT.

19. The information gathered does not confirm that H41 Company was the VC force, but it probable that at least 2 platoons of this company were employed.

1. Stemming from a succession of informal conferences at Hue and Phu Bai during the period 15-19 April, enclosure (1) is submitted for approval.
2. The demarcation of the TACR and related agreements set forth below was negotiated by the undersigned with the Commanding General, 1st ARVN Division, the Commanding Officer of the Phu Bai Special Sector, their respective counterparts of the USMAAG, and members of their staffs.
3. The basis of the arrangements was the discussion with COMUSMACV at 8th RRU on 17 April.
4. The following agreements were made which are subject to the approval of the Commanding General, 9th Marine Expeditionary Brigade:
  - a. Dong Da (Phu Bai) Special Sector will be responsible for defense measures in Zone A. This includes the critical area of the villages lying close-in to the north and east of the airfield.
  - b. Third Marines (3rd Battalion, 4th Marines) will conduct defensive operations in Zone B, with emphasis on quick reaction offensive moves within the TACR.
  - c. Dong Da Special Sector and 3/4 will establish a joint operations center for coordination of efforts within Zone A and B.
  - d. Route #1 check points will be established within TACR, operated by ARVN personnel and supported by 3/4.
  - e. The critical terrain feature in the area (Hill 180-"Virginia Hill") will be occupied by 3/4.
  - f. Water borne patrols will be established by ARVN along the canals on the northern edge of the zone.

- g. Zone C provides for unrestricted operations to the Laotian border
- h. Training Center artillery and mortar range impact areas will be reoriented to the western edge of the TAOR to permit easier coordination between maneuvering elements of 3/4 and practice firing schedules of the Training Center.
- i. A 3/4 liaison officer will be assigned to the 1st Division. Seven liaison officers will be assigned 3/4 from 1st Division.
- j. Continuous liaison will be effected between 3/4 and the Training Center in order to coordinate the movement of 3/4 elements with the training carried out by the Center.
- k. 3/4 will make plans, and be prepared on order, to gradually work into the northern villages of the TAOR to win the confidence and cooperation of the inhabitants, with a view toward gaining their assistance in defending against VC incursions.
- l. Approval of the above is requested.

1. In accordance with reference (a), enclosures (1) and (2) are submitted herewith.

2. In an effort to improve the proficiency of 81mm Mortar platoons within the Regiment, the HOA CAM Range was reserved for a period of six days for firing. Each battalion was scheduled for two days of firing with two sections firing each day. Additionally, a firing test was developed by this Headquarters and administered at 1400 each day firing was scheduled. The results of the test are included in enclosure (2). The 1st Battalion, 3d Marines scheduled firing dates were cancelled on order of CG, 9th MEB. This platoon continued non-firing training.

3. The ammunition employed in the live fire portion of the training was of the following types: HE M43A1, HE M362, and WP M57. The M57 rounds were made in 1944 and it was noted that, out of a total of 41 M57 rounds fired during the training period, the flight path of approximately 10 rounds was irregular.

4. In general, the exercise was considered to be satisfactory. However, additional firing exercises will be conducted to improve the effectiveness of the 81mm Mortar Platoons in the Regiment. Increased speed in adjusting fire, coupled with accuracy, are the primary goals.

81MM Mortar Test

1. This test was designed to measure the combat efficiency of the 81MM Mortar Platoons within the 3d Marines. It is a two part test designed to determine the mortar section's ability to fire missions in either a static or moving situation. Speed and accuracy were the two factors used to judge the efficiency of the mortar sections. Safety precautions were observed throughout the test.

2. Test Procedure

## a. Part I

- (1) Sections registered to seat base plates and check sights.
- (2) Test Officer selected and pointed out target to Forward Observer.
- (3) Forward Observer adjusted fire on target.
- (4) Section fired six rounds for effect.
- (5) Efficiency of section was judged by speed and accuracy.
  - (a) Time started when FO located target and ended when last round of FFE was fired.
  - (b) Accuracy was judged by number of rounds having effect on the target.

- (1) Test started with section marching in tactical order with normal arms and equipment.
- (2) Test Officer selected target for FO and gave command to start the test.

- (7) Efficiency of section was judged by speed and accuracy.
  - (a) Time started when test officer gave command and ended when last round in FFE was fired (time required for safety check was not counted).

1. SITUATION.

a. Enemy forces.

(1) 9th MEB VC OOB as of 1 Apr 65 w/ch 1 or CG, 9th  
 MEB msg 041626Z Apr.

(2) 9th MEB Intelligence Estimate msg 050902Z April.

(3) Daily INTSUMS.

b. Friendly forces.

(1) 9th MEB, in coordination with I Corps, occupy defensive positions and key terrain at DA NANG/HUE PHU BAI and provide security for airfields and critical installations; undertake aggressive combat patrolling within TAOR's; establish a system of deep reconnaissance along principal avenues of approach; and conduct offensive operations as a mobile reaction force.

(2) I Corps, RVNAF, continues operations against Viet Cong (VC).

(3) 2d Air Div maintains air supremacy and conducts operations against DRV and VC.

(4) VNAF conducts CAS missions for I Corps RVNAF and strikes against DRV and VC.

(5) VNN maintains counter-infiltration screen along coast from DMZ south.

(6) US Seventh Fleet conducts naval and air operations against DRV and VC and maintains readiness to provide naval and air support to 9th MEB upon request.

(7) BLSG, BEG and MAG-16 (-) continue to provide combat support and combat service for operations as required.

c. Attachments and Detachments. None.

2. MISSION. 3d Marines occupies and defends key terrain at DANANG/HUE PHU BAI; provides security for airfields, 8th RRU, and Hawk Missile Battery on Hill 327; undertakes aggressive combat patrolling within TAOR's; and conducts offensive operations as a mobile reaction force.

3. EXECUTION.

a. Concept of Operations.

(1) 3d Marines provides security for DANANG Airfield and provides forces for the defense of the Hawk Missile Battery, 8th RRU and the airfield at HUE PHU BAI.

(2) 3d Marines conducts aggressive combat patrolling within TAOR's at DANANG and HUE PHU BAI in order to prevent the VC from conducting surprise mortar attack with impunity, to increase control of routes of approach and to permit early detection of the assembly of strong VC assault forces. Simultaneously, provide close-in security for the DA NANG complex by occupying strong points which control key terrain and roads and passes leading through and around the hill masses located directly west of the airfield.

(3) 3d Marines maintains maximum forces available for reinforcing units operating in TAOR's if suitable targets develop and conducts offensive operations as a mobile reaction force.

(4) Annex A (Operations Overlay)

b. Battalion No 1.

(1) Defend Hawk Missile Battery with minimum of one reinforced platoon under all circumstances.

(2) Control the 327, 268 hill masses and all avenues of approach leading from the west and southwest into the DA NANG Airfield.

(3) Conduct aggressive day and night combat and reconnaissance patrolling within assigned TAOR.

(4) Be prepared to conduct unilateral company/battalion sized operations within TAOR if suitable targets develop.

c. Battalion No 2.

(1) Control the 368, 278 hill masses and all avenues of approach leading from the west and northwest into the DA NANG Airfield.

(2) Conduct aggressive day and night combat and reconnaissance patrolling within assigned TAOR.

(3) Be prepared to conduct unilateral company/battalion sized operations within TAOR if suitable target develops.

d. Battalion No 3.

(1) Provide perimeter security for the DA NANG Airfield complex.

(2) Conduct daylight only reconnaissance patrols.

(3) Be prepared to provide security for the primary and tactical MEB command posts on order.

(4) Be prepared to assume operational control of other MEB units that may be assigned for the defense of the airfield.

e. 3d Battalion (Rein), 4th Marines

(1) Provide security for the airfield and 8th RRU at HUE PHU BAI.

(2) Control assigned TAOR by aggressive day and night combat and reconnaissance patrolling within assigned TAOR.

f. Co A (-) (Rein), 3d Tank Bn

(1) One platoon DS each battalion.

g. Co A (-) (Rein), 3d AT Bn

(1) One platoon DS each battalion.

h. Co D (-) (Rein), 3d Recon Bn

(1) Be prepared to conduct reconnaissance missions on order.

i. Coordinating Instructions

(1) Current battalion designations as follows:

(a) Bn No 1 - 1/3

(b) Bn No 2 - 2/3

(c) Bn No 3 - 3/9

Future battalion designations to be published by separate directive.

(2) Annex A (Operation Overlay).

(3) Annex B (Air Support).

(4) Following rules of engagement are applicable to all operations:

(a) Rounds will not be inserted in the chamber of individual weapons unless an encounter with enemy is obvious, and, in the judgement of the senior Marine present, this measure must be taken to preserve the lives of USMC personnel.

(b) Employment of CAS and artillery will be under the positive control of an ALO/FAC or FC. Tanks will not fire unless the target has been identified and confirmed. Use of all supporting arms will be cleared through the 9th MEB FSCC.

(c) Indigenous personnel are not permitted within original TAORs on the Hill 271, 327, 268 and the Hill 368, 312, 278 complexes. Units occupying these hill masses will apprehend indigenous personnel found within these areas and 3d Marines Headquarters (S-2) will be notified immediately.

(d) In night operations the sequence of engagement will be:

1. Challenge.

2. If there is no response to the challenge, or the response is incorrect, the area will be illuminated.

3. If the persons challenged open fire or make an overt hostile move that precludes apprehension and endangers the life of the challenger, he may load and fire.

(5) Written after-action reports will be submitted within 36 hours after completion of the operation. Reports will contain the following information:

(a) Statistical Data. (Units involved, strengths, time of departure, time of completion, nature of operation, etc.)

(b) Narrative account of action.

(c) Lessons learned, principal problems or difficulties encountered, areas or matters requiring increased training or attention, suggestions for future operations.

(6) Patrol plans and operations plans for offensive operations will be submitted to this Headquarters a minimum of 36 hours prior to execution.

(7) Reports of significant events will be reported on occurrence, and routine reports will be made every 30 minutes in accordance with the SALUTE format.

(8) One reinforced rifle company will be maintained on two hour alert for helicopter borne rapid reaction operations within 50 miles of DA NANG. The schedule for this responsibility will be published separately.

(9) All units will use 3d Marines checkpoint and route overlay system for reporting location.

(10) All units will use 3d Marines helicopter overlay to identify and locate established LZs in the TAOR.

(11) No fewer than eight men will be placed in isolated positions at night. All patrols will consist of at least eight men.

(12) Body armor mandatory for personnel manning defensive positions. Body armor optional on patrols and operations. Any individual who wishes to wear body armor will be permitted to do so.

(13) Patrols/operations in vicinity of Vietnamese villages will be accompanied by representatives from I Corps Civil Affairs Company. Submit requests for liaison personnel to this Headquarters (Attn: S-3) along with patrol and operations plans.

(14) All patrols will be accompanied by ARVN liaison personnel.

#### 4. ADMINISTRATION AND LOGISTICS.

a. Basic allowance per weapon except M-14 (Mod). For M-14 (Mod) carry 100 rounds.

b. Two full canteens of water will be carried by each individual.

c. Units plan for rapid resupply of Classes I and V supplies by helicopter.

d. Individuals take water purification tablets.
