PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of December the Third Marines accomplished troop redeployments which significantly extended the area of operations and altered the concept of operations. USMC forces relieved ARVN units at CA LU and D-5 outposts, thus permitting the ARVN forces to redeploy in full support of the Revolutionary Development program.

The most significant enemy actions during the month were the two mortar attacks on Third Marines positions in the THON SON LAM area.

The effects of the December monsoons influenced many regimental functions. Rain and limited visibility generally hampered operations, particularly helicopter support, logistics efforts, and efforts to improve living conditions. Construction and improvement of the defensive perimeter and cantonment area of Camp CARROLL continued, although weather conditions slowed activities. Much of the construction effort was directed toward facilities which would alleviate the effects of the monsoon. Road resurfacing, to cope with monsoon trafficability problems, received priority in the Camp CARROLL area. Helicopter resupply to the THON SON LAM area was delayed much of the time.

Difficulties were also encountered in other areas not necessarily as a result of the monsoon. Shortages existed in selected items of food resupply and office equipment.

The RAO VINH/CUA Valley reconnaissance in force operation continued into the month of December. The operation entered the CUA Valley in the second phase with the Third Battalion sweeping the populated areas and the First Battalion, Second Regiment, 1st ARVN Division providing blocking forces. In the MAI LOC/MAI DAM area USMC forces surprised 6 NVA, killing 5 and capturing 1. Inclement weather forced retention of forces in the operating area for several extra days due to helicopter unavailability. The operation terminated on 3 December, 3/3 was helolifted to its THON SON LAM positions, and the ARVN forces withdrew to DONG HA by foot and truck.

During the period 2-4 December the 2d Battalion, 3d Marines assumed responsibility for the 2d Battalion, 9th Marines area, and 2/9 was placed under the operational control of the Fourth Marines.

During the first week of December enemy activity in the RAZORBACK/ROCKPILE area increased. The L/3/3 position at the base of the ROCKPILE was fired upon by enemy small arms and recoilless rifles on 4 December, damaging two helicopters and a tank.

A company reconnaissance in force operation, planned for 6 December along the top and to the west of the RAZORBACK, was delayed by weather and helicopter unavailability until 070900H December when the company commenced a foot march to the objective area. M/3/3 moved into a base camp to the northwest of the ridgeline on 8 December and commenced patrolling the area in conjunction with a platoon of Company L which was attached and patrolling on the top and eastern slope of the RAZORBACK. On 9 December M/3/3 received fire throughout

the day from the RAZORBACK sustaining 2 KIA and 14 WIA. The company returned fire, prepared to advance to the top of the ridge, but was ordered to disengage and move to a position to the west of the RAZORBACK, to allow saturation of the area with artillery and air strikes on 10 December. However, on the night of 9 - 10 December, M/3/3 withdrew to the north of the RAZORBACK in order to evacuate casualties taken on the afternoon of the 9th. The L/3/3 platoon withdrew to the southern tip of the ridgeline.

During an air strike on the RAZORBACK on the afternoon of 10 December, an aircraft making a south to north run on the target area released two 250 lb bombs which missed the target, went over the ridge, and landed in M/3/3 area. The company sustained 17 KIA and 11 WIA. After completing medevac of the casualties, M/3/3 continued its return to the CP and terminated the operation at 110229H.

On 13 December Colonel J. P. LANIGAN relieved Colonel E. E. HAMMERBECK as Commanding Officer of the Third Marines. The change of command ceremony was conducted at Camp CARROLL.

A reconnaissance in force operation was conducted by H/2/3 during the period 15 - 17 December to detect enemy activity in the high ground east of Camp CARROLL. There was no significant contact.

On 20 December the Third Marines again conducted search and destroy operations in the conjunction with the 2d ARVN Regiment. With 2/3(-) sweeping north, and ARVN forces providing blocks to the south, the operation resulted in 1 KIA (Conf) and 5 KIA (Prob). In addition, enemy food, supplies, munitions, and documents were captured. Several enemy mines and booby traps were encountered, two of which wounded 6 USMC. Ralliers were employed during the operation to assist in the location of enemy caches and several were found. The operation terminated on 21 December with the return of 2/3(-) to Camp CARROLL.

During dusk of 20 December 3/3 was mortared by enemy units located in the vicinity of the RAZORBACK. Approximately 60-70 rounds of 81/82 mm mortar fire was received. Suppression fire was undertaken immediately by tanks, ontos, 81 mm mortars, and artillery. Artillery fired 106 105 mm HE rounds during this period. H&I fires were conducted throughout the night along the approaches to the RAZORBACK to cut off the withdrawing enemy.

From 240700H to 260700H the Christmas truce prevailed. Extensive local security patrols were conducted, but there was no enemy contact. All personnel at Camp CARROLL received liberal amounts of mail. 3d Marine Division Christmas cards, 3d Marine Division engraved wallets, and a Red Cross gift were the highlights of the Christmas period. A Christmas party for the children of CAM LO and the CUA Valley was conducted in CAM LO.

Operations were resumed on 26 December with E/2/3 conducting a search for a suspected enemy base camp on the southern edge of the CUA Valley. The camp was located with the assistance of a rallier, destroyed, and the operation terminated on 28 December.

A mortar attack on 3/3 positions on 28 December was the third such attack in two months, and the second during December. Differing from previous attacks, the enemy fired from two widely separated positions,

and 120 mm mortars were employed for the first time. A total of 100 - 110 rounds were received in the battalion area north of THON SON LAM, consisting of primarily 81/82 mm projectiles with 7 or 8 120 mm projectiles. Countermortar fire was quickly returned, and two of the three enemy mortar positions were observed and brought under fire. The 120 mm enemy mortar position was later determined to be west of the RAZORBACK and was not detected during the attack. Artillery fired 102 105 mm HE and WP rounds during the period. Throughout the night, 981 rounds of all calibers were fired as artillery attacked targets along the entire length of MUTTER RIDGE from which the enemy fire had predominately originated. On the following morning 421 rounds of 105 and 175 mm artillery were fired at the MUTTER RIDGE approaches to spoil any enemy buildup for an attack on 3/3's positions.

From 310700H December 1966 to 020700H January 1967 the New Year's truce was in effect. The regiment again conducted extensive security patrols, but without enemy contact.

During the truce period a redeployment of forces in the Third Marines AO, and beyond it, was made. The 1st Battalion, 2d Regiment, 1st ARVN Division was relieved at CA LU and D-5 outposts to free these forces for employment in the Revolutionary Development program. K/3/3 (Reinf) and the 123d Regional Forces Company moved over Route 9 to CA LU outpost on 30 and 31 December and assisted the overland withdrawal of the ARVN forces from that location. E/2/3 (Reinf) and the 122d Regional Forces Company moved to D-5 overland and over Route 558 on 31 December and assisted the withdrawal of the ARVN units via Route 558. K/3/3, separated from the control of its parent unit, remained under the operational control of the regiment. G/2/3, which had been operating in the CAM LO area with the Fourth Marines, returned to its parent unit on 31 December.

The redeployment of forces in late December increased the Third Marines operating area by 42 square miles. The inclusion of D-5 and the populated areas of CUA Valley and CAM LO significantly increased the civilian population in the Third Marines AO. Civic action and PsyWar programs are in progress in these areas.

At the end of the period, Third Marines was conducting operations to consolidate the recently acquired portions of its A O.

A. Combat Missions Assigned.

(1) Basic Mission. 3d Marines conduct recon in force operations in assigned area to detect enemy activity in area; attack and destroy enemy forces located in area making maximum use of supporting arms; ensure security of supporting units and installations located in assigned areas; assume responsibility for coordination of all units in AO and of defensive and administrative functions of mutual interest.

(2) 30 November 1966: Deploy 2/9 (-) to DONG HA base and to OPCON 4th Marines and assume OPCON of 2/3 (-) at Camp CARROLL on 2, 3, and 4 Dec 66; on order deploy remaining elements 2/9 to 4th Marines; deploy Battery (Reinf), 1/44 Arty, USA in defense of Camp CARROLL on or about 5 Dec66.

(3) 18 December 1966: USMC forces move by night foot march from Camp CARROLL to establish blocking positions north and east of MAI DAM (YD 1051) and MAI LOC (YD 1151). ARVN forces establish blocking positions as indicated. USMC forces conduct Search and Destroy operations moving south toward block.

(4) 28 December 1966: 3d Marines conducts operations to relieve 1/2/1 ARVN at CA LU and D-5. Extends AO to include CA LU area and eastern GUA Valley and conducts operations therein in coordination with RVNAF forces as directed.

Be prepared on order to provide for the defense of Camp CARROLL from the assets available at that location. Be prepared on order to reinforce Camp CARROLL with one company from THON SON LAM. Be prepared on order to deploy Regimental Command Group by helicopter or fixed wing aircraft to KHE SANH.

B. Significant Operations Conducted:

(1) Command Group A and Companies I and M, in coordination with 3/1/1 ARVN, continued the RAO VINH/CUA Valley reconnaissance in force operation into December. All elements of the operation moved into the MAI DAM/MAI LOC in order to sweep the area. At 030605H Dec, USMC elements surprised 6 NVA eating breakfast in MAI LOC; the ensuing action resulted in 5 NVA KIA (Conf) and 1 PW (NVA). Inclement weather delayed the heli-lift of 3/3 elements until 3 December when that unit was lifted back to THON SON LAM; the ARVN units returned to DONG HA by foot and vehicle. The only contact of any significance occurred on the final day of the operation, and total enemy casualties for the operation were 5 NVA KIA and 1 PW (NVA).

(2) At 041515H December, the Company L 3/3 CP at the base of the "ROCKPILE" recieved automatic weapons and recoilless rifle fire from the "RAZORBACK". The results were 8 USMC WIA, 2 damaged helicopters one of which was forced to land at the Camp CARROLL LZ EAGLE, and 1 tank damaged by recoilless rifle rounds. Fire returned resulted in 1 enemy KIA (Conf). Sporadic incidents continued in the 3/3 area throughout the night.

(3) As a result of increased enemy activity in the area of the "RAZORBACK" an operation was planned on top of and to the west of the ridgeline. Inclement weather delayed the operation for a day, and at 070900H Dec Company M, 3d Battalion, 3d Marines departed the 3/3 CP by foot march, after determining that helicopters would again be unavailable. A platoon from L/3/3 moved to the top of the ridgeline in conjunction with the operation, having been attached to Company M for that purpose. On 9 December, Company M was hit twice by enemy small arms fire from the "RAZORBACK" sustaining a total of 2 USMC KIA and 14 WIA. The company returned fire on both occasions but was too distant to ascertain the results immediately. Moving into the areas from which the fire originated, Company M discovered the firing points; the VC, however, had withdrawn on both occasions. Company M withdrew to positions north of the "RAZORBACK" on 10 Dec to evacuate casualties and so that artillery and close air support could be called in on the enemy. At 101245H December an aircraft making a south to north run on the northern dogleg of the "RAZORBACK" released 2 250 lb bombs which missed the target and passed over the ridgeline and into the Company M position, resulting in 17 USMC KIA and 11 USMC WIA. Participating elements returned to the 3/3 CP by 110229H, December.

(4) At 150630H December, H/2/3 commenced a reconnaissance in force operation in an area east of Camp CARROLL. There was no contact, and the operation was secured at 171155H.

(5) At 192315H December Command Group A and Companies E and H commenced movement to the CUA Valley for a combined operation with ARVN forces at D-5. USMC forces were to act as the sweep force moving from the north through the MAI LOC/MAI DAM area east of Rte 558, and ARVN forces were to be the blocking force to the south of the operating area. The operation was completed by 211130H when the rear elements of 2/3 returned to Camp CARROLL. Results of the operation were 3 enemy KIA (Conf) and 5 enemy KIA (Prob), in addition to the capture of enemy munitions, supplies, and documents. Several mines and booby traps were discovered in the area, two of which resulted in the only USMC casualties of the operation, 6 WIA.

(6) At 201810H December L/3/3 received 40-50 rounds of 81/82 mm mortar fire from the "RAZORBACK". Shortly thereafter M/3/3 received 25-30 rounds of the same. Total results were 3 USMC KIA, 15 USMC WIA.

Countermortar fire was returned by tanks, ontos, 81 mm mortars and artillery. Enemy action terminated by 1840H. Artillery H and I's by 155 mm howitzers on the "RAZORBACK" and further west continued throughout the night.

(7) 3d Marines operations during the Christmas Truce period 240700H to 260700H December were conducted using maximum recon patrols and ambushes.

(8) At 260715H December F/2/3 commenced a reconnaissance in force operation in the foothills to the south of the CUA Valley. In the only significant contact F/2/3 received sniper fire resulting in 3 USMC WIA; returned fire resulted in 1 enemy KIA (Prob). The operation secured at 281915H.

(9) At 281705H December, the 3/3 battalion position received 100-110 mortar rounds, primarily 81/82 mm with approximately 7 or 8 120 mm. A patrol from K/3/3 to the northeast of the battalion CP was mortared during the same period. Friendly casualties were 2 USMC KIA, 2 USMC DOW, and 21 USMC WIA. Artillery missions were undertaken at suspected enemy mortar positions, both observed and unobserved. Crater analysis on the following day determined that two of the three enemy mortar positions were fired upon during the attack. Only the enemy 120 mm mortar position was not fired upon. Artillery fire continued throughout the night and into the following day to cut off enemy withdrawal and prevent any buildup for an attack.

(11) At 300945H December K/3/3 commenced movement to CA LU. By 311130H the move had been completed, and K/3/3 and 123d RF Company relieved ARVN units at CA LU.

(12) At 310920H E/2/3 departed for Outpost D-5, arriving there at 311120H. At 311300H E/2/3 and 122d RF Company relieved ARVN units at D-5.

(13) During the month of December 3d Marines conducted the defense of the Marine Corps - Army supporting arms complex at Camp CARROLL. Several probing incidents occurred, however there were no enemy attacks. On 15 December Battery C, 1st Bn, 44th Arty (AWSF) (USA) arrived at Camp CARROLL and added 16 twin 40 mm automatic weapons and 4 Quad. 50 cal MG's to the defensive fires of Camp CARROLL. These weapons are being employed along the edge of the perimeter for maximum effectiveness. During the entire month improvement of the defensive position continued with supporting units working in their own defensive sectors.

C. Casualties Inflicted on the Enemy.

(1) At 030605H, 3/3 blocking force (YD 107507) located approximately 6 NVA in hut. The ensuing fire fight resulted in 5 NVA KIA (Conf) and 1 NVA captured. Search of the area revealed signs that 1 NVA was also wounded.

(2) At 031000H, M/3/3 located body of 1 NVA KIA (Conf) in shallow grave.

(3) At 041515H, L/3/3 (XD 974568) received automatic fire from unknown number of enemy at (XD 967567). Fire was returned at the enemy and a search of the area revealed 1 enemy KIA (Conf).

(4) At 071055H, G/2/3 patrol observed 4 VC at (YD 065528). The V8 were taken under fire. Search of area revealed signs of 2 NVA KIA (Prob).

(5) At 120130H, THON SON LAM OP (XD 979559) observed and fired at movement south of position. Search of area revealed signs of 1 enemy KIA (Prob).

(6) At 160630H, M/3/3 OP observed 5-7 NVA. The NVA broke contact and fled. K/3/3 patrol pursued and in the ensuing fire fight 5 NVA KIA (Conf).

(7) At 191425H, L/3/3 platoon on "RAZORBACK" observed 5 VC at (XD 960574). Scout-sniper team attached to L/3/3 delivered fire resulting in 1 VC KIA (Conf) and 1 VC WIA.

(8) At 200915H, E/2/3 (YD 112515) observed and engaged 14-16 VC. Results of the engagement were 3 VC KIA (Conf) and 5 VC KIA (Prob).

(9) At 201300H, M/3/3 located 6 freshly dug graves at (XD 989599). The graves contained 6 VC KIA (Conf).

(10) At 261610H, F/2/3 located a grave at (YD 032515) containing 1 VC KIA (Conf).

(11) At 270953H, F/2/3 (YD 031518) received small arms fire from 2 VC at (YD 029515). Fire was returned which resulted in 1 VC KIA (Prob).

(12) At 271705H, M/3/3 observed 2 VC at (XD 965577). 2 106 mm RR rounds were fired resulting in 2 VC KIA (Conf).

D. Casualties Sustained.

(1) On 2 December, K/3/3 Med-evaced 2 non-battle casualties, 1 USMC back trouble; 1 USMC possible malaria.

(2) At 041515H, L/3/3 (XD 974568) received automatic weapons fire in CF area from unknown number of VC at (XD 967567). 8 USMC were WIA, including 2 members of the helicopter crew.

(3) At 041730H, L/3/3 (XD 978564) received 81 mm mortar short round during fire mission resulting in 6 USMC WIA.

(4) At 041835H, K/3/3 platoon (XD 988589) enroute to ambush site, received small arms fire from unknown number of VC resulting in 1 USMC KIA and 2 USMC WIA.

(5) On 6 December, L/3/3 Med-evaced 1 USMC non-battle casualty (convulsions)

(6) On 8 December, M/3/3 Med-evaced 2 USMC non-battle casualties. 1 USMC burns on hand and leg; 1 USMC malaria.

(7) At 090830H, M/3/3 received small arms fire from estimated enemy squad in cave at (XD 954587). Result of action: 1 USMC KIA and 6 USMC WIA.

(8) On 9 December, E/2/3 Med-evaced 1 USMC non-battle casualty, broken foot.

(9) At 091540H M/3/3 received small arms fire from unknown number of enemy at (XD 952592). Results of action: 1 USMC KIA and 8 USMC WIA.

(10) On 10 December, M/3/3 Med-evaced 2 non-battle casualties. 1 USMC malaria and 1 USMC heel injury.

2. New Techniques Employed.

(1) On 6 December 1966, a new water purification facility for Camp J. J. CARROLL was completed. The water point was relocated at the north edge of Camp adjacent to the road in order to take advantage of a water source located below the hill. The water is pumped from the source to the top of the hill where it is purified and pumped into a 21,000 gallon tank for storage and then dispensed by a gravity feed system into water trailers and cans. The project was completed in cooperation between Mobile Construction Battalion (MCB) 7 and 3d Engineer Battalion units.

Water usage for drinking and shower water has been as high as 18,000 gallons per day on certain days during the month since completion of the new water facility. The system eliminated the use of trucks to transport raw water from the CAM LO river near the KHE GIA bridge to the water point at Camp CARROLL some 4 miles away.

(2) The probability of mortar attacks against 3d Bn, 3d Marine's positions required new countermortar techniques. Likely mortar attack positions were actively patrolled, placed under ground surveillance, and subjected to artillery H and I fires. During periods of limited visibility, particularly pre-dawn and pre-dusk periods, countermortar plans were exercised. These exercises included firing selected portions of pre-planned countermortar fires.

(3) Because of the uncertain accuracy of Psy War leaflet drops from aircraft and because of prohibitive flying weather, the 3d Marines employed a new method of leaflet distribution by having patrols saturate their patrol routes with leaflets during normal patrolling activities. Point targets particularly emphasized were trail junctions, harboring sites, and enemy fighting positions.

(4) Expedient artillery ammunition canisters have been employed in a number of construction requirements including: drainage ditches, siding for built-up walkways, improvised warming stoves, and bunkering in the Camp CARROLL area.

G. Equipment

Two Army Armored Personnel Carriers were used for emergency resupply of two companies and a command group of 3d Battalion, 3d Marines on 2 December 1966 in the CUA Valley. The vehicles were able to traverse paved roads, mud, and washed out stream beds in their journey with no difficulty.

On 13 December 1966 three Otters were assigned in direct support of 3d Marines by their parent unit (3d Motor Transport Battalion).

These vehicles have been used for resupply of units at the "ROCKPILE", CUA Valley, combat reconnaissance missions, and general housekeeping duties in the Camp area. The vehicles are satisfactory for mud and rough terrain use, but have a tendency to break tracks when used on paved roads. The CAM LO River has proved to be a barrier to the operation of the Otters because they cannot cross the swift stream during the monsoon season when the water level is high. (See article on Otters from SEA TIGER in Supporting Documents.)

H. Logistics

Message traffic and reports were handled in a routine manner during the month. Administratively the separate OPCON Battalions and Headquarters Company continued to report directly to Division.

(1) Supply

The overall supply situation in December remained good. Significant shortages still existed in consumable supplies such as straw brooms, stationary items, ditto fluid, ball point pens and 1967 calendars.

Canned vegetables, except for beets and carrots, and powdered milk were in short supply during the month. No bread has been received from FLSU DONG HA since 21 December. Mayonnaise was not available during the month. In general the food has been excellent in quality and sufficient in quantity as witnessed by the Christmas menu herewith enclosed.

Certain Class II items were considered critical during this period. Among these items were body armor, upper torso; wrist watches; towels; jungle utilities; and jungle boots in sizes 8, 9, and 10. A large influx of replacement personnel in December further complicated the problem in that one OPCON battalion (2d Battalion, 3d Marines) was in excess of T/O during the last few days of the month.

Generators (PU-278), multimeters, tool kits telephone TK-122/UG, and various other Comm-Elec gear were considered as critical items in the Logistics Summary Report #31 submitted by Headquarters Company. Sandbags and long barbed wire stakes were in limited supply and rationed during the month.

(2) Movement

The following troop movements were accomplished:

(a) Company K, 3d Battalion, 3d Marines was transported by helicopter from its position by the "Rockpile" to an initial point on Route 9 and from there by foot march to CA LU on 30 December 1966. An RF rifle company and a motorized resupply convoy joined Company K at the initial point and accompanied it to CA LU. This was the first time during Operation PHAIRIE that a motorized convoy had traversed this road. The movement was completed on 31 December 1966, and the ARVN Force at CA LU was withdrawn by the same route.

(b) Company E, 2d Battalion, 3d Marines moved by foot march to CUA Valley on 31 December 1966. It was accompanied overland by two Otters. An RF rifle company joined it at the D-5 position by utilizing Route 558 from CAM LO. This represented the commencement of a concerted effort to open Route 558 for military and civilian traffic. The ARVN Force was withdrawn from D-5 by truck transportation on 31 December 1966 over Route 558 to DONG HA.

(3) Entertainment and Camp Facilities

Headquarters Company continued to improve its living area by constructing sand and gravel sidewalks bordered by 175mm powder canisters, by continuing the sandbagging of living spaces, and by the construction of a grease pit for the messhall. During the period 3d Engineers constructed a bunker for use by the Message Center of the 3d Marines. A diagram of the 3d Marines Command Post is included.

A new water point was completed on 6 December. (See Paragraph E above.) In addition a sentry booth was constructed at the entrance to Camp CARROLL. A diagram of the police areas of units at Camp CARROLL is included. The units are generally billeted in the area of police responsibility.

Bunkers, heads, hardbacks, and tent decks were again requested during the month of December. As of this date, only seven heads and one bunker have been received by Marine units at Camp CARROLL through official channels. Most construction has been accomplished by using wood packing boxes for artillery rounds.

(4) Engineers

Engineer support was furnished by the 3d Engineer Battalion at Camp CARROLL. The 11th Engineer Battalion arrived in the DONG HA area in late December and provided some assistance in the form of dump trucks for the construction of gun pads for the Army's 175mm guns. The Sea Bees were assigned the responsibility for the construction of these gun pads in late December.

(5) Motor Transport

During this period no vehicles were combat-dodged for repairs. The only significant repair parts shortages were inner tubes and repair patches. Due to rugged driving conditions and the old age of the rubber, a high number of flat tires occurred - sometimes as many as four or five a day. Many tubes were patched a half dozen times because replacement tubes were not available.

(6) Transportation

Third and Ninth Motor Transport Battalions continued to furnish three household trucks a day for Headquarters Company. Ninth Motors took control of dispatching all such trucks during the month although Army and Artillery units of Camp CARROLL were called upon for transportation in emergency situations.

Trafficability of roads in the Camp CARROLL area has been hindered by the monsoon rain. Holes as deep as three feet developed in the road in front of Headquarters Company and 2d Battalion, 3d Marines area. Alleviation of this condition was partially accomplished by 3d Engineer Battalion, by the use of a rock-gravel base applied to the road.

(7) Ordnance

Claymore mines (M-18) have not been available during December. The firing device used with this mine was found to be defective, and as a result all M-18 Claymore Mines have been returned to the Ammunition Supply Point at DONALD. Claymore Mines (M-18A1) with firing devices are satisfactory, but are not available.

(8) Medical

The dechlorination of water trailers and cans was accomplished during this period. This project was undertaken on the Camp level, and supervised by the Regimental Surgeon. When checking water cans, it was found that over 75 percent of the cans in Headquarters Company lacked lids and as a result were unserviceable but had to be used because of lack of replacements.

I. Civic Action.

December 1966: A timber cutting project was started in the vicinity of (YD 0557) and (YD 0658). Approximately 200 Montagnard Refugee woodcutters are working in the area at the present and the project is progressing smoothly. The site was picked because it is within easy walking distance of the Refugee Hamlet at CAM IO. USAID is the coordinator of the project and the timber will be transported to the sawmill at QUANG TRI by civilian trucks. The woodcutters will be paid with the proceeds resulting from the sale of the lumber.

24 December 1966: A Christmas party was held at CAM IO District Headquarters for 500 school children of the GUA Valley. The party was a complete success. The District Chief explained the meaning of Christmas for the benefit of the non-Christian children present. The 3d Marines Commanding Officer spoke briefly on the theme of Christmas and friendship. Passages from the Bible were read in both Vietnamese and English by the local ministers and the Regimental Chaplain. A high point of the program was a choral group of Marines and soldiers from Camp J. J. CARROLL, who sang Christmas songs for the children. Toys, cookies, and Kool-Aid were passed out to the children at the end of the program.

December 1966: A daily MEDCAP program was conducted at CA LU (YD 0145), CAM PHU Village. A total of 480 patients were treated throughout the month. This type of program continues to be well-accepted and appreciated by the Vietnamese people.

N. Weather

(1) During the month of December, QUANG TRI Province was completely under the influence of the northeast monsoon. From 1-10 December, the weather was either rainy or typically "crachin", i.e., prolonged periods of fog, and drizzle or light rain accompanied by low-level strata phenomenon. From 11-21 December, the weather was fair to partly cloudy with temperatures ranging from 76 degrees Fahrenheit to 89 degrees Fahrenheit. The period 22-31 December was characterized by rainy periods and "crachin" weather.

(2) Average temperature for December was 71 degrees. Total rainfall for the month was 10.5 inches.

(3) The periods of rainfall and reduced visibility seriously affected operations during the monsoon period. Operations scheduled, utilizing helicopter transport of personnel, had to be cancelled in many instances or secondary plans instigated using other means of inserting troops into the objective area. In addition, alternate means of resupply were used when helicopters could not fly during adverse conditions.

(4) Detailed daily weather conditions are documented in 3d Marines Daily LINESUMS.

Subj: Rules of Engagement.

1. Purpose. To provide information and guidance concerning rules of engagement.

2. Cancellation. RegtO 3000.6A

3. Information.

a. Annex J of reference (a) sets forth rules of engagement for 3d Marine Division units.

b. Reference (b) contains information and extracts from COMUSMACV rules of engagement.

c. Reference (c) provides guidance for the use of Riot Control Agents and Munitions within the 3d Marine Division.

d. This order consolidates the information pertaining to rules of engagement published in references (a) through (c).

4. Action. Unit commanders under the operational control of this Regiment will insure that the rules of engagement prescribed by references (a) through (c) and set forth herein are enforced. Troop indoctrination briefings will be held before each operation to emphasize both the short and long range importance of minimizing non-combatant battle casualties.

a. Individual.

(1) Rounds will not be chambered in individual weapons unless contact with the enemy is imminent. The senior Marine present will determine if this measure must be taken to preserve the lives of friendly personnel. Initiation of any offensive or defensive formation implies contact with the enemy.

(2) Magazines will not be inserted in weapons in a camp area unless engaged in action with the enemy or on order of competent authority.

(3) During the hours of darkness, the sequence of engagement will be:

(a) Challenge

(b) If the person challenged makes an overt attempt to avoid apprehension, opens fire or commits any other hostile act and therefore endangers the life of the challenger, the challenger may fire.

(c) Unit commanders may prescribe illumination prior to firing if local circumstances allow.

(d) The requirement for challenge may be waived by the local commander if required by the tactical situation and friendly forces are known not to be in the operating area.

b. Units

(1) Hamlets or villages not associated with ground operations will not be attacked without prior warning (by leaflet and/or speaker systems or other appropriate means) even though light fire is received from them.

(2) Hamlets or villages may be attacked without prior warning if the attack is in conjunction with a ground operation involving the movement of ground forces through the area, and if in the judgement of the ground commander, his mission would be jeopardized by such warning.

(3) All supporting arms fire missions on hamlets or villages will be controlled by an airborne or ground forward observer (FO) and will be executed only after positive FSCC approval. Close air support missions that involve strikes on hamlets or villages always must be controlled by a FAC and executed only after FSCC approval.

(4) Supporting arms will not be fired into any populated area except when the infantry commander on the ground personally determines the area to be hostile and such action is necessary to save Marine lives and that there is no alternative to such a course of action.

(5) All supporting arms missions, with the exception of barrages and preplanned unobserved fires, will be controlled by an airborne or ground FAC, forward observer, NGF spot team or RVNAF observer. All observed and unobserved fires, except barrages, will be positively approved at the appropriate FSCC level prior to the use of supporting arms.

(6) In areas exclusive of villages and hamlets, supporting arms may be directed against VC forces in contact in accordance with normal procedures. However, unobserved fires will be directed only at targets or target areas declared hostile by GVN, VN liaison personnel, observers or forward air controllers (FAC).


(7) None of the foregoing is intended to deny the application of force against the source of hostile fire. Enemy forces engaging friendly troops will be destroyed by any means available.

c. Destruction of Dwellings and Livestock.

(1) Civilian dwellings will not be burned, nor will private property including livestock be destroyed except as an unavoidable consequence of combat actions.

(2) The destruction of Vietnamese dwellings and livestock as a means of denying their use to the enemy is left to RVNAF units. Requests from Vietnamese authorities for employment of Marine forces to perform such destruction will be referred to this Headquarters.

d. Restricted Targets. Every effort will be made to preserve religious, cultural and public utility installations.

Subj: Lessons Learned, December 1966

Ref: (a) CG 3d MarDiv 271438Z Apr66

1. In accordance with reference (a), the below listed Lessons Learned are submitted.

a. Item: Monsoon Operations.

Discussion: The effects of monsoon weather on combat operations are so significant that they dominate virtually all aspects of both planning and operations. The successful accomplishment of a mission will depend upon the preparation of detailed primary and alternate plans which are designed to accomplish missions under the most unfavorable weather conditions, and exploit short periods of advantageous weather, rapidly and effectively.

Normally, the primary plan will be based on courses of action which can accomplish the task in any weather. This precludes reliance on air support in any form. With the limitation imposed by loss of aerial lifts, resupply, medevac, reconnaissance, and observation, the range and scope of the primary plan is reduced. The staying power of a deployed unit becomes an important consideration. The duration of an operation is calculated on the unit's ability to sustain itself without resupply, to care for and move casualties without evacuation, and to accomplish its mission without reinforcement. Thus, plans for monsoon operations must allow for increased combat loads and provide for the combat power necessary to compensate for loss of flexibility.

Time - space factors vary widely. For example, a movement to the objective area may be made in 15 minutes by helicopter in good weather, 5 hours by foot in marginal weather, and 24 hours by foot in bad weather, which requires a circuitous route to avoid impassible terrain and extends the movement into darkness.

A more ambitious alternate plan must be prepared which will capitalize on the use of air support when weather conditions permit. Deploying units must be prepared to exploit the advantage of brief periods of

good weather during any phase of the operation. In dense canopy or other unfavorable terrain the location and availability of helicopter landing zones becomes a vital concern. Deployed units may use possible LZ's for tactical objectives, maintaining their readiness to increase the range and scope of their operations by keeping "one foot in an LZ" at all times.

Recommendation: That the primary plan for combat operations during the monsoon season provide for the accomplishment of the mission under the limitations of the most adverse weather, and that the alternate plan provide for extension of operations during any phase of the operation whenever favorable weather permits.

b. Item: Sav-a-plane.

Discussion: On all artillery fire missions, it is the responsibility of the battalion or regimental FSOC to initiate the Sav-a-plane system. This is done by sending five elements to Division FSOC: location of target, location of unit firing, time firing commenced, time firing ceased, and the maximum ordinate of the trajectory. From the observer's fire request and the subsequent message to observer sent by the firing unit, the FSOC can extract all the elements necessary for the Sav-a-plane except the maximum ordinate. To obtain this information a separate radio transmission from the FSOC to the firing unit is required.

Recommendation: That the maximum ordinate be added to the message to observer when given by the firing unit, eliminating the necessity for the separate, time-consuming transmissions described above.

c. Item: Fire Support Coordination.

Discussion: In many operational areas it is necessary to rely on helicopters to accomplish a variety of vital missions. Heavy and continuous helicopter traffic competes with supporting arms for air space. On many occasions the requirement for artillery fire support and helicopter support is simultaneous and equal. In these cases it is necessary to provide a system under which both missions can be accomplished without delay.

A method of coordinating both missions is for the FSOC to direct the aircraft under the artillery trajectory. To accomplish this the FSOC must be provided firing charts as well as the maximum ordinate. The range and maximum ordinate can be determined from the message to observer. With these two factors the actual trajectory can then be determined from the firing charts. Coordinating this information with the known flight path of the aircraft, FSOC can direct the aircraft to a safe altitude to pass under the flight of the projectile. This procedure is safe and practical and can be used in an emergency.

Recommendation: That this procedure be adopted for the control of emergency missions in which it is necessary to conduct both helicopter and artillery missions simultaneously.

d. Item: Cutting trails through bamboo.

Discussion: Bamboo tree lines can impose a difficult barrier to movement. Experience has shown that there is only one way to cut them quickly: one inch below or above the joint of the stem. A cut in any other place simply shatters the stem and delays clearing the tree.

Recommendation: That inexperienced personnel be advised of the proper method of cutting trails through bamboo.

e. Item: Employment of Provisional Reconnaissance Units.

Discussion: During the past sixty days, this organization has employed members of the Provisional Reconnaissance Unit in two locations on two separate occasions. Results were profitable; however better utilization could be made through better control and coordination. The language barrier, and unfamiliarity with reporting procedures and information required, limited the effectiveness of these units.

Recommendation: That a Marine from a Division or Force Reconnaissance unit and a qualified interpreter be assigned to each patrol to insure proper control and reporting. The indigenous personnel will extend our reconnaissance capabilities, but must be augmented to gather and report the intelligence information accurately and timely.

f. Item: Incorrect reporting of intelligence information.

Discussion: On many occasions the rapid and accurate identification of captured enemy weapons and equipment will enable the commander to determine the strength and mission of the enemy so that he may take prompt, effective action. However, many Marines are not familiar with typical items of enemy equipment and are slow or incorrect in identifying such items in the field.

Recommendation: That additional training in recognition and identification of VC/NVA weapons and equipment be conducted at platoon and company level. Sets of typical items should be made available to infantry battalions for training and demonstration at company/platoon level.

g. Item: Radio communications using the KY-8 equipment.

Discussion: Bringing this sophisticated equipment into initial operation can be facilitated by putting the auxiliary receivers on the

operating frequency. Monitoring communications "in the clear" with the auxiliary receiver allows operators a channel of communication to determine remedies if trouble develops in attempting to communicate in cipher.

Recommendation: That auxiliary receivers be used to assist in establishing initial communications with the above equipment.

h. Item: Utilization of 7.62mm ball, tracer rounds by an infantry squad to mark targets.

Discussion: In a guerrilla warfare situation in which the Viet Cong/North Vietnamese Army continually establish ambushes from well-concealed positions, and in which the enemy frequently uses sniper or "hit and run" tactics, it many times becomes extremely difficult for a friendly squad or larger size unit, when receiving incoming fire, to locate the enemy and direct effective fire to bear on the exact enemy position. Experience in 3d Battalion, 3d Marines demonstrated that the above problem can be significantly decreased by distributing at least one magazine of 7.62mm tracer rounds to each fire team leader and the point man in each squad; so that when enemy fire is received from a concealed position, the location of the target can be marked by one of the fire team leaders or the point man (in the case of an ambush from the front) with tracer rounds, and the squad leader can quickly direct all his organic and attached firepower to the exact target location. The advantages of this practice are:

a. It saves time - Once the target is marked by someone firing a tracer round, the complete firepower capability of a squad and its attachments (M60 MG, 3.5 RL, and M72 LAAW) can be immediately directed at the target, thus precluding the normal delay and initial lack of control when unexpectedly fired upon from a well-concealed or camouflaged position.

b. It provides a better chance for an enemy kill - Against sniper "hit and run" tactics, such as experienced in the Da Nang sector where the enemy would frequently fire 10-100 rounds at friendly forces, and then vacate his position, the full firepower of the reinforced rifle squad could seldom be brought to bear quickly and effectively. By the utilization of tracer rounds, a target could quickly be marked, and substantial firepower (M79, M60, 3.5 RL, M72 LAAW, and rifle) could be directed at the enemy before he was able to slip away.

In the Dong Ha sector where the enemy establishes well-organized ambushes and fights from well-fortified emplacements and bunkers, it becomes extremely important to be able quickly to locate and to destroy the enemy. In situations similar to those experienced by 3d Battalion, 4th Marines, and 3d Battalion, 3d Marines on "Mutter Ridge", where the enemy occupied well-camouflaged and well-fortified bunkers on the hill tops, reinforced by mutually supporting bunkers on the flanks of the trail leading to the hill tops, one of the main problems encountered was that of trying to pinpoint the bunker aperture or exact point from which enemy automatic fire was originating. Failure to locate the exact origin of enemy automatic

fire resulted in heavy friendly casualties; however, being able to locate the origin of enemy fire and to direct fire to bear upon it by utilizing tracer rounds to mark the target, would enable the friendly forces to withdraw under the cover of effective, voluminous, and accurate fire to a safe position from which artillery could be directed against the enemy fortifications. The disadvantage of revealing friendly positions would be minimized since the primary intent of the use of tracers would be to bring heavy fire to bear on the enemy.

Recommendation: That twenty rounds (one magazine) of 7.62mm tracer ammunition be issued to each fire team leader and the point man of each squad for patrols and operations to mark enemy targets.

That 7.62mm tracer ammunition be made available in the form of individual rounds boxed in the same manner as 7.62mm ball ammunition is currently packaged.

i. Item: Use of expended powder canisters.

Discussion: Expended powder canisters can be used for a variety of purposes; culverts for access roads, drainage ditches, drainage pipes, palleting, and when filled with earth, bunkering.

Recommendation: That expended powder canisters be made available for the described purposes.

Amphibious 'Otter' proves its versatility

DONG HA--One of the more unusual pieces of machinery to be found at this northern Marine base is proving its versatility even before being committed to its primary duty.

The Otter, a personnel and cargo carrier with amphibious capabilities, has come to the rescue of several 2½ ton trucks mired in mud.

Six of these stub-nosed, tracked, box-like vehicles from "A" Co., 3rd Motor Transport Battalion will be used to carry supplies from command posts to forward elements of units on Operation *Phuoc*.

First designed for use in snow, the Otters were sent to Vietnam for resupplying when helicopter flights are hampered by weather.




