#### PART II

### NARRATIVE SUMMARY

April commenced finding 1st Bn 3d Mar (-) and 1st Amtrac Bn conducting normal activities, while BLT 2/4(-)(Reinf) was conducting operations in conjunction with 2d ARVN Regt and 3d Squadron of 5th Armored Cav, sweeping north to the DMZ.

ol April: At 0930H, H/2/h in vic (YD 261738) found 1 NVA body, 8 individual weapons, and assorted gear. Weapons and gear were sent to 3d Marines S=2. Between 1050H and 1200H, E and G/2/h in vic (YD 25575h) found 2 partially destroyed individual weapons along with assorted ammo and rice. Destroyed all ammo and rice. During this time E and G/2/h recieved approx h9 Rnds of enemy rockets and sustained 8 WIA (MEDEVAU). At 1215H, C/1/3 in vic (YD 301700) sustained 5 WIA (MINOR) when an LVM hit a mine. At 1523H, B/1/3 sweeping in vic (YD 282762) found 30 CHICOM grenades, 19 AT mines, 30 assorted mortar rounds, 1 RPG launcher, 1 120 rocket round, and 1000 7.62MH rounds. B Co destroyed all ordnance as well as 2 rocket sites and 67 bunkers. At 1810H, B/1/3 in vic (YD 28975h) found 67 lhOMM rockets, 30 82MM rounds, and assorted S/A ammo which was sent to S=2 of 3d Marines. At 2220H, E/2/h was probed by an estimated company size force. Enemy was repelled, resulting in 3 NVA KIA, 1 FOW, and 1 IWC. Negative friendly casualties sustained.

O2 April: At O010H, A PF sqd in vic (YD 339683) ambushed an estimated VC plat. VC returned fire with S/A and RPG's but fled when additional PF's were committed to the fight. Area was swept with negative results. PF's sustained h WIA, and 3 civilians were wounded. All casualities were treated by 1st Amtrac Bn BAS and released. At 0900H, E/2/h in vic (YD 248725) found large cache of ammo and gear including 8 RPG rounds, 50 82mm rounds, 49 60mm rounds, 20 CHIOOM grenades, 2 rifle grenades, and 30 82mm round fuses. All ordnance destroyed. At 1050H, G/2/h came in contact with 5 NVA in a bunker. Results were 2 USMC WIA (MEDEVAC), 1 NVA FOW, and h NVA KIA. At 1650H, G/2/h in vic (YD 278699) found 20 NVA KIA and large cache of enemy ordnance and gear including 270 60mm rounds, 225 82mm rounds, 16 75mm rounds, 3 AT mines, h1 cases of 12.7mm ammo, 5 cases of 7.62 ammo, numerous cans of mortar fuses, increments, and detonators and assorted NVA 782 gear. Selected ordnance was sent to 3d Marines S-2 and the remainder was destroyed. At 2400H, joint operations with BLT 2/h (-) (Reinf), 2d ARVN Regt, and 3d Squadron of 5th Armored Cavalry were concluded.

03 April: At 0945H, D/1/3 received a report from PF's that approximatly 30 VC spent the night in LUONG KIN (YD-325651) and captured 1 PF. They carried carbines, M-1's, AK-50's, 1 pistol, 2 Chinese grenade launchers, and packs. At 2200H, they proceeded to LE XUYEN (YD 345634) and VINH HOA (YD 344655) to geterice. At 1127H, CAPP KISTLER received 27 rounds of medium entry and sustained 2 WIA (MINOR). NOF mission fired on suspected sun positions in vic (YD 205810). At 1315H, G/2/4 found 2 NVA bodies in vic (YD 274687) that appeared to be larger than normal. Photos were taken of bodies and forwarded to S-2 of 3d Marines for examination.

Oh April: At 0700H, B Co 1st Amtrac En at C-h observed 150 to 200 figures moving in vic (YD 292708). A0 was requested. Figures were found to be civilians moving into areas recently cleared of NVA by BLT 2/h (-)(Reinf). This incident marked the beginning of increasing movement of civilians through areas previously occupied by the NVA. At 1530H, patrol from B Co 1st Amtrac En found 1 M98 Mauser rifle wrapped in plastic and the lower torso of 1 MVA in a former NVA strongpoint (YD 299748). At 17h0H, C/1/3 detained 2 suspicious civilians in vic (YD 289643): Nguyen Thanh Quang, age 18, had a camera, pictures of himself with marines, \$46.00 MPC and 93 plasters; Hoang Quang, age 1h, had \$6.00 MPC and 10 plasters in his possession. Both individuals were forwarded to S-2 of 3d Marines for interrogation and released on 05 April as innocent civilians. During the afternoon, G/2/h established a company combat outpost in vic (YD 305682) and a plat outpost in vic (YD 284688).

05 April: At 1030H, G/2/L patrol found bunkers, fighting positions, a 50 caliber MG position, and 9 82mm rounds in vic (YD 289692). Positions and rounds destroyed in place. At 1100H, an ARVN reported a 15 LB AT mine located in vic (YD 311685). G/2/L dispatched a patrol and destroyed mine in place. At 1820H, patrol from 1st Amtrac Bn found L punji pits rigged with explosives in vic (YD 365665) and destroyed them. At 2130H, H/2/L LP spotted approximately 5 NVA moving behind dirt mounds in vic (YD 274664). LP withdrew, and 60mm and 81mm mortars missions were fired. Area was checked at first light with negative results.

of April: At 1028H, E/2/4 while sweeping a hamlet; found and destroyed 2 claymore type mines in vic (YD 257646). At 1455H, in the same area, 8 RPG rounds, 9 82mm rounds, and a case of US 7.62mm rounds were discovered. All ordnance was destroyed except the 7.62 ammo which was forwarded to S-2 of 3d Marines. At 1500H, A-4 airstrikes were conducted in vic (YD 265685) destroying 2 bunkers and 4 structures, and in vic (YD 257658) destroying 4 bunkers and 2 structures.

07 April: At 0300H, radar at C-4 detected 25 to 30 figures moving from south to north in vic (YD 288727). 4.2 mortar mission fired. Area checked at first light and numerous foot prints, 1 M-26 grenade, 1 pair cenvas shoes, and 1 pack of Vietnamese cigarettes were found. Detween 0700H and 0800H, E/2/4 sweeping homlet of VINH QUAN THUONG (YD 252659) to (YD 270660) found 65 to 75 freshly dug fighting holes, 75 bunkers, assorted WVA 782 gear, and 2 WVA KIA in recent graves. All positions were destroyed and gear forwarded to S-2 of 3d Marines. At 1015H, E/2/4 questioned a young Vietnamese boy in hamlet of KY LAM (YD 245670). Boy stated that 2 companies of MVA/VC wearing blue shirts had left hamlet 2 days ago heading north. At 1310H, a patrol from A/1/3 tripped a surprise firing device in vic (YD 334627) sustaining 2 WIA (MEDEVAC). While searching area, patrol found an additional surprise firing dovice and destroyed it in place. At 1315H, G/2/4 in vic (YD 266698) received sniper fire from vic (YD 273697). Fired arty mission on enemy with unknown results. At 1500H, G/2/4 observed 3 NYA in vic (YD 270697). Marine sniper fired and hit 1, and arty mission was adjusted on enemy. Patrol could not check erea due to stream. NVA shot by sniper not carried as NVA KIA. At 1815H, A/1/3 in vic (YD 337628) received 40 rounds of S/A fire from vic (YD 342634). At 1830, they received 40 more rounds of S/A fire. Fire was returned with M-60 MG and 60mm mortar missions. AO checked area and spotted fighting holes in vic (YD 342634) and (YD 340634) but saw no evidence of enomy casualties.

08 April: At 0815H, E/2/4 in vic (YD 250660) found 2 60mm rounds, 2 CHICOM grenades, and assorted small arms ammo. Ordnance forwarded to 3d Marinon 12-2. At 0830M, A/1/3 detained 1 female VC suspect who was wife of confirmed VC and forwarded her to province headquarters. At 1150H, engineer attached to E/2/4 received shrapnel wounds while blowing ordnance and a bunker in vic (YD 266648). Engineer was medevaced. At 1345H, E/2/4 received 2 rounds of incoming arty in vic (YD 265628) and sustained 1 WIA (MEDEVAC) and 2 WIA (MINOR). At 1810H, A/1/3 in vic (YD 335628) received MG fire and 15 - 20 60mm mortar rounds. Fired arty mission with unknown results.

09 April: While conducting search and destroy operation in vic (YD 28276h) in the early morning, B/1/3 found the following: 17 82mm rounds, 18 60mm rounds, 1 AT mine, 1 CHICOM grenade and assorted NVA 782 gear. At 1700H, in the same area they found 14 U. S. CS grenades, 3 CHICOM grenades, 16 60mm rounds, 19 82mm rounds, 11 cans of increments, 42 82mm fuses, h AM mines, 3000 7.62mm rounds, and assorted NVA 782 gear. All gear and ordnance forwarded to 3d Marines. At 2355H, E/2/h observed 6-7 figures in vic (YD 279671) moving toward their position. E Co engaged enemy with small arms and M-79 fire, searched area at first light, but found no evidence of enemy casualties.

Enclosure (1)

10 April: All units conducted routine day and night activities. At 2245H, PF patrol in vic (YD 340677) made small arms contact with estimated squad of VC. Contact was broken and no casualties sustained.

11 April: At COOCH, CAMP KISTLER received approx 110 rounds of incoming arty. Counter battery fires called in on grids (ND 253854), (ND 293754), and (ND 235845) and TPQ'S dropped on (ND 236828) and (ND 227835). Incoming stopped at OllyH resulting in no friendly casualties and slight damage to facilities. During the day, A/1/3 swept to hamlet of LE XUYEN (ND 345633) without incident.

12 April: At 11304, A/1/3 received 7 rounds of M-79 fire from vic (MD 346623) sustaining no casualties. A company swept area finding 2 M-79 round cases and foot prints. During the day, H/2/4 conducted company size sweep to hamlet of MM IAM in vic (MD 245668) without incident. At 1730H, A/1/3 in vic (MD 345630)-received approx 20 rounds small arms fire and 1 AFG round sustaining no casualties. Arty missions fired on suspected enemy positions.

13 April: BLT 2/4 (-) (Reinf) commenced 3 day training program with PF platoons from GIO LINH District Headquarters. At 0825H, A/1/3 in vic (YD 348627) received 3 rounds of M-79 fire from vic (YD 348630) sustaining 1 WIA (WINOR). A company returned fire with small arms and 60mm Portars with unknown results. At 0830H, H/2/4 patrol in vic (YD 255658) found following ordnance: 3 RPG rounds with boosters, 2 boxes of .50 caliber rounds, 2 82mm rounds, and 2 60mm rounds. All ordnance forwarded to 3d Marines S-2. Later in afternoon, H Co found 1 82mm round and 2 CHICOM claymores in vic (YD 265650). At 1335H, G/2/4 in vic (YD 268679) found 13 60mm rounds, 2 CHICOM grenades, 1 AK-47 magazine, and assorted papers. Ordnance and papers forwarded to 3d Marines S-2. At 1440H, A/1/3 patrol in vic (YD 346626) received small arms and M-79 fire and returned small arm fire with unknown results.

The April: Commencing at Oh3OH, B Co 1st Amtrac on and ho Vietnameso from the junk base cordoned and searched resettlement hamlet in vic (YD 327697), detained 20 civilians, releasing all of them as innocent civilians, and captured 2 VC POW's. At 1015H, Marine from F/2/h in vic (YD 305680) stepped in PUNJI PIT and was MEDEVACED.

15 April: At 0001H, G and E/2/4 commenced move to hamlets of LAM XUAM (YD 267698) and WHI HA (YD 270708), respectively.

By 0458H, both hamlets were secured and G and E/2/4 commenced setting up of patrol base sites in hamlets. Between 0900H and 1055H, E/2/4 found Lrigged CHICON claymore and enough old, cooked rice in straw baskets to feed estimated 100 people. Rico and mino were destroyed. At 1000H, 6/2/4 patrol was led to 35 pound AT mine by civilian. Paid civilian 200 plasters reward. At 1130H, A/1/3 received approx 10-15 rounds small arm fire from vic (YD 343626) sustaining no casualties. 60mm Mortars and arty mission fired and area checked with no evidence of enemy essualties. At 1145H, civilians turned over complete CHICOM Mortar to H/2/4. Civilians were paid 5,000 piesters reward. At 1215H, E/2/h in vic (YD 28370h) found 2 82mm rounds, 1 57mm recoilless rifle round, and 3 CHICOM gronades. Grenades were destroyed and other ordnance forwarded to 3d Marines S-2. At 14004, A/1/3, in vic (YD 350627) detonated surprise firing device resulting in 1 WIA (MEDEVAC). HELO evacuating WIA drew ground fire and 1 60mm round, but no additional casualties were sustained. A/1/3 returned fire with all organic weapons with unknown results. At 1500H; E/2/4 in vic (YD 205672) found 1 badly decomposed NVA body. At 1730H, G/2/4 in vic (YD 265700) found 10 60mm rounds, 7 RPG rounds, 7 recoilless rifle rounds, 1 box 7.62mm ammo, 1 CHICOM grenade, and assorted NVA 782 gear. All ordnence and gear forwarded to 3d Marines S-2.

16 April: At 1655H, G/2/h in vic (YD 256701) and (YD 267699) found 92 60mm rounds, 4 RPG rounds, assorted fuses and boosters for 60mm Mortars, 12 82mm rounds, 5 CHICOM granades, 3 RPG boosters, 1 belt of .50 caliber ammo, and assorted NVA 782 gear. All ordnance and gear forwarded to 3d Marines S-2.

17 April: At Ol40H, G/2/4 received 1 round of small arms fire from vic (YD 250701) and returned fire with small arms. Searched area at first light and found blood trail, 1 AK-47 rifle, and 1 bear of canvan shoos.

Rifle forwarded to 3d Marines S-2. At 0936H, A/1/3 came into contact with well dug in unknown size enemy force in vic (YD 352619). A company received permission to engage onemy out of 3d Marines AO and called in arty missions and air strikes on enemy positions. A company continued contact with enemy throughout the day and early evening, consolidating in defensive position during the night. At 1000H, E/2/4 in vic (YD 266650) found 18 82mm rounds, 1 box of fuses, 1 CHICOM claymore, and 2 75mm recoilless rifle rounds which were forwarded to 3d Marines S-2. At 1215H, VN children turned in 1 M-16 rifle, 2 smoke grenades, and 1 belt of linked M-60 MG amme to BLT 2/4 but left area before reward could be paid.

At 1230H, E/2/4 in vic (YD 270705) found 7 RPG rounds with boosters, 11 60mm and 2 82mm rounds, and assorted 782 goar and ID cards. Ordnance and gear forwarded to 3d Marines S-2. At 2320H, A/1/3 in vic (YD 352619) received 2 rounds of 82mm Mortar. LP observed flashes, engaged enemy, and suffered 1 USMC KIA. Casualty figures for A company action on 17 April were 3 KIA, 14 WIA (MEDEVAC), and 7 WIA (MINOR). At this time enemy casualty figures were unknown.

18 April: At 0830H, D/1/3 relieved B/1/3 on station at C-11. 1st Amtrac Bn assumed OPCON of D Co and 1/3 assumed OPCON of B Co. At OBLIGH, E/2/4 found and destroyed in place 1 AP mine in vic (MD 283710). At 0915H, civilian turned 1 M-26 granade into E/2/4 and was paid 100 plasters reward. At 10104, D/1/3 reported that skimmer boat swamped in CUA VIET River in vic (YD 289655) resulting in 2 NBC (willed). Investigation mounted and search conducted for 2 NBC's. At 1200H, A/1/3 completed sweep of area of contact on 17 April finding: 200 AK-47 rounds, 2 RPG-2 rounds and 1 booster, 20 nounds of rice, assorted NVA 782 gear and documents, and 17 MVA KIA. Fixed wing BDA accounted for h secondary fires, 3 secondary explosions, 22 structures destroyed, and at least I of 17 NVA KIA. It is believed that enemy losses were much higher than indicated by body count. A/1/3 after sweeping area returned to 3rd Marines AO. At 1730H, D/1/3 plateon found 1 badly decomposed VN body and 1 unserviceable M-16 rifle (#639810), in vic (YD 2967以上). VN not carried in our totels.

19 April: At 1055H, A/1/3 patrol with PF forces in vic (YD 335627) activated surpriso firing device resulting in 1 USMC WIA (MEDEVAC), 4 PF WIA (MEDEVAC), and 1 National Policeman WIA (MEDEVAC). A 1500H, G/2/4 patrol in vic (YD 264687) found 1 CHICOM 60mm mortar, 6 60mm mortar rounds, 2 8PG-2 rounds, and 1 CHICOM grenado. All items forwarded to 3d Marines S-2. At 1630H, G/2/4 in vic (YD 270705) found 2 cases of 12.7mm rounds, 2 CHICOM grenados, and 1 belt of linked 7.62mm ammo. Ordnance forwarded to 3d Marines S-2. At 1800H, E/2/4 in vic (YD 265706) destroyed 25 bunkers, 3 of which were concrete, and 13 spider holes. E company also found 1 box of 12.7mm ammo and 2 CHICOM grenades. Ordnance forwarded to 3d Marines S-2. At 1800H, A/1/3 in vic (YD 346628) received 3 rounds of 60mm mortar fire when hele came down to pick up NBC. A company fired on suspected enemy in vic (YD 347623) with organic weapons. No casualties sustained. At 2315H, PF's in vic (YD 321672) came in contact with unknown size NVA/VC force in Sampan. Searched area at first light and found burnt out Sampan, 2 AK-47 mazazines, and 1 block of C-4.

20 April: At 0900H, LVT from 1st Amtrac Bn detonated what was believed to be homemade 100 pound mine in vic (YD 367673) resulting in 3 WIA (MEDEVAC). Vehicle was retrieved and found to be unsalvageable. During day, D/1/3 conducted sweep to HA LOI TRUNG (YD 282762) without incident. E/2/4 operating in NHI HA (YD 268704) found and destroyed 33 bunkers and 1 spidor hole.

21 April: At 0100H, A/1/3 received 2 rounds of M-79 fire from unknown location but sustained no casualties. At river assault . patrol craft picked up 2 USMC NBC that were lost in skimmer boat swamping on 18 April. Bodies found in vic (YD 299671) and (YD 304676). At 1030H, VN civilian led G/2/4 patrol to enemy ordnance in vic (YD 256697). Patrol dostroyed 7 RPG rounds, 1 rifle grenade, 2 CHICOM grendes, 5 60mm and 4 82mm mortar rounds, 2 AT minos, BA-40 batteries, and 18 bunkers. Civilian was paid 1500 piasters roward. 1435H, B Co 1st Amtrac Bn patrol in vic (YD 336665) received 2 rounds of small arms fire. Patrol checked suspected enemy position and detained two draft age males carrying 2 M-26 grenades. Civilians were interrogated and released as innocent civilians on 23 April. At 2345H, G/2/4 squad ambush in vic (YD 250716) made contact with lead elements of 100 - 200 NVA sustaining 1 WIA (MEDEVAC) ambush consolidated with 2 other ambushes in vic (YD 257708) but made no further contact. Area of contact was searched at first light and 3 NVA, 1 claymore mine, 1 RPG round rigged as surprise firing device, and blood and drag marks were found.

22 April: At 0855H, E/2/4 in vic (YD 291724) found 3 decomposed NVA bodies. At 0930H, G/2/4 in vic (YD 250712) found 35 82mm mortar rounds. Rounds forwarded to BLT 2/4 (-) (Reinf) S-2. At 1045H, H/2/4 in vic (YD 270664) found 11 75mm recoilless rifle rounds, 2 boxes of 7.62mm ammo, 1 CHICOM grenade, and assorted documents. Ordnance and documents forwarded to 3d Marines S-2. At 2210H, G/2/4 patrol in vic (YD 262688) ambushed 12 NVA. Fnomy broke contact and fled to the north. Scarched area at first light with negative result. Beginning at 2323H, CAMP KISTLER received between 40 and 45 rounds of light arty sustaining 4 USN WIA (MEDEVAC), not carried in our totals, and 3 USMC WIA (MINOR). Arty and NGF missions were fired on suspected grids and TPQ's were requested.

23 April: At 0300H, F/2/4 ambush in vic (YD 318718) ambushed 5 to 6 NVA/VC moving toward their position. Checked area at first light with negative results. At 1130H, G/2/4 conducting sweep to LAI AN (YD 247735) with plateon of ARVN's discovered 2 AT mines in vic (YD 249717) and destroyed them in place.

24 April: At 00158, E/2/h defected movement in front of regimeter in vic (NO 270705) and fired on suspected enemy with small arms. Area was checked at first light and I WYA EIA, 1 AK-47, h AK-47 magazines, 2 CHICOM grenades, blood, and drag marks were found. At 0630%, 1/3 becan planned oreration with 1st ARV rest by moving D/1/3 from C-b nosition to blocking rosition in vic (MD 302610) to (MD 37)4617). D company was in position at 1000H. B/1/3 was in blocking positions at 0930H in vic (YD 350632) to (YD 346628) and (12) 31,0626) to (32) 333629). At 1025%, preparation on LZ centered (32) 393587) was completed and 0/1/3 commenced helo assault to that position. By 1105H, C/1/3 was on the ground sweeping northwest toward B and D company blocks. 1st ARVN'S occupied positions to the south and west of C/1/3. During the course of the day C company swept to (MD 375598), destroying numerous enemy positions, questioning over 200 civilians, and clearing the area. No enemy registance was met although numérous enemy surprise firing devices were encountered by 1/3. C/1/3 found 1 NVA body which was killed by arty. 1/3 sustained h WIA (MEDEVAC) due to surprise firing devices. Detween 0900 and 1620H, engineers with E/2/h in vic (YD) 272703) destroyed 42 bunkers. At 1730H, G/2/4 in vic (YD 262720) found and destroyed 27 60mm mortar rounds and 3 cans of increments. 1 140mm rockets was also found and forwarded to 3d Marines S-2. At 2111H, C/1/3 LP made contact with satisated 20 enemy in vic (MD 372602) and received 1 CUICOM exemado and 2 60 m morter rounds resulting in 1 WIA (MINOR). Checked area at first light with negative results. From 2317H to 2355H, CAMP NISPLER received 75 rounds of light grty resulting in IKLA and 3 WIA (MEDEVAC). Cosualties were Mayy personnel and not carried in 3d Marines cumulative totals.

25 April: At 003/H, Marine W-3/H Helo attempting to lend to evacute Nevy casualties at WSAD rame crashed resulting in 2 MBC (DEAD) and 1 MBC (MDEVAC). Casualties not carried in 3d Marines cumulative totals. At 01004, 8/2/h natrol ambushed 12-15 FVA in vic (MD 2636/H). 60mm morter and arty missions were fired on enemy positions after patrol with drew to company perimeter. Checked area at first light finding 1 EVA ETA, 1 AK-17, and blood trails and drag marks heading south. At 0100H, G/2/h ambush in vic (MD 250697) engaged unknown size enemy force resulting in 1 FVA ETA. Searched area at first light and found 1 AK-17. At 0700H, C/1/3 began sweeping northwest toward B and D company blocking positions. At 0930H, G2/h in vic (YD 268697) found 5 82mm wowter rounds 1 57mm recoilles rifle round, and assorted

documents and forwarded them to 3d Marines S-2. At 1000H, E/2/4 in vic (YD 252718) destroyed 25 bunkers. At 1015H, B/1/3 observed 6 NVA/VC in vic (YD 256612) and took them under fire with small arms and arty missions. Results were unknown. At 1100H, C/1/3 found civilians in vic (YD 373595) burying 2 NVA bodies. NVA were killed by arty. At 1325H, E/2/4 in vic (YD 280713) found 12 82mm mortar rounds and 6 CHICOM grenades. Ordnance was forwarded to 3d Marines S-2. At 1545H, B/1/3 observed 6 NVA/VC in vic (YD 348612) and fired arty mission on them with unknown results. At 1700H, C/1/3 found 1 SKS rifle, 1 loudspeaker, and 1 claymore type mine. Items were forwarded to 1/3 S-2. During the day C/1/3 collected and sent to TRIEU PHONG District HQ a total of 22,700 pounds of rice. In the late afternoon, C/1/3 consolidated and formed a defensive perimeter in vic (YD 373603). At 2130H, C/1/3 received 2 incoming grenades in their perimeter and fired small arms on suspected enemy positions. Checked area at first light with negative results. At 2130H, F/2/4 LP observed 20-30 NVA in vic (YD 305680). LP withdrew to perimeter and arty mission was fired on enemy. Area was checked at first light with negative results. At 1735 C/1/3 (YD 375597) captured RPD MG.

26 April: At ph25E, C/1/3 in vic (YD 368608) observed 15 rounds of 60mm mortar impact outside of their perimeter. No casualties were sustained. At 0850H, C/1/3 in vic (YD 375600) activated a 105mm round ringed as a surprise firing device resulting in 1 WIA, (MEDEVAC). 3 rigged CHICOM grandes were found and destroyed in place. At 1000H, C/1/3 in vic (YD 37260h) activated a 105mm round rigged as a surprise firing device resulting in 1 WIA (MEDEVAC). 4 more rigged 105mm rounds and 1 75mm round were found and destroyed in place. At 0915H, H/2/4 in vic (YD 254648) found 4 CHICOM grandes, 2 NVA grande pouches, 150 rounds of 7.62mm ammo, and 1 U.S. cartridge belt. All ordnance destroyed and gear was forwarded to 2/4 S-2. At 1100H, D/1/3 in vic (YD 378594) found 1 60mm mortar, 1 AK-50, and 1 U.S. M-1 rifle and forwarded them to 3d Marines S-2. At 1515H, C/1/3 linked up with D/1/3 sweeping northwest found 6000 pounds of rice in vic (YD 358601). Rice was sent to TRIEU PEONG District HQ's via helo.

27 April: At 0725H, E/2/h in vic (YD 268703) received l round of incoming enemy arty from unknown direction resulting in 2 KIA and 3 WIA (MEDEVAC). At 0800H, C/1/3 in vic (YD 345609) and (YD 360610) found 3900 and 2200 pounds of rice; respectively. Rice was sent to TRIEU PHONG District HQ's by helo. At 1115H,

D/1/3 in vic (YD 352623) tripped 2 homemade surprise firing devices resulting in 2 WIA (MEDEVAC). 2 more surprise firing devices were found in the same area and destroyed in place. At 1330H, C/1/3 in vic (YD 350617) found 8 NVA KBA from A/1/3 contact on 17 April. At 1500H, G/2/4 in vic (YD 249720) received 19 rounds of 85mm arty resulting in 2 WIA (MINOR). A0 on station checked suspected gun positions with negative results. By 1800H, G and F/2/4 had moved into positions in vic (YD 248721) and (YD 279719), respectively, to support E/2/4 night attack at 280500H, on hamlet in vic (YD 260737). At 2215H, G/2/4 in vic (YD 249721) moving into blocking positions to support E/2/4 came in contact with an unknown size enemy force. B company consolidated, withdrew to vic (YD 252713), and set up a perimeter. 1 KIA, 10 WIA (MEDEVAC), and 2 WIA (MINOR) were sustained.

28 April: At 0105H, helo evacuating G/2/4 casualties was hit by ground fire. Helo landed safely at 3d Marines LZ at-CAMP KISTLER and WIA's were evacuated from there. At 0248H, PPS-5 radar at C-4 detected 2 groups of figures in vic (YD 302719) and (YD 295716) moving horthwest. 60mm mortar mission was fired with unknown results. At 0500H, E/2/4 made scheduled night attack on hamlet in vic (YD 260737) meeting no resistance. E company crossed to the west side of JONES CREEK. At 0705H, E/2/4 swept the area of G/2/4 contact the previous night finding 10 NVA KIA, 2 AK-47's, 4 AK-47 magazines, 4 CHICOM grenades, assorted NVA 782 gear, and 1 wounded NVA POW. was evacuated but was dead on arrival at D-MED. At 0730H, E/2/4 in vic (YD 254707) received 32 rounds of light arty fire and sustained 1 WIA (MEDEVAC). AO on station diverted TPQ strikes to 6-8 gun positions at (YD 22958237). 7 secondary explosions and 2 fires were observed. At 2130H, F/2/4 observed movement in front of lines in vic (YD 281669). F/2/4 company fired small arms and threw 1 WP grenade. Checked area at first light with negative results. At 2145H, H/2/4 LP in vic (YD 266649) observed 4-5 figures moving southwest into hamlet in vic (YD 257646), fired 60mm mortar mission. Observed figures again moving south away from hamlet and fired another 60mm mortar mission. Checked area at first light with unknown results.

29 April: At Oll5H, E/2/4 in vic (YD 282719) observed 3 figures moving toward their perimeter and fired small arms at them. Checked area at first light with negative results. At Oll5H, PPS-5 radar at C-4 spotted 5-8 figures moving north in vic (YD 286732). Arty mission was fired with good coverage. Area was checked at first light with negative results. At O545H, E/2/4 observed movement in vic (YD 268704) and fired small arms at suspected enemy. Checked area at first light

with nogative results. At 1025H, B/1/3 received 30 to 40 rounds of small arms fire from vic (YD 341625). Small arms fire was returned and arty mission fired on enemy. Checked area with negative results. During the afternoon 4 tanks were extracted from A-1 with elements of F/2/4 providing security. Tanks were delivered to north bank of CUA VIET for transhipment to HUE. F/2/4 destroyed 2 AT mines while providing security. At 1610H, H/2/4 patrol in vic (YD 252643) received 9 rounds of unknown size arty resulting in 1 WIA (MEDEVAC). At 1715H, OPCON of E/2/4 was passed to 3d MarDiv. At 2018H, A-1 reported to BLT 2/4 that an estimated 25 NVA/VC were moving south in vic (YD 255745). Arty mission was fired with unknown results. At 2045H, G/2/4 LP heard movement of approximately 2 HVA/VC in vic (YD 261706). Fired 81mm mission on enemy. Checked area at first light and found blood pools.

30 April: At Oli5H, PPS-5 rader at C-L detected 8-10 figures in vic (YD 288732). Arty mission was fired with unknown results. Area was checked at first light with negative results. At OlihOH, river assault group patrol boat received small arms fire from vic (YD 258622). 2nd ARVN regt. was notified and craft was undemaged. At 0830H, NSAD's LCU boats 1477 and 1485 in vic (YD 268638) received small arms and RPG fire from the north bank of the river resulting in 3 USN KIA and 5 USN WIA (MEDEVAC). Craft returned to NSAD ramp.

At this time 3d Marines sent a patrol from H/2/4 to check the area of the 2 incidents on the river. The patrol came in contact with an estimated company of dug in NVA in vic (YD 261623). This contact developed into a contact of major significance which is still going on at the time of this writing and will be covered in the Command Chronology for the month of May.

At 1145H, G/2/4 in vic (YD 269697) found 5 RPG rounds, 2 82mm mortar rounds, 15 CHICOM grenades, 4 75mm rounds, 3 M-79 rounds, and assorted other ordnance. All items forwarded to 3d Marines S-2.

# B. Significent Overstions Conducted.

#### 1. Mone

While there were no operations conducted which were significant either in scope or seriousness of contact, one operation is worthy of special note. From 24-27 April, 1/3 conducted an operation in coordination with the 1st ARVN Regt. Commencing with a thoroughly professional helo assault by one reinforced rifle company, the operation continued for four daws with only slight contact. The significant results were the destruction of several VC harbor areas and the confiscation of 34,800 lbs of rice. The rice was delivered to the TRIEU PROMS District Readquarters.

- (3) At O81130H April 1968, Third Marines assumed OPCON of B/1/3 from 5th Armored Cavalry. Third Marines message 091341Z April 1968 refers.

G. <u>Fourpment</u>. Allowancesoof T/E equipment supporting Headquarters, Third Marines were considered adequate. No recommendations for modification of allowances were received during this period.

#### H. Logistics

1. General. The Regimental Commander as Installation Coordinator continued to direct and coordinate logistical activities within the Cua Viet Waterway Area.

## 2. Supply

### (a) Source

- (1) A Regimental Supply Distribution Point (SDP) was established at the mouth of the Cua Viet River. The SDP maintained stocks of Class I and V supplies for all Marine units within the Regimental AO. Supplies were shipped directly to Cua Viet from Danang, considerably reducing transportation, handling and accounting. Initially, some problems were encountered in submitting resupply requests. These problems were reselved.
- (2) FLSG-B, Dong Ha, continued to be the primary supply source for all classes of supply less I and V. Backup support for I and V items not delivered directly to SUP One View, was provided by FLSG-B.

# (b) Class In Butistackory

- (c) Glass II Glass II supply support was adequate. Some shortages exist, primarily in repair parts for Motor Transport and Communications - Klastronics equipment.
- (d) Class III. Generally satisfactory. Ten and thirty weight oil remain difficult to obtain.
  - (e) Class IV. Satisfactory
  - (f) Class V. Satisfactory
- 3. Evacuation and Hospitalization. Routine medical treatment was provided by the Regimental Aid Station. More serious cases were evacuated to D Company, Third Medical Battalion, Dong Ha.

## 4. Transportation

(a) Water Transportation.

- (1) LCM-8. Third Marines controlled one LCM-8. daily to accomplish resupply and movement of troops and equipment.
- (2) Skimmer/Fire Team Assault Boats. Third Marines employed five commercial Ski barges and three of the newly developed Fire Team Assault boats for logistical resupply, troop movements and administrative travel between units.
- (b) Motor Transport. Motor Transport Section, Headquarters Company provided land transportation for administrative use. Eight 2 1/2 ton carge trucks from ELT 2/4 were utilized in general support. An otter platoon (-) from H&S Company, Third Motor Transport Bn, under operational control of this Headquarters, was deployed with the battalions in the field to provide vehicular support in marginal terrain. The M76 otter was extremely effective in effecting internal distribution of supplies and medical evacuation of casualties.

### 5. Service

## (a) Function

- (1) Construction. A 650' section of beach road matting was laid in an attempt to reduce wear and tear on vehicles caused by the sandy terrain. This matting was effective and additional matting requested. Plans for a complete road network in the Cua Vist area utilizing M8A! Airfield matting were initiated.
- (2) Maintenance. Maintenance was hampered by difficulty in obtaining some second echelon parts. The sandy terrain in the Cua Viet area continued to cause maintenance problems with wheeled vehicles.
- (3) Laundry. Government facilities for laundering of clothing were not utilized. Laundry was sent to a Vietnamese civiliah establishment in Dong Ha. Service was adequate.
- (4) Sanitation. The insect problem was greatly reduced through spraying, covering over the old dump, and increased control over trash and garbage disposal. The new trash and garbage dump operated efficiently.
- 6. Assignment of Responsibilities. B Company, Third Engineer Battalion was in direct support of this Headquarters during the period and provided effective combat and logistical support.

## I. Civic Action

- (1) Significant Activities
  - (a) 1-10 April
- (1) 2/1 began a civil affairs program with a MEDCAP program.
  - (b) 11-30 April
  - (1) 1st Amtrac set up scheduled MEDCAP/DENTCAPS three times a week to the refugee island and PHO HOL-RA TAY hamlets.
  - (2) A well in GIAO LIEM was repaired with the combined efforts of 1/3 and the people of the hamlet.
  - (3) Two solatium payments were made, 16 April involving loss of property (YD 309655), and 20 April involving serious injury to a young boy (YD 303685).
  - (4) A small scale sandbag filling program was initiated by 1st Amtracs, payment being food.
    - (2) Materials Distributed
  - (a) During the month in conjunction with the MEDCAPS 2015 pounds of food, 44 pounds of clothing, and 145 pounds of soap were distributed. In addition several boxes of miscellaneous items school supplies, hygiene items, toys were distributed.
    - (3) Special Civil Affairs Projects
  - (a) 1/3 is working on improving a school located in GIAO LIEM. 2/4 has begun some informal english classes in a hamlet (YD 252644).
    - (4) Apparent Results of Civil Affairs Program
  - (a) The civilians continue to outwardly manifest friendliness to the units near them. In 2/4 area a boy turned in an M-16 rifle. A fisherman turned into Junk Base a crewserved weapon he found in the river. In both cases neither person sought a reward.

## K. Personnel

- (1) Gains. During this period 16 Marine Officers and 354 Marine enlisted replacements were received. 1 Naval Officer and 21 Naval enlisted were received.
- (2) Losses. The 3d Marine Regiment sustained 15 KIA 102 WIA and 66 non-battle casualties. There was 15 Marine Officers and 343 Marine enlisted and 1 Naval Officer and 14 Naval enlisted transferred. The figures listed are computed for HqCo, 3d Marine Regiment, 1/3, BLT 2/4, and 1stAmTracBn for the reporting period they were OPCON to 3d Marine Regiment.
- (3) Emergency Leave/Humanitarian Transfer. There was 20 enlisted Marines ordered to CONUS in connection with energency Leave.
  - (4) Administrative Discharges. None
- (5) R & R/TAD Trips. Out of country R & R trips were afforded to 261 members of the Regiment. There were 21 in country quotas used.

## L. INTELLIGENCE

- 1. Significant Events Activity was at a moderate level during most of the reporting period but increased sharply at the end of the month. The enemy attacked friendly troops and installations by fire.
- a. There were several friendly operations in the northern portion of the AO with little enemy contact. It is probable that the enemy forces encountered were of company strength. However, many contacts and sightings were made with enemy groups. It appears that the enemy was attempting to re-enter the area. Numerous bunkers were destroyed in the Nhi Ha area YD282706. Civilians were returning to this area andthere were several examples of civilians volunteering information and turning equipment in to friendly forces.
- b. The river was relatively quiet with a few mining incidents; however, indications are that the enemy places high priority on interdiction of the Cua Viet River.
- c. The AO south of the river was fairly quiet with one contact with an estimated company size enemy forces in the vicinity of YD350617. There were numerous sniping incidents and the enemy made extensive use of surprise explosive devices. Agent reports point to NVA/VC attempts to convert the people and to collect rice.
- d. The enemy used supporting arms to attack friendly troops and positions. Gamp Kistler was hit by artillery on 3, 11, 22, & 24 April from positions in or north of the DMZ.
- e. The village of Dai Do(YD2563) was the scene of heavy contact between friendly forces and an estimated Regiment. The enemy showed no inclination to disengage and, in fact, reinforced his units in contact. The contact was continuing at the end of the reporting period.
- f. At Dai Do confirmed contact was made with the 6thBn, 52nd NVA Regiment and the 2ndBn, 48th NVA Regiment. This contact is continuing and further information will be available. Possible contact was made with units of the K400 LF Company and the 808th NVA Bn, 5thBn, of the 52ndNVA Regiment. Both agent reports and evert enemy action, indicate an increase in enemy activity within the Third Marines AO.
- g. Large amounts of enemy ordnance and equipment were captured by friendly forces. This included numerous rockets, mortar rounds, error served and individual weapons, ammo, 782 gear and miscollaneous equipment. In the southern part of the AO over 35,000 pounds of rice were captured.

## M. Communications

## (1) General

- (a) During the month of April, communications were established and maintained in support of the Third Marine Regiment.
- (b) During this period of time, the Regimental repair shop received 105 pieces of communications equipment for repair. Of these, 137 were repaired by the Reignental tech ship and 48 were evacuated to higher echelon for repair.

During April 1968, Third Marine controllers provided a total of 1,391 individual control functions. The lowest day in traffic occurred 11 April with only 13 functions. The high day was 30 April with a total of 87. Such was indicative of an increased tempo in operations within Third Marines A0 as the month drew to a close. The average daily number of control function for the month was 46.3.

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#### R. Psychological Operations

(1) During the month of April, Third Marines employed two armed propaganda teams. One four man team worked with BLT 2/4 on south and destroy operations and company sweeps. The other four man team was utilized by the 1st Amtrac Bn for MEDCAPS and patrols to villages and hamlets in their AO. Reports from the using units indicated the APT's worked well in their attempts to gain the support of the populace.

A two man loudspeaker (HB) team was employed with BLT 2/4 but due to technical difficulties with the loudspeaker equipment the team was unable to broadcast more than fifteen minutes of CHIEU HOI appeals.

A "bullhorn" was requested and received from Division PSY-OPS. Presently the bullhorn is signed out to BLT 2/4 for their upcoming joint operations with ARVN forces. It should prove effective in broadcasting surrender appeals and in issuing instructors to the local Vietnamese populace.

A number of aerial loudspeaker missions and leaflet drops were requested in the NAPOLEON/SALINE AO. Target areas consisted of known and suspected enemy locations and civilian population centers. Surrender and CHIEU HOI appeals were directed at NVA/VC targets. Themes directed at civilians included the rewards program, exploitation of recent enemy defeats and support the GVN appeals. Also about 3000 copies of the "Free South" newspaper were distributed to the local Vietnamese. Articles in the newspaper exploited the victories of the GVN in the "TET" offensive.

Third Marines continued to employ 8 KIT CARSON Scouts with 1/3 and 1st Amtrac Bn. Roports on these scouts continued to be favorable.

#### S. Training

(1) Objective. To maintain and improve the high state of combat efficiency of the regiment, training was conducted on a formal and individual basis.

#### (2) Highlights

- (a) One corporal attended a KY-28/38 maintenance course at Da Nang.
- (b) One corporal attended a basic organic supply accounting course at DANANG on a Force Level.
- (c) A one day personal response course was conducted on a Division Level at QUANG TRI. The Regimental Headquarters was represented by the Regimental Sergant Major.
- (d) A one week course in Fire Team assault boat training was conducted at CUA VIET. A total of 28 Marines attended.

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
