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

MARRACIVE SUMMARY

3d Marine Rogt commenced the month of May with BLT 2/4 (-) (Rein) in a major conflict with FVA forces in the DAI DO hamlet complex WD 253628. This conflict will be elaborated on under "SIGHIFICANT OPERATIONS COMDUCTED" of this Chronology. All other units were conducting search and destroy operation in their respective areas of operations.

ol May: At 1029H, AO called in arty mission on 20 NVA in vic MD 26770H. Results: 20 NVA KBA. At 1100H, elements of lat Amtrac Bn in vic MD 315689 apprehended 2 VN trying to soll marijuana to Marines. VN were classified as civil defendants and forwarded to 3d MarDiv. At 1722H, CAMP KISTLER received 11 rounds of light arty of which 6 were duds. Extensive damage was done to 1 LVT. At 1800M, 3d Marines assumed OPCON of 3d Bn. 21st Inf, 196 Light Inf Bde. At 2245M, B Co Amtrac Bn at C-4 observed 10 - 15 NVA/VC with NOD in vic MD 29869H and MD 314702. LVMH-6 mission fired with unknown results. At 2310M, CAMP KISTLER received 50 - 55 rounds of heavy arty. Results: 1 fuel line broken, 1 tropical but destroyed, 3 NSAD WIA (MED EVAC), 1 MSAD WIA (MINOR). Casualties not carried on 3d Marines totals. Counter battery missions fired with unknown results.

Missions to the north along JONES CREEK. While securing LAN XUAN (East) in vic YD 283668, 3/21 observed 1 secondary explosion from arty fire. LAN XUAN (East) was secured at 1055H. By 1200E, 3/21 secured LAN XUAN (East) was secured at 1055H. By 1200E, 3/21 secured LAN XUAN (West) in vic YD 266699 and moved to secure NRI HA in vic YD 260705 under heavy small arms and arty fire. By 1800H, half of WHI HA was secured and 3/21 consolidated into night positions. Results: 9 KIA, 12 WIA (NED EVAC), 3 WIA (MINOR), h MIA, and 19 NVA KIA. At 1402H, CAMP KISTLER received 5 - 10 rounds of 85mm to 100mm arty.

At 1535E, CTF CLEARWATER, after completion of mine sweep, opened the CUA VIET River for traffic. By 1800H, D/1/3 was relieved at C-4 by 8 Co Amtracs and moved to CAMP KISTLER for the night. At 2105H, river patrol craft in vic YD 255622 received mortar fire from vic YD 246629. Craft moved down river, but mortar fire from vic YD 246629. Craft moved down river, but mortar fire was adjusted on craft. Firing coased when craft reached vic YD 260630. Pegative casualties or damage sustained. At 2313H, CAMP KISTLER began receiving light to modium arty. Erty continued until 030105H. 25 rounds were received resulting in

negative capulties or damage. Counter battery missions fired with unknown results. At 2315H, river patrol craft observed 2 figures in vic YD 26653H, and engaged them with small arms. Results: unknown.

· 03 May: At 0028H, ARVE's at A-1, observed estimated NVA In moving south in vic XD 268725. Extensive arty missions fired, and at 0058, A-1 lost sight of enemy. At 08343, 3/21 found & MIA from action on 02 May. All MIA were KIA. During the morning 3/21 directed 6 air strikes and extensive arty missions on NHI HA. Resulting in 2 NVA KTA and destruction of 17 structures, 7 bunkers, 30 meters of tremchos, and 2 fighting holes. At 1100H, 3/21 commenced the attack on NUI HA. At 1135E, 3/21 began receiving incoming arty. Counter bettery missions were fired. Results: 10 WIA (MED EVAC), 2 WIA (MINOR). At 1715E, 1 F-6 and 1 T-4 aircraft in support of 3/21 were hit by ground fire. The F-6 crashed and burned in vic 3D 219716 and the Well returned to its base. Pilot of the F-8 died in the crash. At 1801H, AO (WELIX-1-5) searching for plot of downed F-8 spotted individual in 2672 grid signalling for pickup. C & C bolo was dispatched and picked up individual who was signalling. He was MVA CHIEU HOI. He was forwarded to 3d Marinos. From 1720H to 2018H, 3/21 mot strong resistance from MVA in MHI HA repolling 2 counter attacks. Sporadic arty and mortar fire was received by 3/21 during the attack. 3 air strikes were employed asainst the enemy and counter battery missions were fired. At 20168, 3/21 was no longer in contact and act in night perimeters. Results: 1 RIA, 7 WIA (MIFOR), 67 MVA KIA. At 21208, B and D/3/21 reported movement around their perimeter in vic YD 268699. 1 NVA walked into their perimeter to CHIEU HOI. He reported that he belonged to the 10th Co, 5th En, 23hth Div and left his unit 2 days ago after air strikes. He was forwarded to 3d Marinos on Oly May.

Oh May: At 02254, B co Amtrac En at C-h spotted 6 to 7

MVA hadding north in vie MD 297706. h.2 mortar mission fired.

Group moved to MD 298719 and another mission was fired with unknown results. At 0300%, river patrol craft received 7 to 8 rounds of unknown size and type in vie MD 2756h3. 1/3 was alerted and area kent under observation. Negative casualties or damage sustained. At 0155%, B co Amtrac En at C-h spotted h to 5 MVA in vie MD 30h72h. I round of 90mm beckive was fired. Area was checked at first light with negative results. At 0500%, river patrol craft received 2 rounds of unknown size and type in vie MD 2706h0. Negative esqualties or damage sustained. At 0936%, upon completion of h sir atribes and arty

prep. 0 and D/3/21 commonded the attack on NHI HA. At 1020H, C and D/3/21 came in heavy contact with NVA in fortified positions. Numerous air strikes and anty missions were directed on the enemy, and at 1930H, 3/21 was no longer in contact and was set in night positions. Results: 2 EIA, 11 WIA (NHO HVAC), 5 WIA (MINOR), 53 UVA EIA, and 3 IWC.

Of May: At O348H, C and D/3/21 in vic .MD 282705 received 10 to 15 rounds automatic wearons fire and several grandes. Small arms fire and prenades were returned. Results: 1 IWC. At O940H, C and D compenies, after 4 air strikes and numerous arty missions, commenced the attack on NHI HA meeting no resistance. At 1135H, NHI HA was secured. 3/21 found 64 NVA KIA (willed by supporting arms) and 11 IWC. During the day E/2/h performed retrieval operations in vic YD 254629 finding 1 barrel and sight for 12.7mm AA gun, 3 AK-47's, 1 CHICOM radio, 16 B-40 rounds, 31 RPG-2 rounds, 9 RPG-7 rounds, 5 82mm rounds, 56 60mm rounds, 7 AT mines, 1 CHICOM claymere, 63 CHICOM grandes. 16 penchoes, and 150 lbs of rice. All items forwarded to 3d Marines. At 1530H, 3d Marines assumed OPCON of I and M/3/h and passed OPCON to 1/3. At 1925H, sweep team from CMF CLEAR-WATER in vic YD 256625 found 1 B-40 launcher with 2 rounds and 2 impulse mines. Items turned ever to EOD personnel. At 2110H, CAMP KISTLER received 12 rounds of 65mm to 100mm arty demaging 2 huts and inflicting miner wounds on 2 FSAD personnel. Casulties not carried on 3d Marines totals. Counter battery missions fired on azimuths reported from C-h and CAMP KISTLER.

06 May: At 0150%, C/3/21 LP spotted 2 NVA with AK-17's moving toward their position in vic MD 266707. LP fired N-79 cammister killing 1 NVA. Other NVA returned fire with AK-177 and LP withdrew to friendly lines. At 0249H, CAMP KISTLER received 75 - 90 rounds of medium arty resulting in 2 NIA (MINOR). Counter battery missions fired in grids 2280, 2381, (MINOR). Counter battery missions fired in grids 2280, 2381, 2282, 2383, and 2179. At 0330H, C/3/h LP heard movement in vic MD 261720. Illumination revealled estimated 70 NVA. Arty missions were fired on enemy and all night activities were withdrawn. At 0110H, A and C/3/21 were probed by unknown size enemy force utilizing 60mm mertars, grenade launchers, and small arms. Arty missions and small arms fire were directed at the enemy, and at 0550H, centuat was broken. Results: 3 NVA XIA. At 0700H, while sweeping area of centact, A and C/3/21 made centact with unknown size force. Results: 1 WIA (MMD EVAC), 18 HVA KIA, 11 IWC, 5 CSWC, and asserted papers and decuments captured. At 1215H, CAMP KISTLER received 70 to 75 rounds of heavy arty. Results: 2 tropical hut destroyed, 2 others dewayed, 1 LVT, 1 tank, and 1 MSC-15 slightly damaged,

and was extracted for repairs. At 1818H, C/3/21 received herounds and B/3/21 received herounds of enemy arty. Negative casualties sustained. Counter battery missions fired with unknown results. At 1825H, A and C/3/21 observed 150 to 200 HVA moving north in vic YD 2557hh. From 1840H to 1940H, he batteries fired on enemy with VE, "FIRECRACKER," HE, and WP. 106cm recoilless rifles and 50 caliber MG's were also employed. Fo's oredited arty batteries with 70 MVA MIA. At 2045H, D/3/21 reported hearing tracked vehicle in vic MD 293696. D company later reported seeing 2 tanks, I moving north, I moving south, in same area. At 2058, D company reported seeing 3 tanks in vic MD 235715. At and "SPOOKE" checked area but could not confirm sightings.

of May: At ookou, M/2/h observed 2 figures through starlight coppe in vic XD 273685. 60mm morter mission was fixed and ... area checked at first light with negative results. At 1200M, A/3/21 on body recovery operations in vic ID 26714 recovered 11 MIA, All MIA were MIA. I MIA could not be located. At 1434E, 0/3/21 in vic MD 268700 received 10 rounds of medium enemy crty. NGF counter battery missions were fired. Result: 1 WIA (UMD EVAC). At 1530H, 3d Marines passes OPCON of I and IM/3/U to 3d MarDiv. At 1600H, 3d Marines passed OPCON of 1st In, 5th Cav, 1st Air Cav Div to 3d HarDiv. At 2030M, C/3/21 in vic MD 268703 observed 5 figures moving southeast 400 meters from their position. 82mm mortar mission fired and area checked. at first light with negative results. At 2130H, PPS-5 radar and MOD at C-4 detected 17 MVA in vic MD 293701 moving south. Many moved out of sight to the southwest before fire mission would be called on enemy. 3/21 was alerted and kept area under observation but observed no further movement. At 21/12, wives paimol craft observed 2 figures on river bank in vic TD 263628 and took them under fire small arms and m-79's. Figures drepped out of sight and were not observed again.

100 NVA in vic ND 25/685. Extensive arty missions were fired on enemy with unknown results. During the norming H/2/4 moved to vic ND 267649 and established company patrol base site, and 1/3 completed move from the north bank of the CUA VIET to the south bank in vic ND 293653 and began re-establishing positions. At 1030M, H/2/4 observed possible NVA FO team in payoda in vic ND 256639. Snipers fired 15 rounds at enemy. Patrol checked pagoda and found footprints leading northwest. At 1245M, N/2/4 patrol in vic ND 256669. Patrol roturned small arms fire and adjusted arty mission on NVA with unknown results.

From 1130H to 1530H, H/2/h in vic TD 218561 received 12 rounds of medium to heavy arty. Vegative easualties sustained. Counter battery missions fired on suspected enemy positions. At 1600%, F/2/4 patrol in vic ID 252659 spotted 20 to 25 HVA in vic TD 249662. Patrol engaged enemy with smell arms, m-79's. and arty. MVA fled to the northwest. At 1615E, the petrol received 75-80 rounds of medium enemy erty resulting in h WIA (MINOR). Counter battory missions fired. At 1700%, 3/3/21 elements in vic YD 268697 found 12 60mm rounds, 5 boxes 7.62mm ermo, AK-17 magazines, 6 CMICOM grenades, 9 57mm recoilless rifle rounds, assorted 82mm mortar fuzes and increments, and 1 can of unknown contents. All ordnance was destroyed except 2 boxes 7.62mm ammo, and the can of unknown contents. At 2105H, CAMP KISTLER received 17 rounds of light arty. Results: 2 WIA (MED EVAC), 2 WIA (MEMOR). Counter battery missions fired on Jun flashes observed by B Co Antrac In at C-h. At 2137H, PPS-5 radar and MOD at C-4 detected 20 MVA in vic MD 292713. 60mm mortar mission was fired on enemy. At 2201H, the MVA were again detected in vic MD 290701. Arty mission was adjusted on enemy with unknown results.

10 May: At COLLE, C/3/21 in vic YD 270705 observed estimated 300 NVA moving toward their position in vic TD 268707. company extracted all night activities. Arty missions were fired on the MVA and continuous illum was provded by arty and flareship throughout the night. At 0535H, C company began receiving enemy mortar and arty fire, and at 0558H A, B, and C/3/21 were under heavy ground attacks. Fixed wing air strikes, Mar, helo gunnhirs, arty, and an AO were utilized against the NVA, and at 0800H, contact was broken. Throughout the morning, A, S and C companies received sporadic enomy mortar and arty fire. Counter battery missions were fired. At 1015H, 3/21 began clearing the battle area meeting small pockets of resistance. At 1500H, 3/21 was no longer in contact. Results: 1 KIA, 2 WIA (MED EVAC), 1h WIA (MINOR), 1 tank knocked out; 159 KVA KIA, 2 HVA POW, 55 IWC, 18 CSWC. At 0030H, E/2/h observed 5 to 10 WVA in vic MD 253650. Arty mission fired on enemy and erea checked at first light with negative results. At 0540H, 2/h CP area in vic ND 200668 received 8 rounds of light arty sustaining no casualties, and at 0550H, CAMP KISTLER received 15 rounds of light arty sustaining no casualties. Counter bettery missions fired in vic YD 225825, 212865, and 228862. At 2020K, C/3/21 observed estimated 50 NVA in small groups in vic MD 27370k. Arty missions were fired on MVA with unknown results, and flareship provided illum. At 2055H, C company LP received 1 CHICOM grenade. IP returned fire with m-79 and 1 LAAW. Checked area and captured 1 IWC. At 2230H, B To Amtrac

Bn PPS-5 rader and NOD at C-4 observed 2 groups of 15 to 20 NVA each in vic YD 294703 and YD 281720. MGF missions adjusted on NVA with unknown results.

11 May: At Olli50, A/3/21 LP in vic YD 272669 observed h TVA. Arty mission was adjusted on enemy and area was checked resulting in 2 NVA KIA. At OSCHM, C/3/21 in vic MD 278705 began receiving heavy aniper fire within their perimeter. All ambushes, patrols, and OP's were extracted and C commany engaged onemy with small arms, while arty and air strikes were adjusted on the enemy by an AO. At 1000H, C company began sweeping the battle area. Results: 2 WIA (MED EVAC), 64 NVA KIA (M. by arty, 2 by air, 18 by infantry), 9 IWC, 3 CSWC. At 0925H, CAMP KISTLER received 7 to 10 rounds of light arty at the mouth of the CUA VIET River. C-h reported observing 10 rounds landing in the sea. C-/ observed gun flashes in vic YD 235845 and NGF fired counter battery missions. At 1600H, H/2/h observed h NVA in vic VD 251660 81mm morter mission was fired with unknown results. Between 1320H and 1750H, H/2/h element in vic YD 253659 received 14 rounds of medium enemy arty resulting in no friendly canualties. Counter bettery missions fired with unknown results. At 18103, H/2/4 in vic MD 254657 received 3 rounds of receilless rifle fire from the west. Slam mortar mission and 106mm receilless rifle fired at suspected enemy positions. Negative casualties sustained. At 2032%, C/3/21 LP in vic ND 266704 observed 6 to 7 NVA crawling toward their position. LP ongaged enomy with small arms and Ma79 fire. Checked area with negative results. At 2115K, B Co Amtrac Bn PPS-5 radar and NOD at C-h detected 10 NVA in vic XD 291717. Arty mission fired with unknown results.

12 May: At 0330H, E/2/4 embush in vic ND 276702 observed 5 NVA and took them under fire with small arms and captured 1 NVA. POW was forwarded to 3d Marines for interrogation. At 0356K, C/3/21 in vic YD 267706 observed 10 NVA 100 meters to the north in treeline. Arty mission was fired on enemy with unknown results. At 0725H, G/2/4 while sweeping western area of their AO, made contact with estimated 10 to 15 NVA in vic ND 252658. G company ultilized fire and maneuver, arty, hele gunshits, and AO's to engage the enemy throughout the morning. At 1010M, G company received 4 rounds of unknown size enemy arty, and at the same time, AO supporting 6 company received ground fire from receilless rifle or RPG damacing its landing gear. AO returned to base without further incident. At 1200H, G/2/4 was no longer in contect and had swent the battle area. Results: 4 NIA, 4 WIA (NED EVAC), 19 NVA XIA, 4 IWC, 3 CSWC, and asserted documents. During the morning. E/3/21 swept hamlet in vie ND 306680 finding 4 IWC and 4 CSCC. At 1425H, 3/21 liaison NCO at A-1 research ARVW patrols had located 5 NVA KSA resulting from air

strikes controlled by 3/21 units. 5 MVA KBA were added to 3d Haringo cumulative totals. At 1500H, A/3/21 patrol in vie Yn 27370h found 6 IWC, 2 CSWC, 1 guard rostor, 1 notebook containing goographical land divisions, 1 CHICOM radio, and seversl ID oards. All items were forwarded to 3d Marines. At 1658H, CAMP KISTLER received 18 rounds of heavy arty resulting in 1 KIA and 1 WIA (NED EVAC). NOW and arty counter bettery missions were fired on gun flashes observed from MGF spot team in vic XD 290705. At 2030M and again at 2110M, C/3/21 Lots observed and board several groups of 2 to 3 MVA in vic MD 209703. Arty missions were fired and areas were checked at first light finding 1 MVA KIA. At 2050K, FFS-5 radar at C-4 observed 16 to 20 MVA moving south in vic XD 288714. Enemy moved into prearranged kill zono and 6 Mg8A3 tank 90mm beehive rounds and 61mm morter mission was fired on enemy. ARVN's at A-1 observed 8 NVA KIA boing carried from that area to the north. Results: 8 NVA KIA. At 2115%, G/2/4 in vic YD 258658 observed 2 to 3 HVA in front of their position and engaged enemy with small arms and 2-79 fire. Checked area with negative results. At 2300H, H/2/h LP's in vic XD 275665 observed movement in front of their positions. 2 LP's engaged suspected enony with small arms and N-79 fire. Area checked with negative results. At 2305H, B Co Antrac En HOD at C-1 observed h TVA moving south in vic MD 286710. HCF and Cham missions were fixed with unknown results.

13 May: At 0230H, B Co Amtrac En observed with starlight scope 2 groups of 2 to 3 MVA moving south in vic MD 286710. MiSA3 tank 90mm bechive rounds and HGF missions were fired on onemy with unknown results. At 08100, 8/2/4 patrol in vic YD 264659 orchanged small arms fire with 1 HVA in bunker, resulting in 1 WIA (MED EVAC). MVA was surrounded and interpreter made repeated attempts to make EVA surrender but failed. At 1200H; patrol killed the EVA. Results: 1 NVA EIA, 1 IWC. At 1215H, C/3/21 patrol observed 3 NVA in treeline in vic YD 266704. Arty mission was fired on NVA and area was checked resulting in 2 MVA KIA. At 1615W, B/3/21 patrol observed 1 MVA in vic MD 265700 and engaged him with small arms. Results: 1 MVA KIA, 1 IWC. At 19hOM, G/2/h in vie XD 259659 received sporadic small arms fire from 1 or 2 MVA in vie XD 263660. Resulting in no casualties. Fire was returned with small arms, 60mm mortars, and arty. Area was searched and foot prints were found. At 2050M, 0/3/21 fired on 2 MVA in vic MD 268708. Area was chocked with negative results. At 2143%, C/3/21 observed 2 EVA in vic VD 270706. Area mission was fired and area checked at first light with nocative results. At 2145H, A/3/21 LP throw 1 M-26 promade at 1 HVA in vic XD 267705. Area was checked at first light with negative results. At 2240H, 1st Autrae Bn ambush

ongaged 3 MVA with small arms in vic MD 293750 resulting in 1 NVA MIA. On 13 May, 3d Marines were advised by 3d MarDiv to add 76 additional MVA MBA to their cumulative totals for period 02 to 12 May due to BDA reports received by 3d MarDiv air officer.

The May: At 0130H, CTF CLEARWATER reported that river craft anchored in vic ND 32h68h received what was believed to be 2 B-h0 rockets. M-79 fire was returned with unknown results. Slight demage was done to craft. At 0135M, Amtrac Bn patrol in vic ND 333669 made contact with 15 to 20 VC moving west to east in vic ND 332668. Negative casualties sustained. Between 06h5M and 09h5M, B/3/21 patrol in vic ND 260705 received h rounds of 82mm mortar fire resulting in no casualties. At 1030M, G/2/h patrol observed 2 MVA in vic ND 260671. 60mm mission was fired. Area was checked with negative results. At 1300M, B Co Amtrac Bn in vic ND 296746 found 1 h0mm rocket buried in sand. Rocket was partially damaged and destroyed in place.

15 May: At 0015H, D/1/3 platoon in vic XD 326635 received 1 frag granade, 2 1-79 rounds, and approximately 20 rounds of small arms fire. Arty provided illumination but no enemy sightings were made. At 0715%, 6/2/4 reported that AO spotted 1 body in vic TD 20565. Close check revealed body to be NVA. Results: 1 NVA KIA. At 0900%, B Co Amtrac En found and destroyed in place 3 Am mines in vic ND 293756. During the afternoon F/2/h relieved B/3/21 in place in vic ND 267700, and E/2/h relieved C/3/21 in place in vic MD 270705. All 3/21 units returned to 3/21 GP area in vic MD 288668 to prepare for helolift to QUANG THE airfield on 16 May. At 2021H, A/1/3 in vic YD 252631 found 1 belt of M-60 MG ammo, 2 U.S. claymores, 1 81mm and 1 60mm round, 2 M-26 groundes, 4 LAAM's, 1 3.5" rocket round, 2 RPG rounds, 10 CHIGON grounds, and assorted MVA and U.S. equipment. All sorviceable U.S. equipment was placed in supply system, and all other items were destroyed. At 2325H, F/2/4 observed estimated 10 MVA in vic YD 268699 and engaged enemy with small arms and 60mm mortars. Area was checked at first light and blood pools and drag marks were found.

At 1515H, E/2/h received h rounds of unknown size arty from 6000 wils. Hegative casualties sustained. NGF counter battery missions were fired. At 1537H, E/2/h in vic ID 263707 received small arms fire from 2 to 3 MVA 300 meters to their east. Regative casualties sustained. Fire was returned with small arms and 81mm mortars with unknown results. At 2005M, IP from D/1/3 spotted 1 VC in water in vic MD 308638. LP approhended VC but he broke away and ram. VC was shot and Milled. Rosults: 1 VC KIA.

19 May: At 1130H, H/2/h found 1 homemade bangalore torpedo in their wire in vie XD 27866h. Thorough search of area was conducted resulting in no further findings. Torpedo was forwarded to 3d Marines. At 1606H, 3d Marines passed OPCON of 3d En(-) 9th Marines to 3d MarDiv and 3/9 was extracted by hele from 3d Marines AO. At 1730H, A/1/3 in vie XD 25963h found 1 250 lb bomb, 4 CHICON grenades, 3 MVA cartridge bolt, and 2 MVA grenade pouches and destroyed them in place. At 1830H, H/2/h in vie YD 29066h found well camouflaged sleeping area for 1 man. Blood and drag marks and assorted papers were found in the area. Paperswere forwarded to 3d Marines.

20 May: At 0850H. A Co Amtrae Da found l partially buriod That AT mine. EOD personnel destroyed the mine. At O910H, D/1/3 in vic MD 250658 found 3 unsorviceable M-16 rifles and 1 AK-07 and forwarded them to 3d Marines. At 0915K, D/1/3 in vic XD 254659 found I enemy radio and forwarded it to 3d MARDIV 6-2. At 12/0H, skimmor boat from BIN 2/h hit submorged explosive device in vic MD 26h67k resulting in 1 WIA (MINOR). At 1330E, A/1/3 in vic MD 269639 found 5 CHICOM granades, 20 7.62mm rounds, asserted food, and a list of names. All ordnance and food was destroyed and the list was forwarded to 3d Harines. At 1330%, F/2/1 in vic YD 272692 found harbor site complex consisting of 30 A-frame bunkers, 60 fighting holes, and 6 reinforced hooches. Bunkers and holes were linked by tunnels and were well camouflaged. Complex was destroyed. At 1850M, E/2/4 in vic 10) 27070h received 12 rounds of medium enemy arty resulting in negative casualties. A-1 and A-2 reported gun flashes in vic XD 213832, XD 226827, and XD 230830. NGF counter battery missions were fired on the above grids with 8 inch guns. At 2015H, VM scouts with Amtrac Bn in vic ND 319699 found and disarmed 2 N-26 gronades rigged as surprize firing devices.

At 2230H, G/2/L in vic MD 271668 observed 1 MVA moving in front of their perimoter and fired 1 claymore and small arms at him. Checked area at first light with negative results. At 2301H, PPS-5 redar at C-4 detected 9 to 10 MVA moving south in vic ND 282718. MGF mission was fired with unknown results. Meapons and gear were forwarded to 3d Marines. During the morning, elements of MLE 2/4 provided security for PP's checking D's of civilians barvesting rice in BLT 2/4's AO. At 1000H, A/1/3 patrol in vie MD 255627 found NVA radio book containing frogs, radio accessory bag, 2 packs, and 2 gas masks. The radio book and accessory bag were forwarded to 3d Marinos, and as the other goar was unserviceable, it was destroyed. At 1238H, B Co Autrac Bn patrol found I AT mine in vic XD 2977h6. Mine was smaller than W-41 type and was destroyed in place. During the afternoon A Co Amtrac En swept and searched the resettlement hamlet in vie YD 312699 picking up 1 possible dreft dodger and forwarding him to 3d Marines. At 1700H, 2 BLE 2/h shiwsor boats enroute to the DONG HA remp received fire from vic YD 246617. Fire was also received in the same area on the return trip down river. 2nd ARVH regiment was notified. At 0930H, E Co Ambrac Da on resupply run in vic MD 294752 found 2 Seviet Table AT mines placed side by side in recently used LVT trial. Lines were destroyed in place. At 1200H, A/1/3 patrol in vic MD 262627, while searching sampan, found 1 AK-17. Motebook with VI writing was found nearby in brush. Riflo and notobook were forwarded to 3d Marines. At 1640H, P Co Amtrac on Of spotted 5 MVA in vic YD 285759. Coast Guard vessel exchanged fire with TVA and NGW mission was fired with unknown results. At 17050, 3/2/4 patrol in vic MD 278714 found I MVA entwenching tool, small amount of small arms ammo, I roll of comm wire and 6 MVA holmots. MVA had been sighted in this area previously. All items forwarded to 3d Merines. At 19458, 3/2/h observed 15 to 20 MVA moving south in vie YD 282717. All activities were alerted but no further sightings were made. At 2345%, LP from B/1/3 in vic YD 295641 board movement and observed lights near their position. 3 figures were observed running from the erea. 60mm morter provided illum and LP fired on figures. Area was checked with negative results.

25 May: From 0027H to 0105H, CAMP KISTLER received 111 rounds of light and beavy arty from grids MD 225822, 235825,

and 236613 resulting in 4 WIA (MINOR) 14 fuel colla destroyed, 120,000 gal JP-4 and 67,000 gal MO gas destroyed, 6 6x6 trucks destroyed, and h tents and 1 hut demaged. Counter battery missions were fired and arthight strikes were requested. At 0830H, 3/2/h in vie YD 282713 made heavy contact with large MVA sizo force. E company ongogod the MVA with small arms end called in extensive air strikes and arty missions. At 1221H, D/1/3 and command group landed and joined A/1/3, and 1/3(-) began sweeping north without contact. At 1355%, A company tripped a surprise firing device in vie MD 389641 resulting in 2 MIA (MED EVAC). 1/5(-) completed the swoop without further incident and was hele lifed to vic YD 270660. At 1645H, 3d Marines assumed OPCON of command group and I and M/3/3 from 3d MARDIV. 3/3(-) moved to vic XD 263657. 3/3(-) and 1/3(-) were to move west on 26 May and eccuppy blocking positions for forces employed by 9th Marines. Duo to numerous intelligence reports, during the day extensive arty TOT's wore fired on the hamlets of the DAI DO/THUONE DO complex contered VD 250633 with unknown results. At 1915%, 3d Marines assumed OPCOM of A/1/9 from 3d MARDIV. A/1/9 occuppied a position in vie YD 275660 for the night. At 1930H, M/3/3 in vic YD 252653 made contact with unknown size enomy force. A company engaged the NVA with small arms and at 2000H broke contact reporting no casualties. At 2000H, F, G, and H/2/1 received undetermined number of mortar, recket, and arty recode No casualties were reported. Navel gun, Elma mortar, and arty missions word fired on suspected chamy positions. At 2015H, H/2/4 received large volume of small sams fire. H company returned fire with small arms and supporting arms and enomy fire cossed. Negative casualties were sustained. At 2015H, B Co Antrac En NOD at C-4 detected 17 NVA in vie MD 287729. 90mm behive round was fired with unknown results. From 2010H to 2052H, CAMP KISTLER received 9 rounds of medium arvy from grids XD 225823, 220859, and 225825 resulting in 1 WIA (HIMOR). Counter bettery missions were fired with unknown results. At 2100H, B Co Ambrec Bn PPS-5 and NOD at C-4 detected 10 MVA in vic YD 304720, 10 MVA in vic YD 298714, and 25 MVA in vic YD 300710, 6 rounds of 90mm bechive wore fired at the enemy and "SPOORY" took them under fire with unknown results.

26 May: At 00558, 8/2/4 received 10 rounds of 82mm mortar fire resulting in negative casualties. Counter battery missions word fired with unknown results. At 0100%, F/2/h received small arms and rifle grenado fire from estimated 10 TVA in vic YD 265701 sustaining no casualties. 60mm mission was fired and enemy fire coased. At 0130H, B Co Amtrac Bn outpost in vie MD 293754 observed 10 MVA in vie MD 285749 and 2 MVA in vic MD 291755. Outpost fired small arms at onomy and called in MGF, arby, and mortar missions on the NVA. 11th Coastal Group also fired on the enemy. Results were unknown. At 0555H, F/2/h in vie YD 271703 received mortar fire from vie YD 234805 sustaining no casualties. Counter battery missions were fired with unknown results. A and D/1/3 and A/1/9 moved to vic XD 267697. At 2250H, C/r/h LP observed 35 to 15 HVA in vic YD 269708 moving toward their position. Mortar and crty missions were fired and enemy dispersed. Area was checked at first light with negative results.

observed 2 NVA moving north 150 meters from their position. Outpost engaged them with small arms. Area was checked at first light and 1 wounded WVA was captured. At 1100h, 6/2/h patrol in vie YD 258702 received unknown number of morter rounds resulting in 4 WIA (MED EVAC). Counter bettery morter mission were fired on grids YD 263722 and YD 260740 with unknown results. At 1814H, H/2/4 observed 10 EVA in vic YD 280718 moving northwest. 81mm mortar mission was fired with unknown regults. At 1815%, D/1/3 in vic YD 252708 captured 1 NVA. POW stated that he ran from his bunker in LAI AN on 25 May whom napola landed near him and that his unit had 200 men out of 300 killed since crossing the BEN HAI river. POW was forwarded to 3d Marines. Marly in the evening A and D/1/3 broke contact with the EVA and set in night positions. At 2030H, CAMP KISTLER received 11 rounds of enemy arty from vic YD 295795 resulting in negative casualties or damage. Counter bettory missions were fired. At 2336H, H/2/h observed 8 MVA moving north 75 meters from their position in vic MD 266705 and fired 1-79 and small arms at thom. Checked area at first light and found 2 bangalore torpodes, I satchel charge, I box of 7.62mm mmo, I pack, and 3 sets of drag marks. Gear was forwarded to 3d Harines.

30 May: At 0510H, A and D/1/3 in vie MD 255707 received 12 to 15 rounds enemy arty from direction of 355°. Counter bettery missions were fired and "SPCOKY" checked possible gun

sites with negative results. During the merning, A/1/9 and A and D/1/3 searched the area of the provious days' contacts finding 40 MVA KIA, 3 POW, 12 IVC, 1 CSWC, 3 radios, 1 tolo-phono, and assorted goar and ordnance. At 0930H, G/2/h spotted 2 MVA in vic MD 284680 and took them under fire. Results: 2 MVA KIA, 2 IWC. At 0950W, A/1/3 in vic WD 255701 received 25 85mm arty rounds from direction of 6200 mile sustaining no casualtics. At was requested and counter battery missions were fired. At 1045%, G/2/4 observed 1 NVA running north in vic YD 275697 and took him under fire. Results: 1 HVA KIA. A and D/1/3 and A/1/9, continued to sweep north to LAI AM during the afternoon meeting medium resistance from NVA. 2/9(-) swoot behind them. At 1245H, A/1/3 in vic YD 247717 received 15 rounds of 85mm arty resulting in no casualties. AO chocked possible arty positions with negative results. At 1330H, H/2/4 completed search of area in vie XD 282717 and found 30 CHICOM gronados, 10 RFG rounds, 3 AT minos, 25 assorted mortar rounds, 5 bengelore torpedos, assorted NVA and US 782 gear, and 2 graves containing 5 MVA in each. All ordnance was destroyed and US 782 goar was put in supply system. At 1430H, 6/2/4 in vic YD 263697 found 10 boxes of AK-47 ammo and forwarded it to 30 Marines. At 1545H, skimmer boat beading down river in vic MD 270642 hit dud round which exploded and blow the motor off without injury to personnel. Boat was retrieved and returned to BIM 2/h OP. At 1550H, M/2/h in vic WD 270705 received 25 onewy morter rounds sustaining no casualties. Counter battery mortar missions were fired with unknown results. At 1635%, A/1/9 and A and D/1/3, after being in conjuct with the HVA for the afternoon, broke contact and began moving south with 2/9(-). A/1/9 remained with G/2/h in vic MD 268700, while A and D/1/3 and 2/9(.) moved to vie BLM 2/h OF, Results of 1/3's contacts: h WIA (MMO), 6 WIA (MMOR), 38 MVA EIA, 3 PCW, 17 IVG, and asserted goar and ordnence captured. Fours and weapons were forwarded to 3d Marines. At 1800H, 3d Marines assumed OPCON of 3/3 and command aroup 1/9 with D company. At 20151, H/2/4 in vic YD 270704 received 2 rounds of 130mm arty from direction of 5900 mile resulting in no casualties.

31 May: At 0710H, B Go Amtrae Bn outpost in vic XI 293753 observed 1 NVA in vic XD 290750 with no weapon and engaged him with small arms with unknown results. At 0730H, 3d Marines passed ONGOH of 2/9(4) to 3d MARDIV. At 1010H, L/3/3 in vic YD 2h2672 found 7 TWO, 8 CSWC (including 1 12.7mm MG with AA sight and tripod), and asserted morter and small arms armo. All weapons were forwarded to 3d Marines. At 11h2H, L/3/3 in vic XD 2h6668 found h NVA KIA. At 1h30H, M/3/3 in vic XD 268659 found and destroyed 25 bankers. During the afterneon, command group A9 with D company relieved H/2/h in vic XD 270706. G and

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H/2/4 moved to BLT 2/4's OP and prepared for hele lift out of 3d Marines AO. A and D/1/3 returned by "MIKE" beat to the south side of the THACH HAM river and joined the remainder of 1/3. At 1800H, BLT 2/4 completed hele lift out of 3d Marines AO. 3d Marines passed OPCOM of BLT 2/4 to 3d MARDIV at that time.









Sasic Mission (MAPOLEON/SALINE). 3d Marinos with assigned forces conduct combat operations in your AO on both North and South Banks of CVA VIET and include all tributaries as necessary in order to insure the uninterrupted passage of shipping on the CVA VIET River and to deny enemy access to rocket positions priented against DONG EA and QUAMA TRI. (Ono 5-68)

Supplemental Missions. 3d Marines conducts extensive supplemental operations throughout AO during rice harvest to deny enemy access to rice stores, uncover enemy assembly areas and caches, and deny enemy freedom of movement. 3d Marines also provide local security for equipment and personnel involved in dredging operations on the CUA VIET LOC.








Significant Overations Conducted.

Although the operation covered in this section was not directed by 3d MARDIV, it is felt that the action was of enough significance to be included in this section. Intelligence gleaned from POW's and other sources, indicates that the MVA units encountered by the 3d Marines consisted of at least 2 regiments of MVA (MOth & M2nd) with at least two hattalions each, supported by artillery, neckets, transportation and communications units. During the period 300601M Apr through 090600M May, the action in DAI DO and vicinity resulted in 768 MVA KIA, NO MVA POW, 128 IMC, MA COMC, and large amounts ordnance and MVA equipment. The following is a chronological record of the significant events of that period.


30 April: At ChhOX, a river patrol craft in vic YD 258622 received scattered small arms fire from the north bank of the river. The craft returned fire and vacated the area, heading back to the DOMG MA remp. The 2nd ARVM Regt was notified. Although this incident did not take place in 3d Marines AO, a platoon size patrol from 11/2/4 was dispatched to the southern most edge of the AO to investigate. At OfloH, the platoon came in contact with what was estimated to be an NVA company in fortified positions in vie MD 261632. The plateon engaged the MVA from the north bank of the stream to the immediate north of the NVA. 3d Marines received an extension of their AO from the 2nd ARVM Regt, and the rest of H/2/4 reinforced with 2 tanks and the recon plateen moved to assist the ploteen in contact. The River Assault Group lent fire support to the unit in contact. H company moved to vic YD 262634, and utilized an AO to direct helo gunships, fixed wing air strikes, and arty missions on enemy positions in the MD 2662, 2663, 2562, and 2563 grids. The AO reported that the NVA were employing AA weapons, and air strikes and helo gunships were utilized against thom, destroying 3 known .50 caliber MG positions. At 1005%, an Alpha Command Group moved to H company's position to better control the action, while P company (-) moved to vic MD 260635 in order to attack the hamlet of DAI DO (MD 254628). l platoon of P company remained behind in the BLT 2/4 CP area. U company, under heavy small arms, RPC, receilless rifle, automatic weapons, and arty fire, maneuvered to find a point at which to cross the stream between them and the MVA. By 11454, 3/1/3 had crossed the TRACK HAN river and deployed in vic YD 264619, available for reinforcing. At 1353H, F company began receiving heavy fire from DAT DO as well as from vic TD 261632. At 1400H, air strikes were run on DAI DO, and at 1405H, under heavy fire, F company crossed the stream and moved





on DAI DO, while it company crossed the stream and moved on the MVA in vic YD 261632, also under intense fire. At 11,12H, H company had a foot hold in their objective and were engaging the MVA at close range. F company, meanwhile, was pertially pinned down in vic YD 259639 under increasing enemy fire. 2 LVTP-5's were hit. At 14354, both compenies began recoiving sporadic onemy arty fire which continued throughout the after-Extensive counter battery missions were fired on enemy gun positions. By this time offers were on the way to the battle area with ammo resupply, ready to againt in casualty evacuation. At 1500H, F company was in DAI DO mooting ficree resistance. Although heavy casualties were being sustained, F company continued to move through the hemlet. At 1505F, H company secured their objective, consolidated, and began ovacuating their easualties by holo, skipmer boat, and otter. At 16008, OPCON of B/1/3 was passed to BLT 2/4 from 1/3, and B company moved to cross the BO DIES river. At 16258, the first wave was across in vic ED 259623 under heavy APC recoilless rifle, and small arms fire from vic YD 266627 as well as receiving enemy arty fire. At 1710H, B company was entirely across the river and was in heavy contact with NVA in vic YD 260624. One LVT took 3 hits from recoilless rifles and was destroyed. If company, still in heavy contact in DAI DO began to withdraw back to I company's position. At 1840E, F company was with H company set in a perimeter in vie MD 261632, and B/1/3 had consolidated in vic YD 259625 and was no longer in contact. At 19250, holos lifting 6/2/4 from vic XD 268700 to BLT 2/h's CP area, after extracting 1 plateon, were forced to return to base as G company began receiving intense arty and morter fire. At 1945M, & company began moving to the CP area by foot. At 1950H, G company again received large amounts of enomy arty. At 2230H, all G company units were in the CP arec. During their move, G company received between 200 and 210 rounds of arty and mortar fire. Results for 30 April: 16 BIA, 104 WIA (MED EVAC), 3 WIA (MINOR), 96 NVA KIA, 22 IWC, 7 CSWC.

ol May: The night of 30 April - Ol May passed quiotly with all units set in night positions, while 12th Merines continued to fire extensive arty missions on enemy positions. At 0600H, B/1/3 moved from their position and began to assault through the area of 30 April's contact and continued toward the southern side of DAI DO. At 0626H, F and H companies began receiving enemy rocket and arty fire, and B/1/3 began taking small arms, RPG, receilless rifle, and arty fire. B company called extensive arty missions on the MVA in DAI DO utilizing an AO, and NGF counter battery missions were fired. By 0700H, a foot hold had been secured in the southern edge






of the hawlet, but B company was still receiving fire from the enemy. F and H companies then began to attack DAI DO from the oast. At 0750H, H company spotted 20 to 30 MVA moving south toward B company's position and took them under fire with small arms and arty missions. At CE31H, B companies were hold in position by heavy energy arty fire. By 0900H, Is company her repolled the NVA thrust. At 0915H, 6 company with 2 denits and the CO of BLT 2/h leaded on 2 "FIRE" heats and made way to join the elements in contact. At 0945H, an At directed fixed wing air strikes on the MYA in DAI DO. At 2002H, F and H commanies were again receiving enemy arty as well as intense small arms fire. Fire was returned, and 12th Marines and navel guns continued to fire counter leavery missions throughout the day. By lohom, G company had landed and was moving to continue the attack and to peas through F and E campanios which had moved back to vic M) 263632. Between 1100H and 1246H. DAI Was propod by crty and six statkes directed by an AO. At 1253H, @ company commoneed the attack on DAI DO from the east. H company moved to vie 100 259631 to act as a base of fire and screening force, while F company moved behind 6 company to clear the areas of their contacts on 30 April. B company remained in position in vie YD 255627. While G company moved into DAI DO, fires were shifted to DIMH TO (YD 250632), THUONG DO (TD 257634), and THUONG MEMIA (TD 243633). At 1309H, G company began receiving beavy small arms fire from across the streem to DAI DO's west. At 1319H, B company spotted an estimated 100 MVA moving to cross the street to hit G company's western flenk. B company ongagod the MVA with small arms and arty missions. A smoke and WP mission was fired along the western edge of DAI DO which effectively limited the fire that G company was receiving on its western flank. G company continued to attack the WVA. At 1330%, PLE 2/1 reassumed OPCOM of E/2/4 from 3d MARDIV (Co E had been displaced to DOME HA bridge on a security mission), and E company began moving east to reinforce & company. At Mility, F company, having moved into DAT DO behind & company clearing the battle area, began receiving large quantities of enemy arty. At 1515H, F company had joined H company in the screening position, and both units were taking enemy arty fire. At 1600M, G company had swept to the northern edge of DAI DO and was noving and clearing back to the southeast. At 1625H, an ostimated En of MVA counterattacked G company bohind a furious arty and mortar barrage. F and H companies were once again pinned down by enemy arty an addition to small arms fire. At 16358, B company began moving north to reinforce @ company, and B company started crossing the stream in vic YD 256623. At 1715H, B company completed the crossing but was unable to reinforce G and B companies due to continuous enoug MOLASSIFIED



arty and morter fire. At 1745H, B company in vie YD 253628 made heavy contact with MVA forces. G company in vie YD 253630 was still in heavy contact. Both companies formed tight but separate perimeters and repelled the counterattack. At 1815H, the BLT 2/h recen plateon began LFD EVAC operations along with charents of 3d Marines and 1/3 utilizing skimmer boats and otters. At 1857H, all units in the MAI DO area began receiving enemy arty and morter fire. The arty note were being jamaed by the HVA so the frequency was changed. No difficulties were encountered in effecting a quiek, complete frequency change. At 1954H, B company, having sustained heavy canalities, began to pull back to join E company. B company began the move while still receiving enemy fire. At 2030H, a flareship was providing illum and B company has successfully joined E company. By 20/OH, all wounded had been evacuated to the TIM 2/4 OF area and were being further evacuated to the USS INO JIBA. By 2110H, G company had forced the MVA to break contact. The remainder of the night was spent in relative quiet with isolated, small contacts. Results for Oh Hay: 24 KIA, 144 UIA (ISD EVAC), 91 HVA KIA, 2 HVA FON, 12FG, 7 CSMC.

02 May: At 0550H, H company began to move to take up a position behind & company, while E company moved to link up with & company on the left flank. At 0715H, E company began receiving small eras fire from small groups of NVA in DAT DO but pushed on and linked up with a company at 0720H. By 0745H, both companies, attacking to the northwest, were heavily engaged with MVA forces but continuing to guah the FVA back. At 0805H, otters were sent to assist F commany which was evacuating casualties sustained by E and G companies. At 0853E, G company was two-thirds through DAI DO, and E company was one-half through. Both comparises were still in beavy contact. At 09148, E and G companies were linked up and consolidated at the north end of DA1 DO but still receiving a heavy volume of small arms, RPG, and automatic weapons fire from DIMH TO. From 0915 to 0930H, all units in the battle area received large quantities of enemy arty fire. Counter battery missions were fired throughout the day. At 0955H, H company started clearing pockets of resistance and moving to join G and H companies which had sustained heavy casualties during the morning. At 1025H. the 2nd ARVH Regt which had moved into position on the west side of the atream bordering DAI DO, commenced the attack in en offert to parallel BIM 2/h's attack into DIM TO. At 12hOH, H company moved through G company's position and linked up with B company. At 1250H, E and H companies attacked DINH TO. At 1322H, both companies had secured the hamlet to vic YD 250632 mosting light resistance. I and I commanies then began to consolidate. At this time the ARVIII's had secured the hamlet



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of DOWG LAI (TD 247628). At 1340K, E and H companies were boing counterattacked from THUONG DO. Large groups of TVA were spotted by an AO, moving southeast through the hamlets toward E and H companies. The AO adjusted arty on the advancing MVA and requested chergoney air strikes. It 1430%, both commanies were in extremely heavy contact and in danger of being everrum by MVA attacking in "waves". The remaining plateon of F company, which was at BLT 2 h s CP, quickly joined F company. F and G commenies then attacked to the northwest to aid E and H companies. They immediately came in contact with HVA forces. The AO continued to adjust arty fires and holo and fixed wing oir strikes on the NVA. Between 1600 and 1645H, as F and G companies moved further to the northwest, resistance become stronger. By 1615H, they were in heavy contact on the northern edge of DAI DO. At 1740H, it was learned the the CO of BLF 2/h (Lt. Col. WEISE) was wounded and was boing MED EVACED to the USS IWO JAMA and that F and C componies were moving again to join I and H companies. The EX O of BLT 2/4 (Maj. KRAPP) left the CP area to assume command on the bettlefield. At 1830H, F and C companies meached the hasty perimeter of E and E companies. Although contact was still heavy, easualty retrieval and evacuation was conducted. At the some time, 60 Marines from H and S company, BLT 2/4 wore sent to assist the rifle companies, and more personnel were requested from the USS IWO Fina. During the entire contact, helo gunshipe, fixed wing tir strikes, and arty missions were directed continuously by AO's on the advancing encuy with devestating results. At 2040H, the Marines from H and 3 company arrived at the battle area reinforcing the thinned rifle companies. By 2130H, the HVA attack had been broken. Arty missions were adjusted around ELT 2,4 s position to "box" the perimeter to prevent the EVA from massing. For the remainder of the evening, BLE 2/4 receiv I sporadic ground, erty, and morter fire from the enemy, but no significant ground action took place. Results for 02 May: 40 KIA, 108 WIA (HED EVAC), 3 VIA (MINOR), 374 FVA KIA, 2 NVA POW, 10 IWC, 1 OSWO.

O3 May: During the morning, BIT 2/h held their positions and swept the areas to their inmediate north. D/1/3, having moved from 0-h to CAP KISTLES in the evening of O2 May, displaced to 1/3's position via LVT. At 0°05H, D company arrived at 1/3's position and 1/3 assumed OPCOH of the company. AO's observed many SV's fleeing north from THUONG DO during the morning. Air strikes and arty missions well directed on the DVA as they fled, while BLT 2/h prepared to move back to their CP area and allow 1/3(-) to affect passage of lines and continue

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the attack. D/1/3 moved to C/1/3's position in the MD 273628 and at 1211H, commonced an amphibious river crossing to the wost bank of the MHACH HAM river. At 1455H, 1/3 assumed OPCON of B/1/3 from BLT 2/4. At 1515H, C company as well as D company had crossed the THACH HAM and passed through BLT 2/4's positions. E and F/2/4 withdrew and boarded "MIKE" boats to beturn to the 2/4 GP area. G and H/2/4 remained behind to police the battle area behind 1/3(-)'s advance through the THUONG DO - DIME TO hamlet complex. At 2116H, G and H companies had completed their sweep of the battle area and returned to the BLT 2/4 GP area to join the remainder of the FLT. I and D companies formed a perimeter in vic MD 249633 and B company remained in vic MD 256624. Results for 03 May: 3 MVA KIA, 1 INC, 6 CSWC.


Oh May: 1/3(-) spent a quiet night in defensive positions preparing to commence the attack in the morning. It air strikes were run on the hamlet of THUONG DO in the early morning. After the air strikes, C and D commanies swept to vie MD 246635 with scattered, light contacts. D commany joined C and D commentes in the early afternoon. At 1340M, C company received 5 rounds of many arty, and counter battery missions were returned. 1/3(-) consolidated in defensive positions after sweeping through THUONG DO to remain in position until 05 May when the attack would be continued to the north. Puring the evening D company reported receiving 20 to 30 rounds of energy small arms fire, but no other incidents occurred. Results for Oh May: 1 MMA, 5 WIA (WED MVAC), 1 WIA (MINOR), 4 MVA KIA, 1 MWC, 3 CSWC.

05 May. At 0545H, 1/3(-) completed their sweep of THUONG DO and attacked to the north to soize Regimental Objective 4 (the hunder and graveyard in vie YD 249649). Arty and NGF preps were directed on the objective while 1/3(-) moved. The 2nd ARVA Regt was to sweep north from their positions to the west of 1/3(.)'s position. At 0800H, 1/3(-) was in the harlet in vie YD 240636 and found it to be ringed with concerting and single strand wire. The area was well fortified but uncoccupied. At 1040H, 1/3(-) was on objective 4 with C company on the left, D company on the right, and B company to the rear. Light resistance was mot from FVA in fortified positions. At 1140H, 1/3(-) began receiving an increasing volume of fire from Regimental Objective 6 (YD 245651) as well as from vie MD 257646. Fixed wing air strikes as well as arry missions were called in an enemy positions in both areas. It was believed that the mass of enemy forces was on objective 6 and all available fires were directed on that area, while 1/3(-) continued to assembly through objective 4. At 1250H, 1/3(-) was beevily

counterattacked by NVA moving from objective 6. C company maneuvered to the east of D company, which was in the heaviest contact, in order to flank the enemy. B company moved up to cover and screen C company's move. The ARVM's were in heavy contact with NVA forces to the southwest of 1/3(-) which left 1/3(-)'s left flank open to enemy fires. 3d MARDLY, in response to a request from 3d Harines, passed OPCOM of I and M/3/4 to 3d Marines at 1530H. 3d Marines committed the 2 companies by held to vie ND 248634; to cover 1/3(-)'s west flank. At 1800H, the PVA broke contact with 1/3(-). 1/3(-) then moved to vie ND 240636 where I and M/3/4; joined them to consolidate for the night. The night passed without incident. Results for 05 May: 15 NIA, 64 WIA (MED EV.C), 6 WIA (MIMOR), 151 MVA KIA, 3 IWC, 1 CSNC.

Of May: At O9464, 1/3(-)(Reinf) remmenced the attack on objective h and secured it without consect. B company, with I and M/3/4, remained in position in vie MD 240636. C company moved through objective h and attacked objective 6, while D company memained on objective h. At 13524, C company secured objective 6, finding numerous NVA KIA, weapons, and EVA 782 gear left from the provious day's action. At 17154, 3d Marines assumed OFCOF of the let Bn, 5th Cavalry, lst Air Cavalry Division from 3d LARDIV. 1/5 (USA) deployed in vic MD 276659 and propared to commence the attack to the west on 07 May. 1/3(-)(Reinf) consolidated into company size recimeter on the terrain occupied and spent a quick evening without contact. Results for 65 May: I VIA (RED EVAC), 22 MVA KIA, 3 MOW, 72 IWC, 18 0SWG.

07 May: At 0100H, C company was probed by a small group of NVA using morter and small arms fire. The EVA did not attempt to breach the perimeter and withdrew after a short contact. I ETA was killed and I AK-47 was captured. At 0805H, 1/5 (USA) commonced the attack with C company moving on Regimental Objective 3 (YD 267649) and F company noving on Regimental Objective 2 (YD 267660). A company followed in trace of B company, and D company acted as reserve. At 0853H, objectives 2 and 3 were secured without contact. At 1120H, C company secured Regimental Officetive 5 (YD 257646), and B company secured Regimental Objective 1 (ND 251660) without resistance. A company occuppied Regimental Objective 7 (YD 259659) at the same time. At 1405H, A company meyed to objective 1, while B company secured Regimental Objective 8 (YD 245669). By 1645H, all 1/5 (USA) units word located on objective 1, proparing night positions, During the day, 1/3(-)(Reinf) swent around the areas occuppied by them finding NVA killed from





provious action as well as weapons and equipment. At 2105H, a D/1/5 (USA) ambush observed 3 MVA moving toward their position and ambushed them resulting in 1 MVA KIA. Results for 07 May: 8 MVA KIA (not previously reported) found by 1/3(-)(Reinf), 1 MVA KIA by 1/5 (USA), 7 MVC, 1 CSMC.


08 May: During the day, 1/3(-)(Reinf) conducted search and destroy operations around the terrain they occupied finding 2 MVA KIA and capturing 3 POW. At 1000H, D/1/5 (USA) found 16 MVA bushed in 8 shallow graves in vie MD 245670. 1/5 (USA) continued sweeping to the west. At 1530H, 3d Marines passed OFCOM of I and M/3/4 to 3d MARDIV. At 1600H, 3d Marines passed OFCOM of 1/5 (USA) to 3d MARDIV. Results for 08 May: 18 MVA KIA, 3 MVA POW.

09 May: All 1/3 units completed operations in the western portion of 3d Morines AO and returned to their positions on the south bank of the WHACH MAN river.

Thus ended the Battle of DAT DO. It had its beginning on 30 April when the 3d Harines began shifting units into a posture to intensify coverage of the CUA VIET LOC prior to 1 May. Intelligence indicated that an offensive campaign would be opened by the MVA on M May. In International Communist Holiday. The full impact of this battle is difficult to comprehend so close in time to the event, however the following facts are considered significant:

The 320th NVA Division made on exhaustive effort, as evidenced by 4 counterattacks supported by directed artillery fire, to isolate and attack DONG MA by cutting routes 1 and 9 and blocking the CUA VIET LOC. Their plan was apparently trispered one day early and they were decisively defeated with extremely heavy losses. They did not succeed in isolating DONG MA. In fact, supplies centinued to flow on the CUA VIET LOC throughout the fighting. Explosive devices captured on 30 April were never employed and were determined to be extremely sophisticated influence mines assembled from components of Russian manufacture. Some of these components later proved to be the first of these kind to fall into U.S. hands. The CHIEU HOL picked up on 3 May (see entry page 6) later proved to be one of the assembly techniciens who brought the mines down from MVE and provided information of significant intelligence value.

Wheir staggering losses in DAI DO, combined with similarly severe leases in engagements with adjacent U.S. and ARVN units, apparently left the 320th a badly decimated, ineffective unit. If their rebuilding effort takes as long as it appears it may, the importance of DAI DO will become more apparent.

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G. Equipment. Allowance of T/E equipment supporting Headquarters, Third Marines was considered adequate. No recommendations for medification of allowances were received during this period.

H. Logistice

1. General. Logistically, May was a problem month. Transportation of supplies and equipment to and from units in the Cua Viet ar a was difficult due to non-availability of sufficent river transportation. Decilining of cortain vehicles and pieces of equipment also presented problems. Some of these problems have been solved him others are pending action.

2. Supply

(a) Source

(1) The Regiment A Supply Distribution Point established at the mouth of the Gua Viet River maintained stocks of Class I and V Supplies for the use of units in the Regimental AO. The distribution point worked effectively and greatly reduced material handling until the non-availability of sufficient boat transportation made resupply from this point difficult.

(2) FLSG-B at Dong Ha remained the primary source for all

classes of supplies.

- (b) Problems continued to exist in obtaining certain Class II items such as repair parts for motor transport and communication equipment. Generally all other classes of supply were available provided, transportation could be arranged to deliver them where needed.
- 3. Evacuation and Hospitalization. The Regimental aid Station provided routine medical treatment and emergency first aid. Serious cases were evacuated to D-Medical Company for treatment and further evacuation.

4. Transportation.

(a) Water Transportation.

(1) LCM-8. Third Merines controlled one LCM-8 during the first half of the month for accomplishing resupply from the Cua Viet Distribution Point as well as movement of troops and equipment. It worked quite satisfactorily until commitments for the craft became tengreat to handle. Division G-4 referred the problem to Division Embarkation and control of the LCM-8 was given to them. However, the problem still exists as one LCM-8 is insufficient to meet the logistical needs of units deployed in the Napoleon/Saline AO.

(2) Skimmer/Fire Team Assault Boats. Third Marines maintains a boat section with five Skimmer (commercial ski barges) boats and seven Fire Team Assault Boats. Open Battaliens also maintain small? boat sections. These boats are employed for resupply, troop movements, medical evacuation and administrative travel between units. A problem existed on keeping these boat meters operational. To alleviate this problem, a man is presently being trained to perform the required motor maintenance and repair.

(b) Motor Transport. The Headquarters Company Motor Transport Section provided land transportation for administrative use with 1/4 ten and 3/4 ten vehicles.

Many of the 1/4 ton "Mighty Mites" have been deadlined due to the adverso effect of the sandy terrain but are expected to be replaced shortly when the new M151A1 becomes available. Fight 2 1/2 ton trucks from MIT 2/4 were utilized in general support but most of them also become deadlined and are awatiting repair. The Otter platoon from 3d Motor Transport Bn. has been deployed to support the various battalions in the field. Providing vehicular support in marginal term in, the otters have been indispensable in accomplishing internal distribution of supplies and medical evacuation of Jasua bics.

Service (a) Construction. No major construction was accomplished during this peried, miner construction consisted of repairs and improvements to existing faciliaties.

(b) Maintenance. Problems continued to exist in obtaining cortain

The large EVA units withdraw from the area on about 13 May, and the 3d Marines AO was then relatively quiet until 25 May, when another engagement began. This second surge of enemy activity during the menth lasted through the 29th. On 30 and 31 May, there were no contacts.

end of April, was in and near the village of Dai Do (WD2563). There are estimated two WVA regiments, believed to be the 520 and lifth of the 320th Division, entered the area unnethedd, propared entensive defensive positions, and initiated contact by firing upon J. (A) CSS. CSS or FFQ-10 flights provided by 1st MAW and 7th Air Force provided deep support for 3d Marino Regiment operations by interdicting enemy troop and storage areas and active artillery sites. On a total of 75 flights, 85 aircraft

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dropped a tetal of 431,950 lbs of ordnance on enemy targets.

- (B) GAS. In May, 137 CAS missions, a total of 265 air-craft dropped 793,250 lbs of bombs on enemy targets. The noteworthy contribution of 1st MAW and 7th Air Force circust contributed materially to the success of everations within 3d Marines AO.
- (0) Air Observers. The efforts of American Beauty and Southern controllers were major additions to 3d Marine Regiment operations. On 13% flights, totalling 215.7 hours, air observers called in timely artillery and air strikes as well as providing timely intelligence to ground commenders.
- (D) Illumination Aircraft. During May flare-ships provided by MAG-11, MAG-13 and 7th Air Force supported 3d Marine Regiment units and 21 flights for a total of 42.3 hours. In addition to illumination, 7th Air force "SPOOKY" aircraft provided devestating support with 7.62mm machine guns in direct support of 3d Marine units.
- (E) Psy-Ops Aircraft. During May, 3d Faring Regiment units had occasion to utilize 7th Air Force Psy-Ops aircraft. A single flight provided 3 hours of continuous propaganda broadcast over enemy lines. The flight resulted in a material contribution to the CHIEU HOL program in the I Corps area.

& Control Funitions

(A) During the month of May 3d Marine Regiment controller handled a total of 2,248 separate flights, a significant increase over the previous month. During this period the average number of control functions was 73 per day, with the high day at MAE and the low day 32. The increased activity during the first and last weeks of the menth accounted for the high number of flights controlled and efforts by 3d Marine controllers during these periods greatly increased the effectiveness of air support provided to 3d Marines by 1st MAW and 7th Air Force units.

R. PSTCHOLOGICAL OPERATIONS

Psychological Operations during the month were limited due to a shortage of psy-op resources. Numerous leaflet drops and aerial laudane speaker missions were requested in areas of known enemy activity and in population centers. Though specific leaflets and tapes were not awailable, a number of these missions were flown. Attempts to employ ground loudspeaker teams to exploit recent enemy defeats were prevented by the difficulty in obtaining the HB teams and in getting them to the place where they were needed. A "bullhorn" is being utilized to broadcast "Chiou Hoi," and "surrender appeals" when HB teams are not readily available. Also a large number of leaflets and newspapers have been ordered. When received they will be distributed by units in the Gua Viet area to promote support for the GVN and the "revards program".

Third Marines continued to employ Kit Carson Scouts with its open battalions. These scouts were employed on patrols, medcaps, and in fostering better relations with the local populace. Reports on the parformance of these scouts still remain quita favorable.
