



PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

3d Marine Regiment (Reinforced) continued extensive multi-battalion search and destroy operations in the DMZ and Mutter's Ridge area during the month of October 1968.

The month of October opened with the continuation of 1st Battalion, 3d Marine's two separate, but parallel axis sweep in the Mutter's Ridge area. Companies B and D advanced along Axis GREEN (Mutter's Ridge) with Companies A and C supporting their move along Axis BLUE. 2nd Battalion, 3d Marines pushed futher on with their sweep operations southeast along the Cam Lo River Basin towards route #9. Company F operated from FSB Pete. 3d Battalion, 3d Marines assumed responsibility of Dong Ha Mountain, Khe Gio Bridge, FSB Bird, Thon Son Lam, Camp Carroll and patrol operations along route #9. 1st Battalion, 4th Marines continued to advance toward route #1022, a known road used by the NVA to move supplies and 152mm guns across an underwater bridge in the Ben Hai River.

3d Marines assumed operational control of 2nd Battalion, 26th Marines on 1 October 1968. 26th Marines took over the mission of continuing the advance along route #1022 from 1st Battalion, 4th Marines, who were helilifted to Vandegrift Combat Base. 3d Marines passed operational control of 2nd Battalion, 3d Marines minus to C. G., Task Force Hotel.

Company D, 1st Battalion, 3d Marines completed their helilift to FSB Mac, including a battery of 105mm howitzers. On the evening of 2 October, Camp Carroll received 11 rounds of 130mm artillery from the northwest. All artillery rounds impacted outside the lines with negative casualties.

On 4 Octber, Company K, 3d Battalion, 3d Marines helilifted from LZ Bird to Camp Carroll, relieving Company L of their responsibility for Camp Carroll, road sweep, MCB and convoy escort. Company L conducted fire exercises in preparation for an operation in Dong Ma and Dong Kio complex. Company H, 2nd Battalion, 3d Marines returned to Camp Carroll for rehabilitation. Commanding General, 3d Marine Division assumed operational control of one platoon Company B, 1st Battalion, 3d Marines, and passed operational control to C. G., III Marine Amphibious Force for duty as headquarters security. 2nd Battalion, 26th Marines discovered two 152mm gun pits on 6 October. Located near the gun positions were 200 rounds of 152mm, ammunition, 166 fuses, 181 unexpended canisters, 26 expended canisters, and one box of increments. In the afternoon Company E, discovered one destroyed enemy halftrack capable of carrying ten to fifteen personnel or towing a 152mm gun.


Company B, 1st Battalion, 3d Marines conducted a "stay behind" operation in vicinity of LZ Marilyn, while Company A and C, continued their search and destroy operation through 7 October. Company L, 3d Battalion, 3d Marines completed their move to FSB Pete, and relieved Company F, 2nd Battalion 3d Marines.

On 8 October, 3d Marines assumed operational control of Company K. 3d Battalion, 9th Marines at FSB Winchester. 2nd Battalion, 3d Marines continued their search and destroy operation in the vicinity of Hill 461. Company F, was helilifted to LZ Catapult. Company I, 3d Battalion 3d Marines moved to Camp Carroll to relieve Company K. Company K, assumed responsibility for Khe Gio Bridge and positions along route #9. Company M, was relieved by Company A, 1st Battalion, 9th Marines for defense of Thon Son Lam.

On 9 October, Company I, 3d Battalion, 3d Marines completed their helilift to FSB Winchester relieving Company K, 3d Battalion, 9th Marines, Company K, 3d Marines relieved a platcon of Company I on Dong Ha Mountain of Khe Gio Bridge, and positions along route #9. One platoon of Company M, helilifted to FSB Catapult. 3d Marines passed operational control of Company A, 1st Battalion, 9th Marines to Commanding General, 3d Marine Division.

On 12 October, Company F, 2nd Battalion, 26th Marines found one destroyed amphibious tractor along route #1022. The road continues north across an underwater bridge in the Ben Hai River.

lst Battalion, 3d Marines completed their helilift to 2nd Battalion, 26th Marines position in the DMZ. Company B remained at FSB Mac. 3d Marines continued the mission of uncovering route #1022 by cutting trees at 300 meter intervals for future aerial reconnassance to detect any new vehicle movement. At 161530H, 3d Marines assumed operational control of Company D, 1st Battalion, 4th Marines and passed OPCON of Company K, 3d Battalion, 9th Marines to Commanding General, 3d Marine Division. 3d Marines



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passed OPCOW of 2nd Battalion, 26th Marines to Commanding General, 3d Marine Division upon completion of their helilift to C-4 and Mai Loc.

On 17 October, Company D, 3d Marines found 250, 152mm artillery rounds while checking out a bunker complex just south of the Ben Hai River. Ten artillery rounds were transported by air to 3d Marines and forty artillery rounds to Headquarters, 3d Marine Division for intelligence purposes.

In accordance with Frag Order 55-68, 3d Marines helilifted 1st Battalion from the DMZ to provide security along route #9. 2nd Battalion operating in the western DMZ was helilifted to the Cam Lo and Mai Loc area. 3d Battalion was helilifted into FSB Catapult to commence search and destroy operations to the southweat.


Company A, 1st Battalion, 3d Marines assumed responsibility for FSB Catapult and Company C for FSB Winchester. Company M and I, 3d Marines returned to Camp Carroll for future operations on 22 October. Company D relieved Company K of the responsibility for Dong Ha Mountain, Khe Gio Bridge and defense of route #9. 3d Marines assumed operational control of Company A, 9th Marines at Thon Son Lam, Company K, 9th Marines at FSB Pete. Company G, 3d Marines relieved Company D, 4th Marines of its responsibility for Camp Carroll and MCB and convoy escort. OPCON of Company D, 4th Marines was passed to Commanding General, 3d Marine Division upon return to Vandergrift Combat Base.

Company F, 2nd Battalion, 3d Marines completed their foot march to Mai Loc for operations with RF/PF units on 24 October.

On 25 October, Company H. 2nd Battalion, 3d Marines moved to Cam Lo to participate in combined action patrols with RF/PF units.


OPCON of Company L, 3d Battalion, 3d Marines and attached Recon platoon (Ringlet) was passed to Commanding General, 3d Marine Division on 30 October. Three Companies of 3d Battalion completed their helilift to Camp Carroll for rehabilitation.


On 31 October 1968, 3d Battalion, 3d Marines conducted a motor march to Con Thien and C-2 to relieve 1st Brigade, 5th Division (Mechanized). Company A, 3d Marines helilifted from FSB Catapult to Camp Carroll. OPCON of Company L, 3d Battalion was passed to Commanding General, 3d Marine Division.





3d Marines assumed operational control of Company K, 3d Battalion, 9th Marines at TSL. A platoon from Company D, 1st Battalion, 3d Marines at Khe Gio Bridge received probes from the south by an estimated fifteen NVA. The attack was preceded by 60mm mortar fire and small arms fire.





PART III

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. Combat Missions Assigned:

- a. 1-5 October 1968, 3d Marines (Rein) continued search and destroy operations in eastern Lancaster II AO to destroy enemy fortifications, supplies, and equipment, and provide security for Camp Carroll, FSB Mac, Khe Gio Bridge, Dong Ha Mtn OP, and route #9 in AO. (See Supporting Document #1, 3d Marines Frag Order 49-68).
- b. 6-20 October 1968, 3d Marines (Rein) conducted search and destroy operations in northeastern Lancaster II AO, commenced search and destroy operations in western Lancaster II AO, and provided security for TSL, Camp Carroll, Khe Gio Bridge, Dong Ha Mountain OP, FSB Catapult FSB Winchester, FSB Pete and LZ Mac. (See Supporting Document #2, 3d Marines Frag Order 53-68).
- c. 21-25 October 1968, 3d Marines (Rein) continued present tasks and provided security forces in Cam Lo and Dolta-5 Area. (See Supporting Document #3, 3d Marines Frag Order 55-68).
- d. 26-30 October 1968, 3d Marines (Rein) continued to clear Lancaster II AO of enemy forces. Additionally, 3d Marines instituted a firm pacification assistance program for Operation Rong in the Cam Lo and Huong Hoa Districts in conjunction with GVN District Forces. (See Supporting Document #4, 3d Marines Frag Order 56-68).
- e. 31 October 1968, 3d Marines (Rein) assumed responsibility for Lancaster/Kentucky AO, conducted offensive operations to destroy enemy forces, maintained security for fixed installations and roads in AO, and assisted RVN forces in pacification of Cam Lo and Huong Hoa Districts. (See Supporting Document #5, 3d Marines Operation Order 5-68).

- 5. New Tochniques Employed. None.
- 6. Command Relations. During the period 01-31 October 1968, 3d Marines were OPCON to CG 3d Marine Division.
- 7. Equipment. Allowance of T/E equipment supporting Readquarters, 3d Marines was considered to be adequate. No recommendations for modification of allowances were received during this period.

8. Logistics.

a. General. Logisticially, October was an active month for helicopter resupply of the five battalions OPCON to 3d Marines. All resupply missions were accomplished at Vandegrift Combat Base, which provides Classes I, III, IV, and V supplies to support battalions located in the Northern I Corps and DMZ Areas. All other resupply was brought from Dong Ha by convoy for the Camp Carroll Contonement.

b. Sup ly.

- (1) The overall supply support during this period was considered adequate.
- (2) Class II from Dong Ha was a problem during this period. Office supplies are in short supply and could only be obtained by sending unit representatives directly to the NSA Serv-Mart at DaMang. Examples of unavailable office supplies are white mimeograph paper, manifold carbon sets (white, pink, and gren), and stamp pad ink.
- c. Evacuation and Mospitalization. The Regimental Aid Station provided routine medical treatment and emergency first aid. Serious cases were evacuated to 3d Medical Battalion Hospital at Quang Tri for treatment and further evacuation.

d. Transportation.

- (1) 3d Marines had a truck company located at Camp Carroll that is in general support of the 3d Marine Division consisting of twenty three 2s ten trucks, fifteen cargo trailers and one wrecker from 3d Motor transport Battalion. During this period the truck company was used for tactical troop and administrative troop movements and general resupply missions for 3d Marines.
- (2) The Motor Transport Section, Headquarters Company was in general support of the Regimental Headquarters. This section had some problems aquiring spare parts and batteries from the supply source.

e. Service.

- (1) Construction. No construction was accomplished during this period due to tactical commitments. The present allowance of generators has not been adequate to handle all the requirements at Camp Carroll. Presently there are four generators operating at Camp Carroll. They are (2) 30KW!s, (1) 60KW, and (1) 20KW. There is a need for (2) 100KW's, (1) 60KW and (1) 30KW generators to adequately support the requirements of the Marine Units at Camp Carroll. In conjunction with the generators requirements, the present electrical wiring system is being surveyed by Naval Construction Battalion personnel.
- (2) Laundry service provided by Vietnamose civilians in Cam Lo was very satisfactory.
- (3) Maintenance. Problems continued to exist in obtaining certain first and second echelon repair parts.
- (4) Sanitation. Sanitation improvements have been made at Camp Carroll in the area of the dump and mess hall during the month of October.

9. Civic Action.

- a. Headquarters Company laundry continued to operate; omploying approximately 30 Vietnamese in Com Lo village(YD 145595). Total village laundry operations were valued at \$475.00.
- b. \$252.45 was collected for the Third Marine Division Childrens Hospital Fund.
- c. A program to gather empty wooden ammunition boxes and 6,000 empty 12 ounce cans was initiated.
- d. Five hundred pairs of socks were obtained through the Regimental Chaplain and distributed through the Cam Lo dispensary.

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- e. Eurned over 5 high quality, manual brick-making machines to 2d Sattalion 3d Marines for use in Operation DRAGON.
- f. The Regimental Surgeon inspected the dispensary at Mai Loc. (YD 101515) and ordered medical supplies to institute a MedCap program-

10. Administration.

- a. Discipline. One regimental and two company office hours were conducted during this period.
 - b. Special Services.
- Cigarette lighters and/or money clips were provided to personnel rotating to CuiUS.
 - Stationary kits were provided all personnel. (2)
- Post Exchange facilities were available at Camp Carroll and continued to carry basic health and comfort items and other merchandise.
- d. A postal unit from the Division Post Office was in operation and served all units.

11. Personnel.

- There is a critical shortage of a Career Planning NCO, MOS 8421.

- c. Awards. During the reporting period the following awards were presented:

- d. Morale is considered to be excellent to outstanding. The in-country and out-of-country Ran programs were contributing factors. There were 6 in-country and 11 out-of-country Atak quotas used during this period.

- (a) Distributed 30 paperback books to Marines throughout the Regiment.
- (b) Conducted 10 Sunday and 18 Weekday Worship services in other commands with attendance of 317 personnel.
 - (c) Eaptized 4 Marines.
- (5) Facilities: 3d Marines have a chapel built as a Southeast Asia hut, seating capacity of 50, complete with furnishings and alter appointments. No additional facilities are required.

12. <u>Intelligence</u>

- a. Significant Events. During the early part of October, the enemy fought a delaying action along Route #10228 in the Demilitarized Zono, to cover withdrawal north across the Ben Hai River of ground elements of the 320th NVA Division and of unidentified artillery units. The largest contact was with an enemy company on 8 October. After that date, enemy activity was minor and isolated for the remainder of the month.
- (1). Route 1022S had been discovered by visual aerial reconnaisance and verified by aerial photography during September. Running through the southern Demilitarized Zone from XD 964677 to XD 980685 to XD 997707, it crossed into North Vietnam over underwater bridges. Along this road, elements of 52d Regiment, 320th NVA Division, occupied a series of blocking positions during the first eight days of October. By 9 October the enemy had withdrawn across the Ben Hai River.
- (2). Along Route 1022S, five enemy artillery positions were discovered. The guns had been withdrawn north, but six hundred ninety eight 152mm and ninety 85mm artillery rounds were found. The remains of two tracked vehicles that could have been used to tow artillery pieces and to haul artillery ammunition were also found. Likewise, during the period of the enemy's withdrawal, numerous vehicles were heard while the underwater bridges hit daily by air and artillery were repaired at night.

- . (3). Since it completed its withdrawal, on 8 October the 320th Division has remained in North Vietnam. Enemy activity in the AO of 3d Marines then consisted of sniping and mining, coupled with infiltration and exfiltration of small groups through the area.
- (4). Many new and-well-used trails were discovered during operations in the extreme western portion of the AO, between 8 and 28 October. Some of the trails were well-constructed, and included handrails and steps on the steep portions. Log footbridges had been constructed across streams. Numerous bunkers and shelters were found along and near the trails, almost all of them unoccupied.
- (5). Three NVA prisoners were captured during operations the West. All three had been separated from their units and were captured without defficulty. Of these prisoners, one did not know his parent unit; and one was from the 246A Regiment, which he stated was organic to the 304th Division (246th Regiment is carried as subordinate to the 338th Division). Details concerning supply routes were given by the prisoner from the transportation unit. This led to the discovery of trails, but not of supply caches.

13. Communications

a. General

- (1) The Regimental Communications Platoon continued to support 3d Marines with continuous and reliable communications.
- (2) During this period, the Message Center processed a total of 2428 messages. Of these 1851 were received and 557 were transmitted. Of the total twenty messages were handled by courier.

b. Listing of Events.

- (1) 7 Oct. A two man radio team was emplaced at Landing Zone Catapult to insure communications with 3d Battalion, 3d Marines.
- (2) 15 Oct. A radio relay shot (AN/TRC-27) was established from Camp Carroll to Quang Tri. This provided the Battalion rear areas at Quang Tri with two direct channels each to Regimental Headquarters at Camp Carroll.

14. Weather

- a. Weather during October consisted of periods of almost continuous rain which lasted about a week, periods of scattered showers, visibility was severely limited; it was somtimes as low as O in the mountainous portion of the 3d Marines AO. Visibility was also restricted by daily early morning fog.
- b. Temperatures during October were slightly lower than in September, while humidity was slightly higher. Winds shifted, as the northeast monsoon season began, but the wind velocity remained moderate. Statistics were as follows:
 - (1) Average high temperature 85 Degrees
 - (2) Average low temperature 72 Degrees
 - (3) Average humidity 81%
 - (4) Average daily rainfall 0.42 inches at Camp Carroll.

c. During periods of reduced visibility, which were long and frequent, air support was limited. Helicopter lifts, in particular, were often postponed or delayed by the weather. Ground operations were only slightly hampered by the rain.
