1. SITUATION.


- a. Enemy Forces. Annex B (Intelligence) to Operation Order 321-63

 - (1) U.N. Forces land subsequent to D-Day in the vicinity of KANGNUNG.
 - (2) CTG 79.7 lands BLT: 1/3 in vicinity of CHUMUNJIN.
 - (3) DD 1 D/S (Constructive)

d. Assumptions.

- (1) That weather and beach conditions will allow the execution of the landing as planned.
- (2) That the aggressor will not occupy the objective area in strength prior to D-Day.
- 2. MISSION. BLT 1/3, commencing at H-Hour on D-Day, seizes, occupies, and defends blocking positions in the CHUMUNJIN TONGDONGNI area in order to prevent aggressor reinforcements fram the North, and to destroy aggressor forces and installations in the area.

3: EXECUTION.

a. Concept of Operation, BLT 1/3 lands at H-Hour on D-Day over Red Beach with two companies abreast followed by one company in column; seizes, secures, and establishes blocking positions at Objective 1, Objective 2, and Objective 3; destroys enemy in zone of action; propares to establish combat outpost vic hill 365 (783905), and combat patrols North to HWAS NG - CH'ON RIVAR and South to SACHON RIVER.

1. ENEMY SITUATION.

- a. During early November, 1962 __GGR_SSOR invaded SOUTH KORLA and succeeded in establishing positions South of S__GHOK by late December. __GGR_SSOR has been halted by UN forces which have established a front line position generally along the 37th parallel. __GGR_SSOR ground forces have been supported by tanks and artillery. __AGGR_SSOR has used minimal air, support with only a few aircraft. No aGGR_SSOR combatant naval vessels have been observed. __GGR_SSOR has utilized the eastern coastal highway. Route 41, as a main supply route. Despite daily patrol activity, __GGR_SSOR has experienced some interdiction, along this main supply route, from South Korean guerilla bands. __GGR_SSOR has not been successful, to date in various attempts to win the support of the South Korean peoples.
- b. The Chumunjin-Tongdon-Ni area is occupied by an Aggressor Platoon which provides security for a small logistic and communication center located within the area. "GGRESSOR has been observed sending squad sized patrols daily along highway 41. There has been no evidence of any build-up of defensive positions and no weapons other than organic small arms and machine guns are believed to be in the area. See appendix 1 (Enemy Situation Overlay).

2. ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS OF INFORM TION.

- a. Determine size, organization find logation of enemy-forces addlinstellationarin our zone of action.
- b. Determine if enemy has artillery in the area. If so, where and in what strength.
- c. Determine if enemy has armor in the area. If so, where and in what strength.

d. Determine if the enemy will reinforce elements now located in the objective area. If so, where and with what forces?

3. RECONNAISSANCE AND OBSERVATION MISSIONS.

- a. Orders to Subordinate Units.

 - (a) Report all known or suspected enemy movement giving approximate size and direction of movement.
 - (b) Report all sightings of enemy armor, giving location and/or direction of movement.
 - (c) Apprehend all civilians or suspicious personnel within sone of action.
 - (d) Report all attempts of actual or suspected sebotage immediately.
 - (2) Companies A. B. C and D.
 - (a) Be prepared to conduct reconnaissance missions as directed.
 - (b) Report all enemy contact and enemy patrol activity.
 - (d) Report any unusual loss of contact with enemy forces and any unusual enemy emplacements.
 - (d) Report location of OP's as established,
 - (e) Submit external patrol overlays daily by 1800.
 - (3) <u>H&S Company (-)</u>.
 - (a) Be prepared to set up security within Battelion CP area.
 - (b) Be prepared to provide security for the Battalion POW collection point.
 - (c) Establish control points on all roads leading into Battalion CP area; enforce strict security on all vehicular movement entering or leaving the CP.

- (d) Challenge and Passwords are effective for a period of 24 hours commencing at 1200 daily. Challenge and Passwords will be disseminated only by runner or personal liaison.

- 1. PURPOSE AND OTHER LIMITING CONSIDERATION. The purpose of this study is to determine the effets of weather, terrain and hydrography on military operations in the CHUMUNJINATONGDONG-NI area of SOUTH KOBEA with particular emphasis to an amphibicus operation in January 1963.
- 2. GANERAL DESCRIPTION OF THE ARMA.
 - a. Weather. See Tab A
 - b. Topography.
 - (1) Relief and drainage. The terrain from the beach to about 600 yards inland is relatively flat and sandy. From this point the terrain becomes a series of low rolling hills which gradually become higher until the mountainous area about 12,000 yards from the beach is reached. The valleys within this area are utilized as rice paddies and numerous terraces have been constructed. The YONGOKCHON River on the South and the SILLI CHON River on the North are the principle drainage features within this area.
 - (2) Strfate Materials. The beach area is very sandy and will require the use of beach matting for vehicles. Paddie fields are expected to be frozen and will be easily crossed by troops on foot. Topsoil is absent from most of the low lying hills due to erosion and troops can expect to find footing difficult particular if there is much ice or snow on the ground.
 - (3) Vegetation. Most of the beach area and the low lying hills behind the beach are covered with recently of planted pine trees. There are numerous paddie fields within the area which will be barren during the winter months.

(4) Cultural Features!

(a) All ground capable of being cultivated is utilized as rice paddies.

- (b) There are numerous houses throughout the area. The largest center of population is the village of CHUMUNJIN (30,000) coordinates 854935, other heavily built up areas are located at 865915, 855894, 835913, and 845915. Two schools are located at 852915 and a cemetary is at 854918.
- (c) There are numerous tombs throughout the area particularly on the slopes of the low lying hills behind the beach.
- (d) An abandoned railroad bed runs generally parallel to the beach from 300-600-yards inland. The bridges for this railroad have been destroyed.
- (e) Route 41 runs generally North and South and is the principle road in the area. It is a narrow loose packed dirt road but will support two-way traffic. Heavy snow fall or ice will render this road highly dangerous for vehicular traffic.
- c. Hydrography and Landing Beaches. See Tab B (Beach Study)

3. MILITARY ASPECTS OF THE AREA.

- a. Observation and Fields of Fire. Observation throughout the area is generally good. The trees on the hills are relatively short and the rice paddies will be barren. The rice paddies will afford the enemy excellent fields of fire due to their lack of cover and concealment.
- b. Cover and Concealment. Concealment within the area will be difficult due to the lack of heavy vegetation. Also, snow on the ground will make concealment more difficult. The ridges and hills will provide some cover as will the manmade dikes and terraces. The numerous houses within the area may afford opertunities for concealment.
- c. Obstacles. The hills, ridges and rice paddies will prevent extensive use of vehicles. Troops on foot should not encounter any serious difficulties in movement particularly if the paddie fields are frozen.

e. Avenues of Approach. The main avenues of approach into the area are along the rivers on the North and South of the area of operations. Both these rivers are paralleled by narrow roads. The rivers are quite shallow and may afford movement by troops on foot. There are numerous rice paddies which follow the valleys leading into the hinterland. The major disadvantage of the rice paddies is their lack of cover and concealment.

4. TACTICAL EFFECT OF THE AREA.

- a. Effect on the Enemy. The absence of high ground immediately adjacent to the beach will limit the enemy's effort to defend this area. The lack of a good road network will limit his mobility. Camouflage will be difficult due to the nature of the local vegetation. The paddie fields will afford the enemy good fields of fire. The nature of the terrain suggests that the enemy will defend from a series of strong points rather than a continous lines.
- b. Effect on Friendly Forces. The lack of a good road network will seriously affect the use of vehicles. Camouflage will be difficult. Control of the high ground will be important as valleys will otherwise be untenable. House to house fighting may be encountered should the enemy decide to occupy the built up areas.



Weather (CHUMUNJIN)

The weather in January and February is considerably dryer with almost all precipitation falling in the form of snow. Visibility is restricted by rain and snow and rarely by fog. Fog is at a minimum during the winter months. Mostly clear skies may be expected 10 to 15 days each month, with February showing a few more days of cloudiness than January. Thunderstorms are very rare during this season. During the winter (winter moonsoon season) typhoons rarely if ever, effect Korea.


a. General.

RED BEACH is a slightly concave beach facing 052°T. It has a total length of 3000 yards of which a center portion, 1000 yards long, was surveyed. Beach widths vary from 10 to 50 yards at low water and from 5 to 20 yards at high water. Hinterland and local landmarks are few and are not shown on the charts. However, certain features are distinguishable on approaching the area from seaward. There are no prominent beach features, but the right flank can be marked approximately by the center of the small fishing village of Maemaktong. The Silli Chon River mouth is 325 yards to the right of the beach's right flank. The beach center is approximately marked by two school buildings, partly screened by trees but visible from seaward, situated about 500 yards inland from the beach. The beach left flank is located about 800 yards to the right of the waterline rook outcropping situated at the north edge of the Yongok Chon River mouth.

b. Offshore.

The bottom seaward of the 3 fathom curve is composed of fine sand. No rocks were found in the area. The depths offshore average around 8 to 10 fathoms and the bottom appears to have good holding characteristics. The only navigational hazard are the ever present Korean fishing boats which pass close to the beach going to and from the village of Chumunjin.

c. Nearshore.

The bottom from the 3 fathom curve to LLW is composed entirely of fine sand with no rocks in the area. There are numerous sand bars which have no distinct pattern. A storm could change the entire configuration of the bottom.

Average distance from 1 fathom curve to 2 fathom curve: 2.22 yards
Average gradient from MLLW to 1 fathom curve: 1:8

d. Foreshore.

The beach length was 1000 yards, all of which was usable. The width varied between 8 and 10 yards with an average gradient of 1:8. The forespone is composed entirely of fine sand. Traffice ability extremely poon. Walking is difficult and matting would be required for all wheeled vehicles. Exits to the backshore could be made available anywhere along the forespone with a minimum amount of dozing.

e. Backshore,

The backshore is 1000 yards in length, varying in width from 10 to 100 yards. The area is extremely level with an average gradient of 1:250. There is a berm scrap on certain portions of the beach, but no sand dunes are present. The backshore is composed entirely of others and which makes for poor trafficability. The presence of sparse grass, covering the inland edge of the backshore would aid in the movement of vehicles. However, matting is advisable for most of the area. A staging area is available approximately 150 yards south of the right flank of the beach. This area extends for apdistance of 250 yardsscuthward, and varies in width between 20 to 100 yards. The only exit to the hinterland is a small dirt road leading to the fishing village of Maemak-Tong on the right flank of the beach, All vehicular traffic can be supported by this road without the aid of any matting.

f. Hinterland.

The hinterland is gently rolling terrain almost entirely covered by pine trees, approximately 1 foot in height. These trees are part of the Korean reforestation and conservation program. The village of Maemok-Tong extends 75 yards into the hinterland and behind it lies a Korean cemetery. All the vehicular traffic must passithrough the village and cemetary on a narrow dirt road that leads ultimately to Korea Route #41 which parallels the beach, approximately 700 yards inland.

There is a small ROK Army outpost building at the southern end of the village of Maemok-Tong, behind which a helicopter could be landed with little difficulty.

g. Evaluation.

RED BEACH is excellent for amphibious craft up to LOU. A dry ramp land should be obtained at any tide condition. An LST cannot beach under even the most favorable anditions. There is only one "slots for an LST approach and it is situated 80 yards to the right of beach center. This "slots eand bars on both sides that serve to make navigation extremely demanding. Beach matting is required throughout the landing area. Bulldozing is required in the tackshore area to remove the steep berm scrap. The paucity of beach exits will curtail rapid movement into the hinterland.

- (6) Report location, extent, types, density, and time of completion of minefields installed. Follow up with minefield report DA Form 1355. Use standard U.S. Mine patterns.
- (7) Report barrier locations when established.

4. ADMINISTRATION AND LOGISTICS.

- a. BLT 1/3 Administrative Order 321-63.
- b. Basic allowance armor-piercing ammunition and anti-tank mines to be carried at all times (Constructive).
- 5. COMMAND AND COMMUNICATIONS ELECTRONICS.
 - a. Report actual sighting of enemy mechanized units by fastest means available to lower, higher, and adjacent units.

- b. Initial reports will contain the following information.
 - (1) What (number, type, accompanying infantry).
 - (2) Where
 - (3) Direction of movement
 - (4) Speed

- c. OPERATIONAL INTEDIATE precedence will be employed and contact messages will be relayed immediately to this headquarters. Such messages normally should be authenticated, but lack of authentication should not delay their retransmission or relay.
- d. Amplifying reports will employ EMERGENCY (Constructive) precedence, but OPERATIONAL IMPEDIATE should be used if the situation dictates.
- e. TANKS CLEAR. When the danger of enemy mechanized units is no longer immiment, due to withdrawal or destruction of the enemy forces, a TANKS CLEAR message will be sent to this headquarters.
 - (1) This message will contain the phrase "TIMAS CLAAR."
 - (2) Normally OPERATIONAL IMPEDIATE precedence will be used to send a "TANKS CLEAR" message.
 - (3) All "TANKS CLEAR" messages will be authenticated.
 - (4) Only the originator of the initial message pertaining to a specific mechanized attack will transmit a "T.NFS CLEAR" message.



Time Zone: India

1. ALERT CONDITIONS.

- a. Condition Four. The hostile armored force is detected but contact is not imminent.
 - (1) Control and action to be taken:
 - (a) Control and coordination remain with CLF (CTF 79.7)
 - (b) Armored detection by all agencies will be intensified.
 - (c) This headquarters will alert reserve and general support elements.
- b. <u>Condition Three</u>. The hostile armored force is approaching our force and contact is imminent. The time andplace of contact can be predicted with reasonable accuracy.
 - (1) Control and action to be taken:
 - (a) Control of Artillery and Naval Gunfire will remain with CLF (CTF 79.7).
 - (b) All anti-mechanized crews and observers will be alerted.
 - (c) Designated Artillery and Navel Gunfire units will mass fires on located enemy positions and on critical evenues of approach.
- c. Condition Two. Friendly units are under attack by hostile armored forces.
 - (1) Control and action to be taken:
 - (a) This headquarters will pass control of sufficient supporting arms fires and 106 RR sections to the companies under attack. The amount and number of supporting arms passed to control of subordinate units will not exceed the control capability of the unit concerned.
 - (b) CLF (CTF 79.7) may retain control of a portion of supporting arms and 106 RR section in order to counter any other enemy mechanized threat or attack which may develop.

- d. Condition One. The unit is seriously endangered by the hostile armored attack in progress!
 - (1) Control and caution to be taken.
 - (a) Subordinate units will be prepared on order to take control of additional supporting fires and/or 106 RR sections assigned by CLF (CTF 79.7).
 - (b) all anti-mechanized means will take the hostile armored forces under fire when it comes within range.
- e. It cannot be assumed that in every instance of a hostile armored attack there will be a logical and orderly progression through all the "Alert" conditions for anti-mechanized readiness and shifts of control as described above. It is quite possible that in many instances the first detection will occur when contact is imminent or friendly units are under attack.




