1. Mission's Assigned


1-24 June - Continued to provide security for A-4, C-2, C-3 Bridge, Cam Lo District Headquarters, Khe Cio Bridge, and lines of communication within assigned area of operation.

Ref: Regt Frago 62-69

25-30 June - Conduct operations in accordance with BnFragO 175-69, to locate and destroy the enemy and his supplies within assigned area of operation.

Ref: Regt Frago 76-69

- 2. Intelligence. During the month of June the battalion was located in static positions. During this time contact with the enemy was light with only several minor incidents reported. During this time however, a steady increase in an enemy buildup was observed and detected in the northeast portion of our AO. Through agents and URS reports an element of the 270th NVA Regiment was detected as the unit infiltrating into this general vicinity (YD 1573). From 9 to 11 June sensor in the vicinity of (YD 1573) detected movement of approx 125 enemy into the subject area. And on 10 June Company "F" observed 15 enemy moving in the open in the some vicinity as previously stated. The 24th Saper Company of the 270th NVA Regiment was reported, by a POW captured by the 2d ARVN's on 9 June, as operating between C-2 and Con Thien. Shortly after this time Company "A" at C-2 reported on several nights movement near the wire on the perimeter of C-2. This was possibly a recon of this position by elements of the 24th Sapper Company. Also at this time an agent report placed the 4th and 5th Battalions of the 88th NVA Regiment in the vicinity of (YD 0153). The possible location of this unit was a possible threat to Company "C" at Khe Gio Bridge.
- 3. Operations. During the month while a part of the Regimental operation "Virginia Ridge", the battalion acted as a blocking force to the east of Con Thien for the Third Battalion, 3d Marines. "A" and "B" Companies swept the same area later.

During the month of June the majority of the Battalion was occuping defensive positions in the 3rd Marines AO. Consequently the number of CAS sorties is low since there was little contact. The beacon system and AOA aircraft were utilized as much as possible with some missions being ran above the DMZ with the assistance of aerial observers. The total Battle Danage Assessment reported for all fixed wing missions included 47 bunkers destroyed, 3 secondary explosions, 2 secondary fires, and 30 meters of trail destroyed.

PART III

SEQUESTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

At Ollo20H a road sweep from Company "B" located at YD 132710, exploded two (2) antitank mines, apparently by personnel stepping on them. Company "B" suffered two (2) KIA and one (1) WIA.

Company "A" located at YD 136647 heard movement to their northeast in vic of YD 138653. Fired a 81mm Mortar mission with 7 WP, and 44 HE rounds. Unknown results. Time was 022200H.

At 030830H, in vic of YD 015565, road sweep from Elliot Combat Base found a crater in the road. At 0430, that morning Company du heard an explosion but believed it to be 175mm guns from Elliot. Engineers reported road impassable, to Company "C" at kne Gio Eridge. They then turned around to return to Elliot, and one duster, hit a mine in the same location of the crater. Tractor from Gampany "C" position moved out to fill in the crater.

At approx 1000H on the 4th, a PFC R, L. J. 9944, a member of 1/9 stopped at Cam Lo District Headquarters. He had been leaving the north gate of Elliot Combat Base and was sniped at resulting in gunshot wounds in left hand and left lower leg. He was treated and sent to "D" Med.

At 050825H in vic of YD 136617 a road sweep found one (1) US 60mm Mortar round, blew it in place.

In the vic of YD 016565 an ambush of Company "G" was approached by three NVA. Ambush was triggered using claymores and M-60. The NVA fled the area. Results was one (1) NVA KIA.

A squad from Company "C" conducting S/D operation in the vic of YD 025565 at approx 061315H discovered the following enemy ordnance in an area that showed signs of recent use. 6 - Russian AT Mines, 7 - US Claymores set with det cord, 1 - M-16 bouncing betty. All ordnance blown in place.

At 070730H in vic of YD 078571 four (4) children turned in 1 \sim M-16 magazine (full) and 1 US claymore mine, they was paid a total of 900 piasters.

At 072030H, ground surviellance (SID) located at Company "Ba indicated movement at 115743. At 2130, SID indicated track rehicles movement at 119748. At 2325 movement was to NE. Artillery was called in at 2030 and 2130. Heavier artillery was requested at 2230 for second target but was not obtained. Observed one secondary on grid 133754.



At 080745H, in vic of TD 151618, road sweep found one (1) dud 82mm Nortar round along the shoulder of the road, round was blown in place.

At 080815H in vic of YD 143613 road sweep found booby trapped M-79 round near shoulder of road. Round was planted in ground to be detonated by pressure of foot, blown in place.

At 080915H in vic of YD 104576, 20 Vietnamese children turned in 1 - LAAN, 1 dud 40mm LAAN round, 1 - N-79 round, 79 N-16 magazines (full), 1 N-26 frag grenade, 4 BAR magazines (full), 2 - AK-47 magazines and 1 bayonet (US). Children were paid 4800 piasters.

In the vic of YD 13362h at approx 080945 road sweep found dud. 105mm round 10 meters off of road. Round was blown in place.

At approx 081740H in vic of YD 148604 small arms was fired at truck being washed at C-3 bridge by man from HAS Company. Fire came from vic YD 140598, patrol sent out to check out area.

At 090335H in the vic of ID 104576 lk children turned in 21 - M-16 magazines (full), 2 - M-26 frag (renades, and one (1) AM/FRR9 radio receiver (serial, 10844). They were paid a total of 1250 piasters.

At ap row 091000N from vie YD 134695 a platoon combat patrol of Company "B" observed approx 12 NVA running to the northeast vie YD 139697. Combat patrol pursued and caught three. Acrial observor was requested. Artillery mission was requested but not fired. The remainder of the NVA fled into the ARVN AO. The three captured ware turned over to the CIT.

Company "B" at approx 100130H from vic of YD 116701 reported that the TTS-5 (radar) picked up troops moving south in three groups of 18-25 and two smaller groups. Estimated enemy strength of 30 troops. Requested artillery illum and HE mission, fired 50mm and 51mm Hortars and dusters. TTS-5 reported rounds on target. Troops began retreating to the north. At 0215, the artillery observer with Company "B" was informed the artillery missions was denyed and that Company "B" was to use organic weapons. If the unit was in contact aftillery would be available, but now they were on a tight schedule. This referred to Eattalion S-3. Continued with 60 and 31 nortars and dusters. At 0220 received artillery illum mission and at 0245 received artillery fire for effect. TTS-5 reported artillery mission on target hitting several small groups of retreating troops. By 0315 enemy movement negative.

DESCRIPTION OF THE PARTY OF THE

At 101915H Company "B" in vic of YD 117702 observed 15 NVA from the tower at Con Thian in vic of YD 157733 moving to the north. Artillery mission was conducted on the area with good coverage but unknown results.

At approx 100830H in vic of YD 131628 a truck on a road sweep hit a mine ad was disabled. Following the truck being disabled by the mine, four more mines were found and one Personnel Carrier was disabled by a sixth mine resulting in injuries. The mines were all plastic and were planted in tire tracks in staggered fashion in approx 20 meters intervals. For mines were new and buried 3-dr inches below ground. Two older mines approx 6 inches below ground. Route 558 was closed and another truck with engineers was sent to the scene.

At 111545H in vic of YD 089576, a Vietnamese woman was hit and killed by a truck from MCB-53. The Rat Patrol (road patrol) and NMCV personnel were sent to area. Civilians in area gradually dispensed.

A Regional Force Company at 121030H in vic of YD 110605 made contact with enemy carrying mines. Killed two (2) and captured 2 Chicom grenades and two anti-tank mines.

At approx 120900H in vic of YD 149612 a road sweep found one anti-vehiculer mine in road. Hine was approx 9 inches in diameter. Hine blown in place.

In vic of YD 131628 at approx 121115H a road sweep found a mine approx 9 inches in diameter, in the right tire track. Hine blown in place.

In the vic of YD 093603 Company "D" at approx 121300H found well concealed tunnel entrance with numerous footprints in the area. Believe prints were cat prints. No evidence of recent use. Also found trench running east-west. Trench 4 feet deep and 3 feet wide. Tunnel and trench destroyed.

At approx 121500H a observation post at Con Thein observed 10 NVA in open with packs moving to the northwest. Artillery was conducted, observed three NVA received direct artillery hits.

At approx 130500H in vic of YD 152609, the Slam Mortar: Platoon Hal fires resulted in the death of two Vietnamese.

Local security at C-3 bridge at approx 131130H in the vic of YD 148604 apprehended two (2) indigenous women thin blashing caps and det cord. Delivered to 15th CIT for interrogation and further investigation.

PSECRET Enclosure (1) OF CAPORET

Company "C" in the vic of YD 001566 at approx 131237% found three plastic type mines on Route 9 between the 00 and 01 North South grid line. One mine detonated by a 6% truck. The other two were blown in place by the road sweep team.

At 131915H Company MAN in the vic of YD 135645 sighted three (3) NVA wearing black PJ's inside outer wire. Three (3) rounds of canister and four (4) rounds of WP were fired by tanks. No bodies are overed.

Company "B" at 132355H located at Con Their reported two 122mm rockets impacted in vic YD 115695. A similar incident during noon of 12 June makes apparent a possible NVA attempt to register (Kanyany "B" position.

A platoon from Company **A** in vic of YD 122658 at 140830H discovered a fresh bunker with good overhead. Searching area they found one (1) AT Time. Mine blown in place.

At 15140CH Company "I" located in a perimeter in vis of YD 057586 observed five bunkers.

Combat patrol dispatched into area, all old h! X 8!, A frame type. Traces of CS were evident in the area. No signs of recent use in area. Area searched with negative results. Bunkers were destroyed.

At 151800H a short distance off the road in vic of YD 133533, a unit from Company "A" discovered following friendly ordnance neatly piled in a draw. 7 - 1051M HE rounds, 1 - 1051M Illum round, 4 - 60MI Mortar rounds, 6 - 811M mortar rounds, 8 - duster rounds, and 40 - 50 caliber rounds.

At 161915H, Company "Ar located at C-2 received 6-10 rounds of 122mm Rockets rounds, all rounds landed outside perimeter. Artillery fired rocket suppressive fire. AO in area reported a accurate grid of the MVA as YD 055673. He conducted an artillary mission on the site. Results unknown.

At 170615H Company "A" located at C-2, received two (2) volley of three (3) 122mm rockets each, all landed outside of the perimeter. Artillery and 81mm mortar missions called in on YD 105660 and YD 105668. Results unknown.

In grid square YD 0657 at 171205H, a road groder moving north off of I-80 on access road hit a large plastic mine, resulting in casualties. An army PC moved up same road shortly after and passed by the grader. Approaching rear of duster, PC hit a mine flipping PC over. Requested MedEvac copter for two (2) WIA, but an Army copter flew in and picked up MedEvac, Army MedEvac was not requested by 1/3, and source of the request is not known.

SECRET Enclosure (1) DECT Secreta

At 180830H, in vic of YD 142722, a tank leaving Con Thein to join 3/3 unit, hit a mine. Wegative damage to the tank.

A platoon combat patrol from Company "D" at 180945H in vic of YD 050586, found 10 bunkers, 4: X 8: in cleared area. Area appeared to have been used within last 4 days. Searched area finding 40 - 82mm Mortar rounds, three (3) cans 82mm Mortar fuzes (some old, some new), 2 bore swabs, 2 - AK 47 magazines with 60 rounds of ammo, 1 - 75mm recoiless cannister (empty), 3 - E-tools, 1 saw, 2 cans of coffee, and 3 unidentifiable objects 8 inches in diameter and 2 inches thick with silver attachment sticking out. These three objects were all 3 feet off the ground and anchored to trees. Destroyed everything, with the exception of one (1) of the unidentifiable objects, which were evacuated.

At 180900H, a road sweep from Company "A" located in vic of YD 135623 received SA fire from approx five (5) NVA located in vic of YD 134623. SA fire returned and NVA broke contact moving west. Sweep continued and completed, unit from Company "A" sent to S/D area.

A squad from Company "C" in vic of YD 073574 at approx 1909554 discovered a booby trapped 82mm Mortar round. Round rigged by MCI can. Blown in place.

In vic of YD 065570 at 191455H a 6X6 hit a mine (plastic), vehicle a total lost. Sweep team sent to sweep area in case of more mines.

At 201130H in vic of YD 134634, a SeaBee bulldozer hit a mine or live round in the ground. Slight damage done to vehicle. Two MEC resulted from explosion.

A road sweep at 210920H in vic of YD 036563 found one (1) plastic East German mine on exit road on south side of Route 9. Mine was 100 pounds, rigged with pressure release device, blown in place.

Company "A" at 212245H, in vic of YD 14660H, with Starlite scopes observed three (3) figures carrying weapons moving across channel to the north, approx 150 meters from lines. Fired small arms with unknown results.

NOTE: At 1530 on 19 June 1969, F/2/9, G/2/9, A Co 3d Tanks, and B Co 3d Tanks became OPCON to 1st Battalion, 3d Marines.





At 220615 H Company "A" moved out of C-2, and Company "E" began movement out of Con Thein for final phase of "Operation Virginia Ridge" to the east of C-2 and southeast of Con Thein.

As Company "A" and Company "B" moved out of position, Companies "F" and "G" of 2/9 assumed the responsibility for Con Their and C-2.

Company "F" of 2/9 located at C-2 received 9 rounds of 122mm rocket at 220640H, only one round fell inside of perimeter. Returned fire with artillery on YD 045673, results unknown.

At 221300H, Company "C" observed a mine explosion on Route 9, sent a road patrol vehicle to scene, a duster leaving Route 9 in vic of YD 050569 hit a large AT mine just as it left the black top. Excessive damage done to the custer, Army personnel suffer 1 KIA and 4 WIA. A MedEvac copter had been requested by the Army. Company "D" sent a sweep team to sweep the access road.

At 221540H, in the vic of YD 067642, Company "B" made contact with unknown size of NVA unit, located in vic of YD 069642. Pursued enemy with small arms and maneuver. Conducted artillery to the north. Tried to get the enemy to Cheiu Hoi. Killed 4 NVA and captured 4 - AK 47 and 1 pair of binocular.

At 230915H, in the vic of YD 133655 a member of "F" 2/9 on road sweep, suffered a gunshot would in the leg from accidental discharge of his .45 caliber pistol.

At 230830H, in vic of YD 01256H, road sweep from Commany "M" 3/3 advancing along road was ambushed by four (4) command detonated claymore mines. One wire connected all four and led across road to north side of river to vantage point. Vantage point had observation in both direction of road. Company "D" dispatched a platoon to sweep both sides of road and river, they had negative results. Company "D" conducted artillery on north side of river. Company "H" suffered 2 KIA and 8 WIA.

During the afternoon of 24 June 1969, two company sweep was terminated, and Companies "A" and "B" returned to their positions in Con Thein and C-2 respectfully.

At apirox 251100H, at Con Thein, three (3) members of Company "G" 2/9 entered a old Vietnamese minefield, plainly marked. One KIA and two WIA's.

A road sweep from HAS Company out of Cam Lo Mastrict Toriguarters at approx 250910H, in the vic of TD 130021 discovered two mines in the road and upon deploying to blow them, the team was taken under fire by five (5) enemy. The enemy were observed to flee to the southest by a platoon of "F" 2/9 which was in the area also. The enemy was taken under fire and one was observed to be hit and was observed being dragged away. The platoon of "F" swept the area with negative results. The two mines (1-401b AT mine (plastic), 140 lb metal AT line, rigged to be AP) was blown in place.

At 251420H the 3d Battalion, 3d Marines releaved the 1st Battalion, 3d Marines of the fixed positions (Con Thein, C-2, C-2 Bridge, Cam Lo District Headquarters and Khe Gio Bridge). As each unit was relieved they began movement toward the new Battalion AO to the west of Con Thein and C-2, and to the north of Dong Ha Mts (FSB Fuller).

Hotel Company 2/3 located on Dong Har (FSB Fuller) was . OPCON to 1/3.

At 271100H, in the vic of YD 046622 Company "C" discovered a cache in bunkers. Upon searching area throughly the following was found and destroyed, with the exception of one (1) can of 82mm Mortar fuzes, evacuated to Regiment. 1-RPG-2 round, 1-long handled Chicom grenade, 1 US 81mm Mortar round, 2-82mm Mortar round, 17-1-1b TNT blocks, 5-short Chicom grenades, 5-2% 1b blocks TMT, 10-11b blocks C-3, 100-AK-47 rounds, 1- AK assault pack, 2-satchel charges, 3-pith helmets, 1-pair Ho Chi Minh sandals, 1-AK-47 magazine, 30-82 mm mortar fuzes, assorted bandages (packaged and bloody), and one book (being sent to Regiment.

At 272355H, Company "A" located in vic of YD 078617, received two (2) rounds believed to be friendly 105mm artillery. Rounds landed within 100 meters of perimeter. One (1) man suffer a dislocated shoulder. Requested check fire.

At 280800H, in the vic of YD 046626 a patrol from Company "C" found 15 A Frame type bunkers along trail running in a easterly direction. One of the bunkers (all 8'Kh!) had been destroyed by artillery. Two cooking areas were discovered in the area connected by a maze of secondary trails. One morter pit and four fighting holes were also found in the area. Upon searching the area the following was found and destroyed along with the bunkers. 59-82mm Mortar rounds, 2-81mm Mortar rounds, 4-short Chicom granades, 2-long Chicom granades, 1-can of rice (12"by12"), 1-can soybean oil. 1-AK assault pack, miscellaneous propaganda literature, 1-13 lb block TMT, 1 bag AK-47 rounds (300), 12-82mm Mortar fuzes, 1-AK magazines, 14 containors mortar increments, 5-packets of dried fish, 1-center portion of 82 Mortar baseplate, 1-120mm mortar round, and assorted 782 gear and cooking gear.

At 291200H, in the vic of YD 08663h. Company "P" combat patrol found 25 bunkers, 7 of which had been used recently. Looked as if a enemy plateon had been in area. Discovered and destroyed following with exception of the papers forwarded to Regiment:

2-RFG rounds, 3-full AK-47 magazines, 1-AK47A drum (loaded), 7-82mm Mortar rounds, 3-blocks TNT, 1-60mm Mortar round, 1-pencho, 9-Chicom grenades, 4 rice bags, 1 pair wire cutters, 2-At mines, 1 directional mine,

1. SITUATION

- a. SNEMY: Prequently in the past 6 months, the enemy has attempted to temporarily interdict the MSR, Route 561, between C-3 Bridge and Con Thien. Due to the nature of the terrain along the road which enhances good observation, this has been an impossible task. His activity has thus been reduced to harassment characterised by strike ambushes, mining, sniper fire, and detonation of various type SFD. It is also well known that the enemy attempts to keep the road under constant observation from numerous vantage points and OP's along the road. From POW interrogation, it is known that these positions frequently have radio capability yielding VRS readings. Their mission appears to be radio interception while closely watching movement along Route 561. It does not take long to correllate vehicle tac markings on scheduled moves with unit call signs, thus breaking radio codes.
- b. FRENDLY FORCES: 1st Battalian, 3d Marines continues assigned mission of security of fixed positions from Khe Gio Bridge along Route 9 to Con Thien on Route 561. Activities include extensive day and night patrols through-out the AO. Friendly forces will be periodically operating in proximity to Route 561. Indirect fire support will be available through the 1st Battalian, 3d Marines CCC with Barcroft 24.
- c. ATTACHMENTS: Five APC's from H&: Company are attached to "A" Company, 3d Tanks for augmentation into route security plans.
- 2. MISSION: "A" Company, 3d Tank Battalion, in D/S of 1st Battalion, 3d Marines continues to provide armor support whenever armor can materially contribute to the destruction of the enemy and daily provides one section of tanks or APC's to provide security along Route 561 whenever the MSR is open for traffic.



- 1. On 25 June the Third Bn will complete its R & R and relieve the First Bn of the security role for the fixed positions (A-4, C-2, C-3B, CLDH, & KGB) and the LOC's in the Third Marines
- 2. Upon relief, the First Bn will be committed into the western portion of the 3d Marines AO, astride Mutter's Ridge and north of Dong Ha Mountain. As they move west to east the First Bn will squeeze out the Second Bn.

IT IS FELT SHAT THE REGIMENT IS NOT TAKING FULL ADVANTAGE OF THES CREAT QUANTITY OF POSSIBLE ARTILLERY SUPPORT.

2. DEFENSIVE FIRES. DEFENSIVE FIRES ARE WELT TO BE ESSENTIAL FOR EACH SEPARATE POSITION. ALTHOUGH PREQUENTLY TIME CONSUMING TO PREREGISTER, IT IS CONSIDERED WORTH TOTAL EFFORT TO OBTAIN AND REGISTER DEFENSIVE FIRES.

ARTILLERY NIGHT DEFENSIVE FIRES (NDF). ARTILLERY NDF 3 ARE RECOMMENDED TO BE FIRED BY TWO GUNS IN ADJUSTMENT. ARTILLERY BATTALIONS WILL FIRE THEM IN AS CLOSE AS 500 METERS with good gun target lines (GTL) and 800 meters when the angle "T" IS LESS THAN 900 MILS. FREQUENTLY THIS IS NOT CLOSE ENOUGH AND THEREFORE, UPON THE REQUEST OF THE INFANTRY BATTALION COMMANDER, THIS DISTANCE CAN BE REDUCED TO 300 METERS. IN THE LATTER CASE, NDF'S WILL BE RECHECKED BY THE ARTILLERY DURING METRO CONDITION CHANGES WITH W.P. ROUNDS, TIME FUZED, WITH 200 METER HEIGHT OF BURST. UPON ENEMY CONTACT THESE FIRES MAY BE ADJUSTED TOWARDS THE FRIENDLY POSITIONS IN 50 METER INCREMENTS.

5. MORTAR MIGHT DEFENSIVE FIRES. MORTAR MIGHT D'S ARE USED TO CLOSE THE FIRE SUPPORT GAP BETWEEN THE ARTILLERY FIRES AND THE INFANTRY DEFENSIVE POSITIONS. TIMES FIRES SHOULD ALSO BE REGISTERED AS CLOSE AS SAFETY PERMITS. UNDER PROFER SUBME-VISION 81'S HAVE BEEN BROUGHT IN TO 100 RETERS AND 60'S TO 50 METERS, FROM THE FRIGHDIN LINES. MORTAR AND CAN BE BUILT UP QUICKLY ON ANY POSITION BY PRIORITY RESUPPRY.

- C. ILLUMINATION FIRES. ILLUMINATION BY ANY AND ALL MEANS IS OF GREAT ASSISTANCE ONCE UNDER ATTACK. THESE TARGETS MAY ALSO BE PREREDISTERED BY ARTILLERY & MORTAR BATTERIES AND FIRED IN MINUTES WHEN UNDER ATTACK. THE LACK OF FRIENDLY ILLUMINATION, WHEN AN ATTACK IS IMMINENT, IS THE ONE GREAT ADVANTAGE THE ENEMY HAS TO EXPLOIT OUR CONFUSION AND INITIAL LACK OF ORIENTATION. PROPERLY USED ILLUMINATION PROVIDES FRIENDLY FORCES THE ADVANTAGE.
- d. ASTILLERY FINAL PROTECTIVE FIRES (FPF). EACH INFANTRY EATTALION IN HERBEY ASSIGNED ONE ARTICLERY FPF, UNLESS FRIORITIES AND READJUSTED BY THIS HEADQUARTERS. A DATTERY FPF WILL HAVE THE LAMB SAFATE CALIBRATE AS THE LATTEREST MOSTER. HOWEVER, THE RESTS. TRATION IS MORE TIME CONSUMING BECAUSE SIX GUNS VERSUS TWO WILL BE REGISTERED. THE FFF WILL BE LAID ON THE BATTERY'S GUNS AT ALL TIMES WHEN NOT ENGAGED IN ANOTHER MISSION.
- 3. HARRASSING & INTERDICTION FIRES (H & I). H & I'S CAN BE USED TO COVER EVERY AVENUE OF APPROACH & DANGER AREA NOT AMBUSHED OR COVERED BY A WELL PLACED LISTENING POST. THIS REGIMENT WILL NEVER RESTRICT THE NUMBER OF H & I TARGETS, IF THE ASR DOES NOT PRECLUDE SAME.

- b. ZONE & SHIFT FIRES (Z & S). IF THE KNOWN OR SUSPECTED TARGET IS AREA IN NATURE, WHETHER MOVING OR FIXED, ZONE & SHIFT, FFE CAN BE REQUESTED. FOR SUBSEQUENT FIRES, CORRECT AND REPEAT THE FFE.
- C. REINFORCING FIRES. IF A GREATER VOLUME OF FIRES OR A LANGER CALIBER OF ARTILLERY IS DESIRED REQUEST REINFORCING FIRES BE ADDED TO a. & b. ABOVE.
