9. Mission Assigned

a. To occupy and control assigned TAOR and defend MLR in TAOR (See Operations Overlay); conduct search and destroy operations in TAOR; conduct combat/reconnaissance patrolling throughout TAOR and be prepared to conduct combined and coordinated operations within and/or beyond assigned TAOR.

10. Background

a. 2nd Bn, 3d Marines commenced Operation LIBERTY at 090800H June with "E" and "F" Companies extending their MLR to the south astride route #5 (AKA #540). At 170400H June, companies "G" and "H" passed through companies "E" and "F" and attacked south and southwest (See Operation Order 17-66). Forward movement of Companies "G" and "H" ceased on 20 June when they secured that portion of the TAOR to phase line GREEN.

b. On 29 June, Company "F", having been relieved by "M" Company, 3rd Bn, 3rd Marines, passed through "G" and "H" Companies and established a company patrol base on HILL 65 (AT 879576). Movement was unopposed.

c. At 290800H, operational control of Company "E" was passed to 3rd Bn, 3rd Marines. Company "E" remained in their previous position; i.e. HILL 41 (AT 934663).

11. General

a. As of 302400H, Companies "G" and "F" were involved in consolidating their positions and performing limited patrol action. Company "H" was consolidating its position, performing limited patrol action, and establishing a perimeter defense for the battalion command post.

b. The battalion command post was located above the village of Dai Lee in an old French fort. Command post improvement and organization continued. Effective control of the three (3) rifle companies was maintained by radio and wire and no unusual difficulties in command and control were experienced.

c. Special Services

(1) Special services activities during the reporting period includes the following:

(a) A ration of beer and soft drinks is distributed to the front line companies daily when it is available from division clubs system.

(b) On 15 June, special service facilities secured until approximately 15 July.

2. Administrationa. Personnel Account.

(1) Non-consumable addressograph supplies still remain a major problem. Companies are using the old style Unit Diary forms and even these are becoming short in supply.

(2) Currently the battalion is operating in a split CP which contributes to the overall slowness of administration.

b. Awards. During this period, there were thirteen (13) Purple Heart Medals presented by the Regimental Commander.

c. Promotions. The following promotions were delivered during the period:

d. Postal. Due to split CP, the mail delivery time has been increased. No other difficulties have been experienced.

e. Pay. Pay has been excellent to outstanding, but problems will occur in paying all personnel due to the Battalion's large area of responsibility and the dispersion of personnel there in.

f. Post Exchange. Arrangements have been made to procure mobile exchange for use with battalion forward areas.

5. Legal and Discipline. During the period, there were two (2) Special Courts Martial held. Currently there is one (1) formal investigation pending concerning accidental discharge which resulted in a death. There are currently being processed for undesirable discharge, two (2) persons presently in the III MAF detention facility.

There is one (1) man on official legal with a rotation tour date of 19 June 66. The following Article 15 punishments were held within the Battalion:

3. Intelligencea. Enemy Situation at Beginning of Period

(1) As of 1 June, confirmed units within the TAOR consisted of the R24 Company, Doc Lap Battalion and the Dai Loc Local Force Company with a combined strength of one hundred ninety (190) men.

(2) Carried as probable within the TAOR was the H54 Local Force Company with a strength of two hundred (200) men.

(3) The R20 (Doc Lap) Battalion Headquarters and the R21 Company, Doc Lap Battalion with a combined strength of two hundred thirty (230) men were confirmed vicinity GS (AT 9354), approximately 3000-5000 meters south of the TAOR.

(4) The Hoa Hieu Local Force Company was confirmed vicinity GS (AT 9664), two thousand (2000) meters east of the TAOR.

(5) The V25/5 Battalion, with a strength of five hundred (500) men, was carried as probable vicinity GS (AT 8753), four thousand (4000) meters south of the TAOR.

(6) There were numerous reports from Dai Loc District Headquarters of VC units in the southern portion of the TAOR. District Intelligence Officers reported the following units as possible:

(a) R22 Company, Doc Lap Battalion vicinity AT 893605.

(b) Quang Da Local Force Company vicinity AT 858548.

(c) Unidentified company (300 men) vicinity AT 926596.

(7) The VC continued to rely almost exclusively on mine and booby trap activity to deny USMC units access to areas outside defensive perimeters.

Initiated Incidents During the Period

- (1) 010100H - "G" Co: Platoon position received one (1) incoming grenade. Area was searched with negative results.
- (2) 010755H - "E" Co: Engineer sweep team discovered wire leading to a mine in road vicinity AT943674. Mine was identified as a 25-lb wooden shape charge. The wire was traced 100 meters into a paddy where it ended behind a tombstone. Ends of wire were prepared for attachment to battery.
- (3) 022207H - "H" Co: Patrol tripped mine of unknown type vicinity AT909689. Explosion was larger than that of a grenade. Thought to possibly be a VC shape charge. Three (3) USMC WIA.
- (4) 030730H - "G" Co: Patrol tripped grenade type mine vicinity AT878700. Mine utilized a trip wire attached to a rock weight. One (1) USMC KIA, one (1) USMC WIA.
- (5) 031700H - "H" Co: Patrol found six (6) blasting caps wrapped in tin foil and hidden in brush vicinity AT900700. Caps were destroyed.
- (6) 031730H - "H" Co: Patrol tripped possible M-26 grenade rigged to explode when branch was pushed out of way on trail vicinity AT899704. Grenade probably employed rock weight attached to branch. One (1) USMC WIA.
- (7) 031950H - "F" Co: LP detected two (2) persons near their wire vicinity AT944718. Patrol went out to investigate and saw the persons running. People were ordered to stop and two (2) rounds were fired over their heads. The area was searched with negative results.
- (8) 040035H - "E" Co: Patrol apprehended two (2) VN males who ran from ambush sight. Men were pursued and captured vicinity AT943654. Both men's ID cards had been altered. Men were sent to District Headquarters for initial interrogation. Released as non-VCS.

- (9) 051200H - "E" Co: Mine sweep team detected wire running from paddy to side of road in the vicinity of AT 943676. Probe of road revealed a 5-6 pound wooden shape charge. Mine had been emplaced the previous night. Content was TRI TONAL plastic explosive. Mine was recovered and sent to EOD for study.
- (10) 051415H - "H" Co: Patrol discovered two (2) 20mm rounds buried in trail vicinity AT 921691. This is approximately 150 meters from the company CP. Rounds were buried two (2) feet apart and utilized wire plungers as firing pins. Rounds were destroyed in place.
- (11) 051450H - "E" Co: Mine sweep team received six (6) rounds of carbine fire vicinity AT 945675. Fire originated from La Chau (2) vicinity AT 948675. Upon coordination with the adjacent unit, a squad was dispatched to search the hamlet. Results of search was negative.
- (12) 060710H - "H" Co: Patrol tripped mine on trail vicinity AT 902705. Device was possible MK II fragmentation grenade with trip wire. Grenade was attached to forked stick and tripping wire caused grenade to be pulled onto trail in front of point man. Two (2) USMC WIA.
- (13) 070645H - "H" Co: Patrol searched house vicinity AT 914689 and found two (2) women, but table was set for five (5). Man was found hiding in bunker. Man admitted that he was a VC sympathizer and had been feeding four (4) local VC's in his house. Man was sent to ITT. Ambush was set in around house in attempt to apprehend other VC's using the house. Ambush had negative results.
- (14) 081130H - "E" Co: Long-range patrol observed five (5) VC manning a roadblock vicinity AT 927610, prohibiting local residents from traveling north into Hieu Duc District. FO with patrol requested fire mission. FO reported that fire mission destroyed road block and assessed enemy casualties as three (3) KIA (probable) and two (2) WIA (probable).

- (15) 081645H - "E" Co: Engineer sweep team found M-26 grenade with trip wire beside road vicinity AT 943668. Grenade was destroyed in place.
- (16) 090730H - "E" Co: Patrol apprehended female VN vicinity AT 945671. Woman was observed digging by road on 8 June in same area in which booby trap was found. Woman had invalid ID card and was sent to District Headquarters as a VCS. Woman was released as a non-VCS but it was determined that her husband and younger sister are active VC's.
- (17) 090800H - "E" Co: Engineer sweep team found wire buried in side of road vicinity AT 944677. Probe of road revealed that wire was not attached to any device. Sweep team traced wire into paddies. One (1) man pulled on wire and there was a detonation about 200 meters out in the paddy. It is now evident that the device was intentionally emplaced in this manner to inflict casualties on the sweep teams in the area.
- (18) 090920H - 3d Recon Bn: Recon patrol observed three (3) VC around fire vicinity AT 844046. Artillery mission was fired with good coverage. Patrol assessed casualties as three (3) KIA (probable).
- (19) 091545H - "G" Co: Company Commander, enroute to his CP, received one (1) round sniper fire at AT 903717. Personnel in passing truck dismounted and searched area with negative results.
- (20) 100630H - "E" Co: Company, in conjunction with
101300H - district forces, conducted search and destroy operation in La Chau (2) vicinity AT 945678. Engineer team destroyed 14 tunnels. Woman was apprehended as a VC when search revealed an M-16 pressure fuze and a quantity of U.S. medicines in her house. Two (2) others were apprehended as VCS. All three (3) were retained by the district forces.
- (21) 101030H - "E" Co: Four (4) USMC personnel on water run vicinity AT 915667, were ambushed by six (6) VC. VC threw two (2) grenades and fired 10 rounds of S/A fire. One (1)

grenade damaged the vehicle (M-274) and the other landed in a stream. Grenade in stream caused three (3) secondary explosions, indicating mines had been emplaced in stream bed. Tank/infantry counteraction unit made sweep of area and apprehended two (2) male VN as possible VC's. Men were sent to ITT and classified as VCS by ITT. Three (3) USMC WIA.

- (22) 101400H - "F" Co: Patrol discovered and destroyed bunker vicinity AT 944645. Bunker was 5'x5' and had been used as a shelter and fighting hole.
- (23) 102130H - CombActCo: Ambush sighted three (3) to five (5) VC moving toward ambush site vicinity AT 950691. Ambush opened fire with 12 rounds. VC returned approximately 10 rounds (some automatic). Ambush then fired approximately 100 rounds and received 10 rounds from vicinity AT 952691. Area was then searched with negative results. Ambush feels they inflicted one (1) WIA (probable).
- (24) 111010H - "A" 1/12: Patrol received one (1) grenade vicinity AT 932732. Patrol pursued two (2) men suspected of throwing the grenade but lost contact when they ran into hamlet.
- (25) 111150H - "F" Co: Search and destroy operation resulted in the following action: Cave vicinity AT 948663 destroyed. Cave had two (2) entrances and measured 8'x4'x4'; tunnel complex vicinity AT 945636. Complex measured 3'x4'x20' with a bamboo floor and five (5) feet of dirt overhead; three (3) tunnels vicinity AT 948634 destroyed. Complex measured 8'x6'x12' and was reinforced with bamboo; cave in river bank vicinity AT 951632 destroyed. Cave had entry on river bank and another below the water line.
- (26) 111430H - "G" Co: Patrol apprehended two (2) male VN and one (1) female vicinity AT 908716. ID check revealed one (1) man as being listed on the VC Blacklist. All three (3) were sent to ITT for interrogation.

- (27) 111730H - "G" Co: Patrol apprehended male VN after ID check revealed he was listed on the VC Blacklist. Man sent to ITT.
- (28) 120945H - "E" Co: Engineer sweep team apprehended female VN with large amount of mail. Woman was classified as suspected delivery agent for VC. Sent to District Headquarters for interrogation. Search of woman at district revealed a VC ID card. Woman sent to Province Headquarters as VC.
- (29) 121650H - "G" Co: Patrol tripped rock-fall type mine vicinity AT 879704. One (1) USMC WIA. Area was searched and a 20mm round filled with explosives and rigged with trip wire was found approximately 50 meters from the first mine. Mine was destroyed in place.
- (30) 130745H - "G" Co: Patrol vicinity AT 907717 made routine ID check of two (2) male VN's. Check revealed both men were listed on the VC Blacklist. Taken to ITT as VCS.
- (31) 130940H - "E" Co: Patrol observed VC manning road block vicinity AT 927611. FO with patrol called fire mission. Mission fired with good coverage. FO observed three (3) KIA.
- (32) 130940H - "G" Co: Patrol apprehended three (3) boys approximately 14 years old in a restricted area vicinity AT 892705. Boys were sent to District Headquarters for appropriate action.
- (33) 131500H - "E" Co: Patrol observed seven (7) VC at road block vicinity AT 928610. FO with patrol called fire mission. Mission fired with good target coverage. FO observed five (5) KIA after mission.
- (34) 131700H - "F" Co: Search and destroy operation resulted in the following action: Two (2) caves and one (1) bunker destroyed vicinity AT 953629. Bunker measured 3'x3'x5' with two (2) well camouflaged apertures; one (1) bunker destroyed vicinity AT 954631. Bunker measured 6'x6'x6' with two (2) apertures; one (1) T-shaped cave destroyed vicinity AT 954628.

- (35) 140715H - "G" Co: Patrol apprehended one (1) male VN vicinity AT 908718 during routine check of ID card. Man's name appeared on the VC Blacklist. Sent to ITT as VCS.
- (36) 140930H - "E" Co: Engineer sweep team apprehended male VN with large amount of medical supplies vicinity AT 944676. Medicines included Vitamin B-12, Streptomycin, Ascorbic Acid, and Vitamin B-1. Man also had four (4) BA-30 batteries. Man was sent to District Headquarters.
- (37) 141415H - "E" Co: Patrol observed three (3) armed VC entering hamlet of An My (3) vicinity AT 925610. FO with patrol called fire mission. Mission fired with good target coverage. FO assessed three (3) WIA (probable).
- (38) 150845H - "E" Co: Patrol observed three (3) VC digging in road vicinity AT 927614, possibly laying mines. FO called fire mission. VC ran into hamlet. No known casualties.
- (39) 150915H - "E" Co: Engineer sweep team found decoy mine vicinity AT 942669. Mine proved to be 6" diameter piece of metal buried 4" below the surface. Area was probed for other mines with negative results.
- (40) 161200H - "F" Co: Patrol found a 105mm shell on trail vicinity AT 941630. Round had not been booby trapped but had been tampered with. Shell was destroyed in place.
- (41) 161445H - "F" Co: Patrol discovered tunnel measuring 6'x3'x12' vicinity AT 948621. Also found trenchline 110 meters long, 4' deep, 2' wide. Both installations were destroyed.
- (42) 161845H - "E" Co: Patrol observed six (6) VC working on road block vicinity AT 925613. FO called fire mission. Mission fired with good target coverage. FO assessed three (3) KIA (probable).
- (43) 161900H - "E" Co: Patrol observed three (3) VC with weapons vicinity AT 926610. FO called fire mission with good coverage. FO observed two (2) KIA after mission.

- (44) 162000H - "H" Co: CP received approximately 15-20 rounds S/A fire vicinity AT 956667 from 200 meters on each side of the perimeter. Mortars fired illumination and HE with unknown results.
- (45) 171215H - Cmd Grp "A": Forward elements of the Battalion search and destroy operation destroyed the following ordnance and installations: Four (4) ChiCom grenades vicinity AT 926610; one (1) 105mm round vicinity AT 926612; one (1) 105mm round vicinity AT 927625; one (1) 20mm round vicinity AT 924610; two (2) tunnels vicinity AT 924609; one (1) 105mm round vicinity AT 929611.
- (46) 171230H - Cmd Grp "A": Forward elements observed snipers in treeline vicinity AT 909595. Artillery mission fired with unknown results.
- (47) 171255H - "H" Co: Company forward elements received S/A fire from sniper vicinity AT 925597. Artillery mission fired with unknown results.
- (48) 171300H - "F" Co: Patrol observed three (3) VCS. VN's spotted patrol and tried to evade into hamlet of Phu Son (4) vicinity AT 946637. Patrol fired two (2) rounds M-79 without any effect. VN's ran into hamlet and into lead element of another patrol. All three (3) were apprehended. Had no ID cards. Sent to ITT as VCS.
- (49) 171300H - Cmd Grp "A": Bulldozer hit mine in road vicinity AT 927610. Type of mine unknown. Dozer lost track and was recovered.
- (50) 171310H - "H" Co: Company forward elements received sniper fire from vicinity AT 928-607. Artillery mission fired with unknown results.
- (51) 180830H - "H" Co: Patrol discovered and destroyed cave vicinity AT 932608. Cave measured 20' long with an entry 8'x16'.
- (52) 180845H - "H" Co: Patrol apprehended two (2) VN females vicinity AT 931607. Initial interrogation indicated they were VC liaison personnel. Sent to ITT.

- (53) 180930H - "G" Co: Company with Engineer assistance destroyed the following vicinity AT 915-605: One (1) tunnel measuring 15'x4'x4' with exit below water line; eight (8) bunkers reinforced with rock and bamboo measuring 6'x6'x6'; one (1) steel reinforced bunker 6'x6'x6'; three (3) small boats.
- (54) 181130H - "H" Co: Company with Engineer assistance destroyed the following vicinity AT 921-603: One (1) cave in "Z" shape. The legs were 8', 10', and 10' long and 5' wide. Cave was reinforced with rock and bamboo; one (1) cave reinforced with rock and bamboo 9'x3'x12'.
- (55) 181145H - Cmd Grp "A": Forward elements with bulldozer filled in trenchline vicinity AT 925609. Trench was 2'x5'x400 meters. Also destroyed two (2) bunkers measuring 8'x10'x10' vicinity AT 921605.
- (56) 181330H - "G" Co: Patrol observed one (1) VC with weapon running along tree line vicinity AT 911609. Patrol fired on VC, killing him. VC threw weapon away when patrol opened fire and weapon could not be found.
- (57) 181730H - "G" Co: Patrol apprehended one (1) male VN vicinity AT 915592 in same area in which patrol had observed mine field, punji traps and caves. Initial interrogation revealed man was liaison for VC. Man was sent to ITT.
- (58) 182000H - "F" Co: CP received 30 rounds S/A fire from approximately 100 meters SE of CP vicinity AT 950663. Eight (8) rounds of M-79 were fired at area in which muzzle flashes were observed. Patrol searched area with negative results.
- (59) 182035H - "E" Co: Patrol observed four (4) men running across paddies after company CP received sniper fire. Patrol pursued and captured two (2). Men sent to ITT as VCS.
- (60) 190730H - "E" Co: Patrol enroute to CP with two (2) VCS, apprehended on night of 18 June, apprehended two (2) others in same area. Search of area revealed tunnel and spider

traps. Patrol searched tunnel and found cartridge belt with one (1) ChiCom grenade and two (2) M-26 grenades attached. Also found bag of clothing and documents. Tunnel and spider traps were destroyed. Ordnance given to Engineers for disposal. Two (2) men sent to ITT as VCS.

- (61) 190845H - "G" Co: Patrol found and destroyed two (2) tunnels vicinity AT 915593. Tunnels were 15'x6'x4' each.
- (62) 191110H - "G" Co: Patrol destroyed four (4)-strand barbed wire fence 6' high and 50' long vicinity AT 915593. Fence was booby trapped with unknown device.
- (63) 191150H - "H" Co: Patrol destroyed bunker vicinity AT 920595. Bunker measured 6'x5'x4' and was reinforced with rock and bamboo.

d. Significant Trends During the Period

(1) There has been a decided increase in anti-vehicular mining activity along Route #540 (redesignated from Route #5). Within six (6) days (1st to the 7th), a twenty-five (25) pound and a five (5) pound shape charge were discovered at two (2) bridges approximately one hundred (100) meters apart. In both instances the mines were prepared for electrical detonation.

(2) On 8 June, the VC employed a new method of booby trapping. It is standard procedure for mine sweep teams upon locating wire leading to the road to cut the wire. While one (1) section probes for the mine, another team traces the wire to its source. On this occasion the wire leading to the road was buried with no charge attached. The other end of the wire (about two hundred (200) meters across the paddies) was attached to a grenade. When the wire was pulled, the grenade was activated. It appears the VC are devising this method of booby trapping to inflict casualties specifically upon the mine sweep teams who clear the roads daily.

(3) The first incident of a close-quarter ambush by the VC occurred on 10 June in the vicinity of AT 915667. Four (4) USMC personnel with a vehicle were attacked by six (6) VC with grenades and small arms fire. Two (2) USMC were wounded by small arms fire and one (1) by grenade fragments. The vehicle was badly damaged by grenade fragments and small arms fire.

(4) There were many reports of VC units gathering rice and corn in the extreme southern portion of the TAOR. It appeared the VC were aware of the Battalion's impending move and were attempting to gather food stuffs before USMC forces arrived in the area to curtail their activities.

e. Enemy Situation at End of Reporting Period

(1) As of 30 June, confirmed units within the TAOR consist of the R24 Company, Doc Lap Battalion and the Dai Loc Local Force Company with a combined strength of one hundred and ninety (190) men.

(2) Possible units within the TAOR, as reported by Dai Loc District

intelligence personnel, consist of one (1) unidentified company of the 402 Battalion (NVA), and one (1) unidentified company of the V25/5 Battalion with a combined strength of two hundred (200) men.

(3) The R20 (Doc Lap) Battalion Headquarters and the R21 Company Doc Lap Battalion with a combined strength of two hundred and thirty (230) men is confirmed vicinity GS (AT 9354), approximately three thousand (3000) to five thousand (5000) meters southeast of the TAOR.

(4) The 402 Battalion (NVA) with a strength of four hundred (400) men is confirmed in vicinity GS (AT 8060), approximately three thousand (3000) meters west of the TAOR.

(5) Three (3) unidentified companies of the V25/5 Battalion are carried as possible in vicinity of GS (AT 8454, AT 8555 and AT 8854), approximately one thousand (1000) to two thousand (2000) meters south of the TAOR.

(6) The V25/5 Battalion Headquarters is carried as probable in vicinity of GS (AT 8753), approximately three thousand (3000) to five thousand (5000) meters south of the TAOR.

(7) The enemy continues to avoid direct contact in force with USMC units. There are approximately nine (9) platoons of guerrillas under control of VC Main Force units, operating within the area of mine laying and food requisitioning agencies for the Main Force units.

All adults were screened and all identification was checked. All people were examined by the battalion surgeon and a team of corpsmen. The Hieu Duc District Chief spoke to the assembled people and his speech was well received. A recreation area was set up for the children consisting of volley ball nets and a soccer field. The children participated actively.

(b) On 23 and 24 June, the Dai Loc District Chief spoke over the district public address system and explained to his people the purpose of U. S. Marine Corps activities within the district and encouraged their cooperation and assistance.

(c) Psychological pamphlets were distributed throughout the battalion MCR during Operation LIBERTY by the use of CH-46 helicopters.

d. River Operations: None.

6. Nuclear, Biological, Chemical and other Special Type Warfare

a. This battalion has not employed CBR weapons. However, scout dog teams and scout sniper teams with squad patrols and platoon and company size operations have been utilized.

b. Each company has assigned one (1) NBC officer and three (3) enlisted personnel as company NBC NCO's. Each company has assigned personnel by name to either a monitoring or decontamination team that is trained at company level.

d. Control. Control is exercised through organizational radio and telephone equipment.

e. Problem Area. This battalion has no major problem area.

8. Communications-Electronics

a. Wire. Maintenance on existing lines was continued. Isolated incidents of line cutting occurred. The move to the Dai Loc area precipitated a need for new local wire lines. The task of laying these is underway.

b. Radio. No significant change from last month. The division of the battalion CP required the use of all available FM equipment. Some difficulty was experienced in netting PRC-25's with PRC-10's, particularly if the distance was greater than two (2) miles and over moderate hilly terrain. This has not proved to be a real problem in the past.

c. Radio Relay. The MRC-62 radio relay shot from the new CP site to regiment has been operating excellently. Some interference has been noted and is the possible cause of garbling on some TT transmissions.

d. Message Center. The siting of the battalion message center at the battalion administration rear has necessitated a TT link from it to the battalion forward CP. This has been working satisfactorily. Difficulty has been experienced with AN/TGC-14A (V) and the distribution of equipment and personnel to run two (2) ~~message~~ centers has required the use of technical assistance from regimental communications.

e. Maintenance.

(1) Close liaison with companies is being maintained in order to achieve satisfactory control of 1st echelon preventive maintenance. Heavy usage of equipment continues to take its toll in broken antennas and malfunctioning handsets. The end of the month total on deadlined 3rd echelon portable radios was nine (9) AN/PRC-6's and eight (8) AN/PRC-10's.

(2) Battery supply has been excellent. Items still in short are whip and short antennas.

f. Problems Encountered. Major problem continues to be maintenance and repair on AN/PRC-10's and AN/PRC-6's.

Vietnamese ran south. Area searched with negative results. This battalion conducted eleven (11) squad size day patrols, fifteen (15) squad size night patrols, thirty (30) ambushes, twenty-four (24) listening posts and sixty-six (66) H&I fires.

- (4) 4 June - At 040030H, "E" Company patrol apprehended two (2) Vietnamese male VCS vicinity AT 943654 who were wandering around village. When they spotted patrol, they ran into a house. Patrol apprehended and their identification cards were altered. VCS turned over to District Headquarters. This battalion conducted eleven (11) squad size day patrols, sixteen (16) squad size night patrols, thirty-one (31) ambushes, twenty-three (23) listening posts and seventy-four (74) H&I fires.
- (5) 5 June - National police feel that Vietnamese male killed in mine incident on 040945H was not a VC. After questioning local people, police state that two (2) VC informed villagers that mine was U. S. not VC initiated. There was no report regarding identity of two (2) VC. At 051200H, an engineers sweep team found a five (5) to six (6) pound shape charge set for electrical detonation. Engineers estimated that mine was put in on previous night. Mine had wooden top and the hole of shape charge was filled with broken glass. Mine was removed and sent to Engineer Battalion for study. At 051540H, engineers received six (6) rounds small arms fire vicinity AT 946675. "E" Company sent a squad to conduct a sweep of area. The results of the search were negative. At 052320H, a man from 3rd Platoon, "G" Company tripped and fell into a machine gun emplacement vicinity AT 888726 breaking his left arm. Med evac effected. This battalion conducted fourteen (14) squad size day patrols, eighteen (18) squad size night patrols, thirty-nine (39) ambushes, twenty-two (22) listening posts and ninety (90) H&I fires.
- (6) 6 June - At 060710H, 3rd Platoon, "H" Company patrol tripped a booby trap vicinity AT 902705 resulting in two (2) USMC WIA's. Med evac effected. Booby trap was Mark II hand grenade rigged with hip high wire in fork of stick. Wire pulled grenade onto path the patrol moved on. Area was searched with negative results. This battalion conducted twelve (12) squad size day patrols, seventeen (17) squad size night patrols, thirty-three (33) ambushes, twenty-two (22) listening posts and eighty-four (84) H&I fires.

Man came out of family bunker. Man is definitely helping VC. Man and women sent to ITT. At 070815H, E-3 patrol was fired upon by a CM. The OI-E fired three (3) smoke rockets before patrol could fire green star cluster and smoke to identify friendly positions. Aircraft was identified as a Vietnamese plane. An aerial observer was sent out to clear area of aircraft. This battalion conducted thirteen (13) squad size day patrols, sixteen (16) squad size night patrols, thirty-four (34) ambushes, twenty-three (23) listening posts and eighty-two (82) H&I fires.
- (8) 8 June - At 081130H, 3rd Platoon, "E" Company saw five (5) VC in a road block position vicinity AT 927610. VC were stopping personnel moving north on Route 5. Artillery fire mission called and twenty-four (24) rounds fired for effect. An estimated three (3) or four (4) VC were killed and two (2) wounded. Road block was destroyed. Mine sweeping team discovered a M-26 grenade booby trap vicinity AT 943668 on shoulder of road. Booby trap blown in place. This battalion conducted fourteen (14) squad size day patrols, sixteen (16) squad size night patrols, thirty-two (32) ambushes, twenty-four (24) listening posts and ninety-two (92) H&I fires.
- (9) 9 June - Engineer sweep team found two (2) wires leading into road bank vicinity AT 944677. Engineers cut wire and dug into road bed but found no mine. While tracing down other end of wire, a M-26 or Chi Com grenade detonated. Booby trap was rigged to detonate when wire was pulled. At 091545H, G-6 actual enroute to "G" Company CP (vicinity AT 903717) received one (1) round sniper fire. Stopped vehicle, and checked nearby woodcutters with negative results. This battalion conducted ten (10) squad size day patrols, ten (10) squad size night patrols, thirty-one (31) ambushes, twenty-three (23) listening posts and eighty-seven (87) H&I fires.
- (10) 10 June - At 101015H, a "F" Company patrol member injured his leg on bamboo (not a punji stake) requiring med evac. Injury was non combat. At 101030H, four (4) men from "E" Company on a mule were attacked by six (6) VC at platoon water point vicinity AT 915667.

VC threw two (2) Chi Com grenades, one grenade was thrown into water which detonated three (3) mines of unknown type injuring one (1) USMC with shrapnel wounds. Two (2) WIA's were sustained from thirty (30) rounds carbine fire from VC. E-2 patrol diverted into area. VC broke contact when patrol approached. At 101400H, "F" Company destroyed a bunker vicinity AT 944645. Bunker was apparently used as shelter and fighting hole. At 102130H, CAC #1 saw three (3) VC moving west vicinity AT 952691 toward friendly position. Fired eight (8) rounds at VC. VC returned twenty (20) rounds of semi automatic fire and then VC broke contact. Patrol dispatched to search area. In addition, this battalion conducted nine (9) squad size day patrols, nine (9) squad size night patrols, thirty (30) ambushes, twenty-two (22) listening posts and seventy-eight (78) H&I fires.

- (11) 11 June - At 111150H, "F" Company destroyed a cave vicinity AT 948663 and four (4) tunnels vicinity AT 945636 and AT 948634. "F" Company Commander visited village and offered food for deceased family. Civil affairs officer visited the family and rendered such assistance as possible. At 111730H, "G" Company patrol making a routine identification check vicinity AT 908719 apprehended one (1) Vietnamese male whose name was on black list. Man sent to ITT. In addition, this battalion conducted nine (9) squad size day patrols, nine (9) squad size night patrols, thirty (30) ambushes, twenty-three (23) listening posts and one hundred and three (103) H&I fires.

- (12) 12 June - At 120945H, engineer sweep team apprehended one (1) Vietnamese male VCS vicinity AT 943675. VCS had large amount of mail (letters) in his possession. VCS appears to be possible mailman for VC in Dai Loc District. VCS sent to Hieu Duc District Headquarters for interrogation. At 121650H, "G" Company patrol tripped a rock fall booby trap (Chi Com grenade) vicinity AT 879744 wounding one (1) USMC with shrapnel wounds in his left arm. Med evac effected. Patrol searched area. While searching area, patrol found another rock fall type booby trap. Booby trap blown in place. In addition, this battalion conducted nine (9) squad size day patrols, seven (7) squad size night patrols, twelve (12) ambushes, twenty-five (25) listening posts and ninety-six (96) H&I fires.

Three (3) VCS sent to Hieu Duc District Headquarters for interrogation. At 131500H, "E" Company patrol observed seven (7) VC vicinity AT 928610. Artillery mission called resulting in five (5) VC KIA. "F" Company, 3rd Platoon destroyed two (2) caves and two (2) bunkers 6'X6'X6'. In addition, this battalion conducted seven (7) squad size day patrols, six (6) squad size night patrols, twelve (12) ambushes, twenty-two (22) listening posts and ninety-six (96) H&I fires.
- (14) 14 June - At 140715H, "G" Company patrol apprehended one (1) VCS vicinity AT 908718 during routine identification card check. VCS's name appeared on black list. VCS sent to ITT for interrogation. At 140930H, engineer sweep team apprehended one (1) Vietnamese male VCS vicinity AT 944676. Man was carrying a large amount of medicine. VCS taken to Hieu Duc District Headquarters for interrogation. At 141415H, "E" Company patrol observed three (3) VC with weapons entering An My (3) vicinity AT 925610. Artillery fire mission called but due to dust, results unable to be observed. This battalion conducted eight (8) squad size day patrols, six (6) squad size night patrols, eleven (11) ambushes, twenty-two (22) listening posts and eighty-eight (88) H&I fires.
- (15) 15 June - At 150845H, "E" Company patrol observed three (3) VC digging in road vicinity AT 927614. Fire mission called. VC ran westerly into An My (3), results of fire mission unknown. At 150915H, "E" Company mine sweep team found decoy mine in road vicinity AT 942669. Security elements picked up a VCS from house just off from road in same position. VCS had invalid identification card and was sent to Hieu Duc District Headquarters for interrogation. This battalion conducted nine (9) squad size day patrols, five (5) squad size night patrols, ten (10) ambushes, twenty-three (23) listening posts and sixty-four (64) H&I fires.
- (16) 16 June - At 161100H, "F" Company discovered a 105mm round vicinity AT 941630. Round was not booby trapped and was blown in place. "F" Company found a tunnel and trench vicinity AT 948621. Both tunnel and trench were destroyed. At 161200H, "F" Company patrol found

Artillery mission fired with two (2) confirmed VC KIA (body count). At 162000H, "F" Company received fifteen (15) to twenty (20) rounds small arms fire from vicinity AT 956667. "F" Company returned fire with 81mm mortar and small arms (results unknown). Searched area with negative findings. This battalion conducted three (3) squad size day patrols, four (4) squad size night patrols, four (4) ambushes, twenty-two (22) listening posts and eighty-nine (89) H&I fires.

- (17) 17 June - At 171215H, the following ordnances were destroyed on Battalion Operation: four (4) Chi Com grenades, two (2) 105mm artillery rounds, one (1) 20mm round, and two (2) tunnels. All ordnances were destroyed in place. At 171230H, Command Group Alpha spotted VC sniper in tree line vicinity AT 909595. Artillery mission called (results unknown). At 171255H, "F" Company received small arms fire from vicinity AT 925597. Artillery fire mission called, results unknown. At 171300H, a TD 18 vicinity AT 927610 hit a mine of unknown type. No casualties were sustained. Engineers removed TD-18. At 171300H, "F" Company apprehended three (3) VCS vicinity AT 946637. VCS taken to ITT for interrogation. At 171310H, "H" Company received sniper fire from vicinity AT 928607 wounding one (1) USMC in arm. Med evac effected. Artillery fire mission called (results unknown). This battalion conducted two (2) squad size day patrols, one (1) squad size night patrol, five (5) ambushes and eighty-seven (87) H&I fires.

- (18) 18 June - At 180340H, "E" Company ambush spotted unknown number of VC crossing road. Ambush site moved to a new position. At 180845H, "H" Company apprehended two (2) female VCS vicinity AT 931607. "H" Company interpreters determined that two (2) female VCS were liaison personnel. Two (2) VCS sent to ITT for further interrogation. At 180900H, "H" Company destroyed a tunnel 8'X16'X20'. At 180930H, "G" Company at objective 28 destroyed nine (9) reinforced bunkers, one (1) tunnel 15'X4'X4', three (3) boats and confiscated two hundred (200) pounds of rice.

At 181730H, "G" Company captured one (1) VC vicinity AT 915592. VC retained at "G" Company CP over night. VC pointed out mines and booby traps on objective 36. VC sent to ITT for further interrogation. At 182035H, "E" Company patrol apprehended two (2) VCS vicinity AT 923668. Patrol returned to CP and VCS taken to ITT for interrogation. At 182040H, "E" Company CP received thirty (30) rounds small arms fire from vicinity AT 950663. Returned fire with nine (9) M-79 rounds and small arms fire. Patrol sent to search area and returned with negative findings. This battalion conducted two (2) squad size day patrols, one (1) squad size night patrol, four (4) ambushes and seventy-seven (77) H&I fires.

- (19) 19 June - At 190730H, "E" Company patrol enroute to "E" Company CP vicinity AT 923668 apprehended two (2) VCS in same area as those taken night before. Patrol searched area and found a tunnel with a cartridge bomb, one (1) Chi Com grenade and one (1) M-26 grenade. All ~~was~~ destroyed. Also destroyed two (2) spider traps. At 190845H, "G" Company destroyed two tunnels 15'X6'X4', one (1) barbed wire (four (4) strand) fence six (6) feet high and fifty (50) feet long. Fence was booby trapped with pull type detonation devices. Both fence and booby trap blown in place. At 191145H, "H" Company apprehended two (2) VCS vicinity AT 919595. VCS turned over to Dia Loc Headquarters for interrogation. At 191150H, "H" Company secured battalion objective 37 and destroyed one (1) bunker (6'X5'X5') reinforced with bamboo and rocks. At 191310H, "F" Company destroyed a booby trapped gate vicinity AT 940629. Type of booby trap unknown. At 191545H, "H" Company and engineers destroyed on objective 34 one (1) concrete reinforced bunker (6'X3'X4') and two (2) bunkers (5'X6'X3'). At 191545H, "G" Company on objective 32 destroyed one (1) spider trap. At 191600H, "F" Company patrol discovered a tunnel vicinity AT 950642. Tunnel (4'X5'X8') was reinforced with steel and bamboo. Tunnel was destroyed.

At 191943H, "G" Company received six (6) incoming sniper rounds from vicinity AT 914600. Artillery fire mission called and sniper fire ceased. Patrol sent to investigate and returned with negative findings. This battalion conducted three (3) squad size day patrols, one (1) squad size night patrol, five (5) ambushes and thirty-one (31) H&I fires.

(20) 20 June - At 200745H, "G" Company on objective 35 with engineers assistance destroyed the following: one (1) electrical detonation type booby trap, seven (7) spider traps, one (1) tunnel (6'X4'X4') reinforced with bamboo, and one (1) tunnel (14'X14'X10') reinforced with bamboo rock and bamboo. At 200900H, "G" Company on objective 31 with engineer assistance destroyed the following: one (1) tunnel (14'X14'X10'), four (4) spider traps, one (1) booby trapped gate (type unknown) and one (1) booby trapped 105mm round. Also destroyed numerous punji traps. On objective 35, 2nd Platoon, "G" Company destroyed two (2) reinforced concrete bunkers (6'X6'X6'); four (4) boats hidden along water edge. At 201400H, "H" Company on battalion objective 34 with engineers destroyed the following: one (1) bunker (3'X4'X30'), one (1) bunker (20'X2'X3') with a 6'X4'X10' room, two (2) bunkers (10'X6'X4'), and one (1) tunnel (18'X24") leading into bunker (6'X6'). At 201600H, "G" Company, 1st Platoon, working on battalion objective 32 destroyed one (1) tunnel (5'X5'X22'). At 201700H, recon patrol reported sighting three (3) VC vicinity AT 896594. "G" Company sent patrol to area and patrol made contact with VC. Patrol fired on VC and VC broke contact. Patrol searched with negative results. This battalion conducted three (3) squad size day patrols, four (4) squad size night patrols, four (4) ambushes and fifty-five (55) H&I fires.

(21) 21 June - At 210850H, "H" Company discovered a tunnel complex vicinity AT 921603. Tunnel complex was 3½'X6'X25' reinforced with concrete, steel beams and wood planking. Tunnel complex destroyed by engineers. At 210950H, "G" Company vicinity AT 897591 discovered a cave (5'X3'X2) (not reinforced). Cave was destroyed by engineers. At 210915H, electrical ~~detonated~~ mine was detonated approximately twenty-five (25) meters in front of jeep. Several persons were seen running east towards Bo Ban. Mine sweep team and PF's chased persons with negative results. At 211545H, "G" Company patrol spotted four (4) VC

with rifles vicinity AT 900606. Patrol took VC under small arms fire. Two (2) VC knocked down. Patrol called artillery fire mission. Patrol searched area with negative findings. At 211620H, "F" Company found a booby trapped Chi Com grenade vicinity AT 952639. Grenade blown in place. At 211745H, "F" Company patrol found a 20mm shell booby trapped vicinity AT 951634. Booby trap was buried in tank track along river bank. Booby trap had pressure type detonation fuze. Booby trap blown in place. This battalion conducted three (3) squad size day patrols, five (5) squad size night patrols, five (5) ambushes and one hundred and eighteen (118) H&I fires.

(22) 22 June - At 220845H, "H" Company apprehended a VC vicinity AT 915592. "H" Company's PF's attached from Dai Loc District Headquarters interrogated VC. At 221100H, "G" Company patrol discovered two (2) caves (4'X4'X10') vicinity AT 895589. Caves were destroyed. Also in same area, local villagers pointed out a house as belonging to VC. When PF's destroyed house, a secondary explosion occurred. At 221600H, "H" Company discovered about fifteen (15) pounds of medical supplies vicinity AT 920596. Medical supplies sent to battalion aid station for evaluation. At 221800H, "H" Company found eight hundred (800) pounds of rice vicinity AT 920595. Rice bagged and sent to Dai Loc District Headquarters. At 222030H, "F" Company received incoming small arms fire from vicinity AT 960669. Returned fire with M-79 and LAAW. Patrol deployed to search area and returned with negative results. In addition, this battalion has conducted three (3) squad size day patrols, five (5) squad size night patrols, five (5) ambushes, and eighty-nine (89) H&I fires.

(23) 23 June - At 230645H, "H" Company swept vicinity AT 926590. Conducted routine identification card check on fifty (50) civilians and medical assistance given to civilians. A total of seven (7) VCS were apprehended and sent to Dai Loc District Headquarters. At 230930H, "G" Company on sweep of area vicinity AT 926586 found five hundred (500) pounds of rice. Rice was sent to Dai Loc District Headquarters for redistribution. At 231600H, "H" Company on sweep of objective 34 vicinity AT 951594 destroyed the following: one (1) tunnel (20'X3'X4') with a room (7'X3'X4') and seven (7) tunnels (7'X3'X3', 8'X4'X4', 5'X4'X3', 7'X3'X4', 13'X4'X4', 7'X5'X4' and 6'X3'X4'). All tunnels were reinforced with bamboo. This battalion conducted three (3) squad size day patrols, four (4) squad size night patrols, four (4) ambushes and seventy-four (74) H&I fires.

- (24) 24 June - "H" Company on a sweep of objective 30 destroyed the following: five (5) caves reinforced with bamboo (6'X6'X30'), one (1) underwater cave (10'X4'X4') and three (3) tunnels with underwater entrances (6'X10'X30'). At 251830H, "H" Company was informed by local Vietnamese civilians where two (2) VC were hiding in a cave vicinity AT 916592. "H" Company dispatched a patrol with an interpreter and engineers to area. Interpreter tried to talk VC out of cave but they refused. Smoke was inducted into cave with negative results. Engineers blew cave killing the two (2) VC. At 242250H, "H" Company patrol set in an ambush vicinity AT 912591 observed two (2) figures and took them under fire. Fire was returned at ambush site. Patrol pursued with negative results. In addition, this battalion conducted three (3) squad size day patrols, three (3) squad size night patrols, five (5) ambushes and fifty-eight (58) H&I fires.
- (25) 25 June - At 250645H, "F" Company patrol found three (3) 20mm shells booby trapped vicinity AT 955662. Casings were filled with small pieces of barbed wire and a black powder explosive with a crude pressure type detonation device. Booby traps were destroyed in place. At 251100H, "G" Company patrol on objective 35 spotted three (3) to five (5) VC with weapons running out of village across field. Patrol fired on VC killing one (1) and wounding one (1) VC. VC WIA was med evaced. Patrol searched area for further VC activity with negative results. At 251745H, forward observer from "H" Company called a fire mission on three (3) VC vicinity AT 861559. VC were carrying weapons and two (2) radio antennas. Artillery mission fired with one (1) KIA (body count) and two (2) WIA's. Pursued WIA's with negative results. In addition, this battalion conducted three (3) squad size day patrols, four (4) squad size night patrols, four (4) ambushes and sixty-eight (68) H&I fires.
- (26) 26 June - At 1050H, "H" Company forward observer observed ten (10) VC in khaki uniforms with weapons in boats vicinity AT 849550. Artillery fire mission called. The results of fire mission were two (2) confirmed KIA's. At 261140H, forward observer with "H" Company saw ten (10) boats on shore in area of previous VC activity. Artillery fire mission called and sank six (6) boats (unable to see any bodies). In addition, this battalion conducted four (4) squad size day patrols, five (5) squad size night patrols, four (4) ambushes and seventy-six (76) H&I fires.

- (27) 27 June - At 271725H, a "G" Company patrol found one (1) 105mm round in the vicinity of AT 917602. The round was not booby trapped but believed to be a H&I dud. 105mm dud destroyed in place. In addition, this battalion conducted three (3) squad size day patrols, four (4) ambushes and sixty-two (62) H&I fires.
- (28) 28 June - At 280830H, a water truck following in the track of a tank mine sweep team, detonated a mine which was believed to be of Chinese composition TNT. It was believed that the mine was planted a long time ago and that the weight of the rear wheels of the truck detonated. There were no injuries. The truck was towed away by a wrecker. At 281015H, a "H" Company patrol found three (3) VC in a deserted hut. When VC went for their weapons, the patrol opened up on them killing one (1) VC and wounding one (1) VC who fled. Wounded VC was later found in a cave approximately ten (10) meters from the hut. The VC would not come out of the cave so the patrol threw a M-26 grenade into the cave killing the VC. At 281900H, PF's working with CAC platoon found seven and one-half (7½) pounds of C-4, three (3) boosters and one (1) fuze igniter in the village of An My (1) GS (AT 9260). The munitions were found buried in a case in the hut. Munitions turned over to S-2 for evaluation. In addition, this battalion conducted three (3) squad size day patrols, four (4) ambushes and sixty-two (62) H&I fires.
- (29) 29 June - At 291000H, while at the barber shop, "G" Company XO heard seven (7) rounds of carbine fire from vicinity AT 925595. A squad patrol was dispatched to the area. Upon arrival they found a woman who stated that her son had been kidnapped by three (3) armed VC. She related that the VC had stated her son was a civilian spy for Dai Loc District Chief. The woman was delivered to District Headquarters and district chief has been notified. At 291045H, patrol from CAC apprehended three (3) Vietnamese females and one (1) male as VCS. The VCS were picked up while the patrol was pursuing two (2) VC who crossed the river. at AT 935613 to elude capture. The four (4) VCS were sent to Dai Loc District Headquarters for interrogation. The three (3) females were declared VCS by District Headquarters and the male was released. At 291225H, "G" Company patrol found one (1) Chi Com booby trapped grenade vicinity AT 923598. Trap wire was attached to booby trap and stretched across the

trail. The patrol destroyed the booby trap in place. At 291400H, a fire mission was conducted on four (4) VC boats at AT 854556. When fired upon, the VC pulled the boats to the shore and disappeared. Artillery forward observer adjusted fire and the boats were destroyed. The VC were not in uniform but were carrying weapons. The boats were being used for resupply. At 291545H, one (1) member of a Engineer Recon Team, while attempting to locate a possible ford across the Song Vu Gia in the vicinity of AT 915587, drowned. Body was not recovered as of 301200H. Search continues. In addition, this battalion conducted four (4) squad size day patrols, one (1) squad size night patrol, three (3) ambushes and eighty-seven (87) H&I fires.

- (30) 30 June - At 301830H, a "H" Company patrol found the body of the engineer who drowned on 29 June at AT 920584. The body was taken to landing zone and from there, it was taken to "C" Med. In addition, this battalion conducted four (4) squad size day patrols, one (1) squad size night patrol, three (3) ambushes and ninety-six (96) H&I fires.

10. Fire Support and Fire Support Coordination

11. Logistics

a. Supply

(1) Supply point distribution for first half of the month was by company trucks effected daily with bi-weekly helicopter resupply. Helicopters were used primarily to transport ammunition and other supplies to isolated areas. One (1) water trailer from each company is filled daily in the Battalion CP area. Also a tanker distributed gasoline and diesel fuel to the CP.

(2) During the second half of the month resupply was completed by trucks with emergency helicopter resupply only. The battalion resupply point for the companies was moved to the 3rd Marine Regiment on 15 June 66 due to tactical move of the battalion to a new CP location. Resupply is a time consuming factor at the present. A forty-eight (48) mile round trip from supply point to Battalion CP is required daily and a maximum of two (2) trips is all that can be made.

(3) Periodic runs to FLSG were made for repair of ordnance, optics and office machines.

(4) Requisitions were hand carried daily to the Fleet Stock Account. Priority O2 and walk-thru requisitions were cleared through division supply and G-4 prior to submission.

c. Food Service

(1) The first half of the month of June the battalion mess hall provided three (3) hot meals per day for personnel in the command post. The three (3) front line companies were provided with a hot noon meal daily. Food was prepared at the mess hall and transported by trucks in vacuum cans to company positions. C-rations are utilized for the breakfast and supper meals by these front line companies. During the second half of June, the hot meals for the front line companies were prepared and furnished by the 3rd Bn, 3rd Marines mess hall. Cost for the food was transferred from this battalion account to the 3rd Bn, 3rd Marines account.

(2) The following shortages still exist:

(a) Eight (8) accessory pack field ranges due to an increase in the T/E.

d. Cantonment and Camp Facilities Development

(1) The following projects are in progress:

(a) Construction of bunkers in the forward company areas.

f. Fiscal: The units OpBud report was screened for erroneous charges, corrections were submitted to 3rd FSR.

g. Water

(1) The battalion has a T/E of six (6) water trailers while in-country. One (1) to each line company and two (2) for the mess hall in

the battalion CP area. The trailers are filled from nearest water point and water tanker refilled the trailers every other day.

(2) Platoon and squad positions are resupplied through the use of water cans.

(3) A bath unit was operated by 3rd Engineers adjacent to local water point during first half of the month. Showers operated daily, one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) hour in the morning and one (1) hour in the evening.

(4) Makoshift showers constructed at all forward positions down to platoon level.

h. Motor Transport.

(1) The battalion has twenty (20) M-422 and thirty (30) M-274A1 vehicles. One (1) M-422 and seven (7) M-274A1 were combat deadlined during June 1966. Eighty-four (84) per cent were available to the battalion and one hundred (100) percent of the nineteen (19) trailers were available during the period.

(1) 2 June. Three hundred fifty (350) school kits from CARE were given to students at the Dai Loc District High School, located at coordinates AT 917577. One hundred (100) CARE school kits were also given at a school in Nong Lam, coordinates AT 832566.

(2) 4 June. Two hundred fifty (250) school kits were given to refugee school children in Ai Nghia hamlet, coordinates AT 913581, and four hundred (400) school kits were distributed to students in Loc My village, at coordinates AT 885574. All children were very thankful and appreciated the kits.

(3) 5 June. Again today, school kits were distributed to school children within Dai Loc District, with a total of seven hundred ninety six (796) kits being distributed.

(4) 6 June. Fifty (50) bags of cement (five thousand (5000) pounds) were given to the Catholic Orphanage at Phu Thuong Hamlet, coordinates AT 906734. The cement will be used to aid in the construction of a refectory, and as always the nuns were very grateful for the assistance.

(5) 10 June. Today a County Fair Operation was held in the hamlet of Ia Chau (2), coordinates AT 945675. Two (2) volley balls, nets and two (2) soccer balls were given to the hamlet chief by the battalion civil affairs officer. The district chief assembled residents and spoke about the purpose of Marine operations. Corpsmen treated a total of one hundred seventy (170) people and distributed two hundred (200) bars of soap.

(6) 12 June. As the result of an influx in the number of refugees within Dai Loc District, three thousand (3000) pounds of food consisting mostly of bulgar wheat, was distributed to the refugees who are located in the hamlet of Loc Iuan, coordinates AT 916578.

(7) 13 June - 30 June. Through this period, medical assistance was given to the local populace on a daily basis and civil affairs activities were expanded to new areas with Dai Loc District as a result of our battalion extending its TAO southward. Especially noteworthy to mention is the field of medical assistance, for an average of two hundred (200) persons were treated daily during this period in Dai Loc District alone.

They are under the jurisdiction of the 3rd Marine Division and their primary job is working with the refugees in Dai Loc, although they do render medical assistance to the Vietnamese on a daily basis.

d. Apparent Results of Civil Affairs Programs

(1) Having just moved into a new area it is too early to note any apparent results other than the gratitude which the people show and express for the medical assistance which they have received. All activities of civil affairs which have been conducted by this battalion have been received warmly by the local populace.

1. MISSION

- a. As defined in the basic order.

2. SITUATION

- a. Weather. To be promulgated daily.

- b. Terrain

- (1) The east-central and southern portions of the area are characterized by low-lying flat land utilized for wetland rice and dry-land crops. These paddy areas extend westerly and northerly from the eastern and southern boundaries of the present TAOR for an average distance of 3,000 meters.
 - (2) Foot traffic can move freely throughout the area of operations while vehicles are restricted to the present road network. The existing road network may be considered as all-weather, although some portions were closed for short periods during the monsoon season.
 - (3) The Song Vu Gia River delineates the southern boundary of the area of operations, and therefor is no obstacle to vehicular traffic within the operational area.
 - (4) Observation by the enemy is possible from the high ground in the western portion of the area of operations.
- c. Population. The civil population is governed by the military commander of the district. Authority is delegated to village and hamlet chiefs who are appointed officials.
- (1) Economics. Agriculture and livestock are the primary means of economic income for the local population.

- (2) Transportation. Transportation is generally on foot, supplemented by a few bicycles and scooters and some local buses that carry passengers and produce during the daylight hours.
- (3) Religion. The over-all religion in the area is Buddhist; however, there are a few Roman Catholic hamlets in the area.
- (4) Language. Vietnamese is the basic language; some of the older people, however, are conversant in French. The school-age children are quick to learn and speak English.

d. Enemy Forces

- (1) See current INTSUMS issued by this headquarters.
- (2) As a rule, the enemy can be expected to make use of the hours of limited surveillance before launching any attack. The VC possess only a limited crew-served weapon support capability. To neutralize our fire support superiority, they can be expected to attack only on nights without a moon and on nights of heavy fog or rain. Generally, attacks will end by 0300 hours to permit the enemy time to regain the protection of the mountains before dawn. VC attacks will usually be planned as raids. They will not attempt to hold any ground taken. Their primary objective will be to inflict casualties and seize equipment and materials.
- (3) The extent of mining activities in the area of operations is not known at this time. If the activity presently taking place within our present TAOR is any indication, heavy mining activity may be expected within the area of operations, especially along the road network.
- (4) Local intelligence sources (District Headquarters) have reported increasing numbers of "Hard Core" units within the area of operations. These units are considered well armed and trained. These reports have been partly substantiated by heavy contact with VE units by the adjacent USMC unit to the south. It may be expected that the VC units in contact with the adjacent unit to the south, have moved northward into the area of operations.

3. POSSIBLE ENEMY COURSES OF ACTION

SECRET

- a. Continue present course of avoiding contact.

Enumeration. Although there have been numerous reports of enemy units moving throughout the operating area, there have been no instances of concerted attacks against friendly units within the area.

- b. Adopt tactics of harassment and terrorism.

Enumeration. Because of the enemy's need to alienate the people from the government and from aid from friendly forces, a program of harassment and terrorism against the population and against friendly forces must be initiated.

- c. Adopt an aggressive mining and booby trap program.

Enumeration. Due to the lack of concerted attacks and the number of incidents involving only sniper fire, there is an indication that the enemy suffers from a shortage of weapons and/or ammunition. In order to maintain a quasi-control of the area, the enemy must rely primarily on mine and booby trap operations.

- d. Launch a concerted attack against our forces.

Enumeration. Recent local intelligence sources indicate an increase of enemy forces in the area. These reports have not been substantiated by contact with the reported units. Recent reverses, especially during the rice harvest, increase the need for an impressive victory if the enemy is to regain lost prestige.

- e. Withdraw from the area.

Enumeration. Since little is known of the area as pertains to the attitude of the civil population, plus the fact that there have been no major actions initiated by the enemy, it may be assumed that the enemy will follow their customary tactic of refusing to engage in a prolonged action that could deplete their stockpile of war materials. The enemy could decide to employ their "Main Force" units in another area, where their chances of success may be greater.

4. CONCLUSIONS

- A. Due to the fact that there have been no incidents of concerted unit actions against friendly units within the area, it is felt that the enemy does not possess the weapons and equipment necessary to launch a major attack against our forces.



It is felt that the enemy will continue their campaign of mining, in conjunction with harassment and terrorism against the civil population, to maintain quasi-control of the area. This assumption is partially borne out by the report received of a 3,000 meter stretch of Route 540, from AT 912590 to AT 930620, has been heavily mined. Aerial observation has substantiated this report to the degree it has been reported that the local populace will not use this stretch of road, but prefer to walk off the road through the fields. It is not felt that the enemy will withdraw completely from the area, as this would be too great a loss of prestige from which they might never recover.

b. It is felt that the enemy will employ their possible courses of action in the following sequence:

- (1) Course a.
- (2) Course b, in conjunction with course c.
- (3) Course d.
- (4) Course e.

1. The Viet Cong rely heavily on the collection of intelligence before planning any attack or harassment of friendly forces. The employment of women and young children to gather intelligence information is widely used by the VC.
2. As an aid in combating the collection effort of the VC it is imperative that certain actions be initiated by our forces. These actions include, but are not limited to, the following
 - a. Care will be taken to keep all indigenous personnel clear of areas of observation. This policy must be applied with common sense, however, it does not mean that civilians will be removed from their normal living and working area.
 - b. Any necessary discussion of military matters will be done within Marine defensive locations only. Viet Cong agents are placed within all Vietnamese markets to collect information.
 - c. All military documents will be hand held while vehicles are standing to preclude their being snatched by passers-by. Documents will not be taken into Vietnamese markets and shops.
 - d. Military matters will be discussed with Armed Forces of Vietnam personnel only with the express approval of the Battalion Commander.
 - e. Within the operating area personnel working with the Viet Cong units have been noted to be Negroid and Caucasian, as well as Oriental. They have been known to wear friendly uniforms. It is imperative that unknown or suspicious acting persons within close proximity to friendly positions be identified.
3. Wide use of the sign and countersign must be initiated during the hours of darkness or poor visibility to preclude the infiltration of friendly positions during these times.

1. MISSION. 2nd Bn, 3d Marines continues the attack to the southwest, ~~that commenced~~ 090800H with two (2) companies abreast to clear populated areas in southern portion of TAOR of VC and VC influence.
2. CONCEPT:

 - b. At 090800H, Companies "E" and "F" commenced search and clear/destroy operation with the axis of their advance paralleling route 540 (AKA route 5) south from vicinity GS (AT 9467) to Duc Hoa (3), vicinity GS (AT 9058).

At such time as Companies "E" and "F" have completed their search and clear operations and have secured that portion of their assigned sector along phase line ~~B~~ (See Appendix 1), Companies "G" and "H" will displace from present locations north of phase line A, pass through Companies "E" and "F" and continue the attack in the Battalion TAOR to phase line AMBER and thence to phase line GREEN.
 - d. The 2nd Bn Command Post will, at such time as companies "G" and "H" pass through companies "E" and "F", displace to HILL 41 (vicinity GS (AT 9366)) and coordinate all tactical operations from that site and such forward (south) sites as may be selected.
 - e. Following the seizure of phase line GREEN, the Battalion will prepare to continue the attack to the southwest on order to secure the remainder of the assigned Battalion TAOR.



landing zone (LZ) during the hours of darkness, and a minimum of three flashlights will be used to outline the LZ. No bright lights should be visible when the helicopters are making their approach and retirement.

f. Yellow smoke will be used to mark an LZ during daylight hours.

1. SITUATION

a. Enemy forces

- (1) See Annex B (Intelligence)
- (2) See current INTSUMS.

b. Friendly forces. See Annex A (Task Organization)

2. MISSION. See Basic Order.

3. EXECUTION

a. Concept of Operation. See Annex C (Concept of Operation)

b. Fire Support Coordination Procedure.

(1) Artillery

- (1) Artillery fire missions will be sent to 1st Bn, 12th Marines with Bn FSCC monitoring. Bn, Regt and Div FSCC's must give positive clearance before a mission can be cleared.

(2) Air, close air support, med-evac, and resupply missions must be coordinated with Bn FSCC,

(3) All mortars organic to the Bn, must clear their fire missions through Bn FSCC prior to firing except in an emergency situation, in which the Company Commander may authorize fire missions to suppress enemy attack.

(4) All armor units (Tanks and Ontos) in direct support of the Bn must clear their fire missions through Bn FSCC. Any indirect fire missions must also be cleared by Regt FSCC.

c. Coordinating Instructions

SECRET

- (1) To support the operation the Bn FSCC will function as two separate FSCC's, each containing representatives of the supporting arms concerned.
 - (a) FSCC Alpha will move with the Battalion Commander in Command Group Alpha and will coordinate all fires for "G" and "H" Companies. Fire Support Coordinator will coordinate all fires.
 - (b) FSCC Bravo will remain with Bn Command Group Bravo and will coordinate all fires for "E" and "F" Companies. This FSCC will be operationally controlled by the senior artillery representative.
- (2) The Bn Fire Support Coordinator retains final coordination authority for FSCC's.

4. TARGET INFORMATION

- a. The Division Rules of Engagement will apply.
- b. Schools, hospitals and churches will not be fired on unless considered warranted by the infantry commander on the ground.
- c. Villages and hamlets will not be taken under fire unless:
 - (1) Friendly forces are receiving fire from them.
 - (2) The infantry commander on the ground considers such action necessary and justified.

5. SAFETY

a. Air Safety

- (1) Each artillery firing battery and each FO on the ground will appoint air sentinels.
- (2) Regt FSCC will inform aircraft entering the area of artillery fire and its maximum ordinate.

b. Troop Safety


- (1) No harrassing and interdiction fires will be plotted within 1500 meters of friendly troops (artillery), or 1000 meters (mortars).

6. COMMAND AND COMMUNICATION-ELECTRONICS

1. SUPPLY

a. General

- (1) Supplies are to be staged upon receipt of this order to accomodate the initial phase of operations.
- (2) Supply Sources
 - (a) Prescribed loads will be issued by each unit from their current assets. Shortages of prescribed loads will be requisitioned from Battalion Supply.
 - (b) During this operation all classes of supplies will be requested thru the Battalion S-4 to Battalion Supply by forward units.
 - (c) Sufficient "On Call" supplies (all classes) will be prepared and staged at HILL 41 (AT 934663) for helicopter lift to the forward units.
 - (d) Resupply of the supporting companies will be by vehicle.

(3) Prescribed Loads

(a) Class I

(1) Forward (Assault) Units

- a. Meals, Combat, Individual - 1 Day
- b. Fuel, Trioxane bar - 1 Day
- c. Salt Tablets, 100 tablets per individual

(2) Units in established positions

- a. One (1) hot noon meal will be fed daily.
Breakfast and supper; C-rations

SECRET

b. MIC's, Fuel Trioxane and salt tablets as required.

(b) Class II

- (1) Individual combat - essential T/E equipment.
- (2) Dry Cell batteries - two (2) days.
- (3) Flashlights w/batteries - one (1) per squad

(c) Class V - One (1) B/A

(d) Water

- (1) Two (2) filled canteens per individual
- (2) Halizone tablets - 100 tablets per individual
- (3) Resupply of water, five (5) gallon cans, will be available if requested. Empty water cans must be returned.

(e) Medical

- (1) Medical personnel will carry a Surgical Instrument and Supply Set, Individual (Unit One).
- (2) Complete basic outfit. (IOL).

b. Control and Distribution

(1) Control

- (a) Battalion TACLOG Group will be established with Command Group Bravo prior to D-Day.
- (b) Battalion Supply Officer shall retain custody and control of supplies until issued to unit commanders.
- (c) Every effort will be made to ensure that supplies are safeguarded against damage by the elements, destruction or capture by enemy action and/or pilferage and waste by friendly units.

(2) Distribution

- (a) Unit distribution to all forward units of the Battalion.
- (b) Supply point distribution to all other units.

(c) Resupply

- (1) Sufficient helicopters will be available to effect daily resupply to all forward elements down to platoon level.
- (2) Requests for resupply will be submitted at least six (6) hours in advance of the anticipated need. The primary method of requesting resupply is by messenger; the alternate method is the use of radio (battalion tactical net).
- (3) Emergency resupply requests will be fulfilled as expeditiously as possible.
- (4) Requests for all supplies should include:
 - a. Unit location (coordinates)
 - b. LZ designator (if applicable)
 - c. How LZ will be marked (color of panels, smoke)
 - d. Commodity and the amount required (if practical, request to the nearest whole case)
- (5) Every effort will be made to alert the requesting unit when supplies are airborne and enroute to unit LZ.

(d) Captured Material

- (1) All units report type, quantity, condition and location of captured material to this headquarters.
- (2) Units will mark material with time and date of capture.
- (3) The use of captured material is prohibited until reissued by this headquarters or higher echelon.
- (4) Material having intelligence value. See Annex B (Intelligence)

2. EVACUATION AND HOSPITALIZATION

- a. See Appendix 1 (Medical)

3. TRANSPORTATION

SECRET

a. Highway

- (1) All organic vehicles will be utilized to the maximum possible extent.
- (2) Non-organic vehicles will be available and distributed daily according to needs and availability.
- (3) All vehicular traffic in the forward areas will be dispatched by Command Group Bravo and will be organized in convoys of at least three (3) vehicles and nine (9) personnel.
- (4) Southbound traffic has the right of way except for ambulances which have the right of way regardless of direction of travel.

b. Air. See Annex E (Air Support)4. SERVICEa. Functions

- (1) Maintenance. Unit commanders stress the importance of first echelon maintenance on all motor transport, ordnance and communications equipment. Second and third echelons of maintenance will be performed by the appropriate service organizations within the battalion and FLSG.
- (2) Salvage.
 - (a) All units report type, quantity, condition and location of salvage material to this headquarters.
 - (b) Downed aircraft, friendly or enemy, will be placed under guard and the location reported to this headquarters.
 - (c) Salvage of enemy supplies and equipment is prohibited for use by units until evacuated and evaluated for intelligence purposes by this headquarters and higher echelon.

5. PERSONNEL

a. See Appendix 2 (Personnel).

6. MISCELLANEOUSa. Uniform and equipment



- (1) Uniform - Utilities w/field boots.
- (2) Equipment
 - (a) Normal arms and equipment.
 - (b) Light marching pack w/ontrenching tool (include change of clothes and extra socks).
 - (c) Body Armor.
 - (d) Poncho.
 - (e) Helmet w/camouflage cover (green side out).

b. Special Instructions

- (1) Insure that all company supplies and personal effects remaining with company admin CP's (Rear) are safeguarded by physical security and under lock and key where practicable.
- (2) Security of all supplies and equipment at the Battalion Admin CP (Rear) to be provided by H&S Company.
- (3) Request for resupply of ammunition should be based on actual expenditure.
- (4) Used batteries will be destroyed completely to prevent re-use by the enemy.
- (5) Maximum utilization of all transportation should be attained. Never allow a helicopter or vehicle return to the supply point empty if at all possible. Plan ahead and stage gear to be returned.

1. STRENGTHS

- a. All Companies will deploy with their current on-board strengths. Personnel in a non-deployable status will be maintained in the CP in the Bn Admin CP (Rear). The following categories of personnel are classified as non-deployable:

- (1) Hospitalized, sick (light duty or on duty).
- (2) Emergency Leave
- (3) Thrice wounded.

b. Personnel Reports

- (1) Personnel Daily Summary Reports (PDS) will be submitted daily by 1000, as of 0800.

2. REPLACEMENTS

- a. Personnel input will be regulated by higher headquarters.

3. DISCIPLINE AND ORDER

- a. In accordance with BNO P5000.1 (SOP for Administration).

4. PRISONERS OF WAR

- a. Handled in accordance with BNO 3800.1C (SOP for Intelligence).

5. GRAVES REGISTRATION

- a. The following policy will govern Graves Registration.

- (1) Unit commanders will notify this headquarters of personnel killed in action (KIA) immediately by the fastest available means of communication.

SECRET

(2) Commanding Officers of the deceased will:

- (a) Provide the S-1 with sufficient information for this headquarters to comply with Chapter 12 of reference (a). Service Record Book/Officer Qualification Record will be forwarded immediately to the S-1.
- (b) Forward to the S-1 within three days, a letter of condolence in accordance with Chapter 12 of reference (a).
- (c) All military equipment of the deceased will be forwarded to Battalion Supply.
- (d) Personal effects of the deceased will be inventoried and turned into the Battalion Supply Officer within three days.
- (e) Identification of the deceased will be determined by one or two of the following:
 - 1. Statement of two witnesses who can identify the deceased
 - 2. Identification Tags and Card.
 - 3. Clothing: All clothing will be forwarded with deceased. This is an important item for identification purposes.

6. MORALE AND PERSONNEL SERVICES

- a. Leave. Only emergency leave will be granted; Authority to grant emergency leave rests with the Battalion Commander.
- b. Medals and Awards. All recommendations for awards will be forwarded in accordance with references (b) and (c).
- c. Postal Services. The Battalion S-1 is responsible for the Battalion mail. Mail will be forwarded as the situation permits.

7. CIVIL AFFAIRS. Civil Affairs/Civic Action will be accomplished by all members of the Battalion under the cognizance of the Battalion Civil Affairs Section in accordance with Area Commander policies and directives, and such oral orders as may be issued by the Battalion Commander.8. PERSONNEL PROCEDURES. Normal administrative procedures will prevail during the period of the operation, with the S-1 and Company Offices in the Battalion Administrative CP (Rear).

9. INTERIOR MANAGEMENT. S-1 will effect a daily courier run to the forward positions for the purposes of picking up and delivering guard mail.
10. CIVILIAN EMPLOYEES. None authorized.
11. COMBAT CASUALTY REPORTING. Combat Casualty Reporting will be administered in accordance with reference (f).
