

NARRATIVE SUMMARY


The New Years' truce period was observed and the Battalion conducted extensive reconnaissance patrols and established numerous observation posts. No onemy sightings were recorded and there were no violations of the truce in the Area of Operation. On 1 January; Company G was placed under the operational control of the 3d Battalion, 4th Marines and conducted a one day search and clear operation north of CAM IO. Company E continued to consolidate the CUA Valley Company Patrol Base and observation post established 31 December 1966. The 122d Regional Force Company was also noved to the CUA Valley to conduct combined operations with U. S. Marine Corps forces. On 7 January, Company E in conjunction with the 122d Regional Force Company and CAM LC District personnel conducted a COUNTY FAIR type operation for two days in the CUA Valley Refugee Centers. The names of nine suspected VC were added to the Black List and a complete search of the area was nade with negative results. A nedical team comprised of members of the Medical Sections of this Battalion and the 3d Marine Regiment initiated a MEDCAP Program in the Refugee Centers and the village of CAM IC. On 13 January, Company G was placed under the operational control of the 3d Marinos and was assigned to RA LONG Area of Operation. Company G continues to conduct operations in the RA LONG Valley. In an effort to increase the surveillance north of the Camp J. J. CARROLL Complex, Company H ostablished a Platoon Patrol Rase in the vicinity of DONG MA Mountain 4,000 meters north of Camp CARROLL on 13 January, This patrol base was maintained until 25 January when it was secured because of additional operational commitments. On 21 January Company F was placed under the operational control of the 3d Enttalion, 4th Marines and provided security for the DONG MA Combat Base. Company F returned to the operational control of this Battalion on 25 January. The 26th of January the 2d Battalion, 3d Marines (-) (reinf) ceruenced a search and destroy operation in the hills northwest of CAM LO. Company M, 3d Pattalion, 3d Marines and Companies L and M of the 3d Battalion, 4th Marines were placed under the operational control of this Battalion. Company L, 3d Battalion, 4th Marines provided security for the Camp J. J. CARROLL Complex and Company E (..), 2d Bettalion, 3d Marrines provided security for the KHE GIA Bridge and the displaced Artillery Battery that was in support of the operation. Company M, 3d Rattalion, 4th Marines established blocking positions in the eastern portion of the Arca of Operation. Initial search and clear operations were conducted in the vestern portion of the Area of Operation but the sweep to the east was cancelled and the operation aborted because of new operational commitments on 27 January. All employed units commenced overland movements to return to their parent organization. All units were returned to the operational control of parent organizations by the 28th of January at 0330 hours. No contact with enemy forces resulted and due to the cancellation of the operation it was impossible to search the entire Area of Operation. On 31 January, Company M, 3d Rattalion, 3d Marines was again placed under the operational control of this Battalion and provided security for Camp CARROLL while Companies E, F, and H with the Command Group initiated a three day search and clear operation in the CUA Valley area.



Operation PRAIRIE terminated 312400 January. The highlights of the month wore the numerous enemy sightings and encounters in the CVA Valley areas the Eattalian size search and destroy operations north of the CNA IO River and in the CVA Valley, and the commencement of a Civil Affairs Program in the Village of CAM IO and CVA Valley Refugee Centers.





NEW TECHNIQUES PAULCYED

(1) The dual 40mm guns of Nattery C, 1st Battalion, 44th Anti-Aircraft Artillery Regiment were utilized to deliver preparation files on a helicepter landing zone prior to introduction of a platton. The large volume of fire delivered completely neutralized the landing zone and the helicepter lift was unopposed.

(2) Small nochanized forces composed of tanks, Ontos, and dual 20rm (SP) guns have been used extensively to patrol the long MSR in the Area of Operation. Infantry mounted on the vehicles previded additional security and established check points for population control along the MSR, and ostablished forces also provided flank security furing the CUA Valley operation and delivered preparation fires on Objectives prior to the assault by infentry forces.

(3) During truce periods additional reconnaissance patrols and observation posts were established to report movement of all persons noving through the Area of Operation.

(4) A rallior was used at the County Fair operation in CUA Valley to point out known or suspected Viet Cong that were living in the Refugee Centers.

f. COMIAND RELATIONS MERNARCHED

During the period 1-31 January the 2d Battalion, 3d Marines was under the Operational Control of the 3d Marine Regiment and under the Administrative Control of the 3d Marine Division.

Company G was CPCCN to the 3d Battalion, 4th Marines from 010730H to 011730H January 1967 and CPCCN to the 3d Marine Regiment from 130900H Company G remains CPCCN to 3d Marine Regiment. ADCON of Company G has remained with the 2d Battalion, 3d Marines.

Company F was CPCON to the 3d Battalion, 4th Marines from 211705H to 251530H January 1967. ADCCN remained with the 2d Battalion, 3d Marines.

Company M, 3d Pattalion, 3d Marinos was CPGON to this Battalion from 260800H to 280330H January and from 301500H January to 021630H February 1967. ADGON remained with the 3d Battalion, 3d Marines.

Companies L and M'3d Eattalien, 4th Marines were CPCCN to this Battalien from 260800H to 271000H January 1967. ADCON remained with the 3d Battalien, 4th Marines.

G. EQUIPMENT

- 1. General: Monsoon conditions have continued to cause a high percentage of deadlined equipment. High usage parts such as brake shoes for the M/22/Al, and H-138U hand sets for the AN/PRC-25 are particularly vulnerable to the adverse weather conditions experienced during this period.

 2. Individual Clothing and Equipment. Most individual clothing and equipment has withstood the climatic and operational conditions excellently. Exceptions are jungle utility trousers, jungle boots and flak jackets, all of which remain critical items due to high usage rates.

 3. Special Equipment.
- (a) Eight charcoal space heaters were used throughout the past nonth. Both wood and focal charcoal were burned with excellent results.

 (b) Twenty-five MICEL rifles have been received for training purposes.

(c) Tests of the vehicle mounts for the AN/IRC-47 and AN/IRC-41

were conducted with excellent results.

4. Communication Flectronics. As indicated above, some items of equipment have been in short supply due to a high usage rate. Generators to provide electric power for the Pattalion encampment have been furnished by 3d Engineer Battalion.

5. Motor Transport.

- (a) All vehicles are on hand except for two M274's that have been on order for several months.
- (b) Second echelon repair continues to be a heavy requirement due to mensoon conditions.

6. Mess. Galley equipment continues to perform excellently. Flame heads from "B" pack field ranges were used with excellent results to supplement charcoal stoves in warning tents.

H. LOGISTICS

1. Supply

(a) Battalion Supply has continued to maintain a rear area physically separted from the forward base camp by 15 road miles. The supply rear is located near FLSU. Class I, III, IV and V items have been available at FLSU and transported directly to forward distribution points for the Battalion. Limited Class II has been available from FLSU.

(b) Daily trips to FLSU, as required, were made for the repair

of ordnance and office machines.

(c) Requisitions were hand carried to Fleet Stock Account. Priority 02 requisitions were cleared through Division Supply prior to submission.

2. Maintenapce

(a) The following quantity of items by category were taken to MTSU for main temands:

- (b) Second echelon repair has remained adequate, although nonsoon conditions, have been destructive on noter transport parts such as brakes shoes and wheel cylinders.
- 3. Fool pervices. A Battalion field moss has been in operation during January. One company and the major part of H & S Company moss at a central facility. Hot rations are transported to one additional company. Mossing facilities for the 150 man rear are provided by the 4th Marines moss hall.

4. Cantemment and Camp Facilities Development.

(a) Positions turned-over to the Rattalion at Camp CARROLL have been improved and expanded, however, no permanent cantonment facilities have been constructed due to the field role of the Battalion at Camp CARROLL. Extensive wire barriers have been constructed.

(b) The supply and administrative rear have utilized existing tin roof buildings and tents for personnel billeting storage, and office space.

(c) Additional head facilities, tent flooring, and limited material

for bunkers have been requested.

Encl: (1) Format for Reporting Sighting

- 1. The anticipated increase in dispersion of units and the requirement for timely and accurate intelligence as a basis for realistic planning and operations requires that units submit all sightings of persons or unusual events immediately. The enemy bases his future infiltrations, attacks, and ambushes upon the intelligence he receives from his reconnaissance forces. These forces may be wearing uniforms and carrying weapons but more likely will be dressed as farmers or in other civilian type clothing. An effective courier service is an integral part of our enemy's intelligence system. Denied this critical means of communication, he will be hard pressed to know our patrol routes, unit locations, and weapons emplacements.
- 2. In the past, we have reported movements of, and contacts with, armed enemy forces. In an effort to curtail the enemy's intelligence gathering effort, deny him his infiltration routes, and disrupt his courier service, increased emphasis must be placed on population control, reconnaissance patrols, and observation posts.
- 3. All sightings of, and encounters with, indigenous personnel will be reported to this Headquarters using the format shown in enclosure (1). Spot Report forms will continue to be utilized to report all enemy initiated incidents or contacts.
- 4. Company Commanders will assign watch standers on all observation posts, and will ensure that these watch standers are informed as to their specific duties, including the requirement to report. Watch standers will be on duty during all daylight hours. Binoculars should be utilized whenever possible.





1. SITUATION.

Destruction of enemy forces will be accomplished by limiting the enemy's advance by strategically placed blocking positions, the coordinated movement of reserve or reaction forces, and proplemed artillery/morter concentrations.

3. FXECUTION.

a. Concept of Overations. This plan provides for the rapid movement of friendly forces within Camp J. J. CARROLL to provide physical reinforcements to a sector under attack, and to place troops in designated blocking positions. The Sector under attack will utilize Sector Reaction Forces to contain and destroy the attacking force. If the Camp is under large scale attack and is penetrated or in immediate danger of being penetrated, all reaction forces will assume blocking positions to contain or delay the enemy penetration in order that the Camp Defense Reserve may close with and destroy the enemy.





b. Sector A

(1) Be prepared to defend assigned perimeter against enemy attack.



Establish blocking positions within Sector A along routes of possible enemy penetration. Be prepared to occupy these positions to contain, delay, and destroy any enemy penetration.

(3) Be prepared to employ Sector Reserve Forces to delay and/or destroy the enemy penetration.

c. <u>Sector B</u>



Alert Conditions

Readiness Status

Condition I

Camp is under attack

100% security on perimeter. All persons man defensive positions. Personnel not actively engaged in execution of this plan will man minimum essential command/control billets, or will take shelter in designated areas.

Condition II

Attack Imminent

100% security on perimeter. All persons man defensive positions except those necessary to maintain communication, command, and fire direction centers in defense of camp.

Condition III

Attack warning

50% security on perimeter. Be prepared to execute <u>Condition II</u> within 15 minutes.

Condition IV

Normal

25% security on perimeter. Be prepared to execute Condition II within 30 minutes.

Alert conditions will be promulgated by the fastest means available.

<u>Condition III</u> is always in effect during the hours of darkness and poriods of reduced visibility. <u>Conditions I and II</u> will be passed over the Camp J. J. CARROLL Defense Net or Landline.

Rehearsals and Drills

- 1. Rehearsals and drills may be conducted at any time by Sector Commanders after securing clears to from the Camp De Sense Coordinator.
- 2. Unscheduled Camp defensive drills will be conducted by the Camp Defense Coordinator to realistically evaluate the counter-mortar plan and perimeter defense.





- 3. Sector Commanders will result the initial Drill Alert via the Camp Defense Not.
- 4. The Drill will normally be conducted in two phases:

Phase I: Phase I consists of a live fire test of the counter-mortar plan by both direct and indirect fire weapons. Fire missions for direct fire weapons will be passed over the Camp Defense Not, while the appropriate Conduct of Fire Net will be utilized to request fire missions for indirect fire weapons. All persons not engaged in the conduct of counter-mortar fires will immediately go to bunkers, shelters, or trenches. Sector Commanders will notify the Camp Defense Coordinator via the Camp Defense Net when all persons have taken cover.

Phase II: Phase II provides for the manning of all sector defensive positions and the movement of reaction forces by the Camp Defense Coordinator to reinferce one or more of the sectors. Sector Commanders will notify the Camp Defense Coordinator when all defensive positions are manned.

5. Sector Commanders will be notified to secure from the drill via the Camp Defense Net.

Annex G (Glossary) to Operation Plan 1-67

- 1. ASSEMBLY AREA Is an area where units (personnel) assemble prior to further tactical action. It is used for entrucking or detrucking, feeding, resting, awaiting or issuing orders, and reorganizing and/or making preparations for combat.
- 2. <u>BLOCKING POSITIONS</u> Organized to deny the enemy access to a given area or provent his advance in a certain direction.
- 3. CAMP COMMANDER Commanding Officer, Marine Infantry Regiment.
- 4. CAMP DEFENSE COORDINATOR As appointed by Commanding Officer, Marine Infantry Regiment, usually the Resident Infantry Rattalion Commander.
- 5. CAMP DEFENSE RESERVE * The reserve forces organized by Camp Defense Coordinator. Utilized for commitment into any sector of the base perimeter to serve in reinfercing the already established defenses, as a counter-attacking force, or as a blocking force.
- 6. FINAL PROTECTIVE FIRES (FFF) In the defense, the machinegum fires, barrages of mertars and artillery, the PDF's of automatic rifles, sectors of fire of individual rifles, and the granadier's sector of fire.
- 7. FINAL PROTECTIVE LINE (FPL) Fired by machineguns as a part of the final protective fires (FPF).
- 8. NIGHT DEFINSIVE FIRE PLAN During the hours of darkness, the tactical plan for using the weapons of a unit so that their fire missions will be to each automatic rifloman, usually covering a likely avenue of approach or dead space in the FFL.
- 9. FROVISIONAL RIFLE FLATOON Consists of poronnol not normally assigned an infantry billot.
- 10. SECTOR OF FIRE In the defense, assigned to all riflemon, automatic riflemon, machine gunners and groundiers. Consists of direction of fire with a designated right and left limit.
- 11. SECTOR REACTION FORCES The reserve force organized by each Sector Commander, which is readily available in event of attack to assist in reinforcing the already established defensive perimeter or serve as a counter-attacking or blocking force.





- i2. SPOT REFORT A standardized report used to pass information. The following format is utilized. Only the letter designation are used to identify paragraph when reporting.
 - A (Unit/Individual/Source of report)
 - B Date Time Group of incident
 - C Location of incident by coordinates, friendly first, enemy second.
 - D Complete Description of incident, when, who what, where, why.
 - E Complete Description of action taken.
 - F Fridndly Killed in Action (KIA)
 - G Friendly Wounded in Action (WIA)
 - H Friendly Missing in Action (MIR)
 - I Enony Killed in Action (KIA)
 - J .- Enony Wounded in Action (WIA)
 - K Viet Cong Confirmed (VCC)

During this Dattalion's participation in Operation PRAIRIE there has been no direct support Pattery assigned. Liaison section and FO teams are members of Dattery A, 1st Dattalion, 12th Marines. Despite the fact that a wide range of Marine, Army, and Navy supporting units have been caployed, operating relationships have been excellent. Artillery has been omployed heavily by this Dattalion. All plateen and company size operations were proceded by heavy propartion fires on objectives which the infantry was to occupy. When such forces were to be helicopter lifted, massive preparation and flak and nortar suppression fires were delivered on and around the Landing Zone. Harrassment and interdiction fires were fired around the clock discouraging potential bnony nortar attacks on friendly positions. Observed fire missions on live targets have been few, and the targots small. In many instances, there has been no opportunity for friendly forces to enter a target area to obtain an accurate enemy casualty count before the survivers can remove the bodies. The overall effectiveness of artillery fired in support of this Pattalion, however, is attested to by the fact that recent sweeps and patrols have uncovered several graves containing VC/NVA bodies killed by shrapnet.



b. Air Support. During the period 24 October - 24 December this Battalion requested and received the following air support:

Close Air Support - 5 missions
Holicoptor Rosupply - 4 missions
Holicoptor Troop Lift - 4 missions
Fixed Wing Troop Lift - 1 missions
Modical Evacuation - 17 missions

All air requests were passed to Regimental TAOP via land line or Regimenal TACP Local Not. The Regimental TACP passed the requests on to the Direct Air Support Contor after screening. The reaction time and effectiveness of this Close Air Support was good. The average time from submission of requests to arrival of the aircraft was 30 minutes. The availability of AO's and TAO (A)'s was excollent, often calling in offering their services without a prior request having been nade. UH-IE gunships were very effective against "soft" targets which were extremely close to our lines. All 17 medovacs were of an immediate nature. The senior medical Officer/Corpsnan on the scene designated the procedence of the nedevac i.o., emergency, priority, or routine. The reaction time for medevace varied with nedovac procedence assigned and weather conditions. Emergency nedevacs avoraged 15-20 minutes from request to pick-up, and priority requests avoraged 25-35 minutes. Flight distance from DONG HA was about 11 miles; ... Considering that the weather was marginal during most of the reporting poriod, the above averages were outstanding. All medevacs were conducted on the Regimental TACP Local Net. On all operations; the Rattalian TACP was briofed to record the coordinates of VC trenches, flighting holes, heavy travelled jungle trails, etc. These targets plus others suggested by the Battalion 5-2 were passed to Regimental TACP in the form of TPQ - 10 Bombing Roquests. The Battalion submitted approximately 25 TPO requests daily.

- c. Tank Support. Tanks have been effectively used as part of the perimeter defense of Camp J. J. Chilloll, convoy and engineer nine sweep security, and are included in the reaction/counterattack plans of this unit. Company A (-), 3d Tank Battalion has performed all assigned missions excellently, but the use of tanks has been restricted to the read network because of the poor cross-country trafficability due to the rains that have provailed during this period.
- d. Anti-Tank Support. Ontos have been effectively used as part of the perineter defense of Camp J. J. CARROLL, convoy security, mechanized patrols along the MSR, security for the KHE GIA Bridge, support of Company E in the CUA Valley, and are included in the reaction/counter-attack plans of this unit. The Ontos cross-country use is not as severely curtailed as the tanks, but their use has been limited in many areas because of the poor trafficability of the terrain. Response to all assigned missions has been excellent.

- Anti-Aircraft Support. Battery C (-) (reinf) 1st Battalion, 44th Anti-Aircraft Artillery Regiment, U. S. Army has been assigned the prinary mission of support of the ground forces and the secondary mission of anti-aircraft defense. In its prinary role of support of the ground forces Company C's dual 40rm guns and quid .50 caliber neunts have been positioned around the perimeter of Camp J. J. CARROLL and the KHE GIA Bridge. Other tasks assigned have been convey security, mechanized patrol along the MSR and in one instance preparation fires were delivered on a landing zone prior to the introduction of a plateen. The fires of the dual 40's completely neutralized the landing zone. Both the dual 40's and the cuad 50's have been utilized to deliver eight H&I fires. Company C is included in the reaction/counter-attack plans of this unit. The performance of Company C has been cutstanding and it has performed all assigned missions competently and professionally.
- f. Scout Snipers. The Scout Sniper Squad in direct support of this unit has been employed on all Battalien and Company size operations. In addition, Scout Sniper teams have been employed on the observation posts north of Camp J. J. CARROLL and on the observation post overlooking the CUA Valley. The Scout Snipers have performed well, but low visibility throughout this period has reduced their effectiveness.
- 7. Intelligence. During the period of 24 October 1966 to 15 November 1966, the 2d Dattalion, 3d Marines continued its mission of defending its assigned Tactical Area of Responsibility, south-southwest of DANANG Air Base. On 15 November the 2d Battalion, 3d Marines deployed to DONG HA to assume a defensive posture for the DONG HA Combat Base and the bulk fuel installation, at the mouth of the CUA VIET River, in support of Operation PRAIRIE. Intelligence at that time carried the confirmed 308th Battalion, two confirmed companies. HAI LANG and TRIEU PHONG Companies, two possible unidentified companies and one possible unidentified plateon as enemy units boaring a direct throat to the security of DCNG HA Combat Base and the bulk fuel installation. It was estimated that the enemy had the capability of launching a ground assualt, mortar attack, combined or separate, against the area as well as to continue acts of harrassment and sabotage against USMC and ARVN positions. Encounters with the eneny remained light throughout our employment at DONG HA and the bulk fuel installation. The first significant contact was initiated by an estimated squad of VC/NVA snipers during a Company I swoop north of the SONG VINH PHUCC. The estimated 140 rounds of small arms and automatic weapons fire received from vicinity YD 251552 and YD 255552 was suppressed by friendly small arms fire and an artillery mission that forced the enemy to withdraw. Two caves, four feet wide and approximately six feet deep were observed across the river vicinity YD 195520, capable of providing refuge for the enemy. Incidents of further enemy activity during the period of 18 November to 3 December included the detenation of one undetermined type mine, rigged with a trip wire, by a Company G patrol vicinity YD 237568; 12 to 14 rounds of sniper fire received by convoy shuttling equipment from the LCU ramp to our Command Post, from vicinity YD 249608; Company C, 3d Tank Battalion Command Post, vicinity



YD 235591, received 15 rounds sniper fire from vicinity YD 242585 and an explosion was observed vicinity YD 252596 accompanied with suspected novement. No evert enemy activity was reported within or adjacent to our Area of Operation between 30 November and 4 December.

On 4 December, 2d Pattalion: 3d Navinos displaced to Camp J. J. CARROLL to assume the mission of providing security for the Camp Complex and initiating offonsive search and destrey operations within our Area of Operations. Current intelligence carried three confirmed, two probable and eight possible energy units within and adjacent to our Area of Operation. The K-5, K-6 and K-7 Companies of the 2d Battalien, 31st Regiment, 341st Division, North Vietnamese Army were, and still are, carried as confirmed enony forces capable of launching an offensive action, utilizing ground forces, nortar barrages or a combination of both within the Area of Operation PRAIRIE. Although this Battalion was not subjected to any large scale enemy offensive, the outlying Marine positions of CAM LO and the Reckpile were mertared on several occasions. Two unidentified companies, carried as probable enony units within reinforcing or attacking distance of less than 24 hours, romain unlocated and unconfirmed. Of the eight rossible enony forces, one Regiment, one Battalien, 812 Regiment, 324B Division, North Victnamese Army and the "YELLOW STAR" Company also remain unconfirmed. All of the above units have the capability of continuing harassment, mining, booby trapping, sniping, mortaring and propaganda activities throughout the QUANG TRI Province, with emphasis being directed toward the Operation PRAIRIE area. The most significant event to be noted after 5 December was the search and destroy operation conducted by Companies E and H in the CUA Valley with blocking elements provided by ARWN for ces at the "D-5" compound. The area swept produced light enemy centact with 15 VC/NVA firing heavy automatic and small arms weapons. Small arms and a UH-1E gunship, forced the enemy to withdraw. Enony casualties totaled three KIA confirmed and five KIA probable. Two mines were detenated, one by Company E elements, determined to be pressure type mine; the second, a trip wire rigged grounde detenated by elements of Company H vicinity YD 102500. A third mino, CHI CCM gronado rigged with a trip wire, was discovered and destroyed by elements of Company E vicinity YD 112313. A total of 500 pounds of rice, assorted medical supplies, documents and two roinforced caves were captured or destroyed. The rice was released to ANVN personnel for redistribution to the refugees. Company G patrol sighted and fired on four VC/NVA vicinity YD 065528. The enemy was armed with small arms and gromades. Friendly small arms claimed two KIA probable. Two automatic and two carbine weapons were discovered in a house as well as assorted nedical supplies, clothing, 30 pounds of rice and various cating utensils. Other incidents during the period included many detections of energy never ent by the AN/TPS-21 (Ocuntorintelligence Surveillance Radar). The AN/TPS-21 on the observation rost at Hill #250 (YD 0655) registered all of the movement north of the SONG CAN LO in the area bounded by grid squares YD 0357, 0359, 0859 and 0857. Artillery, mortar, and 40mm fire missions neutralized all detected movement. Also noteworthy is the jaming and interference attempts on Battalien Tactical Net and Artillery Conduct of Fire Net. Although nost of the transmissions nonitored were determined



to be of a Vietnamose language, several interceptions were of an Criental language other than North or South Vietnamese. Furthermore, merimeter security for Camp J. J. CARRELL reported, on different occasions, sightings of lights and movement immediately adjacent to the perimeter wire.

Weather and terrain conditions during Sporation PMITALL often made patrolling and sweeping difficult. This reporting period included the annual meason season. Constant reducall, interupted by periods of clear weather, often too brief to be of any value for drying terrain and lowering the height of streambeds, made trafficability of reads and fording of streams often impossible.

8. Mission. During this period two separate missions were assigned to the Dattalion.

a. Period 15 November - 4 December 1966

- (1) Execute defense for DONG HA Combat Base and Bulk Fuel Installation at nouth of CAU VIET River.
- (2) Maintein at DONG HA Combat Base a reinferced rifle plateen as reaction force on 15 minute alert.
- (3) Conduct operations in the Area of Cperation to the south and southeast of the DONG HA Combat Dasa.
- (4) Coordinate and conduct the defense of DCNG HA Combat Base to include artillery, notor transport, and other installations.
- (5) Bo prepared to conduct other operations as directed.

b. Poriod & December - 24 December 1966

- (1) Conduct reconneissance in force operations to detect, attack, and destroy enemy forces in the Area Operation.
- (2) Conduct operations to maintain security of the MSR (Route #9) in Area of Operation.
- (3) Conduct operations to defend and ensure security of Camp J. J. CARWILL (YD 0654).
- (4) Conduct operations to defend KHE GIA Bridge (YD 027561).
- (5) Provide security for Camp J. J. CARR'LL water point, water source, and water pipes.
- (6) Bo prepared, on order, for deployment by air or surface means for operations anymore in the Operation PRAIRIE Area of Operation.

9. Concept of Coration. During the initial period 15 November through 4 December the 2d Battalion, 3d Marines provided one Rifto Uchipaly (roin) to defend its assigned sector of the MING KA Combat base perimeter; ene Riflo Company (roinf) provided security for the Bulk Med. Installion at the mouth of the CAU VIET Rivery a Wift's Company (...) provided a plateon (roinf) as a reaction force on 15 minute alert and conducted limited patrols, ambushes, and listening posts in its assigned sector. One Rifle Company (reinf) conducted reconnaissance in force operations in assigned Area of Operation and was made available to other Pattalions for operations in the Operation IRAIRIE Area of Operation. During the 4-24 December period one Rifle Company provided security for the assigned sector of Camp J. J. CARRELL perimeter; one Rifle Company provided security for the KHE GIA Bridge and a plateen (reinf) as a reaction force. Two Rifle Companies and a Cormand Group conducted extensive reconnaissance in force operations, patrols, ambushos, and listening posts, One of those companios was made available to other Battaliens for operations in the Operation PRMIRIE Area of Operation .

10. Execution. In early Nevember, the 2d Battalion, 3d Marines located in DAI LCC District, DANANG TACR was ordered to correct novement to the Operation PRAIRIE Area of Operation and relieve the 3d Battalion, 7th Marines at DONG HA Combat Dase. Initial nevenent of Company H commonced on 15 November and Company H had, by nightfall of the 15th assumed the mission for the defense of the CAU VIET Bulk Fuel Installation. By the 19th of Nevember all Rifle Companies and the Command Group had displaced to the DONG HA Combat Base and were placed under the operational control of the 4th Marines. The displacement from DAI ICC to DANANG airfield was accomplished by helicopter as the MSR was not trafficable because of bridge washouts caused by the terrential rains. The movement of men, equipment, and supplies from DAMANG airfield to DING HA Combat Base was accomplished by KC-130 aircraft. The movement of Command Group "B" and the "follow up" supplies was completed by 21 November. This element neved by KC-130 aircraft and YFU boats. The 3d Pattalion, 7th Marines displaced concurrently with this Cattalion and no major problems were encountered. Company G, reinforced with one plateen from Company E, assumed responibility for the defense of the assigned sector of the defensive perimeter. Company E (-) conducted patrols, ambushes, and reconnaissance in force operations throughout the assigned Area of Croration. Company E also provided a plateon (reinf) as a reaction force. On 23 November, Company F was placed under the operational control of the 3d Battalion, 4th Marines and conducted reconnaissance in force operations in the CON THIRN/CAM IC area. Company H in conjuction with the 1st Battalion, 2d ARVN Regiment conducted a search and clear operation on 30 November along the coast north of the CAU VIET River. The 1st of December, the 2d Pattalien, 3d Marines (-) continued to provide security for the DONG HA Combat Dase and the CAU VIET fuel facility. Company F remained under the operational control of the 3d Battalion, 4th Marines until 4 December. On 2 December, the Battalion initiated displacement to Camp J. J. CARRILL and by nightfall of 4 December



Companies E, F, and G in addition to Command Group "A", had arrived at Camp J. J. CARWILL and relieved the 2d Battalion, 9th Marines for the defense of the Camp CARWILL Complex at 1100 hours. The 2d Battalion, 9th Marinos assumed the mission for detense of the D NG MA Combat Base at 1600 hours. Company E, 2d Dattalians, Sch Marillos was placed under the operational control of this Bassalion and provided security for the KHE GIA Bridge. Cornand Group "B" dasplaced to Gamp CARWILL on 5 Docombor. Cn 8 December, Company G was placed under the operational control of the 3d Battalion, Ath Marines and conducted operations in the CAM IC area. Cn-11 December, Company H returned to the operational control of this Battalion and Company E, 2d Dattalion, 9th Marines returned to the operational control of its parent unit. Company H conducted a reconnaissance in force operation for a three day period commencing on 15 December. Command Group "A" with Companies E and H corrected a two day combined operation with the 1st Battalion, 2d ARVN Regiment in the CUA Valley. The ARVN forces provided the blocking elements along the southern portion of the valley and the forces of this Battalion conducted a search and clear operation initiated from the northern portion of the valley and sweeping to the south. Contact was made with an estimated VC squad and the enemy suffered three KIA confirmed and five KIA, probable. The VC command center and living quarters were pointed out by a rallier that accompanied the assault units and wore destroyed. 500 pounds of rice were recovered and returned to the D-5 ARVN outpost for redistribution to the refugees in the area.



12. Administrative Matters. Administrative planning for the operation was extensive as the entire Battalien. Due to the short time from the receipt functions accompanied the Battalien. Due to the short time from the receipt of the order to the nove to the operation FRAIRIE area, no fermal written plans were published. The tactical elements of the Battalien were air lifted from the DAI ICC position beginning on 15 November 1966. Due to isolation of the main position by floods and bridge washouts, the final elements were unable to depart DANANG until 21 November 1966 for the Operation FRAIRIE area. Once established in DONG HA, the supply base has remained in that general location with a minimum of support established forward.

a. Supply. After the initial neverent phase, ending on 21 December 1966 the Pattalion and Conpany supplies have remained at the DONG HA Cambat Base area. A consolidation of supply accountability was offected in mid-December. Supply distribution points were established at both the rear and forward areas. One supply man, one armorer and abreviated records have handled the distribution of supplies forward, and accomplished basic armory repair and issue.

b. Maintenance. Primary maintenance facilities have been established with the supply rear. Some repair of motor transport, communications, and ordnance goar has been accomplished at the forward base camp. Maintenance support for third echolon and above has been through FLSU, MNG HA to FLSG, DANANG.

c. Treatment of casualties was conducted primarily by Company Corpsnen. The Battalien Aid Station was established at the Camp CARROLL base camp. Medical facilities were available from that location, and with the Battalien Command Group in the field. Medical evacuation of all seriously wounded and non-ambulatory personnel was conducted by helicopter to "D" Collecting and Clearing Company at DONG HA. No problems or serious delays resulted with such evacuations. Non-battle casualties were hospitalized at the Battalien Aid Station unless further studies were indicated. All battle casualties were hospitalized at "D" Collecting and Clearing Company unless further treatment was necessary.



Interestation. Organic notor transport has been based with the supply rear. Despite a high deadline rate caused by nonseen weather conditions, support of essential tactical and housekeeping functions has been excellent. Organic transport has been supplemented by trucks from 9th Motor Transport Battalion. Two brucks per day have corried rations and general supply from the DONG FA Base to the forward area. The two trucks have performed administrative and house keeping runs for the Battalion.

o. Communications.

(1) Goneral

a. The communications section supported the assigned missions at the DNNG HA Combat Base and Camp J. J. CARROLL during this period. At DCNG HA few corrunications problems natorialized due to the restricted supplement of the Battalion. At the Camp J. J. CARROLL position several problems presented themselves due to the bread, diverse, and independent employment of the Battalion units.

(2) Wiro.

- a. This capability was hanpored by the inadvertent but frequent interdiction by friendly tracked and whooled vehicles.
- b. Enomy intordiction of this capability has been extremely limited.
- c. Equipment difficulties created by the mensoon weather was compounded by the repair lag in the established FLSU/FLSG arrangement. Equipment turned into FLSU for repair was dependent upon the availability of transportation between FLSU, DONG HA and FLSG, DANANG where the actual repair takes place.


(3) Redio

a. The continued combat attrition of AN/FRG-25 accessories without replacement through the supply system presented an extremely difficult situation.

b. Implement of the Battalion's subordinate units into widely separated and independent areas created a strain on radio equipment.

(4) Mossavo Contor. During Operation PRAIRIE this capability functioned strictly by courior due to the preximity of the Rattalion Cornand Post to the Regimental Headquarters. No electrical or cryptographic devices were employed although the capability was maintained.

- (6) Power. During Operation FFAIRTE power requirements remained constant. Combat Operations Center, Patvalien Aid Station, messhall and electronic repair facility were provided electricity.
- (7) Rader. AN/TFS-21 equipment continues to be susceptible to the hunid environment. However, when operable the AN/TFS-21 has been extremely effective in detecting enemy neverent in the Area of Operation.
- 13. Special Equipment and Techniques. No special equipment has been used on this operation. Organic Marine Corps issued equipment has proven reliable and satisfactory in all respects. Otters have been effectively utilized during this period for resupply of outlying positions and have been placed in a standby status for medical evacuation if helicopter support was precluded by weather conditions. Ralliers have accompanied assault units to point out known minefields, booby traps, and VC command centers and living areas. A joint Command Post was established to include both U. S. Marine Corps and ARVM personnel for fire support coordination ofall forces operating in the Area of Operation during the CUA Vally operation. Licison personnel were exchanged during this operation and resulted in an excellent exchange of information concerning the exact location of forces and the future intentions of units. The Marine liaison team consisted of a Liaison Officer, radio operator with AN/PRC-25, and an interpreter
- 14. Commander's Analysis. The most important factor contributing to the success of this operation during this period has been the rapid response and combat readiness of all Marine units. No delays have been encountered due to deadlined equipment or unprepared personnel. The Marines have acted promptly and aggressively in every instance. Missions have been clearly defined, intelligence data accurate, and all assigned tasks have been accomplished in a highly professional manner. No Civil Affairs projects were initiated during this period because of the displacements of the Battalion and the scarity of civilians in the Area of Operation. Programs have been planned to assist the refugees in the CAM LC and CUA Valley refugee centers. Esychological Marfare Teams, including leaflet drops and breadcasts, have been used extensively throughout the Area of Operation. Combined operations with Republic of Vietnam forces have been well planned and executed.







15. Recommendations.

- a. That increased emphasis be placed on Civil Affairs projects.
- b. That combined operations with ARVM forces continue to be planned and executed.
- c. That reconniessance in force, search and destroy operations be conducted north of the CAM LC River.





I. CEVIL ACTION.

Conoral.

- (a) 7 January A combined County Fair/search and clear operation was conducted in the hardet of DOC KINH, coordinates YD 098525. The 3d Marine Regimental Surgeon and Battalion expenses conducted a MEDCAP treating 238 people. On 6 January, the District Chief distributed foodend several and hundred pounds of clothing. Entertainment was provided by the 244th Psychological Operations Company and an Audio-Visual Team. During the operation all persons were screened by a team from 15th CIT and National Police with fair results. A number of persons were narked for further investigation.
- (b) 12 January . The Pattalion Commandor and Operations Officer not with CAM La District Chief and sub-sector advisor to discuss the capabilities of the Battalion to best support needed Civic Action Projects within this District. Several projects were discussed, principally oriented toward the Refugees in the CUA Valloy. These included schools, dispensaries, and sanitation. Requisitions have been submitted for the necessary materials with which to further these programs.
- 2. Material Distributed. During the period covered by this report, a total of 1005 persons received nedical aid from the Battalien medical personnel. In the handet of DCC KINH, 250 pounds of clothing were distributed.
- 3. Special Civic Action Projects. Material has been requisitioned to repair NO KINH Hantet school, build a dispensary, playground, and to construct or repair wells.



A. Apparent results of Civil Affairs Programs. Due to operational consistents, the Civil Affairs Program of this Attalion is just gotting underway. One of our companies is working closely with Regional and Popular Force personnel in the CUA Vally area. Company corporan are holding daily sick calls. A feeling of nutual trust and confidence is gradually approaching through the valley.

J. ADMINISTRATION

Personnel Accounting. A shortage of consumable supplies still exists.

- 2. Awards: One Silver Star Medal, Two Bronze Star Medals w/Combat Distinguishing Device, One Navy Commendation Medal w/Combat Distinguishing Device, Four Purple Hearts, One Vietnanese Cross of Callantry w/Palm, Two Vietnanese Crosses of Gallantry w/Gold Star, One Vietnanese Cross of Callantry w/Silver Star, One Vietnanese Cross of Gallantry w/Rrenze Star.
- 3. Fromotions: One to First Sorgant, one to Connery Sorgant, one to Sorgant, 61 to Corporal, 60 to Lance Corporal, and 23 to Private First Class.
- 4. Festal: Satisfactory.
- 5. Pay: No problems areas.
- 6. Fost Exchange: The Battalien is being serviced by the Division Fost Exchange and the use of sundry packs. Fost Exchange supplies continue to be extremely limited.
- 7. Legal and Discipline: One Surmary Court Martial and one Special Court Martial conducted. One Special Court Martial pending. Two cases are pending trial by General Court Martial. One Pro-trial investigation was completed. One violation of Article 86, one Article 92, and three Article 134, UCMJ, have occurred. There were one Enttalion and three Company NJP's.

K. PERSCHIEL.




1. Enemy Situation at Beginning of Period:

- (a) Captured documents confirm the K-6 Company of the 2d Battalion, 31st Regiment, 341st Division, North Vietnamese Army as operating within and adjacent to our Area of Operation vicinity grid square YD 0159, approximately 7000 meters northwest of our Command Post. Reported strength and amment is 120 men with MO's, B-40's, AK's, and individual small arms.
- (b) The K-7 Company of the 2d Battalion, 31st Regiment, 341st Division, North Vietnamese Amy is a confirmed unit operating approximately 7000 meters northwest of our Command Post, vicinity grid square YD 0159, with a strength of 110 men amed with three 82mm nortars, AK's, CKC's and individual small ams.
- (c) The K-5 Company of the 2d Battalion, 31st Regiment, 341st Division, North Vietnamese Amy is being carried as a confirmed unit, operating 4000 neters southeast of our Command Post, vicinity grid square YD 1151.
- (d) One unidentified Company with Headquarters and Support Company, is being carried as a probable unit (Headquarters and Support Company a possible unit), operating 4000 meters east of our Area of Operation, vicinity grid square YD 1153. The company has a reported strength of 40 men, Headquarters and Support Company strength unknown.
- (e) One unidentified company is being carried as a probable unit, operating 3000 meters east of our Area of Operation, vicinity grid square YD 1052.
- (f) One company designated as the "YELLOW STAR" Company is being carried as a possible unit, operating 5000 meters south-southeast of our Area of Operation, vicinity grid square YD 1049.
- (g) The 6th Battalion of the 812th Regiment, 324B Division, North Vietnamese Amy (AKA K.6-D.6, THU BON Battalion or CUA LONG Battalion) is being carried as a possible enemy force operating within our Area of Operation, vicinity grid square YD 0752, 4000 meters south-southeast of our present Command Post. The 6th Battalion has a strength of 520 men amed with 3x82mm mortars, 3x57mm recoilless rifles, 9x8-40 s and 12 machine-guns.
- (h) The K-8 Company of the 2d Battalion, 31st Regiment, 341st Division, North Vietnamese Amy is carried as a possible unit, operating 5600 meters northwest of our Command Post, vicinity grid square YD 0158.







- (j) One unidentified Regiment is being carried as a possible enemy force operating vicinity grid square YD 0347, approximately 2000 meters south of our Area of Operation.
- (k) One unidentified Battalion is being carried as a possible enemy force operating vicinity grid square YD 9954, approximately 7000 meters west of our Command Post.
- (1) One unidentified Company is carried as a possible enemy force operating within our Area of Operation vicinity grid square YD 0553, approximately 3000 meters south of our Command Post.
- (m) One unidentified Company (Possible) is reported to be operating in the CUA Valley immediately south and southeast of our Area of Operation with a night assembly area vicinity grid square YD 0650.

2. Significant Trends During the Reporting Period:

- (a) During the reporting period it is significant to note that this Battalions' Area of Operation was not subjected to any large scale overt action by enemy forces. Elements of 3d Battalion, 3d Marines, responsible for the security of the "Rockpile", were mortared on several occasions as were elements in the CAM LO area.
- (b) The enemy has the capability of initiating a mortar attack against elements of 2d Battalion, 3d Marines and their assigned areas of responsibility, then withdraw along a preplanned escape route. He also has the capability of using 120mm mortars; coupled with movement during periods of inclement weather, to "utilize terrain favorable for defilade fire upon any of numerous targets such as the bridge vicinity YD 036562 and the outpost at the "D"-5 area. Marine and Amy counter-mortar fire concentrations from Camp J. J. CARROLL include every ideal mortar position for 60mm mortars, 81/82mm mortars and 120mm mortars, to compensate for these capabilities.
- (c) The enemy has left extensive evidence of his propaganda activities, and conducted harassment and delaying actions in the CUA Valley and surrounding jungles. Operations initiated by Marines and friendly forces have men minimal resistance in most areas. The enemy has attempted to delay our forces and then withdraw, of ten leaving little evidence of his occupation of the area.







Recent intelligence reports further substantiate the presence of an undetermined size oncay force directly south and southest of our Area of Operation. These reports are supported by physical sightings of groups of NVA soldiers numbering from five to twenty, plus discovery and investigation of numerous graves in the area, revealing bodies dressed in NVA uniforms.

- (e) During the reporting period the AN/TPS-21 (Counterintelligence Surveillence Reder detections have decreased from the number recorded during the month of December.
- (f) During a recent battalion size search and destroy operation 9000 meters north-northeast of our Command Post, little evidence was found to substantiate the present or past occupation of reported large enemy forces in this area. Furthermore, existing fortifications found during the operation do not substantiate reported enemy forces carried on enemy Order of Battle.

3. Enemy Initiated Incidents During the Reporting Periods

- ol2000H Battery C, 1st Battalion, 44th Artillery: 40mm gun position on northwest portion of defense perimeter reported sighting moving lights in trash dump. Two trip flares were set off, vicinity YD 058552. Fired three rounds 81mm illumination and observed individuals several times. There were no more than two persons. Unable to determine type of clothing worn and no weapons were sighted. No rounds fired.
- 021140H Company E: Patrol vicinity YD 104490 recieved 6 to 8 rounds sniper fire from vicinity YD 109500. Slmm mortar mission expended 10 HE rounds, patrol searched area, found footprints and four empty carbine cartridges.
- 021330H Company E: Patrol found an M-26 fragmentation granade under a cement water container vicinity YD 093504. Also found one trip flare approximately 100 meters south of the granade. Granade and trip flare were not booby trapped, and were destroyed.
- 021445H Company E: Reported a grenade or 60mm mortar round exploded vicinity YD 094515 while burning trash.





COMMUNICATIONS - FLECTRONICS:

1. General. During this period the Battalion continued operations from Camp J. J. CARWOLL. Difficulties previously reported in repair and resupply have been alloviated somewhat by the use of couriers to and from the maintenance facility at DANANG. "Down" equipment is transported by a Pattalion courier to electronic maintenance at FLSG and repaired equipment is picked-up and returned to this unit. Here stocking of ropair parts at the Battalion electronic maintenance shop has also reduced the "down" time to some degree. 2. Wire.

(a) Personnel: Recent personnel allocations have greatly enhanced the flexibility of this Rattalion in this area. During operations, wire personnel wore utilized as radio operators in the rear command post.

(b) Equipment: Switchboards continue to be the main problem in this Mine Packs are being affected by the mensoon weather. Advent of warm dry weather should alleviate this problem.

(c) Wire Lines: Broaks by friendly tracked and wheeled vehicles continue to be a problem.


3. Radio

- (a) Personnel: Assignment of additional communications personnel to the Battalion has alleviated the personnel shortages that have existed in the past.
- (b) Operations: The despersion of Battalion units has greatly taxed the available equipment. Companies operating independently have a greator demand for radios than those operating directly for and in conjunction with the Battalion.
- (c) Muignent: Honsoon hunidity continues to take its toll on radio equipment. Retention of 16 AN/PRC-10's has greatly enhanced the extended operations currently undertaken, and serve to augment the units operating independently so that they may better meet their expanded communications needs. Waterproofing is continually stressed, although waterproofing materials continue to be in short supply.
- 4. Radio Relay: No radio relay equipment is presently assigned to this Pattalion although it is anticipted that a team will be attached when the Battalion rotates to OKINAWA as a Battalion Landing Team.

Message Conter:

(a) The nessage center continues to function by courier with Rogiment. No electrical machines are employed.

(b) The equipment deficiency previously reported has been rectified by the return of a reproducing machine from rapair on OKIMAWA. 6. Maintenance: Problems in this area have been improved by direct contact with the repair facility and by the availability of more parts at the Battalion electronic maintenance facility.


