

2. INTELLIGENCE

Enemy activity during the menth was extremely light as the enemy moved in small groups, concentrating their efforts farther to the western boundary of 3d Merines AO. There was one incident in the Battalica's AO on 17 September. An ambush from Echo spotted rive to six people with me M-60 meahine gun. A hasty ambush was set up but the NWA spotted the ambien and fled. The area was searched and the fall wing someont and gear was found: two hammocks, one cantern, one Fil sover, one NVA poncho, one NVA flashlight, and ten younds of rice. Also captured were assorted personal documents.

3. OPERATIONS

General

b. Saturation Ambushes

The concept of saturation ambushing was emphasized during the period 11 to 20 September 1969. This technique consisted of emplacing a maximum number of four to six man ambushes branching out in all directions like the spokes of a wheel from the "hub" or patrol base. Communications were enhanced through the use of the PRC-88 radios. Good results were realized using the saturation technique; however, the 21 September stand down of the 3d Marine Regiment cut short the opportunity to evaluate their concept fully.

The use of the FRC-88 as primary communication between ambush sites and plateon patrol base proved to be successful. The saturation ambushes proved the PRC-88 a satisfactory radio, with limitations. It was found that the PRC-88 was not durable enough or that the battery life was too short. Since the FRC-88 is a line of sight radio, the range was not always constant, especially in thick vegatation. The major limitation was that the receiver makes too much noise and can compromise the am-

bush location.

c. Long Range Patrol

The battalion was directed to conduct a long range





size patrol into the AO referred to as the Division Recon Zone. The concept of the operation was to conduct a recon patrol with one company unit, operating initially with five days supply of rations and ammunition. Resupply was to be accomplished on the fifth day by helicopter. Three recon teams from 3d Recon Bn. accompanied the movement. These recon teams were dropped off as "stay-behind" forces, left in position after the company moved out from successive areas. Recon teams were replaced every five days with fresh teams.

Echo Company, commencing 14 September, conducted the clandestine long range patrol into the recon zone. Each night at least two squads moved out from the PPB's. Once out the squads broke into three separate ambunus using the squad leaders position as the ambush base. The ambush sites were approximately 30 meters apart. This technique enabled the plateon to saturate completely one to two grid squares, depending on the terrain. In effect, one company was able to place, in mutually supporting positions, a minimum of 21 ambushes.

Movement was made in late afternoon so arrival at the night position would be at dusk--when it becomes more difficult for the enemy to distinguish base locations, while enabling suff-icient preparation of night position.

On 15 September, one Marine had to be helo med-evaced as a result of a snake bite, thereby risking disclosure of the patrol's location.

Patrol activities continued until 20 September when Echo was ordered to move to Quang Tri Combat Base to "stand down" and begin preparations for redeployment.

d. Combined Operations with PF RF Forces


On 14 September a triefing was held at Cam Lo by the District Chief to plan the beginning of a new operation which would integrate elements of the battalion into designated Regional Force units in the Cam Lo Area. Plans were made for integrating two platoons of Golf with two companies of RF's.


Integration was planned as follows: one USMC platoon with an RF company, each squad of the platoon with an RF platoon, down to the level of Marine fire teams with each RF squad.

Plans called for initial employment of the two combined units within that portion of the battalian AO area north of the Cam Lo River up to the 62 grid line.

Following the briefing, unit leaders were introduced to one another. Marines of Golf Company were given personal response lectures by the Battalion S-5 on 15 September in preparation for combined operations.

The operation failed to materialize; however, due to the fact that the District RF companies were rotated without notice on 15 September, and the battalion was moved to Quang Tri Combat Base to stand down on 20 - 21 September.





e. Mortar fire and support of RF/PF forces operating north of the Cam Lo River was rendered on 9 September, consisting of an illumination mission followed by six rounds of 81mm HE.

L. RESULES OF OPERATIONS

a. Casualties Inflicted on the Enemy

The enery suffered a total of nine KIA during the month of September. All enemy KIA's were due to air strikes in the vicinity of the Dong Ma Hill complex. The number of enemy WIA is unknown. There were no MYA POSES and no detaineds during the month.


a. Artillery Support

Artillery support of the battalion during the month of September was severely limited by the size and nature of the battalion's area of operation. The area encompassed static positions at C-3 Brings, Cam Lo District Headquarters, FSB Dakota, and populated areas in and around Cam Lo. Consequently approximately 90% of the area of operations consisted of no fire zones. Up to 21 September, when offensive operations terminated, a total of 391 rounds were expended on 56 targets. This included 281 fired during 14 observed fire missions. The remaining 110 rounds were expended on H&T, SID targets, special fires, and rocket suppressive targets. One active mortar was silenced on 15 September.

Batteries firing in support of the battalion were: A 1/12, B 1/12, and the Army's C battery, 6/33. Liaison was also effected with the ARVN artillery battery at FSB Angel, southwest of Quang Tri, but occasion for their employment in behalf of

the battalion did not arise.

Catholic services were conducted in the field by the Battalion Chaplain. Prostestant services were held in the field by visiting Chaplains when available. Catholic and Prostestant services were held in the rear for all personnel.

EQUIPMENT

The overall supply situation remained satisfactory during this recording period, with resupplies being provided to the com-

panies in the field via Cam Lo.


Items of significant importance received during this reporting period were three MISIAI vehicles which satisfied a T/E deficency within the unit. Crew-served weapons and individual equipment availability was satisfactory.

An item that is once again in short supply is small size trousers, with limited quantities available thru FISG-B.

A total of seven hours of technical training was conducted during the month.

TRAINING

The companies were able to conduct intensive training pro-





grams while providing security for fixed positions. Emphasis was placed on vactics, communications, M-60 machine gun, weapons safety, immediate action drills, ambushes and patrolling, and the use of claymores and trip Plares.

New troops continue to take part in the Command Orientation Training Program, The battalion also filled the following school quotas:

10. SERVICES

The only messhall maintained and operated throughout the month was the regimental messhall at Dong Ha. A temporary facility was maintained for the OP and supporting companies at Cam Lo until 21 September.

Showers were provided for the troops in the rear and the

troops at Cam Lo.

All third echelon maintenance was performed by FLSG-B.
Minimal problems were encountered and services were rendered satisfactorily.

II. COMMUNICATIONS S

The communications platoon of the battalion continued to support the battalion throughout their movements and operations. The battalion CP remained open at Cam Lo and communications were maintained at Vandergrift Combat Base. Relay sites and stations were maintained to preserve communications consistent with the tactical situation. On 21 September, the battalion was moved from the field to Quang Tri Combat Base. The battalion rear established communications with Quang Tri, and the station at Vandergrift Combat Base was closed.

Thre chout the month of September, the technicians repaired and maintained 23 RT-505's, one RT-524, 1144 AN/PRT-4's, 143 AN/PRR-9's, one AM-2060, one C2329A, one PP-388, one AN/PSR-1, one MX-2799, one CP-95A, and seven TA-1/PT's. One technican remained with the battalion CP to repair all faulty AN/PRC-25 radios that came from the field until stand down on 21 September.

12. MEDICAL L

Medical care was provided by the hospital corpsman assigned to the line companies. They were equipped to hold routine sick call and provide emergency treatment for casualties.

More extensive care was provided by the battalion aid station

wounded by a mortar round.


