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NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. GENERAL

- a. At the beginning of the period 3d Bn. 3d Marines was in position within the assigned TAOR conducting patrols, ambushes, village searches, and generally improving positions. The Battalion CP location is at (BT 566044). Extensive patrolling was conducted forward of, the MLR with results varying from no contact to engagement with known Viet Cong. A company size patrol was conducted everyday during daylight hours and a minimum of two (2) squad sized patrols in addition to numerous layouts and ambushes were conducted every might. Three combat outposts were manned forward of the MLR and a traffic control point vicinity (BT 540027).
- b. The battalion continued saturation patrolling of the assigned TAOR and conducted a civil affairs program within the local hamlets and villages. The period was characterized by small probes by a few individuals at night with intermittent small arms fire to large scale armed engagements during daytime operations. The searches have resulted in the apprehension of several civilians and Viet Cong within the TAOR who were delivered to the collection point for processing.
- c. On 5 July 1965, the mattalion (-) executed 3d Bn 3d Marines Operation Order 4-65 which was a searchand destroy operation on the east bank of the SONG TRA BONG north of grid line BT 00. On 8 July 1965, 3d Bn. 3d Marines carried out 3d Bn. 3d Marines Operation Order 5-65 as effected by Frag Order 32 ammending Op Plan 5-65 which was a search and destroy operation of the entire TRUNG PHAN Peninsula. On 9 July, the battalion realigned the MLR as directed by 3d Bn. 3d Marines Frag Order #33. The realignment placed three (3) companies on line occupying platoon strong point positions and the establishment of combat outposts 1000-1500 meters in front of the MLR and a road block along Highway #1. Agressive patrolling throughout the assigned TAOR continued and Company "M" remained in Regimental Reserve. The realignment of the MLR was continually hindered by the lack of fortification gear. On 10 July 3d Bn. 3d Marines Frag Order #34 was put into execution which entailed intensive saturation patrolling of the eastern sector of the assigned TAOR by sending one (1) company on deep twenty-four (24) hour patrols daily, and conducting medium and short range patrols of squad and platoon size. The battalion conducted a search and destroy operation on 16 July in execution of 3d Bn. 3d Marines Operation Order 6-65 which was a search and destroy operation of the hamlets near the mouth of the SONG TRA BONG. On 17 July 3d Bn. 3d Marines Operation Order 7-65 was effected which is a Battalion contingency plan assigning one (1) or more companies to conduct a night search and destroy operation at various locations within the battalion sector at times to be designated. On 26 July, 3d Bn. 3d Marines Operation Order 8-65 which was a Battalion (-) search and destroy operation in the sub hamlets on the western bank of the SONG TRA BONG was carried out by the battalion.
- d. The battalion when not on an operation maintained the defensive posture as indicated in 3d Bn. 3d Marines Frag Order #33 throughout the remainder of


2. MISSIONS ASSIGNED

- a. RLT-4 Frag Order #9-65 was received by 3d Bn. 3d Marines on 5 July 1965. The mission assigned was:
- (1) Be prepared to move south from the Regimental TAOR on two axis (BS 5896) paralleling national route #1 and the railroad. After crossing the SONG TRA BONG River (BS 5992) the battalion deploys into an extended order formation.
- (2) Be prepared to attack to the south and south west to be designated and seize the high ground vicinity (BS 5177) and (BS 5278).
 - (3) Be prepared to continue the Attack to the west or south on order.
- (4) Be prepared to provide one Battalion (.) for helilift to the QUANG NGAT Airfield (FS 605721) for defense of the facility.
- b: 1th Marines Frag Order #10-65 was received by 3d Bn. 3d Marines on 25 July 1965. The mission assigned was:
- (1) Occupy and defend along the trace of the MLR in the left sector of the Regimental TAOR.
 - (2) Maintain OPLR within sector.
- (3) Maintain traffic control point to check and control movement of civilians and vehicles through sector.
- (4) Provide liaison personnel to effect positive coordination with 2d ARVN Division, QUANG NGAL.
 - (5) Provide one Rifle Company as Regimental Reserve.
- (6) Conduct and maintain surveillance of seaward approaches within sector to repel overt landings and prohibit infiltration.
- (7) Be prepared to provide Battalion (.), on order for employment as a reaction force to be helilifted or road transported anywhere in the Division Zone.

3. OPERATION PARTICIPATION

- a. During the greater part of the period 3d Bn. 3d Marines conducted company operations within the assigned TAOR and small unit operations along the the MLR.
- (1) On 5 July 1965, 3/3 participated in search and destroy operations in the area enclosed by (BT 619023) to (BT 635024) to (BS 639997) to (BT 625997)





to (BT 614008), the mission to destroy all Viet Cong facilities within the area and kill or capture all Viet Cong found. The operation resulted in one (1) VC dead, thirteen (13) VCS captured, and numerous caves destroyed.

(2) On 8 July 1965, 3/3 conducted a search and destroy operation of the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula to kill or destroy all Viet Cong and his logistical facilities. The operation netted eleven (11) VC killed, 47 VCS and numerous caves and tunnels destroyed.

4. TERRAIN AND WEATHER

a. Weather. Precipitation during the month of July fell mostly in the form of late afternoon showers which occured more frequently during the latter part of July with a total of fourteen (14) days receiving precipitation. Temperatures ranged from 77 degrees in the early morning to 101 degrees in the afternoon with an average temperature of 85 degrees and an average humidity of 84%. Predominate surface winds were from the East at 7-8 knots. Cloud cover during daylight hours has been minimal permitting almost continuous air operations, late cloud cover has been more prevalent after dark which aided in nighttime patrolling. Light rain with thundershowers in expected to continue through October at which time we anticipate the monsoon season. The most reliable estimates indicate the average annual rainfall for this area is about 70 inches.

3. MORALE AND DISCIPLINE

a. Food Service. All companies are maintaining individual messes capable of serving "A" or "B" rations as provided by the battalion mess. Breakfast and supper have been either "A" or "B" ration during t is reporting period for all units of the battalion. Morale in this area: Excellent.

b. Liberty/ R&R Irogram.

- (1) There is no liberty in the CHU LAI Area due to location and operational requirements.
- (2) There has been a marked increase in quatos for the R and R program within this unit. The program allows four (4) days and three (3) nights in either HONG KONG or BANKOK. Morale in this area: Good.
- c. Mail Service. Mail service has been on a daily basis to the batatalion. but remains out of sequence. Morale in this area: Excellent.
- d. Pay. The men are paid regularly, but are drawing only enough to purchase PX supplies and beer. In most instances, the men are leaving their pay on the books, or sending it home for deposit in savings accounts. Morale in this area: Excellent.
- e. <u>PX Supplies</u>. All units of the battalion are serviced each Monday by a PX truck. Items of necessity are noticeably lacking at each service period. Morale in this area: Poor.

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for Protestants and Catholics in the area of the battalion CP. Attendance is good when operational requirements permit. Morale in this area: Good.

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- g. Special Services. Special Services equipment has been slow in coming and limited in quantity. A movie is shown each evening in the battalion CP area. The units on the MLR however, receive very little in the way of Special Services benefits due to apparent non-availablity and operational commitments. Requisitions for Special Services equipment have been submitted regularly. Morale in this area: Poor.
- h. <u>Discipline</u>. Disciplinary action this month, as compaired to list month, was dramatically reduced. Adjustment to Vietnam and the combat conditions here seems now to be complete, and despite the often strenuous duties of the Marines of the line, there seems to have been no perceptible breakdown of discipline. On the contrary, discipline, with several isolated exceptions, appears excellent.



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1 July 1965. The Commanding General, EMTPAC visited the CP during the afternoon bounds. Commandes conducted aggressive patrolling throughout the assigned

2 hely 1005. All companies continued to improve their respective defensive postures. During hours of dankness reports of movement to our front were received when Companies "N" and "N". At 2150H a patrol from Company "L" fired on 2 VUS with negation mosults.

3 July 19(3). Sense has conducted aggressive patrolling throughout the assigned a TAON, Company We conducted platoon tactics training to the rear of their position, and was imperied by the Battalion Commander. A light section of Office and a detachment of H&S Company made a route reconnaisance and lagison visit to BLMN 1867 of a grantin were completed for the use of P. F. platoons for the 5 July open thou. Construction on the MLR continued.

4 July 1965. The Battalian Commander conducted an inspection of "L" and "M" Co's, the Latter being in Regularian Reserve, by the SATS Strip. A COMMEX and a loading rehearsal for operations planned for 5 July were conducted.

5 July 1965. At 0530H execution of 3/3 Operation Plan 4-65 commenced.
Earlier at 0410H 07 / reported two (2) explosions on their position and small arms fire was received from vicinity (BS 555987). One (1) Marine was wounded and evaluated by helicopter. Subsequently, a 60mm Mortar Fin Assembly was found. At 0715H Company "I" was helicopter lifted to LZ ROUGE and at 0715H Company "E" livided over beach RED. Search and destroy operations in the ZULU Area commenced. One (1) reinforced platoon from Company "L" was placed in a blocking position on the West bank of the SONG TRA BONG at (BT 614008). Also Company "E" provided one (1) platoon to man the vacated positions of Company "K" on the MaR. A detachment of Company "A", 1st AmTrac En accompanied this operation to recover an LVTP-5 that had been burned and abandoned on 29 June in a provious operation. A light section of tanks, plus a flame tank participated in the operation and were transported to and from the objective area by an LCM-8 provided by Naval Beach Group #1. The operation was concluded at 1830H with eleven (11) Marine WIA and one (1) confirmed VC dead and thirteen (15) VCS captured.

6 July 1965. All companies conducted close-in Patrols and maintained security on positions. The Battalion Commander inspected Companies "K" and "L" and reconnoiteered the mean of the proposed new MLR. Two Onto's of the 3d Plat Co "B" 3d AT En conducted a road reconnaissance to NAM BINH (2).

7 July 1965. During this period all companies conducted aggressive patrolling and condinued to maintain security on positions. At 0845H six (6) fishing boats with approximately sixty (60) to seventy (70) Vietnamese landed vicinity (BT 576034). A platoen from Company "K" was dispatched to apprehend the landing party. All were taken to the collection point by LVT. The Battalion Commander visited wounded numbers of this Command who are convalencing at Company "B", 3d Medical Battalion.





8 July 1965. Companies "K" and "L" conducted squad size patrols and all units unintained security an positions. At 0400H Company "H" 2/4 occupied the vacated positions of Company "K" and "L" on the MLR. At 0530H all Companies assembled and wors formed into helicopter teams. At 0620H the 1st elements of the battalion were lifted into the objective area. The battalion (4) conducted a search and destroy operation in the ZULU Area. All elements. of the battalion with the exception of Recon were lifted in to the objective area by helicoptem. At the conclusion of the mission two (2) campandes were withdrawn by helicoptem and two (2) by INTs. The operation concluded at 2030H with one (1) Maxime KIA and nine (9) WIA. Eleven (11) confirmed VC dead and forty seven (7) supports captured.

9 July 1965. At 0000M Compenses "I", "K", and "L" commenced realignment of the 1876. In plateon have Company "I" departed at 1120H with a mission to search in the victorial of coordinates (ES 610991) for two (2) missing Marines reported to have to be said and buried at that point. Company "M" remained in Engineerial Reserva.

10 July 1965. During the voporting period Companies "I" "K" and "L" were managed to tight security on their new MER positions. The night was quiet except for a report from Company "I" at 0550H that they had received eight (5) rounds of \$4 fire. Company "K" boarded LVT's at 0740H and departed on a search and destroy operation in the 2000 Area. The Pattalian Commander conducted an imagestion of Company "I" (OP #1) and of Company "M" currently in hagmantal Reserve.

11 July 1955. Companies "I" and "L" maintained security on the MIR and conducted a secret as all level percols and layout ambushes. Company "K" conducted a search and destroy apprention in the ZULU area. At 0830H, Company "I" was withdrawn from regimental reserve and lifted by helicopter to the ZULU area to relieve Company "Y" and continue the search and destroy operation. Company "K" reversed to regimental reserve on return to the sinfield area.

12 July 1965. During the norming hours the Battalion Commander conducted an inspection of all units on the MIR. Company "M" conducted a search and destroy operation in the FULU area. At 0900H, Company "L" was withdrawn from its position on the MER and moved by ETT to the ZULU area to relieve Company "M" and continue operations... Company "M" relieved Company "K" as regimental reserve who in turn remanded to previous positions on the MER.

13. July 1965. We scout section from HAS Company conducted a long range patrol to (LT 6.01 and BT 5800) during the early morning hours, with the mission of providing surveillance to the facent of Company "L" positions and prevent sammeptions substitute to the facent of the MIH. At 0830H Company "I" was wendred from the continuous the MIH and moved by LWI's to the TULU area to remain from the sall continuous the search and destroy operation. Company "K" seconded the visited positions of Companies "I" and "L" or the MIH until the release of Grapher "L" at 1005H,

14 July 1967. Companies "K" and "L" maintained security on the Hins in deep local saudi size parms, was understed by Company "L" and Legout ambushes were staged by joyth under. At 0750H Johnany "K" was withdrawn from its position



on the MLR and lifted by helicopter to the ZULa Area to relieve Company "I" and continue operations. Company "L" occupied the vacated positions of Companies "I" and "K" on the MLR until the return of Company "I".

15 July 1965. Companies "I" and "L" maintained security on the MLR. At 0800H. Company "M" w 3 withdrawn from its position adjoining the SATS Strip (Regimental Exercive) and lifted by helicopter to the TRUMG FILM Perinsula to relieve Company "K" and continue the search and destroy operation. Company "K" occupied the vecated positions of Company "M" and is now in Regimental Reserve.

16 July 1965. At 0300H Company "L" assumed defensive responsibility of the MMR as Company "I" withdrew from position to move to assigned assembly area near the mouth of the SONG TRA BONG. At 0505H LVT's rendesvoused with Company "No and moved them from T. C.C. PHAN Peninsula to assigned blocking positions and Company "I" commenced search and destroy operation in the hamlets of HAI NIER (1) and VINCE (1) and (2). The operation concluded at 1030H.

17 July 1965. Company "I" conducted an unprecedented river crossing operation onto the Eastern bank of the SONG TRA BONG River. The landing was covered by elements of the 3d Tank Bn in direct support on the West bank. At O810H a booky trap exploded causing one (1) KIA and five (5) WIA's. Attention is being fecused during operations, to detect and destroy the Viet Cong logistical support within the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula. Company "I" conducted extensive saturation patrolling while "K" and "L" Companies assumed the defensive responsibility of the MIR. Company "M" continues in Regimental Reserve.

18 July 1965. At 0145H with the left portion of the MLR being manned by elements of Company "L" movement was detected to their front at (BT 553408) Upon illuminating the area, one (1) M-79 round was fired in the direction of a fleeing figure with negative results. Later at 0210H 0P #1 (BT 560996) noted movement around their tactical wire. The area was illuminated and the VCS flee with machinegum fire in hot persuit. Company "I" conducted a search and destroy operation in the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula. Company "K" made an amphibious landing to relieve Company "I" and assume its mission. By continuing to rotate fresh Marine Companies into the area, it is hoped that the Vict Cong will soon tire of running and hiding and will either stand and fight or depart the area. Companies "I" and "L" now occupy the MLR and Company "M" continues to remain in Regimental Reserve.

19 July 1965. Company "K" concluded a vigorous search and destroy operation in the TRUNG Phin Peninsula and was relieved by Company "M" 0845H. Companies "I" and "L" assumed responsibility of the MLR and Company "K" reverted to Regiment 7. Reserve. Company "M" suffered one (1) KIA and one (1) WIA during operations in the afternoon of the 19th.

20 July 1965. Company 'M' conflucted search and destroy operations on the THUNG PMAN Forthsolo. Moreover Company "L" joined Company "M" to make a thorough search of the village complet along the Eastern bank of the SONG TRA BOWG. The search was supported by LVT's, Tanks, and Onto's. Company "I" assumed defensive responsibility of the MLR and Company "K" remained in Regimental Reserve until relieved by Company "M" at 1200H. A convoy escorted by ten (10) Onto's went south to the town of BINH SON to make listen with District authorities and discuss Civil Affairs matters.

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21 July 1965. Company "L" conducted search and destroy operations on the Third Peninsula. This daily maneuver is designed to saturate the public like with friendly movement which will either drive the every from the area or cause him to tire and stop at which time he will be destroyed. Company "L" was relieved by Company "I" and assumed the defensive responsibility in conjunction with Company "K" along the MLR. Company "M" remains in Regimental Reserve. Company "H" suffered one (1) WIA during the afternoons sweep activities.

22 July 1965. Company "I" conducted search and destroy operations on the TEUNG PHAN Peninsula. Company "K" joined Company "I" in a rapid reaction to intelligence concerning the whereabouts of a sizeable force of Viet Cong. The search proved negative but numerous caves and tunnels were uncovered and destroyed. Company "L" assumed responsibility of the entire MIR until the return of Company "I". Company "M" remained in Regimental Reserve.

23 Fully 1965. Company "K" continued search and destroy operations on the THAN Peninsula and was relieved by Company "M". Company "K" then reverted to Regimental Reserve. Company "L" and Company "I" presently occupied the entire MUR. A series of local patrols and layout ambushes were conducted.


24 July 1965. Company "M" continued search and destroy operations on the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula and was relieved by Company "L". Company "M" reverted to Regimental Reserve relieving Company "K" who along with Company "I" maintains security on the Battalion MLR. A Command Post alert drill was run to rehearse movement of CP personnel into their assigned defensive positions. Deep local patrols and layout ambushes were staged by both Companies "I" and "K".

25 July 1965. Company "L" continued search and destroy operations on the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula and was relieved by Company "I". The Civil Affairs Officer made liaison in BINH SON with public officials to discuss methods for the handling of civil affairs problems and having leaflets printed to encourage the populace in and near the TAOR to stay indoors as much as possible after 2000 hours to avoid contact with Marines operating in the area. The Command post again conducted a successful alert drill to test the reaction of CP personnels novement into defensive positions. Local patrolling and legout ambushes were staged by both Companies "K" and "L".

26 July 1965. Company "I" conducted search and destroy operations on the THUNG PRIN Peninsula. Company "I" was joined by Company "L" and swept the village complex clong the West bank of the SONG TRA BONG. Civil action teams. Were dispatched into the villages in the wake of the company sweeps. During this period Company "K" manned the MLR. During hours of darkness layout ambulhes were staged by Companies "I" "K" "L" to the front of the MLR.

27 July 1965. Companies "I" "K" and "L" conducted seven (7) night patrols/
ambushes to the front of the MEC, in an effort to meet the enemy in an armed
engagement. Company "M" conducted search and destroy operations on the TRUNG
PHAN Peninsula. Companies "L" and "L" are in position on the MER and Company
"K" reverted to Regimental Reserve. A squad (+) from MAE Company accompanied
by a tank, boarded an ACM to conduct a search of boats in the TRUNG PHAN Area
and provide fire support to Company "M" if required. The Battalion Civil

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Affairs Team continued the People to People Program by holding sick call for the village complex at the mouth of the SONG TRA BONG.

28 July 1965. Companies "I" and "L" conducted eleven (11) night pairols/
ambushes in front of the MIR in an effort to neet the enemy in an armed
engagement. Company "M" conducted search and destroy operations until they
were retracted by LVT from the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula and returned to Regimental
Reserve. Company "K" moved from Regimental Reserve to join Company "I" in
assuming the defensive responsibility of the MIR. Company "L" occupied defensive positions along the MLR of the 2nd Bn, 4th Marines. As LVT's were
proceeding to retract Company "M", one (1) Antrac struck a land mine which
resulted in the total destruction of the LVT and the wounding of five (5) Marines.

29 July 1965. Companies "I" and "K" conducted eight (8) night patrols/ambushes in a series of added neasures to insure a tight defense along the MLR. After receiving vital intelligence from local villagers concerning the whereabouts of a VC Platoon Commander and a possible cache of weapons, Company "K" moved to the reported area and conducted a thorough search and destroy operation. The operation netted a large group of young men (175) three of whom were carrying large sums of money. Sixteen (16) were forwarded to Bn S-2 for further processing while most of the money was returned to the people. Company "L" occupied the MLR of 2/4 until the late afternoon of the 29th. Company "M" remains in Regimental Reserve. Five (5) LVT's with S-2 Scouts were positioned in the SONG TRA BONG River searching boats for weapons and anything shedding light on Viet Cong activity.

30 July 1965. Companies maintained a tight MLR defense and conducted nine (9) patrols and ambushes along the MLR. Company "K" moved to the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula and conducted search and destroy operations. Companies "I" and "L" now occupy defensive positions along the MLR while Company "M" remains in Regimental Reserve. At 1855H Company "K" (-) retracted from the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula. A platoon (+) sized ambush patrol from Company "K" remained behind.

31 July 1965. Company "K" acting on current intelligence conducted an ambush near SON TRA (2) on the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula. Also the company was in a ready reaction standby after retracting from the peninsula on 30 July 1965, to come to the aid of the platoon left in the above mentioned ambush. Company "M" noved by LVT to the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula to conduct search and destroy operations and the platoon of Company "K" was retracted to the company area and reverted to Regimental Reserve and occupied a defense position around the airfield.

- 2. Two (2) companies of the Battalion conducted search and destroy operations in the place described above. One (1) reinforced platoon was placed in a blocking position on the West bank of the SONG TRA BONG River at (BT 614008). One (1) Company was lifted by helicopter and the other by LVTP-5's.
- a. 32 Platoon, Company "L". This platoon reinforced with the 3d Plat, Co "A", 3d ATBn and an artillery FO Team occupied blocking positions at (BT 614008). While moving into position a M-26 Hand Grenade set with a trip wire was detonated. Eleven (11) Marines were wounded by the fragments. lstLt J.J. JAROS, the Platoon Commander, and three (3) other Marines were evacuated immediately to the Battalion and Station and to Company "B", 3d Medical Battalion. lstLt J.T. BROSNAN JR., the Artillery Forward Observer, although wounded slightly, remained with the platoon throughout the operation along with six (6) other slightly wounded Marines. Upon detonation of the grenade, sniper fire was received from the East bank of the river. The fire ceased as Marines occupied their positions and commenced to return fire. The blocking position was maintained throughout the operation. No further enemy contact was made until about 1715 when a sniper began firing. The sniper was fired at and attempted to escape in a boat. He was shot while in the boat. His body with weapon sank immediately. The blocking force returned to the Battalion area without further incident where all remaining wounded were treated at the Battalion Aid Station. lstLt BROSNAW was sent to Company "B", 3d Medical Bn for x-rays and was returned to duty.
- b. Company "I" (Rein). Company "I" was reinforced with 2 squads of flame throwers and with a detachment of the 3d Plat, Co "A", 3d EngrBn. At 0715, the company boarded helicopters at Landing Zone BOBCAT ALFA and landed in the objective area at (BT 640005) at 0735. The lift was completed in two (2) waves of 12 helicopters each at 0750.

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The 1st Platoon, Company "I"occupied positions at BT 539998 to cover the landing zone and the initial deployment of the rest of the company. The search operation commenced at CCIM and continued until 1230H when the company was ordered to hold in positions occupied at that time. Seven (7) male VCS were captured during this search and were forwarded to the Battalian Collection Point. All males seemed to have left the hamlets as only women, children and old men were found. On order the search was continued and was completed at 1440H with three (3) more VCS being forwarded to the Collection Point. Mopping up operations were commenced against tunnels and cares. During this operation the Engineers used 528 pounds of C-4 and desurged eight (8) large bunker type tunnel shelters with multiple entrances and about eight (3) small one (1) man shelters. At 1535H the company moved to the beach for recovery by helicopter. The helicopter reachesy commenced at about 1615H and was completed at about 1645H.

- c. Company "M", The Company boarded LVTP5's at 0620H at the Battalion area and proceeded to the objective area landing without incident at 0710H. The 1st Flatcon moved by LVTP5 to positions from (BT 621022) to (BT 623016). The 3d Platoon moved into positions from (BT 623016) to (BT 629011). The 2nd Platoon detached one (1) squad for security of the Mobile BAS and Collection Point and moved to positions vicinity (BT 624016). On order the 1st and 3d Platoons moved to positions at (BT 621018) to (BT 623009). During this movement forward the 3d Platoon came under small arms fire from a village located (BT 626013). Fire was returned and the Platoon moved through the village capturing three (3) Viet Cong suspects but no weapons were found. Six (5) spider traps were found in this village and were blown by the Engineer detachment. The company occupied its assigned position without further incident and prepared to cover the search operation of Company "I". A mop up operation of tunnels and caves was conducted which expended 420 pounds of Cato One (1) large tunnel about 50 yards long was destroyed and about 12 smaller holes and shelters were destroyed. Company "K" covered the helicopter recovery of Company "I" and at 1632H began withdrawing to the beach for recovery by LVT. The recovery was made without incident and ± 1330 M ± 1 elements of 3/3 were back in the Battalion area.
- d. A detachment of Company "A", lst AmTracEn accompanied this operation to recover an EVTE-5 that had been burned and chandoned on a previous operation. The Tot was successful in their recovery operation, the burned LVTP-5 was found floatable and was towed back to the Company "A", lst AmTrac area.
- e. A light section of tanks with a flame tank participated in the operation and were transported to and from the objective area by an LCM-8 provided by Mavel. Beach Group $\#1_o$

Casualties: Friendly: One (1) KIA and nine (9) WIA; Enemy: Eleven (11) confirmed dead and 47 suspects captured.

Nature of Action: Search and destroy.

- 2. The Battalion (Rein) conducted a search and destroy operation in the Zulu Area which is enclosed by the above mentioned coordinates. All elements of the Battalion except Recon were lifted in by helicopter. Two companies were withdrawn by helicopter and two companies were withdrawn by LVT. See overlay.
- a. General. At approximately 080100H elements of the 3d Platoon, Company B, 3d Reconnaissance Battalion embarked aboard LCM and were taken to a point (BT 690055) where LCR's were launched and reconnaissance Marines infiltrated to the top of hill vicinity (BT 664048). An OP was established at approximately 080830H. Surveillance of the objective area was initiated and maintained until subsequent link-up with infantry elements of 3/3. At approximately 0530H eight (8) LVT's departed the battalion area to conduct a feint off Beach RED. At 0555HArtillery commenced preparation of the landing zone (BT 640017) supporting the diversion. Helicopter loading commenced at 0610Hand the first wave touched down at Landing Zone BLUE (BS 681975) at 080635H. The initial landing was followed immediately with landings in LZ's WHITE (BS 670979) and RED (BS 647973). The Mattalian moved out toward Phase Line DIAMOND (1500 meters to the north). During this movement artillery, naval gunfire, close air support, and 81mm mortars were used with good effect on Viet Cong that fired on the advance elements. The Battalion crossed Phase Line DIAMOND and progressed toward Phase Line RUBY. This Phase Line was quickly crossed and the Battalion started toward Phase Line SAPPHIRE. The combination of heat, terrain, and humidity began to take its toll as Phase Line SAPPHIRE was approached. Small arms fire on the extreme left flank slowed Co. "M", however, the right flank was able to continue moving rapidly from Phase Line SAPPHIRE to Phase Line EMERALD. The center of the battalion pushed on across Phase Line SAPPHIRE, blowing caves and bunkers along the way. The left flank progressed slowly as the firing became more intense and finally Phase Line EMERALD was reached by all elements of the Battalion. As the Battalion approached the beach, Co. "L" and Co "K" established a defensive position around Landing Zone BLACK (BT 640026). Co "M" on the left flank fought its way to the beach to join the perimeter. Co "I" on the right flank linked up with Recon and moved toward Landing Zone ORANGE. Some apposition was encountered as the company closed the LZ. The helilift

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lift of Co "L" from Landing Zone BLACK commenced with two companies protecting the LZ. As soon as the lift of Co "L" was completed, Co "I" was lifted from Landing Zone ORANGE. The remainder of the battalion consisting of Companies "M", "K", and the Battalion CP group in that order departed the beach in LVT's following the last flight of helicopters clearing LZ ORANGE. The pattalion was back in the area at 082030H.

b. Company "I" (Rein). At 080620H July 1965, Company "I" boarded helicopters in 3/3 area and proceeded to LZ BLUE (BS 681975). Lift was completed at 080635H with landing of second wave of twelve helicopters. High ground at (BS 683972) and (BS 688982) was secured immediately. Movement to Phase Line RUBY was made without incident and the company halted awaiting permission to cross. While at PL RUBY Naval Gunfire was called in on high ground (BT 672011) to reduce touch link tharbed wire, caves and tunnels that had been spotted by reconnectering S-2 scouts. The gun-target line was not at a favorable angle however and adjusting proved unsuccessful. Artillery fired two rounds which were on target and the company proceeded across PL RUBY and on to PL SAPPHIRIE without contact. Progress was then made across PL EMERALD to vicinity of (BT 663036, BT 667037) where, at approximately 081450H, contact was made with Reconnaissance Platoon by radio. Reconnaissance reported VCS on rocks at (BT 670040). Eventually five Vietnamese males carrying three U.S. fragmentation hand grenades were flushed out from this area and taken prisoner. The 3rd Platoon was then drawing sniper fire from a fishing boat in vicinity (BT 674043). Marines returned fire with negative results. The incident was reported to the USS Galveston who dispatched a boat to intercept the VC craft. The Company continued toward LZ ORGANGE and while conducting a village search vicinity (BT 649044), the 2nd Platoon came under small arms fire from the village. A Vietnamese male with rifle ran from the village toward the shore of VUNG DUNG QUAT, climbed into & basket boat and commenced paddling frantically to the West. He was shot and killed by a Marine. No attempt was made to recover the body or the weapon. Two more male prisoners were taken from the house from which the rifleman . escaped. As the search continued, three Marines were wounded by a grenade It could not be determined where the grenade had come from. A home made hand grenade booby-trap was found at (BT 649046) anchored to the ground and rigged with a 120 foot fishing line trip wire. A VC was seen running from the area and, when efforts to capture him were unsuccessful he was shot and killed. The area was cleared at 081840H. The company then moved to LZ ORANGE for heli-lift back to the battalion area. The lift began at 081915H and was completed at 081930H when the last elements touched down in 3/3 area.

b. Company "K" (Reinforced). Company "K" landed in LZ RED at 08075H and commenced movement to PL DIAMOND. Upon arrival there the company mayed on toward PL RUBY with two platoons on line sweeping villages in assigned zone. PL RUBY and PL SAPPHIRE were crossed without incident and villages between PL SAPPHIRE, PL EMERALD and the beach were swept without significant activity. Three large caves (BT 644003) and numerous spider traps and smaller caves were destroyed. Upon arrival at the beach one platon moved over to (BT 624015) to cover Company "M"'s withdrawal. Upon completing this maneuver the company covered the retraction of Company "L" by helicopter from LZ BLACK. Then, loaded in LVTS, began its withdrawal from the beach and return to the battalion area. The move was completed at 082030H.

- c. Company "L" (Reinforced). Company "L" landed in LZ WHITE (BS 670979) at 080630H and commenced sweeping to the North in assigned some to PL DIAMOND. At the phase line fortifications were encountered, (BS 668992), consisting of fighting holes and bunkers. These were demolished by attached engineers. As the company crossed PL DIAMOND they uncountered punji pits and assorted trenches. At this point two VCS were picked rp and forwarded to the collection point. The company then moved to PL RUBY without incident. One VCS was captured vicinity (BS 660998). As the company moved to PL SAPPHIRE they spotted four VC with rifles vicinity (BT 668008) running eastward to the river. The Marines opened fire and one VC was blown into the air, while in the river, by an M-79 round. The body and weapon could not be recovered. The other three escaped. PL SAPPHIRE was crossed at 0813330H and the sweep pushed on to PL EMERALD. Numerous dry irrigation ditches with punjis in them were found. Fortifications around DONG LE (5) (BT 666010) and TUYET DIFM (4) (BT 653016) were fairly new. PL EMERALD was reached at 081515H. The company moved on toward the beach and received sniper fire from village (BT 658028). The village was rapidly overrun and three VC with M-26 hand grenades were captured. Company I, then moved to LZ BLACK and was lifted back to the battalion area by helicopter. The lift was completed at 081910H.
- d. Company "M" (Reinforced). Company "M" landed in LZ RED approximately 080700H and commenced sweep to westward. An enemy ambush vicinity (BS 624973) was sprung prematurely because of effective point security. A fire fight followed and several VC were seen to fall. Due to intensity of fire fight no time was taken to count casualties. Artillery and 81mm mortar fire was called in with excellent results. The company received seven rounds of incoming 60mm mortar fire from vicinity (BS 638964). Air strike was called in on the enemy mortar silencing it. When 81mm mortar fire lifted the village was assaulted and Marines counted five VC dead and recovered two rifles. (Rifles forwarded through intelligence channels.) Four VC were seen running south vicinity (BS 635967). Machine guns opened up and at the same time aircraft were making strafing runs. Two VC were seen to fall and lie motivaless. Shortly a bomb stuck the areandthe VC disappeared. The company then pushed on toward PL DIAMOND. As they went through THUONG HOA(1)(BS 628971) two men were seen climbing into a boat and attempting to cross the river. One man was carrying a rifle. USMC fire cut the boat and its occupants to ribbons. Dark stains appeared on the surface of the water. Four prisoners were taken in this same area. The village was heavily tunneled and had many spider traps and barricades. The company moved on to PL DIAMOND without further significant incident. PL DIAMOND was crossed at 081150H and the company reached PL RUBY at 081310H. Prisoners were evacuated and water was resupplied at PL RUBY. The company left the phase line at 081415H and proceeded to PL SAPPHIRE capturing 14 VCS on the way. As the company moved through TAN HY (1) (BT 623009) they encountered sporadic sniper fire but were reluctant to return fire due to the bevy of women, children and elderly people in the village. The village was honeycombed with tunnels and bunkers. The company destroyed several of these but did not have enough demolitions to blow them all. Sniper fire killed one Marine and wounded another in this area. The company moved across PL EMERALD and into the villages of SON TRA (2) (BT 622015) and SON TRA (1)

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
(BT 621020). Heavy sniper fire was received in these villages and they were found to be heavily tunneled. Company "M" moved on through and down to the beach. Withdrawal was completed at 082030H when Company "M" arrived by LVT in 3/3 area.

3. Remarks

- a. The helicopter request for this operation (m) for 36 aircraft. Battalion plans for the helilift were made accordingly. At 1600 on the day before the operation, the battalion was told at a Wing G-3 briefing that this number of helicopters would not be provided and that there would be 24 helicopters available for the lift. Subsequently, the battalion was informed that the number would be increased by six. Plans were modified during the night and had to be revised in the morning because, in fact, only 27 helicopters arrived. It is recommended that early notification of inability to provide requested aircraft be given to the requesting unit.
- b. Close air support aircraft were requested at 080931H to strike a suspected mortar position and caves from which the battalion was receiving machine gun fire. Although the planes did an excellent job upon arrival, the time delay was in excess of 40 minutes. It is considered to be an inadequate response to the needs of the ground unit.
- c. Colored smoke was required to mark each landing zone for casualty evacuation, heat evacuation, and water resupply. It is not only impractical to carry smoke grenades excusively for landing zones but it is a logistical impossibility. Pilots should carry 1:50,000 maps and be prepared to receive landing instructions from the ground.
- d. The battalion was visited in the field by the Regimental Commander Colonel Dupras at approximately 080945H and by the Assistant Division Commander, Brigadier General Kartch at 081400H.

- 2. Company "K" (Rein) conducted search and destroy operations and extensive patrolling in ZULU Area, Delta Section. (See Appended Overlays).
- a. General. At approximately 100830H July, Company "K" (Rein), landed by LVT at (BT 628022) and moved to a position along (BT 623019) (BT 624016) (BT 622012). From 100930H to 101230H a search and destroy operation was run (See Overlay 1) resulting in no enemy contact. Three (3) caves along with six (6) spider traps were destroyed. Next, a second movement was conducted from 101330H to 101515H during which, small arms fire was encountered at (BT 621011). Fire was returned on the enemy and one (1) man was observe being carried away. We were not able to physically determine the extent of wounds inflicted. Also, two (2) small cames and three (3) spader traps were destroyed. (See Overlay 2). A third search and destroy mission was conducted during the period 101530H to 101700H (See Overlay 3). This operation netted nothing. At 101705H, the company received small arms fire from (BT 622018) where eight (8) armed men were observed. Mortar fire was returned and two (2) men were seen to fall and were carried away. Three (3) VCS were observed entering a building at (BT 622018) and were fired on by mortars with negative results. The company moved into the new company patrol base at 102100H. From 102200H to 102400H a platoon size patrol was conducted (See Overlay #4) with negative results. Later, from 110200H to 110530H a platoon size ambush was set up without any enemy contact (See Overlay #5). Three (3) layouts were kept out all night that also observed nothing. Ammo Expended: 25 Frag Grenades, Six (6) WP Grenades, seven (7) M-79 rounds; one hundred twenty (120) 7.62mm rounds, eight (8) 81mm HE rounds.
- 3. Remarks. Communications were hampered by a lack of fresh batteries. two (2) of the four (4) batteries would not work. With the exception of the Battalian Commander, it is recommended that all other staff sections seek required information from the Battalian S-3. This would cut down on reports required by the company and conserve communications equipment.


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



- a. General. At approximately 110820H July 1965, Company "M" was helo-lifted to an LZ at (B8602973), and moved to (BT 635003) where extensive tunneling was found and destroyed. As the company moved southward, at 111100H, (BS 637995) sniper fire was received. Movement through the area netted nothing. Following the movement southward, Company "M" searched the villages TAN HY (2) (BS528992), THUONG HOA (6) (635989), nd THUONG HOA (4) (BS 633982). Turnels were blown in THUONG HOA (4) At 111250H one (1) platoon was set in a blocking position at (BS 623983) in support of Lima Companys sweep of My Hue (1) at (BS 613934). As the sweep progressed , local inhabitants were seen boarding boats to escape from the area. Warning shots were fired at these boats which in turn returned fire on Company "M". The boats beached on sandbars at (BS 619985), (BS 618975), and (BS615975). Fire was brought down on these boats and four (4) people were seen swimming towards My Hue (1). Lima Company was notified. They appeared to be captured. At 111500H, (Bs 624983) recivied 1 WIA. After the Lima Company sweep, the company moved northward, resweeping Thuong Hoa (4) and (5), and also Tan Hy (2) with negative results.

 At 122030H the company moved to (BS 640999) and conducted two patrols (Overlay #1) with negative results. Company "M" was relieved by Lima Company at 120945H at (BT 645030).
- 3. Remarks. Resupply, which is run by a pre set schedule does not always work. Resupply should be on call when possible. Communications is greatly reduced during inclement weather.

- 2. Company "L" acting on current intelligence conducted rapid reflex operations to recover the bodies of two (2) Marine MIA's and to locate and destroy enemy caches.
- a. General. At 111250H, two (2) platoons of Company "L" debarked from trucks at (BS 572873) and began moving towards MY HUE (2) (BS 607983). At 131315H one (1) platoon from Company "L" was helilifted to (ES 614988) to establish a blocking position. Shortly thereafter this force was reinforced with five (5) tanks and two (2) LVT's. Movement through MY HUE (2) (BS 607983) and to MY HUE (1) (BS 614984) was without incident. At MY HUE (2) the company halted to search and dig in the area where the two (2) Marine MIA's were reported buried. At 111445H the company began to receive small arms fire from a sand bar (BS 618981) and an undetermined position from across the SONG TRA BONG River. Fire was returned with negative results. At 111755H, the company moved to (BS 608985) to continue the search for the MIA's and supply caches. The search netted seven (7) VCS, but met with negative results in the effort to locate the two (2) Marine MIA's and supply caches.
- 3. Remarks. Troops grow anxious to fire after long periods of incoming fire without discernable targets. Control of fire becomes increasingly difficult during these periods.

- 2. General. Company "L" conducted saturation patrols in the TRUNG PHAN peninsula area with the intention of engaging the enemy, denying him freedom of movement and locating enemy supplies, equipment, and weapons.
- a. At 120900H Company "L" left the Battalion CP area (BT 567043) to relieve Company "M" on the beach (BT 645030). Company "L" landed at 120947H and moved to (BT 650019). There, observation revealed numerous persons, unidentified at (BT 650005) and (BT 658011). An accurate count of the people was impossible and no contact was initiated at this time. Next, the company swept onward to (BT 663029) which was a fording position across the SONG CAU River. Upon arrival, a check of the opposing terrain revealed approximately 15 armed persons in the vicinity of (BT 667036). Artillery and 81mm mortar fires were immediately directed into this area. After the fire mission ceased, one platoon was sent to sweep the terrain of the air strike. At (BT 674024) one VC dead was located. The rest of the company moved northward across the SONG CAU River only to locate another position of VC at (BT 669045). Air was requested at 121355H and arrived at 121510H. Next, the company patrolled through the bombed area with negative results. Lima then moved on and destroyed numerous caves at (BT 672032) and (BT 668037). When this was completed, the company at 131815H moved back across the ford (BT 663029) and on to sweep the village, TUYET DIEM (3) (BT 654040). This action met with negative results. The company then moved to the beach (BT 649029) and established a defensive position. Layouts were set 75 meters in front of the defensive perimeter. The company had no contact throughout the night. Lima Company was relieved by Company "I" at 130925H
- 3. Remarks. Air support must react more quickly when requested. The fleeting nature of targets require rapid reaction. Artillery was engaging a separate target at the time of the request for air. After the request was initiated, the support was expected at any time, hence maneuver and movement was held to a minimum. During this period the targets were able to escape.



- a. At 130830H, Company "I" departed their company position (BS 564444) to relieve Company "L" on the beach (BT 651033). Company "I" landed at 130920H and immediately moved into a company patrol base (BT 651022) from where platoon size patrols were initiated to sweep the area. A village search at (BT 654039) revealed nothing out of the ordinary, however, when moving back towards the company CP, a suspected ARVN deserter or VC was apprehended at (BT 650038). At 131700H fighting holes and tunnels were discovered near (BT 651010) and were subsequently destroyed. All other daylight efforts met with negative results. After dark, the company moved to a night patrol base (BT 659010) and were set in by 132100H. From there, three (3) more patrols were conducted during the night without incident. The next morning, at 140630H, Company "I" (-) moved to (BS 666999) to secure a landing sone for their relief by Company "K". The remaining portion of the company destroyed fighting holes and tunnels at (BT 659011) until 140810E. Company "I" was relieved by Company "K" at 140750H.

2. General. Company "K" conducted saturation patrols in the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula with the objective of engaging the enemy, opposing his freedom of movement, and locating enemy supplies, equipment, and weapons. (See Appendix Overlay).

a. At 140800H, Company "K" was helilifted from their company position (BT 574028) to relieve Company "I" on the beach at (BT 665002). From the beach, the company immediately moved to establish a company patrol base at (BS 675985) from which three (3) daylight patrols were conducted. The first patrol sweptthe hamlet of DONG LE (BS 661991) and found nothing. However, moving further on, the patrol found foreign made utilities (BS 674974), tunnels at (BS 673977) and old punit pits (BS 673977). Also, an extremely large cave (60) deep was discovered at (BS 678987) and destroyed. A second patrol from 141500H to 141800H found nothing except two (2) large punji pits located at (BS 694975). The punji pits were hardly detectable in that they were in the middle of the path, tunneled from the side of the road so that the topsoil was completely untouched. A third patrol from 141630H to 141930H found a cave that still hasn't been destroyed at (BT 673012). After darkness as the company displaced, small arms fire was received from the vicinity of (BS 667000) at 141959H. A search of the surrounding area disclosed nothing. The company patrol base for the night was set in at (BT 664002). Actions initiated from the patrol base netted nothing.

3. Remarks. It is recommended that daylight movement be conducted by platoon size units and night operations by squad size units. This will allow for maximum saturation, increased stealth and improved training for small unit leaders.



2. General. Company "M" conducted intensive patrols in the Eastern sector of the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula in an effort to capture or destroy the Viet Cong and his supplies and to deny the Viet Cong freedom of movement.

a. At 150800H, Company "M" was helilifted from a loading zone (BT 536057) to relieve Company "K" in the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula at (BT 665999). After the relief was effected, Company "M" moved Northward, crossed the SONG MUI River at (BT 669009) and began saturation patrolling of an assigned area. At 151117H, caves were discovered and blown in the vicinity of (BT 675010). Next, a thorough sweep was made of hamlets near (BT 673024) and (BT 663034). This action netted nothing. Moving further, boats were found along the beach at (BT 675032). A search of these also disclosed nothing. One interesting note, throughout the entire morning, the company was under constant observation, either by a person alone or two (2) men observing together. The individuals made their observations from a distance of 1000 meters. None of the observers appeared to have weapons. Further North, at (BT 668047) approximately 25 men were sighted as we moved to within 1200 meters, they manned basket boats and put to sea. It was also noted, that in the same area, natural caves were spotted along the Eastern shoreline of hill 141 (BT 667046). The company then proceeded to and conducted a sweep of TUYET DIEM (1) at (BT 657046) where numerous caves, tunnels and punji stakes were found and destroyed. Included in the search, were boats along the TUYET DIEM (1) shoreline. The results of these searches were negative. The company continued movement Southward, re-crossed the SONG MUI River at (BT 660037) and checked the villages of TUYET DIEM (2) at (BT 645026). A search of the villages produced nothing. The company set up a perimeter at (BT 644025) and remained in such until 152030H at which time the company moved into a night patrol base at (BT 637025). At 152200H, patrols were sent out until 152315H. The patrols made no contact. The next morning, Company "M" was retracted by LVT's at 160515H.


3. Remarks. During periods of extensive movement over rugged terrain, the men began to tire losing their alertness, thus becoming careless and have a tendency to bunch up. Aggressive small unit leadership becomes a critical factor at this time. Also, there is much time spent unnecessarily waiting for water resupply.

The LVT's proceeded on and retracted Company "M" at 160550H-the Commanding Officer's group, the tanks, the 81's, the tanks. the CI team departed the CP for the objective area arriving at 16060; just at that time Company 'M" moved into a blocking position from (BY 6110) (BT 601012), LVT's commenced patrolling the mouth of the SONG TRA BURN With fire teams embarked, tanks took up firing positions from (BT 617016) to (BT 613020), and Company "I" commenced sweeping to the Northeast. The route had been reconnoitered previously and the company was guided to an assembly area vicinity (BT 605007) arriving at 160520H. The company deployed along a line of departure from (BT 602008) East to (BT 615007). At 160600H the company moved out with three platoons on line and swept to the North until they reached the beach vicinity (BT 609020) at approximately 160850H. No information of intelligence value was obtained. The only items found were one MIAI grennde adapter found at (BF 615009) at approximately 160805H and one pouch containing miscellaneous first-aid gear found at (BT 610018) at approximately 160840H. The pouch was of Vietnamese issue and PF's have operated in the objective area recently. One large cave, which could accomodate 15-20 people, was found vicinity (BT 615008). It was searched with negative results and destroyed by engineers. At approximately 160925H the company reswept the area from East to West, swung around to the North and halted on the beach vicinity (BT 605019). The company covered Company 'M's withdrawl, boarded LVT's and returned to 3/3 area arriving at approximately 161045H.

c. Company "M". The company was retracted from the TRUNG PHAN penisula vicinity (BT 646030) by LVT at approximately 160530H and proceeded to beach vicinity (BT 605020), where they arrived at approximately 160550H to establish a blocking position from (BT 611018) to (BT 604016). One squad was put aboard three LVT's to patrol the mouth of the SONG TRA BONG from (BT 617017) to (BT 620018). 2. General. Company "I" conducted saturation patrols in the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula attempting to engage the enemy in armed conflict and to locate and destroy his logistical support.

a. At 170700H, Company "I" left the company defensive position (BT 548016) in eight (8) LVT's and executed a crossing of the SONG TRA BONG River at (BT 620017). From the landing area, the company moved to and secured objectives #1 (BT 623018) and #2 (BT 625016) at 170805H. At 170810H, on objective #1 (BT 623018) a Marine tripped a booby trap which resulted in one (1) Marine KIA and five (5) Marine WIA's. All were helo-evacuated by 170900H. A search of objective #1 (BT 623018) revealed numerous explosive devices. The company evacuated the area without clearing it due to the limited time necessary to perferm the assigned mission of search and destroy. The company moved on to Phase Line COMET (BT 632984). At this point, one (1) platoon returned to (BS 635990) to search the area for a reported arms cache. The search found nothing; however, it was observed that the area had been recently occupied. At 171100H, S-2 Scouts who had been covering the companies forward movement, turned in two (2) VCS found in hiding near the river bank et (BS 624988). The VCS were helilifted to Bettelion at 171230H. Moving onward, the company swept the area to the SONG THAI CAN (BS 628971) which netted no unusual activity. At 171445H, the S-2 Scouts saw 6-7 armed VC across the river at (BS 649971). During the ensuing firefight, the VC retreated to (BS 645968) where one (1) VC was observed to fall (presumed deed) and one (1) VC was observed to be wounded. The scouts returned to the company. The company followed the remainder of the prearranged patrol route with no unusual incidents. At 180845H, Company "I" was relieved by Company "K" on the beach at (BT 640026) and returned by LVT's to the Bettelion CP. (BS 564645). During the twenty-four (24) hour patrol period, the attached Engineers blew three (3) caves and four (4) tunnels.

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3. Remarks. Organized Viet Cong Units appear to have left the peninsula at this time. It is felt that the Marines have a definite upper hand; however, there is a void which the military cannot fill in pacifying the civil population. Civil action teams are needed now to help the people.



However, the villagers at (HT 654040) did appear to be very friendly. At 180915H, a 2nd platoon patrol was conducted and returned without making any contact. The company did find some ARVN uniforms at (HT 649014). At 181400H, a third patrol departed at 181400H and returned at 181800H. Nothing significant was noted on this patrol. The company moved to a night patrol base (HT 644028). From there three (3) patrols dispatched and returned with negative results.

3. Remarks. Preparation fires called in on suspected areas containing booby traps would seen to have some possibilities of clearing the area. It is also recommended that a first light operation be conducted to search all boats thoroughly and to question all occupants in the boats.



2. General. Company "M" landed in the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula to remove any existing Viet Cong threat against the local inhabitants and the Marines of the CHU LAI Area.

a. Compa ny "M" landed on the beach (BT 632023) at 190903H and effected a relief of Company "K" without incident. From the landing area, a platoon was rapidly moved to form a blocking position at (BS 627997) to (BT 635001). The remainder of the company began a drive Southward in hopes to push the enemy from the village complexes of SON TRA (1) (BT 622018), SON TRA (2) (BT 623015) and TAN HY (1) (BT 6200). One (1) Platoon swept into SON TRA (1) (BT 622018) while another platoon covered the movement on the high ground (BT 624018). In the search of the village, one (1) large cave was found that was blown while the covering force on the high ground (BT 624018) found One (1) Chinese grenade, and several punji stakes. The sweep then moved on into SONG TRA (2) (RT 623016) where the only significant action was the destruction of a few caves and tunnels. As one (1) of the pletoons prepared to move into TAN HY (1) (BT 620014) they began to receive heavy small arms fire in vicinity of (BT 619013). Another plateon was sent to help the engaged platoon but hit an ambush at (BT 624014). During the ensuing firefight, the Marines sustained one (1) WIA, while inflicting one (1) confirmed VC dead. At 181500H, the platoon initially sweeping Tan HY (1) (BT 620014) reported one (1) Marine KIA. As a result of sniper fire from vicinity (BT 620014). At 191500H Company "M" received work that Lina Company was going to join them and for the company to move to (BT 625016). Also at 191500H, the Battalion Commander joined Company "M". At 191708H, Company "M" and Company "L" linked together to continue searching for the Viet Cong. At 191800H, four (4) armed "Khaki Clads" (VC) were sighted running East (BT 631008).

We took them under fire but observed no results. A search of the area revealed blood spots. pieces of clothing, and one (1) bloody shoe. At 191935H the company covered the withdrawal of Company "L" and the CP Group which was completed by 192030H. As the company was formed into a night perimeter (BT 621010), the blocking position platoon joined the Company and told of receiving sniper fire during the day from (BT 630002) and (BT 634004). Also it was learned that at 191330H, the resupply helicopter received sniper fire from three (3) to five (5) persons at (BT 630002). The helicopter returned fire and when the ground troops checked the area (BT 630002), large traces of blood, bloody sandles, a bloody straw hat with a hole in it, and a U.S. "Ace" bandage that was soaked in blood were found. At 192054H two (2) VC were captured attempting to infiltrate the night positions of a Company "M" platoon at (BS 628995). The rest of the night was uneventful. At 200630H the company was directed to move to (BT 623013) a nd act as a blocking force for the landing of Company "L". At 201020H, Company "M" and Company "L" finished the sweep of TAN HY (1) (BT 620014) without results. Company "L" remained on the peninsula while Company "M" was retracted at 201055H from (BT 619013) to their compa ny defensive position.

3. Remarks. The Marine Corps needs a good inter company family of radios. The PRC-6 doesn't neet the requirements.

2. General. Company "L" landed in the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula to conduct mearch and destroy operations against the Viet Cong.

a. Company "L" landed in relief of Company "M" at 200815H coordinates (BT 619013) and began a methodical search in the village of TAN HY (1) (BT 625005). The movement continued to a line (2 626000) and (BT 626014) which was reached at 201130H. From this line the company reversed its movement and began searching back towards the SONG TRA BONG (BT 619013) which was completed at 201430H. The search netted a few unreadable papers that were forwarded through 3-2 channels. Next, the company began moving to (BS 621985) where resupply was to be effected. The company noticed movement on the proposed IE (LS 621985) and cleared it with a few nounds of 81mm Mortar and M-79 fire and then physically compied it. The resupply was made without incident at 201735H. The company then set in for the night at 201830H, vicinity (BT 648988). While setting in the camp received two (2) rounds of sniper fire at 200640 if from on undetermined position. At 202015H, as come patrol was leaving, a firefight erupted between two (2) unknown units in the vicinity (BS 647980). The company could not determine just who was doing the shooting as no patrols had yet been dispatched. The remainder of the night was without event. At 210545H, one (1) platoon moved out as a forward element to secure an LZ (BT 676986). At 210600H, the remainder of the company followed up and joined the security element in the IZ. At 210805H Company "I" relieved Company "K".

2. General. Company "I" landed in the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula to conduct search and destroy operations against the Viet Cong.

a. At 210740H Company "I" was helilifted from a LZ at (BT 548017) to a LZ at (BS 674983) and effected a relief of Company "K". The company then moved to (BS 676986) where two (2) 60mm Mortars were found buried nose up in the ground with the fuze slightly exposed. The mortar rounds were removed by EOD personnel and returned through S-2 channels. The company moved on to (BT 674977) and began a search of PHUOC HOA (2). S-2 Scouts covering the advance of the company received small arms fire at (BS 675963) from the vicinity of (BS 679963). The company moved to overcome the source of the small arms fire while the S-2 Scouts moved on to (BS 672961) where they were pinned down by heavy small arms fire from (BS 667963). An air strike was called and delivered at 211120H. After the air strile, secondary explosions and reall arms detonation were heard and believed to be caused by the fires from the air strike. The company swept on through the bombed area searching for the enemy, and found nothing. At 211315H, S-2 Scouts again were taken under fire in the vicinity (BS 663958). One (1) man was wounded and promptly evacuated. The company pushed forward again in an attempt to maintain contact but they were not able to make any further daylight contact. At 212335H the company conducted a company sized patrol but incurred no contact throughout the entire night. At 220640H, the company secured a LZ at (BS 666997) for retraction, however twenty-five (25) VC were noted at (BS 660993). The company pursued and when the VC reached a hill at (BS 657998), artillery was directed on them. The company moved to the impact area (BS 657998) and found tunnels and evidence of recent occupancy, but no VC. The company moved to (BT 640026) and retracted in LVT's.



2. General: Company "K" landed in the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula to conduct search and destroy operations against the Viet Cong.

a. At 220830H, Company "K" landed by helolift (BT 646030) and (BT 647015). Two (2) platoons moved to (BT 657011) and one (1) platoon to (BT 650005) which covered the retraction of Company "I". Three (3) large caves were found and destroyed at (BT 655014) and (BT 657011). At (BT 655028), one (1) VC escapes was apprehended. The captive stated that he had been picked up by the VC vicinity (BT 655028) 11 July 1965. He had escaped on 21 July 1965 after having been taken prisoner and noved to an unknown position in our TAOR. He also stated that a Main Force company had occupied and round the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula until 11 July 1965, and now only a platoon of guerrillas moved from hamlet to hamlet depending on the location of the Marines. At 221630H, five (5) VC were spotted at (BT 657011). Three (3) were wearing green utilities while two (2) were wearing the black pajana type uniform. Morter and artillery fire were directed on the area (PT 657011) but a check of the impacted area revealed nothing. The company moved into a night patrol base at (BT 648028). From there, two (2) squad patrols were carried out 222200H - 222400H and 222300H -230100H. Three (3) ambushes were set, a platoon sized ambush at (BT 659010) 221730H to 230600H, a squad sized ambush at (BT 648018) 230130H - 230500H, and a squad size ambush at (DT 653033) from 230200H - 230500H. At 230600H, the company secured the area of retraction: (BT 625991) and were relieved by Company "M" at 230900H.

Remarks, The VC may be nowing into areas previously occupied by Maxines for the purpose of laying hooby traps. If the area offers sufficient cover, layout type ambushes may discourage booby trapping, however, the unit involved must be sufficiently capable of defending itself as distances involved and helicopter availability make immediate reaction almost impossible. Platon size hommer and anvil with helicopters and LVT's could be tried.

2. General. Company "M" landed in the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula to conduct search and destroy operations against the Viet Cong.

a. Company "M" landed by LVT (BS 624993) at 230855H and effected relief of Company "K" without incident. From the landing area, the company moved South dropping a squad size ambush at (BT 629989) that remained in position until 231815H, without incident. At 231130H the company moved to a patrol base at (BS 643982) where two platoon size patrols were dispatched to search the hamlets of THUONG HOA (3) (BS 644979) and THUONG HOA (2) (BS 641974). Although no contact could be made with the Viet Cong, nany afficels were found in the villages and destroyed. The patrol also noted that the villagers were more friendly and cooperative in relation to previous encounters within these same villages. At 231415H a search was conducted of HOA TAY (BT 647975) which revealed tunnels that were destroyed by explosives. The company moved as a patrol without incident until 232225H at which time a base camp was established at (BS 642994). During the night. the company conducted four (4) squad sized patrols. Two (2) patrols were sent out at 232300H until 230030H, while the last two (2) patrols of the night departed at 232400Hand returned at 240145H. The company moved to a LZ at BT 638004 and effected a relief with Company "L" at 240805H.

3. Remarks. That our presence on the peninsula is being felt and that the people are beginning to behave more friendly towards the Marines.

- 2. General. Company "L" landed in the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula to conduct search and destroy operations against the Viet Cong. Moreover, civil affairs was conducted in the form of medical aid in an attempt to win the friendship and confidence of the people.
- a. At 240800H Company "L" landed (BT 635008) and effected a relief of Company "M". The company rapidly moved to establish a two (2) platoon blocking position at (BT 651016) to (BT 651022) while one (1) platoon searched a village at (BT 656014). The search revealed nothing. News. the company sent one (1) platoon to (BT 659030) where three (3) squad size ambushes were placed. The remainder of the company moved Northward, dropping two (2) squad-size ambushes near (BT 650022), to (BT 649029) where a company CP was established. Enroute to the CP area, the company dispensed medical aid along the way to needy individuals. From the established CP (BT 649029), a platoon was sent to (BT 634020) where three (3) squad ambushes were set. At 241700H, the platoons reassembled and moved into platoon defensive perimeters at (BT 638024) (BT 639019), and (BT 640021). Three (3) squad patrols and two (2) platoon ambushes were conducted during the night but were not able to make enemy contact. At 250605H the company moved to a blocking position (BT 621017) - (BT 623019) (BT 621021). The company was empleced by 250720H. Company "L" was relieved at 250805H by Company "I" which landed at (BT 620019). After the relief, Company "L" moved into the hamlet of SON TRA (1) (BT 622019) and started administering limited medical aid to the needy. At 251015H, the company retracted by LVT's bringing two (2) very sick Vietnamese to the Battalion BAS for further treatment.
- 3. Remarks. More and more people are seen working the fields as 1f they had confidence in the presence of the Marines. Moreover the people no longer express fear in their actions and appearance when the companies patrol through the villages. Lastly, while this upsurge of feeling 1s taking place among the Vietnamese, a hard sell Civil Affairs Program should follow close behind as the companies clear an area.

2. General. Company "I" landed in the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula to conduct search and destroy operations against the Viet Cong. The operations are designed to either destroy or route the Viet Cong from the peninsula and to gain the confidence of the local villagers.

a. At 250700H, Company "I" left by LVT from (BT 549017) and proceeded. to the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula. There they landed at (BT 620019) and effected a relief of Company "L". At 251040H two (2) Chinese type hand granades were discovered near (BT 622017). One (1) grenade had been rigged as a pull type booby trap while the other was merely laying on the ground as if dropped. Both granades were considered unsafe for handling thus they were destroyed in place by Engineers. At 251340H an extensive tunnel complex was found at (BT 624016) which showed signs of worksmanship during the past forty-eight (48) hours. The tunnel was destroyed. The remainder of the day was uneventful and without incident. During the night, three (3) squad size ambush petrols were conducted during the period 252100H -252400H, 252300H - 260400H, 260300H - 260630H. None of the patrols made any contact throughout the night. At 260755H, Company "I" was bounding LVT's at (BS 623989) the company received three (3) rounds of sniper fire. No casualties were incurred. As the LVT's moved across the SONG TRA BONG, two (2) more sniper rounds were received without casualties. The company lended at (BS 615990) and moved into a blocking position from (BS 604990) to (BS 614990) in support of Company "L". The blocking position netted no results. Afterwards, the company dispatched a Civil Affairs Team to MY HUE (1) (BS 613984). There Corpsman gave limited medical aid while CA and CI teams passed out leaflets and attempted to gain information concerning two (2) Marine MIA's. At 261330H, the company retracted by LVT from (BS 613991) and moved down the SONG TRA BONG. At HON BA (BT 616016) the company stopped, moved among the many villagers who were busy with their daily routines. One (1) boat was searched with negative results, however, the primary movement in the area was mingling with the people letting then feel the presence and becoming acquainted with large numbers of Marines

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The willagers moved freely and unaffed during the short stop at the mouth of the SONG TRA BONG. The company returned to their position on the MLB at 261600H.

3. Remarks. Throughout the entire company operation on the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula, who people did not attempt to hide when the Marines approached nor did the people express fear during the Marines presence. The Civil Affairs Program should offer medical care as its mainstay.

- 2. General. Company "L" conducted a search and destroy operation in the BINH YEN NOI and MY HUE village complexes along the Western banks of the SONG TRA BONG. Moreover, after the operation, a Civil Affairs Team rapidly moved into some of the cleared villages to administer medical aid and attempt to gather intelligence.
- a. At 260530H Company "L" departed from the MLR and proceeded by foot march to an assembly area (BS 589976). At 260800H, the company began a methodical search and destroy operation of the village complex along the Western bank of the SONG TRA BONG which included the hamlets of BINH YEN NOI (3), (1), (2) (BS 586977), (BS 599976) (BS 606977) and MY HUE (3), (2), (1) (BS 604983) (BS 607983) (BS 613983) in that order. At 261130H, the search was completed without detecting anything suspicious nor were any acts of hostility noted. Next, the company immediately dispatched a Civil Affairs Team into the hamlet of MY HUE (3) (BS 604983). The limited medical aid performed by the company corpsman was well received, however; many cases appeared which were beyond the medical capabilities of the corpsman. - 2. General. The boarding party cruised the coastline of the TRUNG PHAN Pentasula with the mission of searching sampams to determine the presence of arms and other combrahand, and destroying any sampams from which hostile fire was received.
- a, At 270912H the boarding party departed from Naval Beach Group II and after experiencing minor difficulty putting to sea through the eight (8) foot surf, proceeded to a position off HON ONG island vic. coord (BT 613027), and commenced sampam s earches/at 270945H. Between the hours 270945H and 271100H fourteen (14) boats were searched. The method employed during the day, was to (1) hail the sampam, the interpreter (using a boat mike) telling the occupants to drop sail and approach the LWM-8 or be fired upon, (2) lash the sampam along side and search it thoroughly, assuring the occupants through the interpreter that if they were innocent fishermen they would not be harmed, (3) check the occupants' identification and ask them for information about VC in the fishing fleet, and (4) offer a small gift of tobacco or candy and cast them off. These 14 sampams were all located in grid squares (BT 6103) and (BT 6202).
- b. At approximately 271100H the boarding party proceeded to a point vice coord. (BT673040), arriving at approximately 271240H. Four sampams were searched in that vicinity, one of which contained two (2) male Vietnamese without indentification cards. While this sampam was being searched, three (3) male Vietnamese were observed running toward a coral head on the beach, obviously attempting to avoid discovery. They were hailed by the boat mike told to stop, and three warning shots were fired ahead of them, but they made it to the rocks and disappeared vic coord (BT 670040). The men carried no visible weapons. Pursuit would have be instituted had there been a suitable

Landing side for the LCM-8 in the area, but there was none.

- o. The boardingparty then proceeded back around the peninsula, searching two (2) sampans at 2713/64 vicinity coordinates (BT 659055), and two (2) more at 271430H, vicinity coordinates (BT 635050). Ten (10) sampans were searched at 271451H, vicinity coordinates (BT 630040) and three vace searched at 271515H, vicinity coordinates (BT 644044).
- d. The Learningporty then proceeded down the coast to the mouth of the SONG TRA BONG Piver, vicinity coordinates (ET 617025) where nine (9) sampans were secreted at approximately 271610H.
- e. A worsh of forty-five (45) boats were searched, and no weepons or other contribed was found. With the exception of the two (2) male Victnamese provided by nontioned, all the Vietnamese had identification cards. Approximately 225 Vietnamese were checked, based on an average of six (6) per boat. At 271625H the boarding party departed for Naval Beach Group 1, arriving there and debarking uneventfully at 271700H.

3. Remarks

- a. Random searching of sampans during daylight hours proved fruitless, and in my opinion the LCM-8 with tank was an unnecessarily large and unwieldly craft for this purpose.
 - b. Recommendations for future operations of this kind:
 - (1) That a standard LCM be employed, with one (1) rifle squad, reinforced, with a machinegun section and a rocket squad, one (1) interpreter, one (1) corpsman, one (1) AN/PRC-10 operator with radio, and an OIC. This combination would provide more than adequate firepower for any engagement affoat, enough personnal to conduct searches, and would have the capability (which a LCM-8 with tank aboard does not have) of making unplanned landings to take advantage of targets of opportunity ashore as they appear, such as the three (3) Vietnamese on the beach noted earlier in this report. The M-60 Machineguns and 3.5° mocket launcher would be entirely satisfactory for sinking sampans, or if, because of the presence of innocent boats near the target area, firing were deemed inappropriate, the superior size and speed of the LCM would enable the landing party to ram a hostile sampan without resorting to firepower.
 - (2) That daylight operations of this kind be coordinated by radio with an encirclement of a coastal village by ground forces, or other land operation designed to flush VC to seaward in sampans. The LCM could then conduct a search and destroy mission on these boats, having them anchor in one location for later interrogation and classification.

An LVTP-5 with a rifle squad aboard could be used as security for such a floating collection point. The LCM would then be free to utilize its speed and manauverability to destroy, by machinegun rocket fire and ramming, any sampans which failed to respond to instructions to halt.

- (3) That a similarly armed landing party, embarked aboard an LCM equipped with searchlight unit, be employed at night to check sampan traffic at the mouth of the SONG TRA BONG and other suspect points on the peninsula coastline for smuggled arms and contraband.
- (4) That future landing partics search the fishing weirs off the peninsula coast marked by bamboo poles imbedded in the sea bottom which protrude above the surface of the water. One such pole was investigated in the course of this mission but it did not have a net attached. Weapons could conceivably be cached in waterproof bags underwater, attached to these weirs.

2. General. Acting on intelligence passed by friendly villagers, Company "K" moved to apprehend NGUYIN DOAN, a known Viet Cong Platoon Commander who keeps a store of weapons in his dwelling.

a. At 290300H, Company "K" departed from the MLR and moved quietly under the cover of darkness to the hamlets HAI NINH (2) (BT 603019), HAI NINH (1) (BT 607017) and HON BA (BT 616016). Ten (10) fishing boats were ordered to shore and searched with negative results. The occupants of the boats were ordered to a collection point on the beach (BT 610019). At 290730H, another platoon moved northward through the hamlet HAI NINH (1) (BT 607017). The search achieved complete surprise as an extremely large number (175) of young men were found in the group of civilians sent to the collection point on the beach marmed by S-2 scouts and Division CIT. Heretofore young men were seen only occasionally when the company conducted village searches. During the search, NGUYEN DOAN was not found. At 290900H, one platcon was placed in security of the VCS as the Division Counter-intelligence Team attempted to further determine who should be left behind, and who should be interrogated further. The remainder of the company returned to the MLR.

3. Remarks. The villages were taken by complete surprise as was indicated by the large number of young men. Also, large quantities of money were taken from the fishing boats searched which may indicate the boats as a lucrative target. Moreover, the feinting movements of the LVT's during the night and the night movement to the searched harlets may have aided in complete surprise of the area of operation.

1. General. Company "K" conducted search and destroy operations and night ambushes on the TRUNG PruN Peninsula.

a. At 300910H, the company landed at (ET 638026). One plateon set in squad defensive positions at (DT 621016), (BT 625015) and (Dr 624018). Another platoon moved out at 300915H on a patrol and discovered what appeared to be a 4.2" Mortar fuze protruding out of the ground vicinity (BT 634015). The protrusion was blown in place and the patrol incurred no further incidents. At 301000H, a squad size patrol was conducted which found a basket containing expended rounds of a foreign make at (BT 621015), at-301300H. Also at 301300H, the company dispatched another platoon patrol and found one (1) notebook reportedly containing names of nembers of the Peoples Liberation Army, two sheets of notebook paper with similar names, a VC flag, one (1) green utility jacket, and numerous other civilian type documents (narriage and birth certificates) hidden in a tree vicinity (BT 623011). At 301500H another platoon patrol was conducted with negative results. At 302010 Company "K" minus one (1) platoon was retracted from (BT 642026). The platoon renaining on the Thung Phun Peninsula set one (1) squad layout and two (2) squad ambushes at (BT 622013), (BT 623008) and (DT 623009). No contact was made except by the ambush vicinity (DT. 621008) at 310555H at which time five (5) armed VC were seen at (DT 620008). Some children were also near the VC. The VC detected the ambush and Marines inmediately opened fire. As the VC quickly used the childreen as a shield, the Marines were only able to fire momentarily. One of the children was hit and evacuated with the platoon as it returned at 310930h.

3. Remarks. More ambushes should be tried in likely spots on the TRUNG PHAN Peninsula. Also, due to the present rules of engagement, small unit leaders are reductant to fire on a target without approval from a higher authority.

1. Operations

a. General. During the reporting period it has been generally quiet. Companies have been improving their respective defensive posture as necessary and maintaining tight security on positions. Up until 090800H combat outposts were being manned vicinity (BS 560996, (BT 572017) and (BT 583026). At that time companies of this Command executed 3/3 Frag Order #33 which directed realignment of the MLR. This realignment has been completed. Units started immediately to improve their defensive positions but shortages of all types of wire, sandbags and shoring material as well as a shortage of heavy equipment for grading exists. Personnel and equipment of attached armored units have continued to support the Battalion as have attached units of artillery. Aggressive patrolling from company (_) to fire team has been carried on throughout the reporting period. During the periods 050530H to 051830H and 080530H to 082030H July 1965 this Battalion conducted search and destroy operations in an area enclosed by (BS 620008) to (BS 655994) to (BS 670970) to (BS 620970).

b. Summary of Activities

- (1) Company "I" continued to improve its defensive posture on $\overline{0P^7s}$ #1, #2 and #3 up until the execution of 3/3 Frag Order #33, which directed realignment of the MLR. Aggressive patrolling both during the day and at night was conducted. During the period 050530H to 051830H and 080530H to 082030H July 1965, Company "I" participated in battalion search and destroy operations.
- (2) Company "K" continued to improve its defensive posture up until the execution of 3/3 Frag Order #33, which directed realignment of the MLR. Aggressive patrolling both during the day and at night was conducted. During the periods 050530H to 051830H and 080530H to 082030H July 1965, Company "K" participated in a battalion search and destroy operation.
- (3) Company "L" continued to improve its defensive posture up until the execution of 3/3 Frag Order #33, which directed realignment of the MLR. Aggressive patrolling both during the day and at night was conducted. During the period 050530H to 051830H Company "L" provided one (1) platoon to occupy positions vicinity high ground at (BT 614009). One (1) platoon was also provided to man the vacated positions of Company "K" while it participated in a search and destroy operation. During the period 080530H to 082030H Company "L" participated in a battalion search and destroy operation.

(4) Company "M" is in regimental reserve. During the period 050530H to 051830H July 1965 the company reverted to battalion reserve for the duration of a scheduled search and destroy operation and was prepared to execute a helicopter landing in a LZ that was to be designated in the area of operations should its employment be necessary. On 080530H to 082030H Company "M" participated in a battalion search and destroy operation. At the completion of the operation it again reverted to Regimental reserve.

c. Statistics

(1) Operations

Concany "I", until the execution of 3/3 Frag Order #33. cooupied OP's #1, #2 and #3 vicinity (BS 560996), (ET 572017) and (BT 583026). At 050410H OP#1 (BS 560996) reported two (2) explosions on the positon and small arms fire was received from the vicinity of TRI BINH (1) (BS 555987). One (1) Marine was wounded and evacuated by helicopter at 050430H. Subsequently, one (1) 60mm Mortar fin assembly was found. Investigation of the area proved negative. At 050730H Company "I" reinforced with two (2) squads of flames and with a detachment of 3d Plat, Co "A", 3d EngrBn boarded helicopters at LZ BORCAT ALPHA and landed in the objective area at (BT 640005). The lift was completed in two (2) wayes of twelve helicopters each at 0750H. The 1st platoon escripted positions at (BT 639998) to cover the LZ and the initial deployment of the rest of the company. The search and destroy operation commenced at 0815H and continued until 1230H. Seven (7) male VCS were captured during this search and were forwarded to the Battalion Collection Point. All males seemed to have left the hamlets as only women, children and old men were found. The search was continued and was completed at 1440H with three more VCS being forwarded to the Collection Point. Mopping up operations were commenced against tunnels and caves, with engineers using five hundred twenty eight (528) pounds of C-4 destroying eight (8) large bunker type tunnel shelters with multiple entrances and about eight (3) small one (1) man shelters. At 1530H the company moved to the beach for recovery, by helicopter which commenced at 1615H and was completed about 1645H. At 080620H, Company "I" board helicopters in 3/3 area and proceeded to LZ BLUE (BS 681975). Lift was completed at 080635H with landing of second wave of twelve heliconters. High ground at (BS 683972) and (BS 688982) was secured immediately. Movement to PL RUBY was made without incident and the company halted awaiting permission to cross.

While at PL RUBY Naval Gunfire was called in on high ground (BT 672011) to reduce trench line, barbed wire, caves and tunnels that had been spotted by reconnoitering S-2 Scouts. The gun-target line was not at a favorable angle however and adjusting proved unsuccessful; Artillery fired two rounds which were on target and the company proceeded across PL RUBY and on to PL SAPPHIRE without contact. Progress was then made across PL EMERALD to vicinity of (BT 663035-BT 667037) Platoon by radio. Recon reported VCS on rocks at (BT 670040). Eventually five (5) Vietnamese males carrying three (3) U.S. Fragmentation Hand Grenades were flushed from this area and taken prisoner. The 3d Platoon was then drawing sniper fire from a fishing boat in vicinity (BT 674043). Marines returned fire with negative results. The incident was reported to the USS GALVESTON who dispatched a boat to intercept the VC craft. The Company continued toward LZ ORANGE and while conducting a village search vicinity (BT 649044), the 2d Platoon came under small arms fire from the village. A Vietnamese male with rifle ran from the village toward the shore of VUNG DUNG QUAT, climbed into a basket boat and commenced paddling frantically to the West. He was shot and killed by a Marine. No attempt was made to recover the body or the weapon. Two (2) more male prisoners were taken from the house from which the rifleman escaped. As the search continued, three Marines were wounded by a grenade. It could not be determined where the grenade had come from. A home made hand grenade booby-trap was found at (BT 649046) anchored to the ground and rigged with a 120 foot fishing line trip wire. A VC was seen running from the area and, when efforts to capture him were unsuccessful he was shot and killed. The area was cleared at 1840H. The company then moved to LZ ORANGE for heli-lift back to the battalion area. The lift began at 1915H and was completed at 1930H when the last elements touched down in 3/3 area. At 092235H one (1) fragmentation hand grenade was exploded at (BT 551015). Investigation of the incident proved negative. At 100330H Company "I" reported receiving eight (8) rounds of SA fire vicinity (BT 564007). Artillery fired illumination and there was no further incidents.

(b) Company "K" continued work on its defensive positions until the execution of 3/3 Frag Order #33 at 090800H. During the period 3 through 5 July, a Platoon in the offensive training was conducted to the rear of the company positions. At 050620H Company "K" boarded LVT's and proceeded to the objective area landing at 0710H. The 1st Platoon moved by LVT's to position from (BT 621022) to (BT 623016). The 3d Platoon moved into position from (BT 623016) to (BT 629011). The 2d Platoon detached one (1) squad for security of the Mobile Bas and Collection Point and moved to positions vicinity (BT 624016).

On order the 1st and 3d Platoons moved to positions at (BT 621018) to (BT 623009). During this movement the 3d Platoon came under small arms fire from a village at (BT 626013). Fire was returned and the Platoon moved through the village capturing three (3) VCS. Six (6) spider traps were found and were blown. The Company occupied its assigned position without further incident and prepared to cover the search operation of Company "I". A mop up operation of tunnels and caves were conducted which expended four hundred twenty pounds (420) of C-4. One (1) large tunnel about 50 yards long was destroyed along with about twelve (12) smaller holes and shelters. Company "K" covered the helicopter recovery of Company "I" and at 1632H began withdrawing to the beach for recovery by LVT. The recovery was made without incident and at 1830H all elements of the Company were back in the Bn area. Also, a detachment of Company "A", 1st AmTracBn accompanied this operation to recover an LVT that had been burned and abandoned on a previous operation. They were successful and the abandoned LVT was towed back to the AmTrac area. Furthermore, a light section of tanks with a flome tank participated in the operation and were transported to and from the objective area by an ICM-8 provided by Naval Beach Group #1. At 080715H Company "K" landed in LZ RED and commenced movement to PL DIAMOND. Upon arrival there the company moved on toward PL RUBY with two (2) platoons on line sweeping villages in assigned zone. PL RUBY and PL SAPPHIRE were crossed without incident and villages between PL SAPPHIRE, PL EMERALD and the beach were swept without significant activity. Three (3) large caves (BT 644003) and numerous spider traps and smaller daves were destroyed. Upon arrival at the beach one (1) platoon moved over to (BT 624015) to cover Company "M" s withdrawal. Upon completing this maneuver the company covered the retraction of Company "L" by helicopter from LZ BLACK. Then, loaded in LVT's, began its withdrawal from the beach and return to the battalion area. The move was completed at 082030H. At 100740H Company "K" (+) embarked on LVT's to commence a twenty-four (24) hour patrol of the ZULU Area.

(c) Company "L" continued work on its defensive positions until the execution of 3/3 Frag Order #33 at 090800H. On 5 July Company "L" provided one (1) platoon to occupy blocking positions vicinity high ground at (BT 614009). One (1) platoon was also provided to man the vacated positions of Company "K" while it participated in a search and destroy operation. At 050645H, a Marine at the blocking position, triggered a M-26 grenade, that had been employed as an anti-personnel mine, vicinity (BT 14009). This Battalion had not set the grenade. The investigating engineer squad leader was of the opinion that the grenade was set recently as the bamboo stake used for the trip wire looked fresh.

The resulting blast wounded eleven (11) Marines. At 050820H one (1) Marine was struck in the lower left leg by a sniper round vicinity (BT 557026(. He was evacuated by helicopter and forwarded from the Battalion BAS to "B" Med. At 080630H Company "L" landed in LZ WHITE (BS 670979) and commenced sweeping to the North in assigned zone to PL DIAMOND. At the phase line fortifications were encountered, (BS 668992), consisting of fighting holes and bunkers. These were demolished by attached engineers. As the company crossed PL DIAMOND they encountered punji pits and assorted trenches. At this point two (2) VCS were picked up and forwarded to the collection point. The company then moved to PL RUBY without incident. One (1) VCS was captured vicinity (BS 660998). As the company moved to PL SAPPHIRE they spotted four (4) VC with rifler vicinity (BT 668008) running Eastward to the river. The Marines opened fire and one (1) VC was blown into the air, while in the river, by an M-79 round. The body and weapon could not be recovered. The other three (3) escaped. PL SAPPHIRE was crossed at 081330H and the sweep pushed on to PL EMERALD. Numerous dry irrigation ditches with punjis were found. Fortifications around DONG LE (5) (BT 666010) and TUYET NIEM (4) (BT 653016) were fairly new. PL EMERALD was reached at 1515H. The company moved on toward the beach and received maiper fire from village (BT 658028). The village was rapidly overrun and three (3) VC with M-26 hand grenades were captured. Company "L" then moved to LZ BLACK and was lifted back to the battalion area by helicopter. The lift was completed at 081910H.

(d) Company "M" was in regimental reserve during the reporting period. During the period 050530H to 050830H July, Company "M" reverted to battalion reserve for the duration of a scheduled search and destroy operation and was prepared to execute a helicopter landing in an LZ that was to be designated in the area of operations should its employment become necessary. This contingency did not arise and the company reverted back to regimental reserve. At 080700H, Company "M" landed in LZ RED and commenced sweep to Westward. An enemy ambush vicinity (BS 624973) was sprung prematurely because of effective point security. A fire fight followed and several VC were seen to fall. Due to intensity of fire fight no time was taken to count casualties. Artillery and 81mm Mortar fire was called in with excellent results. The company received seven (7) rounds of incoming 60mm Mortar fire from vicinity (BS 638964). Air strike was called in on the enemy mortar silencing it. When 81mm Mortar fire lifted the village was assaulted and Marines counted five (5) VC dead and recovered two (2) rifles. (Rifles forwarded through intelligence channels.) Four (4) VC were seen running South vicinity (BS 635967).

Machine guns opened up and at the same time aircraft were making strafing runs. Two (2) VC were seen to fall and lie motionless, Shortyly thereafter, a bomb struck the area and the VC disappeared. The company then pushed on toward PL DIAMOND. As they went through THUONG HOA (1) (BS 629971) two (2) men were seen climbing into a boat and atampting to cross the river. One (1) man was carrying a rifle. USMC fire cut the boat and its occupants to ribbons. Dark stains appeared on the surface of the water. Four (4) prisoners were taken in this same area. The village was heavily tunneled and had many spider traps and barricades. The company moved on to PL DIAMOND without further significant incident. PL DIAMOND was crossed at 1150H and the company reached PL RUBY at 1910H. Prisoners were evacuated and water was resupplied at PL RUBY. The company left the phase line at 1415H and proceeded to PL SAPPHIRE capturing 14 VCS on the way. As the company moved through TAN HY (1) (BT 623009) they encountered sporadic snaper fire but were reluctant to return fire dut to the bevy of women, children and elderly people in the village. The village was honeycombed with tunnels and bunkers. The company destroyed several of these but did not have enough demolitions to blow them all. Sniper fire killed one (1) Marine and wounded another in this area. The company moved across PL EMERALD and into the villages of SON TRA (2) (BT 622015) and SON TRA (1) (BT 621020). Heavy sniper fire was received in these villages and they were found to be heavily tunneled. Company "M" moved on through and down to the beach. Withdrawal was completed at 2030Hwhen Company "M" arrived by LVT in 3/3 area.

Subj: Intelligence Reports of TRUNG PHAN Peninsula

- 1. As a result of continuous patrolling for the last seven days the following intelligence information has been determined:
- a. There appears to be a buildup of VC strength, possibly hard core, on the TRUMD FEAN Feninsula. On three different occasions on 19 July 1965 groups of 20.30 armed men wearing black and brown uniforms have been spotted. First group it BS 663981 moving in a southernly direction; second group at BS 642998 dispensed when observed by helicopter; and the third group at BT 638007 moving in a north easterly direction.
- b. In grid squares (PT 6200 and BT 6300) numerous holes have been dug in the last flew days with the following specifications: tactical location, well crossflaged, circular, four to tive feet deep and leading into tunnels, and sturdily constructed.
- c. Several booby traps have been discovered on the peninsula, especially in grid square (BT 6201). A Chinese manufactured handgrenade was found at (BT 624005).
- d. Large volumes of smiper fine has been fixed at companies patrolling on the western side of the peninsula, and two reports of morters have been received. On 19 July as nime Company was departing from the beach at coordinates (BT 521006) by INT, a large volume of fixe, including at least one automatal weapon, was received from the beach at coordinates (BT 622006).
- e. Intelligence sources (Bink Son District) have reported one hard core VC Contant operating along the high ground from coordinates (BS 633964) east to the coast. Also, two generalla platoons and two hard core VC platoons are reported operating in the area directly south of the high ground.
- f. Small arms fire has been extremely accurate indicating that the persons firing are not run of the mill guerrillas.
- g. There has been a definite effort to reconnoiter company night positions. Two members of such a reconnaissance team were captured by M Company on 19 July 1965.



- 1. On 25 July 1965, Company I, 3/3, patrolling on the Trung Phan peninsula discovered a tunnel system under construction. Investigation of the system revealed three separate tunnels leading from a shaft that opened near the top of the hill at BT 624014. One of the tunnels branched in to two separate tunnels about 20 feet from the shaft, with the beginning of a room at the face of the branch tunnel. Another tunnel leading from the shaft was identical in construction and it appeared that the plan was to make one large room with two entrances. A sketch of the system is attached as enclosure (1).
- 2. The tunnels were supported by bent five foot U.S. barbed wire stakes with a shaft opening approximately six foot square. There was no apparent attempt at camouflage.
- military force. The failure to camouflage the entrance is an error that professionals would not allow. The size of the shaft, the tunnels and the grows were much larger than any other previously encountered. It is presumed the system was being built to specification and may have been planned for use in storing bulk supplies. The tunnels were close proximity to the SONG TRA BONG River which is an alleged VC supply route.

4. The tunnels were destroyed by demolitions.

Civil Affairs/Civic Action situation at end of period 2400, 15 July 1965.

1. This unit is operating in the area of Chu Lai. Liaison has been established with Captain Long, the District Chief of Binh-Son, province of Quang-Ngai, at his headquarters in Binh-Son at 602922. During this reporting period, this battalion has been operating extensively in the villages of Binh-Sa and Binh-Giang. On 5 July, a three company sweep and clear operation was conducted in Binh-Giang and on 8 July a battalion sweep and clear operation was conducted in the same area. These missions were completely operational in nature and as such there was very little opportunity for civic action. During both operations, all hands were instructed to avoid incidents that would alienate the friendly civilians. No such incidents occurred.

#### 2. Governmental

- a. National Covernment. Nothing to report.
- b. Provincial Government. Nothing to report.
- c. <u>District Government</u>. This battalion is operating almost exclusively in the district of Binh-Son, province of Quang-Ngai. The district chief is a Captain Long. The Dai Uy is a dynamic cooperative man, but apparently his tactical employment of his military forces and his brutal treatment of prisoners has placed him in disfavor with the Provincial Government. At present, Dai Uy Long's position is somewhat tenuous and it is rumored that he is soon to be replaced by the Province Chief.

#### d. Village Government.

- (1) The villages within Binh-Son are organized along the normal lines for Vietnam. There is a village chief and a village police chief in each village. The older men of the village also enjoy the positions as advisors to the village officials.
- e. Public Safety. Public safety and law enforcement is a critical problem in the district of Binh-San. The danger of the VC is more prevalent in the villages in the southwest portion of the district. This area is outside our battalion TAOR and consequently, the Binh-Son police forces are mostly located outside our TAOR. As a result, the village of Binh-Sa, within our TAOR, is unsafe for the village chief and police chief. They are presently located at Tri-Binh in Binh-Thang

village BS 575970. The district chief cannot a ford to keep enough police forces in the villages of our TAOR. Civil control measures within Binh-Son include a strict curfew between the hours of 2000 and 0600 and road blocks along route #1.

f. Public Health. The general health of the people of Binh-Son is at best poer. Halnutrition is widespread and its presence together with poor personal hygiene habits tends to enhance the severity and existent diseases. Prevalent diseases are Trachoma, Tuberculoses, various worn infestations, parasites, vitamin deficiencies, arthritis, and superficial fungal infections.

There is a small hospital in the district capital which is extremely illequiped and for all intents and purposes, unstaffed. There are no doctors or nurses in the district; there are two mid-wives at the hospital. One U.S. Army medic and two Vietnamese medics are available in the district. These medics are able to visit hamlets and distribute medications, however, medical supplies are almost nonexistent the district appears unable to get them from the province, and so this team is severely handicapped.

- g. <u>Public Welfare</u>. Public welfare in this area is almost nonexistent. There are no formal provisions made for aged and orphaned. Each hamlet cares for its own welfare cases and relatives look after members of their family.
- h. Public Education. There are four primary schools in the battalion's Thor; all very poor. There is a secondary school in the district capital.

#### 3. Economic

- a. Commerce and Industry. Commerce and industry are limited to the town of Binh-Son and even there, there is little in the way of either. There is locally produced tin ware and a small amount of wrought iron products are produced and sold in Binh-Son. Beer is bottled in several of the nearby villages and ice is transported to this area from Quang-Ngai. Pottery is also produced and sold in Binh-Son.
- b. Food and Agriculture. Basically, the economy in this area is agricultural. There are three main crops raised locally; rise, peanuts, and potatoes. These crops are raised year round and the rice and potatoes are extremely important staples. The area within our TAOF is very poor owing to the fact that the soil is very sandy. There is a sizeable fishing fleet operating out of the Song Tra Bong and fish are consumed by the population. All food stuffs are in limited supply and the population within the area suffers from widespread malnutrition (See Public Health Above).

4. Civic Action. A civil affairs team visited the hamlet of Vinh-An at coordinates BT 612011 at approximately 1000 of 11 July. The villagers in the area were not aware of the visit in advance, but there were no problems incurred as a result because we had been in this area on several occasions in the past. The purpose of the visit was to give medical aid to the people in the area. On this trip approximately 250 people were seen by the Battalion Surgeon, LT Donald F. HAGEN, aided by six corpsmen provided the medical assistance. Dr. HAGEN feels that the general health of the people in Vinh-An has noticably improved during the 6 weeks that we have been visiting this area.

On 12 July, the Battalion Civil Affairs Officer visited the hamlet of Tri-Binh(5) in the village of Binh-Thang. The purpose of the visit was to make arrangements to hold a weekly sick call in this hamlet. At this time, the Civil Affairs Officer talked with the hamlet chief, Mr. Le Van Anh and they agreed on holding an initial sick call on 14 July. The hamlet chief was, at first, worried that the VC would cause an incident because he had very few popular forces to protect his village. When he came to understand that the medical team would bring its own protection, he was very desirous of the planned program.

On 14 July, we returned to Tri-Binh and were greeted by the village chief, Mr. Nguyen - HOANG and Le Van Anh. The medical team quickly set up and after some introductory conversation concerning over all needs of the area, the doctor and corpsmen went to work. Approximately 300 civilians were seen by the nedical team and 10# of soap was distributed. The reaction of the people was very gratifying. Both the village and hamlet chiefs appeared genuinely grateful.

5. It is felt that this battalion's operational posture during the reporting period plus the recent movement of the battalion's MIR has restricted the number and extent of civil action projects. It is felt that the medical program of visiting specific hamlets on specific days each week has been very effective. The battalion surgeon has noticed an overall improvement in the general health in the hamlets we visit. The civilians seem sincerely grateful for the medical aid and to this extent, it is felt that the program has been very effective.



Subj: Aspects of the Vietnamese Campaign; comments concerning

Ref: (a) 4th Marines msg 0305402Z July 1965

- 1. In accordance with reference (a) the following comments concerning the Viet Nam campaign are hereby submitted:
  - a. Probably the most important of the unique aspects of this campaign is the difficulty involved in identification of the enemy. Frequently, our opponents are clad in little more than loin cloth. Their dress is no different, for the most part, than every other civilian in the area. Momen and children have been known to participate in the hostilities. Indiscriminate killing must be avoided which, of course, prompts the promulgation of "Rules of Engagement." The enemy must be positively identified as such before he may be taken under fire. Often this simply boils down to "Do not fire unless you are fired upon? Providing that the enemy is a decent marksman, which he is occasionally, this affords him a distinct advantage. Troops must be prepared psychologically to cope with this handicap.
  - b. A good portion of contact is made during the hours of darkness. Troops moving to this theater should receive intensive training in night marksmanship. Training should be conducted under illuminated and non-illuminated conditions.
  - c. The importance of intelligence at the small unit level should be emphasized. Individual treops must report everything that they see or hear on patrol regardless of how seemingly insignificant. They must pick up trivia and bring it in for evaluation with a complete report of location found and circumstances surrounding the find. Empty brass, tape from mortar cannisters, pieces of communication wire, bits of clothing, all help to form a picture of what teck place at a given location.
  - d. Men must be psychologically prepared to endure periods of intense frustration. Long and repeatedly monotonous patrols without contact tend to develop a sense of complacency and troops relax.





Then when the troops least expect it, the enemy will strike and if the patrol is off guard the kill ratio will be unfavorable. Individual snipers will wound troops in position and the troops will never know where the fire came from. All this leads to frustration and fear which can be combatted only by strong leadership at the small unit level.

- c. Units should have an organic language capability. The need to rely on local interpreters , which are pitifully short supply anyway, weakens the security of counter-intelligence effort.
- 2. We cannot comment on ambush and counter amubush techniques as we have had an opportunity to employ neither tactic.
- 3. Population and resource control measures have not been intense enough to obtain an evaluation of their effectiveness.
