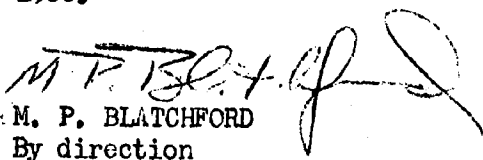

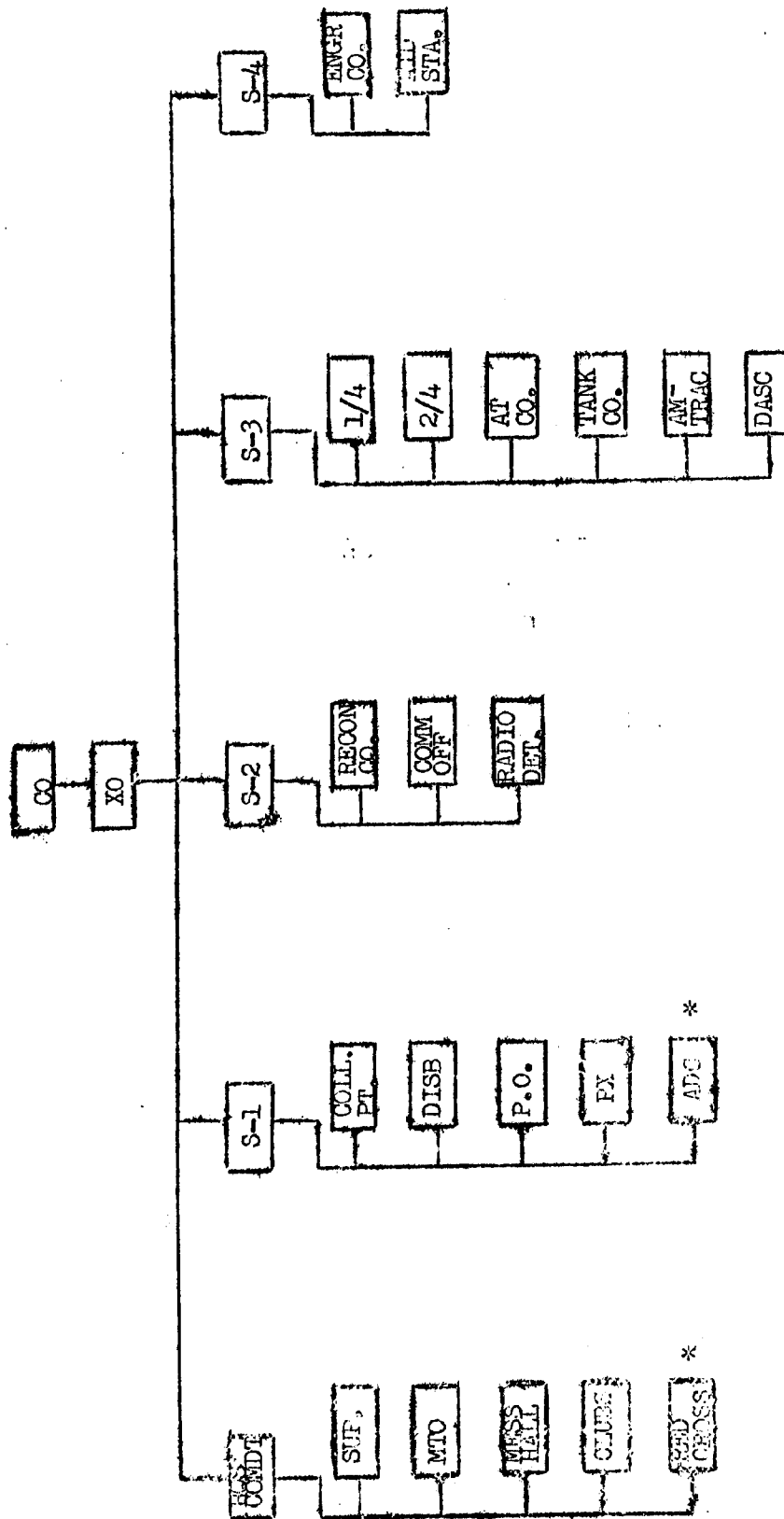

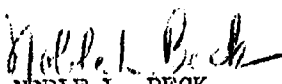

Subj: Roadblocks and Checkpoints; procedures governing

1. Purpose. To promulgate information concerning the establishment of procedures governing, and control measures for roadblocks and checkpoints within the 4th Marines TAOR.
2. Cancellation. Commanding Officer, 4th Marines Speedletter 3/RLT/csm. Ser: 003/28-65 of 28 September 1965.
3. Background. In a counterinsurgency situation, frequent and elaborate control measures are needed to prevent freedom of movement or infiltration of enemy forces. The lack of such measures would constitute a hazard to the mission of this Regiment. Under agreements presently in effect between the United States and the Republic of Vietnam, the U.S. Armed Forces are not allowed police action upon Vietnamese nationals. While roadblocks and checkpoints may be established to search vehicles entering the TAOR, U.S. seizure of materiel and equipment is limited to weapons, ammunition, and propaganda material. Seizure of contraband beyond the direct weapons of war will be accomplished by authorized Vietnamese Armed Forces personnel or other authorized Vietnamese officials.
4. Action.
 - a. Each Battalion is authorized to establish such roadblocks and checkpoints as may be necessary to control the entry of VN civilians or prohibit unauthorized traffic within their respective TAORs.
 - b. Battalions will report to this Headquarters the establishment and disestablishment of all roadblocks and checkpoints, and coordinates therefor.
 - c. Units of this Regiment on Route #1 and on the MSR between 2000 and 0600, will first clear their movement with the unit responsible for the area to be traversed.

d. All VN civilian traffic along the MSR is unauthorized except the following:

(1) Those escorted by a member of the U.S. Armed Forces or a U.S. citizen representing USOM, JUSPAO, or RMK.

(2) Employees of RMK. These may be recognized by badges they are required to carry at all times and which contain the name, other identifying data, and a photo.

(3) Such other VN civilians whose names and identification are furnished by the ADC as persons who have legitimate business and are properly cleared. Staff agency for ADC in this regard will be the Provost Marshal.

e. A sector pass is required of all Marines prior to leaving the Regimental MLR, and this pass must be checked by roadblock personnel before departure/entry is made.

f. The establishment of roadblocks and checkpoints for the purpose of seizing direct weapons of war is authorized with search by U.S. personnel confined to vehicles only. Search of VN persons, baggage and cargo will be conducted only by Vietnamese nationals empowered to search under Vietnamese laws of military regulations. Confiscation of material other than war material by U.S. personnel is prohibited.

g. In conjunction with paragraph (a) above, although not required, it is highly recommended that joint USMC/VN roadblocks/checkpoints be established. Utilization of these joint USMC/VN roadblocks/checkpoints, will preclude any acts which may be detrimental to Vietnamese relationships.

h. Specific roadblocks/checkpoints required by this Headquarters will be published by separate message.

5. Action. The following operational reports will be submitted by all units assigned to this organization unless specifically indicated to the contrary behind the Report title.

a. Daily Situation Report (SITREP) (All Task Organized Units)

(1) SITREPS are submitted by this Headquarters at 1730H daily covering the previous twenty-two hours activity from 1800H to 1600H. The remaining activity in the twenty-four hour period is submitted as telephonic spot reports as events occur.

(2) Battalions and separate companies will submit daily SITREPS by 1330H daily, covering the previous eighteen hours from 1800H to 1200H. For the last six hours of the reporting period, 1200H to 1800H, the individual units will submit telephonic spot reports, see subparagraph b. below, to cover significant occurrences as they arise. Complete information: who, what, when, where, and why, must be included in these reports. Any information not previously reported on the written SITREP must also be included.

(3) In addition to the required information submitted on the daily SITREP, units will include on Saturday's report the CP locations of all organic and attached units company size and larger. b. Spot Reports (SPOTREPS) (All Task Organized Units)

(1) Spot reports will be made on significant events as they occur. In addition to the requirements for SPOTREPS mentioned in subparagraph a.(2) above, SPOTREPS will be utilized to report, but not limited to, the following:

- (a) Friendly casualties, regardless of cause.
- (b) Enemy initiated acts against friendly forces or installations.

(3) Enclosure (2) lists the contents required for telephonic submissions of SPOTREPS.

c. Operational Readiness Reports (REDOPS) (Infantry Battalions only)

(1) Operational Readiness Reports provide information regarding operational readiness of combat and combat support forces.

(2) REDOPS will be submitted by Infantry Battalions only. Attachments will report to their parent battalions when so directed. The method of reporting may be in the form of a message, or regular correspondence, provided the report contains the required data as specified below and in enclosure (3). REDOPS reports will be submitted in accordance with reference (a) and this Order. Negative reports are not required. REDOPS will be submitted in the original only.

It is desirable that the unit have two weeks of additional training prior to deployment. Not less than 60% authorized crews, where required, are combat ready but adequate crews combat ready to man/launch ready equipment.

C-3 (Marginally Combat Ready)

Unit's combat capability is marginal unless it has one month additional training prior to deployment. Not less than 50% authorized crews, where required, are combat ready, but adequate crews, combat ready to man/launch ready equipment

C-4 (Not Combat Ready)

Less than criteria established for C-3.

1. Purpose. To promulgate instructions concerning the issue and employment of the subject rifles.

2. Background

a. Combat experience has indicated a requirement for the employment of sniper teams to deny the enemy movement throughout the area of operation.

b. Marine Corps emphasis on the marksmanship program has provided qualified personnel to implement the employment of sniper teams.

c. Specially conditioned rifles mounted with scopes will be made available to each infantry battalion.

3. General

a. Issue

(1) Sniper rifles will be issued on the basis of six per battalion. Two rifles will be held at the Regimental Armory and issued on an "as needed" basis.

(2) Twenty-four additional rifles will be held at FLSG in DA NANG.

(3) Weapons and Scopes Available. Listed below are the available types and models of rifles and scopes to be issued:

(a) Rifle, WINCHESTER, Model 70 W/scope, 8 power

(b) Rifle, WINCHESTER, Model 70 W/scope, 3-9 Variable mount

(c) Rifle, MID W/scope

b. Organization

(1) 1st Lt E. A. THOMAS, U. S. Marine Corps is designated as the Regimental Sniper Team Project Officer and will coordinate with unit commanders on training and employment of sniper teams in conjunction with Division's Sniper Training Team.

(2) Each infantry battalion will establish a sniper team composed of no more than eight highly qualified and motivated expert rifleman.

c. Training

(1) The Division will furnish a sniper training team upon request by this Headquarters. This training team will be available on a scheduled basis to train members of each battalion sniper team.

(2) While formal instruction will be accomplished, the paramount effort will be directed toward on-the-job training. In this respect the utmost effort must be made to place qualified, competent personnel, possessing the required patience of a sniper, in the training program.

d. Maintenance

(1) Under no circumstances will rifles be disassembled by the individual or by the unit.

(2) When maintenance is required, regardless of how minor, the weapons must be turned in to the Regimental Armory to be further sent to DA NANG.

(3) Cleaning will be limited to the bore, outside of the rifle, and the stock only.

(4) Scopes will not be disassembled. Interior cleaning and all maintenance will be accomplished by FLSG.

f. Ammunition

(1) Match ammunition will be stored by the Regimental Armorer.

(2) All requisitions for ammunition will be submitted to the Regimental Sniper Team Officer twenty-four hours prior to the date required.

(3) The Regimental Sniper Team Project Officer will forward approved requisitions to the Regimental Armorer and the battalion will be notified to pick up the required ammunition.

(4) Ammunition may be picked up at the Regimental Armory by the Battalion Sniper Team Leaders only.

4. Action

a. Unit Commanders

(1) Appoint a Battalion Sniper Team Project Officer.

(2) Upon receiving the required weapons and ammunition, and upon completion of unit training, employ the sniper teams commensurate with unit operations.

b. Regimental Sniper Team Project Officer

(1) Coordinate all sniper project activities within the Regiment.

(2) Approve all ammunition requests and maintain an accurate inventory.

(3) Insure inclusion in the Daily Sit Rep all information concerning employment and results of the sniper teams.

c. Battalion Sniper Team Project Officer

(1) Coordinate all sniper team project activities within the battalion.

(2) Approve ammunition requests and submit same to the Regimental Sniper Team Project Officer.

(3) Insure that sniper rifles are employed only by trained, capable sniper teams.

(4) Insure that accurate, timely and complete reports are forwarded to the Regimental Sniper Team Project Officer immediately upon completion of a mission. Negative reports are required.

d. Battalion Sniper Team Leaders

(1) Requisition ammunition for their teams and distribute same.

(2) Insure that sniper rifles are employed only by trained, capable sniper personnel.

(3) Upon returning from a mission forward report via the Battalion Sniper Team Project Officer to the Regimental Sniper Team Project Officer including:

(a) Number of rounds fired

(b) Number of rounds on hand

(c) Hits scored and assessment (include time and coordinates)

(d) Number of enemy killed and wounded

(e) Any difficulties encountered with weapons

(1) Store and safeguard all match ammunition in the Regimental Armory, and be responsible for same.

5. Safety. Instruction will be conducted to develop the ability to identify the enemy at long ranges (up to 1000 meters). Care must be exercised that innocent persons are not the victims of a sniper rifle.

6. Reports

a. The results of the employment of sniper teams will be reported on Unit Daily Situation Reports indicating the location, times, methods of employment, ammunition expended, and casualties inflicted.

b. Four months after the sniper teams have been placed in service units will be prepared to report on the following:

(1) Evaluation of weapons, scopes and ammunition to include significant maintenance problems

(2) Methods of employment

(3) Results of the program

(4) If warranted, a recommended table of organization and table of equipment

(3) Ensure all members of their command understand the purpose of the Association and are given ample opportunity to become members.

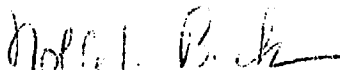

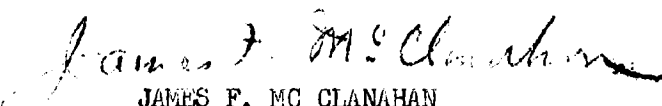
1. Purpose. To provide instructions concerning procedures to be followed in submitting reports required by references (a) and (b).

2. Background. Reference (a) defines reportable incidents and prescribes a format for reports. Reference (b) assigns Regimental Commanders the responsibility for submitting Backlash or serious incident reports.

3. Action. Battalion and separate Company Commanders submit Backlash or Serious Incident reports as defined in reference (a) as follows:

a. Initial reports immediately to this Headquarters (Attn: S-1) by phone or message.

b. Detailed reports in the format prescribed in reference (a) as soon as possible (no later than eight (8) hours after the incident becomes known).

(LAW); training concerning

1. Purpose. To promulgate instructions concerning the training with, and employment of, the subject weapon by units within the 4th Marine Regiment.

2. Information

a. Reference (a) cancelled the allowances of 3.5" Rocket Launchers for units of the 3d Marine Division (Rein), FMF, with the exception of Infantry Battalions. Former allowances will be filled by the 66mm HEAT (LAW).

b. The 66mm HEAT (LAW) replaces the allowances of Grenade, Rifle, HEAT M-28/M-31, throughout the 3d Marine Division (Rein), FMF.

c. The M-72 (LAW) does not eliminate the smoke, WP Rifle Grenade, streamers, signals, or various hand grenades launched from the rifle grenade launcher.

3. Training Requirements

a. Operating instructions are clearly printed on the side of each launcher and are considered adequate to permit its operation by any Marine in the field. Actual firing of the weapon is similar to the 3.5" Rocket Launcher.

b. Reference (c) states that the M-72 (LAW) is suitable for combat and authorizes its use; additionally, that initial training will be accomplished by using the 3.5" Rocket Launcher.

c. As M-72 (LAW) rockets are fired under combat conditions, the expended M-72 Launcher Tubes will be retained by the deploying units for use as training devices.

4. Action

a. Infantry Battalions, and task organized units authorized allowances of M-72s (LAW) utilizing reference (a) as a guide will conduct a minimum of four hours of classroom instruction to include the following:

- (1) Launcher controls and sighting equipment
- (2) Ammunition
- (3) Maintenance, inspections, and destruction
- (4) Marksmanship
- (5) Technique of fire
- (6) Tactical employment

b. A minimum of one hour practical application will be conducted for all personnel utilizing the 3.5" Rocket Launcher and/or expended M-72 (LAW) Launcher Tubes.

c. Upon initial usage of the M-72 (LAW) in combat, expended launchers will be retained until sufficient tubes are available to adequately meet training requirements.

d. Expended launcher tubes in excess to the units training requirements will be turned in to the salvage unit of FISU #1. Should a case arise which precludes the return of the expended launcher due to the tactical situation, units will completely destroy the expended weapon to preclude subsequent use by the enemy.

e. At the present time no actual M-72 (LAW) firing is authorized for training purposes.

5. Reports. Training accomplished under the provisions of this Bulletin will be reported in the situation report weekly. On the Sunday situation report to include the following:

- a. Number of hours training conducted during the past week.
- b. Number of personnel trained
- c. Percentage of training completed

Subj: Conservation of Electricity within the Regimental CP

1. Purpose. To promulgate procedures for the conservation and control of electricity within the Regimental CP.
2. Background. The increased use of electricity in the Regimental CP has placed an overload on the generator. Spare parts for and maintenance of the generator have become major problems. In order to get the maximum use and provide for essential needs of electric current a strict program of conservation is mandatory.
3. Action
 - a. All personnel living in the Regimental CP will:
 - (1) Turn off all fans at 1800 daily.
 - (2) Keep all electricity usage to a minimum during the hours of 1830 - 2200 daily.
 - (3) Register all electrical appliances in use with the Regimental Communications Officer.
 - b. The Regimental Communications Officer will:
 - (1) Approve the use of all appliances (except electric razors).
 - (2) Supervise the installation of all wiring.
 - c. The Headquarters Commandant will:
 - (1) Supervise the conservation of all electricity.
 - (2) Assist the Regimental Communications Officer as required.
 - d. Hot plates and coffee makers are not authorized for use in the Regimental CP.
 - e. All sections/units desiring electrical wiring will request same from the Regimental Communications Officer. No person residing in the Regimental CP is authorized to install any electrical wiring without the Regimental Communications Officer's approval.

Subj: Preparations for Severe Weather

Ref: (a) CG III MAF 100654Z Nov65
(b) ADC 3dMarDiv 211135Z Nov65

1. Purpose. To prescribe precautionary measures to be taken in preparation for and during periods of severe weather.

2. Background

a. References (a) and (b) advise of the high probability that a tropical storm would affect the Eastern coastal areas of South Vietnam within the immediate future. This storm would be characterized by flooding of the coastal lowlands; rainfall of 10 to 20 inches in a twenty-four hour period; and wind speeds in excess of 75 knots. In addition there is always the danger of flooding during the monsoon season.

b. The location of portions of this command is vulnerable to flooding and wind damage and requires that detailed preparations and plans be made in order to prevent loss of life, minimize loss of supplies, equipment and facilities, and enable units to continue to perform their mission.

3. Notification of Impending Storm or Severe Weather.

a. FROST CALL procedures utilizing land line communications will be the primary means of disseminating storm or severe weather warnings. Initial warning will include all available information on severity of storm and anticipated arrival time.

b. Existing radio nets will be utilized as secondary means of communications only when land line facilities are not available or their use impractical.

c. Unit commanders are responsible for notification of subordinate units and maintaining communications during periods of storm or severe weather.

d. It is anticipated that a minimum of two hours, and an expected 48 hours, warning will be provided for any storm threat.

4. Action. The following are considered to be the minimum precautionary measures to be taken in order to protect personnel and minimize loss and damage to material.

a. Advance Preparations

(1) Evaluate the location of personnel, equipment and supplies and relocate, or be prepared to relocate, from low-lying areas to a higher position which affords protection from flooding, and wind, insofar as possible.

(2) Construct drainage ditches where necessary.

(3) Provide sanitation facilities away from lowlands and be prepared to fill in heads which are subject to flooding.

(4) Provide maximum protection for all personnel.

(5) Maintain prescribed levels of supply on hand.

(6) Be prepared to lash down all tents and secure all loose objects which are potential missile hazards.

(7) Ensure that material is protected insofar as possible.

(8) Make provisions for backup electric power.

(9) Maintain maximum amount of water on hand.

b. Action Upon Receipt of Storm or Severe Weather Warning.

(1) Disseminate warning.

(2) Secure all non-essential activities and make final preparations to safeguard equipment, material, and personnel from storm or severe weather.

(3) Ensure that prescribed levels of supply are on hand.

(4) Ensure that all water containers are filled.

(5) Be prepared to strike tents, if necessary.

5. Emergency Assistance

a. All units will make maximum use of organic resources prior to requesting assistance from external sources.

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b. All requests for assistance will be made to this Headquarters (S-4).

c. Requests for assistance from local civil authorities will be forwarded to the ADC, 3d Marine Division, via this Headquarters, for coordination.

6. Coordination

a. The Regimental S-4 is responsible for the coordination of efforts and activities in connection with storms or severe weather.

b. Co. A, 1st AmTracBn.

(1) Be prepared to provide emergency assistance as directed by this Headquarters.

(2) Upon receipt of storm/severe weather warning, advise this Headquarters (S-4) of availability of LVTs.

c. Co. B, 3d EngrBn.

(1) Be prepared to provide emergency engineer assistance as directed by this Headquarters.

(2) Upon receipt of storm/severe weather warning, advise this Headquarters (S-4) of availability of engineer equipment.

7. Reports

a. Hazardous or impassable road conditions will be reported to this Headquarters (S-4) immediately.

b. Significant damage to supplies, equipment, and facilities and injuries to personnel will be reported as occurring.
