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PART II
NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the reporting period Headquarters 4th Marines continued Operation FREMONT (see TAB (G)), terminated Operation CUMBERLAND and participated in Operation LIBERTY. While detailed after-action reports have been or will be submitted on each operation, the highlights of September's activities are as follows:

- 1 September 1967 Assumed OPCON BLT 2/3 for Operation FREMONT.
- 3 September 1967 Lt Gen V.H. KRULAK, CG FMF PAC; Lt Gen R.E. CUSHMAN, CG III MAF; and Maj Gen B.A. HOCHMUTH, CG 3d Mar Div, visited Operation CUMBERLAND area from 0945 to 1025 and Camp EVANS from 1035 to 1120. Assumed OPCON BLT 1/3 for Operation FREMONT.
- 4 September 1967 Chopped BLT 2/3 OPCON to CTG 79.5.
- 9 September 1967 1st FAG departed CUMBERLAND Area. Chopped BLT 1/3 OPCON to CTG 79.4.
- 12 September 1967 Chopped 2d Bn, 4th Mar OPCON to 9th Mar and assumed OPCON 3d Bn, 26th Mar. Maj Gen J.G. BOUKER, CG FMF PAC (FWD), and Maj Gen B.A. HOCHMUTH, CG 3d Mar Div, visited Camp EVANS from 1110 to 1140.
- 14 September 1967 BGen L. METZGER, ADC 3d Mar Div, visited Camp EVANS from 0905 to 0945. 1st Bn, 4th Mar provided one reinforced rifle company for security force QUANG TRI Air Facility construction.
- 15 September 1967 Terminated Operation CUMBERLAND. 1st Bn, 4th Marines moved from CUMBERLAND Operating Area to Camp EVANS.
- 17 September 1967 Chopped L/3/26 OPCON to 2d Bn, 26th Mar for security of NAM FOA rock crusher/bridge complex. See TAB (F).
- 20 September 1967 QUANG TRI Air Facility security increased to BRAVO Command Group 1st Bn, 4th Mar and two rifle companies.
- 23 September 1967 BGen J.E. HERBOLD, Jr, CG FLC, visited Camp EVANS from 1450 to 1510.
- 26 September 1967 Det, 1st Plat, Co B, 1st Amphib Bn (4 LVTP 5) arrived at Camp EVANS.
- 27 September 1967 BGen L. METZGER, ADC 3d Mar Div, visited Camp EVANS from 1150 to 1159.

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PART III
SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

A. COMBAT MISSIONS ASSIGNED.

1. In accordance with 3d Marine Division Operation Order 41-67 the combat missions assigned the 4th Marines for Operation FREMONT were as follows:
 - a. To conduct search and destroy operations in the PHONG DIEM district.
 - b. Conduct patrol and ambush operations to interdict enemy lines of communications.
 - c. Conduct extensive psychological operations.
 - d. Maintain direct liaison with the PHONG DIEM District Chief and 1st Infantry Division (ARVN) forces in adjacent areas.
 - e. Provide support as requested to 1st Infantry Division (ARVN) conducting unilateral or combined operations in PHONG DIEM District within capabilities.
2. For Operation CUMBERLAND the mission assigned the 4th Marines was:
 - a. Provide security for the NAM HOA bridge/ferry site, MCB-3 rock crusher, engineering upgrading of Route 547 and development of the fire support base.
 - b. On order, be prepared to provide security for engineer construction effort on the extension of Route 547 west from the fire support base to Route 548 in the ASHAU Valley.
3. 3d Marine Division Order 03300.4 requires that tactical unit commanders provide for the security and defense of installations and vital areas in their respective operating areas. The Commanding Officer, 4th Marines as Base Coordinator, Camp EVANS is, therefore, responsible for the security and defense of Camp EVANS, to include the personnel, equipment and installations located therein.

B. SIGNIFICANT OPERATIONS CONDUCTED.

1. Operation FREMONT continued as the 4th Marines' major effort in its operating area. Battalions assigned OPCON to Headquarters, 4th Marines during the month were:

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2d Battalion, 4th Marines
 Battalion Landing Team 1/3
 Battalion Landing Team 2/3
 1st Battalion, 4th Marines
 3d Battalion, 26th Marines

Taking advantage of intelligence on enemy movements and base areas, single and multi-battalion search and destroy operations were conducted in conjunction with the continuing security missions for various construction projects along National Route One. Foot and vehicular movement became more difficult as the monsoon rains made their presence felt with increasing frequency and effect towards the end of September.

2. Operation CUMBERLAND was terminated on 15 September 1967. The base camps utilized by units in the CUMBERLAND operating area were destroyed by infantry working parties and engineer demolition teams. Persistent CS-1 gas in powdered form was buried in bunkers and fighting holes. The 1st Battalion, 4th Marines, the major infantry unit supporting Operation CUMBERLAND moved from the CUMBERLAND OA to Camp EVANS. One reinforced rifle company was chopped OPCON to 2d Bn, 26th Marines to provide security for a 200 ton per hour rock crusher operated by MCB-3 and a pontoon bridge near the village of NAM HOA.

3. Mechanical failures experienced with the CH-46A helicopter grounded approximately half the troop lifting helicopters of the 1st Marine Air Wing. This loss plus the increasing difficulty with weather and terrain provided problems with both individual and unit mobility.

E. NEW TECHNIQUES EMPLOYED. Artillery flushing fires to protect convoys.

1. During Operation CUMBERLAND direct support artillery was utilized to protect thirty and forty truck convoys from enemy small arms and anti tank (RPG) rocket fires. Known danger areas were first covered with pre-planned fires prior to the convoy's departure. Then, as the convoy proceeded, fires (spaced approximately 100 meters apart and fired in series of five rounds) were kept 1000 meters ahead of the convoy. These

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flushing fires, controlled by an artillery forward observer accompanying the convoy, were capable of clearing a sheath 75 meters on either side of the road or a total of 150 meters on one side, if desired. Attacks on the convoy diminished upon initiation of this procedure.

F. COMMAND RELATIONS.

1. As Commanding Officer 4th Marines, the Regimental Commander exercised command over those units assigned OPCON to and in support of the Regiment through normal channels. When the 4th Marines was assigned OPCON of Special Landing Force battalion teams, preliminary command and staff visits were exchanged between the 4th Marines headquarters and the SLF afloat.

2. Assigned as Base Coordinator for Camp EVANS and the general area along Route 1 north of the SONG BO River and south of HAI IANG, the Regimental Commander was responsible for establishing administrative and regulatory procedures for the establishment and control of normal base activities.

3. In matters concerning coordination with local civilian and military officials, the Regimental Commander maintained constant communications and liaison with 1st Infantry Division (ARVN) units, district chiefs from adjacent districts and their U.S. advisors.

4. Contact with Division headquarters and adjacent regimental command echelons, was maintained through normal command/control communication channels and command/staff visits.

G. EQUIPMENT

"Otters" were requested to assist in fulfilling resupply requirements during the monsoons; however, a shortage of qualified equipment operators has delayed these marginal terrain vehicles. Four LVTP-5's arrived on 26 September to assist until the otters can be made available.

2. A Tactical Air Fuel Dispensing System (TAFDS/AVGAS) was installed near the helicopter resupply landing zone on 7 September and another (JP-4) on 26 September. This landing zone (designated LEMON LZ) was equipped with lights constructed by Shore Party personnel to provide terminal approach guidance to helicopters during periods of reduced visibility and darkness.

H. LOGISTICS1. Supply

a. The primary source of supply remains FLSO-1 located 42 kilometers to the south in PHU BAI. DONG HA has been established as the

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supply point for 4th Marines elements providing security for the airstrip at QUANG TRI. During September a shortage of BA-30 and BA-386 dry-cell batteries occurred but did not become critical.

b. Monsoon requirements for special equipment have been ordered in accordance with CG, 3d Mar Div ltr 4/EEC/cis O4A24667 dtd 2 September 1967. Limited quantities of Long Range Patrol Rations were received. These items are being used by units going to the field for extended periods that could not be resupplied due to inclement weather or the tactical situation. The 3d Battalion, 26th Marines received 1,028 rainsuits; however, no further distribution of monsoon requirements has been made thus far.

2. Resupply

a. Helicopter resupply for the month of September was routine and utilized primarily in support of Operation FREMONT. Three emergency resupplies were required due to the weather and non-availability of CH-46A helicopters. In addition, the lack of CH-46A's has required the use of CH-53's for resupply on HILL 674,

b. See TAB (A) for helicopter resupply weights.

3. Transportation

a. 3d Motor Transport Battalion provided truck support, including one platoon in general support and trucks "as required" for supply convoys from PHU BAI. 3/12 also provided transportation upon request.

b. On 12 September two companies and a command group of 2d Battalion 4th Marines departed to DONG HA and 3d Battalion, 26th Marines arrived at Camp EVANS. On 14 September B/1/4 and W/1/13 were transported to QUANG TRI. Movement of 2d Battalion, 4th Marines rear was commenced on 15 September. On 16 September 3d Battalion, 26th Marines rear was moved from PHU BAI and L/3/26 relieved A/1/4 at the NAM HOA rock crusher/bridge site. A DONG HA convoy, including seven of the 4th Marines vehicles, remained in DONG HA the 18th and 19th of September due to a washed-out bridge south of DONG HA. A/1/4 and the BRAVO Command Group 1st Battalion, 4th Marines were transported to DONG HA utilizing 9th Motors' vehicles on 20 September. On 24 September a truck convoy moved C/1/4 and an artillery battery from 3d Battalion, 12th Marines to a forward artillery position north of Camp EVANS. On 27 September the trucks returned the battery and company from the Forward Artillery Position to Camp EVANS.

c. Due to traffic restrictions during the Vietnamese national elections and bridge problems between QUANG TRI and DONG HA, supply convoys to Camp EVANS were halted for approximately seven days. No significant hardships were encountered.

d. Approximately 5,000,000 lbs of supplies were transported from

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PHU RAI to Camp EVANS during September. The 2d Platoon, Co B, 3d Motor Transport Battalion in general support at Camp EVANS transported 1062 tons, 4349 passengers, for a total of 6099 miles. 3d Battalion 12th Marines transported 4349 tons, 650 passengers, for a total of 7000 miles.

4. Services

a. 3d Engineer Battalion elements continued to maintain the Camp EVANS water point producing a total of 70,000 gallons of potable water during September. Engineers continued to improve roads for the monsoon season; a total of 1,560 tons of fill was distributed during the month. The engineers were responsible for conducting mine detection sweeps over approximately 14,000 meters of road daily. 85 explosive devices were detected and destroyed during September. Bunker evaluation and construction was commenced by the engineers in preparation for winter monsoon. On 27 September the 3d Bridge Company constructed a ferry crossing of the SONG BO river at AN LO. 3d Engineers also constructed classes III and V supply dumps with protective berms in a new area which extended the perimeter out 300 meters across a 650 meter front.

c. A teletype and switchboard contact team was provided by FMFPAC.

d. A 40-man construction crew from MCE-1 worked on the Camp EVANS contourment to build a job order consisting of 201 strong back tents, 24 tropical huts, one 500-man messhall. The estimated completion date for the entire project is 10 November.

2. Narrative Summary. The Regimental Civil Affairs Section (S-5) turned over 125 bags of cement to QUANG DIEN District to be used for general purposes throughout the district under supervision of the District Chief and U.S. advisors. Five bags of cement were also taken to AP TAN NGUYEN to complete repairs on a school. Distribution is as shown:

a. AP DINH CU-Four school kits, one case of cooking oil, nine masonry kits, ten carpentry kits, four cases of powdered milk, and one bag of corn. One box of doll clothes was presented to the children.

b. AP TAN NGUYEN-Delivered six school kits, two boxes of doll clothes, two cases of cooking oil, four cases of powdered milk, two bags of bulgar wheat, 10 carpentry kits, and 10 masonry kits to be distributed throughout the hamlet for general use.

c. AP KHANH MY-Eighteen masonry kits, 20 carpentry kits, two cases of cooking oil, eight cases of powdered milk, two bags of corn, and two bags of bulgar wheat.

d. PHONG DIEN District Headquarters-65 bags of rice and two cases of cooking oil were turned over to the District Chief. On 18 September 200 bags of cookies were distributed to youngsters throughout the district in recognition of VIET NAM'S Children's Day.

3. COUNTY FAIR. The major civic action/psychological operations effort conducted during the reporting period was COUNTY FAIR 4-3 held in the hamlet of AP UU THUONG (YD 505365) on 28-30 September. Major elements of RVN and US Forces involved were:

The object of the COUNTY FAIR was to obtain the support of the VIETNAMESE people for the government of South VIETNAM and Free-World Military Forces, to destroy or weaken the VC infrastructure, and to appeal to the VC to rally to the government through his family. Commencing at 0455H on 28 September when Company D, 1st Battalion, 4th Marines cordoned the hamlet of AP UU THUONG the COUNTY FAIR progressed on schedule with excellent results.

The Cultural Drama Team performed skits, entertained and helped control the villagers.

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Taped Vietnamese music was played.

c. Overall, the COUNTY FAIR seemed well-received by the villagers who enjoyed a three-day break from their pastoral routine. The one VC captured was attempting to break through the Delta Company cordon with a sketch-map of the Marine positions. The effect on the VC infrastructure could not be immediately determined upon the conclusion of the COUNTY FAIR; however, much valuable data and information was obtained by district officials. The experience gained by both Vietnamese and American participants was encouraging and similar operations will be planned in the near future.

J. ADMINISTRATION. Functioning in accordance with Division Order 5450.1.

1. All administrative personnel received on-the-job training in the field during Operation FREMONT consisting of all phases of administration under combat conditions.

2. During the period of this report 50% of the personnel in the S-1/Adjutant Section were members of the Regimental Headquarters Company reaction platoon. 50% participated actively in the defense of Camp EVANS by supplementing the base security and perimeter defense. Inspections of personnel and equipment were held by the section head to ensure that personnel and equipment were in a high state of readiness.

3. Staff Studies and estimates: Staff study accomplished on the Evaluation of Recent Graduates of The Basic School (forwarded to CG 3d Mar Div; insufficient number of copies to append).

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4. Morale, PX, Postal Affairs, Liberty, and R&R:

a. Morale: Morale is improving as the Camp EVANS' construction program provides better living quarters, mess and recreational facilities.

b. PX: A new post exchange building is currently being built which will enable the exchange to carry a larger assortment of stock and provide better retail facilities. The well stocked PX continues to be a major contributing factor to high morale.

c. Postal: Sub Unit #7 of the Third Division Post Office handles all mail for the Camp EVANS complex, as well as providing money orders and parcel post service. This unit also will soon enjoy the convenience and comfort of a newly constructed post office:

d. Liberty: Not applicable

e. R&R: Quotas for the month were adequate and sufficient for one of each 13 Marines on the rolls. R&R continues to contribute to high morale.

5. Chaplain counselling and religious services were conducted in the field and at Camp EVANS for those of the Catholic and Protestant faiths.

L. INTELLIGENCE

1. There were no significant changes in the enemy order of battle during this reporting period. Several agent reports alluded to units of the 5th NVA Regiment being present along with the 6th NVA Regiment in Base Area 114. These reports have not been confirmed.

2. There was a marked increase in the enemy's mining activities during the month of September. The enemy employed a wide variety of ordnance in this role. The largest single incident consisted of 50-120mm mortar rounds linked together with detonating cord and subject to command detonation. There were forty-five mining incidents during September as compared with thirty in August.

3. There were no large scale enemy actions during September. The enemy pattern of activity consisted of sniping, brief meeting engagements, and the use of surprise explosive devices. HILL 674 received several rounds of mortar fire on two occasions.

M. COMMUNICATIONS.

Normal communications were maintained between this and senior, adjacent and subordinate headquarters. A voice radio relay station was operated from HILL 674 with effective coverage throughout the area. A KY-8 covered voice radio shot was established between 1st Battalion, 4th Marines

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(FWD) at the Air Facility construction site, QUANG TRI and Headquarters 4th Marines at Camp EVANS. The command's communications network received 1526 messages and delivered 495 messages.

1. AN/TPS-21 radar-operator training was conducted for Marines from Headquarters Company, 1st and 2d Battalions Fourth Marines, and 3d Battalion 26th Marines.

2. Lack of supply and maintenance support still imposes a severe handicap on the communication capabilities of this headquarters as maintenance support is hindered by a critical shortage of repair parts.
