NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the reporting period Headquarters 4th Marines completed Operation FREMONT, participated in Operation LIBERTY II and commenced Operation GRANITE. While detailed after-action reports have been or will be submitted on each operation, the highlights of October's activities are as follows:

1 October 1967	Lt Gen J. M. MASTERS, CMCS, visited Camp EVANS from 1045H to 1100H.
10 October 1967	Chopped Bravo Command Group and two companies of 1st Battalion 4th Marines to 1st Marines for security for construction of QUANG-TRI Air Facility (YD 3155).
11 October 1967	Operation LIBERTY II commenced.
14 October 1967	Major Generals R. L. MURRAY and H. NICKERSON visited Camp EVANS from 1530H to 1605H.
19 October 1967	Resumed OPCON Bravo Command Group and two companies of 1st Battalion 4th Marines.
19 October 1967	Assumed OPCON BLT 1/3 for Operations LIBERTY II and GRANITE.
23 October 1967	Operation LIBERTY II terminated.
25 October 1967	Operation GRANITE commenced at 1600H.
26 October 1967	Assumed OPCON 2d Battalion (-) 1st Marines (Command Group and two companies) for Operation GRANITE.
30 October 1967	Chopped OPCON 2d Battalion (-) 1st Marines to 1st Marines.
31 October 1967	Operation FREMONT terminated.

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTSA. COMBAT MISSIONS ASSIGNED

1. In accordance with 3d Marine Division Operation Order 41-67, the combat missions assigned the 4th Marines for Operation FREMONT were as follows:

a. To conduct search and destroy operations in PHONG-DIEN District.

b. Conduct patrol and ambush operations to interdict enemy lines of communication.

c. Conduct extensive psychological operations.

d. Maintain direct liaison with the PHONG-DIEN District Chief and 1st Infantry Division (ARVN) forces in adjacent areas.

e. Provide support as requested to 1st Infantry Division (ARVN) forces conducting unilateral or combined operations in PHONG-DIEN District within capabilities.

2. For Operation LIBERTY II the mission assigned the 4th Marines was:

a. Conduct combat patrols/ambushes in area west of National Route One in PHONG-DIEN District in support of Governmental elections.

3. For Operation GRANITE the mission assigned the 4th Marines was:

a. Conduct combat operations in VC/NVA Base Area 114.

b. Capture and destroy logistics caches, installations and equipment.

c. Obtain intelligence, and to kill or capture enemy encountered

4. 3d Marine Division Order 03300.4 requires that tactical unit commanders provide for the security and defense of installations and vital areas in their respective operating areas. The Commanding Officer, 4th Marines as Base Coordinator, Camp EVANS is, therefore, responsible for the security and defense of Camp EVANS, to include the personnel, equipment, and installations located therein. From 1-10 Oct the 4th Marines had the mission of providing security for the construction of QUANG-TRI Air Facility (YD 3155).

B. SIGNIFICANT OPERATIONS CONDUCTED

1. Operation FREMONT continued as the 4th Marines major effort in its operating area. Extensive small unit patrolling and ambushes were a daily event in order to interdict and destroy VC/NVA forces. Search and destroy operations were conducted throughout the month in the FREMONT OA. Various construction projects along National Route One were continued with the 4th Marines providing security. Daily patrols and night ambushes were continued to provide close-in security to Camp EVANS.

2. Operation LIBERTY II was conducted from 11 to 23 October. The 4th Marines forces were utilized to interdict VC/NVA forces west of National Route One in order to assist in providing security for the national elections on 22 October.

3. Operation GRANITE which commenced on the 25th of October was a major search and destroy operation into VC/NVA Base Area 114. Two battalions conducted the mission in conjunction with a 1st Infantry Division (ARVN) Task Force.

4. County Fair 4-4 was conducted by 3d Battalion 26th Marines from the 28th to the 31st of October in AP PHO NINH and AP HIEN SI hamlets. The 4th Marines supported the County Fair with civil affairs support and psychological warfare media. County Fair 4-4 was highly successful and resulted in 47 detainees.

F. COMMAND RELATIONS

1. As Commanding Officer 4th Marines, the Regimental Commander exercised command over those units assigned OPCON to and in support of the

Regiment through normal channels. When the 4th Marines was assigned OPCON BLT 1/3 from Special Landing Force-A, preliminary command and staff visits were exchanged between the 4th Marines and Special Landing Force-A staff.

2. Assigned as Base Coordinator for Camp EVANS and the general area along Route One north of the SONG-BO River and south of HAI-LANG, the Regimental Commander was responsible for establishing administrative and regulatory procedures for the establishment and control of normal base activities within Camp EVANS.

3. In matters concerning coordination with local civilian and military officials, the Regimental Commander maintained constant communications and liaison with 1st Infantry Division (ARVN) units, district chiefs from adjacent districts and their U. S. advisors.

4. Contact with Division Headquarters and adjacent regimental command echelons was maintained through normal command/control communication channels and command/staff visits.

G. EQUIPMENT

1. Six otters arrived on 7 October to assist in fulfilling resupply requirements during the winter monsoon season.

2. A ferry was installed at AN LO (YD 6230) on the SONG BO River on 1 October to carry heavy lifts across the river.

H. LOGISTICS

1. Supply

a. Primary source of supply remains FLSC-A, PHU BAI. Shortages for the period included BA-30's, 105mm HE, 155mm HE, and fuzes.

b. Distribution of winter monsoon requirements was not completed although some equipment was distributed.

2. Resupply

a. Helicopter resupply for the month of October was routine and primarily utilized in support of Operation FREMONT.

b. See Tab A for helicopter resupply weights.

3. Transportation

a. 3d Motor Transport Battalion provided truck support, including

one platoon in general support and trucks "as required" for supply from PHU BAI. In addition, one platoon attached to BLT 1/3 was used in direct support commencing 19 October. 3d Battalion 12th Marines also provided transportation upon request.

b. 4 October - Transported 1st Battalion 4th Marines mess equipment to QUANG TRI.

14 October - Three amphibious tractors were utilized in support of tactical move.

17 October - 9th Motor Transport Battalion provided transportation to move 2d Battalion 4th Marines messhall equipment to DONG-HA.

18 October - Two others reconnoitered route to Hill 51.

19 October - BLT 1/3 arrived 4th Marines OA. 9th Motor Transport Battalion transported 1st Battalion 4th Marines from QUANG-TRI to Camp EVANS.

25 October - Transported Btry "W" 1st Battalion 13th Marines from QUANG-TRI to Camp EVANS.

30 October - Transported 2d Battalion (-) 1st Marines to IA-VANG and QUANG-TRI.

c. Due to traffic restrictions during the Vietnamese elections, supply convoys to Camp EVANS were halted for four days. No significant hardships were encountered.

d. Approximately 3,000,000 lbs of supplies were transported from PHU-BAI to Camp EVANS during October. The 2d Platoon Co "A" 3d Motor Transport Battalion in general support at Camp EVANS transported 3,054 tons, 7,437 passengers, for a total of 6,715 miles. The 2d Platoon Co "B" 3d Motor Transport Battalion in direct support transported 42 tons, 1,793 passengers, for a distance of 3,740 miles. The 3d Battalion 12th Marines transported 5,244 troops and 226 tons a distance of 7,500 miles.

4. Services

a. 3d Engineer Battalion continued to maintain the Regimental water point which produced a total of 600,000 gallons of potable water during October. Engineers progressed in the program of preparing roads for the winter monsoon season; a total of 2,350 tons of fill was distributed during the month. The engineers were responsible for conducting mine detection sweeps over approximately 14,800 meters of road daily. Approximately 96 explosive devices were detected and destroyed during

October. Bunker construction is being continued in preparation for the winter monsoon season.

- b. Contact teams have been provided by FLSG-A as follows:

c. Forty men detached from MCB-1 have completed the 1st Camp EVANS cantonment package. The job order included 201 strongbacks, 24 tropical huts, 1 - 500 man galley, 4 showers, 17 burn-type latrines and 2 bunkers.

d. Provided staging area, billeting, and messing for "Rough Rider" convoys on 6, 10, 15, and 18 October.

b. Narrative summary. Four garden tool kits and four volleyball sets were taken to PHONG-NGUYEN village and distributed throughout the hamlets. County Fair 4-4 was held at AP PHO NINH and AP HIEN SI hamlets

and the various items were distributed at that time.

2. Psychological warfare. For the month of October Psyops supported MedCaps, County Fair 4-4 and Operation GRANITE. Utilizing the various media available in psychological warfare, a large audience of civilians were contacted. NVA and VC no doubt were capable of monitoring these broadcasts.

a. HB Team #4 from the 244th Psyops Company (USA) broadcasted 25 hours for MedCaps in the PHONG DIEN District. HB Team #4 also broadcasted 11 hours in support of Operation GRANITE from Hill 674 vic (YD 516219). Their broadcast themes were the CHIEU HOI program.

b. In support of the County Fair 4-4 held by 3d Battalion 26th Marines a cultural drama, Armed Propaganda and Audio Visual teams were employed. Leaflets and broadcasts were used with the CHIEU HOI program as the theme.

J. ADMINISTRATION: Functioning in accordance with Division Order 5450.1.

1. All administrative personnel received on-the-job training in the field during Operation FREMONT, LIBERTY II, and GRANITE. This training consisted of all phases of administration under combat conditions.

2. During the period of this report 50% of the personnel in the S-1/Adjutant Section were members of the Headquarters Company reaction platoon participating actively in the defense of Camp EVANS by supplementing the base security and perimeter defense. Inspection of personnel and equipment was held by the section head to ensure that personnel and equipment were in a high state of readiness.

a. Morale: Morale is considered excellent.

b. PX: Numerous Post Exchange items are currently stocked in our PX located at Camp EVANS by the PX Officer from PHU BAI. This has been a definite asset to the Marines in the field and a tremendous morale booster for all hands. A new Post Exchange building has been completed and is currently being painted and shelves are being procured.

c. Postal: Unit #7 of the 3d Marine Division Post Office is functioning in a new building which facilitates a more efficient operation.

d. Liberty: None

e. R&R: Quotas for the month were adequate and sufficient for one of each 13 Marines on the rolls. R&R continues to contribute to high morale.

5. Chaplain Support and Religious Services: Worship services were conducted in the field for those of the Catholic and Protestant faiths.

L. INTELLIGENCE

1. There were no significant changes in the enemy order of battle during this reporting period. Substantiation, through documents taken from enemy dead, was obtained which corroborates the presence of the C-4 Company, 800th Battalion and C-15 Company TRI THIEN Regional Headquarters within Base Area-114.

2. An increase in usually reliable source reports positioning enemy command elements within VC/NVA Base Area-114 was noted during the period of October 25 to October 31. This time frame coincides with the initiation of Operation GRANITE.

3. There was a slight decrease in the enemy's mining activities during the month of October which coincided with a waning moon. The enemy employed a wide variety of ordnance in this role. There were thirty seven mining incidents during October as compared with forty five in September. The portion of National Route One lying between PHO-TRACH hamlet and the bridge at (YD 475376) remains the sector of highest mine incident frequency.

4. Perimeter sightings and small contacts along the Camp EVANS perimeter increased during October. These instances of enemy presence were entirely during hours of darkness.

5. The period 17-25 October was notable for an increased incident of enemy sightings in the CO BI THANH TAN Valley adjacent to the SONG BO River.

M. TRAINING October saw the inauguration of a Regimental Noncommissioned Officers' Leadership School. Conducted under the supervision of the Regimental Sergeant Major (Sergeant Major J. C. KULL), the three day course was initiated on 10 October 1967 with 20 Corporals in attendance. TAB G contains details concerning the purpose and curriculum of the school. Classes are taught by experienced officers and noncommissioned officers with emphasis placed on subjects vital to small unit combat leadership to include a maximum amount of day and night practical application. Student response to the two courses of instructions conducted in October was most encouraging and it is intended to continue the school on a weekly basis.

N. COMMUNICATION

1. Normal communications were maintained between this, senior and subordinate headquarters.
2. A manual retransmission facility was established on Hill 674 on 26 October 1967 for all units operating in the area.
3. A KY-8 covered voice radio shot was established between BLT 1/3 at HAI LANG and the 4th Marines at Camp EVANS from 18 October to 22 October 1967.
4. The Command Communications Network received 1680 messages and transmitted 198 messages. There were no reported security violations.
5. Lack of supply and maintenance support still imposes a handicap on the communication capabilities of this headquarters. Maintenance support is hindered by a lack of parts. Critical items are:

2. Close Air Support. During this period 56 flights of fixed wing attack aircraft were received. Ordnance expended ranged from 20mm rounds to 2000 pound bombs. Reaction time of the fixed wing was excellent. Fixed wing arrived on station in as little as ten minutes from the time of request. Average response time (time of request until on station) was 23 minutes. Weather was favorable during this period, particularly the last two weeks. Aerial observers conducted fifty missions during this period and provided excellent support in adjusting artillery, directing air strikes and providing surveillance over the FREMONT OA for possible enemy targets.

4. General. During this period the Regiment received the majority of helicopter support from the 190th Assault Helicopter Co, U. S. Army. Support provided by this unit flying the UH-1D helicopters was outstanding. On 16 October 1967, two helicopters of the 190th lifted 25,279 pounds of resupply to outposts of this command. Regimental TACP logs indicate that lift was a record for two helicopters over a twelve hour period.

1. Purpose. To promulgate information and instructions concerning activation of a Regimental NCO School.

2. Background. In order to improve the effectiveness of the junior NCO as a small unit leader in combat and to take advantage of the experience and knowledge of SNCO's and officers gained in Vietnam, a Regimental NCO school will be activated.

3. NCO School. This school will be of three days duration with 25 hours of classroom instruction and practical application. (See enclosure (1)). Classes will be limited to 20 sergeants or 20 corporals. Quotas will be established by the Regimental S-3 and promulgated by message. It is anticipated that one class per week, Tuesday through Thursday, will be conducted. Newly arrived in-country NCOs and newly promoted corporals with eight months remaining of their tour will be given priority for assignment to the school.

4. Students. Students will report to the Regimental Chapel at 0730 on Tuesday of the week they are to attend school. The uniform will be the Uniform of the Day as defined in reference (a), with cartridge belts, two canteens, magazine pouches, first aid kit, foul weather clothing, and rifle. Each student will have a notebook and pencil/pen and a lensatic compass. Students will eat their noon meal in the Regimental Headquarters Company mess and will return to their parent unit for morning and evening meal and billeting.

5. Supervision and Logistic Support. The Regimental Sergeant Major is designated NCOIC under cognizance of the Regimental S-3. Logistic support will be furnished by the Regimental S-4. Instructors will be designated by the Regimental S-3.
