#### PART II

#### NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. (C) A comprehensive training program was conducted during the first half of 1975 to prepare our battalions to deploy with Amphibious Ready Group "ALPHA" or to assume an Air Contingency Battalion commitment. In addition, we concentrated on preparing our Regimental Staff to deploy as an RLT Headquarters or to augment other headquarters. As a result of this training we were able to meet each one of these requirements during this period with outstanding results. Those successes are detailed in the chronologies of "Eagle Pull", "Frequent Wind", "Amphibious Evacuation RVN Support Group", and "Mayaguez Recovery" and this report details the preparations that made our units and individual Marines ready. We continued to stress Human Relations Training, Essential Military Subjects Training, Physical Fitness, and Weapons Requalification. In addition, this Regiment was totally involved in the Predischarge Education Program and every non-high school graduate was afforded the opportunity to attend formal classes and to receive a diploma.
- 2. (C) The Fourth Marines Headquarters was activated as RLT-4 from 18 April to 12 May as a part of the 9th MAB. We also provided personnel to augment the 9th MAB staff, the 31st MAU staff, and 33rd MAU staff during various phases of operations afloat.
- 3. (C) The Fourth Marines provided Battalion Teams (BLTs) for operations throughout the period. BLT 2/4 was deployed from 1 January to 28 May with ARG ALPHA. BLT 1/4 was deployed from 29 March to 30 June with Amphibious Evacuation RVN Support Group, RLT-4, and ARG ALPHA.
- 4. (C) The Fourth Marines provided Air Contingency BLTs (ACBLT) during this period. BLT 3/4 was assigned as primary ACBLT for Operation "Eagle Pull" from 28 January to 12 April. BLT 3/4 was also assigned as ACBLT for Operation "Frequent Wind" from 19 April to 30 April. BLT 2/4 was assigned as primary ACBLT from 1 June to 30 June.
- 5. (C) 58 enlisted Marines of Headquarters Company augmented other headquarters in operations afloat and joined with Marines of 3/4 to form detachment "PAPA" of the Amphibious Evacuation RVN Support Group.
