



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

Section II

a. Summary. The Battalion spent the entire month operating from the Phu Bai enclave in defense of the vital area. Twice during the month the Battalion assumed the responsibility for the FSCC from Regiment. During the month the CAC process was increased by one additional village. Toward the end of the month, here was a Coonge of Command Ceremony for the Battalion Commanding Officer. Lieute and Colonel Jack WESTERMAN replaced Lieutenant Colonel R. E. SULLIVAN as Commanding Officer.

b. Significant Events.

- 5 June New Executive Officer, Major M. C. CAFFEN assumed duties.
- 8 June Battalion assumed the responsibility of FSCC for the entire enclave.
- 24 June The CAC Unit was enlarged by the addition of one more hamlet to the program.
- 25 June Battalion assumed operational control of Company Mr, 3rd Battalion, 4th Marines.
- 26 June Battalion had a Change of Command Ceremony in which Lieutenant Colonel Jack WESTERMAN replaced Lieutenant Colonel R. E. SULLIVAN as Commanding Officer.

c. Problem Areas/New Developments.

1. The present problem area which shows no promising relief at least not until after October is the critical shortage of officers. A total of nine officers rotated during June and were replaced by five new officers.

f. Morale, PX, Postal Affairs, Liberty, R&R.

Morale is excellent, the battalion's fighting spirit has remained high throughout the month. The entire period was spent in the relative comfort of the Phu Bai Combat Base; hot "A" and "B" rations meals were served, showers were available three times daily, the clubs maintained a good supply of liquid refreshment, and novies were available to all hands not on watch. PX facilities were available to all Marines in the enclave, and provided adequate "health and comfort" items. Mail service has improved and is quite regular; liberty was not authorized to the command during the period. R&R quotas have increased for the month, and at the present rate all members of the command should be able to take advantage of the opportunity.

g. Chaplain's Activities.

tst Battelion, 4th Marines was without a Chaplain for the first few days of the month. On 4 June 1966 Chaplain Stephen E. ALMASY was assigned; he undertook and continued Chaplain MOODY's fine program. The initial period of this assignment was taken up with establishment of office space and coordinating activities with Regiment for needs of the service. Each Sunday three to four services were conducted covering, besides 1st Battalion, 4th Marines, 3rd Battalion, 4th Marines, 8th RRU, and HMM 161. Each day services were conducted at Regimental Chapel, at 1700; also Memorial Services

at CAC villages. A visit was also made to a Vietnamese Orphanage, in which soap was distributed. Regular visitation made to the Medical Ward and assisted at A-Med. Counseling military personnel amounted to approximately seventy-five for the nonth of June. Extension of activities outside scope of 1st Battalion, 4th Marines is necessary for support with other units, as well as our dependence upon them for use of their Protestant Chaplain.

INTELLIGENCE

SECTION III

A. General. (Period covered: 1 June 66 - 30 June 66) The Battalian was actively engaged with Viet Cong elements throughout the reporting period with the majority of contacts being made during the period 7 Jun 66. to 22 Jun 66, by patrols and ambushes. Also several probing attempts were made by small VC elements along the Battalion's defensive perimeter. During the period 1-7 June contact was light and few in number. During this time the majority of the contacts made were initiated by VC in groups of 1-3 or by lone snipers expending only a few rounds per incident. Marine retaliation, usually involved illumination and the return of a heavy volume of fire to the enemy position and a physical search or sweep of the area. The period 7-22 June was characterized by a marked increase in VC activity resulting in an average of 5 incidents daily, most of which occurred during the hours of darkness. Throughout this period, the Battalion was credited with 2 VC KIA (Conf), 13 WIA (Prob), 11 VCS and 2 weapons captured. The majority of the action during this period involved the Combined Action Company (CAC) (Co. C, 1st Battalion, 4th Marines) while on patrol and/or ambush.

At 082345H, CAC-7A patrol ambushed 3, VC on a trail at YD820177 resulting one VC KIA (Conf), one weapon captured, and 2 VC WIA (Prob). At 112040H, CAC-7B patrol fired on 4 VC at YD826167 resulting in one VC KIA (Conf), one weapon captured, and the apprehension of one VCS. At 130142H, Co. A patrol fired on 3 VC at YD889123 resulting in one VC WIA (Prob).

At 151000H, Co. D with PF's attached conducted a company size operation in the hamlet of Loi Nong GS YD8319 along the Song Loi Nong River. Contact was extremely light with one incident of the attached PF's firing on 4 VC across the river. The operation ended with the location of freshly prepared positions in the southern end of the hamlet.

At 182340H, CAC-7B patrol apprehended one VCB at TD819183 near the scene of a small arms incident.

At 202255H, CAC-7A patrol ambushed five VC at YD830172 resulting in one VC WIA (Prob).

At 211030H, Co. B on a sweep apprehended one WCS at YD839163.

At 221615H, CAC-7A patrol engaged 10 VC at 10839195 resulting in two VC WIA (Prob).

At 221800H, PCAC-7A patrol engaged 45-40 at 194 with a heavy volume of S/A fire resulting in five VC WIA (Prob).

At 222235H, CAC-1 patrol apprehended four VCS at YD678117 as a result of acting upon a report from PF's of a VC meeting taking place.

The remainder of the reporting period produced a decrease in the number of enemy contacts. On 27 and 28 June 66, two VCS were apprehended. Also on 28 June 66, a request for an artillery mission was processed through the Battalion FSCC and fired, resulting in eleven VC KIA (Conf by ARVN)

and three weapons captured by the ARVN. On 30 June 66 at 2000H, a CAC-7 patrel fired on two separate VC resulting in two VC KIA (Conf), one automatic weapon captured and the apprehension of one VCS.

Summary of enemy units reported in the TACR and vicinity during the reporting period were: C-4:1 MF company at YD843042, C-1:16 LF company at YD850030, 120 MF company at YD790080 and the K-80 MF company at YD850095 on 1 June. An unknown battalion reported on 5 June; at YD800084, an unknown company at YD867135 on 7 June, an unknown company at YD850210 on 8 June, an unknown battalion at YD790108 and YD786118 on 9 June. The F-118 LF company (Possibly C-118 LF company) at YD835196 on 12 and 23 June, a battalion size unit at YD815075 on 14 June an unknown company at YD900100 on 15 June 66. On 17 June the C-117 Prov LF Company was reported at YD797244. This company is known to operate in Phu Vang District and is believed to have supported and possibly directed the local guerrilla activity encountered by the elements of this battalion. Of other significance was the capture of 2 K-58 magazines of a Grech automatic weapon recently introduced or discovered in the VN conflict.

C. Weather and Terrain

Terrain encountered during the reporting period consisted primarily of rice paddies, rolling terrain and populated areas. During this period many of the rice paddies were flooded limiting movement in these areas. However, overall movement by the troops and vehicles was unrestricted.

Weather for the period was generally bright and hot. Rain fell on eight occasions with the greatest amount of rain falling in the afternoon and evening.

Eight days with precipitation and nine days with thunderstorms. Maximum rainfall 13.1". Prevailing winds, East at 7 knots. Relative humidity 77%.

OPERATIONS/TRAINING

SECTION IV

MISSIC

- 1. During the month of June 1966, 1st Battalion, 4th Marines executed the following mission:
 - a. Defend the HUE-PHU BAI vital area.
- b. Conduct operations and extensive patrol and anbush activity in assigned sector of TAOR to deny enemy passage through or buildup in that area.
- c. Coordinate defensive efforts of all units within the vital area perineter.
- d. Be prepared to assume responsibility and command of the HUE-PHU BAI TAOR upon displacement of the 4th Marines Headquarters for operations outside the TAOR.
 - e. Maintain the Combined Action Company to provide security for assigned village/areas with the TACR.
 - f. Maintain the Sparrow Hawk.
 - g. Maintain Combat Outposts on Hills 180 (YD 855133) and 225 (YD 848087).
 - h. Conduct a vigorous Civil Affairs program within assigned sector of TACR and those areas assigned for operations.

CPERATIONS. During its stay to date at the HUE-PHU BAI Combat Base the battalion has been involved primarily in the manning of its portion of the vital area perimeter and two combat outposts. In conjuction with the manning of the lines numerous deviant and night-time patrols of fire team and squad size have been conducted. In addition, observation posts and listening posts have been employed. Besides these normal defensive type activities the battalion has been involved in other tactical matters.

At 011850H two tanks were assigned to CAC-7 for providing assistance to Lieutenant Colonel KHOA an officer loyal to the national government threatened by dissident elements. The tanks were dispatched and along with CAC-7 provided assistance to Colonel KHOA within the CAC-7 compound (YD 819178) with orders to fire only to protect U. S. property and lives. The tanks set in as a roadblock which initially was named day and night but eventually only at night. As the situation improved the units were secured from their assigned mission.

On 2 June command of the 3rd Platoon, Company K OpCon of Company D changed from Lt HOPGOOD to Sgt HENSARLING. The platoon continued in its mission of providing security for Battery M, 3/12 in Company D's perating area.

At 041345H H&S Company employed two snipers from regiment in their lines in the hope of countering any VC sniper activity, however there was no contact.

An action typical of those encountered in the defensive area occurred at 052145H when an estimated two VC fired twenty rounds of semi-automatic weapons fire and threw one grenade at the CP of CaC-7 (YD 819178). The Marines illuminated, returned fire, and diverted a patrol to sweep the area. As was often the case in this type contest, the sweep produced negative results.

On 6 June novement on Highway #1 outside the vital area was restricted to an extent by the placing of alters in the roadway by Buddhist elements. Resupply of CaC units was effected by use of helicopters, and operations continued as adjusted to the situation. This condition persisted until 18 June with varying degrees of restriction.

Effective at 071215H the battalion released Opcon of the 3rd Platoon, Company K, 3/4 who had been providing security for Battery M, 3/12 in the south-eastern portion of the TACR. Both units vacated the position and returned to their parent commands.

H&S Company occupying a portion of the vital area perimeter along with the rifle companies received its share of the nonth's contacts. In one instance at 080305H three VC walked into an F&S Company ambush site and received approximately fifteen rounds of semi-automatic weapons fire. No fire was returned, and one VC WIA probable was reported. On this same day at 2000H the battalion assumed regimental FSCC responsibility for the HUE-PHU BAI TACR during the absence of the regimental headquarters command group from the area on Operation FLORIDA.

An enery kill was obtained at 090145H when a patrol from CAC-7 spotted two VC noving along a brush line (YD 820176). The patrol opened fire expending approximately 100 rounds of 7.62m amunition and eight M-79's. During a sweep of the area at first light one VC body was recovered along with two magazines of amunition, one CHICOM prenade. One enti-personnel mine, and cleaning gear. At 1200H this day the helipad in the regimental headquarters area was closed. Helicopter open tions for the remainder of the month initiated from the HMM-161 area at the HUE-PHU BAI airfield. Action the night of 9 June and then again on 10 June centered along the Company B sector of the perimeter with several contacts being made and small arms rounds exchanged. In addition an Ontos was employed on the line and its main battery fired. Despite the fire power put forth no VC casualties were discovered during after-action sweeps.

Action shifted back again to CaC-7 when at 112025H its patrol sighted four VC in a bruch line (YD 826178) and fired on them. One VC was killed. The patrol recovered the body and one CHICOM automatic weapon. The next day at 121600H 4th Marines assumed responsibility for the HUE-PHU BAI TAOR FSCC, the regiment having returned from Operation FLORIDA.

On 13 June Company D provided a platoon for one of the commitments commonly assigned to the battalion, an alert platoon on standay during movement of the ROUCH RIDER resupply run from Da Nang to Phu Bai. Occasion did not arise for the platoon to be committed to action. That evening at 2055H a Company B patrol received four to five rounds of small arms fire and one fragmentation grenade. The patrol returned fire at the suspected enemy position (YD 896154) and threw one fragmentation grenade. One VC was observed running across the rice paddy. The next day at first light a sweep of the area revealed a blood trail leading into a village (YD 896157) and to a straw mat covered with blood, evidence of one VC WIA.

Company D noved out early on the norming of 15 June and conducted a company size operation in the hanlet of Loi Nong (YD 837197) on the northern boundary of the TAOR. Intelligence reports had indicated VC activity in that area. The company trucked to the area, debarked, and crossed a rice paddy to the hanlet where a slow and deliberate search was conducted. The company made no contact and returned to its CP area that same day.

Personnel of Company D were again involved when at 181057H Sparrow Hawk was alerted for drill purposes to test is responsiveness. Thirteen ninutes later the unit arrived at the HMM-161 helipad and upon being inspected was found to be well prepared for any appropriate mission.

From mid-month on the AN-TPS-21 radar was employed on the line in Company A's area. It proved helpful in tracking friendly patrols as they moved forward of the lines and on several occasions picked up sightings which were later lost.

On 191100H Sparrow Hawk was launched to assist a reconnaissence unit that had come under heavy fire. The Sparrow Hawk lifted off the HMM-161 help pad under OpCon of Recon Group B but was not inserted due to thick jungle canopy. Extraction of the recon unit was made by hoist lift and later pickup from a cleared area. Sparrow Hawk returned to the Company B area at 191325H.

At mid-month a counterattack plan was developed for the battalion and on 192150H a drill was conducted. Without being previously alerted, units responded and traveling from different points within the vit l area were in position within thirty-eight minutes. A total of seventy-two infantrymen, five corpsnant, and two Ontos participated.

Effective 200700H the battalion lost a small portion (Grid squares YD 7817, 7917) of its TAOR in the northwest to 2/1 for use as an impact area. The change was not large enough to affect the CAC unit in the area.

Acting as a followup to contact by CAC-7 with VC the night before in Loi Nong Hamlet (YD 837197), Company D was sent into the area. again on 23 June 1966. Crossing the line of departure at 0800H the company advanced, noved into the hamlet, and swept east and west. The search and destroy operation produced no VC, and the company was back in its company area by 1345H.

Two days later at 241800H the battalion once again assumed FSCC responsibility for the HUE-IHU BAI TAOR. This cormitment was still im effect as the nonth ended. Also in effect as the month ended was the attachment of Company M, 3/4 to the battalion initially effective 250800H. Company M was given the mission of provinding security for Battery I, 3/12 in the southeast portion of the TACR and for a new CaC unit being established at the Tauri bridge (YD 966064). Responsibility for the Truoi operating area was assigned to the battalion effective 252000H. This added a significantly large operating area to the TACR in the southeast. The new CAC unit, designated CaC-II, was established within the newly assigned area on 25 June. Another CAC unit planned for LOC DIEN in the operating area was not activated due to the nonavailability of FF's.

On 26 June command of the battalion changed from Lieutent Colonel R. E. SULLIVAN to Lieutenant Colonel Jack WESTERMAN. An appropriate

change of command ceremony was held.

Sparrow Hawk was alerted for the second time during the month for other than drill purposes at 290905H. After an air recently the Battalion Executive Officer it was conmitted to the Song Mong River area (YD 901062) to sweep that area in which an air strike had been conducted. A reinforced platoon from Company D with a headquarters group followed in thrace, helilifted in. Option of the Sparrow Hawk was assumed by Company D CO. Both units sweet the area with negative VC contact. Sparrow Hawk was retracted and returned to its company area at 1530H. Company D searched further and was then retracted arriving back 1855H. The next day, 30 Junes Battery I displaced from its position in the vicinity of Company N (ID 932059) and novel north to support regimental operations. Support N continued operations in its area.

As the north drew to a close ampther counterattack drill was conducted on 302030H. Company A responded with thirty-four troops; Company D with thirty-five troops; three tanks and three Ontos also participated. Opcon of the assembled units was assumed by Company B CO whose area had supposedly been penetrated. The drill secured at 302130H.

A patrol from CnC-7 encountered 2 VC along its route (YD 833172). While being searched the first VC contacted reached for a granade in his shirt and was immediately shot and killed. The second VC opened

fire and was killed by return fire;

Other activity engaged in to a considerable extent by the rifle company members during the nonth was the providing of security of Vietnamese grave digging details, for medical evaluations, and for truck convoys. In addition tank/infantry operations of platoon size were conducted on two occasions.

During the month the battalion supported Operation DODGE taking place north of the TACR by conducting intensified patrol activity in the northern portion of the TACR.

The month ended with the battalion continuting in its assigned mission.

TRAINING. Training consisted prinarily of on-the-job type instruction within the rifle companies and H&S Company. Those classes that were held were nostly on the platoon level and dependent upon the availability of personnel from their assigned commitments. Classes dealt with general military subjects applicable.

Classes for CaC personnel were attended by FF's in addition to the Marines. Advantage was taken of the proximity of the ARVN Dong Da training Center and the availability of its ranges for firing on Sundays. Weapons fired by members of the battalion included the M-14 rifle, the .45 caliber pistol, the 60mm and 31mm mortars, the M-60 machine gum, and the 3.5" rocket launcher.

Instruction conducted by staff section representatives consisted of instruction on radio procedures, FO procedures, and information reporting procedures.

Eighteen personnel attended a two day course of instruction on the regimental level dealing with mine warfare and booby traps. One officer attended a two week course of instruction at division level on a man packed personnel detector.

Orientation and indoctrination briefings were conducted for all hands joining the battalion.

JUNE

CHRONOLOGICAL ACCOUNT OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

L

At 040050H a CAC-7 patrol reported receiving 30-40 rounds of semi-automatic small arms fire from 100 meters south of their IP. No return rounds were fired due to friendly units being in the area. The area was thoroughly searched with negative results.

5

At 052155H CAC-7 received 20 rounds of automatic small arms fire and one fragmentation grenade. Marines manned their defensive positions and returned fire.

6-7

At 072300H CAC-7B patrol sighted 3 VC crossing a field and heading south. The patrol opened fire, and the VC then began to return fire, expending 10 rounds of carbine ammunition and throwing one grenade. Marines expended 100 rounds 7.62mm, one round M-79, and 8 rounds of 81mm illumination. Two Marines suffered minor superficial woulds of the leg; cause was undetermined.

A

At 080305H a Company B patrol reported 3 VC walked into their ambush site. The patrol fired 15 rounds automatic small arms fire. One VC WIA probable was reported. There was no return fire. At 082130H Company D illuminated to its front and flanks. 3 VC were spotted in the vicinity of Company B's lines as a result of the illumination. The Marines fired approximately 20 rounds. One VC fell and did not rise again. Company B requested illumination at 2145H. The illumination was on target but nothing was observed. A fire team was sent to check the area; negative results. At 2150H, Company D received 20 small arms rounds and 2 grenades on its left flank. Company D personnel saw people moving away from the lines as requested illumination was burning out. They returned fire; negative results.

At 092130H CAC 8A patrol fired at 2 VC at coordinates YD 795185. The VC had crossed the path of the patrol point, and the front element of the patrol fired 8-10 rounds of automatic fire. Marines pursued as the VC withdrew to the north. Contact was lost. The patrol swept the area. Contact was not regained. At 2300H, an LP at YD 895153 spotted 6 VC and fired one burst of 7.62mm and threw 2 grenades. Illumination was requested and 2 VC were spotted moving from left to right. Marines fired 2, M-79 rounds, most probably wounding one VC. At 2400H, CAC-7B patrol heard movement in a tree line 100 meters east of their checkpoint #2 at YD 825181. 6 VC were spotted and fired upon. The area was checked with negative results. No incoming rounds had been received. The Marines expended 150 7.62mm rounds, 3 M-79 rounds, 2 81mm illumination rounds, and 5 white star clusters.

JUNE

10

At 102050H a Company B listening post at YD 895154 received one fragmentation grenade and 5 rounds small arms fire. The Marines returned 2 WP grenades and 20 small arms rounds and returned to the lines. At 2115H the right flank of the lines received 400-500 rounds small arms fire. They observed 25-30 VC which were taken under fire. Six to ten VC were believed to be wounded. The VC broke contact and withdrew to a tree line about 250 meters from the lines. A tank on the lines fired 25-30 rounds .30 caliber light machine gun fire. Contact was lost. At 2115H, one VC was observed running northwest in front of CAC-1's CP at TO 80174. The Marines fired at the VC expending 65 small arms rounds and 3 parachute flares. The Marines received no incoming rounds; contact was lost. When Marines swept the area one VC KIA was found. At 2210H a CAC-1 patrol received 6 rounds small arms fire at vicinity YD 881174. They saw 2 persons running south. The patrol fired, expended 250 rounds and 3 illumination hand grenades. They pursued the VC, lost contact, and returned to their CP. At 2330H a Company A patrol heard movement to their front. Cne round of M-79 ammunition was fired. The patrol received an undetermined number of incoming rounds and requested illumination. The Marines spotted 3 VC enter a tomb area. The patrol swept the area with negative results.

11

CAC-7B patrol had its ambush at YD 826178 sprung. The ambush sighted 4 VC in a bruchline and fired on them. One VC was killed. Recovery was made of the body and one CHICOM automatic weapon. Four VCS were apprehended by the patrol while enroute back to its IP. At 112040H a Company D LP received one incoming granade and at the same time sighted 3 VC running away. The LP opened fire expending 10-15 small arms rounds and heard one VC yell as the rounds impacted. The LP then withdrew to its own lines. One VC WIA probable was reported.

12

At 122215H a Company A patrol 500 meters forward of the lines observed movement along the river bank at YD 887123. The patrol threw one illumination hand grenade and observed 15 VC, 4 of whom were carrying weapons. The patrol received 3-4 rounds from a carbine. Fire was returned, contact lost; negative results.

13

At 130145H a Company A patrol spotted three VC at YD 883123. The patrol shot one VC who tried climbing a tree on the river bank. Continuous illumination was requested as the patrol tried to retrieve the body from the river.

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1933

The body could not be found. The other VC withdrew northwest. At 2035H H&S Company line position #3 received one incoming grenade approximately 30 meters in front of the position. Illumination was requested and fired. Negative activity was observed. Line position #1 observed one VC in front of its position at YD 877127 at 132040H. The position fired two small arms rounds. The VC fell, then got up and moved off to the south. One VC WIA probable was reported. At 132055H a Company D patrol while moving to its ambush site received 4-5 rounds of automatic weapon fire and one fragmentation grenade. The ptrol returned 8-10 rounds 7.62mm and one fragmentation grenade at the suspected enemy position at TD 896154. They observed one VC running across a rice paddy toward the northeast. The patrol returned to its lines and then later swept the area at 2115H with negative results.

14

At 140330H an H&S Company patrol moving towards it ambush position made contact with an unknown number of VC at YD 875132. The patrol fired 5 rounds of 7.62mm, and the VC broke contact withdrawing in an unknown direction. The patrol moved on its ambush position. At 2100H an unknown number of VC threw three 2 grenades at CAC-7A patrol. The Marines expended 6 white star clusters and 4 81mm illumination rounds and swept the area with negative results. The patrol continued on the nighttime operations.

15

At 152330H one VC was spotted in a bruchline heading west from coordinates YD 816178. CAC-7 Marines opened fire and expended 60 7.62mm rounds, 3 M-79 rounds, and 6 white star parachutes. No incoming rounds were received. The area was swept with negative results.

16

At 162015H a CAC-7 patrol sighted 7 VC moving in a column along a tree line at YD 820175. The VC were heading north. The Marine patrol received approximately 45 rounds of small arms automatic weapons fire. The Marines expended approximately 500 rounds 7.62mm, 7 white star parachutes, 1 M-79 round and 4 81mm illumination rounds. The CAC-7 unit swept the area with negative results and continued on patrol.

17

At 172230H CAC-7A waiting in ambush was fired upon by an undetermined number of VC. The Marines returned fire and swept the area with negative results. One USMC KIA was sustained.

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JUNE

18

At 18235H C.C-7B observed 7-10 VC in a tree line moving northwesterly. The Marines opened fire on the VC expending approximately 245 7.62mm rounds, 6 M-79, and 4 81mm illumination. The Marines received no incoming rounds. The area was searched with negative results.

19

At 190005H CAC-7B reported sighting one VC running southeast down a trail. The Marines opened fire expending approximately 40 small arms rounds and 4 81mm illumination rounds. At the time of contact the VC were approximately 30 meters away. The Marines received no incoming rounds; they swept the area taking 3 VCS into custody. They were taken to CAC-7B CP to be interrogated. At 190035H approximately 15 VC fired 10 rounds at patrol 7B as they returned to their CP. Approximately 6 rounds and one grenade were fired at the CP. The CP responded with 3 grenades. The VC broke contact heading north toward Loi Nong (YD 836196); no friendly casualties were sustained. At 2205H the Company A bunker reported hearing automatic weapon fire. Illumination was fired. A Company A patrol at coordinates YD 891118 saw three men hunched down 100 meters away when the illumination was fired. They swept area with no contact. At 2320H an H&S Company patrol heard movement to their front, received approximately 20 to 30 rounds automatic wearons fire, and observed 3 VC. They requested illumination and returned fire with approximately 200 small arms rounds and 5 gronades. Negative findings resulted.

20

At 200005H VC tried to encircle CAC-5 at a distance of approximately 30 meters. CAC-5 opened fire. The VC dispersed in all directions; the area was swept with negative results. At 2255H 3-4 VC were observed at YD 830172 moving in a northern direction along a tree line. CAC-7 Marines opened fire and expended 150 rounds 7.62mm, 3 M-79 rounds, and 10 81mm illumination rounds. The VC failed to return fire. The Marines swept the area and found a blood trail. They followed the blood trail with negative results. At 2345H approximately 20 VC moved to and surrounded a CAC-7 ambush site. Friendly troops opened fire expending 200 small arms rounds, 12 M-79 rounds, 3 M-26 grenades, 5 white parachute illumination and one red illumination. The VC broke contact after returning 100-200 small arms rounds. Two PF WIA's were sustained.

JUNE

21-22

At 220040H approximately 10 VC attacked the compound at CAC-8. The Marines received 100 small arms rounds and 3 grenades inside the compound. The Marines returned fire expending 600 rounds 7.62mm, 8 M-26 grenades, and 12 81mm illumination rounds. The VC broke contact and headed northwest. Marines swept the area at 0130H with negative results. At 1615H at YD 839195 We in a tree line opened fire on a CAC-7 patrol. Approximately 10 VC fired 30 small arms rounds. The patrol returned fire and assualted the tree line. The VC broke contact and withdrew in an easterly direction. area was swept with negative results. Villagers told PF's with the patrol that 2 VC had been wounded and that the VC were carrying 2 BAR's, 4 carbines, and 4 SMG's. At 1800H CAC-7A patrol at YD 844194 was fired upon by approximately 15 VC in a tree line with semi-automatic weapons. The Marines returned fire expending 780 7.62mm rounds, 10 M-26 grenades, 15 M-79 rounds, one red smoke grenade, one LAAW, 2 hand held illumination, and 16 .45 caliber rounds. The VC broke contact withdrawing in a northeasterly direction. The area was searched with negative results.

23

At 230015H a patrol from C.C-1 acting on intelligence from the PF's was sent to the vicinity of coordinates YD 878177 to check on a meeting of Vietnamese that was to be held. Eleven Vietnamese males (ages 24-80) were apprehended. The VCS were held overnight and turned over to ITT at first light for interrogation.

24

At 0048H the CAC-7 CP was probed by an estimated 3' VC. The Marines opened fire with 50 rounds 7.62mm. 2 M-26 grenades, and 11 white parachute flares. A sweep of the area revealed one wounded civilian. He was med-evaced by request of CAC-7. At 0127H a patrol from CAC-7 received 4 rounds of small arms fire from YD 819181. The Marines returned 20 rounds of 7.62mm into the tree line from which the fire came. A sweep of the tree line produced negative results. At 242400H, four VC were sighted moving thru a treeline at YD 814176 by a CAC-7 patrol. The CAC-7 patrol opened fire at 50 meters from the VC. The expenditure of ammunition was 30 7.62mm rounds, 3 M-79 rounds, 7 M-26 grenades, 8 white star parachutes, 5 illumination hand grenades, and 9 81mm rounds of illumination. The VC fled west after contact. The area was swept with negative results.

JUNE

25-26

At 262310H The Company D bunker and listening posts heard sounds of digging and saw three men walking parallel to the lines. The lines fired two rounds of illumination, 10 rounds of small arms fire, and threw one M-26 grenade. Negative results ensued.

27-28

At 2240H a Marine/PF ambush at YD 790190 reported receiving 2 rounds of small arms fire from an unknown number of VC in an unknown position. One hundred rounds of 7.62mm and 4 M-26 grenades were returned in the direction of the fire. The area was swept with negative results. At 282200H 4 VC were observed in the vicinity of a Company M (OpCon to 1/4) LP at YD 992042. Marines expended 3 grenades, 35 rounds 7.62mm and 3 M-79 rounds. The area was searched with negative results.

29

At 290718H the Regimental S-2 reported that an AO had spotted 12 to 15 boats containing people with weapons moving east to west on the river at YD 932053. Parmission was requested to conduct an air strike. The air strike was approved and conducted at coordinates YD 903046 and YD 908065. At 0755H the Regimental S-3 reported on results of the air strike:

YD 903046:

1 boat sunk 5 VC KIA

5-10 VC KIA possible

YD 908065:

4 boats sunk 10 VC KIA

15-20 VC KIA possible

At 0905H Sparrow Hawk was alerted to move to HMM-161 to be lifted into the area of the air strike. The Sparrow Hawk under OPCON of 1/4 moved to the ebjective area at YD 901062. At 0940H Company D was alerted to move the Company headquarters and one platoon to HMM-161 and to have the remainder of the company follow. At 0945H Commanding Officer of Company D assumed OPCON of Sparrow Hawk. The two units searched the objective area with negative VC contact. At 1530H Sparrow Hawk returned to the Company B area. At 1855H the Company D headquarters and platoon returned to the company area.

30

At 302135H a CAC-7 patrol made contact with and killed two VC at YD 833172. The VC KIA's were wearing green uniforms. Captured equipment included one new CHICOM weapon, 3 CHICOM grenades, 1 M-26 grenade, 2 cartridge belts, 3 magazines, and assorted documents taken off the two VC KIA's.

LOGISTICS

SECTION V

A. Significant Events

- 1. During June the Battalion maintained positions in the PHU BAI Vital area and the Battalion Area of Responsibility. Platoon and squad outposts were maintained on Hills 180 and 225 respectively. The Battalion's Combined Action Company maintained positions in hamlets around the enclave (See SECTION IV).
- 2. Resupply to Hill 225 was accomplished by helicopter once each 48 hour period. Average resupply totaled 3,000 pounds. Resupply of all other areas was accomplished by truck.
- 3. Rehabilitation of fortified positions in the Battalion operating area was initiated and noticeable progress was made.
- 4. Turn in of excess and unserviceable ammunition, left on position by the unit previously assigned was effected.
- 5. During the reporting period, the Battalion was afforded an "in kind" issue, the first in over three months.

B. Supply

- 1. Class I 1,400 gallons of water and 447 MCIs were provided daily. "A" and "B" rations were also provided for an average daily strength of 695 personnel.
- 2. Class II Re-orders and re-issues of all types of Class II individual and organizational equipment and supplies lost as a result of operations conducted the previous months was commended.
- 3. Class III POL consumption consisted of 45 gallons of Diesel; 90 gallons of MOGAS per day; and small quantities of greases and lubes, for operation of organic vehicles and electrical power sources.
- 4. Class IV Class IV issued in support of the rehabilitation of fortifications consisted of: 45,000 sandbags, 84 rolls of concertina, and 25 rolls of barbed wire.
- 5. Class V A Basic Allowance (B/A) was maintained and procedures for maintaining and storing emergency use ammunition were established.
- C. <u>Transportation</u>. Inadequate truck support to meet daily logistical and tactical commitments, to the point where obtaining water and provisions for the Messhall precluded the use of available

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transportation for any other purposes.

- D. Sanitation. No sanitation problems were encountered.

COMUNICATIONS/ELECTRONICS

SECTION VI

During the nonth, the wire section installed a new wire system to more efficiently handle the communications consituents of the Battalion in the Enclave. This installation was done in three phases.

Phase I

Included the installation and overheading of telephone lines within the Battalion Command Post and to the individual Company administrative offices and command bunkers. Lines were then installed along each of the company bunkers. Wire and longer in use in the Battalion Area was then recovered and will be serviced and salvaged.

Phase II

Individual Telephone lines were installed to each of the CAC posts eminating from a switchboard in the Company C Office thereby giving the Company Commander the ability to talk directly with any one or all of the CAC posts by land line. This system also affords lateral telephone communications to the individual CAC's, thus reducing the load on existing radio facilities. All lines were overheaded.

Phase III

Separate, overheaded telephone lines were installed from the Battalion Switchboard to each unit participating in the defense of the Enclave, including the observation/radio relay position on Hill 180. This system provides for rapid, direct incident reporting to the Battalion Operations Center, supporting fire requests to the Battalion FSCC and lateral communications among the participating units.

The Battalion has installed approximately 85 miles of WDI/TT communications wire, 90% of the installation being overheaded.

ARTILLERY/NAVAL GUNFIRE

SECTION VIII

A. Artillery. On 082000H, 1st Battalion, 4th Marines FSCC assumed regimental FSCC duties for the 4th Marines TACR while regimental FSCC was on Operation FLORIDA. On 121600H, 1st Battalion, 4th Marines FSCC returned regimental FSCC duties for the 4th Marines TACR to regimental FSCC when they returned from Operation FLORIDA.

On 16 June the FSCC team from 2nd Battallian, 4th Marines was transferred to 1st Battalian, 4th Marines and Golf Battery, 3rd Battalian, 12th Marines was put in direct support of 1st Battalian, 4th Marines.

At 1800H on 24 June the FSCC of 1st Battalion, 4th Marines assumed regimental FSCC duties in the 4th Marines rear CP, while the forward CP of the 4th Marines was participating in Operation JAY.

 - (1) FFC R. R. FIRROVA. 2142408 was brought to the BAS on 8 June 1966. He had suffered a gunshot wound of the left lege. The wound was debrided and he was admitted to the BAS ward for further treatment.
- 4. There were approximately 4,700 innoculations administered during the month. In accordance with current instructions two crowless screening test vaccines have been placed on order and will be administered when they are received.
- 5. Vietnamese civilian nedical treatments in the CAC villages totaled 3,376 for the nonth. One new village (11) was opened and one Hospital Corpsnan was assigned to administer the nedical needs of the village.
- 6. An electric refrigerator was requistioned through Division Medical Supply but the request was disapproved by the Division Surgeion's Office. Fuel operated refrigerator is still on order with Battalion Supply. Biologicals are currently being kept in the Regimental Mess Hall refrigerators but this has caused considerable inconvenience in that the packaging has rapidly deteriorated.

CIVIL AFFAIRS

Corpsnen of Combined Action Company treated 2,979 civilians during the nonth of June. 12 civilians were nedically evacuated for treatment to "A" Medical Battalian. Company M corpsnen treated 86 civilians during the nonth of June.

3. Special Civil Action Projects

A project to build an aid station in Thuy Phu Village was undertaken. The aid station was completed by Marines and Popular Forces Personnel.

4. Apparent Results of Civil Affairs Program

The attitude of the villagers is receptive and friendly. The redical assistance has been especially effective. During the political turnoil in Hue, Buddhists placed alters on National Highway 1. These alters inpeded military traffic. Military traffic, therefore, was kept to the kere minimum. Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts kept watch over these alters. Several banners were displayed that read, "Down with US vehicles that upset and run over our Buddhist alters". However, in midst of the tense political situation, there were no violent outbursts of anti-Americanism in any of the villages within the Battalion TAOR. There were no conflicts of ARVN units with Marines. Buddhists altershave been removed from National Highway 1. Military traffic on Nationali Highway 1 has resumed.

PSYCHOLOGICAL WARFARE

A. One leaflet drop was requested and conducted during the month, during a reinforced plateon search and destroy operation by Company "B"; in the vicinity of Thon Photoing Lam (YD 834171). The drop was timely arriving just as the unit swept through the area.




