

a. Summary. The Battalion spent the first half of the month operating from the Phu Bai Enclave in defense of the Vital Area. On 13 August the Battalion held a County Fair Operation in Gia Le, North of the Vital Area. On the 16th of August, the Battalion moved up to Dong Ha for Operation PRAIRIE, leaving an Administrative rear in the Phu Bai Combat Base.

B. Significant Events.

13 August - The Battalion conducted a County Fair Operation North of the Phu Bai Combat Base in the village of Gia Le.

16 August - The Battalion moved to Dong Ha, to participate in Operation PRAIRIE with 2nd Battalion, 4th Marines.

16 August - Operational Control of Company "C" was relinquished to 2nd Battalion, 9th Marines who relieved 1st Battalion, 4th Marines of the responsibility of the defense of the Vital Area.

23 August - In conjunction with Operation PRAIRIE the Battalion Command Group with Company "A" (Rein) conducted a combined Tank-infantry reconnaissance in force of the area north of Dong Ha to Con Tien.

30 August - The Battalion moved to the field to conduct a reconnaissance in force in the area west of Cam Lo.

C. Problem Areas/New Developments.

1. The continued shortage of Officers still exists. The problem is not as critical as it has been in the past, however, sixteen are yet needed to bring us up to T/O.

2. After the Battalion left for Operation PRAIRIE, the Administrative Rear moved into tropical huts in the proposed Battalion area in the Phu Bai Enclave.

F. Morale, PX, Postal Affairs, Liberty, R&R.

Morale is excellent. The Battalion's deployment in the field for Operation PRAIRIE, and the highly successful contacts with the enemy have helped to keep the morale at its present high state. The first part of the month was spent in the relative comfort of the Phu Bai Combat Base; hot "A" and "B" rations were served, showers were available three times daily, the clubs maintained a good supply of liquid refreshment, and movies were available to all hands. While in the vicinity of the Dong Ha Combat Base, the same facilities were available to all while in both the Phu Bai and Dong Ha Combat Bases. While in the field, ample sundry items were distributed to all. R&R quotas were again high this month, and were available to the Battalion up to the 27th when, because of field operations, they were cancelled.

G. Religious Activities.

With the arrival of 1st Battalion, 4th Marines at the Dong Ha area, the activities of Chaplain Stephen Almasy were oriented to the needs of the area. Though the Battalion left the area, it was the wish of the Command that the Chaplain remain back for duty with the BAS. During this time services were provided for the surrounding area's troops; usually the schedule for Sunday ran as follows:

SECTION III

Ac (General). (Period covered 1 August 1966 - 31 August 1966). The Battalion was actively engaged with VC and NVA elements during the reporting period. During the period 1 August 1966 - 15 August 1966, the majority of the contacts were made by patrols and ambushes. Also, during this period several probing attempts against the Battalion's perimeter was made. During the period 1 August 1966 - 15 August 1966, contact was light and involved the exchange of only a few rounds per incident. The majority of the incidents during this period was initiated by small groups of VC and usually resulted in the VC breaking contact and withdrawing. One exception occurred on 1 August 1966, when an element of the Combined Action Company (CAC) C Co 1st Battalion, 4th Marines) was taken under fire with mortars, machine guns and small arms from an estimated 50 VC. As a result of this incident, a company size operation was initiated on 6 August 1966 in the same area (LOI NONG-Hamlet, YD8318 - 8319) which resulted in 4 VCKIA (Conf) by air, ground, and artillery, and the capture of assorted medical supplies. Of other significance during this period, was an attack on 2 Marines traveling on National Route #1 during daylight hours by 3 VC armed with AK-47 automatic weapons which resulted in the death of the Marines. Also, the Battalion supported a "County Fair" operation conducted by the ARVN during this period.

In the second reporting period (16 August 1966 - 31 August 1966), the 1st Battalion, 4th Marines (Rein) displaced it's CP from the HUE/PHU BAI TAOR to the DONG HA (Vic YD2460) area of operations. During this period, from 16 August 1966 - 29 August, the Battalion perimeter was subject to probes by small groups of VC throwing rocks in an effort to ascertain the locations of defensive positions. Also, several incidents of grenades and small arms exchanges occurred which resulted with the VC breaking contact and withdrawing. The majority of the incidents were initiated by the VC. Of prime significance during this period was the coordinated attack by combined NVA/VC(LF) elements, estimated to be two companies in strength, against Company A, 1st Battalion, 4th Marines (Rein) located vicinity YD1157 on 26 August 1966. As a result of this attack, the Battalion accounted for 76 KIA (Conf), 26 assorted weapons and 1 VCC. The latter of which revealed the attacking elements to be organic to the 812th Regt, NVA with element of the CAM LO LF Company attached. Additionally, on the night of 27 August 1966, a possible probe was again attempted against Company A's defensive perimeter which resulted in 1 VCKIA (Conf) and the sighting of a platoon (30-40) size element to the rear of the would be probbers. No subsequent contact was made by the Battalion nor did the Battalion have any significant activity for the remainder of the month.

At 010910H, a CAC-7 patrol at YD819199 sweeping the area of the previous days firefight, received 200 rounds small arms fire and 3 rounds 60mm mortar fire from an estimated 50 VC located in a treeline vicinity YD821-198. The patrol assaulted the treeline by fire and maneuver. The VC withdrew East into LOI NONG (H) (YD8219-8319) and as patrol swept village, they received a heavy volume of AW and SA fire from an unknown number of VC located YD839196. Patrol called an artillery mission on enemy positions and the VC broke contact dispersing in all directions. Patrol swept enemy position finding blood stains.

At 060030H, Company D made a sweep of the LOI NONG Hamlet (YD8219-8319) utilizing ground fires, artillery and air strikes which resulted in 4 VC KIA and 12 VC captured, 3 tons of medical supplies.

At 080030H, a Company D 105mm mortar patrol investigated shooting vicinity YD326178 which reported 2 Mortars driving a Mighty Mite had been ambushed by 3 VC armed with RPG/ automatic weapons. Patrol swept the area with negative results.

At 100030H, a MAG-40 gun crew at YD322179 engaged an estimated 6 VC in same vicinity, destroying 1 VC WIA (Prob).

At 200030H, Company D 105mm Mortar Battalion tank attached to 1st Battalion, 4th Marines on a armored reconnaissance vicinity YD135726 received 3 rounds AT/North Vietnamese fire vicinity YD131727. Tank fired 90mm HE on the enemy position resulting in 6 VC KIA (Prob).

At 230030H, Snipers attached to 1st Battalion 4th Marines and employed at CON THINH OP YD216701, fired on 2 VC vicinity resulting in 1 VC KIA (Conf).

At 260343H, Company A and Supporting Elements at YD113575 engaged with an estimated 2 NVA companies reinforced with LF guerrillas at Company A Defensive perimeter resulting in 76 NVA/VC KIA (Conf) and the capture of 26 weapons and assorted medical supplies and documents.

At 272343H, Company A defensive position at YD128587 fired on 3-5 VC at the defensive wires in same vicinity resulting in 1 VC KIA (Conf).

Summary of enemy units within the Battalion TAOR during the reporting period were: The CAM LO District LF Company at YD113575 on 260342H; 12 unidentified LF companies at YD057528 and YD059522 on 3 August and 7 / 8 August respectively; 1 LF platoon at YD110515 on 20 August; and elements of the 812th Regt., 324th B Division(NVA) which were operating in the CUA valley (SW of Battalion TAOR) and which took place in the assault on Company A, 1st Battalion, 4th Marines perimeter defenses on 26 August 1966.

G. Weather and Terrain

During the period 1-15 August 1966 the terrain encountered consisted primarily of rice paddies, rolling terrain, and populated areas. During this period many of the rice paddies were flooded limiting movement in these areas. However, overall movement by troops and vehicles was unrestricted.

During the period 16-30 August 1966, the terrain encountered consisted primarily of rolling type hills with scrub vegetation. Some dense jungle type vegetation was noted, however, this type foliage was not prevalent in the Battalion TAOR. Vehicular trafficability, though not employed, would have been impaired and impractical except in the Battalion vital areas and along the improved routes.

During the period 30 August 66 - 1 September 66 the terrain encountered consisted primarily of heavy vegetated, thick jungle, and steep hills. Movement of vehicles was impossible through this type terrain and made troop movement difficult, but did not prevent the accomplishment of the Battalion's mission.

Weather for the period was generally bright and hot. Rain fell on several occasions with the greatest amount of rain falling in the afternoon and evening.

1. During the period 1-15 August 1966, 1st Battalion, 4th Marines executed the following mission.
 - a. Defend the Hue - Phu Bai Vital Area. On 16 August 1966 Operational Control of Company "C" was relinquished to 2nd Battalion, 9th Marines who relieved 1st Battalion, 4th Marines of the responsibility of the defense of the Phu Bai Vital Area. This Battalion displaced from Phu Bai to Dong Ha by motor convoy to participate in Operation PRARIE.
 - b. Conduct Operation and extensive patrol and ambush activity in assigned sector of TAOR to deny enemy passage through or build up in that area.
 - c. Coordinate defensive efforts of all units within the vital area perimeter.
 - d. Be prepared to assume responsibility and command of the Hue-Phu Bai TAOR upon displacement of the 4th Marines Headquarters for operations outside the TAOR.
 - e. Maintain the Combined Action Company to provide security for assigned village/areas within the TAOR.
 - f. Maintain the Sparrow Hawk.
 - g. Maintain Combat Outposts on Hills 180 (YD855133) and 225 (YD8548087)
 - h. Conduct a vigorous Civil Affairs program within assigned area of TAOR and those areas assigned for operations.

OPERATIONS. During the period 1 August through 15 August the battalion continued to man defensive positions and coordinate defense of Huo-Phu Bai Vital Area. This included manning perimeter positions and two combat outposts. Numerous day and night patrols and ambushes were maintained; also the establishment of many LP's and OP's with the intent to maintain constant surveillance of the operating area. This was coordinated to the limit of 81mm/82mm mortar range within the TAOR. Throughout this 15 day period enemy contact was frequent, but the size of the units involved was small.

During the period 16-31 August, the Battalion participated in Operation PRARIE in the Dong Ha - Cam Lo area, conducting a tank/infantry Search and destroy operation (one company reinforced), and a Battalion Reconnaissance in Force operation.

On 1 August a patrol from Company C received heavy S/A fire, and 1 round of 60mm mortar fire at YD819199. The patrol pursued the VC by fire and

MANUEUER. At 1315H the patrol requested an artillery mission and 81mm mortar fire at YD841196, at VC trenches. At 1430, the patrol moved in to sweep the impact area. The results were blood trails and drag marks.

At 022155H MCB-7 received one incoming grenade at coordinates YD899136. Another grenade was received within ten minutes of the first one at the same coordinates. MCB-7 saw two Vietnamese with black clothing, but it could not be determined whether they were armed. The next morning the area was thoroughly searched with negative results.

At 030700H, Company A provided security for a convoy to Da Nang; Company D provided one reinforced platoon as a standby element.

At 031810H CAC-7 heard S/A firing and sent two fire teams to investigate the area in the vicinity of YD823175. The area was checked with negative results.

At 040650H Company B provided one (Rein) platoon as a 30 minute alert for emergency convoy reinforcement.

At 060615H, during a search and destroy operation Company B received S/A fire from coordinates YD829197. The Marines returned fire immediately and the VC immediately broke contact. Again at 1400H, Company B received I/W fire from an estimated force of 20 VC located at YD853193. 2 air strikes were executed detonating 4 secondary explosions, and a artillery mission was called in, expending 169 rounds of HE. After the supporting fire lifted Company B searched the area finding 4 VC KIA Confirmed. Company B sustained 1 USMC WIA, not serious.

On the 7th of August at 0215H, Company C patrol received 5 rounds S/A fire. The patrol requested illumination and searched the area with negative results.

On 8 August at 0805H, Hill 180 received 4-5 incoming rocks from the west side of the hill. One VCS was seen running down a ravine on west side of hill. Marines returned fire, but results were unknown. At 1401H patrol CAC-7B received 100 rounds of S/A fire at YD836198, fire was returned and 81mm illumination was called in but contact was broken, Marines continued on patrol.

On the 10th of August at 2310H, a patrol sighted 6 VC at YD822179. The VC initiated a short fire fight, after which the area was swept. Marines found trails of blood and counted one VC WIA (Probable).

On the 13th at 0500, the first County Fair Operation conducted by this Battalion was executed. Combined with ARVN Forces, Company D, and Company L/3/4 continued the County Fair until 1630. Results were considered to be highly successful.

At 1630 on the 13th, 1st Battalion assumed OPCON of 4/2/9 and immediately deployed this unit to YD853194 and YD869183 to act as a blocking force for an ARVN operation being conducted on the northern boundary of the TAOR. The Company maintained position overnight, but had no contact and was withdrawn at 0730 on the 14th of August.

On the 16th of August at 0850, the Battalion departed the Phu Bai Enclave by Rough Rider Convoy for the Dong Ha - Cam Lo area. 2d Battalion 9th Marines had assumed responsibility for defense of the Phu Bai perimeter on the 15th of August. The Battalion arrived at Dong Ha at 1520, ~~and at 1630 assumed~~

for defense of the airfield at Dong Ha and artillery positions at Cam Lo.

Throughout the period 16 to 23 August contact with the enemy consisted of small incidents in the lines at both Dong Ha and Cam Lo. There were instances of rock throwing and exchange of fires, all with negative results.

On the 23rd of August, Company A, with Company C 3d Tank Battalion in direct support conducted a tank infantry sweep north into the Con Thien area (ID1372). This day long operation resulted in three contacts; two mortar attacks and one ambush. Swift reaction by the tank-infantry team resulted in 9 VC KIA (Prob). Marine losses were 3 KIA and 17 WIA. The tanks encountered mines on four occasions, with no personnel casualties. However, evacuation of the disabled tanks was not effected for another two days.

The heaviest contact of the month occurred on the night of 25-26 August. At 260340H, Company A, located at the artillery positions at Cam Lo began receiving heavy incoming mortar and S/A rounds. During the next 1½ hours, Company A's lines were penetrated by an estimated 2 Companies of VC and NVA. By virtue of a determined resistance, quick and immediate unit response, and many cases of individual courage and initiative, The attack was repulsed, and the enemy was driven from the position. Final results were 75 VC KIA (Confirmed); USMC 3 KIA and 13 WIA.

At 260610 Company D was ready to helicopter lift to Company A's area to block and/or sweep the area of the attack. The company lifted into position and swept the area with negative results.

From 26 to 29 August the battalion had no contacts, and at 0930 on 29 August began a reconnaissance in force to the area west and north of Cam Lo. This operation was still in progress as the month ended, but the battalion had no contact.

CHRONOLOGICAL ACCOUNT OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1 At 011100H, CAC-7A patrol of Company C, received 200 rounds of S/A fire, and 1 round of 60mm Mortar fire, at coordinates YD 819199. The patrol pursued the VC by fire and maneuver. At 011315H the patrol requested an artillery mission at YD 841196, suspected VC in trenches. Mortars were also fired at these coordinates during this period. At 011430H, patrol 7A moved in to sweep the impact area. The results were blood trails, and drag marks; no bodies were found.

2 At 022155H, MCB-7 received one incoming grenade near coordinates YD 899136. At 022204H they received another incoming grenade at the same coordinates. VG were seen running from the lines and were fired upon. The area was searched the next morning with negative results.

3 At 030700H, Company A, of 1st Battalion, 4th Marines provided security for a Rough Rider convoy to Da Nang. Company D provided one reinforced platoon as standby. An artillery FO and an air FAC team were provided. At 031810H, CAC-7 heard firing and sent two fire teams to investigate the area in vicinity of YD 823175. Results of this investigation were negative.

4 At 040650H, Company B provided one platoon (Reinf) on 30 minute alert for emergency convoy reinforcement.

5-6 At 060615H, Company B on a Search and Destroy Operation, received S/A fire from an estimated 6-8 VC located at YD 829197. Company B returned S/A fire and the VC broke contact. The Company continued on the operation. At 061400H, Company B received A/W fire from an estimated 20 VC located at YD 853193. An artillery mission was called, expending 169 rounds HE. A. Significant Events

1. During the reporting period the Battalion (-) moved from the Phu Bai Area to Dong Ha, to participate in Operation PRATINIP. The move, by convoy, took place on 16 August 1966 (See Section IV).
2. Between 12 and 14 August, two LCU's were provided for transport of the remaining organic vehicles to the Dong Ha Area.
3. Clothing, in quantities sufficient to provide a minimum level of acceptance for field operation was provided by FISU.
4. Resupply to Cam Lo (Company "A") carried out by truck and consisted of A Rations, Ammunition and Clothing.

B. Supply

1. Class I - Since movement to the Dong Ha - Cam Lo Area, all personnel were provided "A" Rations.
2. Class II - A - Availability of spare parts and maintenance at this echelon have improved the combat posture of the Battalion by lowering deadline time.
3. Class III - POL consumption consisted of 55 gallons DIESEL per day; 60 gallons MOGAS per day and lubes and greases sufficient for operation of organic vehicles and power sources.
4. Class IV - Approximately 5,000 sandbags and 73 rolls of concertina were issued for improvement of positions at Dong Ha - Cam Lo.
5. Class V - Basic Allowance and D)A's (Day of Ammunition) maintained as requested.

C. Transportation. Satisfactory truck, air and sea transport (LCU's) provided for all logistical requirements.D. Sanitation. No sanitation problems encountered.E. Reports Required.

The Communication-Electronics Equipment of the Battalion is in a reasonably high state of readiness considering the relative lack of replacement items and serial parts. The Battalion has no USF equipment available for this reason. 59 AN/PRC-25's and 5 AN/GRC 125 radio sets were received during the month. 3 of the An/GRC 125's were received incomplete.

B. OPERATIONS

The Battalion participated in two operations in support of regimental operations in the Dong Ha Area. Both operations were conducted at extended range from the Regimental and Battalion Command Posts. Using the AN/PRC-25, intra-battalion communications were suitable. Subjected to extreme heat, humidity, direct intense sunlight and wet weather conditions for an extended period of time the AN/PRC-25 proved to be suitably adapted to the local environmental conditions and only minor adjustments in the field were necessary. The useable life of the battery BA-386 significantly demanded to an average of 60 hours due to the rapidly changing extreme weather conditions, even though they were carried in their waterproof bags and boxes that time of use. It was found that by placing the plastic bag from a BA-386 over the handset H-136 during inclement weather, the waterproof integrity of the handset was great enhanced and problems with the handset were negligible.

Communications with higher headquarters was difficult due to the extreme terrain in the operating area and a voice relay from a prominent terrain position was necessary.

31 Civilians were medically evacuated for treatment to "A" Medical Battalion.

3. Special Civil Action Projects.

a. On 12 August the Village Chief of Thuy Duong (YD 797194) was visited in regards to a family whose father was accidentally killed by Marines in a fire fight during June 1966. The family was given 25 pounds of food, and 15 pounds of clothing. Brief condolences were given to the family by Village Chief and Battalion Civil Affairs Officers.

b. On 14 August Operation County Fair was held at Thuy Phuong Village (YD 819172). Operation County Fair was run by Marines and local GVN authorities (See Enclosure (1) attached).

c. On 18 August the Village Chief of Loc Bon (YD 925104) was given one 8x4 ft. sheet of plywood for construction of election Ballot Box.

d. On 18 August coordination was made with Village Chief of Thuy Phuong Village (YD 819175) for construction of an additional school house at YD 820181. The village Chief has requested 100 sheets of tin and 25 bags of cement. This will be donated during the month of September.

e. On 26 August, Civil Affairs Officer, 1st Battalion, 4th Marines, District Chief Phu Loc, and Village Chief Loc Son went to homes of civilians who were victims to artillery fire on 20 August. One civilian was killed and 3 wounded. Two houses were damaged, and 5 buffalos were killed. Food and clothing were given to the civilian families concerned. Further intentions were to provide building material to repair the damaged houses and to submit solatium payments for the injured civilians and killed buffalos.

4. Apparent Results of Civil Affairs Program. The attitude of the villagers is receptive and friendly. The medical assistance has been especially effective. It is felt that the prestige of Marines has been increased because of Operation County Fair. It is also felt that the prestige of the village officials was increased by their motivation in directing resources for the betterment of their village people.

8. Results. The mission was accomplished, with guidance given by Marines, the local GVN authorities helped through to success their role in County Fair. The local GVN authorities were highly enthusiastic and motivated. The local inhabitants in turn were very spirited. Both old people and young people (children) showed very much interest and enthusiasm in participating in the games, in particular throwing balls at cans and throwing darts. Prizes were given to winners in all the games, and this generated much interest. People were eager to win something. The movies and the music appealed to the people, in particular the movies because they were in Vietnamese. The movies were general in nature, not psy-war type. A few of the movies shown were "4th Annual Asian Sports Festival", "City of Huu", "Tour of Cities", "Rice Growing", "Baby Care", and "Vietnamese Classical Music". The raffle was perhaps the biggest entertainment success. The people quickly caught on to the idea, and some managed to get hold of more than one raffle ticket to better their chances of winning. The most significant point of the material distributed was that the people looked forward to getting something that was given them by a local GVN official. This factors important in accomplishing the overall mission of County Fair. Every person got something, and quite a few got more than one item. A very friendly receptive and lively atmosphere was evident throughout the fair.




