F. Morale, PX, Postal Affairs, Liberty, R&R.

Morale is excellent. The Battalion remained at the PHU RAI Combat Base with the job of providing the security for the vital area. Showers were available throughout the month. Hot "A" and "B" rations were served and the clubs maintained a supply of liquid refreshment. Liberty was not authorized during the period covered due to the tactical situation. R&R was not utilized due to the Battalion rotating to OKINAWA on 15 December. Postal facilities continue to be satisfactory with some delays due to flight cancellations during period of heavy rain.

G. Chaplain's Activities.

The Chaplain, Lt. Stephen E. Almasy, of 1st Battalion 4th Marines, conducted a total of 26 masses during the month of December. The location, dependent on where the troops were, ranged from PHU BAI to OKINAWA. The fervices covered not only our family of 1/4 but also 2nd Battalion 26th Marines, 2nd Battalion 9th Marines, and all units in the Camp SCHWAB area. Protestant coverage was provided by Chaplain Almasy making liason with Protestant Chaplains of nearby units. Instructions and counseling continued throughout the month with members not only of 1/4 but also other who came seeking assistance. (While in PHU BAI, the Chaplain gave out presents to men out in the field. The presents were received throughout the month of December through OPERATION FRIENDSHIP.)

Discipline was excellent. During the period covered, there were no Courts-Martial completed or pending.



On 4 December, the Advance Party left for Okinawa; the Battalion Executive Officer was in charge. On 1. December the remainder of the Battalion embarked for Okinawa from Goco Beach, located outside of Hue. Republic of Vietnam.

8. Personnel Procedures.

During the period covered the Battalion was located at the Phu Bai Combat Base with the security of the vital area. As shown in paragraphs 1.b and 2.a, the Battalion increased in strength by 8 USMC Officers, 238 USMC Enlisted, 4 USN Officers and 29 USN Enlisted. This increase was mostly due to the Battalion joining attachments for rotation to Okinawa.

9. Interior Management.

Throughout the period covered the Battalion was quartered in Ely Huts. Also during the period covered, the Battalion was busily preparing for embarkation to Okinawa on 15 December 1966.

SECTION III

A. General. (Period covered: 1 December 1966 to 16 December 1966) The Battalion was actively engaged in the defense of the Hue/Phu Bai Vital Area, during this reporting period. In addition "A" and "B" Companies were deployed in the TROUI and GIA IE Operating Areas. During the reporting period enemy contact was light but increased towards the end of the reporting period. There were several minor incidents occurring along the defensive wire of the PHU BAI Vital Area. Much of the enemy contact involved the Combined Action Companies (CAC) while on patrol and/or ambushes. During the reporting period there were a total of 3 VC KIA (Confirmed) and 20 VC KIA (Probable).



A. Mission. During the period 1 - 16 December 1966 the 1st Battalion, 4th Marines continued to assume the responsibility of the HUE/PHU BAI TACR until reliaved on 13 December 1936 by the 2nd Battalion, 9th Marines. Missions assigned as follows:

- (1) Coordinate and control the PHU BAI Vital Area derense.
- (2) Conduct offensive operations within the TAOR.
- (3) Provide SPARROW HAWK on 5 minute alert.
- (4) Provide one Rifle Company as Rough Rider Reserve.
- (5) Maintain COP's within the TAOR and conduct extensive patrolling.
- (6) Assume operational control of the Combined Action . Company.
- 2-December
- (7) Activate as BLT 1/4 and assume command of BLT attachments.
- 13-December (8) Prepare for and conduct BLT 1/4 embarkation.

B. Surman of Additition. 1st Battalion, 4th Marines (Rein) continued es igned massion at raid BAI Combat Base RVN, Company B at GIA LE security position coordinates YD 811156, Company C at TRUOI security area coordinates YD 93,059, Ca. by A and F/2/26 manning defense positions at the Combat Base and Company D providing Rough Rider reserve and Sparrow Hawk stand-by.

At 012015H a Company B patrol received 8-10 small arms rounds and 3 incoming grenades. Small arms fire and grenades were returned. The patrol withdrew and called in artillery fire. Search of the area at first light revocated 1.VC KIA confirmed. MCB-7 perimeter position was harrassed by an estimated five 70 doming the night. Small arms received and returned. No friendly casualties, VO capualties unknown.

in 2 December 1966 1st Battallon, 4th Marines assumed OPCON of attachments obsignated for BLT 1/4.

At 021030d Company C was reliaved by Company A at TRUOI area position

and assumed the defease of the Company A perimeter position.

A school house near CAC 6 - 9 was mined and the blast killed one Biet Kiet and wounded seven. Evacuation by Marine Helicopter was coordinated by this Headquarters. (032145H).





One plateon from Company D provided security for an engineer recon of a bridge at coodinates YD 401399 at 040800H.

Two hand grenades were thrown at MCB-7 perimeter position at 060020H. No friendly casualties, M-79 fire returned, VC casualties unknown. At 061345H a squad from Company D provided security for extraction of a recon team in GS YD 8212, negative contact. Cpl COCKRAN, H&S Company 1/4, received a gunshot wound in right foot and was evacuated to A - Med at 062134H.

At 2045H on 7 December a CAC 8 ambush at coordinates YD 945070 made contact with an estimated 60 VC. Small arms fire was exchanged, no friendly casualties, two VC KIA confirmed and evidence of other VC KIA apparent.

F/2/26 perimeter position received nine rounds of small arms fire at 072210H. Fifty rounds small arms fire returned. No friendly casualties, VC casualties unknown. A follow up report was received on 8 December which indicated that the CAC 8 embush of 7 December may have caused an additional four VC KIA. This was not confirmed.

At 091145H a CAC 6 patrol made contact with a VC ambush. Small arms fire exchanged, no friendly casualties. VC casualties unknown.

On 10 December Company A forward position coordinates YD 931059 apprehended four ARVN personnel who were released VC prisoners. They were turned over to ITT. Company E/2/26 began, the relief of Company F/2/26. At 102105H the Company D perimeter received small arms fire, no casualties.

Between 2240H and 2400H on 10 December the Provisional Artillery Battalion and MCB-7 observed some povement forward of their perimeter position. Small arms were fired with negative results.

At 110420H a satchel charge caused one Marine WIA at CAC 2. The

Marine was evacuated by helicopter.

At 110800H Company E/2/26 relieved Company F/2/26 and became OrCON of 1st Battalion, 4th Marines. MCB-62 relieved MCB-7 of defensive perimeter position.

The Sparrow Hawk, a platoon (-) from Company C, was committed in an effort to cut off VC sighted by a recon team at coordinates YC 895998 at 111310H. No contact was made and the Sparrow Hawk was extracted at 111655H. Company E/2/26 provided one platoon for security of bridge repairs near All LO on 11 December.

Company A (Rein) moved from TRUOI security position to provide security for bridges at CAC 3, 4, 8, 10. All platoons were in position by 111800H.


At 120115H Company D porimeter position received one hand grenade, no casualties. At 120250 CAC 3 position coordinates YD 912118 was attacked by unknown number of VC. Four incoming 60mm mortar rounds were received, one Marine WIA not requiring evacuation. VC casualties unknown.

A squad from Company B provided security for a survey team at various sights in the TAOR on 12 December 1966.

Between 122025H and 130020H VC activity, movement and noises noticed near 1.03-62, Company D and FLSU perimeter positions. Five rounds were received. No friendly casualties. Small arms fire was returned with unknown results.

On the morning of 13 December, Companies of 2nd Battelion, 9th Marines began the relief of the Company A bridge security positions and Company C perimeter positions. After relief of these companies, at 131800H, 2nd Battalion, 9th Marines relieved 1st Battalion, 4th Marines of all missions







assigned in the defense of the PHU BAI TAOR. 2/9 assumed OPCON of Company E/2/26, CAC Company D 1/4, and Company C/1/4 Sparrow Hawk.

At 142120H Company C Sparrow Hawk was relieved by 2/9 and the Company C squad reverted back to their parent Company.

At 151500H the BLT 1/4 advance party boarded the USS LENAWEE.

Elements of the BLT moved from PHU BAI to embarkation points at HUE Ramp and COL CO Beach on 15 December and began loading as ships arrived.

The USS LENAWES, APA 195, completed loading at 161317H and got under way for OKINAWA with 52 Officers and 1276 Enlisted of BLT 1/4 embarked. BLT 1/4 reported OFCON to TF 79 and for Command to Ninth MAB.

The USS COMSTOCK, LSD 19 completed loading at 171200H December and departed for OKINAWA with 40 Officers and 139 Enlisted of BLT 1/4 embarked. The USS WASHBURN, AK 108, finished loading the remaining elements of BLT 1/4 and departed for OKINAWA at 172300H.

- C. Training. During the period 1 13 December 1966 heavy rain and operational commitments limited too training on the unit level within the rifle companies. All Gampany continued training on the Section level but adverse weather conditions limited the use of the DONG DA range for live fire.
- d. <u>Training Problems Encountered</u>. Adverse weather conditions and heavy tactical commitments limited the use of training facilities during this period.

1. Loristical Situation.


a. During the period 1-16 December 1966 the Battalion formed as a Dattalion Manding Team and prepared to Embark from RVM to Okinawa. An advance party of 1 Officer, 8 SHCO's and 1 Corporal departed PHU TAI and proceeded to Okinawa. The BIM was formed and commenced loading on 14 December and completed loading on 17 December. On 13 December the defense duties of the PHU BAI perimeter were assumed by the Second Battalion, Minth Marines.

2. <u>Supply</u>

a. Supported Strength - 1100 personnel (includes elements of "3" Co, 2/26)

b. Supply

- (1) Class I Over 9,000 MCI were issued, these were supplemented by at least one meal of "Alpha" rations daily to units deployed in all outlying areas.
- (2) Class II One "In-Gind" issue was held during the reporting period.
- (3) Class III FOL provided consisted of 180 gallons of Diesel and 90 gallons of NOCAS daily.
- (4) Glass IV Sandbags, concerting and barbed wire stakes were received during the reporting period for the construction of a defense perimeter around the ASF.
 - (5) Class V = B/A's and DOA's were maintained as appropriate.
- 3. Evacuation and Hospitilization. See section IX.
- 4. Transportation. The Dattalion was supported by five 2 ton trucks supplied by Dravo Company, Finth Motor Transport Battalion.
- 5. Service. The both unit provided by FLSU-2 to the battalion was broken during the entire reporting period, because of this showers were not made available to the troops during this same period.





COMMUNICATION-ELECTRONICS

Section VI.

- 1. Operations. All phases of Communication support operations conducted during the period 1 thru 16 Pecumber 1966 were routine in nature. Upon relief by 2nd Battalion, 9th Marines on 13 December 1966 all communication facilities were replaced in position. No difficulties were encountered in the relief of communication personnel.
- a. Radio. Internal radio communications were normal throughout the reporting period. To facilitate coordination and control during the embarkation phase of the Battalion's departure from RVN, seven stations ere activated on the Division Embarkation Net. The stations were located as follows: FMH BAI (coordinates YD 885132), Hill 180 (coordinates YD 855132), Hue Ramp (coordinates YD 771222), Coco Beach (coordinates YD 827316), USS LENAWEE, USS MASHBURN and USS COMSTOCK. The station on Hill 180 performed relay service between Phu Bai and all other stations, and between HUE RAMP and CCCO BEACH. RC-292 Antennas were used at Hill 180 and HUE RAMP initially. Upon closure of the relay station, a temporary outage was experienced between HUE PAMP and CCCO BEACH. This was rectified upon arrival of the Battalion rear echelon at CCCO BEACH at which time an RC-292 was set up and direct communications became possible between the two points. Communications was maintained on this net until all elements of the Battalion were embarked.
 - b. Wire. Telephone communications were normal for the period.
- c. Message Center. Message Center operations were normal for the period.





- 1. There were 244 visits made to the Sick Bay by 1/4 personnel during this 15 day period.
- 2. Prevalent and significant illnesses encountered were:
 - a. Upper Respiratory Infections 26
 - b. Dermatological Conditions 16
 - c. Cellulitis 10
 - d. Bronchitis 2
 - e. Gonorrhea 3
 - f. Diarrhea 9
 - g. Gastroenteritis 11
 - h. Otitis 6
- 3. There were no cases of malaria diagnosed during this period.
- 4. No casualties as the result of hostile fire, mine detonations or booby traps were incurred during this period.
- 5. One accidental discharge from a .45 caliber pistol occurred of 6 December 1966 resulting in a perforating gunshot wound of the right foot with a chip fracture of the first metacarpal. Following first aid treatment, the patient, Corporal T. L. COCHRAN, 2104128, USMC was evacuated to "A" Medical Company.
- 6. There were 28 dental consults during this period.
- 7. The principal activity of this period not directly related to the care of the sick was the inventorying, refurbishing and packing of equipment in preparation for embarkation to Okinawa.
- 8. On 14 December 1966, the Medical Department ceased operations in the FHM BAI enclave. Medical coverage from 14 December to 15 December was supplied by the Medical Department of 2nd Battalion, 9th Marine Regiment.

- 1. <u>Civil Affairs</u>. During the period 1 13 December 1966 all Civil Affairs in the PHU BAI Combat Base were handled by G-5, 3rd Marine Division.


Summary of Operations/Activities

On the departure of the USS LENAWEE, APA 195 from HUE, HVN BLT 1/4 with it's commander embasked, reported to CTF 79 for OPCON and to CG 9th MAB for command less OPCON. The remaining elements of the BLT embarked aboard the USS COMSTOCK, LSD 19 and USS WASHBURN AKA 108 departed TUE, RVN on 17 December and 18 December respectively. The USS LENAWEE arrived at TENGAN Pier, OKINAWA on 20 December. Off loading of all embarked personnel and equipment was completed at 2135, the day of arrival. At 0830 20 December BLT 1/4 reported to CG 9th MAB for OPCON and to RLT-26 for command less OPCON.

The USS COMSTOCK arrived at Camp SCHWAB, OKINAWA at 0930 21 December to off load LVT's. The ship moved to WHITE BEACH and completed unloading at 2000 on the same day. The USS WASHBURN arrived at TENGAN Pier at 1230 on 22 December. Off loading was completed at 0235 on 23 December. With the completion of offloading of this ship, BLT 1/4 was deactivated and the attachments were assigned to appropriate host units within RLT-26.




