1. 2dBn, 4th Marines Operations

A. Company E. Company E is the Regimental Reserve Company and is ready to deploy at anytime requested.

B. Company F is maintaining the security of AnTan Bridge with one platoon and a checkpoint/roadblock to prevent the flow of contraband and VC into or out of the TAOR. The other two platoons are occupying hill 76 and hill 69.

The squads are combat patrols operating in the area 2,000 meters in front of the TAOR to seek out and destroy VC. 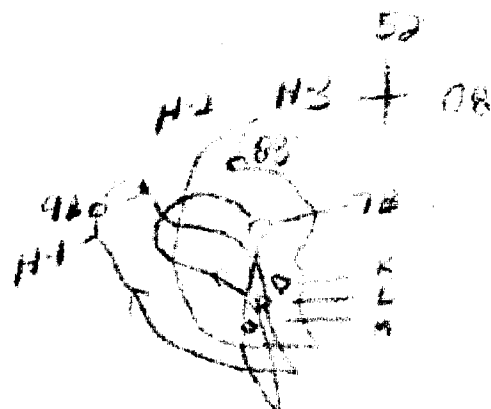

2dBn, 4th Marines Operations

A. Company E. Company E is the Regimental reserve company standing by to move out on short notice should any 4th Marines unit need reinforcing or a situation develops where it would be desirable to exploit with fresh troops.

B. Company F. Company F established during the hours of darkness a roadblock at AnTan Bridge (BT497066) enforcing the 2000 to 0600 curfew. At first light, the Marines were joined by PFs and National Police and as the roadblock was opened they commenced to search all vehicles and personnel crossing the bridge for contraband and hidden VC.

C. Company G. Company G ambushed forward of the MLR with three squads in attempt to destroy VC moving toward the perimeter. Company G is daylight patrolling with three squads and one platoon. The squads are combat patrols operating in the area 2,000 meters in front of the TAOR to seek out and destroy VC. The platoon is conducting operations designed to kill VC and capture equipment in the KyKuong village area.

D. Company H. Company H conducted three ambushes to the front of the MLR last night to prevent VC penetrations. Today, three squads are operating forward of the MLR to search out and destroy VC while exploring the area for indications of VC activity. One platoon is patrolling in the vicinity of KyKuong village to seek out and destroy VC.

E. Six mortar are moving off hill 69 today and moving to the reserve position.

F. Two 4.2 howitzers are displacing to hill 69 to relieve the 81 section moving off today.

A. Company E. Company E made necessary preparations for their Company size operation scheduled to commence at 032000H.

B. [Company F. Company F enforced the curfew along highway one from 022000H to 030600H with a physical roadblock at AnTan Bridge (BT497066). At 030600, the Co F fire team was joined by the National Police and PFs at AnTan Bridge. The bridge was opened to traffic and all personnel and vehicles crossing were searched by the National Police for contraband and VC stowaways. Co F is conducting one platoon size daylight combat patrol with one squad of PFs in the KyKuoung Village area. In addition to searching out and destroying VC, they will be looking for evidence of VC movement, harbor sights, caches of food and equipment and likely artillery targets.

C. Company G secured the MLR with four squad size stakeout/listening posts forward of their positions last night. At 030800H, Co G commenced daylight combat patrolling activities with three squad size units to the front of the MLR. They will be seeking out and destroying VC while looking for suitable ambush sights, harbor sights, and avenues of approach to the MLR.

D. Company H. Company H provided three combat ambush positions forward of defensive lines during the hours of darkness to destroy any VC moving toward the MLR. Company H's daylight patrol activity consists of three squad size combat patrols in the vic 2,000 meters forward of the MLR.

They will jump off tonight at 032000H and move to the LOD at the base of the objective hill. At 040630H they will commence the searching and clearing of the area.

A. Company E. Company E moved out at 032000H from Hill 69 (BT467068) on the first phase of their border and search operation Hill 22 (BT423091). At 040226H, Company E was in position in their harbor sight and remained there until 040710H when they crossed the LOD. At 040800H, Company E began receiving light small arms fire from (BT421094). By 040820H, the incoming had ceased. At 040950, more incoming small arms fire was received from (BT428098). No action was taken as the rounds were coming from too great a distance to be effective. Company E was located at (BT424098).

B. Company F. Company F enforced the curfew along highway one from 022000H to 030600H with a physical roadblock at Antan Bridge (BT497066). At 030600, the curfew was joined by the National Police and PPs at Antan Bridge. The bar was opened to traffic and all personnel and vehicles crossing were searched by National Police for contraband and VC stowaways.

C. Company G secured the MLR with four squad size stakeout/listening posts forward of their positions last night. At 030800H, Co G commenced daylight combat patrolling activities with three squad size units to the front of the MLR. They will be seeking out and destroying VC while looking for suitable ambush sight harbor sights, and avenues of approach to the MLR.

D. Company H. Company H provided three combat ambush positions forward of defensive lines during the hours of darkness to destroy any VC moving toward the MLR. Company H's daylight patrol activity consists of three squad size combat patrols in the vic 2,000 meters forward of the MLR. The patrols will, while conducting the primary mission of seeking out and destroying VC, look for intelligence information inadvertently left by VC.

E. H&S Company. Raiders are operating with Company E in the vicinity of 124.

F. PPs from KySanh and KyKuong villages are with Company E. The KySanh PPs are engaged in the sweep with the Marines while the KyKuong PPs are acting as a blocking force.

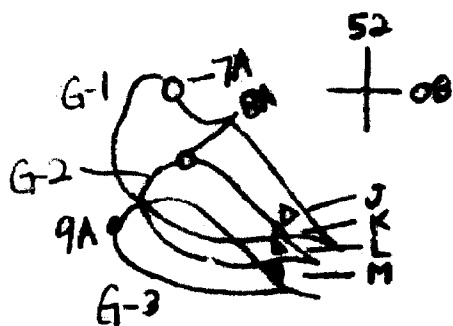

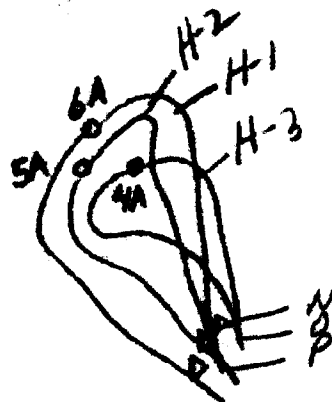

1. 2dBr., 4th Marines Operations

A. Company E. Company E is the Regimental Reserve Company and is standing by to be committed upon notice from 4th Marines that their services are needed. A warning order was received from Regiment at 050015H to have one platoon prepared to go to the aid of a downed helicopter South of QuangNgai. The platoon lifted out at approximately 050930H to QuangNgai, reverting to Regimental control.

B. Company F. Due to the nonavailability of PFs, Company F's cordon and search operation of the unnamed village at (BT4405) had to be reduced to a reinforced platoon night combat ambush around the village and a day combat patrol through the village. The ambush was in position at 050455H where it remained until approximately 050645H when the patrolling phase commenced. At 050810H, the village had been thoroughly traversed with no VC contact. At this time the unit started moving back toward hill 69 (BT467068). The checkpoint at AnTan Bridge was manned by a fire team and National Police as usual.

C. Company G. Company G secured the MLR last night with four squad ambushes forward of the MLR. At 041930H, G-3, one of the aforementioned ambushes, spotted three VCS moving across a dike at (BT510068). The patrol immediately attempted to make radio contact with G-4, another patrol in the immediate vicinity, to assure coordinated action by the two units. However, G-3 spotted the three men before contact could be established. Since it was prior to curfew, the VCS were challenged by G-4. They fled in a Northwesterly direction and were promptly taken under fire. The VC returned four rounds of carbine fire and, despite the aggressive pursuit of the squad patrol, escaped. Today Company G has three combat squad size patrols operating in the LongBinh (BT506071) area being especially alert for evidence of the three VC engaged last night.

D. Company H. Extensive and aggressive patrolling was conducted by Co H last night and today. Three combat ambushes, squad size, were stealthily emplaced just after night fall forward of the MLR positions to intercept any VC who might have tried to penetrate the perimeter. Operating in the area 2,000 meters forward of the MLR, three squad combat patrols searched for VC today. There were no VC found in the area.

E. Snipers went to 1/4's range today to acquire new dope for their recently serviced weapons.

1. 2dBn, 4th Marines Operations

A. Company E. Last night, Company E was engaged in defending a downed UH-1B aircraft at (BS785425). They were engaged by a sizable VC unit during the hours of darkness and killed at least 17, captured 7 weapons, and suffered nine WIAs. A detailed account of the action will follow in the after action report.

B. Company F continued to control the AnTan Bridge by means of a checkpoint/roadblock. This is a combined effort by both USMC/PF teams and the National Police. Work is progressing in the construction of suitable, waterproof defenses at the Bridge, hill 69, and hill 76.

C. Company G. Four squad size ambushes protected the MLR from surprise probing last night. Today, three squad combat patrols are securing the area forward of the lines in an effort to search out and destroy VC. One platoon of Company G will combat patrol up Highway one 3,000 meters past District Headquarters, move West approximately 3,000 meters into the TAOR searching for VC, and then return to LyTin District Headquarters for pick up.

D. Company H was on standby until Company E returned this morning. Consequently, their night patrols were all cancelled. They are, however, conducting the normal three daylight squad patrols forward of the MLR.

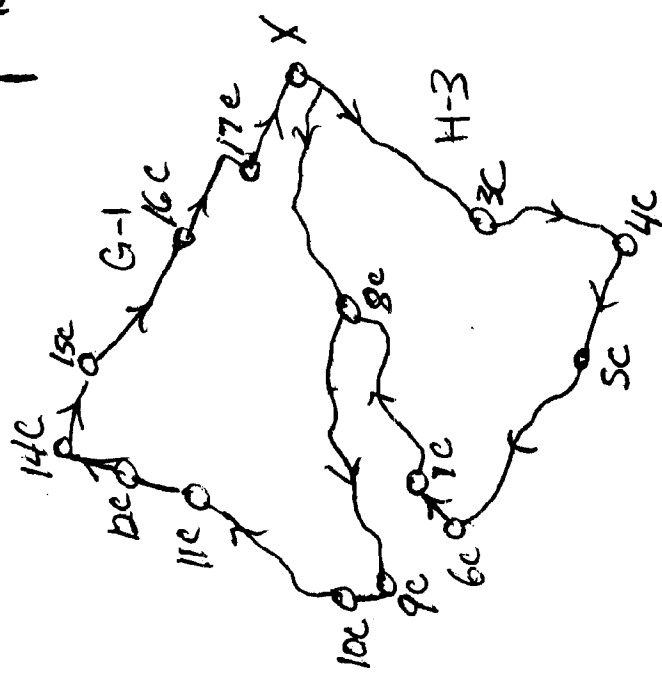

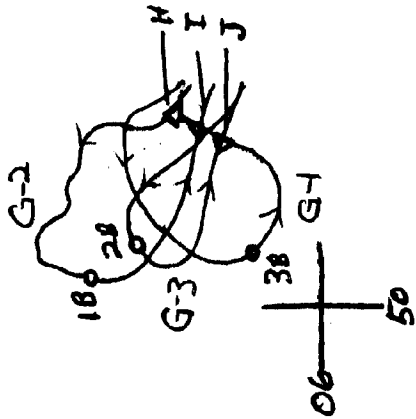

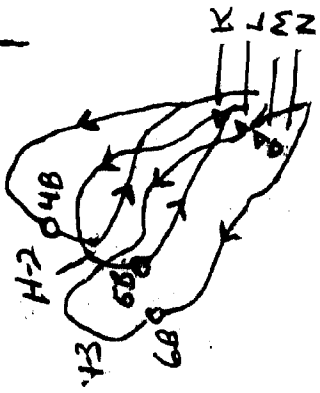

2d Bn, 4th Marines Operations.

A. Company E. Company E is the Regimental Reserve Company and is standing by to be committed upon notice from the Regimental Commander. They are providing a 90 man detail at the 4th Marine CP at 1145 this morning for a honor guard at General KRULAK'S presentation of awards ceremony. They are also on standby to reinforce the MLR in the 7th Marine TAOR.

B. Company F. Company F enforced the curfew along highway one from 062000H to 070600H with a physical roadblock at AnTan Bridge (BT497066). At 070645H the roadblock fire team was joined by the National Police and PF's to assist in searching vehicles passing through the roadblock position. One reinforced rifle platoon is occupying hill 76 and is continuing to improve their defensive positions. One reinforced rifle platoon and the Company Command Group is occupying and defending hill 69. They are continuously improving their positions. One reinforced rifle platoon is occupying and defending the AnTan Bridge and maintaining the roadblock on the North end of the bridge.

C. Company G. Company G provided four squad sized ambushes forward of the MLR in an effort to prevent probes and infiltrators from approaching the MLR. Three squad size day combat patrols are forward of the MLR to search for VC or evidence of VC activity in the area between the MLR and SongAnTan River.

D. Company H. Company H provided three squad sized ambushes forward of the MLR during the hours of darkness to destroy any would be snipers or infiltrators approaching the MLR. Three squad size day combat patrols are run 2,000 meters forward of the MLR searching for VC or signs of VC activity forward of their defensive positions.

E. H&S Company. The scout radar team is at coord (BT517063) operating the TFS/21. They have a surveillance of 300 meters forward with a left azimuth of 200 and a right azimuth of 130. The H&S Raiders are standing by to be committed at any place within the TAOR to reinforce any patrol or ambush.

F. Two 4.2 howtars are in position on hill 69 for any support requirements necessary within our TAOR.

1. 2d Bn, 4th Marines Operations

A. Company E. At 260255H a reinforced platoon from Co E moved to the Antan Bridge to reinforce the unit occupying that position. At 261030H the platoon returned to the MLF. The platoon patrol scheduled for this period was cancelled.

B. Company F remains as the Regimental Reserve Company. At 260410H, Co F (-) arrived at Antan Bridge to reinforce the unit occupying that position. At 260714H Co F (-) commenced on a thorough sweep of the vicinity around Antan Bridge, searching for VC HIA, weapons and other material. At 261000H Co F returned to The BnCP with nothing new to report. The Co operation (99-65) has been postponed.

C. Company H. At 252110H Hill 76 reported that the SID was detecting movement in their landing zone. Two rounds of illumination were fired. One rifle shot was heard after the first round. There was no further activity. At 252245H, Antan Bridge heard one round of small arms fire. A sampan was sighted moving South towards the bridge. Illumination was fired and the sampan was taken under fire. It then reversed its course and beached on the SW shore. A man emerged and swam across the river. He was taken under fire, results unknown. At 260235H the platoon received several incoming hand grenades and satchel charges. The VC attacked the NorthEast end of the bridge, appearing very suddenly to throw these grenades. Two Marines were killed and 9 wounded in the action. During this time a squad leader on the South side of the bridge sighted 6-7 men swimming down river towards the bridge. These men were taken under fire and they are believed killed. At 260245H the platoon began to receive small arms fire which lasted for several minutes. Fire was returned with the results unknown. At 260400H the platoon again received small arms fire which was returned with no casualties. Sporadic firing continued throughout the remainder of the night. At 260710H, while searching the area, one dead VC was pulled out of the river. Captured was a satchel charge and a French Sub-machine gun. The search also uncovered a log wrapped in explosives with a lead wire protruding from it. This was accompanied by a large satchel charge found in the same vicinity. Throughout the action artillery was used both for illumination and night defensive fires. A flare ship was also utilized from 0430H until daylight.

2. Plans Summary 261200H-271200H

A. Company E. At 270800H, one reinforced platoon will commence a day-light search and clear operation in the vicinity of KhuongNhon(2). Attached will be one squad of PF's and one interpreter.

B. Company F will remain as the Regimental Reserve Company.

C. Company G. At 270800H one reinforced platoon from Co G will commence their patrol vicinity E of Hill 22. Attached will be one squad of PF's, an interpreter and a scout sniper team.

4. Psy/War 19-26Dec65

1) During the week, MedCap treated 435 men, women, and children in An Tan (BT497066), Long Binh (BT506071), and Ky Phu (") (BT478047) villages. MedCap supplies were received this week so a full schedule can once again be undertaken.

2) A leaflet requested some weeks ago was received this week. It reads "we found your trap, next we will find you". It is to be left in place of any discovered mines, booby traps or punji pits. It is hoped to be particularly effective at the end of the rainy season.

3) An aircraft mounted loudspeaker will be made available to 2/4 during the early days of January for use in the TAOR. It comes with various pre-recorded messages, and the capability of using a message recorded by a local political Official.

4) Extensive use was made of the translation leaflet to enable the individual Marine to extract information from civilians. This has been particularly useful in grid squares (BT4310) and (BT4409), where the people are gradually beginning to feel secure enough to volunteer information on VC locations and plans.

5) Due to the extremely wet weather, leaflets were not extensively employed. It is anticipated that better results will be obtained this week.



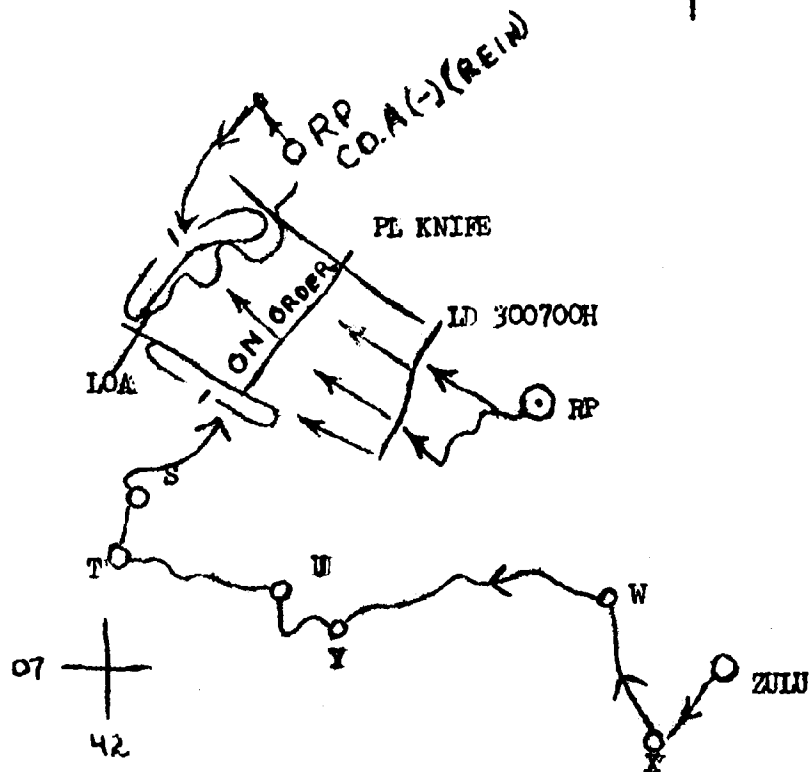

2. Narrative Account of Operation.

a. Company E departed the 2/4 outpost on hill 69 (BT468068) at 290100H and pro-

ceeded along assigned route. One PF casualty was incurred when he slipped and fell against a rifle barrel muzzle which lacerated the skin below his left eye. A bandage was applied and he was evacuated to B-Med at 290700H by helicopter.

B. At 290600 Company E was in position completely surrounding TinSen (BT445054) with two rifle platoons set in on the Western fringe of the hamlet. (See encl (1)). The Raider platoon and PF company were in position on the East side of the hamlet ready to sweep through the objective at first light. As the sweep commenced a Vietnamese male, about age 30, broke from the brush near the blocking force and attempted to escape from the encirclement. A Marine shouted DungLai(halt) twice and fired one round over the head of the fleeing VC. When he would not stop the Marine fired two rounds which struck and killed the VC. He was found to have 2 hand grenades, M-26, rolled in a black shirt. The sweeping force cleared the hamlet of all personnel which were moved to an assembly area while the PF's searched the hamlet. The PF Company Commander spoke to the people telling them why we were there and urged them not to help the VC. A VC flag was found in one house along with a hand made knife and a bear trap. When the people were released and sent home the woman who lived in the above mentioned house was captured and sent to ITF by helicopter as a VCS.

C. The search was completed by 291130H and the Company returned to hill 69. (See encl 1).

3. Problems Encountered and Lessons Learned.

a. Streams which are normally easily fordable become greatly swollen and are extremely hazardous during and after local or mountain rain storms. Night crossings must be executed with extreme caution. It is recommended the crossings be made by two facing each other holding each other's wrists.

b. The cordon or encirclement technique proved highly effective. The hamlet was somewhat isolated or set apart from neighboring hamlets. This is necessary for effective encirclement. The size of the operating force must be sufficient to station men about 15 to 20 meters apart covering three sides of the hamlet. The sweeping force covers the fourth side before and during sweeping operation. (See encl (2)).

2. Narrative Account of Operation.

a. The 4th Marines notified this Headquarters at 050815H to have one reinforced rifle platoon to stand by to be helilifted to the vicinity of QuangNgai

DECLASSIFIED

Province Headquarters. At 051000H the platoon was lifted out of landing zone Wildcat (BT533081) to Quang Ngai.

b. The remainder of the company was put on standby to be helilifted to Quang Ngai at 051200H. Also a section of 81's were put on standby to be helilifted with E Company (-). At 051500H E Company (-) reinforced with an 81mm mortar section attached was lifted out of landing zone Wildcat to Quang Ngai District Headquarters.

c. At 051730H the company received a frag order from ADC to secure the compound and the disabled helicopter at coord (BS793412). The company reinforced was helilifted from Quang Ngai Province Headquarters to (BS793412) and moved out toward the compound at (BS785425) at 051745H.

d. As the tactical column moved out the rear guard was fired on by what at first appeared to be friendly PF's. They received small arms fire and 60mm mortar fire. The fire was returned with no friendly casualties. The column continued to move toward its objective area.

e. After reaching the compound a complete sweep of the area was conducted finding no one in the area. An immediate defense was set up around the compound at 1830H. At 1900H a VC was killed in the moat on the west flank of the perimeter. He was seen completely submerged breathing through a straw floating in toward the perimeter.

f. At 051830H approximately 16 PAT's arrived at the compound and requested to be allowed to enter the compound. They were disarmed and admitted into the compound and placed in a large room guarded by 2 sentries.

g. As soon as it became dark the perimeter from all sides began receiving sniper fire and probes from VC trying to infiltrate. Constant movement was heard near the wire on the East flank. At 2300H 8 VC were seen at (BS785425) and 12 VC at (BS784425) all of which were moving East.

h. The probing continued until 060150H when an attack of at least one reinforced company came in waves on the East flank of the perimeter. The attack was touched off when the company OP bunker was hit with three 57 recoilless rounds. The attack continued for approximately 35 minutes supported with 3.5 inch 57 recoilless, 60mm and 81mm mortars.

i. The tactical and protective wire on the East flank was cut with wire cutters in at least one place and three bangalore torpedoes were also used to cut paths through the wire. With the protective wire virtually ineffective the attackers were thrown back time and time again only by the 2d platoons fire power.

j. The enemy mortar positions were so close to the perimeter that the muzzle flashes could be seen on various occasions. Using the 81mm and 60mm mortars as counter mortar weapons the VC were forced to fire only one or two rounds from each position before displacing.

k. Naval gun fire and 81mm mortar illumination was used until 060300H when a flare ship arrived on station.

1. During the attack the company sustained 26 WIA's which 5 required emergency evacuation. The med-evac plane arrived at 060330H and took onhit from a 50 cal as it was making its approach to land. All 5 casualties were removed from the compound with little difficulty.

m. At 060430H the flare plane had expended all of its illumination and the probes commenced again. It is believed at this time many of the VC casualties were removed from the battle field by the VC. At 0500H another attack was commenced using only 57 recoilless and mortars. At 0515H another flare plane arrived overhead and provided continuous illumination until daylight. Due to the low over cast, A4-E aircraft on station from 060300H to 060445H were unable to provide CAS.

n. The VC in the attack wore a variety of uniforms including black PT's gray shirts, green uniforms and some wearing helmets.

o. At first light a complete search of the area was made finding VC KIA and several weapons. Approximately 150 meters out from the perimeter numerous blood trails and bandages were found indicating that many wounded and dead were removed from the battle field.

p. At approximately 060715H extraction began from (BS782424) by helicopter. The entire company arrived back at the Battalion CP at approximately 061100H.

3. Problems Encountered and Lessons Learned.

(a) The distance to travel by helicopter was too far to be traveled with troops in flights of only two helicopters lifting the initial platoon to Quang Tri.

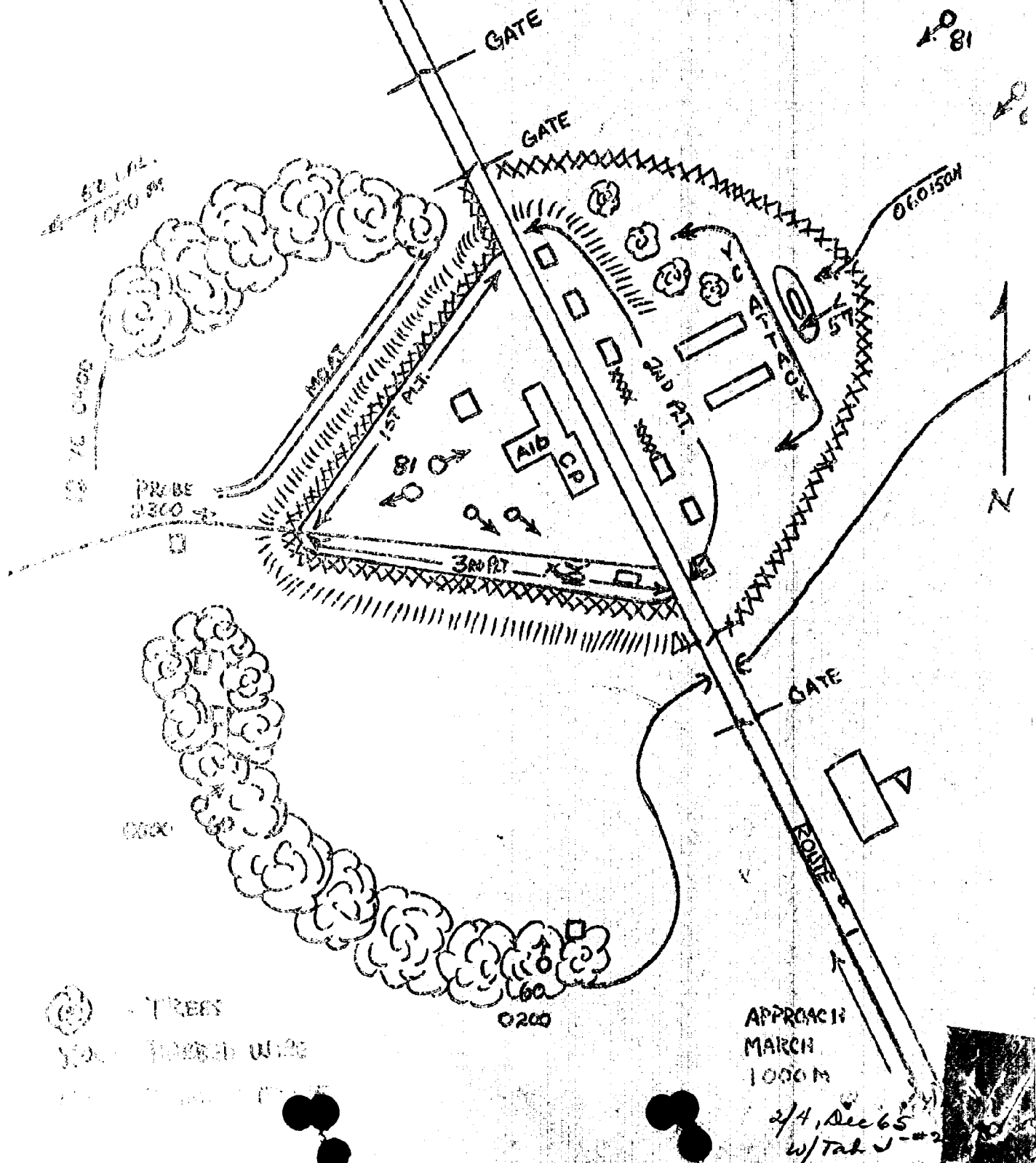
(b) The non-availability of maps for the objective area became critical when the entire company was committed with only 3 maps.

(c) The lack of any intelligence information in the objective area was a problem.

(d) The 60mm mortars were an invaluable aid in giving the company the indirect close in fire capability which is needed.

(e) Claymore mines would be an invaluable asset for any mission of this type.

2. Narrative Account of Operation.

a. At 101500H H&S Co. (-) moved by foot from Hill 69 to Ky Phu (2) and made contact with the PF Company.

b. At 102200H Co. F (-)(Rein) commenced movement by foot along designated route (See encl. 1) and proceeded without incident, arriving at blocking position at 110500H.

c. At 110200H, H&S Co. (-) and the Company of PF's moved along their designated route, (See encl. 1) and arrived at their assigned position to commence the sweep at 110630H.

d. At 110645H a fleeing Vietnamese male was apprehended at blocking position 3 (See encl. 1) On being questioned by the PF Company Commander he admitted to being a VC mainforce squad leader.

e. At 110700H the sweeping force apprehended a VC in the objective area who, after questioning, admitted to being a VC cell leader.

f. At 110930H the sweeping force uncovered a trip wire and a booby trapped hand grenade at coord. (BT441078). The booby trap was disarmed by the PF Company Commander.

g. At 111000H the operation was completed with no further contact, and all units returned to their assigned areas by their assigned routes. (See encl. 1)

h. Upon return to the Battalion CP, the VC were turned over to IPT for further questioning.

3. Problems Encountered and Lessons Learned.

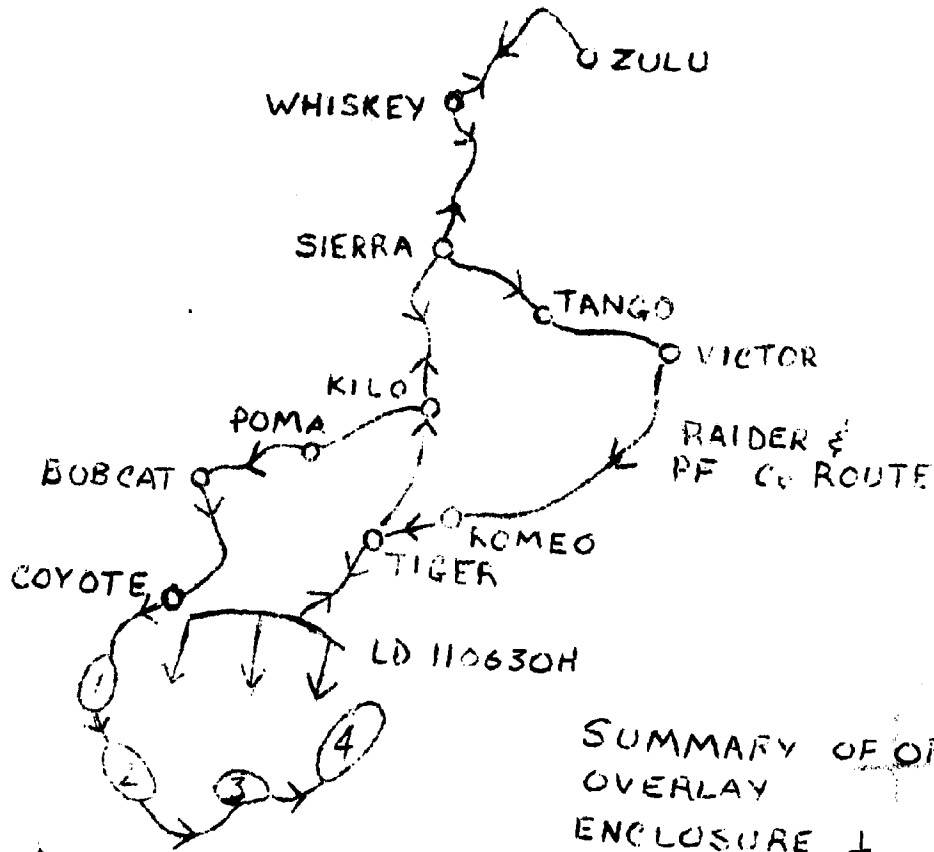
a. Navigation to the objective area was difficult due to poor visibility caused by heavy rainfall. The rain however, was a contributing factor in the undetected movement of the entire blocking force.

b. In an operation such as this, the employment of PF's with the searching force proved most effective, especially in a populated area.

a. Units Involved

b. Time. The operation was conducted between 161500H and 181200H.

c. Place. The operation took place in QuangTin Province, LyTin District, KySanh Village.

2. Narrative Account of Operation.

a. At 161500H, the Raider platoon moved by foot from AnTan Bridge to the hamlet of KyPhu(2) and made contact with the PF Company.

b. At 161930H, the PF Co(-) and the Raider platoon(-) moved by foot along designated routes (see encl 1) and proceeded without incident, arriving at ambush site at 162200H. The Command Post for both participating units in the operation was maintained at KyPhu(2).

c. At 170700H this operation was completed with no contact. Units returning to KyPhu 2, while enroute checked an area reported to have recently been booby trapped by VC (BT453053). Report was confirmed and units disarmed two (2) types of booby traps for analysis by S-2. These proved to be all pull string type, 3 of which were tomato can grenades and two pineapple grenades.

From 170930H to 171900H the platoon harboured in the vicinity of Ky Phu (2).

d. At 171900H the PF Co(-) and the other platoon (-) moved by foot along designated routes (see encl. 2) and proceeded without incident, arriving at ambush sites at 172300H. The Command Post for both participating units was maintained at KyPhu(2).

f. At 180900H this operation was completed with no contact. Units returning to KyPhu 2, were ordered to check out an area reported to be booby trapped and mined (BT440020). Sighting was made of one mine, size of a one (1) lb. coffee can, painted red. Unit was ordered to return without further checking the area. Units returned to KyPhu 2 at 181100H.

g. At 181200H Raider platoon moved by foot to AnTan Bridge arriving at 181300H.

3. Problems Encountered and Lessons Learned.

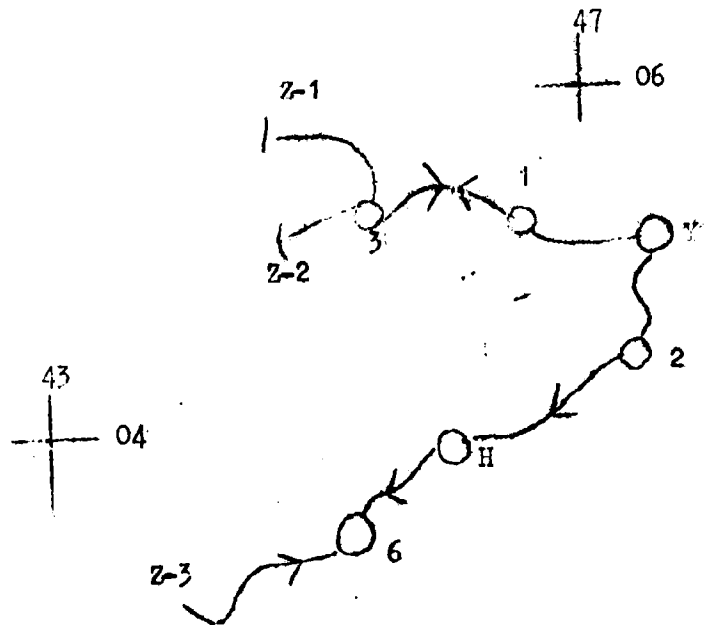
a. Navigation was difficult due to heavy rain. Small bridges were in water and many were washed away.

b. From a case of 12 new batteries, 7 were found to have no transmitting power. This shortage hindered communications to some extent and at 181000H communications were entirely out.

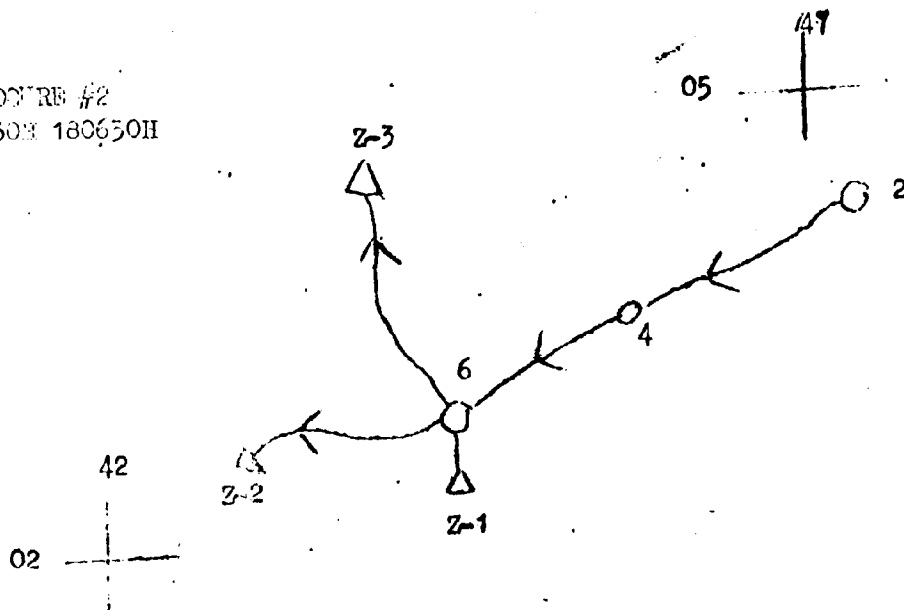

1. Statistical Data.

a. Units Involved

b. Time. The operation was conducted between 140700H and 181230H.

c. Place. The operation took place in the Harvest Moon Operations Area, QuangTin Province.

d. Casualties.

2. Narrative Account of Operation.

a. At 140700H, Company G departed from the Bn area enroute to the Forward Support Area, Task Force Delta.

b. At 141230H, the movement was completed with no casualties or unusual incidents.

c. At 141730H, Company G was deployed in defense of the LSA at positions coord(BT153449), (BT158448) and (BT156445).

d. At 142025H, 15 rounds of automatic weapons fire was received. Fire was returned and there were no casualties.

e. At 151520H, Company G was helilifted to the 3d Bn 3rd Mar position, coord (BT130286). The company was immediately deployed to relieve Lima Co, 3rd Mar.

f. At 151745H the helilift was completed and the Company had established defensive positions around the Bn Command Post. (see encl 1)

g. At 160700H Company G (-) (Rein) commenced a search and destroy operation at coord (BT130295).

h. At 161030H several caves were discovered at coord (BT131293). These caves were destroyed.

i. At 161100H at coord (BT128294) a rice cache of approximately 7 tons was uncovered. This rice was destroyed also.

j. At 161315H the Co returned to the Bn CP and resumed their defensive positions.

k. At 170955H, acting as Bn security, the Co moved out in a tactical column directed toward the LSA. (See movement order encl 1, 2)

l. At 171445H the column received some small arms sniper fire from (BT 154296). The fire was returned and the column continued its movement. There were no casualties.

m. At 171630H the column came to a swollen river and due to the hazards of crossing and the time involved, was ordered to Hill 34 (BT175313) in order to retract by helicopter.

n. At 171700H the unit was helilifted out of the area. One platoon (-) was transported to the LSA and the remainder of the Co was flown to the ARVN 5th Regt. Hdqs located at coord (BT237316).

o. At 171800H the Company (-) set in defensive positions in the vicinity of ARVN 5th Regt. Hdqs and remained at this position throughout the night. The platoon (-) at the LSA remained there during the night.

p. At 181000H the Company was reunited at coord (BT242318) and transportation departed, transplacing the Company back to its parent unit.

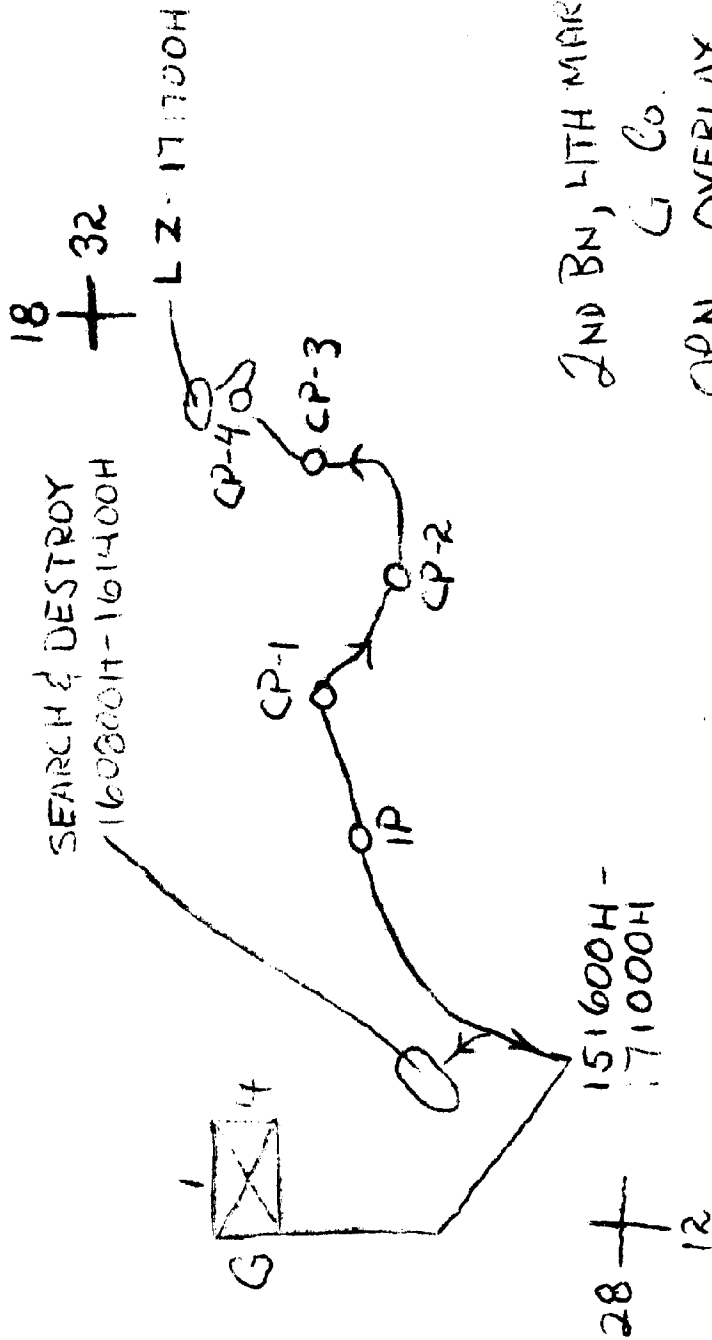
q. At 181230H Company G rejoined its unit and deployed at positions on the MLR of the 2nd Bn 4th Marines.

3. Problems Encountered and Lessons Learned.

a. The weather was extremely poor, forcing the individual Marines to spread out or bunch up as the navigational terrain dictated.

b. Throughout the operation communications was maintained using a PRC/25 on the Bn Tac Net and a PRC/10 on the Company TacNet. Communications at both the Co and Bn level are much more effective using a PRC/10 with each rifle platoon and a PRC/25 with the Company for use on the Battalion Tactical Net.

c. Place. The operation took place in the QuangTin Province, LyTin District.

2. Narrative Account of Operation.

a. At 292000H Co G(Rein), with one squad of PF's attached, departed from their assembly area (Hill 69) and moved by foot along their assigned route to occupy their blocking position on Hill 22.

b. At 300515H, 2ndBn(-)(Rein) 4th Marines departed from the BNCP by truck and moved to an assembly area on the MSR. At 300640H, 2ndBn(-)(Rein) 4th Marines departed the assembly area and moved up route #1 towards the LyTin District Headquarters, arriving at 300705H. Liaison with LyTin was completed and PF's were attached to the Bn. Two squads of PF's were attached to Company F and a Vietnamese American Adviser was attached to Company A, 4th Marines for the purpose of coord-

inating with the Regional Force at the OngBo Bridge, and to aid in guiding Co A into it's blocking position.

c. At 300700H Company G reported that they had successfully occupied the assigned blocking position coord (BT422093) to (BT426090) without any incidents.

d. At 300735H the convoy arrived at its initial release point.

e. At 300740H the sweeping force of Co F(Rein), the Bn Command Group, and the H&S Co Raiders began moving on their predesignated route to the LCD. Almost immediately after moving out, the lead platoon received four (4) rounds of incoming small arms fire from coord (BT445085). Fire was returned and 3 VCS were seen running to the East from this position. The Marines pursued, capturing 1 VCS and one wounded VC. The third VC, who is believed wounded, escaped.

f. At 300745H, Co G reported 10 VC at coord (BT425093). Simultaneously, Co G heard approximately 12 rounds of small arms fire. They were unable to determine the origin of the fire.

g. At 300818H, Co G reported approximately 5 VC moving from a village (BT 428094) NW to houses at (BT426094). Shortly after, 2 more VC were seen moving in the same direction. The scout sniper team attached took them under fire and saw one man fall.

h. At 300815H Co F, continuing towards the LCD, found and destroyed a booby trapped cave at coord(BT445095).

i. At 300830H, 2ndBn(-)(Rein) crossed the LCD and commenced their sweep of the objective area. Four VCS were then apprehended and turned over to the CIT for action. On interrogation, one of the VCS was released.

j. At 300843H, Co G received 3 rounds of small arms fire from coord(BT421094).

k. At 300845H, Co A had successfully established their assigned blocking position from coord (BT428106 to 422095).

l. At 301000H, Co F found and destroyed one anti-personnel pressure plate mine at coord (BT433094).

m. At 301055H, Co F found and destroyed one small cave at coord (BT424094). Co G found and destroyed 1 booby trapped M-26 grenade, a small cave and a well at coord (BT426091).

n. At 301118H, Co F found some documents appearing to be school books, coord (BT424094). They were brought in and turned over to the BnS-2.

o. At 301125H, 2ndBn(-)(Rein) reached the LQA at this time.

p. At 301145H, Co F found some documents appearing to be school books at coord (BT424095). They were turned over to the Bn S-2.

q. At 301150H, Co F found a 30 foot cave. Inside were some medical supplies and one Khaki uniform. The cave, at coord (BT426099) was destroyed. All captured equipment was turned over to Bn S-2.

r. At 301245H, Co A, 1/4 reported 2 VC moving SW at coord(BT420400). They were taken under fire with unknown results.

s. At 301250H, Co G moved from their position and rejoined the Bn. After a thorough search of the area, the Bn(-)(Main) commenced their move along the Song Trau River towards Route #1. At 301305H Co F found a cave with civilian clothes and some corn. The cave was destroyed and the captured material was turned over to the Bn S-2. Continuing on their route, two M-16 anti-personnel mines were found by Co F in the vicinity of the previous mentioned cave(BT426098). The mines were destroyed.

t. At 301515H, all units reached Route #1 in the vicinity of the Gravel Bridge. Retraction was begun, commencing with Co A, followed by Co G, Command Group and Co H.

u. At 301700H all participating units had been returned to their regular assigned positions.

3. Problems Encountered and Lessons Learned.

a. The Mighty Mite Blower (Smoke machine) proved to be very effective. Several hidden exits were discovered by the use of the machine.

b. Both the EOD and the CIT personnel attached to the Bn for this operation proved extremely helpful in the destruction of mines and the immediate interrogation of captured civilians.

c. The PKC-25 was used and communications was therefore excellent throughout the operation.

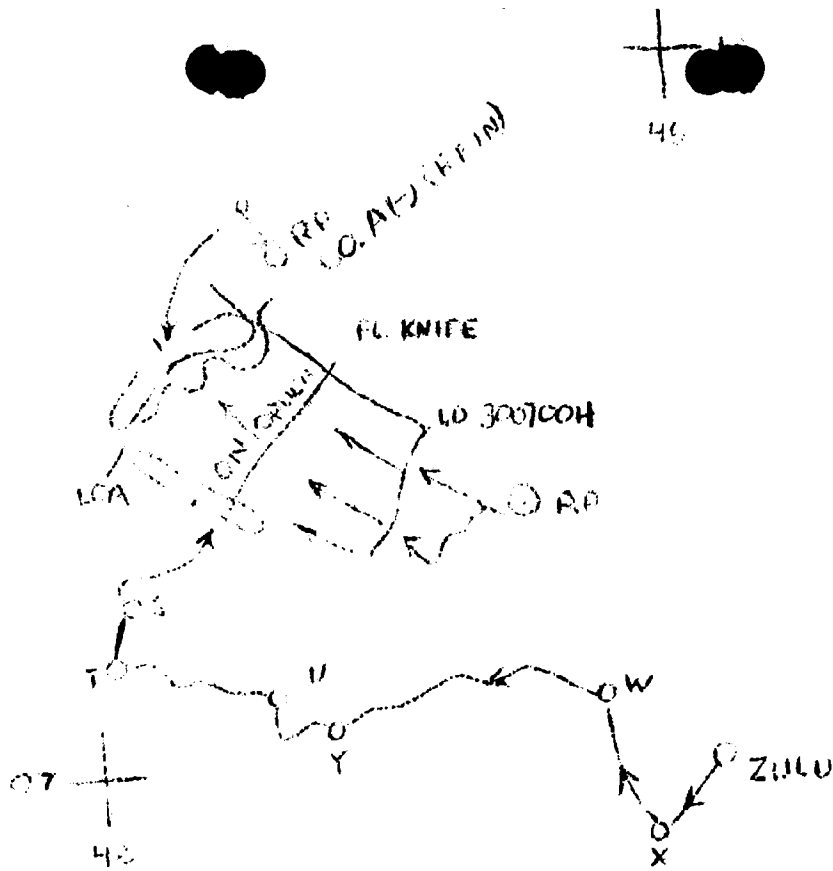
d. One of the most difficult problems encountered during this operation was searching the river banks of the Song Trau River for submerged cave entrances. This obstacle required the utilization of skilled divers and boats to conduct a thorough search from the water side. A request was made for the attachment of a Reconnaissance platoon to conduct this portion of the operation; however, this request was disapproved as not being a proper mission for this type unit. The Song Trau River is characterized by steep banks and heavy overhanging vegetation which made it practically impossible to check from the land-side. This resulted in only a limited search of the river.

(2) The rabies case and the fractured foot in AnTan continues to receive daily treatment. Both children are responding well.

(c) General Information.

B. Narrative Report

(A) Medical Assistance. One Med-Cap was held today at Long Binh.

The two Vietnamese children in Anfan who require daily treatment are continuing to receive it. One is being treated for rabies, the other for injuries sustained in a motorcycle accident.

(B) A young man, NG NG C THANG, claimed to be injured by a five ton 6x6 truck at LyTin yesterday. He wanted either 5,000 piastres or a chest x-ray. When told by the CAO that he would be taken to B-400 for x-ray, he relented and asked for 4,000 piastres. He claimed it was for the damage done to his property. A report was filed by LyTin District on the accident yesterday. It is the opinion of Mr. BUCH, the District Medical Chief and the CAO that the boy's claim is unjustified. No further action is contemplated.

(C) Mr. BUCH contacted the CAO about getting a truck to tow his broken down 4x4 1/4 ton truck to HMM. The truck is used by the LyTin Dispensary and HMM has volunteered to repair the clutch plate if he can get it there.

NOTE: 9th Motors will be contacted and asked to provide a wrecker for a few minutes tomorrow morning. M

Mr. BUCH was informed that Medical supplies in bulk cannot be turned over to him for fear of the VC stealing them. A request was made for materials to build a dispensary in KySanh(1) village.

NOTE: The matter will be discussed with the Regimental CAO.

The CAO was approached by a man in LyTin District who wanted help to go with the line a VC controlled area not far from Hill 69 to bring his sick family out. Capt. PERKINS informed the CAO that Capt. PITCH was aware of this situation.

NOTE: None planned until it is ascertained why Capt. PITCH has not gone after these people.

The LyTin Army sub-sector advisory team has some information concerning the inoculation of the local civilians against plague and cholera. Doctor PITCHER, the 2/4 surgeon, will contact the Army Medic at LyTin to help co-ordinate the vaccination.

A minor labor dispute over the construction of 2/4's Chapel was settled today with Mr. BUCH, KySanh village chief.


(B) Contacts with Local Personnel

The name of the boy who was bitten by a mad dog in AnTan yesterday is Vo Cam. His treatment started today.

Yesterday, it was reported that Mr. CAI, whose truck was towed to BKK through the courtesy of KLSU motor transport, did not have a legitimate contract with BKK for repairs. A call was received this morning to the contrary. As it turns out, Mr. CAI is the anti-malaria Officer from TamKy and is currently working on a project in Ky Lien village.

(A) Medical Assistance

Two Med-Caps were held today. One at Longbinh and one at the base of Hill 69.

(B) Dental Assistance

A small boy, B. I. XO, of KHONG THO (2) (BT4606), was diagnosed to have a seriously abscessed tooth. Arrangements were made through AF TIE District Headquarters with the Hamlet Chief to insure that the child is brought to the AF TIE Dispensary on Wednesday morning when a dentist will treat him.

(C) Dealing With Local Personnel

A trip was made by Captain TICH, Captain DUFFEN, and the CAO under the escort of the 1st platoon to KhungThe(1) (BT4607) to follow up the action taken when an accidental bombing strike was made in that village. It was discovered that the Vietnamese had done very little to aid the stricken families. The claims had not been properly made, the damage had not been assessed so that a settlement could be received. The equipment provided by the 4th Marines had been partially used, and in general the situation displays a lack of concern by the local Vietnamese to help themselves.

Contact was made with a woman from Khungbung, (BT4310) who was concerned about her sister. The sister is one of two women evacuated to 2-Med yesterday morning with bullet wounds. The woman says they were shot by VC, the wounded woman claims they were shot by Marines.

The CAO will investigate and make a report ASAP so that a proper settlement may be reached. The same woman reported that in her village many people are sick with a swollen arms and legs. No positive diagnosis has been made as yet.

The first English class was conducted at Kylien village school today. The students are all educated men, mostly school teachers themselves and all are valuable contacts. Their friendship and confidence gained through daily contact may be very useful.

Voody, a PF in Chulai hamlet is suffering from an unknown illness that has him immobilized. The Kylien village chief requested that 2/4 examine and treat him. 2/7 was sent out, since Chulai is in their FAOR, and Dr. MEDA of 2/7 is treating him now.
