PART II

NARATIVE SUMMARY

The Second Battalion, 4th Marines opened the month on a search and destroy operation in the eastern portion of the Mai Loc area. Extensive patrolling was conducted which accounted for the destruction of a number of bunker complexes. On 3 January, a night ambush from Company G captured an NVA soldier, in full uniform and carrying an AK-47. Company G also discovered two NVA graves. On 4 January, Company G suffered one KIA and two WIA's from a command-detonated claymore. A thorough search of the area for the person who set off the wine produced negative results.

On & January, the Battalion (-) assumed the defense of Vandegrift Combat Bas: and Calu. The following day, the defense of Elliot Combat Base was also assumed by 2/4 (-). On 11 January, the Battalion moved to the 3d Marine Division R and R Center at Cua Viet for Battalion R and R, where they stayed until 15 January. At that time, 2/4 returned to the VOB area where they took over the defense of VCB, Elliot Combat Base, FSB Fuller, and the Khs Gia Pridge with the help of Company K, 3/4 who was chopped open to the Battalion. Security patrols and night ambushes were sent out daily at all positions.

On 17 Vabrary, while retaining responsibility for the defense of Elliot Combat Pasa, FSM Fuller, and the Khe Gia Bridge, 2/4 (-) began a two-company search and destroy operation to the east and northeast of Elliot Combat Pasa. Aggressive patrolling resulted im the destruction of many enemy bunker complexes and the discovery of a considerable amount of enemy equipment. On 20 January, the two sweeping companies lifted to LS Sierra, with the Alpha Command Group, to conduct operations in that area. Company F, the first unit into the LZ, received small arms fire while Flying into, and landing in, the LZ. Fixed wing strikes, gunships, and AO's suppressed the fire and no casualties were suffered. Company H, moving to its night position, found an enemy body at TD 937629. On 22 January, elements of the Alpha Commano Group found two NVA bodies in a shallow grave. Large amounts of enemy gear were found in this area, as well as numerous bunker complexes.

On 24 January, Companies E and H, joined by Company F, heli-lifted to the LZ Comet area (YD 046636) to conduct a search and destroy operation. On 25 January, the Pattalion was relieved of the responsibility of defending Elliot Combat Base, FSB Fuller, and the Khe Gia Bridge. That day, Company H found three MVA bodies. Elements of Company F fired upon three NVA who were spotted moving back into the foliuge at YD 043675. Fixed wing and artillery were called in with unknown results. The next day Company F found two enemy graves at YD 066647. On 27 January, Company H discovered a cache of enemy equipment at YD 033572.





While moving the gear to an LZ, they received twenty-five rounds of incoming 60mm mortar fire from the vicinity of YD 033681.

Immediate counter-mortar fire from 60mm nortars and artillery suppressed the fire, but Company H suffered one KIA and nine WIA's

suppressed the fire, but Company H suffered one KIA and nine WIA's. On 28 January, Company F discovered a grave site at YD 061647 which produced twenty-six bodies. The following day, Company H took thirty incoming 60mm mortar rounds at YD 045374. Countermortar fire silenced the enemy tube, and only two WIA's were taken. The Alpha Command Group also book two rounds of incoming artillery, which was believed to be friendly. No casualties were suffered. Om 30 Fanuary, a unit from Company E, 2/3, which was under this Battalion's opcon, suffered one WIA when they triggered a claymore tripwing. That same day, a squad patrol from Company G was fired upon at YD 082751 by Friendly aircraft and antillery that resulted in Ill WIA's. The matter is now under intensive investigation. On 31 January, a unit from Company F, while moving to a night ambush position around dusk, made contact with an enemy force of unknown size. 87 mm moretars and artillery fire were called in, after which the unit set in to observe the area until it could be searched in the morning. Company F suffered one WIA.

During operations in this area, a significant number of bunkers were destroyed and large amounts of enemy equipment were captured

due to aggressive and conscientious patrolling activities.

E. COMMUNICATIONS AND ELECTRONICS

- 1. Wing: The wire section encountered no problems during the month of January. Communications were generally good. Wire crows were involved, for the most part, in maintenance work.
- 2. Radio: Radio communications have been generally satisfactory despite the frequent moves made by the Esttalian. Communication with 2/4 Rear and 2/4 Forward had been rather poor because of the distance involved. This problem was solved by the use of improved antennas.
 - 3. Message Center: No significant events.

F. LOGISTICS

l. During the month of January, the Pattalion moved several times and was at the RAR site for four days. Normal resupply problems were encountered due to a shortage of transportation, i.s., trucks and helicopters. Rifle cleaning gear and helmets are still a critically short item. The continued shortage of helmets and hody armor creates a large problem in that newly joined personnel cannot be moved forward without them. BA 386 radio hatteries are no longer in a critically short supply status.

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G. MEDICAL AFFAIRS

- 1. Significant Events: On 29 January 1969, HM3 Raymond DIPPER was awarded a Bronze Star with Combat "V" and HM2 Jon HINZ was awarded the Navy Commendation Medal by General CARNEY. These awards were received for outstanding action while serving with a line company.
- 2. New Developments: An all out program is well under way to bring our immunization program up to date. We are in the process of giving immunizations in the field to up-date each individual's immunization record. Immunizations are available daily now at the Rear BAS, and this overall improved program is achieving desired results.

The Battalion Medical Resupply has been made available at the FBAS, which is presently located at Vandegrift. This makes it possible for a faster, more efficient resupply of medical

supplies to each individual line company.

Dr. J.E. FRANGER LT MC UNSR, Battalion Surgeon, has set up a medical ward at the FBAS with the help of a very capable staff working with him. This makes it possible to give better individual care to the patients, which in turn makes it possible to return men to duty much faster, since they need not be sent further to the reer at Quang Tri as in the past.

3. Problem Areas: At the present time, we lack adaquate space at the Rear EAS for Supply and Living Quarters. Supply is now located in a tent, making many security items susceptible to theft. A work request has been submitted to provide SEA huts to improve this situation.

The Rear BAS is in need of a typewriter to handle the work loads of Administration, Health Records and Supply Departments. At the present time a privately owned portable typewriter is

being used.
