

#### PART II

### NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of May, 2d Battalion, 4th Marines participated in Operation Purple Martin and Operation Herkimer Mountain which began on 9 May. At the beginning of the month, the Battalion conducted a search and destroy operation in the area north of FSB Neville, while one company provided security for that fire support base. The next part of the month was spent at the R and R Center at the Cua Viet beach, with two companies providing security for the Center while two companies participated in the R and R. Returning to Vandegrift Combat Base, the Battalion assumed responsibility for the security of VCB, FSB Cates, Hill 691, Hill 950, and Signal Hill. They also maintained the Sparrow Hawk/Bald Eagle capability. At a change of command ceremony at Vandegrift Combat Base on 6 May, LTCOL W.C. BRITT relieved LTCOL J.E. HOPKINS as Commanding Officer of 20 Battalion, 4th Marines.

During the period 1-31 May, operations were characterized by extensive patrolling and ambushing. In all, one hundred and eighty-three patrols were run and one hundred and fifty-two ambushes were established. Contact with the enemy was very light occurring on only eight occasions that produced seven enemy KIA's and two friendly KIA's. During the month, the Battalion took incoming rockets or mortars on ten different occasions, for the most part while providing security for VCB. There was one incident in which the enemy fired .50 caliber machine guns at helicopters attempting to resupply a company and one incident which involved a land mine.

On 25 May, the Battalion underwent an FMF Pac inspection with mixed results.

- 1. Conducted seven patrols and six ambushes.
- 2. 106 Recoilless Rifle Platoon moved to Quang Tri to assume the responsibility for convoy security.
- 3. Company H reported movement outside their lines at XD 627616 on the previous night. A claymore was detonated and the listening posts were recalled to the perimeter. Small arms, 60mm mortars, and 81mm mortars were fired at the suspected movement as an artillery mission was called on the area. The following morning the area was thoroughly searched with negative results.
- 4. Company F observed one NVA at XD 858618. Artillery was fired on the enemy location and an AO came on station. The AO observed one NVA in a bunker and two NVA running across an open area. Fixed wing was run on the enemy position. The AO reported one NVA killed by artillery.
- 5. Company E reported hearing movement and saw figures in front of their position at XD 793620 at 2100. Small arms, illumination and 60mm mortars were fired and grenades were thrown at the suspected enemy position. A thorough search of the area produced negative results.

- 1. Conducted seven patrols and nine ambushes.
- 2. 2nd Platoon, Company H, ran into an enemy ambush at XD 831627. Enomy initiated ambush by detonating a claymore mine killing two friendlies and wounding one. The enemy then opened up with small arms fire. 2d Platoon returned fire and called in artillery on the suspected enemy position. Two enemy were killed by



artillery fire. After 2d Platoon swept through the area, they set up security and modevaced casualties.

- 3. 2d Platoon, Company F, landed and set up security at XD 901598 for a downed CH 46. 2d Platoon extinguished the fire and began removing the twelve bodies, and collecting all personal effects. All gear, ammunition and weapons were removed or destroyed by the 2d Platoon.
- 4. 3rd Platoon, Company F, landed at XD 913611 and set up security for two UHLE's, one of which had a damaged rotor. The personnel of the second UHLE had removed the damaged UHLE's weapons and were preparing it to be lifted out by holicopter. 3rd Platoon conducted a search for a SID device said to be in the area with negative results. 3rd Platoon found one M-16. 3rd Platoon was then heli-lifted back to their CP.
- 5. Company E reported losing one Marine from their cdumm while moving in the vicinity of XD 799629 at 1615. The area was thoroughly searched with negative results. Area search was continued.




