5. Terrain and weather:

- a. The terrain in the PHU BAI area is low rolling hills cut by swampy gullies. The TAOR is split to the right of center by a prominent ridgeline dominated at the north end by Hill 180,

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the commanding terrain in the TAOR. The south end of the TAOR contains a series of high hills and ridgelines which separate very distinct East-West corridors. There is a small fordable river in the northern portion of the TAOR. There is very little foliage except in the southwest portion of the TAOR, and the similiarity of the appearance of the hills at night makes night navigation very difficult.

- b. The weather is predominately hot and humid. Daytime highs range from 85 to 120 degrees farenheight with an average humidity of 85%. There have been several days of rain and thunderstorms with temperatures in the 70's.

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NARRATIVE

1965

1 June

Co K patrolled vic of grid square YD 8405, discovered a total of 27 huts that had apparently been occupied the week prior. Some had been occupied within the previous 24 hours. Huts contained caches of clothing, ammunitions, medicine, and communications repair parts.

Co C, 3rd Recon Bn patrolled during the day and set night ambushes in right sector of TAOR.

Co M maintained security of airfield; Co's I and L maintained security of the Bn CP.

The June Rotation Draft, consisting of 47 Marine enlisted and 2 Navy enlisted hospitalmen departed this command.

2 June

Co K patrolled left sector of TAOR utilizing plat size patrols. At 1145, 2nd Plat, Co K received 10 rds small arms fire from 4 men at vic YD 820064. The fire was returned, the enemy was pursued and an Arty mission was called on vic YD 811067. Coverage was excellent but surveillance was negative. 2nd Plat, Co K continued on patrol and at 1410, received 2 rds small arms fire from across SONG TA TRACH River while departing THUONG PHUONG Village at YD 800070. 1st Plat, Co K received 6 to 8 rds of 60mm Mortar rds at 841056, 200 meters from 1st plat position. An Arty mission was fired on the possible mortar position at 846057 and 849054. Negative surveillance on these two targets. 1st Plat, Co K located and destroyed 3 huts vic 839597 and 840055 and 2 huts vic 843050. Well prepared holes were found along the approaches leading into these positions. A medical team from B Med and one rein plat of Co L departed at 0830 for a "people to people" medical assistance visit to the village of CHIET BI HA. The team was well received, and treated approximately 130 persons, mostly for minor skin rashes, etc. Co M maintained security of airfield; Co's I and L maintained security of CP. Co C, 3rd Recon Bn conducted daylight patrols and night ambushes in right sector of TAOR.

3 June

Co I replaced Co B, 3rd Recon in right sector of TAOR. Co C, 3rd Recon returned to CP. Co I conducted daylight patrols and night ambushes in their sector. Co I patrol at 1853 reported having found and destroyed 1 hut dug into stream bank at YD 812108. Hut contained lamp and mess gear and appeared to have been used within past week. Co M remained at airfield as security force. At 1035 Major Generals KIER and ROBERTSHAW, USMC, AIR FMF PAC, visited this command and were briefed by the Bn CO. At 1425 General WESTMORELAND, USA and Major General WALT, USMC visited this command and were briefed by the Bn CO.

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4 June

See After Action Report #5 attached as a supporting document.
Co C, 3rd Recon Bn returned to right sector TAOR in the vicinity of LANG XA Village (830120) to destroy land mine and then to stay in right sector to conduct daylight patrols.
Co C, 3rd Recon and Co I set up night ambushes in the right sector of TAOR; Co K conducted daylight patrols and set up night ambushes in the left sector of TAOR.

5 June

At 0331, H&S Co sector of Bn CP perimeter was probed by one unknown. One illumination hand grenade was thrown and 4 rds small arms fired. Unknown fled with negative results.
At first light a sweeping operation was conducted sweeping southwest along KHE LA River to 806093. Units involved were Co C Recon and Co L (-) conducting the sweep with 2 plats. Co M manning a blocking position via YD 803093. M Co (-) was helo landed after Arty preparation at YD 803093, and L Co (-) was landed at YD 814124. This sweep resulted in negative enemy sightings. Co C Recon located and burned one hut containing three mattresses at YD 805096.
At 1752, one tank exploded land mine at YD 809114, damaging one track. Tank was returned to tank park on 6 June assisted by two other tanks. One infantry squad was security of tanks. C Recon also maintained a night position at that location.
At 2200, CP #1 on Hwy #1 was probed. Sniperscope operator shot one man, saw him fall and attempted to keep him under surveillance. Firing into CP #1 from opposite flank distracted operator and when scope was brought back to vic of downed man, he had been removed. No friendly casualties were suffered.

6 June

At 0717, 2 tanks departed to assist damaged tank. Eng mine clearing team was dispatched to clear return route for tanks.
Co C, 3rd Recon Bn departed position at YD 815115, to reconnoiter south-east to Hill 101 (YD 828086), then SE to vic YD 849967, east to vic YD 870065, then north to YD 877096, where they set in a night ambush. Bloodstains and footprints leading north were found on trail at vic YD 822084.
Co K (-) and Co I conducted daylight patrols and night ambushes in their assigned sectors.
One plat patrol of Co I patrolled along stream bed from YD 832118 to YD 811105. Many harboring sites were discovered with one at YD 815109 containing fresh blood. Other sites appeared to have not been used in past 24 hours. Numerous items of clothing, pieces of cloth and 3 bloody ponchos were confiscated as well as 105 rd, 7.62mm in 5rd clips, 17 kpd block TNT and 1 Chinese type concussion grenade.

7 June

Co M (-) replaced Co K (-) in left sector of TAOR.
Co K w/1 plat of Co M (Reaction Force) assumed defense of airfield.
Co M (-) conducted daylight patrols and night ambush in assigned sector.
Co L (-) replaced Co I (-) in right sector of TAOR.
1st Plat, Co M replaced 2nd Plat, Co I on CP 2291.
Co I assumed defense of Bn CP.
Co C, 3rd Recon Bn was returned to Bn CP area.
Co L patrol found intelligence information at YD 821117 that indicated a planned attack for the future on an ARVN outpost at HA TRUNG (YD 970105). This information was reported to all interested intelligence agencies.

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- 7 June At 2119, Road CP #1 received 2 incoming rds of small arms fire from a SE direction. No casualties were sustained and no fire returned. At 2310, a grenade (type unknown) exploded approximately 15 meters outside of perimeter protective wire in vic of CP #1. No casualties were sustained. Approximately 5 rds small arms fire were fired by CP #1 into direction that grenade was thought to have come from with negative results.
- 8 June At 0725, Co C, 3rd Recon was returned to the Bn CP. Co L (-) and Co M (-) conducted daylight patrols and night ambushes within their respective sectors of the TAOR. A medical team from B Med with a plat (rein) of Co I departed at 0815, for PHU BAI #3 Village for a "people to people" medical assistance visit. They treated approximately 100 person, most of which were women and children.
- 9 June Co I (-) and Co M (-) conducted daylight patrols and night ambushes in the TAOR.
At 1405, an Arty mission was fired on coord YD 800053. Target 15 to 20 troops; excellent coverage; negative surveillance.
At 1500, an Arty mission was fired on coord YD 794083. Target 5 troops; excellent coverage; negative surveillance.
2nd Plat, Co M located 16 huts vic YD 849075.
At 1815, an Arty mission was fired by evening helo recon flight at coord YD 835045. Target suspected VC harbor site; excellent coverage; negative surveillance.
At 1930, an Arty mission was fired at coord YD 811109. Target troops in brush; excellent coverage; negative surveillance.
- 10 June Co L (-) and Co M (-) conducted daylight patrols and night ambushes in the TAOR. Co L (-) patrol located and destroyed 3 bamboo huts and one submerged bamboo bridge at vicinity YD 800065. Co M (-) patrol destroyed 16 huts at vicinity YD 844095, that they had located late afternoon of 9 June. Co L (-) Arty FO adjusted Arty fire mission for 1st ARVN Division at YD 800048. Target: troops in open.
Btry I, 3/12, fired the following missions called by HMM 365, Recon Flight: 0625, suspected bivouac area, YD 843049; 0653, suspected bivouac area, YD 822053. Excellent coverage on targets with negative sightings.
Co "C", 3rd Recon Battalion set in one platoon night ambush at YD 894112. Negative contact.
- 11 June Co "C" Recon Platoon ambush returned at first light to Battalion CP. Co M (-) conducted daylight patrols and a night ambush in the left sector of TAOR. A medical assistance, ten from "B" Med and one platoon of Co I departed at 0830, for a "People to People" Mission at CHIET BI HA Village. Treated 140 persons, mostly women and children of which approximately 70% were returnees for treatment. Seven cases of pneumonia were treated. The team was received very well and returned to this CP at 1150. At 1857, the evening helo recon flight sank a vessel at YD 799067.

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- 12 June Co L (-) and Co M (-) conducted daylight patrols and night ambushes in their respective sectors of the TAOR. Co K maintained security of airfield, Co I the Battalion CP. Co M patrol located and destroyed 5 huts at vicinity YD 858101. Co L patrol located propaganda material which were processed through intelligence channels. At 1045, HMM 161, assumed support of PHU BAI critical area. HMM 365, relieved. Co "C", 3rd Recon manned two platoon size night ambushes; one at 892122 and one at 899133. At 0930, Brigadier General CHUAN, Commander General, 1st Division, Army of Republic of Vietnam presented combat awards to 19 members of this Battalion. (See supporting documents.)
- 13 June Co L (-) and Co M (-) conducted daylight patrols and night ambushes in TAOR. Co K maintained security of airfield; Co I the Battalion CP, Co "C", 3rd Recon manned one platoon night ambush at YD 894120. 3rd Platoon, "B" Company, AT Battalion, and 106mm RR Platoon conducted daylight FIREX in left sector vicinity YD 879110.
- 14 June Co M assumed defense of airfield perimeter. Co L assumed defense of Battalion CP. Co K (-) assumed patrol and ambush mission in right sector of TAOR; one platoon (rein) to OP 225. Co I (-) assumed patrol and ambush mission in left sector of TAOR; one platoon to airfield as reaction force. Co I (-) and Co K (-) conducted daylight patrols and night ambushes in TAOR.
- 15 June Co K (-) and Co I (-) conducted daylight patrols and night ambushes in TAOR. Co L (-) and "C" Recon set a night ambush on the SONG TA TRACH in accordance with Battalion Frag Order 6-65. (See supporting documents.)
- 16 June Co K (-) and Co "C", 3rd Recon executed the river ambush as set forth in Frag Order 6-65 (Attached). One boat was ambushed. One body was seen floating and one body on boat was seen to fall on boat. One enemy KIA and one enemy WIA not confirmed. Co I (-) conducted daylight patrols and a night ambush in their sector of the TAOR. At 0735, Btry I, 12th Marines displaced back to their positions within the perimeter.
- 17 June At 0800, S-1, S-2, S-3 and one platoon of Co "C", 3rd Recon departed on motorized patrol of Zone "A". This was an observation patrol to familiarize persons with the village characteristics and terrain features within Zone "A". Co M (-) and Co I (-) conducted daylight patrols and night ambushes in their sectors of the TAOR. At 1550, OP 225, spotted three unknowns at YD 829060, who appeared to be observing OP 225. An Arty mission was fired on the location with good target coverage. An observation flight at 1728, observed no movement in the target area.

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- 18 June Co I (-) and Co K (-) continued missions of daylight patrols and night ambushes in their respective sectors. Co "C", 3rd Recon conducted two platoon sized night ambushes on left and right flanks of Highway CP #1 at YD 894122 and YD 898135.
- 19 June Co K (-) manned a blocking position on the east bank of The SONG TA TRACH in grid square YD 8109, in support of a 1st ARVN Division operation which started on the west side of the river. After the ARVN unit had moved north, Co K (-) made a sweep up the western edge of the TAOR. Co K (-) made no contact, but the ARVN unit captured 18 known VC in the Village GIA LE. Co I (-) conducted daylight patrols and night ambushes in the left east sector of the TAOR. Btry I, 3/12, fired mission on suspected VC OP at YD 895102 at 0906. Co I (-) patrolled area after completion of the mission with negative results.
- 20 June At first light, Co K (-) was returned to the airfield perimeter. One platoon of Co K remained on OP 225 until 0830, when they were relieved by 2nd Platoon of Co L. Co M (-) replaced Co K (-) in the right (west) sector of the TAOR. One platoon of Co M remained at airfield as a reactionary force. Co M (-) conducted daylight patrols and night ambushes in the right (west) sector of TAOR. Co I (-) conducted daylight patrols and night ambushes in the TAOR. One Arty section (3 guns) displaced forward to YD 883091 to fire concentration data and then were returned to Btry position. At 1225, Co M (-) received three rounds small arms fire from vicinity YD 800105. A reaction platoon (28 men) of Co I were heli-lifted to area to assist Co M (-) sweep area. Sweep results were negative and Co I platoon was returned to airfield at 1545. At 2050, 2107 and 2110 Arty fired missions outside TAOR at request of 12th ARVN Arty.
- 21 June As of 0730, this Battalion's TAOR was extended to include Zone "A". Co. K(-), H&S (-) one plt of "C" Recon, Bn. CO and S-1, S-2, & S-3 patrolled through THUY PHU district of Zone "A" to familiarize personnel of this Bn. with the area and become acquainted with the local populace. At 1325 this Command was visited by Lieutenant General THROCKMORTAN, USA; Major General WALT, USMC, Commanding General, 3d Marine Division and Colonel WHEELER, USMC, Commanding Officer, 3d Marines.
- 22 June Co. "M" (-) was helo lifted into eastern sector where they conducted daylight patrols and night ambushes. Co. "I" Arty. FO team and H&S Co. (-) conducted patrol through THUY LUONG village in order to familiarize personnel with area and to pick out approaches to villages, and possible Arty. and mortar concentrations. One section of "I" Btry. (3 guns) displaced forward to YD 883091 for firing H&I fires during night and then to return to Btry. position 23 June.

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- 23 June** Forward Arty. section returned to Btry. position. Co. "I", Arty. FO team and H&S Co.(-) conducted patrol Through THUY HAN district to familiarize personnel with area and to pick out approaches to villages and possible Arty. and mortar concentrations. Co. "M"(-) was helo lifted into western sector where they conducted daylight patrols and night ambushes. Co. "C", 3d Recon. Battalion conducted two squad size ambushes during the night.
- 24 June** Co. "M"(-) was helo lifted into eastern sector where they conducted daylight patrols and night ambushes. While preparing a position on Hill 96 (YD 874100) personnel of Co. "M" set off a dud 60MM mortar shell. Casualties sustained consisted of one man killed (Pfc. Frank L. Adamson) and four wounded (Sgt. W.L. Ray, Sgt. P.P. Balignasy, Cpl. R.H. Thompson Jr., and Pfc. M.S. Skupien.) At 1030, HMM 161 Helicopters received Small Arms fire from vicinity YD 845187. No hits were sustained by aircraft. At 1035, Co. "M" received 8 to 10 rounds from vicinity YD 867103. Reaction Platoon from Co. "K" was dispatched by helo to assist Co. "M". Two men were seen crossing over top of Hill #93 (YD 865106) to Northwest but no further contacts were made. Co. "K" Reaction Platoon was returned to airfield at 1430. Co. "C", 3d Recon. Battalion conducted one platoon size daylight patrol and two platoon size night ambushes in eastern sectors.
- 25 June** Co. "M"(-) patrolled by foot from eastern sector to western sector and conducted daylight patrols and a night ambush in western sector. At 1320, Co. "M" evacuated the Co. Commanding Officer with high fever. He was subsequently evacuated with malaria. Co. "C", 3d Recon. Battalion conducted two squad size and one platoon size night ambushes.
- 26 June** Co. "M"(-) remained in western sector and conducted daylight patrols and a night ambush. Between 1130 and 1230, "I" Btry. fired smoke rounds and registered concentrations vicinity PHU BAI village (YD 910120). Co. "C", 3d Recon. Battalion conducted one platoon size night patrol and one night squad size ambush.
- 27 June** Co. "M"(-) patrolled in western sector during daylight patrols and set Co. size night ambush in western sector. Co. "C", 3d Recon. Battalion conducted two squad size daylight patrols in eastern sector. Two platoon size night ambushes were also set in by Co. "C". At 1445 3 unknowns were spotted at YD 888112. Squad of Co. "I" helo lifted to area but 3 persons fled into PHU BAI village and contact was lost. Squad was returned to Battalion CP at 1550. Companies "I, K, and H&S" conducted night security patrols of squad size on outer perimeter of Battalion CP.
- 28 June** Co. "M"(-) relieved as forward Co. by Co. "L". 2d platoon of Co. "M" assumed defense of Co. "L".

conducted daylight patrols and a Co. size night ambush in eastern sector. Co. "C", 3d Recon. Battalion conducted two platoon size daylight patrols; one along western edge of TAOR; one along eastern edge of TAOR. Companies "I, K, and H&S" conducted night squad size security patrols on outer perimeter of Battalion CP. This Battalion joined a replacement draft consisting of 95 enlisted Marines.

- 29 June See After Action Report #6 attached as supporting document. Co. "L" was helo lifted into western sector where they conducted daylight patrols and a Co. size night ambush. An air strike was conducted by 4 aircraft on YD 883053, YD 882036 and YD 853025. Excelent coverage of area. Survaillance by observation aircraft. Extensive fires were reported. The evening Recon. helo flight received Smallarms fire from YD 820042. No hits were sustained by helos. Companies "I, K, 'C' Recon and H&S" conducted perimeter security patrols during night time.
- 30 June Co. "L" conducted daylight patrols and a Co. size night ambush in western sector. Co. "C", 3d Recon. conducted two daylight platoon size patrols in north western section of TAOR. An airstrike was conducted by 2 F4B aircraft on YD 8504; ordannance expended was 16 500lb. Napalm bombs. Area was completely covered and burned. Companies "K, L, and H&S" conducted squad size night security patrols on edge of CP perimeter.

INFORMATION FROM INTERTOCATION

How was he captured while on peration: His unit (K-41 Company) was locating at Mo Tan Mountain area, vicinity YD 843047. 044700 June, 1st and 2nd platoons of K-41 was ordered to move to Gia Le Thuong, vicinity YD 815145 to purchase food. 041000 June they moved to vicinity YD 810100. They could not act on day times, so they resited in this area and attempted to wait for night times. b. Narrative account: At 290730H a 25 man reconnaissance platoon from C Recon Company lifted from the 3d Bn, 4th Marines CP area to YD 883062. Their mission was to make a reconnaissance of the terrain in the general vicinity of the area bordering the jungle. The patrol proceeded to YD 883053 where they were taken under fire at approximately 0800. The rear point was taken under fire first from fire coming from a northerly direction. This was followed by the front point taken under fire from a southerly direction. There are strong indications that the attack was initiated by a whistle blast however there is doubt as to whether the whistle blast preceded the attack or sounded immediately following the attack. Recon platoon returned fire and were able to recover one V.C. body. Others were seen being dragged off by the V.C. Although the V.C. initiated the attack, accurate and violent firepower from the recon platoon overpowered the V.C. and changed a fired ambush into a running battle between two platoons. The number of V.C. was fixed at approximately one platoon of around 20 men. This was confirmed by the numbers of men seen and the numbers unseen but heard by rifle fire.

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Since the mission of the platoon was reconnaissance the platoon commander decided to withdraw to the LZ and return to base camp. The LZ was located in an area of very high grass. When the helicopters landed the OIC received an all up from his team leaders and lifted off. However upon arrival at base camp it was discovered that two Marines were unaccounted for. A reaction force of Recon Company was dispatched to the LZ to search for the two Marines. This was followed up by a reaction platoon from Company M. Recon landed and searched the area and found the two men. The two men had been in a continuous fire fight. The helos received fire on landing in the LZ. Meanwhile Company M had secured the LZ. When everyone returned the helos began lifting the troops back to base camp. However upon arrival at base camp it was discovered one Marine from Company M was missing. A small reaction force was sent back to the area to retrieve the man. No difficulties were encountered and all forces were returned to the C.P. area. This was completed by 1130H.

During this time 3 guns of I Battery had displaced to 883091 and were prepared to saturate the area with artillery fire when the target area was clear. Artillery fired a total of 285 rounds into the target area.

An air strike was called on coordinates 870030 at 291530H and was carried out by four F4D's who delivered 12 M81 bombs, 16 Zuni rockets, 8 napalms, and 200 rounds 20mm.

F. Area on engagement with VC was in densely vegetated area on forward edge of jungle. The patrol made no further penetration into the jungle. After the fire fight, 2 VC WIA were seen being removed from scene of battle.

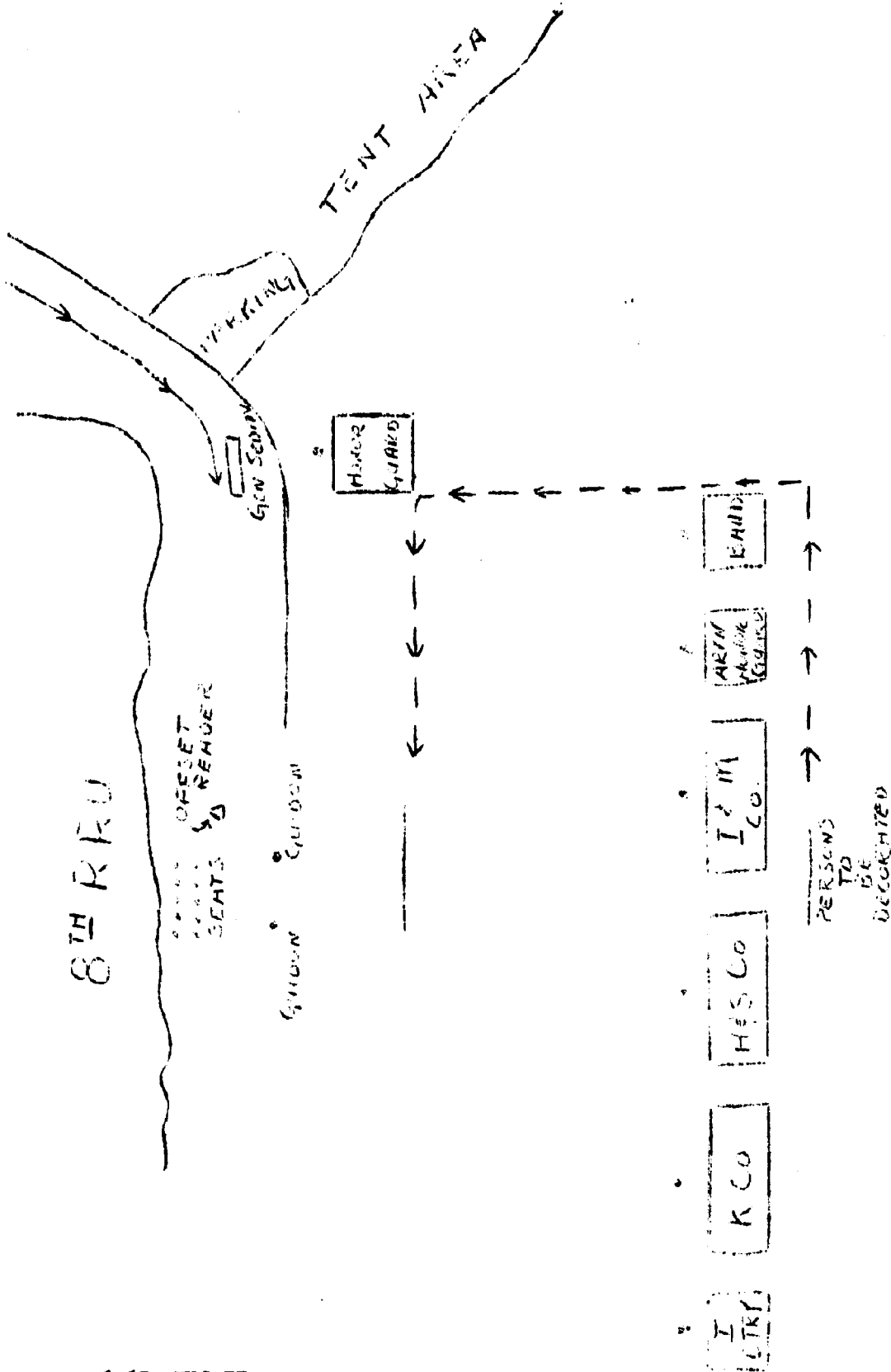
