PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of June 1967, Operations were continued at a normal level. Captain J. A. MARKS relieved Captain W. F. COHEN as Commanding Officer of Communication Support Company, 5th Communication Battalion, FMF on 15 June. Communication Support was provided to Commanding General, III Marine Amphibious Force and limited support to the 1st and 3rd Marine Divisions, 1st Marine Aircraft Wing, Marine Air Group 16 and Force Logistic Command/1st Force Service Regiment. Message traffic continues to decrease from 67,279 in May to 55,891 in June. The installation of the AN/TCC-7A was completed and actual operation of the Parchment Switchboard began on 27 June. A test of the Emergency Out of Country Communication Circuits was conducted with NAVCOMSTAPHIL during the period 5-6 June. Some difficulties were encountered with frequency selection and equipment compatibility with NAVCOMSTAPHIL. Two Communication Officers from the Battalion who were familiar with the tests being conducted, equipments being employed, and the problems being encountered made a liaison visit to NAVCOMSTAPHIL with the mission of resolving the frequency difficulty and equipment incompatibility. As a result of this visit, new frequency selections were made and two Receiver Modification Kits that will permit continuous receiver tuning, and improve compatibility with the equipment being used by NAVCOMSTAPHIL were received, however, installation of these kits has been delayed pending receipt of the technical installation instructions. Additional tests of this system have been coordinated with NAVCOMSTAPHIL for July and August. Telephone communication were provided at both China Beach and the General's Beach House. Public address systems were provided at the China Beach R&R Center, Freedom Hill and the Danang River Bridge. In country and out of country Radio Communications were continued using TSC-15 vans and MAR-83's.

(6) Morale - The morale of this organization continues to improve. This can be attributed, in part to the close proximity of the excellent South China Sea Beach facilities, Post Exchange facilities, Service Clubs, and a daily movie.

(7) Disbursing - The 1st Marine Division provided disbursing support to this organization.

c. Intelligence: None

d. Training

(1) Training was conducted on Vietnam oriented subjects, selected general military subjects, individual MOS's small engine generator operation (through 10KW) and Troposcatter Radio Relay AN/TRC-97. In addition, gas chamber exercises were conducted for all members of the Battalion.

(2) Familiarization firing was conducted at the Hoa Cam Regional Forces Training Center for 378 members of the Battalion. Weapons fired included Rifles M-14 and M-16, Shotguns 12 Gauge, Pistols, Caliber .45 and practical application in the throwing and firing of the hand and rifle grenades. In addition, 7 hours of formal instruction was conducted on the M-16 Rifle with primary emphasis on the care, handling and cleaning of the rifle and magazines and the reduction of stoppages by placing only 18 rounds, vice 20, in the magazine.

(3) Four members of the Battalion attended "out of country" formal schools and four attended "in country" schools that are operated by other commands.

e. Special Operations

(1) Provided communication support for the Vietnam visit of CG, FMFPAC and other VIP's during this reporting period.

(2) Completed the installation and cut over of the expanded III MAF Switchboard System. The MTC-1 Switching Central at the III MAF Headquarters was replaced by two AN/TRC-7A Switching Centrals which provides for twice the "drop capabilities" of the MTC-1. To facilitate providing the subscriber with the best possible service, a three digit telephone numbering system was initiated for III MAF subscribers and segregated into hundred groupings on the switchboard with an operator assigned to service each group of one-hundred numbers. This expanded switchboard system has noticeably reduced the time element in completing calls and will permit additional subscribers to enter the system with no confusion in the assigning of a drop and number.

g. Communications. Continue to provide communication support for the Commanding General, III Marine Amphibious Force and limited support to the 1st and 3d Marine Divisions, 1st Marine Aircraft Wing and the Force Logistic Command/1st Force Service Regiment.

The installation of the AN/TCC-7A was completed and actual operation of the Parchment Switchboard began on 27 June. Results of the test for the Emergency Communications Circuit with NAVCOMSTAPHIL were unsatisfactory. One officer from this company and one officer from ComSpt Co. were dispatched to the Philippines to resolve problems encountered during the test. Test will continue during July. Morale continues to be high with approximately 33% of company personnel extending for 6 months.
