PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of August 1967, operations continued at a normal level. The Battalion joined 59 enlisted personnel and dropped 4 Officers and 79 enlisted personnel. The Battalion conducted no special operations during this period. However, in addition to performing its primary mission of providing communication support to the Commanding General, III Marine Amphibious Force, limited support is provided to the 1st and 3rd Marine Divisions, 1st Marine Aircraft Wing and Force Logistic Command/1st Force Service Regiment on a permanent basis. Numerous short term support commitments were issued and completed during this period, i.e. Cable restoral assistance to MAG-16, Public Address System support to various units, technical assistance in cable and antenna installations. Message traffic in the III Marine Amphibious Force Communication Center has decreased from over 100,000 in April to an average of 55,000 to 60,000 per month which is within personnel and equipment capabilities.

(1) Training was conducted on Vietnam oriented subjects, selected General Military Subjects, Small Engine Generator School (through LOKW) individuals' MOS and Troposcatter Radio Relay Set AN/TRC-97.

(2) Familiarization firing was conducted at the Hoa Cam Regional Forces Training Center for 156 members of the Battalion. Weapons fired included Rifles M-14 and M-16, Pistols Caliber .45, and Shotguns, 12 Gauge for members of the Battalion Security Platoon. In addition, four hours of formal instruction was conducted on the M-16 Rifle with emphasis on the care, handling, and cleaning of the rifle and magazines and the reduction of stoppages by inserting only 18 rounds, vice 20, in each magazine.

(3) Two members of the Battalion attended "out of country" formal schools conducted by other commands and seven attended "in country" formal schools operated by other commands.

(a) Leadership Indications and Problem Areas (1 hour).

(b) South East Asia Wide Band Communications Systems ($\frac{1}{2}$ hour).

(c) DCA Management/Role in I Corps (1 hour).

(a) Vietnamese Religions and Customs.

(b) Nature of the Enemy.

(6) Orientation trips/visits to other communication agencies and presentations by representatives of these agencies have been scheduled for September.


