PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of October 1967, operations continued at a normal level. One officer and 74 enlisted personnel were joined, and three officers and 41 enlisted personnel were dropped from the Battalion. The Battalion conducted no special operations during this period. During this reporting period the Battalion has continued to support the III Marine Amphibious Force Headquarters with Communication Center, Command Operations Center, radio and wire communications. The Radio Central, COC has been relocated and is operating smoothly. Total message count at the III Marine Amphibious Force Communication Center for the month of October was 61,787. Public address systems were provided at several locations to satisfy requirements. Field wire was installed from the German Hospital Ship Helgaland to the Motley frame. Communications on the Command Communication Circuit were activated and maintained for the duration of the visit of the Commanding General, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific. In-country and out-of-country radio communications were continued using TSC-15 vans and MRC-83s.

(2) Familiarization firing was conducted at the Hoa Cam Regional Forces Training Center for 75 members of this organization. Weapons fired included rifles M-14, and M-16; pistol caliber .45. In addition, 5 hours of formal instruction was conducted on individual weapons to include care and cleaning of the rifle and magazines with emphasis on the M-16.

(3) Ten Marines attended out-of-country formal schools operated by other commands and twenty-one Marines attended in-country formal schools operated by other commands.

(4) The Battalion Command Information Program was conducted throughout the month of October. Specifically, the following classes were conducted:
