PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of November 1967, operations continued at a normal level. 5 officers and 53 enlisted personnel were joined, and 5 officers and 70 enlisted personnel were dropped from the Battalion. During this reporting period the Battalion has continued to support the III Marine Amphibious Force headquarters with Communication Center, Combat Operations Center, radio and wire communications. The radio station supporting the COC has been moved into a permanent area of operation, and additional cryptographic equipment has been installed in the area formerly occupied by the radio section. Total message count at the III Marine Amphibious Force Communication Center for the month of November was 60,617. Public address systems were provided at III Marine Amphibious Force on three occasions. In-country and out-of-country radio communications were continued using TSC-15 vans, and MRC-83s.
