PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During February 1968 operations increased in tempo. In addition to the standing commitments in III Marine Amphibious Force headquarters and support detachments to 1st and 3rd Marine Divisions, 1st Cavalry Division and 2nd Republic of Korea Marine Brigade, the following significant operations took place:

Commencement of a telephone cable project for the Republic of Korea Marines involving 4.1 miles of cable, 165 telephone poles and three-fourths of the construction platoon's personnel and equipment. Estimated completion date is 16 March 1968.

Upgrading and expansion of Force Logistic Command's telephone cable network.

Extension of the III Marine Amphibious Force cable system to Camp Haskins.

Unusual degree of repair and restoration efforts in connection with disruptions caused by enemy attacks by fire.

Activation of new communications center and combat operations center circuits incident to troop build-up and additional command posts in I Corps Tactical Zone of Action.

Extensive increase in cryptographic equipment and III Marine Amphibious Force Registered Publications Account incident to increased allowances.

Above normal logistics efforts in support of deployed equipment damaged by enemy activity.

Logistics and operational support of two CMC sponsored projects/training programs: the multi channel AN/PCC-1 and AN/VCC-1(2) equipment and the Secure Voice Retransmission equipment.

Intensified operation of communications facilities and security measures commensurate with the alert status throughout the month. Total message count at the III Marine Amphibious Force Headquarters was as follows: Communication Center - 45,999 incoming; 32,744 outgoing; 78,776 total; Combat Operations Center - 8,337 incoming; 15,506 outgoing; 23,843 total.

2. Personnel strength dropped considerably and continued decrease at this rate could jeopardize battalion effectiveness. It was noted that replacement technical personnel are well trained on the newest Marine Corps equipment, forecasting relief in the area of inadequately trained personnel. Additional benefit was derived from the training in the AN/DCC-VCC classes conducted by CMC, code CSY, representative, Captain C. BRIDGES.

3. There has been an overall improvement in logistics support. Particularly gratifying has been the apparent reduction in cryptographic equipment supply cycles. Fixed plant teletype and AN/TRC-97 replacement parts continue as major problems.

(4) 13 incoming personnel received the Battalion Initial Lecture conducted by the Battalion Sergeant Major.

5. Special Operations:

a. The Battalion continued to provide electronic equipment maintenance support to the Combined Action Group and cryptographic maintenance and support for Army and Navy units attached to III Marine Amphibious Force.

b. The Battalion hosted and coordinated the school on the operation, installation and maintenance of Telegraph-Telephone Terminal Sets AN/PCC-1, AN/VGC-1, AN/VGC-2 and Log Periodic Antenna AS-2236/GRC conducted by CMC (CSY) representative. In addition to on-the-job-training gained from assisting in school preparation, three members attended formal classes.

c. Eleven personnel of the Battalion attended the 3rd quarter, Fiscal Year 1968 Small Engine Generator Operators School conducted by the Battalion Engineer Maintenance Section.

d. Two personnel from the Battalion Electronics Maintenance Shop attended a three day course of instruction on the repair and maintenance of teletypewriter AN/TCC-114V. The instruction was conducted by the technical representative from the MITE Corporation and held at the Electronics Maintenance Shop of the 1st Force Service Regiment.

e. Personnel, equipment and logistic support was rendered to CMC (MCD/EC) representative in connection with secure voice relay project. One officer and two technicians received on-the-job-training while assisting the project officer.

6. NBC Warfare: Members of the Battalion NBCD Teams participating in the Group Study Course, MCI 57.5, were administered the final examination during the month of February.

7. Communications: The Battalion continued to provide operational communication to III Marine Amphibious Force headquarters and support to the 1st and 3rd Marine Divisions, 1st Marine Air Wing, Force Logistic Command, 2nd Republic of Korea Marine Brigade and 1st Air Cavalry Division, U. S. Army.

8. Logistics:

a. Construction of a new concession building was completed and the concession is now in operation. Installation of commercial type power is still in progress although only 90 per cent complete due to the lack of bell-type insulators. The scheduled technical inspection of Radio Relay and Construction Company was postponed due to operational commitments.

b. Maintenance of Combat Essential Equipment continued during the month of February 1968.

1. To promulgate a schedule for General Military Subjects and MOS Training for the personnel of the company for the month of February 1968.

2. Action

a. Training will be conducted as scheduled in enclosure (1).

b. Instructors will prepare a lesson plan using the format contained in reference (a) for each period of instruction. Subjects lesson plan will be submitted to the Company Operations Chief for approval five days prior to the scheduled instruction.



b. 4 additional AN/TRC-97's were activated: 2 as a link between 5th Communication Battalion and 1st Marine Division and 2 with operation Fogasus.

6. NBC Warfare: The quarterly gas chamber exercise was conducted for newly arrived personnel of the Battalion and for those personnel who have been issued a Protective Mask since the previous gas chamber exercise.

7. Communications: The Battalion continued to provide communications for the Commanding General, III Marine Amphibious Force and support to the 1st and 3rd Marine Divisions, 1st Marine Aircraft Wing, Force Logistic Command, 2nd Republic of Korea Marine Brigade, Provisional Corps Vietnam, Project Delta Forces and 1st Cavalry.

8. Logistics: Installation of commercial type power is 95 per cent complete at this time. All that is required is to tie lines into Naval Support Activity. On 15 March, the Marine Corps Automated Readiness Evaluation System (MARES) was implemented within the Battalion. A 24 hour MARES Coordination Center was established in the S-4 office. The system is in full operation at this time. On 14 March the Battalion commenced implementing the Mechanized Embarkation Data System (MEDS) which is 10 per cent complete at this time. On 28 March this Battalion received 1 AN/TGC-37.





1. All personnel whose duties involve operating vehicles are to attend periods of driver indoctrination regardless of MOS.
2. The initial Troop Indoctrination will be held at 1300 on Wednesday afternoons. Company 1st Sgt. will notify the Battalion Sgt Major as to the number of personnel who will attend.
3. Officer orientation classes/Tours will be schedule as required and promulgated by separate memorandum.
4. Plt CMDR of Comm Center, C.O.C. and wire plts III MAF will assign their own instructor.
5. For all Bn personnel who have joined since the gas chamber exercise in December.
