PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. In addition to the standing commitments for III Marine Amphibious Force Headquarters and support detachments to 1st and 3rd Marine Divisions, and Provisional Corps, Vietnam, the following significant operations took place:

Communication Company Radio Platoon continues operating a secure voice retransmission facility utilizing RT-524 radio sets and the HYL-3 regenerative repeater. This facility is operated on the Force Tactical Net providing secure voice communications between III Marine Amphibious Force Headquarters, DaNang and Americal Division Headquarters, Chu Lai. This secure voice retransmission equipment had previously been deployed in support of Task Force "X-Ray".

Four AN/MRC-83's and five AN/PRC-47's remain in support of the Joint POL Pipeline System in the northern I Corps Area.

Training was conducted for ten U. S. Army personnel from the 54th Signal Battalion on the AN/TRC-97.

Training was conducted for twenty-two Marines from the 1st MP Battalion on the AN/PRC-77 and KY-38.

On 9 July 1968 this Battalion held a change command ceremony. Maj LEE R. JOHNSON relieved LtCol D. L. LINDEMUTH as Commanding Officer of this Battalion.

During the month of July, Communication Support Company radio and wire platoons were divided between Radio Relay & Construction Company and Communication Company to meet the commitments of this Battalion. Communication Support Company continues to function administratively.



## PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. Throughout the month of July, Communication Support Company continued to provide communications support to units outside of Third Marine Amphibious Force Headquarters.

Radio Platoon maintains support for the Joint POL Pipeline System in the northern I Corps area. The support consists of four AN/MRC-83's and four AN/PRC-47's deployed in the following locations: Phu Bai, Dong Ha, Tan My, Quang Tri, and Hue.

Radio Platoon also continues to provide personnel and communication facilities for the secure voice retransmission station between the Third Marine Amphibious Force and Americal Division on the Third Marine Amphibious Force Tactical Net.

One AN/TSC-15 and three men are being provided for support of Provisional Corps Headquarters, Phu Bai.

One AN/TSC-15 and two men continued in support of the FLC-3rd FSR, Okinawa phone patch.

In southern I Corps, one AN/MRC-83 and two men provided communication for the Americal Division in Chu Lai.

Wire Platoon provided the Battalion with internal telephone communications. Wire Platoon also provided telephone communications at the General's Beach House.

Wire Platoon was also committed to set up public address systems for the Battalion change of command ceremonies on 9 July.

Communication Support Company continued to augment Communication Company, Task Force Hotel, 3rd Marine Division with 1 officer and 10 enlisted men.

16 men supplemented Communication Company, Headquarters Battalion, 3rd Marine Division in Dong Ha.

Radio Platoon provided secure voice radio support for the 1st MP Battalion Tactical Net with seven AN/PRC-77's and KY-38's. A school was initiated to instruct radio operators and officers from the 1st MP's in the proper operation and use of the secure voice equipment. Plans were formulated for the initial utilization of the equipment on the Tactical Net.
