

1. During the month of May 1969 the Fifth Communication Battalion continued to perform its mission of providing communication support to the III Marine Amphibious Force Headquarters, the First Marine Division, the First Marine Air Wing and the Second Republic of Korea Marine Brigade. In addition personnel and/or equipment are deployed in support of the Third Marine Division, Task Force Hotel, and XXIV Corps Headquarters.
2. The movement of 7th Communication Battalion into Camp Hoa Long from Hill 34 was completed during the early part of May. Extensive effort is currently being expended to expand camp facilities to accommodate the large increase in occupants. An additional water tower has been constructed and work has been completed on a physical fitness building and the Officers Club galley. Construction was started on an addition to the Battalion Aid Station.
3. Damon Hamlet and the Con Dien Orphanage continued to be the focal points of the Civic Action programs. Regular MEDCAP visits to the hamlet were made each Saturday. One hundred and fifty persons, principally children, received treatment during these visitations. One hundred and sixty Orphans were also administered medical treatments during May.
4. Communication Support Company, 5th Communication Battalion remains in cadre.

a. Radio Relay Platoon of Radio Relay and Construction Company continued to provide radio relay channels to users throughout the I Corps area. Relay sites located on Monkey Mountain were realigned as terminal stations releasing two pieces of AN/TRC-97E equipment for other employment.

b. Radio Relay and Construction Company's Construction platoon expended 4491 feet of 100 pair cable, 9 poles and 4626 man hours maintaining the III MAF cable systems during May. In addition over one mile of 25 pair cable was issued to 7th Communication Battalion to assist them in filling their commitments.

c. The III MAF Communication Center and Combat Operations Center, which are operated by Communication Company personnel, processed a total of 78,430 administrative and tactical messages during the month.

d. A total of 373,285 telephone calls passed through the III MAF switchboard during May, and sixteen telephone installations were completed at III MAF headquarters by Communication Company personnel.

e. Fifth Communication Battalion supply completed 109 requisitions of a total of 1426 initiated, and the Motor Transport section transported 296 tons of cargo and 21,793 passengers a total of 47,350 miles with 2116 dispatched runs.

f. The following number of work orders were completed during May by the combined 5th/7th Communication Battalions' maintenance section: Motor Transport - 232; Electronics - 649; Camp - 35.

2. Personnel/Equipment Deployments

a. Fourteen men, five AN/MRC-62's and one AN/TRC-97 are at Dong Ha in support of the Third Marine Division.

b. The following personnel and equipment are attached to III MAF Headquarters to provide radio, radio relay, telephone and teletype communications.

- e. Five men and one AN/TRC-97 are deployed with XXIV Corps at Phu Bai. Also with this unit are 3 men as well as AM and FM radio equipment from Communication Company.

3. Other Assistance to Other Organizations

- a. Five men are temporarily assigned to Air Force GEEIA in the DaNang area to assist in the laying and splicing of cables.
- b. A construction crew was provided to MAG-39 at Quang Tri to assist in laying cable.

During the month of May 1969, Construction Platoon completed the following commitments; issued 1000 ft. of 25 pair cable to RR&CCo. 7th CommBn., issued 3000 ft. of 25 pair cable to 1st MARDIV, issued 3500 ft. of 25 pair cable to RR&CCo. 7th CommBn., trouble shot the M-36 cable at III MAF Transient Facility, installed a 100 pair cable from PANAMA site to Monkey Mountain TRC-97 site, installed 30 forty ft. poles at 1st Log cantonment, trouble shot and repaired the M-39 cable, checked circuits from MAG-16 S-3 bunker to TABG/HDC 1st MAW, trouble shot and repaired the following cables; M-1, M-26, M-32, M-39, M-44, M-7 and M-35, provided one Staff NCO to assist 3rd MARDIV in planning a cable route, installed three 40 ft. blackjacks poles at MAG-16,

extended the M-13 cable to VMGR-152 a distance of 500 ft., installed four 90 ft. poles at MARES station 1st MAF, extended existing 25 pair cable at MWHG-1 to HAMS-17, installed four 25 ft. poles in 5th CommBn. industrial area, installed two 25 pair cables between 1st MAF frame and new building which will house MACG-18, trouble shot and repaired the M-30, M-37 and M-39 cables, moved MAG-39's MTC-1 and installed necessary outside cable plant, trouble shot and repaired the M-35 and M-41 cables, trouble shot and repaired the M-8 cable, issued one SB-22 switchboard on temp loan for a period of 30 days to Necon, trouble shot and repaired the M-30 and M-39 cable to repair damage caused by fire.

Total man hours for Construction Platoon for the month of May 1969 were 4626, total materials used for the month were; 7611 ft. of 25 pair 19 AWG, 5329 ft. of 50 pair 19 AWG, 329 ft. of 50 pair 22 AWG, 4491 ft. of 100 pair 19 AWG, six 25 ft. poles, three 20 ft. poles, 1150 ft. of messenger, 87 tape rolls, 18 ready access boxes, 16 scotch essts, 2 21/B1 splice cases, 1 20/A1 splice cases, 2 9/A splice cases.
