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## PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. 5th Communication Battalion (Rein) continued to fulfill its mission of providing communication support to III MAF units during November 1969. Among the organizations receiving support, or assistance, were III MAF Headquarters, the First Marine Division, the First Marine Air Wing and the Republic of Korea's Second Marine Brigade. U.S. Army and Air Force units in the I Corps area received support and assistance when required, and radio stations were maintained on the Third Marine Division's embarkation net to assist in the deployment of that unit.
2. Equipment for a secure voice radio net for CORDS was furnished and the net established during November. This net links CORDS detachments from Quang Ngai to Quang Tri. A communication system with voice and secure teletype equipment was also installed to link III MAF Headquarters with Force Reconnaissance Companies at Da Nang and Phu Bai. Operators are also assigned to operate this net on a 24-hour basis.
3. The Construction Platoon of Radio Relay and Construction Company received a letter of commendation from the Military Assistance Command, Vietnam for their efforts in training ARVN personnel of the 610th Area Signal Battalion Da Nang in heavy construction and cable splicing techniques during the period May to October 1969.
4. The Civil Affairs program provides bi-weekly Medcaps to Damon Hamlet and the Sacred Heart Orphanage. Two hundred ninety five villagers and over three hundred orphans received medical treatment during November. Eleven truck loads of used lumber was given to Damon Hamlet to be used in home improvement programs.

2. Routine Operations

- a. Radio Relay and Construction Company

- (1) Construction Platoon completed the installation of 25-pair cables between the Seventh Engineer Battalion and the Northern Artillery Cantonment, and the First Marine Division Headquarters and the summit of Hill 327. A 25-pair cable was also installed at ASP #1 for a new fire alert system. Over thirty-four thousand feet of cable and ninety-four poles were expended in these projects which consumed four thousand man hours of labor. In addition to this new construction considerable time and effort was expended maintaining the existing cable system. This task was made even more difficult by heavy seasonal rain and shortages of equipment.

- (2) Radio Relay Platoon continued to provide Multichannel radio communications throughout I Corps and in Mekong Delta area.

- b. Communication Support Company, Seventh Communication Battalion.

- (1) Radio Relay and Radio Platoon continued to operate multichannel radio links in support of the Second ROK Brigade and the First Marine Division. In addition personnel and equipment were assigned temporarily to COMNAVFORV for operations in the Delta area.

- (2) Wire Platoon provided local-battery telephone service to the Fifth Communication Battalion and the Second ROK Brigade compounds.

- (3) Communication Center Platoon continues to operate the communication center at the Second ROK Marine Brigade Headquarters.

- c. Communication Company continued to maintain communication systems in support of III MAF Headquarters. A total of 61,691 messages were processed during November by the Communication Center and Combat Operation Center. A total of 407,901 telephone calls were peg counted by the III MAF switchboard.

- d. Battalion Supply completed 404 requisitions of a total 1,306 received during November.

- e. Motor Transport dispatched 2,216 vehicles during the month. These vehicles logged 67,753 miles while transporting 27,357 passengers and 88 tons of cargo.

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f. Electronic Maintenance completed 581 work orders while Motor Transport Maintenance and Camp Maintenance completed 137 and 31 work orders, respectively.

### 3. Personnel/Equipment Deployments.

a. Twenty men were assigned to support the requirements of the First Marine Division. These men operated three AN/TRC-97E terminals, two AN/MRC-62 terminals and two AN/TRC-27 terminals. In addition two cable splicers were assigned to assist the Division G-2 Surveillance Section.

b. Nineteen enlisted and one Officer were detailed to operate radio nets in support of First and Third Force Reconnaissance Companies. Three AN/TSC-15 vans, two teletypes and associated ciphering equipment were employed on these circuits.

c. The following men and equipment were assigned to the Republic of Korea's Second Marine Brigade at Hoi An to operate and maintain a communication system: 1 Officer, 46 enlisted, 6 AN/MRC-62, 10 AN/PCC-1, 1 AN/VCC-2, 4 PRC-77's and 10 RT-505's plus teletype and telephone equipment.

d. Second CAG was supported by five men operating one AN/MRC-62, two RT-505's and one AN/PCC-1.

e. MACV at Hoi An employs one AN/PCC-1 and one AN/MRC-62 operated by three men from this battalion.

f. Ten men augmented the communication section of the First Military Police Battalion in the Da Nang area.

g. Three AN/TRC-97E and one AN/MRC-62 terminals on Monkey Mountain were manned by ten operators from this battalion.

h. XXIV Corps at Phu Bai had ten men, one AN/MRC-83, one AN/TRC-97A one AN/MRC-62 and two RT-524's providing communication support during November.

i. Force Logistics Command was assigned three men to operate an AN/TRC-27 terminal on the III MAF-FLC link.

j. Fourteen Officers and one hundred fifty-two enlisted Marines from the battalion operated the communications center, telephone exchange, FCC and RPS at III MAF Headquarters. Operators were also provided for radio and teletype nets in the COC and surveillance and reconnaissance center, and personnel were provided for augmentation to G-6, III MAF.

### 4. Assistance to Other Organizations.

a. Covered FM radio net linking Quang Tri, Hue, Hoi An, Tam Ky and Quang Ngai with Da Nang was provided to CORDS.

During the month of November the Construction Platoon completed fourteen work orders. Work is still in progress on an additional twelve work orders. Of the fourteen work orders completed, nine involved trouble-shooting and repairing existing cables in the Danang area. The platoon completed three major construction projects.

- a. A new cable was installed from 7th Engineer Bn. to the Northern Artillery Cantonment. Work consisted of installing 54 poles and 10,800 feet of 25 pair cable.
- b. Work was completed on two new cables from the 1st Marine Division Command Post to the top of Hill 327. Forty poles and 10,000 feet of 25 pair cable were installed.
- c. A cable was installed at ASP #1 for a new fire alert system. Sixty poles and 6200 feet of cable were installed.
- d. In addition to the work orders, many man hours were expended in policing existing cables, relashing cables, and straightening poles. The platoon continued to operate under many days of unfavorable weather and with a continuing lack of proper equipment and material.

Total man hours for Construction Platoon for the month of November 1969, were: 4,083 hours, total materials used for the month were; 14,000 feet of messenger cable, 99 poles, 32,388 feet of 25 pair cable, (1) terminal (31-D), and 3 pedestals.

During the month of November 1969, Radio Relay Platoon completed the following commitments;

- a. Provided one TRC-97 and team to 1st Marine Division for the period 3 November 1969 to 10 November 1969.
- b. LTI'ed and turned into Battalion Supply two PU-278 generators for temporary loan to 5th Marines.
- c. Received from Comm. Support, 7th Comm (8) C-7827, (6) C-7674, (10) Th 81's, plus auxiliary equipment to constitute (6) AN/VCC-1's, for Operation SeaLord. One officer and (4) man team with equipment to COMNAVFOR V for installation of Relay links. (6) AN/VCC-1's to be signed on temporary loan to Major Davia, COMNAVFOR V for a period of 180 days.
- d. Turn into Battalion Supply (2) TA-807 line units for temporary loan to Comm Support for a period of 90 days.

Total man hours for the above for the month of November 1969 were 60.5 hours. Total materials for the above commitments were: (1) TRC-97, (2) PU-278, (2) TA-807, (6) VCC-1, and (14) AS-2236's.
