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

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PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. Fifth Communication Battalion (Rein) continued to fulfill its mission providing communication support to III MAF units during December 1969. Among the organizations receiving support, or assistance, were III MAF Headquarters, the First Marine Division, the First Marine Air Wing and the Republic of Korea's Second Marine Brigade. U.S. Army and U.S. Air Force units in the I Corps area received support and assistance when required.
2. The Civil Affairs Program provided bi-weekly medcaps to Damon Hamlet and the Sacred Heart Orphanage. Three hundred ninety villagers and three hundred twenty orphans received medical treatment during the month of December. Twelve trucks of used lumber were given to Damon Hamlet to be used in home improvement.
3. The detachment of personnel assigned from the Communication Support Company, Seventh Communication Battalion to operate the message center in support of the Second ROK Marine Brigade, relocated, improved and enlarged the communication center building by a self-help program. This improvement will provide more efficient traffic handling as well as added protection for personnel against mortars and rockets.

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PART III

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS1. Combat Operations

a. 21 December 1969, Radio Relay personnel stationed at Monkey Mountain relay site were sent out to aid two wounded Marines that were ambushed $\frac{1}{4}$ mile from the relay site.

b. 22 December 1969, Radio Relay personnel with the assistance of one officer and five men from MACS-4 and two men from Headquarters Company, Fifth Communication Battalion, defended the relay site against an enemy force of undetermined size.

2. Routine Operations

a. Radio Relay and Construction Company

(1) Construction Platoon continued to install and maintain III MAF cable systems in the Da Nang area. The Construction Platoon completed sixteen operational commitments during the month of December.

(2) Radio Relay Platoon continued to provide multichannel radio communications throughout I Corps and in the Mekong Delta area.

b. Communication Support Company, Seventh Communication Battalion

(1) Radio Platoon continued to operate multichannel radio links in support of the Second ROK Marine Brigade and III MAF Headquarters. The multichannel radio equipment and personnel supporting the First Marine Division were transferred to Radio Relay and Construction Company on 5 December 1969.

(2) Communication Center Platoon had a total message count of 2897 at the KMB Communication Center.

(3) Wire Platoon provided local-battery telephone service to the Fifth Communication Battalion and the Second ROK Marine Brigade compounds.

c. Communication Company continued to maintain communication systems support of III MAF Headquarters. A total of 57,787 messages were processed during December by the Communication Center and Combat Operation Center, and a total of 371,130 telephone calls were peg counted by the III MAF switchboard.

d. Battalion Supply completed 266 requisitions of a total 1,196 received during the month of December.

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e. Electronics Maintenance completed 709 work orders while Motor Transport Maintenance and Camp Maintenance completed 93 and 21 work orders, respectively.

f. Motor Transport dispatched 2,002 vehicles during the month. These vehicles logged 56,926 miles while transporting 25,390 passengers and 115 tons of cargo.

3. Personnel/Equipment Deployments

a. Nineteen enlisted and one officer are detailed to operate and maintain communications in support of First and Third Force Reconnaissance Companies. Three AN/TSC-15 vans, two teletypes and associated ciphering equipment were employed on these circuits.

b. The following men and equipment are assigned to the Republic of Korea's Second Marine Brigade at Hoi An to operate and maintain a communication system: One (1) Officer, 46 enlisted, Eight (8) AN/MRC-62, eight AN/PCC-1, one (1) VCC-2, four (4) PRC-77's and 10 RT-505's plus teletype and telephone equipment.

c. Fourteen men continued to augment the communication section of the First Military Police Battalion in the Danang area.

d. Three AN/TRC-97E and one AN/MRC-62 terminals on Monkey Mountain are manned by eight operators from this Battalion.

e. Three men remain detailed to Force Logistics Command to operate an AN/TRC-27 terminal on the III MAF-FLC link.

f. Fourteen officers and one hundred forty-five enlisted Marines from the Battalion operated the communications center, telephone exchange, FCC and RPS at III MAF Headquarters. Operators were also provided for radio and teletype nets in COC and Surveillance and Reconnaissance Center; and personnel were provided for augmentation to G-6 III MAF.

g. Second CAG was supported by five men operating one AN/MRC-62, two RT-505's and one AN/PCC-1.

h. There are twenty men in support of the requirements of the First Marine Division from the Battalion. These men operated three AN/TRC-97E terminals, two AN/MRC-62 terminals and two AN/TRC-27 terminals. In addition two cable splicers remain assigned to assist the Division G-2 surveillance section.

4. Other Assistance to Other Organizations.

a. A detachment of one (1) officer and seven (7) enlisted installed the sound system for Operation Holly (Bob Hope Show). The equipment was temporarily loaned from Air Force and Navy units.

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5. Personnel/Equipment Casualties.

a. Corporal D. A. PENDELL, 2483758 was killed in a truck accident on Monkey Mountain on 15 December 1969, and the vehicle he was driving, M-37 #302984, is coded H.

PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of December the Construction Platoon completed 16 operational commitments. Work is in progress on an additional 12 commitments. Of the 16 work orders completed, nine involved trouble-shooting and repairing existing cables in the Danang area. The platoon completed two major construction projects.

a. A 50 pair cable was installed on existing poles from the 15th Aerial Port to the Southwest corner of the airfield. Work consisted of installing 2500 feet of 50 pair cable, 1300 feet of messenger cable, 1 splice case, 2 40 foot poles, 2 25 pair cable terminals, and 1 ready access.

b. A 100 pair cable was installed between MACG-18 and the Staff Judge Advocate Building outside the 1st MAW compound. 4 25 pair cable terminals, 2 poles, 175 feet of 25 pair cable, 400 feet of messenger cable, and 1500 feet of 100 pair 19 AWG cable were installed

Total man hours for Construction Platoon for the month of December 1969 were: 3,353 hours, total materials used for the month were 15 poles and 9,000 feet of multi-pair cable.

During the month of December 1969, Radio Relay Platoon completed the following commitments:

- a. Provided (1) AN/PCC-1 on temporary loan to 7th Marines.
- b. Provided a two man team to instruct 7th Marines personnel in AN/PCC-1 installation and operation.
- c. Turned in to Battalion Supply (5) AN/PRC-25 for temporary loan to Naval Facilities Danang.
- d. Turned in to Battalion Supply (1) PU-463 generator for temporary loan to 1st MarDiv
- e. Provided (2) AN/MRC-62 with (2) PU-463 generators and (1) AN/MRC-63 with generator in support of 1st Radio Battalion and 24th Army Corps.

Total man hours for the above for the month of December 1969 were 1,920 hours, total materials utilized for the above commitments were: (2) AN/MRC-62, (1) AN/MRC-63, (4) PU-463, (5) PRC-25, and (1) AN/PCC-1.
