NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. Fifth Communication Battalion (Rein), continued to fulfill the mission of providing communication support to III MAF units during the month of June 1970. Among the organizations receiving support, or assistance, were III MAF Headquarters, the First Marine Division, the First Marine Air Wing and the Republic of Korea's Second Marine Brigade. U. S. Army and U. S. Air Force units in the I Corps area also received support and assistance when required.
2. The Civil Affairs Program provided weekly medcaps to Da Man Hamlet and the Sacred Heart Orphanage. Additionally, the below listed projects were undertaken or completed during the month of June by the Civil Affairs section:
 - a. Food and water were supplied twice daily to the community pigs of Da Man Hamlet.
 - b. Plans are being formulated for the distribution of ten piglets that were born during the month of June.
 - c. Civil Affairs, working with the 8th Vietnamese Engineer Battalion, was able to start repair of the road which connects the hamlet with the main road. So far, 450 loads of earth were poured on the previous sand base. Plans are underway for the completion of this road in July.
 - d. A ARVN heavy equipment driver was killed while working on the road. The widow was provided assistance and materials to build a house by Civil Affairs.
 - e. Lumber and corrugated metal roofing material were given to the needy families of the 5th Communication Battalion employees and also to those of the Da Man Hamlet. Seven Hundred sheets of corrugated metal roofing material and thirty-seven loads of lumber were obtained and delivered to the Civil Affairs Stock pile. A total of fourteen homes were supplied with enough material to get a significant start on repair work.

a. Radio Relay and Construction Company

(1) Construction Platoon continued to install and maintain the cable system in the Da Nang area.

(2) Radio Relay Platoon continued to provide multi-channel Radio communications throughout the I Corps area.

b. Communication Support Company, Seventh Communication Battalion.

(1) Radio Relay Platoon continued to operate multi-channel radio links in support of the Second ROK Marine Brigade and III MAF Headquarters.

(2) Wire Platoon continued to provide local-battery telephone service within the Fifth Communication Battalion and the Second ROK Marine Brigade cantonments.

c. Communication Company continued to support III MAF Headquarters with radio and wire communications and communication center services. A total of 5,920 messages were processed during the month of June.

d. Battalion Supply processed a total of 1,140 requisitions and completed a total of 171.

e. Electronics Maintenance processed 725 work orders and completed 578, while Motor Transport dispatched 1,880 vehicles during the month. These vehicles logged 42,426 miles while transporting 23,121 passengers and 81.1 tons of cargo.

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f. Repair has been completed on the electrical wiring in the mess hall. The wiring was damaged recently by high winds.

g. Work has also been completed on the alternate CP Bunker.

h. A mosquito trap has been installed by the Army to check for Malaria.

3. Personnel/Equipment Deployment

a. The following men and equipment are assigned to the Republic of Korea's Second Marine Brigade at Hoi An to operate and maintain communications: One Officer, twenty enlisted, components of eight AN/MRC-62s, twelve RT-505s plus assorted telephone equipment.

4. Personnel/Equipment Casualties

a. One personnel casualty for the month of June 1970, Cpl. Terence J. CONNORS 2551427. Cpl CONNORS died while on annual leave in Bangkok, Thailand. Autopsy report is due in August.

5. Training

a. Training has been conducted in accordance with directives of higher headquarters and the command has introduced and/or stressed those subjects for which there is a special requirement. The latter subjects are as a result of a influx of new personnel, routine inspections and new pending operational commitments.

b. Formalized instruction and on the job training were conducted for all MOS's at the Company and Platoon level.

c. All personnel who arrived during June fired their individual weapons for familiarization and zero fire.

d. A contact instruction team composed of one officer and two enlisted was furnished to the 1st Marine Division upon request to provide instruction in trouble shooting and operator's maintenance of the AN/PCC-1, AN/VCC-1 and AN/VCC-2.

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6. Significant Events

a. Fifth Communication Battalion went to C-3 operational readiness status on 21 June 1970 primarily due to personnel losses. On 1 July 1970, the personnel input percentage improved sufficiently to upgrade to C-2 operational status; although, officer, staff non commissioned officer and sergeant billets remain critical with no relief in sight. The target date to reach overall C-1 operational readiness status is 15 August 1970.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During June food was again supplied for the raising of the six pigs in the hamlet of Da Mang. In the beginning of the month twelve piglets were born to one of the sows, but two died shortly after. Presently, plans are being formulated for the distribution of these piglets throughout the village.

Wood and tin were also big programs during this month. Thirty-seven loads of lumber were picked up and delivered back to the Civil Affairs Stock Pile. Seven hundred sheets of tin were obtained this month. This wood and tin was used for the purpose of constructing homes for Vietnamese Families both in the Hamlet of Da Mang and for 5th Communication Battalion Employees. This month material was supplied to build fourteen homes. Tin and wood was also given nine families for repairing roofs, kitchens, homes, and animal shelters.

June was also road building month. After six months of requests from the people of the hamlet Da Mang, Civil Affairs was able to start the repair of the road which connects the hamlet with the main road. Working with the 8th Vietnamese Engineer Battalion 450 loads of ground were poured on the previous sand base road. Presently, any type of vehicle can easily travel between the main road School house in the hamlet. During July plans for the completion of this road are under way.

While constructing this road one of the equipment drivers was killed. Civil Affairs bought a wreath and supplied the widow with materials to construct a house.

During the construction of the road with the Vietnamese Engineers one of the Scraper drivers fell under the wheel of one of these earthmovers. The following evening this man died. As a token of our remembrance of this man this Civil Affairs section bought a wreath to place in the house of the wife of this man. We also attended the funeral services held in the hamlet of Lang Cu, where we dicovered that the widow and seven children had no home of their own to live in. We have so-far supplied this family with a small amount of lumber to construct a house. In the next month plans have been made to give this family enough wood to complete one house.

During this month Cpl. Baker was sent to drivers school where he received his license to drive a jeep.
7. Significant Events, Equipment & Logistics
During June efforts of Civil Affairs were centered arround the construction of a road. Working in co-operation with the 8th Vietnamese Engineer Group for a period of 9 days 500 loads of ground were poured inorder to lay a base for the construction of this road. During the next month rock will be poured and finishing touches will be put on this road.
