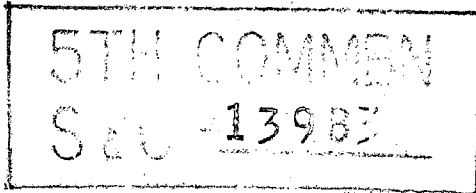

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. Fifth Communication Battalion (-) (Rein), continued to fulfill the mission of providing communication support to III Marine Amphibious Force units during September 1970. Among those organizations receiving support and/or assistance were III Marine Amphibious Force Headquarters, First Marine Division, First Marine Aircraft Wing, First Radio Battalion and the Republic of Korea's Second Marine Brigade, MACV, the Combined Action Force, U.S. Army and U.S. Air Force units also received support and assistance.
2. On 2 September 1970 the S-5 was officially notified to close down the Civic Action Program. The Pig Raising Program and all other outstanding programs and areas of responsibility of Da Mang and My Da were turned over to the MAG-16 Civic Action Team on 30 September 1970. In closing down the Civic Action Program, 18 Truck loads of building materials were taken to the hamlet of Da Mang, two loads of lumber were given to the first convalescence Hospital to repair kitchen tables, five loads of firewood were given to the First ARVN Military Police Battalion and extra office supplies were given to the ARVN Liaison Office.
3. On 6 September 1970 Communication Company departed aboard surface transportation to Camp Pendleton, California.
4. On 13 September 1970 Radio Relay and Construction Company turned over all operational commitments and selected assets to Communication Support Company, Seventh Communication Battalion. Radio Relay and Construction Company was carried at zero strength as of 13 September 1970.

5. On 17 September 1970 First Lieutenant T. A. Henderson, U. S. Army, and 40 enlisted of "B" Company 14th Engineer Battalion, 45th Engineer Group reported to this command for the purpose of relieving the security guard and reaction force. They were given special training on their areas of responsibility and were given familiarization firing of their weapons. Several inspections were held by the S-3 Officer and the men were integrated into the regular guard prior to their complete take-over of the security of the cantonment at Camp Hoa Long on 1 October 1970.
6. On 25 September 1970 First Lieutenant R. G. Berryman and Sgt C. R. Stoeter were selected to return the Battalion Colors to Camp Pendleton for official deactivation.
7. On 1 October 1970 Communication Support Company, Seventh Communication Battalion chops Administrative Control and Operational Control to Commanding General, III Marine Amphibious Force. This Company will be reinforced by a detachment of Fifth Communication Battalion.
8. On 1 October 1970 Headquarters Company will be at zero strength.
9. This constitutes the final Command Chronology report for Fifth Communication Battalion. Subsequent reports will be submitted by Communication Support Company, Seventh Communication Battalion.

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS1. Combat Operations

a. The Battalion was tasked with a continuing commitment to provide two T/O rifle platoons to the Da Nang East Defense Command on a stand-by basis. In view of the stand down of the Fifth Communication Battalion, the requirement for the two platoons were dropped on 6 September and the requirement for one platoon was dropped on 15 September 1970.

2. Routine Operations

a. Headquarters Company

(1) Provided continuous support to the Battalion in the area of Administration, Motor Transport, Food Services and Supply,

b. Communication Support Company, Seventh Communication Battalion.

(1) Radio Platoon continued to operate multi-channel radio links in support of the Second ROK Marine Brigade and III Marine Amphibious Force Headquarters.

(2) The Radio Relay Platoon continued to provide multi-channel radio communications throughout the I Military Region.

(3) Construction crews are rehabilitating First Battalion Eleventh Marines cable system at 31 Test Frame, MAG-11 and the First Marine Aircraft Wing.

(4) Wire Platoon continues to provide local battery telephone service within the Fifth Communication Battalion Area.

(5) Battalion Motor Transport dispatched 1,328 vehicles during the month. These vehicles logged 38,769 miles while transporting 7,967 passengers and 56,120 pounds of cargo.

(6) Camp Maintenance processed four work orders and completed one. Due to the displacement of Communication Support Company, Seventh Communication Battalion, priority was placed on the construction of the Registered Publications System building at Camp Haskins.

(7) Battalion Supply processed only two requisitions for fuel as all other requisitions were cancelled and all future requisitions will be sent to the Force Logistic Command on a "fill or kill" basis.

3. Personnel/Equipment Deployed

a. The following men and equipment are assigned to the Republic of Korea's Second Marine Brigade at Hoi An to operate and maintain communications. One Officer, nineteen enlisted, components of nine AN/TRC-166's plus assorted telephone equipment.

b. One AN/TRC-97E terminal on Monkey Mountain is manned by two operators from this Battalion in support of First Marine Aircraft Wing.

c. One AN/TRC-97E terminal at Chu Lai is manned by three operators from this command in support of First Marine Aircraft Wing.

d. Two AN/TRC-97E terminals on Hill 244 are manned by four operators from this command in support of First Marine Division and Second Combined Action Group.

e. One AN/TRC-97 terminal at Hoi An is manned by two operators from this command in support of Second Combined Action Group.

f. One AN/TRC-97E terminal and one AN/MRC-62 terminal at Force Logistic Command are manned by two operators from this organization in support of III Marine Amphibious Force.

g. One Officer and fourteen enlisted with one AN/TGC-37, three AN/PRC-47's, three AN/TGC-14A(V)'s four UGC-6's and other radio and teletype equipment are in support of the III Marine Amphibious Force Combat Operation Center.

h. Thirteen enlisted are TAD to the Force Logistic Command Communication Center in support of III Marine Amphibious Force Headquarters.

Fifth Communication Battalion will revert to C-4 status on 1 October 1970.

1. Purpose. To publish the Company Training Schedule requirements for the period of 1 Sep through 30 Sep 1970.

2. Formation. Company training is designed to present instructions on the subjects necessary to qualify personnel in their MOS and to increase overall professional knowledge of personnel within the company.

3. Action:

a. Sections OIG & MOEB's will:

(1) Conduct MOS training in accordance with Enclosure (1).

(2) Insure maximum attendance of section personnel at all scheduled company training.

(3) Section heads will insure that all appropriate training records, lesson plans are maintained at each section. Also, personnel data cards will be maintained on each Marine to reflect the Technical Training received.

b. Instructors will prepare two copies of the lesson plan and submit them to the Company Training MO at least three days prior to the scheduled class. Lesson plans may be typed or hand written, but must be legible and in correct format.

(1) The original lesson plan will be returned after the period of instruction to the Company Training MO.

(2) Two copies will remain in the training office.

e. Company Training NCO

- (2) At Company conducted classes take an attendance roster of all Headquarters Company, personnel by name and section.
- (3) Prepare two copies of HqCo training attendance report of sections, ascertaining from the section b7-name those personnel who were absent and reason for the absence.
- (4) Total the number of attendees and submit this data with one copy of each of the section training attendance reports to the Battalion S-3.
- (5) Retain on files with Company Training Reports a copy of the Company Training Attendance report for each section.
