

Narrative Summar

During June 1968, the mission and disposition of the 5th 155 Gun Battery (SP), reinforced by the 1st Platoon, 5th 8" Howitzer Battery (SP), commanded by Major E. B. BEALL, Jr, underwent some change. On 1 June, as directed by the 12th Marines, two (2) 155 Guns completed displacement from IZ SHARON, Quang Tri City to the First Platoon's position at Cam Lo (C-3). The battery headquarters and two (2) 155 Guns remained at IZ SHARON with the mission of general support of the 3d Marine Division, reinforcing the fires of the 3rd Battalion, 12th Marines. The mission was only performed on a few occasions and then confined almost entirely to long range H&I fires. Numerous H&I's, occasional fire missions, and all registrations were conducted in support of the Army's 1st Air Cavalry Division, reinforcing the fires of the 2nd Battalion, 19th Artillery with approval of the 12th Marines. One mission fired the night of 27 June accounted for 60 confirmed enemy KIA's in support of OPERATION JEB STUART III.

The First Platoon, augmented by two (2) additional 155 Guns, continued its mission of general support of the 3rd Marine Division, reinforcing the fires of the 12th Marines. The volume of fire has been heavy with numerous TOT's and counter rocket/mortar fires in the area of the DMZ, Con Thien, and north of Dong Ha.

The 8" Platoon completed OPERATION DRUMFIRE II on 1 June, chopped OPCON of the 3rd Platoon; alst 8" Howitzer Battery to Task Force HOTEL, and returned to its position at Ca In. One truck received considerable damage from an enemy rocket attack of the staged convoy at Khe Sanh on 1 June.

During June, the volume of fire for the 8" platoon, answering calls for fire missions from the 12th Marines in Dong Ha, was very light.

Personnel readiness remained C-1 with the only real shortages being communicators. Equipment status dropped back to C2 for most of the month with 1 gun, the retriever and several tube changes causing down time. By the end of the month, the battery achieved C1 status with seven of eight guns shooting. Supply status remains C2 due to the nonavailability of 2nd echelon spare parts for motor transport andordnance equipment.

The battery continues to improve its three (3) positions. Construction of a messhall was begun at the IZ SHARON headquarters position. New gun pits and bunkers are being constructed at Cam Io to accommodate the two (2) additional guns. No personnel casualties were incurred during June and vehicle damage was confined to one truck.

The battery continues to support OPERATIONS SCOTIAND II, LANCASTER II, KENTUCKY, NAPOLEON/SALINE II, and JEB STUART III.

Sequential Listing of Significant Events

- 1 June 1968 Completed displacement of Two (2) additional 155 Guns from LZ SHARON to Cam Io to reinforce the 1st Platoon.
 - Completed OPERATION DRUMFIRE II. Displaced 8" Platoon from Khe Sanh to Ca Lu. Received rocket attack at Khe Sanh with damage to two (2) vehicles.
- 4 June 1968 1stLt H. K. IEE relieved 1stLt S. A. MENNUIT as 8ⁿ Platoon Commander
- 7 June 1968 Numerous incoming rocket and artillery rounds at LZ STUD and Ca Lu. Ammunition Dump at LZ STUD was destroyed.

 No 8" Platoon casualties.
- 20 June 1968 LZ SHARON received about 25 rounds incoming 81mm mortar rounds; no battery casualties
- 26 June 1968 Major CANTIENY, Executive Officer, 1st Battalion, 13th Marines, visited LZ SHARON position.
- 27 June 1968 60 confirmed KIA's from mission fired by IZ SHARON platoon.
- 30 June 1968 Battery continues to support OPERATION SCOTLAND II, IANCASTER II, KENTUCKY and NAPOLEON/SALINE and JEB STUART III



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
