Narrative Summary

During April 1969, the 5th 155mm Gun Battery (SP)(REIN), commanded by Major A. B. THOMPSON JR, remained under the operational control of the 108th Artillery Group USA and continued its mission of reinforcing the fires of the 12th Marine Regiment.

On 2 April, a battery 5 ton truck traveling East on Route 9 ran off the road and rolled over. The accident resulted in two men killed, two men medievaced, and 9 men with minor injuries. The accident is under investigation at this time.

The turning in of 155mm Guns (M-53) began on 22 April and ended on 25 April. During that period five 155mm Guns were turned into FLSG-B.


Four 175mm Guns (M-107) were received on 23 April brings to six 175mm Guns possessed by the Battery.

With the turn in of the 155mm Guns and the receipts of four more 175mm Guns, Gunsplatoons were redesignated. Delta Platoon (175mm Guns) became Bravo Platoon (175mm Guns) and Charlie Platoon (155mm Guns) changed over to 175mm Guns.

Also during April, the two 175mm Guns received in March have been retubed. The retubing of these guns took place at Vandegrift Combat Base and were completed in a matter of hours with little difficulty. The changing of the tubes in the field rather that at FLSG-B in Dong Ha eliminated the downing of the guns for a day or more and the wear and tear on the carriage on the road.

Rounds expended during April were 1553 rounds of 155mm, 378 rounds 8" Howitzer, 286 rounds 175mm from Charlie Platoon and 568 rounds from 175mm from Bravo Platoon. Targets fired on were unobserved intelligence/artillery/rocket suppression fires and some observed targets. The battery is also in direct support of some long range recon teams and the covering of Seismatic Intrusion Devices.



The batteries personnel status has risen to Cl with approximately 92% of essential ranks and MOS's on hand. There is a continuing need for qualified personnel in the 2151 and 1345 fields.

Equipment status is now Cl as the result of the turning in of the M53 155 Guns, and the aquisition of the M107 Gun 175mm SP.

Deadlines were of short duration for tube changes in positions. One B! Howitzer continues to be inoperable due to the lack of a hydraulic valve in the supply: system.
