2. COMMANDERS NARRATIVE SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

A. The most significant events for the reporting period the promotion of Colonel Widdecke to Brigadier General, and the Passing of Command to Colonel Fred E. Haynes Jr. on 27 December 1966 at the Regimental Command Post. (see Note 1)

B. All units continued their extensive patrolling activity during the reporting period, with ambushes and listening posts being used to their fullest advantage. A high

level of activity was maintained despite adverse weather conditions. Battalion size and Company size search and destroy operations with platoon size sweeps aided in the control of the tactical area of responsibility.

- C. During the reporting period Second Battalion, Fifth Marines continued under the direct operational and administrative control of the First Marine Division. The Seventh Marines, under Task Force X-Ray, maintains operational control of the First and Third Battalions, Fifth Marines. This Headquarters, also under Task Force X-Ray, retains administrative control of the First and Third Battalions. Regimental Headquarters remained in place at Hill 35 in the Chu Lai TAOR and continued as an informational, administrative and logistical headquarters.
- D. The majority of the primary regimental staff officers are in absentia and function as staff members of Task Force X-Ray, while the regimental commander continues as Chief of Staff, Task Force X-Ray. The regimental executive officer maintains on the spot control of the headquarters itself.

### 3. DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- A. Personnel. No significant personnel changes occurred during the reporting period.
- B. Administration. Second Battalion continued under the administrative control of First Marine Division. No other significant administrative changes occurred.
- C. Intelligence. The S-2 Section continued to process and disseminate intelligence data. The services were rendered to the Command Post complex with primary requirements being that of dissemination of information received from the various sources.
- D. Training. General military subjects instruction as well as technical military occupation training continued with emphasis on those subjects of immediate applicability to our current commitment. A Sniper Contact Team from First Marine Division held a three day course for Regimental snipers. The below listed formal schools were utilized by the Regiment.

i. Logistics. During the first week of December the access road to the Regimental CP, Hill 35, was washed out by the heavy rains, thus becoming totally dependent on Carrier, cargo, amphibious, M-76 for re-supply. A walkway was constructed over the rice paddies for use by the troops in carrying trash, garbage, mail, etc. to and from the dismount point and CP.

Regimental level inspections of logistics, supply and embarkation in the Battalions and Headquarters Company in preparation for forthcoming inspections by higher headquarters was conducted.

Cantonment construction was completed on fourteen tin roof huts by MCB-40 to be used within the Regimental CP for billeting, office space and storage.

On 29 December 1966 MCB-40 started conversion of thirty strongbacked tents to tin roofs. This will be

completed during January 1967.

Road and drainage improvement continues, but is almost impossible without the aid of heavy engineer support, which has been sporadic during the month. On or about 26 December 1966, 9th Eng. Bn. started construction of a sand berm road along side the present washed out access road. This is to be completed during January 1967.

- j. Civil Affairs. Medical Civic Action patrols treated 7565 civilians during this month.

Dental medical civic action patrols have provided dental assistance, provided toothbrushes and coordinated oral hygiene classes for approximately 250 Vietnamese.

Four truck loads of lumber were distributed for use on the constructing of the remodeling of schools within this TAOR.

Christmas parties within the TAOR resulted in an attendance of approximately 1000 Vietnamese. Assorted gifts of candy, clothing, calendars, pencils and writing paper were distributed.

English language classes were coordinated on a daily basis for 65 Vietnamese.

Two village hog cooperatives have been formed and constructed completed on two hog shelters. Local pigs are currently being raised and will be bred with American pigs on arrival from USAID sources.

- k. Nuclear Biological and Chemical or other Special Type of Warfare. Nothing significant to report.

- l. Medical. On 13 December 1966, about 25 battle casualties from "M" Company, Third Battalion, Fifth Marines were evacuated through Regimental Aid Station to First Medical Battalion. The quantity and quality of medical personnel were found to be adequate with one physician, three corpsmen (Hq. Co. rates two on T/O), two Dentists, and two dental technicians caring for the casualties.

The space available for casualty care proved too cramped for optimum performance. Subsequently the Regimental Aid Station (a 16 X 32' roofed hut) was redesigned with the following changes to insure better triage and emergency care of the wounded.

(a). Existing partition removed.

(b). Mount-cut and other supplies stored in rear of Regimental Aid Station in tarpaulin covered area.

(c). Area refurbished to provide adequate emergency treatment facilities for at least seven non-ambulatory wounded patients.

m. Dental Facility. 100 persons were seen during the month of December with a total of 934 procedures.

Catholic coverage for the Regimental Headquarters was made by Chaplain Edward Toner. Chaplain R. F. Wood L.D.S. Chaplain, made one visit to the L.D.S. personnel. Chaplain assisted the Red Cross Field Director with seven cases involving 5th Marine Regiment personnel. Chaplain distributed 250 gift packets from Red Cross Chapters in the United States and 75 packages from individuals, schools, and clubs to the men in Headquarters Company.

1. Purpose. To publish instructions for the conduct of a Regimental Change of Command Ceremony for 27 December 1966.

- c. 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines. One platoon of 30 men with Platoon Commander, Platoon Sergeant and right guide. One senior officer to represent the Battalion and guidon bearers for each Company of the Battalion.
- 6. Formation for Ceremony. The formation for the ceremony will be Regiment on line with platoons on line. Encl (1).
- 7. Sequence of Events. See enclosure (2).
- 8. Uniform and Equipment. Uniform and Equipment for the Ceremony will be uniform of the day w/normal arms and helmets. Normal arms except all troops in platoon ranks will have rifles. Cartridge/pistol belt (no shoulder-holsters) with four magazines in four pouches for riflemen and one pouch with two magazines for pistol men. First aid packet will be worn on belt. No Bayonets or canteens will be worn.

    - (4) Provide stand for speakers microphone (Encl 1).
  - c. Communications Officer.
    - (1) Provide suitable amplifier, microphone, speakers, etc.
    - (2) Provide taped music (Marital and Marine Hymn).
  - d. S-3 Officer will coordinate ceremony.
