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PART III

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. Personnel and Administration. The command received an input of 9 officers and 647 enlisted personnel during the month of November from normal replacement channels. Additionally 1 officer and 146 enlisted personnel with short periods of time remaining on their overseas tour were received from the 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines during their personnel readiness preparations prior to going afloat as the SLF.

A total of 2 officers and 106 enlisted personnel were medically evacuated out of RVN during the month. The average chargeable strength for the Regiment was 119 Marine officers and 3289 Marine enlisted, 10 Naval officers and 138 Navy enlisted personnel.

During the month of November, this command has experienced what must be necessarily stated as a critical shortage in the following military occupational specialties by rank as indicated.

a. During the month of November 1967 the S-2 section continued the planning, collection and dissemination of intelligence within the

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PART II

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NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the period 1-30 November 1967, the 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines continued under the direct operational control of the 1st Marine Division. The 5th Marines operated intensively within their TAOR in Quang Nam Province with the 1st and 3rd Battalions of the Regiment and with the operational control of the 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines. Priority of operational efforts was directed at the protection of the DaNang vital area and the support of the Revolutionary Development effort within the regimental TAOR. Aggressive day and night patrolling and ambushes were conducted with intensification of such efforts within the Rocket Belt; waterways were kept under constant surveillance and interdicted; intensive search and destroy operations of battalion size and smaller and rapid-reacting heliborne assaults on targets of opportunity were conducted; Reaction forces were maintained in readiness for contingency defense of centers of political and economic importance and such military installations as those of the Combined Action Group. On 29 November 1967, the 5th Marines received operational control of the 2nd Battalion, 3rd Marines who assumed control of the 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines TAOR the following day preparatory to that organization going afloat as the SLF.

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Regiment for numerous "hole-hunting", cordon and search, rapid reaction and search and destroy operations conducted on a battalion basis.

On 8 November 1967, Major C.M. WOGAN arrived at the 5th Marines C.P. to begin briefings in preparation for assuming duties as the S-2 officer. On 30 November Major D.A. SAYE was officially relieved of duties as the S-2 officer by Major WOGAN and rotated to CONUS.

On the late afternoon of 11 November while returning from the 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines combat base, the assistant S-2 officer, one scout and the vehicle driver were ambushed at coordinates BT003633 by 10-15 VC. Only the driver, severely wounded, survived.

b. Projects initiated during the month:

(1) Drafted and published a letter of instruction on utilization of Vietnamese agencies during Cordon and Search Operations.

(2) A letter of instruction on enemy sapper tactics.

(3) Regimental Order on information concerning Clearance and Access.

(4) Intelligence Annex to Operation Order 6-67 (Operation DENVER).

(5) Intelligence Estimate of the Phu-Loc/Phu-Bai area in connection with future operational planning and possible deployment to that area.

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d. Enemy.

(1) The enemy situation within the TAOR has remained relatively unchanged, principal contacts being with fire teams of smaller sized units, snipers and mines and other surprise explosive devices. The enemy has continued his harassing activities throughout the TAOR. Enemy emphasis was placed on interdiction of the LOC as indicated by the fact that the three main bridges within the TAOR were blown up during the month.

(2) Weather. Due to the fact that the monsoon season had not yet arrived by the end of the reporting period, the weather did not have a significant effect on friendly operations.

(3) Terrain. A continuous collection effort on terrain information, including numerous aerial photography reconnaissance requests, has been maintained during the reporting period.

3. Training

The command continued a training program that emphasized care and cleaning of the M-16 rifle, familiarization firing, weapons safety, fire discipline and fire distribution, wet weather foot care, small unit tactics, map reading, mine and explosive devices and indoctrination on the harmful effects of marijuana. An intensive indoctrination program for the training of all replacement personnel to the Regiment continues.

Technical training was accomplished through both attendance at schools and on the job training. During the month of November the following schools were utilized.

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4. Operations.

(a) During the period reported on, the 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines continued under the operational control of the 1st Marine Division participating in a battalion sized operation named ESSEX which took place in Antenna Valley against NVA units. This operation also included Company D and Company M and a platoon of Company I from the other two battalions of the 5th Marines.

(b) Both the 1st Battalion and the 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines conducted a battalion-sized operation during November and numerous company-sized and smaller operations within the regimental TAOR. The highlights of the operations were several "Rapid Reaction Packages" and "Hole Hunting" Operations by each battalion. The "Rapid Reaction Package" enabled the battalion commander to make a visual reconnaissance of his TAOR by helicopter to select a target of opportunity on which to direct a heliborne company assault force. "Hole Hunting" involved cordoning off an area and then sending a unit within the area to remain a minimum of one day and conduct a detailed and painstaking search of the area for enemy hiding places and cache sites.

(c) During the month of November, the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines conducted two battalion-sized Search and Cordon Operations which utilized a company as the searching force and applied "Hole Hunting" techniques. A quantity of material including a cache of over three thousand pounds of rice was found during these operations. During the latter portion of the month the 3rd Battalion conducted a two day sweep through the south-eastern sector of their TAOR preparatory to assuming blocking positions for a regimental operation to have been conducted in the Special Operating Area southwest of Duy Xuyen. The operation, named DENVER, was to have involved the SLF but had to be cancelled due to the scheduling of the SLF to relieve another battalion to go afloat and poor fighting weather.

(d) During the month of November the regiment maintained intensive small unit patrols and ambush activity within their TAOR with emphasis on coverage of their portion of the "rocket belt" which surrounds the DaNang vital area. Additionally, the regiment continually maintained reaction forces to respond to enemy threats on the Quang Nam province capital at Hoi An, three district capitals, and the numerous Combined Action Company sites and other military installations within the TAOR.

(e) An intensive Waterway Denial Program was maintained which involved patrols and ambushes along these lines of possible enemy communication as well as numerous AO missions and six "firefly" missions utilizing after-curfew patrols of the waterways by teams of UH1-E gunships with searchlight helicopters. As a result of waterway interdiction, 16 VC boats were destroyed and 7 boats damaged during the month.

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5. Fire Support. The 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines continues to be in direct support of the Fifth Marines. During the month of November, the following missions were fired in support of the Regiment.

Med Evac missions included 82 USMC WIA, 28 USMC NBC and 10 USMC KIA, 12 ARVN WIA, 30 CIV WIA and 2 VC WIA.

7. Logistics. Company sized operations within the TAOR were supported logistically by their battalions through a variety of means including helicopter, LVT, M-76 truck (Otter) and M-35 truck. A temporary LSA was established at the 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines combat base with a five day level of Class I and Class V supplies and very limited Class II materials. These supplies were pre-staged in the temporary LSA in preparation for Operation DENVER. A Class III stock pile of 55 gallon drums of mogas and diesel fuel was set up as well.

A significant tank and motor march was conducted on 27 November. Company A, 1st Battalion, 5th Marines mounted on eight (8) M-35 trucks and six (6) tanks of Company C, 1st Tank Battalion moved from Dien Bon coordinates 065583 to coordinates 077517 on Route 537 near Duy Xuyen in connection with Operation DENVER prior to the cancellation of that operation.

Embarkation data has been updated and re-compiled, mount-out boxes

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repaired and re-marked and other embarkation materials stocked. Two (2) butler huts in the 11th Motor Transport Battalion area, assigned to the 5th Marines, were each divided into two (2) separate battalion personal effects storage facilities through the construction of seabag storage racks. Enough racks were constructed in each area for the storage of one seabag for each individual with an additional floor space remaining for cargo storage. Efforts were exerted to reduce the amount of individual personal effects by urging that Marines have their excess effects shipped home.

Special efforts have been made to reduce the numbers of deadlined items, particularly in the area of motor transport and communications equipment. The use of "RED BALL" nominations has also been reinstated.

Much of the month of November was devoted to planning the movement of the 5th Marines from their present TAOR to the Phu Bai/Phu Lo area.

The logistic status of the 5th Marines is considered excellent at this time.

8. Communications. In the area of communications the following significant events occurred during the month of November.

a. During the period 1-13 November the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines constructed a 25 pair cable line on telescopic telephone poles from its combat base to the I Corps Hoi An Advisory switchboard, a distance of four (4) miles. The telephone cable gave the following circuit capabilities:

(1) One (1) trunk line from 5th Marines COC switchboard direct to the Hoi An Advisory switchboard.

(2) Two (2) trunk lines from 1st Battalion, 5th Marines switchboard to Hoi An Advisory switchboard.

(3) One (1) Trunk line from 1st Battalion, 5th Marines switchboard to the ARVN armored personnel carrier unit located in the battalion TAOR.

(4) One (1) trunk line from Hoi An Advisory switchboard to the ARVN armored personnel carrier unit.

(5) One (1) trunk line from Hoi An Advisory switchboard to Dien Ban District Advisor.

b. On 23 November the 7th Communication Battalion completed a portion of a 25 pair cable on telephone poles to Dien Ban. This circuit gave the 5th Marines the following telephone capability:

(1) One (1) trunk from 1st Battalion, 5th Marines to the Dien Ban District Advisor.

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(2) One (1) trunk from 1st Battalion, 5th Marines to the Combined Action Company Headquarters at Dien Ban

This cable is to be utilized with the existing pole line construction on Route #1 in December allowing wire circuits from the 5th Marines Headquarters to the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines to supplement existing radio relay circuits.

c. Police of extraneous wire was conducted within the TAOR by the 5th Marines in the following areas.

(1) 1st Battalion, 5th Marines Command Post to Route 1 at Dien Ban.

(2) 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines Command Post to 5th Marines Headquarters on the Anderson Trail.

(3) Route #1 from Dien Ban to the 5th Marines Headquarters.

9. Medical. During the month of November, a total of 195 patients were treated at the Regimental Aid Station of which some 55% or 107 were referrals from the battalions. Not included in this figure were several Vietnamese civilian indigents, treated for humanitarian reasons. On 14 November, Lieutenant R. A. HARRISON (MC) USNR, formerly of the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines assumed duties of the Regimental Surgeon from Lieutenant T. E. BRUNNELL (MC) USNR who was transferred.

10. Dental. During the reporting period, a total of 301 Marines were treated at the mobile dental unit located at the Regimental Command Post of which some 93% or 284 were from Headquarters Company itself. Additionally, some 347 Marines received stannous fluoride treatments.

11. Civil Affairs.

a. During the month of November, the battalions of the Regiment conducted a vigorous civil affairs program within their area of responsibility which included a total of some 3349 Vietnamese civilians seen at MED-CAPS and the distribution of rice and assistance kits. The notable battalion efforts in civil affairs were that of the 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines and personnel of the 29th Civil Affairs Company relocated 7921 refugees in THANH MY Refugee Settlement, DUC DUC District. Additionally, 27½ tons of rice captured in both operations was bagged and turned over to Duc Duc District.

b. Assisting substantially in the civic action program particularly at the regimental level was the 2nd AA Platoon, 29th Civil Affairs Company (U.S. Army) which was attached during the period reported on. At the Regimental level, the following were the most notable of the projects

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completed during November:

(1) A study of the capabilities of the Vietnamese National Police Force and their employment by Marine units in such operations as County Fairs. Copies of the study were distributed to the battalion.

(2) Construction assistance to CAP G-6 for a MED CAP building in the vicinity of BT 071701.

(3) Control of the civilian populus throughout the TAOR while close-in protective artillery fire was being requested.

(4) Delivery of a ton of rice as well as blankets, clothing and household items to Dien Ban District Headquarters for distribution to six hundred refugees of Phu Cu refugee camp who were left homeless by a Viet Cong attack.

(5) Preparation and publication of a comprehensive study of the Revolutionary Development Teams in the TAOR.

(6) Commenced a joint pilot project to determine the feasibility of units of the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing supplementing the civic action efforts of the infantry battalions in Le Son Peace Hamlet.

(7) Continued work on the development of a monsoon drainage system at Kim Son Peace Hamlet.

(8) Provided material assistance in the form of rice, clothing and building materials to Vietnamese individuals and groups.

c. Chaplain. During the reporting period the Regimental Chaplain supplemented the services of the battalion chaplains and provided services for the CAP units within the Regimental TAOR.

Subj: Regimental Scout/Sniper Platoon

1. Purpose. To publish information relative to the mission, organization, training, capabilities, employment, and equipment of the Regimental Scout/Sniper Platoon.

2. Background.

a. The Scout/Sniper Platoon is established organic to each infantry regimental headquarters company by reference (a).

b. Snipers were used by the Marine Corps in World War II and in Korea. During the period following the Korean War and up to 1965, little was done with the idea of trained Scout/Snipers. Most of the existing data concerning the subject was compiled (from Canadian and Welsh Manuals) by Captain E. J. Land, who had a personal interest in the "art of sniping". Through his guidance, a sniper training school was set up in Hawaii, but a need for snipers was not felt until March of 1965, when the 3rd Marine Division generated interest in the subject.

In January of 1967 the M700 Remington Rifle and the Redfield 3x-9x variable power scope were received in RVN as the weapon and scope to be used by scout/sniper teams. In February 1967 the weapon was placed in service and sniping schools were begun.

c. A properly trained and equipped scout/sniper platoon should be considered a strong supporting arm that is as flexible as the imagination. This platoon may be employed as a unit or subdivided into squads and teams for attachment to any size tactical unit.

d. Scout/snipers are an asset to any field unit. Their training incorporates a wide variety of subjects which are as important

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as their skill with the rifle itself. The value of these Marines extends in many directions beyond their primary task of shooting.

3. Mission.

a. To identify, kill or wound the enemy, especially key personnel, with single shots from positions of concealment.

b. To act aggressively in a counter sniper role, seeking out and eliminating the enemy sniper.

c. To dominate the TAOR, denying the enemy freedom of movement.

d. The gathering of intelligence while observing enemy territory.

4. Capabilities.

a. A well trained scout/sniper team will be able to hit a head sized target at 300 meters with one shot, and a body size target at 600 meters with one shot. Under ideal conditions a target out as far, or on occasion beyond, 1000 meters can be brought down.

b. At night using a starlight scope the sniper is effective in bringing down targets out to 500 meters. Observation, however, with the starlight scope is effective under ideal conditions from 700 meters to 1000 meters.

5. Methods of Employment.

a. Offensive Combat.

(1) The scout/sniper team can be most effectively used in the offense from static positions. Examples would be:

(a) Blocking positions.

(b) Set in a position which would afford good observation and fields of fire as a unit sweeps through a village.

(c) Positions covering likely avenues of approach or waterways and trails used for travel.

(2) Through their accurate fires a scout/sniper team can demoralize and disorganize an enemy and possibly force him to deploy his

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unit before he is ready to do so.

(3) With their use of optics scout/sniper teams can be a very useful source of intelligence for the S-2.

(4) At night, with the use of the starlight scope the scout/sniper team could be utilized in ambushes which could be triggered from greater distances than would be expected, or used to detect enemy movement and give early warning to friendly units.

(5) The scout/sniper teams are schooled in forward observer procedures and if the opportunity presents itself, can be utilized to call in artillery, air, or mortars.

b. Defensive Combat.

(1) The scout/sniper team can be used as a covering force to kill, harass, and delay the enemy by causing him to deploy his troops.

(2) In areas of good observation scout/sniper teams can be used for local security, by deploying them in observation towers or bunkers.

(3) Combat outposts or general outposts could also utilize scout/sniper teams.

6. Equipment.

a. Scout/sniper teams are equipped with the following special equipment.

- (1) Remington M700 7.62mm rifle with a medium weight barrel.
- (2) Redfield (3x-9x) variable power scope.
- (3) Binoculars, 7x50.
- (4) Spotting scope, M49, 20x.
- (5) Ammunition, Lake City, 7.62mm, match.

b. The accuracy and finely tooled equipment utilized by the scout/sniper teams dictates timely and expert care. The rifle team

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equipment armorer assigned to each platoon should ensure proper maintenance. Further command attention is mandatory in the daily cleaning, storage and employment of arms, ammunitions, optics, and related equipment. Rifle and telescopic sights requiring third echelon maintenance will be evacuated to FSR(Div).

c. Destruction of Equipment. The scout/sniper platoon members are instructed to destroy their equipment in the following manner if the situation deems this step necessary:

(1) All optics are to be broken, destroyed and buried if possible.

(2) The rifle itself is to have the bolt action removed and carried with the person or buried apart from the weapon itself.

7. Selection of Personnel. Personnel for the scout/sniper platoon are selected from organic resources and must possess the following basic qualifications:

a. Be an expert rifleman, demonstrating an excellent understanding of those skills associated with superior marksmanship.

b. Volunteer.

c. Above average physical and mental capabilities.

d. 20/20 uncorrected vision.

e. Have 6 months remaining in country or extend.

f. Be recommended by his commanding officer.

8. Action. Commanders are urged to utilize the scout/sniper teams in those roles which will afford the best results of their training and skills. They should not be used to supplement lines, stand radio watches or other such duties just because of their presence. Used properly and with aggressiveness the scout/sniper team will turn in appropriate results. If they cannot be used for their purpose, scout/sniper teams should be detached for another units use.

TRAINING SYLLABUS FOR THE SCOUT/SNIPER PLATOON MEMBERS

The initial training for the individual snipers by the Division Scout/Snipers Instruction Team is vigorous, progressive, and continuing. The school presents the following syllabus:

1. Care and cleaning of weapons and equipment.
2. Optics.
3. Starlight Scope.
4. Data Book and Range Cards.
5. Intelligence.
6. Map Reading and Compass.
7. F.O. Procedures.
8. Camouflage.
9. Live Firing.

The school lasts a total of $5\frac{1}{2}$ days. Of this period, 3 days are spent in the classroom and $2\frac{1}{2}$ days are spent on live firing ranges.

The scout/sniper teams should also be presented the opportunity to rezero their weapons weekly to insure proper dope.

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SCOUT/SNIPER EQUIPMENT PROBLEMS

1. The table of equipment reflecting equipment allowance for the scout/sniper platoon has not yet been made available.
2. The humid weather causes the stocks to warp resulting in constant changes of zero.
3. Teleopic len covers break easily and cannot protect the scopes lenses.
4. There are no iron sights on the rifle, so a loss of the scope eliminates the use of the rifle.
5. The table of allowance does not provide extra stocks or scopes, resulting in complete loss of the weapons use in a case of resultant damage to these essential pieces of equipment.
6. All scopes (Redfield 3 x 9 variable power) must be transferred to CONUS for maintenance. Minor repairs on the M700 Remington Rifle can be accomplished through the platoon armorer, however, because of the delicate nature of the weapon, much of the maintenance is handled only through 3rd echelon maintenance (FSR, Division).

Subj: Letter of Instruction on Utilization of Vietnamese
Agencies During Cordon and Search Operations

1. This letter of instruction is promulgated to familiarize commanders with the resources available to them, from the Government of Viet Nam. Utilization of the below listed agencies during operations can enhance the Command's probability of success in Cordon and Search Operations.

2. Enclosure (1) is based on a study of past cordon and search operations. It by no means includes all methods that can be employed, and is to be used strictly as a guideline. Enclosure (2) is an evaluation sheet to be used by the Commander, as a basis for this Headquarters to evaluate the agency and its usefulness to this Command. Upon completion of any operation utilizing the below listed agencies, enclosure (2) will be forwarded to this Headquarters (Attn: S-2).

a. MILITARY SECURITY SERVICE (MSS). The MSS is the Counterintelligence arm of the Armed Forces, Republic of Viet Nam. The MSS is concerned mainly with the GVN military services. The MSS normally does not participate in operations, but nevertheless should be contacted to determine their knowledgeability concerning the operational area.

(1) Capabilities:

- (a) Interrogation of military personnel
- (b) Security checks on Vietnamese Nationals
- (c) Answering certain EEI utilizing agent nets

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- (d) Provide Blacklists
- (e) Provide area studies
- (f) Screening populace for deserters and draft dodgers

(2) Employment: The MSS can be employed during cordon and search operations as a screening agency to look for deserters, draft dodgers, etc. Occasionally they may have knowledge of specific targets (tunnels, caches, and munitions) in the area of operations. The MSS when participating in operations can be utilized with great effect in the physical search of dwellings.

b. SPECIAL BRANCH NATIONAL POLICE (SBNP): The SBNP is the equivalent to U.S. plain clothes police. They are responsible for establishing and maintaining covert intelligence collection units directed against the Viet Cong Infrastructure.

(1) Capabilities:

- (a) Provide field interrogation teams
- (b) Provide Blacklists
- (c) Provide area studies
- (d) Penetration of specific targets
- (e) Answer certain EEI utilizing penetration field agents
- (f) In some instances SBNP can act as guides but must be disguised to protect their identity.

(2) Employment: The SBNP can be employed during operations at civilian screening points. They may have the capability of using an in-place agent to point out Cadre, Viet Cong, tunnels and caches. They can further be employed as interrogators. The using unit should in all cases give the SBNP enough advance notice in order for the SBNP to step up penetration of the area of operations. The SBNP are very useful in the actual physical search of dwellings as they are more familiar with out-of-place items than U.S. personnel.

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c. NATIONAL POLICE (NP). The NP are the uniformed police of the GVN. Their function is to locate and apprehend the criminal element, and maintain law and order. A large majority of these men have personal knowledge of enemy personnel in their area as well as knowledge of the terrain.

(1) Capabilities:

- (a) Provide Blacklists
- (b) Provide field interrogation teams
- (c) Provide area studies
- (d) Provide guides
- (e) Identification of VC sympathizers
- (f) Provide screening and collection point activities

(2) Employment: The NP being native to the area in which they are stationed gives the using unit a capability which should not be overlooked. These personnel often know of Viet Cong Infrastructure in the Hamlet/Village but are reluctant to come forward. NP personnel are best employed by placing them at screening points to check ID cards of the populace. They are familiar with the people living in the area and can identify any stranger. The employment of NP in conjunction with Static Census Grievance is usually very beneficial (See Static Census Grievance).

d. NATIONAL POLICE FIELD FORCES (NPFF). The NPFF is a paramilitary organization. Being of a paramilitary nature, their methods are often questionable. No matter what their methods the NPFF will often obtain positive results. The NPFF are usually placed in areas where NP cannot operate due to VC influence.

(1) Capabilities:

- (a) Annihilation of VC Infrastructure
- (b) Riot control
- (c) Operate with Military Elements

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(d) Interrogation of VC

(e) Screening of Civilian populace

(2) Employment: The NPFF will normally be employed with the search element of the operation. Best results can be achieved by assigning an NPFF member with each Marine Fire Team. This can also act as a check and balance for any future complaints by inhabitants of theft or destruction of property. Due to the NPFF's mission, a thorough briefing is necessary. The exact mission the Commander wants the NPFF to perform must be stated. Any request for utilization of NPFF must be directed to the Central Government in Saigon through local U.S. Advisors.

c. VIETNAMESE INFORMATION SERVICE (VIS). The VIS is a psychological warfare element of the GVN. A VIS team is usually located at each District Headquarters.

(1) Capabilities:

(a) Propaganda dissemination

(b) Loudspeakers

(c) Motion Pictures

(d) Give Speeches

(e) Entertainment during County Fair/Cordon and Search Operations

(f) Drama Teams

(2) Employment. The VIS is best employed in conjunction with S-5 activities. After the cordon is in place and screening of populace begins, the persons who are cleared by the screening agency should be collected in one (1) general area. The VIS can then entertain these people until they are allowed back to their homes. A good method of employment is to assign CHIEU HOI's to the VIS. During the search operation the CHIEU HOI's in conjunction with the VIS Loudspeaker capability can try to persuade hiding Cadre and guerrillas to give themselves up. A carefully rehearsed speech, to include the security that will be offered surrendering Cadre/VC, must be included.

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f. CHIEU HOI's. The Chieu Hoi is a returnee to the GVN. The selection of Chieu Hoi's for operations should be based on obtaining the most recent returnees from the area of operations, and those who have the most exploitable knowledge.

(1) Capabilities:

- (a) Pointing out infrastructure/guerrillas
- (b) Pointing out tunnels, caches
- (c) Pointing out mines/booby traps
- (d) Propaganda speeches

(2) Employment: The Chieu Hoi from the area of operations should be acquired early in the planning phase of the operation. A careful debriefing is essential to develop all the knowledge the Chieu Hoi has. Some Chieu Hoi's may be reluctant to point out infrastructure/VC personalities. When this situation arises a means of hiding the identity of the Chieu Hoi must be found that will convince him that he will be safe. A Chieu Hoi that is willing to point out mines and booby traps should lead the way. He knows where they are and the signs to look for, if new ones have been placed in the area. The employment of the Chieu Hoi with the VIS can be rewarding in that he may convince those who have doubts about returning to the GVN, to surrender themselves. His speech should be carefully written to conform with the hardships of the present time and be well rehearsed. IT MUST BE KEPT IN MIND THAT ALL CHIEU HOI'S ARE NOT RELIABLE.

g. REVOLUTIONARY DEVELOPMENT (RD). The RD is composed of armed platoons with the mission of training hamlet personnel in self-government, self-protection, self-help projects, refined methods of industry and agriculture, and to unseat the VC infrastructure control that has been established in the area.

(1) Capabilities:

- (a) Identification of VC Cadre
- (b) Village/hamlet plans/studies
- (c) Population count

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- (d) Intelligence collection of covert VC infrastructure

(2) Employment: It must be kept in mind that the RD will not be in areas that are unpacified. Therefore use of the RD in tactical operations is doubtful. They can be utilized by the Command for intelligence collection if near Combat Base and Command Post areas. The information the RD gains by working in their areas is a great aid for intelligence studies.

h. PROVINCIAL RECONNAISSANCE UNIT (PRU). The PRU is a field intelligence collection unit. It is controlled by the Province Chief and all requests for these personnel must be addressed to the Province level.

(1) Capabilities:

- (a) Recon patrols into VC areas
- (b) Covert intelligence mission
- (c) Specified missions
- (d) Snatch Operations
- (e) Guides
- (f) Penetration missions

(2) Employment: The PRU have an unlimited use and are only limited by the imagination of the employing unit. When requesting this unit, the exact mission must be stated and the type of uniform to be worn, i.e. combat dress, civilian clothes, etc.. They are best employed to gather intelligence prior to operational planning. The PRU are trained in terrain analysis and other forms of intelligence collection. The PRU can be employed in a covert status as civilians to enter built up areas where U.S. Forces have no access. The PRU should be utilized as often as possible, to gain up to date information on the area of operations. PRU in Quang Nam Province has been temporarily disbanded.

i. STATIC CENSUS GREIVANCE (SCG). The SCG has the mission of conducting census of hamlet/villages and to determine the greivances and asperations of the inhabitants. The information that can be provided by SCG covers a vast area of knowledge. The SCG is probably the only agency within the GVN that deals

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continually with the people at this low level.

(1) Capabilities:

- (a) Obtain accurate population figures
- (b) Obtain information concerning VC infrastructure activities
- (c) Obtain information on secret tunnels
- (d) Obtain information on supply caches
- (e) Obtain information on location of booby traps and mines
- (f) Provide hamlet plans
- (g) Guides

(2) Employment: The SCG recruits their personnel from the local area. This gives the employing unit the availability of a person familiar with the area. The SCG may be able to identify individuals who they think are VC collaborators. Most knowledge of hidden tunnels, caches, etc., will be obtained from interviews with the local populace. Normally the SCG cannot point out the exact location of these tunnels and caches but may lead the search personnel to the general area, or point out the person who actually knows where the target is.

NOTE: SCG personnel are normally of the lower educated class. They are not trained in intelligence collection, therefore some SCG personnel may possess knowledge of great importance without being aware of it. A kind and patient attitude toward these personnel can often reap a great harvest. Take your time and explain in detail what you are after and be thorough in your debriefing.

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CONDUCT OF CORDON & SEARCH OPERATIONS

1. PLANNING PHASE.

a. Selection of Operational Area. In operations of this nature a careful study of past intelligence reports is vital to select the area which will be most productive. Consideration must be given to the area in regard to the number of troops assets available for the Cordon. The area must not be greater than the troops assets can cover.

b. Prior Penetration of Operation Area. Should the Command desire a physical penetration of the target area, for the most recent intelligence, PRU personnel should be utilized. This penetration should be a one time penetration and the PRU should be dressed in the manner of the populace in that area.

c. Security. This aspect of the planning phase is the most critical. GVN agencies to be utilized should not be told the exact target. When requesting area studies from GVN sources, request a larger area or other areas at the same time. GVN personnel utilized on operations should arrive at the CP's for briefings the evening prior to the commencement of the operation and be required to remain in the CP location. NOTE: Any compromise of the operation, no matter how slight, will probably result in failure.

d. Liaison with GVN Agencies. All GVN agencies have American counterparts as advisors to them. All liaison concerning cordon and search operations should be conducted with the American counterpart. Emphasis must be placed on security. The actual place and time of the operation should not be disclosed to any of the agencies' members other than the American counterpart.

2. MOVEMENT TO OBJECTIVE. The movement to the objective is the most critical aspect of the operation. Movement by foot is normally out of the question if any type of success is desired. The warning systems utilized by the VC are excellent and will detect any movement by troops on foot. Should foot movement be necessary, the employment of a faint is recommended to direct attention from the real target. In any event, movement by foot or by heliborne troops must be coordinated so that the complete cordon is in place at the same time.

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3. CORDONING. Many military elements may be utilized in the cordon: tanks, ~~ant~~tracks, ontos, etc. Mechanized elements should not be used in the initial cordon. They are excellent elements for replacing troops once the cordon has been completed. Once the cordon is in place no individual must be allowed to pass through it. Persons attempting to infiltrate the cordon from the outside are to be apprehended and forwarded to the collection point.

a. Clearance of Population from Cordon. Once the cordon has been set and checked to ensure that no gaps exist, the next step is to clear the populace. The clearing of the populace should be done by the NP in conjunction with the Marine sweep force. A second rapid sweep of the area is recommended to detect any persons that may have been missed or attempting to hide. Be sure to instruct the inhabitants to bring enough food to last the day.

4. SEARCH PHASE. During this phase all assets of the GVN that have knowledge of hidden tunnels, caches, etc., are to be employed. At least one fire team to accompany each GVN source is recommended. This search must be detailed. Every inch of ground must be probed. Never overlook hedgrows, small ponds, roofs and walls of dwellings and other obvious places. Time and patience is the key to success.

NOTE: The use of a probe spike is recommended. The rod from an artillery canister, fitted with a bamboo handle and sharpened to a fine point makes an excellent probe spoke. Dog Teams are highly recommended for use in the search phase, and should be employed whenever possible.

5. COLLECTION POINT. This is the area where the screening of the populace is conducted. NP, SBNP, SCG, and MSS should be employed at this point. If informants are utilized to point out personnel, they should be located at the collection point. Police should screen ID cards. Checks by all the agencies against blacklists should be conducted. Before screening and after, the VIS and propaganda teams can be used to entertain the people. An interrogation center should be established. It is recommended that the local village headquarters be used for this purpose. MEDCAP and DENTCAP Teams may also be employed at the collection point.

(1) Handling of Informant Personnel. Informant personnel must be protected at all times during the operation. It is recommended that these personnel be disguised and placed at the

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collection point where they can observe personnel being screened by the various agencies. A house in the immediate vicinity is ideal for this purpose. The use of a bamboo screen with a slit cut in it, located in the screening area, will also suffice. It must be kept in mind that these personnel are doing a dangerous service for you and their safety is paramount.

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INTELLIGENCE ESTIMATE OF THE SITUATION

1. Mission

a. Basic Mission. Commencing on or about 1 December 1967, 5th Marines moves from present TAOR on relief of elements of the 1st MarDiv and ROK Bde; establishes combat bases in the PHU BAI/PHU LOC area, secures route #1, and conducts offensive operations to kill or capture the enemy and destroy his forces and materials.

b. Previous Decisions. Boundaries, order of movement and policies are defined in paragraph 2, 4 and 5 of reference (b).

c. Purpose of this Estimate. To provide sufficient intelligence information to plan the displacement of the 5th Marines from present TAOR to the PHU BAI/PHU LOC area and to prepare for initial operations in that area.

2. Enemy Situation

a. Characteristics of the Area of Operations.

(1) Military Geography. The TAOR, located in the Eastern and Southern portion of THUA THIEN PROVINCE, ICTZ, is divided topographically into the western mountains, the central piedmont and the coastal plain.

(a) The mountains which extend in a general north-south belt along the western boundary, and an east-west belt along the southern boundary, are heavily dissected and rugged with slopes ranging from 30 to 40 degrees. Evergreen secondary forests are predominant, trees range in height from 25-30 meters with some as high as 50 meters. The canopy is continuous and dark green. Tree trunks are straight, commonly 2 to 16 meters apart and unbranched to great heights. Secondary forests consist of smaller trees with a discontinuous canopy and more dense undergrowth.

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(b) The narrow piedmont, west of Highway #1, consists of undulating hills which are cut by numerous river valleys. These waterways extend like fingers from the western highlands, through the piedmont, and into the coastal plain. Hills in the piedmont range from 30 to 70 meters in elevation with slopes between 10 and 20 degrees. The piedmont is predominantly secondary, broadleaf forest with some dense evergreen forest. Dense undergrowth is more abundant than in the mountains, with 15-30 foot high bamboo and palm thickets very common. There are some grass areas, growing as high as five feet, as well as small cultivated areas of dry crops.

(c) The coastal plain is a relatively flat strip 10 to 15 kilometers wide which extends the length of the coast. The plains are interspersed by isolated hills and ridges, and are sectioned into many areas of rice paddies bounded by dikes 2 to 5 feet high. The eastern edge of the coastal plain consists of a belt, which averages 200 meters in width, of beach and sand dunes 3 to 20 meters in height. The coastal plain is characterized by canals and irrigation ditches which link together numerous streams, deltas, and distributing channels, forming a network of waterways to provide drainage, irrigation, and water transportation. In the coastal plains, wetland rice and some dry crops are the major vegetation, although dune grass and marshes are scattered throughout. Rice fields, flooded to a depth of 6 to 18 inches during the growing season, are drained just prior to the harvests in March and August, and are driest in September. Mature rice forms a dense grass 3 to 4 feet high. Villages are covered by dense vegetation, including thick hedges between houses. Soils throughout the coastal area and in some inland areas are a sandy silt, poorly suited for construction, except for fill.

(d) Good observation and fields of fire in the mountains are restricted to those areas where slopes abut open valleys. Aerial observation is severely limited by the dense vegetation. In the piedmont good observation and fields of fire can be found only in the open areas on the valley floors. Aerial observation is improved by a decrease in vegetation density but remains restricted by dense undergrowth. In the coastal area observation and fields of fire are generally good but impeded by local irregularities and hedges in built up areas. Air observation is good.

(e) Cover and concealment. Cover and concealment in the mountains and in the piedmont are excellent. In the coastal plains some cover is provided by paddy dikes and occasional sand dunes. Concealment is limited to that available in the built up areas and in the dense, mature rice fields at certain times of the year.

(f) Avenues of approach. Avenues of approach are restricted to the existing very limited road net; helicopter landing zones, which vary from plentiful in the coastal plain to infrequent and easily interdicted in the mountains; the navigable waterways of the coastal plain; the minor valley systems with gradual gradients; and an extensive trail net.

(g) Key terrain

1. The military complex at HUE/PHU BAI, containing the

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FLSC and the air field, which is essential to support of sustained operations.

2. The SONG HUONG, from its mouth to HUE, with associated waterfront, highway, and logistics facilities serving the HUE/PHU BAI military complex.

3. Highway #1, the MSR, throughout the TAOR, but particularly in the HAI VAN PASS area where it can be most easily interdicted.

4. Stream-valley and trail junctions along the piedmont which control avenues of approach from the west and south.

5. The CAU TSO HIEN which provides water access to the DAM CAU HAI, controlling a major water infiltration route.

6. The city of HUE, which is important from historical, cultural, religious and political points of view, as well as controlling the MSR to the north of our TAOR.

(h) Effect on enemy capabilities. Mountain and piedmont favor the enemy tactically. Irregular terrain and dense vegetation offer excellent concealment, routes of infiltration and defensive positions. The coastal plains do not favor sustained attacks by large forces.

(i) Effect on Friendly forces. The steep, rugged, heavily forested mountains in the west and south of our TAOR will seriously hinder overland mobility. Short fields of fire, restricted observation, and limited LOC and helicopter LZ's make forces operating in these areas particularly vulnerable to ambushes and difficult to support logistically. The piedmont area is less restrictive. It contains more LOC and helicopter LZ's as well as some areas where observation and fields of fire are much better than in the mountains. Dense undergrowth throughout most of the piedmont, however, will impose definite restrictions on friendly operations. In the coastal plains during the monsoon season, flooded rice paddies and the extensive waterway system will impede foot movement and seriously restrict motorized/mechanized movement. During the dry season, however, these areas will favor our operations. The extensive waterway system can be exploited year around with special equipment and techniques.

(2) Hydrography. The DAM CAU HAI, the large lagoon along the coast, is approximately 8 kilometers wide and has a depth of 12 meters at its deepest point. This lagoon is connected by a series of lagoons to form an inland waterway running the length of the TAOR, approximately 64 kilometers long.

Surf and tide conditions are affected by the season of the year. During the period of November through March, surf 4 feet or higher occurs along the the exposed beaches up to 55% of the time. During the period June through September surf up to 4 feet or higher occurs 26% of the time. Average tidal range for this area is two feet.

Numerous landing beaches exist along the entire length of the

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TAOR. Beach approaches near shore are clear. Near shore slopes range from steep to flat but relatively few steep slopes front the beaches. The primary near shore bottom material is sand. Beach gradients are predominantly steep to moderate in the low water to high water and mostly steep in the high water zone. Exits from the beaches are almost nonexistent, presenting a major difficulty to sustained amphibious landings.

(3) Climate and Weather. The North Eastern monsoon, which normally begins in October and lasts through February, affects the coastal plain, the piedmont and the eastern slopes of the mountains. The average monthly rainfall is 9-23 inches, highest in the first half of the wet season, tapering off in the latter half. Monthly rainfall in the dry season is 1-4 inches. Prolonged precipitation occurs frequently between late November and late March. Ceilings under 1000 feet and visibility levels between $\frac{1}{2}$ and 2 miles are common to the period. Between September and March, frequent fogs occur along the coast, beginning about 0300 and dissipating about 0800 daily. Typhoons with associated flooding occur from August through November with October the peak month. Temperatures range as high as 130 degrees fahrenheit during the dry season and as low as 40 degrees during the wet season. The monsoon season favors the enemy in that it restricts air operations and ground movement, and conversely, the dry season favors friendly operations.

(2) Transportation.

(a) Highway. The main north-south supply route is Highway #1. The road bed is built-up; however, the foundation is weak and has not held up under heavy traffic. The surface is a bituminous macadam and varies in width from three to seven meters. The overall rating is class 15, though it is possible to sustain up to class 25 traffic by exercising caution, risking crossings of certain bridges and utilizing bypasses during the dry season. Highways are easily interdicted and keeping them open is an important indication of controlling ICTZ. Replacement of timber-trestle bridges washed out during the past monsoon with pile-bent bridges is expected to impede further washouts. To the south of the TAOR, Highway #1 cuts through a mountainous section (Hai Van Pass) where the road is so narrow that traffic must be monitored at terminal points to permit only one way traffic.

(b) Railroads. The national railroad parallels Rte #1 throughout the TAOR; however, enemy interdiction has made the use of rail facilities impossible.

(c) Waterways. Streams flow swiftly in the highlands but as they reach the piedmont they widen into rivers and flow more slowly. In the coastlands they become sluggish and subject to silting. Consequently the utility of the rivers and the inland

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waterways is largely limited to shallow draft ships and craft. There are three principal waterways within the TAOR: the Song Huong, the Song Dai Giang - River/Canal complex, and the inland waterway made up of the Dam Tham Lam, the Lagoon De L'Est and the Dam Cau Hai. These are navigable only to small native craft, and near the coast, to shallow draft vessels and landing craft. The Song Huong (YD8031) will accomodate LCU's inland as far as Hue. The Lagoon De L'Est (YD9026) and the Dam Cau Hai have a safe draft of 3.3 meters at high water and 1.5 meters at low water.

(e) Although friendly forces seldom use the inland highways, the VC are continuously using them in conjunction with the trail system and waterways, as primary transportation routes.

(f) The main roads are easily interdicted, but cuts are usually repaired or bypassed within 24 hours. Increased bridge and road security measures will be required to improve the reliability of land travel. Accordingly, a heavy dependence on air and sea LOC is anticipated. The only significant airfield is located at Hue (YD8917). Waterways in the coastal plain may be of some use provided adequate small craft are available.

(3) Telecommunications.

(a) The military network includes a major switchboard at Phu Bai which connects to a switchboard at Hue. This system links Hue - Phu Bai with DaNang, Tam Ky, Chu Lai, Quang Ngai, Hoi An, and various stations outside of ICTZ with both voice and teletype circuits.

(b) The Northern Toll system of the Post Telephone and Telegraph Company links Hue and DaNang by HF. This net is too insecure for most friendly traffic, however it is used during emergencies, and by ARVN. It also enables a shrewd enemy to pass his own traffic.

(4) Politics. The political situation within the TAOR is much the same as is found elsewhere in ICTZ.

(5) Economy. Agriculture is the area's basic industry with rice culture in the coastal plain principal. Fishing is the second most important industry. However, security restrictions have severely hampered its exploitation. Some light industries exist near the cities, however, most manufactured items must be imported. Despite two rice crops annually, the area remains a food deficit area. The current economic situation favors VC economic and propaganda warfare. Effective security on the rice production areas, on the other hand, will destroy a vital element of the enemy's logistics base.

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(6) Sociology.

(a) Language. Central dialect Vietnamese, understood by both Northerners and Southerners is the most important language. French is understood by a large percentage of the urban population, and some English is also spoken in the cities. The few Chinese of the area understand Vietnamese but cling to their ancient language. The Montagnards speak a tribal language intelligible only to members of their own tribe.

(b) Religion. The majority of the Vietnamese are nominal Buddhists. The activist element of the Buddhist Hierarchy is located in Hue. In the past, a militant Buddhist element has had considerable influence upon the GVN. The most important minority religion is Catholic, and Hoa Hao and Cao Dai Sects are found in small numbers. The Montagnards are almost uniformly animist.

(c) Education. The schools are patterned after the French system with 5 primary and 7 secondary grades. Since many rural dwellers spend no more than 3 years in school, the literacy rate is generally low. Educational opportunities for the Montagnards are almost nonexistent. Hue University is one of the most important institutions in the area. It is not only a center of higher learning, but also a center of religious and political activist groups, who in the past have shown considerable hostility toward the U.S.

(d) Minorities. Some members of the PACOH Montagnard tribe may be found in the North Western part of the TAOR. However, their numbers are expected to be insignificant.

(e) Overall. Social unrest is aggravated by economic, political and military dislocation of Vietnamese life. Family and Village groupings continue as the basic social and economic units, hampering efforts toward achieving national identity.

(f) Public Health. Public health is plagued by dietary diseases, inadequate GVN Medical services, lack of potable water, and primitive sanitation and hygiene standards. This is due to a low level of health education and a prevailing philosophy which accepts diseases as the normal condition.

(g) Effects on enemy capabilities. The relative homogeneity of the society limits the enemy's capability to exploit antagonisms between ethnic groups. The issues of relative poverty and wealth, social unrest and national loyalty are exploitable.

(h) Effects on friendly capabilities. Social conditions in areas under GVN control favor the maintenance of large

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numbers of U.S. forces. These conditions will prevail as long as social progress brings increased benefits to the masses. No indigenous troops, however, are particularly susceptible to the health hazards of the area. Extensive education and training programs are essential to the long range nation-building processes within the TAOR. Conditions are particularly good for an extensive civic action program, to win the confidence and support of the people. School aid, public health and technical training programs are prime C. A. targets.

(7) Science and Technology. Capabilities in these endeavors appear to be virtually nonexistent at present. This favors the enemy in that it hampers GVN economic, health and education projects.

b. Enemy Military Situation.

(1) Strengths and dispositions.

(a) Units reportedly operating in this TAOR are as follows:

K4B MF Bn (AKA 802d), vic (ZC1698), strength 350
 804 MF Bn, vic (YD8723), strength 305
 C116 LF Co, vic (YD8420), strength 50
 C117 LF Co, vic (YD9318), strength 60
 C118 LF Co, vic (ZD0402), strength 60

The total strength of units reported within our TAOR is 825 men. Arms include 81mm and 60mm mortars, 57mm RR, B-40 rockets, AA guns, MG's and assorted S/A.

(b) Units located adjacent to our TAOR and probably operating frequently therein are: 802 NVA Bn, vic (YD8600) (16Oct67), strength 355; C115 Co, (probable) vic (YD7412), strength 100. The total strength of these units is 455. Arms include 75mm RR, 57mm RR, 82mm mortars, 7.62mm HMG, B-40 rockets, BAR's, LMG's and carbines.

(2) Composition. Headquarters Northern Front (also known as Tri-Tien Military Region Headquarters) controls both the provinces of Quang Tri and Thua Thien, and is directly subordinate to the High Command in Hanoi. Main Force and NVA units are subordinate to Headquarters Northern Front, while local force units and guerrillas are subordinate to province, district and village committees.

(3) Availability of reinforcements.

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(a) The 6th NVA Regiment consisting of a Hq, the C-4 Recon Co, the C-5th Signal Co (located at Base 114); the 800th MF Bn, (YD5642) on 28Sep67; the 806th NVA Bn (YD5642); and the 802 NVA Bn mentioned above, is considered locally available with additional strength of 1150 and weapons similar to those mentioned above. It is estimated that additional specialist reinforcements from the Northern Front Headquarters are also available. These include the C11th NVA Intelligence Co, the C12th NVA Sapper Co, the C13th NVA Communications Co, the C14th NVA Engineer Co, the C15th NVA AA Co, the C16th NVA Mortar Co, and the C17th NVA RR Co with strengths totaling 710.

(b) The enemy is capable of reinforcing his present forces in Thua Thien with forces from a neighboring province. If this capability should be adopted, which appears doubtful at present, the reinforcements could be expected to be MF and NVA units. Main Force and NVA total strength in Quang Tri and Quang Nam Provinces presently are estimated at 16,340 and 1,745 respectively, including confirmed, probable, and possible.

(4) Movement and activities. Enemy activity in the TAOR during the two weeks period, 22 October through 4 November, has consisted largely of the employment of explosive devices and small scale harassing actions. Friendly operations, notably Operation "KHOU" in the Phu Loc District, terminated on 4 November, having had only minor contact.

(5) VC Naval/Air Defense Forces.

(a) Naval. The VC have no Navy and constitute no naval threat to operations in our TAOR other than small arms and mortar fire from junks, a rarely used tactic. The VC do have a limited mining and swimmer capability which they have used occasionally in river operations.

(b) Air Defense. Enemy AA weaponry consists primarily of captured U.S. and French machine guns, plus assorted Communist bloc and Chicom 7.62mm and 12.7,, machine guns. 20mm aircraft cannon recovered from downed aircraft have also probably been modified for use in an AA role. Reports indicate that all weapons, including mortars, shaped charges and small arms are used against aircraft. The increased number of hits sustained by U.S. aircraft in ICTZ indicates emphasis on AA training.

(6) Logistics.

(a) The enemy logistics system rests on three bases: support from the population, the resources of North Viet Nam, and battle booty, particularly arms and ammunition. Principal items

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provided by the population are food, clothing, some medicine and some communication equipment. North Vietnamese material support, which depends upon land and sea infiltration routes, consists principally of weapons and ammunition.

(b) Infiltration routes are primarily overland, but include one intra-province sea route which terminates on the Phu Loc beaches between (ZD1806) and (AU8206). (See Annex A: Infiltration Routes)

(c) The base area concept is fundamental to the Viet Cong logistics system. The nearest accepted base areas (114 and 607) are located to the North and West of our TAOR (See Annex A: Infiltration Routes). Base areas are supplemented by "combat villages" which have been fortified with both active and passive defenses. One VC/NVA objective is to maintain secure corridors between these areas.

(d) For operations in forward areas, the enemy depends on materials moved to and cached in the intended area of operations.

(e) The VC exercise close control over medical supplies which are inadequate by Western standards and frequently in short supply. A substantial amount of the drugs are purchased on the local markets in DaNang and Saigon, and transported into the TAOR. Medical supplies are also infiltrated from North Viet Nam. The medical support system, while austere, is apparently capable of providing the minimum support necessary to sustain VC/NVA operations.

(f) Transportation. The VC/NVA forces rely heavily upon human transporters, pack animals and bicycles for movement of their supplies. Two transportation battalions, consisting of a large number of porters, are reported active near the Laotian border. In addition, local villagers are often recruited for logistics movements.

(7) Signal and Communications Equipment. In the area of signal equipment, the VC have developed a reliable communications system. They also have the capability to build their own equipment from locally purchased materials. VC signal equipment in use is of U.S., Chinese, Japanese, and French manufacture. One prime source of VC communications equipment has been captured friendly equipment. Because of the significant amount of captured equipment, it must be presumed that the enemy is capable of monitoring any and all friendly transmissions.

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(8) Combat Intelligence and Counterintelligence. The enemy has an unsophisticated but well-organized and effective Intelligence and Counterintelligence system. Combat intelligence is usually provided by local guerrillas and MF/NVA intelligence companies. Counterintelligence agents include children, vendors, and U.S. base employees.

(9) Chemical Warfare.

(a) A captured document indicates that one unit has issued protective suits and masks in anticipation of U.S. initiated chemical warfare. One protective suit and many gas masks have been captured. The majority of these captured masks were simple, homemade devices with charcoal filters. NVA units have an effective two-piece mask of Chicom manufacture, consisting of goggles and a separate face-piece with an activated-charcoal-filter canister. This is similar to those used by U.S. policemen in riot control.

(b) Chemical capabilities.

1. VC are capable of employing homemade and captured smoke and riot-control munitions.

2. VC are capable of making use of locally available poisons.

3. The use of CS by NVA units has been reported in this area.

(c) Vulnerabilities. The VC are vulnerable to all types of currently authorized chemical agents.

(10) Significant Strengths and Weaknesses.

(a) Strengths.

1. The VC control the western highlands, which gives them free access to infiltration/resupply routes from Laos.

2. The VC have developed a highly effective population control system, which enables them to obtain manpower, money, shelter, and supplies to sustain their operations.

3. The VC have an excellent, well established intelligence system.

4. Being of the same ethnic origin as the people of SVN, the VC have little difficulty, except in definitely anti-VC

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areas, of gaining concealment by intermingling with the populace.

5. VC/NVA forces generally have available combat experienced leaders and, in most units, combat experienced troops.

6. VC/NVA forces have the capability of employing both conventional and guerrilla warfare.

7. VC/NVA forces possess a capability of rapid cross country mobility.

(b) Weaknesses.

1. VC/NVA forces in our TAOR possess no air support and only limited artillery support.

2. The VC rely heavily upon external support for arms and ammunition. This support is dependent upon infiltration routes subject to air interdiction, thus necessitating long lead times and caches to insure availability.

3. The VC rely heavily upon the local population, who may become disenchanted by heavy taxes, conscription of manpower, and death and destruction.

4. Animosity between NVA and VC, due to the NVA attitude of superiority, has been known to affect discipline, tactics and chains of command.

(c) Peculiarities.

1. Offensive Combat.

a. VC/NVA attacks are thoroughly planned and quickly executed with a high element of surprise and maximum fire at the onset. After the attack, contact is broken quickly, and the battlefield carefully policed.

b. VC/NVA offensives normally have only the objectives of inflicting casualties and destroying installations. However, captured documents and defectors have indicated that the mission of the 324B Division is to seize, control and defend Quang Tri and Thua Thien Provinces.

c. Withdrawals are usually covered, and normal withdrawal routes are along the axis of the attack.

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d. Contact is most often established in the evening or late at night to restrict friendly maneuver, while providing time for withdrawal under cover of darkness.

e. Doctrinally, the enemy does not commit reinforcements to save trapped units or to insure the accomplishment of a mission for which presumably adequate forces have already been allocated.

2. Defensive positions are characterized by mutually supporting bunkers, concealed under hedgerows, with narrow firing ports 8-12 inches in diameter and 6-8 inches above ground. This makes them very difficult to see or hit. Connected by deep, narrow communications trenches, these positions are relatively invulnerable to mortar or light artillery fire, which facilitates the enemy's delivery of close supporting fires. Fire discipline has been excellent with most engagements initiated at ranges of less than 100 meters.

3. Others. One recent tactic employed by VC/NVA forces has been "Hugging". The technique is to attempt to maintain as close a contact with friendly forces as possible to minimize the effect of friendly supporting arms.

c. Enemy unconventional and psychological warfare.

(1) Guerrillas. The guerrilla continues to be the base for the VC effort in SVN, providing the military force required for successful support of the VC Infrastructure; harassment of friendly LOC, installations and troop concentrations; and guides for MF/NVA units.

(2) Psychological.

(a) Since the beginning of the VC insurgency, the conversion of friendly troops has been given a priority equal to military and political actions. Three to five member cells, predominantly women, are organized for this purpose. Results are lowered morale and reduced combat effectiveness of allied units, and occasionally a propaganda or intelligence agent won at very low cost.

(b) Propaganda has been disseminated by leaflet, indoctrination courses, political lectures, newspapers, magazines, and whisper campaigns. The most prevalent themes are divisive ones, aimed at exploiting disaffection among U.S. forces, ARVN Forces, and VN civilians. English language themes stressing the lack of support at home and racial strife have recently been aimed at U.S. Forces.

(c) Psychological Warfare. Targeting of American servicemen, ARVN and the civilian population of various hamlets

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and villages is expected to continue.

(3) Subversion. Subversive operations are standard throughout the area, and in many cases overshadow VC military efforts. Among the many subversive techniques employed by the VC, and probably the single most important technique, is terror. Terror programs are executed by "Special Activities Cells" made up of dedicated militants generally between the ages of 13 and 25. Terror targets are most frequently natives of the area, rather than Saigon Appointees, and normally include only the very best and the very worst officials. Terror has five objectives: to improve VC morale, to advertise the movement, to create disorientation and psychological isolation, to eliminate opposing forces, and to provoke GVN into repressive measures.

(4) Espionage. Espionage agents, principally low level, are active throughout the area. Frequently, cover is provided by exploiting the divergent social and political aims of religious, ethnic and student groups. Recruitment of agents is often the result of threats or pressures against the individual or his family. Agents include vendors, children, and U.S. Forces employees. Recruiting of females is emphasized. Although some sophisticated communications have been reported, the individual courier is probably the only reliable media, restricting the VC in the receipt of timely intelligence. Targeting of easily accessible installations, to collect sufficient information for sabotage operations, is expected to continue.

(5) Sabotage.

(a) Sabotage units are known to be operating throughout the area. These units usually operate as cells; however, all military and guerrilla units are considered capable of sabotage activities.

(b) The vast majority of these acts have been conducted with explosive devices. Principal targets have been unguarded LOC and lightly defended installations.

(c) The majority of operations appear to be crude, conducted by inexperienced persons, and sometimes ineffective. They have enjoyed considerable success against LOC, however.

(d) It is estimated that the VC have the capability to perform acts of sabotage in the cities and against any installation within our TAOR. This is a highly probable course of action as it avoids the risk of heavy losses in large scale attacks.

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3. Enemy Capabilities.a. Attack.

(1) Attack the Hue - Phu Bai area with one regiment (6th NVA) and two separate battalions (804th MF and 810th LF) with an aggregate strength of about 1500.

(2) Attack isolated units and outposts with up to one reinforced regiment.

(3) Attack selected key installations with medium and/or heavy mortars, artillery and rockets.

b. Defend. Defend isolated positions anywhere within our TAOR with forces locally available.

c. Delay. Delay in present operating areas with forces locally available.

d. Unconventional and psychological warfare. Conduct unconventional and psychological warfare to include small scale attacks and ambushes, interdiction of LOC, terrorism, sabotage, propaganda activities, the use of mines and booby traps, and the use of nontoxic chemical capabilities.

4. Analysis of enemy capabilities.a. Attack.

(1) Attack the Hue - Phu Bai area with one regiment and two separate battalions.

a. The following factors favor adoption of this capability:

1. The enemy's knowledge of our situation and the terrain, based on extensive reconnaissance activities.

2. The enemy's desire to achieve tactical success.

3. The city of Hue is an attractive historical, religious and political target, which if successfully attacked and temporarily held, would provide a significant propaganda advantage.

4. Dissident Buddhist and remnants of the militant movement could provide sympathizers and collaborators to the enemy.

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capability: (b) The following factors militate against this

1. The enemy's losses during recent operations.
2. The enemy's reluctance to mass his forces.
3. The fact that Hue is located on an exposed coastal plain where surrounding terrain is unfavorable to the enemy's tactics.
4. The strength of friendly forces in the area.

(c) VC/NVA troop movements and activity in the coastal plains North and East of Hue and in the piedmont areas West and Northwest of Hue, are considered indicators of the possible adoption of this attack plan.

(2) Attack isolated units and outposts with up to one reinforced regiment.

capability: (a) The following factors favor adoption of this

1. The enemy's knowledge of our situation and the terrain, based on extensive reconnaissance activities.
2. Isolated units and outposts offer the best targets at the least risk.
3. The enemy's past successes against isolated targets.
4. Many outposts lie astride main infiltration routes, where the enemy may achieve temporary superiority.
5. Enemy doctrine dictates the attack of relatively weak targets under the most favorable conditions.
6. The enemy's desire to achieve tactical success.

capability: (b) The following factors militate against this

1. The enemy's reluctance to mass his forces.
2. The demonstrated friendly ability to detect

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enemy buildups and to react rapidly to destroy them by supporting arms and ground spoiling attacks.

(c) The following factors are indicators of adoption of this capability:

1. Interrogation reports, captured documents, and low level agent reports continue to indicate the possibility of such attacks.

2. The enemy's known desire to disrupt the GVN RD program.

(3) Attack selected key installations with medium and/or heavy mortars, artillery and rockets.

(a) The following factors favor adoption of this capability:

1. Lucrative targets can be hit from a distance with less risk than ground attacks.

2. The practice of striking quickly under the most favorable conditions is a basic enemy tactic.

3. The enemy's past limited successes in such attacks.

4. The enemy's desire to achieve a tactical success.

(b) There are no factors which militate against the adoption of this capability.

(c) The fact that the enemy is currently exploiting this capability throughout ICTZ indicates continued adoption of this capability.

b. Defense.

(1) Defend isolated positions anywhere within the TAOR with forces locally available.

(a) The following factors favor the adoption of this capability.

1. The enemy may adopt a hasty defense in order to delay while command posts, vital installations, and caches are displaced, concealed or dispersed.

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2. The enemy's need to protect vital base areas which he may have established or may be establishing within our TAOR.

3. The enemy's desire to conserve forces in our area while exploiting an opportunity elsewhere.

(b) The following factors militate against adoption of this capability:

1. Reluctance to stand and fight except under the most favorable conditions.

2. Enemy doctrine dictates against defending occupied terrain unless it is absolutely vital.

3. The enemy's limited in-country supporting arms capability.

4. Past enemy operations have avoided direct contact with superior forces and emphasized small unit harrassing actions designed to inflict maximum casualties at minimum cost.

5. The achievement of a much needed victory is unlikely by defensive actions.

(c) The enemy's losses in recent operations throughout ICTZ is an indicator of adoption of this capability.

c. Delay.

(1) Delay in present operating areas with forces locally available.

(a) The following factors favor the adoption of this capability:

1. The enemy's desire to conserve forces and await conditions more favorable to him.

2. The enemy's desire to prevent expansion of the GVN RD program.

3. Delay of friendly operations would enhance the enemy's prestige with the local populace.

(b) There are no factors which militate against this capability.

(c) The enemy's need for the support of the local

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population, primarily as a source of food, recruits, and intelligence, is an indicator of the adoption of this capability in conjunction with obtaining the required local support.

d. Unconventional and psychological warfare.

(1) Conduct unconventional and psychological warfare to include small scale attacks and ambushes, interdiction of LOC, terrorism, sabotage, and propaganda activities, the use of mines and booby traps, and the use of nontoxic munitions.

(a) The following factors favor adoption of this capability:

1. This capability is a basic enemy tactic.
2. It provides the enemy an opportunity to inflict damage on friendly forces while minimizing the effects of friendly supporting arms.
3. VC knowledge of the terrain and local populace.
4. The enemy's belief that successful exploitation of this capability will wear down friendly forces.
5. Guerrilla and local force VC units hope to tie down friendly forces with static defense and local reaction mission while VC main force and NVA units conduct large scale operations.

(b) There are no factors which militate against this capability.

(c) The following facts are indicators of the adoption of this capability:

1. The enemy is currently exploiting this capability.
2. Interrogation reports, captured documents, and low level agent reports continue to indicate that the enemy will emphasize this tactic.

5. Conclusions.

a. Enemy capabilities in relative probability of adoption:

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(1) Capability 4.d.(1). Conduct unconventional warfare to include small scale attacks and ambushes, interdiction of LOC, terrorism, sabotage, propaganda activities, the use of mines and booby traps, and the use of nontoxic chemical munitions.

(2) Capability 4.a.(3). Attack selected key installations with medium and/or heavy mortars, artillery and rockets.

(3) Capability 4.a.(2). Attack isolated units and outposts with up to one reinforced regiment.

(4) Capability 4.a.(1). Attack the Hue - Phu Bai area with one regiment and two separate battalions.

(5) Capability 4.b.(1). Defend isolated positions anywhere within our TAOR with forces locally available.

(6) Capability 4.c.(1). Delay in present operating areas with forces locally available.

b. Enemy Vulnerabilities.

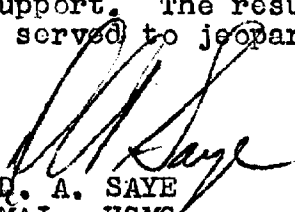
(1) Enemy forces, installations, and LOC are vulnerable to air, artillery, and naval gunfire attack.

(2) Enemy forces are generally weak in total combat power because of the absence of air support and the limited availability of supporting arms.

(3) Rigid tactical doctrine and dependence upon detailed planning render the enemy vulnerable to surprise.

(4) The recent drop in overall combat effectiveness of enemy forces has increased his vulnerability to psychological warfare operations. Contributing factors include: recent decisive defeats; increased reliance upon conscripted personnel; reduced training time; lower morale due to shortages of food and medicine, sickness, general hardships, and fear of our supporting arms; and our increased psychological warfare operations.

(5) Enemy forces are becoming more dependent upon local resources, especially food, for support. The resulting increased pressures on these resources have served to jeopardize the enemy's standing with the local populace.

1. Purpose. To publish information and action required to insure that a proper degree of clearance and access to Regimental S&C Files and Message Center is issued to personnel in appropriate billets, in accordance with the regulation contained in references (a) and (b).

2. Cancellation. RegtO 5521.1A

3. Action. Commanding Officers will insure that the appropriate degree of clearance and access is possessed for personnel stipulated in enclosures (1) through (3).

4. Authority to Grant Clearance/Access.

a. The Regimental Commander will issue TOP SECRET, SECRET, and CONFIDENTIAL clearances and access as required. This Headquarters will issue all clearances and access to Battalion and separate Company Commanders. Requests for such clearance/access will be accompanied by the OQR and Health Record of the individual concerned.

b. Battalion Commanders will grant SECRET and CONFIDENTIAL clearances and access, as appropriate, within respective commands.

c. Separate Company Commanders will grant CONFIDENTIAL clearance and access within respective commands.

d. Authority to draw and receipt for classified material,

Ref: (a) Force Order 1550.3

1. Purpose. To establish the requirement for personnel to receive the subject training and to establish procedures to attend the approved course of instruction at DA NANG.

2. General.

a. Land mine warfare, demolitions and booby traps continue to increase in importance in operations against Viet Cong and North Vietnamese forces. It is imperative that Marine and Naval personnel in proximity to the enemy have a solid background and thorough understanding of the type warfare with which they will come in constant contact.

b. Reference (a) provides basic guidance relative to the subject training and has established the minimum training standard for all infantry company commanders and gunnery sergeants, all infantry platoon commanders and platoon sergeants, and all rifle squad and fire team leaders.

c. Reference (b) promulgates information on a Land Mine, Demolitions and Booby Trap Course conducted by the 1st Engineer Battalion in DA NANG for which infantry units have a priority. Optimum class size is thirty (30) students.

3. Action

a. Infantry units under the operational control of the 5th Marine Regiment will require the personnel holding the billets listed in paragraph 2b above to be qualified in land mine warfare, demolitions, and booby trap training by having attended the three day course offered by the 1st Engineer Battalion school. Replacement personnel will be trained to maintain the standard.

b. The scheduling of personnel to attend the three day class is to be accomplished by direct liaison with this Headquarters. Such liaison will take place not later than the 15th of the month preceding the month in which the instruction is to take place.

c. Administrative Instructions

(1) Parent battalions will issue TAD orders for a period of about four (4) days directing students to report to the 1st Engineer Battalion at coordinates AT947754 by 1800 the day prior to the first day of the school.

(2) Units will arrange transportation for their students to and from training.

(3) 1st Engineer Battalion will billet and feed students.

(4) Units will ensure that each student arrives with the following equipment:

- Individual weapon
- Helmet
- Appropriate web equipment
- Jungle kit
- Two canteen w/covers
- Flak jacket
- Clothing and personal effects for four (4) days
- Mess gear (Sergeants and below)

(5) Information concerning the syllabus of the course conducted by the 1st Engineer Battalion is contained in enclosure (1) of reference (b).

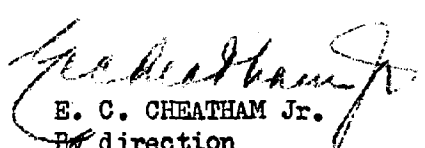

1. Purpose. To provide guidance for the Employment of Riot Control Agents (RCA) within the Fifth Marines Regimental TAOR.

2. General. RCA may be employed for cave and tunnel clearance, in areas where a noncombatant population may possibly be endangered by use of conventional ordnance, and to block, canalize or otherwise deny terrain to the enemy. It may also be used defensively as well as to prepare a helicopter LZ or an objective prior to an assault.

3. Action. Unit commanders will be responsible for the employment of RCA within their TAOR. Enclosure (1) lists the RCA ordnance available and enclosure (2) sets forth concepts and suggestions for employment of RCA. Unit commanders will become familiar with the available RCA equipment and are responsible for the training of their personnel in its employment.

RCA EQUIPMENT AVAILABLE FOR EMPLOYMENT

1. General. There are two basic types of ordnance utilizing RCA available for employment within the Republic of Vietnam. One type utilizes CS as a burning munition and the other employs CS in a micro-pulverized form.

a. CS utilized as a burning type munition falls into the following categories:

(1) Hand Grenade, Series M-7. The M-7 grenades were developed for utilization as a riot control agent but have since been used in cave and tunnel clearance, ambushes, and small unit operations. The M-7 series has two types of fuzes. One type fuze is used for conventional ground employment and the other is for use from helicopters and contains an eleven second fuzing device.

(2) CS Cluster, E-159. The E-159 cluster is deliverable by either helicopter or by sub-sonic aircraft and is suitable for non-persistent area coverage. It was primarily adopted for use in preparing objectives for assaults and for clearing areas where the presence of noncombatants makes the use of explosive ordnance unfavorable. The E-159 cluster can also be utilized to block routes of egress from the battlefield; to deny the enemy the ability to regain the battlefield to claim their casualties and equipment; or to otherwise canalize or deny terrain to the enemy. The E-159 cluster is presently available in limited quantities and then only by emergency request sent through normal air request channels to the Regimental S-3 for clearance and further request to Division.

(3) CS Cluster, E-158. Two E-158 clusters are contained as the components of the cluster E-159. When separated, each E-158 cluster can be fuzed and delivered by helicopter or a low speed aircraft capable of manually ejecting it. The E-158 cluster is ideal for small area coverage and small unit operations and will cover an area approximately three thousand square meters when properly employed under optimum conditions (see ref (b) for further information). Requests for the E-158 cluster will be submitted through the normal air request channels via the Regimental S-3 to Division in the same manner as the E-159 cluster.

(4) CS Smoke Pot, M-10. CS Smoke Pots are available in limited quantity for evaluation and must be requested from the ammunition supply point. No table of allowance has been established for this item of ordnance.

(5) CS Launcher, E-8. The man-portable E-8 launchers are currently available and can be employed at the company level. The E-8 launcher may be utilized on ambushes, to flush the enemy, to cover or prepare objectives, to deny the enemy the ability to regain the battlefield, or in combat base defense. (See ref (b) for further information).

b. Micro-pulverized CS-1 and CS-2 are dry powder agents for employment in area contamination.

(1) CS-1. Micro-pulverized CS-1 can be employed with the M-106 back pack dispenser and with the modified flamethrower. It can also be used in bulk form to contaminate coves and tunnels by wrapping the bags of CS with detonating cord and exploding them inside the enclosed area. CS-1 is packaged in 25 pound bags or in drums containing ten 81 pound bags. CS-1 also may be delivered from sub-sonic aircraft in the BLU-53 cannister.

(2) CS-2. Micro-pulverized CS-2 is available in bulk form and is packaged in the same manner as CS-1. It is employed over water and contains silicon to produce a flotation effect. CS-2 will rise into the air when the surface of the water is stirred or disturbed.

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SPECIFIC EMPLOYMENT CONCEPTS FOR RCA

1. RCA munitions may be employed either offensively or defensively and should especially be considered for use when maximum shock and surprise are desirable.

a. In conjunction with raids, ambushes and in special operations such as river crossings and interdiction of waterways.

b. During operations to gain physical control of a target area and its population with minimum casualties.

c. To deny the enemy access to an avenue of escape or to canalize him into a killing zone.

d. Prior to an assault with preparatory fires and close air support to increase the enemy vulnerability.

e. As a means of countering enemy ambushes or to recon areas where ambushes are suspected.

f. For denial of an area to the enemy to reclaim his casualties and equipment.

g. In conjunction with the perimeter defense of static positions.

2. Employment of RCA will be reported as soon as possible after employment to the Regimental S-3 using the format prescribed in Annex A of enclosure (2).

1. SUMMARY OF ENEMY SITUATION.

a. Current intelligence indicates that the MR 5 National Liberation Front is using Xuyen Truong and Xuyen Tien Villages as staging areas, harbor sites and coordinating centers for resupply between 5th Marines TAOR and Que Son District. Xuyen Truong Village is considered by the R-20th VC Bn as its home village, and it often locates its headquarters and support elements therein.

2. ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS OF INFORMATION.

a. Determine the location of VC/NVA headquarters, rest areas, supply check points, and ammo/weapons staging areas.

b. Determine VC/NVA methods/techniques of communication. Give special attention to types of radio and telephones used and methods of employment; also note signs and symbols used for warning, marking of minefields, punji traps and booby traps.

c. Determine methods employed by VC/NVA to control population and to instill and maintain a hostile attitude toward Americans in the minds of the local population, to include what effects current psy ops have had in countering the VC/NVA control measures.

d. Determine the effect of aircraft bombing, artillery and naval gunfire on enemy emplacements, with regards to material damage, casualties, and the effects on the morale of both VC and civilian population.

e. Determine locations of VC/NVA mine and booby traps; to include storage areas, manufacturing sites, areas in which mines and booby traps are planted, and transportation routes used for movement.

f. Determine VC/NVA rice and food products status; with emphasis on amount available, significant shortages, sources, caches, resupply routes, check points and modes of transportation.

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g. Determine identity of units operating within the area, to include size, location, uniforms, armament and morale.

h. Determine what effect friendly aerial broadcasts and leaflet drops have upon enemy and civilian morale.

3. INTELLIGENCE ACQUISITION TASKS.

a. Orders to subordinate and attached units.

(1) 13th Interrogation-Translation Team. Report all significant information obtained from detainees through interrogation, report significant information obtained from captured documents as soon as possible via Regimental TAC #2.

(2) All other units report:

(a) All VC/NVA sightings and contacts, to include size, direction of movement, location, armament and equipment.

(b) All fighting holes, bunkers, tunnels, caves and other fortifications.

(c) Population composition and attitude of hamlets.

(d) Locations and types of all mines and booby traps.

(e) Trails, paths and areas that VN civilians avoid.

(f) All supply and arms caches.

(g) Map corrections, to include unmapped trails, streams, built up areas and areas evacuated.

(h) Any other information obtained to satisfy the intelligence requirements.

b. Requests to Higher and Adjacent Commands.

(1) 1st Marine Division.

(a) Provide as obtained any information to satisfy the intelligence requirements.

(b) Provide AP coverage of operation area from BMCT to EECT daily.

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(c) Provide additional intelligence support as required.

(d) Provide on call IR, night/day photography and SLAR as requested.

4. MEASURES FOR HANDLING CAPTURED ENEMY PERSONNEL, DOCUMENTS AND MATERIALS.

a. Captured Personnel and Documents.

(1) PW's/Detainees in accordance with DivO 3461.2.

(2) Documents, materials, maps, charts and photos in accordance with DivO 3800.1F.

b. Captured Materials. Routine processing of captured materials will be effected through normal channels. Special emphasis, however, will be placed on rapid evacuation of captured material having significant intelligence value. Items of specific intelligence interest, to be forwarded to 5th Marines CP as soon as the tactical situation permits, are as follows:

(1) All captured materials (weapons, ammunition, food-stuffs, and medical supplies) that have not been heretofore encountered.

(2) All communication equipment, to include telephones, radios, and electronics.

(3) All chemical warfare materials (decontamination kits, protective masks and chemical munitions).

(4) VC/NVA uniforms, all types, including head gear and accouterments.

(5) Miscellaneous items such as flags, banners, political propaganda, pictures, etc.

5. Overlays and Photography.

a. Overlays.

(1) Roads and Trails, Appendix 1.

(2) Helo Landing Zones, Appendix 2.

(3) Ground Reconnaissance, Appendix 3.

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(4) Air Reconnaissance, Appendix 4.

(5) SPARS, Appendix 5.

(6) Trafficability, Appendix 6.

(7) Enemy Activity, Appendix 7.

(8) Enemy Order of Battle, Appendix 8.

b. Aerial Photography. Two sets of aerial photography of operation area will be made available to each battalion (to be issued).

6. COUNTERINTELLIGENCE.

a. Blacklists for area will be disseminated by 7th Counter-intelligence Team.

7. REPORTS AND DISTRIBUTION.

a. Reports.

(1) Spot Reports. All contacts, sightings, and other intelligence information of an urgent nature will be immediately reported to this Headquarters by spot report. Those spot reports will be in the format specified in current directives and will answer the questions: Who, What, When, Where, and How.

(2) Shell Report/Mortar Report.

(a) See DivO P3800.1F.

(b) VC/NVA use of mortar/artillery/recoilless rifle will be reported immediately.

(c) Crater analysis will be performed as soon as practicable and the results reported to this Headquarters.

b. Distribution of Intelligence Reports, Interrogation-Translation Reports. Information of immediate tactical value will be passed to the unit(s) concerned by the most rapid means available.

8. MISCELLANEOUS.

a. Normal reconnaissance and observation will be carried out by all units in their assigned areas of operation.

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b. Units in contact make maximum effort to take prisoners.

Subj: Letter of Instruction on Sapper Tactics,

1. This letter of instruction is promulgated to familiarize Commanders with tactics and techniques used by VC Sapper units. With the increased emphasis being placed on Sapper training by the VC, it is necessary that we all review the lessons learned from previous Sapper attacks.

2. The most recent Sapper attacks within the 1st Marine Division AOR occurred 2 November 1967 against, the 2nd platoon, M Company, 3rd Battalion, 7th Marines. The following information was extracted from the after action report of the attack.

a. There were no unusual intelligence indications that the enemy would attempt an attack at that particular position (Hill 25-AT839568). The enemy was extremely careful to avoid noticeable activity east of Hill 65. Intelligence reports for the period immediately preceding the attack on Hill 25 were centered around the "L" or "K" Company MAOR. Only in the late moments prior to the initiation of activity by the VC were units alerted to possible contact. The enemy had taken great precautions to conceal his plans.

b. Total enemy forces involved were estimated at 150-200 men separated into two main bodies and two smaller harassing type units. Of the two main bodies one was the primary attacking force estimated to be 100 strong and concentrated on the main objective at Hill 25. The second body, at about 50 strong, was sent against the Hill 37 area and the old Dai Loc Bridge as a diversionary force and possible deterrent against any attempts to reinforce. The entire plan was extremely well coordinated and from evaluation of all sources involved,

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as to the tactics employed in the series incidents it may be reasonably assumed that the VC were members of the 402nd Sapper Battalion (AMA T-89).

d. Initial contact was made at Hill 37 in the vicinity of Old Dai Loc Bridge at 020130H when the bridge security received an unknown number of mortar rounds. The enemy advanced upon the bridge from two directions, north and south, and established a good base of fire using an automatic weapon. Although the enemy reached a close proximity to the bridge and put out a large volume of fire, they did not attempt to overrun the bridge, but rather harass and deter the troops. Enemy fire was not accurate at this time, but was considered sufficient to keep Marine Forces occupied and to draw their attention away from the prime objective.

e. At 020200H the main attack was launched against Hill 25, and a detailed survey of the enemy actions at that position reveal the Sapper techniques employed to their fullest extent. Activity began with 20 incoming rounds of 82mm mortar fire and approximately 10-15 rounds of RR fire. By the time this barrage had lifted it was discovered that the enemy had penetrated the wire in four places. Methods of breaching the wire were a combination of 2 successful attempts to blow the wire using bangalore torpedoes and 2 equally successful attempts at cutting the wire. Once breaches had been established the enemy rushed through one of the openings, being repelled at the others. Inside the wire the VC made extensive use of satchel charges and grenades to destroy bunkers. It should be noted here that the sequence of events beginning with the breach of wire under cover of mortar fire and the use of bangalore torpedoes and satchel charges are all distinct earmarks of a Sapper attack. Although the other three openings were ultimately denied to the enemy he did succeed in breaking through one weak point which was in the western portion of Hill 25 and once inside went immediately and methodically to work destroying the bunkers in the vicinity. At no time during the attack were the VC observed to be at great loss or suffering from states of confusion as is often the case. They had the presence of mind to establish a hasty aid station outside the wire to care for wounded. In addition, once inside the wire they worked in teams of 4 to destroy the bunkers with two men covering while 2 others ran up to a bunker with a satchel charge. This is yet another distinct sapper tactic. The enemy had obviously observed the objective for some time and knew precisely what to do and where to go. He only lost control of his situation when VT was called in on the friendly area.

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f. While this activity was occurring on Hill 25 elements on Hill 65 were also receiving mortar fire from a position south of the hill. This extremely well planned maneuver removed the threat of reaction by "L" Company and likewise reduced his capability for fire support.

g. In addition, CAP units C-3 and C-4 were both taken under fire to complete the harassing picture and cut off H-2 position from any immediate, physical assistance.

h. A thoroughly skillful attitude was demonstrated by the VC in this incident. An enormous amount of planning and rehearsal was necessary to execute so well coordinated a plan. They were led by a small CP group, but little more than hand and arm signals were used. Each man knew his own job.

i. Routes of egress were generally along the same axis as the attack. The enemy escaped to the NW retreating up the draws and valleys from which he had came. The route out was no surprise to H Company and had been scheduled for artillery concentrations. The enemy will normally follow the quickest route away from the area of contact because this is when he is most vulnerable. Other elements of the 402nd, who had attacked various positions through out the FAOR, dispersed in small groups and are believed to have made their way back into the mountains or across into the "Arizona" area, crossing in the vicinity of AT9055.

j. The uniform worn by the enemy was shorts and a camouflaged head band, again a Sapper distinction. Some had charcoal smudged on their faces and bodies. None wore shoes.

k. Weapons used by the enemy were AK-47's, K-50's, Chicom grenades, satchel charges, bangalore torpedoes, 82mm mortars and 57mm recoilless rifles.

3. Defense Consideration Against A Sapper Attack:
Based upon an analysis of VC Sapper tactics the following procedures will prove useful in deterring a Sapper Assault. These procedures by no means includes all methods that can be employed, but are promulgated as guidelines for a Sapper Assault program.

a. The enemy usually reconnoiters targets carefully in order to prepare sketches of weapons positions, defensive bunkers and locations of key personnel. Consequently, the following measures should be considered:

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- (1) Shifting crew-served weapons frequently.
- (2) Not allowing strange Vietnamese within the compound.
- (3) Not setting "patterns." For example, vary times for changing sentries, sending out patrols, etc.
- (4) Not using VC suspects as labor force for barriers and bunkers; when released, they may well compromise the defensive plan.

b. Consider the incorporation of dogs into the sentry/warning system. Dogs have proven to be an excellent early warning system in the past. They need not be K-9 trained.

c. When the Sappers penetrate the perimeter, they divide into small groups and head for pre-selected targets. A possible deterrent is the use of internal wire (concertina) in order to slow, confuse and channelize the enemy into pre-selected automatic weapons killing zones. These wire barriers should not be permanently emplaced, but prepared in such a manner that they can be periodically shifted, thereby foiling enemy reconnaissance. This change should be made after dark. Another possibility is the installation of ankle-high trip wires.

d. In many of the attacks, the majority of friendly KIA resulted from the lack of overhead cover for bunkers. Many have been killed by being shot in the head or back while crouching in an attempt to shield themselves from incoming mortar fire. In actuality, the explosions mistaken as mortar fire were torpedoe and satchel charges. The enemy had penetrated the defense at almost exactly the same time as he lifted suppressive mortar fire. This is a result of crawling forward to the wire while the supporting mortar keeps the defenders down. Unit Commanders should, therefore, have some percentage of the troops, in positions from which visual surveillance of the entire perimeter can be maintained in spite of mortar fires.

e. Almost all the installations that have been over-run in the I Corps Tactical Zone shared a common failing: No listening posts, or ineffective listening posts. Another common failure was the lack of constant aggressive night patrolling. Both of these measures are

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recommended, particularly during the following times:

- (1) Weekends
- (2) Nights of reduced lunar illumination
- (3) Between the hours of 2400 and 0300H.

f. Mines should be regularly checked. Claymores should be checked for sabotage to the firing wire and for changes to the direction of aim. An after-action investigation of the over-running of a PWWP position revealed that the claymore wires had been cut prior to a successful enemy ground assault.

g. Some of our installation are bordered by civilian dwellings. Use the local people, whenever possible, as early warning indicators. Prior to an attack, the enemy will infiltrate a nearby hamlet or village and use it as an assembly area and command post. Try to recruit at least one reliable agent in each nearby hamlet with the sole mission of alerting your installation to VC presence. As in any agent operation, the most difficult problem to overcome is communications. One possible communication means of having the agent report enemy activity without compromising himself is to place a trip flare in a location far enough from the agent's home that its activation will not cause the enemy to be immediately suspicious of the agent. The flare could then be activated by means of a thin wire.

h. Perimeter Barriers: Based on current intelligence on the enemy's tactics and capabilities in breaching perimeter barriers, the following actions will reduce the possibility of the perimeter being breached.

- (1) At least 3 separate apron/concertina fences should ring the installation.
- (2) The distance between the outermost and innermost fence must be at least 100 meters. Fences closer together can be breached by a single detonation.
- (3) The distance between any two fences should be at least 30 meters. The enemy has developed the tactic, according to one high-ranking MR-6 defector, of employing 3 man bangalore torpedo teams (called "Mat Boc") as the advance element in a Sapper attack. Each team conducts a physical reconnaissance of the fence and mines, booby traps and grenades are marked or deactivated

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along the selected avenues of approach. On the night of the attack, the "Mat Boc" team infiltrates the barrier with bangalore torpedoes and clears the way for the attacking infantry. Possible countermeasures are:

(1) Patrolling of the perimeter between 0500 and 0600 hours each morning making a careful inspection for signs of tampering and or track activity.

(2) Emplacing mines and flares when there are no civilians in the area, which will reduce the possibility of compromise.

4. In addition to the material presented above, the following tips on compound defense are provided by an experienced Australian Advisor:

a. Conduct aggressive patrolling, not less than maximum mortar range from the compound.

b. Constant night patrols, ambushes, and outposts with some form of communication, i.e., radio, flares, weapons and signals which are changed at irregular intervals, will discover and disrupt enemy attacks.

c. Change the occupants of bunkers in an irregular pattern at irregular intervals.

d. Clearly illuminate the perimeter wire and keep it under constant watch.

e. Defense of any position, especially static ones, must incorporate the three (3) principles:

(1) Depth

(2) All around defense

(3) Mutual support--To achieve mutual support there must be internal positions, moveable wire barriers, internal claymores and a sectionalization of the compound into not less than two (2) complexes, preferably three (3), each able to fight and survive on its own, but able to support the other complexes once the outer wall has been breached.

f. Two command posts with both radios and land line communications are essential.

g. Be alert. At least one Marine must be awake in each position at all times (night). Check on sentries

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by moving around the compound at irregular times in an irregular pattern.

i. Mortars, both 81mm and 60mm, should have their ammunition prepared and laid out ready to use to include both illumination, and HE. Be sure to provide protection for the ammunition from weather and enemy counter-mortar-fire.

j. Upon commencement of an enemy mortar/rocket attack, initiate the final protective fires among the wire defenses.

k. Connect bunkers and fighting bays with a trench system.

l. Design bunkers to have all around observation and fire ability.

m. Encourage defenders to keep their heads up when under mortar/rocket/snatchel charge attack and to ensure they know the characteristics of these weapons and their capabilities, i.e., 82mm round, 10 meter lethal area, 30 meter casualty area, etc.

5. The use of Sappers throughout South Viet Nam is not new and many local force companies and sabotage cells are trained as such. However, the increase in the number and size of Sapper trained units in the 1st indicates a new emphasis on these tactics. The success enjoyed by the enemy in the use of these techniques, particularly during the last six months, indicates their wider employment.

a. Thua Thien Province; The major Sapper units are subordinate to the Hue City unit, and the Tri-Thien military Region.

(1) The Hue City unit has 3 Sapper companies; The "Co Be" A, B, and C which normally operate in the Hue City, Phu Vang, and Huong Thy Districts. At the present time the "Co Be" is operating in southern Thua Thien and is probably the Sapper unit which assisted the KLB Bn in the 3 July IALC Convoy ambush. Other elements of the "Co Be" series are believed responsible for the Sapper attack on the Huong Giang Hotel in Hue City in late May.

(2) The 12th Sapper Bn, presently an unconfirmed unit was first identified on 13 August when a member of the unit was captured during the attack on

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Huong Dien Sector Headquarters. The 12th Sapper Bn was reportedly formed in August 1967 from the 12th Sapper Company which was subordinate to the Tri-Thien Military Region. At this time little hard intelligence is available on the 12th Sapper Bn; however, it is probably subordinate to the Tri-Thien Military Region, and will be operating in the northern Thua Thien area.

b. Quang Da Special Zone. The following are units known to have employed Sapper tactics in Quang Nam:

(1) The 402nd (AKAT-89) Sapper Bn operates in the northern part of the Province, principally in Hieu Duc, Hoa Vang and northern Dien Ban Districts. Its recent targets have been major bridges along or near Highway #1.

(2) The V-25th Bn operates principally in Hieu Nhon and Dien Ban Districts. Returnees have said that the Bn would undergo training in Sapper tactics during August and September of this year. This unit conducted the 27 August attack on Hoi An in which Sapper Teams penetrated defensive perimeters and placed numerous explosive charges in 3 compounds. This unit is also believed to have been responsible for the 11 September attack on the Hieu Nhon District Hqs. in which Sappers entered the compound and destroyed or extensively damaged all buildings.

(3) The R-20th Bn has received Sapper training; and elements thereof were responsible for the 27 August attack on Dien Ban Artillery positions. This unit is also believed to have assisted the T-89th Bn in the 2 November attack on Hill 25 (A 39560).

c. In Quang Tin Province, the only confirmed Sapper unit is the 70th Company of the 409th Sapper Bn. However, it is believed that other elements of this Bn are also operational in this province. Documents recovered from one of the dead after the 6 September attack on Tam Ky indicated that a 50th Company participated in the attack. This attack on Tam Ky was a complete failure due to the high level of alertness maintained by the defenders and to the effective employment of a reaction force. The 70th Bn, once subordinate to the 1st VC Regiment, is now an independent unit operational in the Operation Pike area of Quang Nam Province.

1. SITUATION

b. Friendly Forces.

(1) I ARVN Corps conducts operations against VC and NVA Forces throughout ICTZ. Among the major commands of I ARVN Corps are the LUC LONG DAC BIET (LLDB, VN Special Forces) and Civilian Irregular Defense Groups (CIDG).

(2) CG III MAF/Senior Advisor I Corps exercises OPCON of all U. S. Army Special Forces (USASF) A Detachments at CIDG Camps in ICTZ through the Deputy Senior Advisor I Corps and C-1 Detachment 5th USASF GP (Abn). USASF Detachment Commanders serve as advisors to corresponding units of the LLDB, including the eight CIDG Camps located within the 1st Marine Division area of responsibility.

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(3) I Corps DASC provides for delivery of air support to CIDG Camps and provides an FAC (Airborne) to support camps under attack. Included in this air support of I Corps are two all-weather air delivery systems: the 7th Air Force MSQ-77 system at PLEIKU (AR7850) and DONG HA (YD2461) and the TPQ-10 system operated by the 1st MAW at DA NANG (AT9574) and CHU LAI (BT5211).

(4) 11th Marines (Rein) is in general support of the 1st Mar Div and is tasked with supporting, either unilaterally or in coordination with ARVN artillery, any CIDG Camp within the Division area of responsibility.

(5) 2nd Bn, 11th Marines is in direct support of the 5th Marines. Other artillery units that are in general support/reinforcing of the Division in the southwestern sector of the Division area of responsibility include one 155mm Gun Platoon, one platoon of the 3rd 8" (SP) Battery and the four 155mm Howitzers (T) of Btry E, 2nd Bn, 11th Marines, all of which are located at AN HOA (AT878476).

(6) The U. S. Army Special Forces Detachment A-109, 5th Special Forces Group (Airborne) maintains forces at THUONG DUC CIDG Camp (ZC143533).

(7) See Annex B (Overlay of THUONG DUC TAOR) of reference (b).

c. Attachments and Detachments. See Task Organization.

d. Assumptions.

(1) Upon execution of this plan the 5th Marines will have available sufficient forces to accomplish its currently assigned mission within the TAOR.

(2) Additional artillery support will be made available for deployment within range of a besieged CIDG Camp.

2. MISSION

5th Marines has the secondary responsibility for providing relief of the THUONG DUC CIDG Camp through reinforcement, spoiling attacks, and/or counterattacks with the 7th Marines assigned primary responsibility for such support.

3. EXECUTION :

a. Concept of Operations

(1) Primary responsibility for contingency support of the THUONG DUC CIDG Camp is assigned to the 7th Marines, to insure flexibility to execute plans and provide additional forces as required. Secondary responsibility is assigned to the 5th Marines.

SECRET

(2) The assignment of contingency support for CIDG Camps is required due to their vulnerability to a surprise enemy assault. This vulnerability emanates from their inability to conduct the continuous, intensive, and far ranging patrol activities required of an aggressive defense and the CIDG Camps generally remote locations that allow the enemy to mass their assets and plan well coordinated assaults. Such attacks usually occur during hours of darkness and especially when periods of prolonged bad weather lessen the likelihood of detection and hampers the ability to relieve or support the beleaguered camp. Survival of a camp under enemy ground attack will often be dependent largely upon the speed and effectiveness with which supporting arms can be brought to bear and the ability to render rapid ground support. Contingency plans are required for such eventualities. The particular plan executed for the relief of the THUONG DUC CIDG Camp is contingent upon the immediate enemy and friendly situation and the extent of Marine Corps participation determined by higher headquarters. The reaction to attack or threatened attack includes:

(a) Reinforcement by supporting fires through close air support and/or artillery fires.

(b) Insertion of all or portions of available forces to LZ's inside the THUONG DUC CIDG Camp by helicopter and/or fixed wing aircraft.

(c) Employment of all or portions of available forces by helicopter and/or fixed wing aircraft to LZ's outside the THUONG DUC CIDG Camp to expel enemy forces and restore the defenses of the camp.

b. 1st Battalion, 5th Marines.

(1) Prepare detailed plans to implement the provisions of Plans ALPHA through DELTA described below. Submit plans to this Headquarters for approval.

(a) Plan ALPHA. Provide appropriate sized infantry security unit for Marine artillery units displaced to augment existing Marine Artillery support for the THUONG DUC CIDG Camp.

(b) Plan BRAVO. Deploy all or part of the forces provided within the task organization by helicopter and/or fixed wing aircraft to LZ's inside the THUONG DUC CIDG Camp.

(c) Plan CHARLIE. Deploy all or part of the forces provided within the task organization by helicopter and/or fixed wing aircraft to LZ's in vicinity of the THUONG DUC CIDG Camp. Be prepared to conduct spoiling attacks and/or counterattacks for the relief of CIDG Camp defense forces.

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(d) Plan DELTA. Deploy all or part of the forces provided within the task organization by helicopter and/or fixed wing aircraft to LZ's in the vicinity of the THUONG DUC CIDG Camp. Be prepared to assault the CIDG Camp, expel enemy forces and restore the camp defenses.

c. Coordinating Instructions.

(1) This plan will be executed following issuance of a frag order setting forth the existing situation, the support available, and directing the specific employment of forces as indicated in the concept of operations.

(2) Units will provide for the continued accomplishment of currently assigned missions within their TAOR with organic assets if tasked to participate in the execution of this plan.

(3) Planning liaison with USASF and CIDG personnel at THUONG DUC will be arranged through this Headquarters. Direct liaison is authorized for execution of this plan.

(4) Direct liaison is authorized with forces assigned by task organization for planning.

(5) Artillery Support: See Annex C (Artillery Support) of reference (b).

(6) Air Support: See Annex E (Air Targets) of reference (b).

(7) No change in rules of engagement. See reference (b).

(8) This plan effective for planning on receipt and for execution on order.

4. ADMINISTRATION AND LOGISTICS

a. Initial loads as prescribed by unit commanders.

b. Helicopters will be primary means of resupply.

c. Normal resupply to be scheduled upon commitment. Emergency and priority requests should be submitted as required.

d. All captured enemy equipment will be processed through the Bn S-2.

SECRET

e. All evacuation of casualties will be made by helicopter to medical facilities located in DA NANG unless otherwise directed.

f. Companies deploy with on-board strengths. Replacements to be furnished as required and available. Commanders will notify parent organization of all casualties, including nonbattle, by the fastest means available.

5. COMMAND AND COMMUNICATIONS - ELECTRONICS

a. Reference (b) and (c).

b. See Annex F (Communications) of reference (b)

c. Command Relationships.

(1) As a matter of U. S. policy, the command relationships between U. S. and allied commanders should remain one of cooperation and coordination. U. S. forces should not be placed under command or OPCON to allied commanders. However, this restriction does not preclude temporary tactical direction of U. S. forces by ARVN commanders under agreement, or temporary direction of ARVN forces by U. S. commanders under certain circumstances. Matters of this nature will be referred to this Headquarters.

(2) Where a USMC ground force is committed, OPCON of the USASF A Detachment passes to the senior Marine infantry commander in the area of operations.

(3) See Annex G (Command Relationships) of reference (b).

d. Command Posts. Unit report CP locations when established outside combat base.

e. Coordinating Instructions.

(1) Radio.

(a) Maintain communications on Regimental Tactical Net #1 with KY-8 capability if possible.

(b) Activate Regimental Command Net (HF) if unable to establish FM communications to this Headquarters. 5th Marines guard Regimental Command Net (HF) until VHF(FM) communications is established from objective area.

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(c) Utilize Regimental Tactical Net #2 HF or VHF(FM) for administrative reporting.

(d) Be prepared to operate Tactical Air Request Net (HF) and Air Coordination Nets (UHF).

(e) Normal to rear Command Post.

(2) Wire and Radio Relay.

(a) Normal between combat bases.

(b) Internal as required.

(c) In case of sustained operations in objective area, radio relay (MRC-62) will be requested from CG, 1st MarDiv by this Headquarters.

(3) Message Center. Normal between combat bases.

(4) Cryptographic.

(a) KY-8, KW-7, KAC QX and KAC PX will be utilized in accordance with DivO P 02000.1G.
