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PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. The 5th Marine Regiment continued its assigned mission and tasks in the TAO with emphasis placed upon platoon and squad patrols, ambushes, road security, and pacification efforts. The responsibility for road security was conducted with great success by both the 2nd and 3rd Battalions, 5th Marines and not a single road mining incident occurred on Liberty Road or Route 540 during April. The month began with attacks by fire against the Combined Unit Pacification Squads which also received ground attacks as well as mortars and RPGs. However, the 5th Marines intelligence network was able to forecast many of the attacks and, as a result, casualties were kept to a minimum. These attacks, and other enemy contacts throughout the AO, accounted for over 89 enemy kills during the month as well as a captured mortar tube. CUPP Platoon 3/5 and M/3/1 CUPP Company continued operating in their assigned AOs and were responsible not only for continuing to provide security for their assigned hamlets but were also successful in ambushing several enemy units which resulted in 12 enemy kills and 6 DFC. On 14 April, General L. W. WALT, Assistant Commandant of the Marine Corps, made an official visit to the An Hoa Combat Base and participated in an awards ceremony for a Marine and an ARVN noncommissioned officer. During April, 6 ground officers from the 5th Marines and 6 aviation officers from the 1st MAF participated in an exchange orientation program. The program was designed to broaden the knowledge of ground operations for the aviators and to familiarize the ground officers with air operations.

2. The 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines continued operations along Liberty Road, the Arizona Territory, and on Go Noi Island. A three-day, battalion (-) tank/infantry operation with a platoon of PFS was conducted in the Arizona Territory and resulted in a total of 6 enemy KIAs and 4 friendly casualties all caused by booby trap detonations. In addition, a number of tank operations were conducted in the Phu Nhuan Area with moderate success. Company B 1/5, OPCON to 2/5 during April, conducted RIF operations on Go Noi/Le Bao Islands and accounted for 14 enemy KIAs in one large contact on April 15. Company H, in a significant contact on 4 April, assaulted 12 NVA killing 8 and capturing 3 POWs and a 60mm mortar tube.

3. The 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines conducted category II operations in the Thuong Duc Corridor and provided security for Hills 65, 25, and 52. Company M, 3/1, the Combined Unit Pacification Program Company, conducted securing and pacification operations within its respective AO and it was against this unit that many of the enemy's attacks were directed. CUPP Platoon 3/5 conducted squad size patrols and ambushes in the vicinity of Hill 25 and accounted for a number of enemy deaths through highly successful ambushes. Company C was assigned OPCON to the 1st Marine Regiment for a category III operation

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conducted on Charlie Ridge and the unit located an enemy base camp finding 54 individual weapons and 12 crew served weapons to include 2 complete Chinese Communist radios, 36 B-40 rocket rounds, and a large amount of small arms ammunition and medical supplies.

4. The 51st ARVN Regiment conducted limited operations in the Arizona Territory near Football Island during the month. On 9 April they returned to their cantonment and 2/5 again assumed responsibility for the complete Arizona AO. A combined cordon and search was also conducted with 3 companies of the 51st ARVN Regiment, National Police Field Forces, Company M, 3/1 CUPP, and 1 platoon of Company I in the Chau Son Area which resulted in 51 detainees. This operation was conducted in preparation for the reinsertion of the Chau Son Combined Unit Pacification Squad.

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PART III

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. Personnel and Administration. The Regiment received an input of 5 officers and 5 enlisted personnel during the month of April. Four (4) Marine officers, one (1) enlisted Navy and seventy-six (76) enlisted Marines were redeployed out of RVN during the month.

2. Intelligence

a. General. During the month of April 1970 the S-2 Section continued to collect, evaluate and disseminate intelligence concerning NVA/VC units in and around the 5th Marines AO.

b. The S-2 Section continued to make use of the command and control helicopters for VR purposes. This program has allowed S-2 personnel to actively locate, identify and plan destruction of intelligence targets.

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d. Significant Aspects of Enemy, Weather and Terrain

(1) Enemy

(a) Enemy forces continued a program of upgrading the capabilities of VC local and main force units. This program has been developed to the point where NVA soldiers have been transferred from their parent unit to VC units for duty.

(b) Intelligence reports indicate enemy plans for an upsurge of military activity during the first half of May 1970. This upsurge will mark the beginning of the second phase of the enemy's spring-summer (or K700) offensive.

(c) No new enemy units were identified within the 5th Marines AO.

(d) Mine/booby traps incidents decreased for the second month in a row. Total incidents reported were 96; 58 found, 38 detonated.

b. A five-day period of instruction was conducted by the RAS at An Hoa for all newly arrived corpsmen. This course will be conducted on a continuing basis.

4. Operations. There were numerous company and platoon size operations conducted by the 5th Marines throughout the reporting period as well as the combined operations conducted in coordination and cooperation with the 51st ARVN Regiment.

5. Fire Support. See Enclosure (6).

6. Air Support. During the month of April, the 5th Marine Regiment was supported by one hundred seventy-seven (177) medevac missions and evacuated three hundred six (306) personnel from the field. Daily resupply was accomplished with a package of two (2) CH-46s, two (2) helicopter gunships and often one (1) CH-53. Normally two (2) CH-46s were used for the C&C mission. By using CH-53s, both battalions of the Regiment were airlifted to and from Stock Piles. Eighty-one (81) tactical air strikes were flown in support of the 5th Marines. One hundred nine (109) aerial observer (AO) missions were flown for visual reconnaissance, control of air strikes, artillery spotting, convey escort, and support of ground units in contact. Units in contact at night received four (4) "Basketball" flare ships, one (1) "Shadow" and two (2) "stingers". Special helicopter packages used by the Regiment were one (1) "pacifier", one (1) quick reaction mission, and two (2) strike missions. Anti-aircraft fire was reported twelve (12) times with seven (7) aircraft receiving hits.

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7. Logistics, Equipment and Supply

a. Base Development. Improvement of the physical appearance of the An Hoa Cantonment continued to be emphasized during the month of April. Road surfacing and drainage improvements were effected by the seaboats. Salvage airfield matting was hauled out by District and Province representatives, while "B" Company, 1st Engineers facilitated on site disposal. Alpha Sector defenses were improved with the relocation of a 35 foot tower from Hill 65.

b. Supply. The following amounts of consumable supplies, (by class) were received during April at the LSU, An Hoa.

Class I - 310 short tons
Class III - 580 short tons
Class V - 3825 short tons

c. Land Transportation. The direct support platoon assigned to 5th Marines from 1st Motor Transport Battalion traveled 7019 miles, carried 1061 tons of cargo and transported 18,542 troops during the month.

d. Air Transportation. A total of 212 fixed wing aircraft utilized the airfield during the month. During this period, rotary wing aircraft made 151 lifts carrying 2785 passengers and 301 tons of cargo.

8. Communications. During the month of April 1970, communications in the 5th Marines area of operation were maintained as previously established, with the following changes:

- a. On 5 April, rewired Alpha Sector defense bunkers.
- b. On 14 April, prepared and distributed new 5th Marines GEOI.
- c. On 15 April, covered TACP Local nets and established new TAR-5 not covered.
- d. On 28 April, established refresher instruction in use of operational codes.
- e. On 24 April, Captain SUMNERLAND, member of Divisions GEO's Office arrived at An Hoa for 30 days to assist in communications problems and procedure.
- f. On 30 April, received Division Inspection on Communications Tactical Publications which resulted in satisfactory with noteworthy comments.

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9. Medical

a. The RAS continued in full operation during the month of April treating 647 U. S. military and 666 Vietnamese. In addition, 198 immunizations were administered.

b. 102 patients, 18 of whom were battle casualties, were aeromedically evacuated via the RAS during the month.

10. Civil Affairs. During the month of April several projects and programs started the previous month were completed and other long term projects were continued. The two principal projects completed were: (1) a nursing home, and (2) a classroom. Both were completed in a short period of time and were very effective in influencing the inhabitants of this community. In Dai Loo District two (2) elementary schools were constructed and opened. Now, it is reported that Vietnamese civilians are supplying greater amounts of intelligence information and dud ordnance. The continuous type projects equally effective were: ModCAPs and DentCAPs, General Walt Scholarships (119 students were recipients), sports program (two (2) games were played in competition), English instruction (forty (40) hours were taught this month) and refugee assistance (providing transportation to and from RAS, and assisting Vietnamese who are victims or relatives of victims of tragedy). Vietnamese participation in civic action programs continues to increase significantly.

a. Materials distributed during the month of April from military resources for Civic Action are as follows:

(1) 200 1x12s, 10 4x12s, 80 4x4s, 20 2x8s, 134 1x4s, 30 2x6s, 8 1x10s, 131 $\frac{1}{2}$ " plywood, 200 12 foot tin, 250 bags of cement, 30 pounds of 8p nails, 30 pounds of 6p nails, 30 pounds of 4p nails, and 4 blackboards (5' x 6').

c. Medical treatment was administered to 1,975 Vietnamese throughout 5th Marines' areas of responsibility.

d. Daily employment of Vietnamese for work on and off An Hoa Combat Base continued. Approximately 80 Vietnamese laborers work on a daily basis.

11. Psychological Operations. Most psychological operations are planned and managed by Division Psyops personnel.

12. Chaplain. Significant statistics on religious services for the month of April:

a. Twenty-five religious services were conducted aboard the An Hoa Combat Base during the month.

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b. Two lectures on "Religiously Based Customs in Vietnam" were delivered at Regimental Indoctrination School. These lectures are considered an integral part of the Personal Response Program.

(1) Man and maintain supplementary positions in vicinity of LSA during Readiness Condition A. (see Annex E (Operation Diagram) and Annex I (Alert/Readiness Conditions)).

- (2) Coordinate with Base Defense Coordinator.

n. 1st Platoon, Company C, 1st Tank Battalion

(1) Man tank slots as directed by the Base Defense Coordinator nightly.

(2) Coordinate with Sector Commanders who maintain tank slots within their sectors.

(3) Be prepared to provide tanks as directed for counterattack. (see Annex K (Counterattack)).

o. 1st Platoon, Company A, 1st Motor Transport Battalion

(1) Man and maintain supplementary positions in Alpha Sector during Readiness Condition A (see Annex E (Operation Diagram) and Annex I (Alert/Readiness Conditions)).

- (2) Coordinate with Alpha Sector Commander.

(3) Provide appropriate number of trucks for deployment of reaction forces as directed by the Base Defense Coordinator. (see Annex J (Reinforcement) and Annex K (Counterattack)).

p. Provisional Rifle Company, 5th Marines

(1) Headquarters Commandant, 5th Marines will provide adequate forces for the Provisional Rifle Company.

(2) Personnel assigned to the Provisional Rifle Company will muster daily at 1800 and when Alert Condition I siren is sounded in the Regimental COG parking lot. (see Annex I (Alert/Readiness Conditions)).

SECRET

(3) Be prepared to be committed anywhere in the An Hoa Combat Base. (See Annex J (Reinforcement) and Annex K (Counterattack)).

g. Base Augmentation Company

(1) The Base Augmentation Company is a designated rifle company OPCON to 5th Marines and will man and maintain the defense of Delta Sector in accordance with sub-paragraph 3d above.

(2) Additional duties are as follows:

(a) Provide force for road sweep security to Engineer Sweep Team each morning.

(b) Coordinate with Commanding Officer, Company B, 1st Engineer Battalion.

(c) Be prepared to provide a daytime working party as required to the Base Defense Coordinator.

(d) Coordinate with the Base Defense Coordinator as required.

(e) Be prepared to deploy forces required by 5th Marines Operation Plans 2-70, 3-70 and 4-70.

(f) Be prepared to conduct squad/platoon sized operations in and around An Hoa upon order.

h. Base Defense Coordinator (EDC)

(1) The EDC is responsible for orientating the Base Defense Augmentation Company to the defensive posture of the An Hoa Combat Base.

(2) The EDC works under the staff cognizance of the Regimental S-3 Officer and receives and administers directions from the Commanding Officer 5th Marines pertaining to the defenses of the An Hoa Combat Base and other matters as directed.

(3) Plans and executes a weekly Sector Commanders meeting held on Sundays at 1300H monitored by the Regimental XO. The purpose of these meetings is to discuss problems, coordinate instructions and other matters pertaining to the defenses.

(4) The EDC or his representative will hold a daily meeting with the Sector S-3/Cmdr of the Guard at 1700H in the Alternate COC. The purpose of this meeting is to coordinate night activities, pass latest enemy intelligence and issue any special orders or instructions.

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(5) During periods of contact with the enemy, the position of the HEC is in the Regimental COC. The HEC will be guided in his duties by this operation order.

s. Coordinating Instructions

(1) All primary fighting positions within each sector will be numbered and all modifications, recommendations for addition and deletion to the defensive perimeter will be coordinated with the Base Defense Coordinator.

(2) Inspection of sectors will be scheduled by this Headquarters.

(3) Continue rehabilitation of sector defenses.

(4) Sector Commanders ensure that a patrol is made daily to check defensive wire. Submit wire check results to 5th Marines COC by 1700H daily.

(5) Basic ammunition allowance for each individual and crew served weapon is as follows:

(a) M16A1 - seven (7) magazines with eighteen (18) rounds plus one (1) additional bandolier.

(b) M-79 Grenade Launcher - 24 rounds

(c) Machinegun, 7.62, M-60 - Eight-hundred (800) rounds 7.62 linked.

(d) Machinegun, caliber .50 - five-hundred (500) rounds.

(6) Maintain weatherproof ammunition kits for each numbered fighting positions with the following minimum requirements.

(a) Ten (10) M-26 hand grenades.

(b) Ten (10) hand hold pop-up illuminating flares.

(c) One (1) can of 5.56 ammunition in addition to basic allowance for M16A1 rifles.

(d) One (1) can of 7.62 linked ammunition in addition to the basic allowance for each fighting position containing an M-60 machinegun. One (1) can .50 caliber ammunition in addition to the basic allowance for each fighting position containing a .50 caliber machinegun.

(e) Two (2) LAWS.

(f) Forty-four (44) M-79 rounds to include 24 HE rounds, 10

illumination rounds and 10 flashette rounds in addition to basic allowance per fighting position having M-79 Grenade Launchers.

(7) Inspect and inventory ammunition kits daily to insure minimum requirements are maintained and establish appropriate control procedures for the issue and turn in of all ammunition and ordnance from these positions not manned during daylight hours.

(8) Prepare supplementary positions as appropriate.

(9) All sectors will coordinate with 5th Marines COC prior to granting permission to fire weapons unless positions are actually under attack.

(10) Ensure that the ~~Officer-of-the Day/Commander-of-the Guard~~ from each sector attend the daily 1700H guard meeting in the 5th Marines Alternate COC.

(11) Ensure that a corpsman is present in each sector COC.

(12) Ensure that the applicable portions of this order are disseminated to those personnel directly concerned with the defenses.

4. ADMINISTRATION AND LOGISTICS

a. General. Reference (b).

b. Distribution of field fortification materials to accomplish construction tasks assigned in paragraph 3 above will be coordinated by the Base Defense Coordinator.

c. Requests for engineer assistance will be submitted to the Base Defense Coordinator in writing and will contain a description of work requested and name of person familiar with work to be accomplished.

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Annex D (Concept of Operations) to Operation Order 1-70

Time Zone: H

1. The An Hoa Combat Base is organized into six (6) defense sectors (See Annex E (Operations Diagram)) with all 5th Marines and other tenant units participating in the defense of the base. Sector Commanders designated as shown in Annex A (Task Organization) will organize their prescribed sectors, utilizing tenant units, and will be responsible for manning and maintaining the defensive lines. Sector Commanders will also ensure that perimeter fighting positions are manned in accordance with the provisions of Annex I (Alert/Readiness Conditions). All numbered fighting positions within each sector are linked with the sector COCs by land line communications and each COC communicates with the 5th Marines COC by land line and/or radio communications where overall command and control of the base defense will be exercised. Each sector is responsible for maintaining a reaction force on standby which is ready for employment as directed by the CO, 5th Marines or Sector Commander. The Base Defense Coordinator designated, by the CO, 5th Marines, will coordinate the defensive posture of the base and carry out other matters of defense as directed by the CO, 5th Marines.

2. Artillery fire in support of the base defense is provided by one artillery battalion (Rein) as shown in Annex B (Support Units) and in accordance with fire support plan shown in Annex G (Artillery Support). Illumination during the hours of darkness is provided upon request by two 81mm mortars located within the An Hoa Combat Base. The Composite 81mm Mortar Section is organic to the 5th Marines S-3 Section and is directly responsive to the 5th Marines COC in the conduct of fire. The 81mm mortar fire is preplanned illumination targets and on-call fire. The artillery and 81mm mortar target numbers and grids are as shown in Annex G (Artillery Support).

3. Plans to reinforce any sector under ground attack are shown in Annex J (Reinforcement). Plans for counterattacks are as shown in Annex K (Counter-attack). Forces for both reinforcement and counterattacks will be either the sector reaction forces or the Provisional Rifle Company.

Time Zone: II

1. General

a. There are four communication nets utilized within the An Hoa Combat Base for command and control of the defense. They are as follows:

- (1) Base Defense Wire Net.
- (2) Counter Mortar/Rocket Wire Net.
- (3) Base Defense Radio Net.
- (4) Base Damage Control Net.

b. Frequency designators (MIKE number) and call sign information will be designated by references (a) and (b).

c. Appendixes 1, 2, 3 and 4 to this Annex graphically display the four nets utilized.

2. Communications-Electronics

a. Wire Communications

- (1) Base Defense Wire Net

(a) The Base defense wire net will be the primary means of communications to and from the Regimental COC for the conduct of the base defense.

(b) Units responsible for each defense sector will ensure that two wire lines, using different routes, are laid from each sector COC to the Regimental COC.

(c) A continuous telephone watch will be maintained in each sector COC and the 81mm Mortar Section FDC from 1800H to 0700H nightly and during periods of attack by ground or fire as signaled by the sounding of

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the alert horns or siren. (See paragraph 3 below)

(d) During emergencies, a conference call will be established linking all sectors so that conferencees will be able to hear conversations.

(2) Counter Mortar/Rocket Wire Net

(a) This wire net is a separate net that connects each observation tower with the Regimental COC for the purpose of reporting mortar and rocket firing positions and directions.

(b) Appendix 2 graphically portrays the Counter Mortar/Rocket Wire Net.

(c) See Annex H (Observation Tower Procedures)

b. Radio Communications

(1) Base Defense Radio Net

(a) The Base Defense Radio Net will be used as back-up communications for the wire net from the Regimental COC to the sector COCs and the 81mm Mortar Section FDC.

(b) The Base Defense Radio Net will be activated from 1800H to 0700H nightly and during periods of attack by ground/fire as signaled by the sounding of the alert horns/siren. (see paragraph 3 below)

(c) The frequency and MIKE designator for this net are as specified in reference (b).

(d) Tank or tanks utilized on the defensive perimeter in tank slots will check into and monitor the Base Defense Radio Net once they are in position. Tanks designated for reserve will check into Base Defense Radio Net when alert signals are sounded.

(e) Call signs for the Base Defense Radio Net will be utilized as follows:

- 1 Regimental COC -- (Regimental call sign as established by reference (a)).
- 2 Sector COCs -- (Letter designator) SECTOR.
- 3 Tanks -- (Call sign established by reference (a)).
- 4 81mm Mortar Section FDC -- (Regimental Call Sign) WHISKEY.

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(2) Damage Control Radio Net

(a) During the period of attack by ground or by fire, the Damage Control Net will be used for damage control and the Regimental Tactical Net #2 is the primary frequency. (See reference (b)). The units specified in sub-paragraph (c) below will immediately enter this net whenever the signal is sounded that signifies the base is sustaining an enemy ground attack or attack by fire. Stations will check into the net in the order listed in sub-paragraph (c) and will report immediately both initial damage assessments and casualties sustained and simultaneously make immediate requests for emergency logistical support (ambulance, firetrucks, EOD, etc.) at that time. The Net Control Station for this net is the Regimental S-4 Damage Control Officer (DCO). This net may be pre-empted in emergencies by the Regimental Commander to communicate with organic or tenant units to pass messages essential to the defense of An Hoa Combat Base. When this occurs, the DCO will monitor the net in readiness to resume his net control functions.

(b) When a signal is sounded which indicates the base is sustaining an enemy ground attack or attack by fire, the units specified in sub-paragraph (c) below will ensure that their radios are immediately turned on and an operator is ready to send and receive messages. When the DCO requests all stations to check into the net, each station, in order listed below will do so using his assigned call sign. (See Appendix 4 for call signs). The station will report an initial damage assessment and casualties; report the number and type of rounds received, if any. Stations missed will be called by the DCO after other stations have checked in. Negative reports are required during this check-in procedure to inform the DCO as to which stations are up on the net and to pass damage assessments and/or immediate logistic/damage control requests.

(c) If soon as possible after an attack commences, the reporting units will determine in greatest detail the type and number of rounds received, damage inflicted, and logistic/damage control requirements. If this information was not complete during the check-in procedure, amplifying details will be reported after the DCO has completed the check-in and received reports. Negative reports required.

(d) Routine reports and requirements will be transmitted to the DCO only after the second round of priority reports and requests. The DCO will announce when the net is open for routine messages.

(e) The following stations will check-in, in order, when the Base Damage Control is activated:

(f) The Regimental Communications Platoon will provide a radio for RAS; the call sign suffix will be "One six".

(g) For other call signs utilized on this net see Appendix 4 and references (a) and (b).

(h) Stations unable to enter this radio net will use the administrative telephone system for reporting. IMMEDIATE precedence will be used for this purpose and calls will be placed to the Regimental S-4 (Damage Control Officer). Messengers will be used in the event neither radio nor wire communications are operational/available.

3. Sound

a. The sounding of the truck horns in Tower #2 is the signal to take cover immediately and signifies that the base is under rocket or mortar attack. When the horns sound, personnel will immediately drop to the prone position and not attempt to run to a bunker or other covered positions.

b. The sounding of the siren is the signal for the Readiness Condition A (See Annex I (Alert/Readiness Conditions)).

c. At night, the signal for Readiness Condition A will be the sounding of the truck horns followed immediately by the sounding of the siren.

d. Tests of the truck horns and siren will be conducted daily at 1200H to ensure proper functioning.

4. Pyrotechnics

a. Colored pyrotechnics will be utilized as an alternate means of communications.

b. Pyrotechnic signals are as follows:

(1) Red Star Cluster - in trouble, need assistance

(2) Green Star Cluster - friendly unit returning back into sector

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c. All LPs will carry the above pyrotechnic signals.

5. Command Posts

a. See Annex E (Operations Diagram) for CQC locations.

b. 5th Marines CQC and Alternate CQC will be manned during Readiness Condition A in accordance with reference (b).

6. Diagrams and Forms

a. Appendixes 1, 2, 3, and 4 graphically portray the wire nets and radio nets utilized in the defense of the An Hoa Combat Base. These forms will be completed by entering the call signs in use in the space provided and the forms will be prominently posted at communications stations on these nets.

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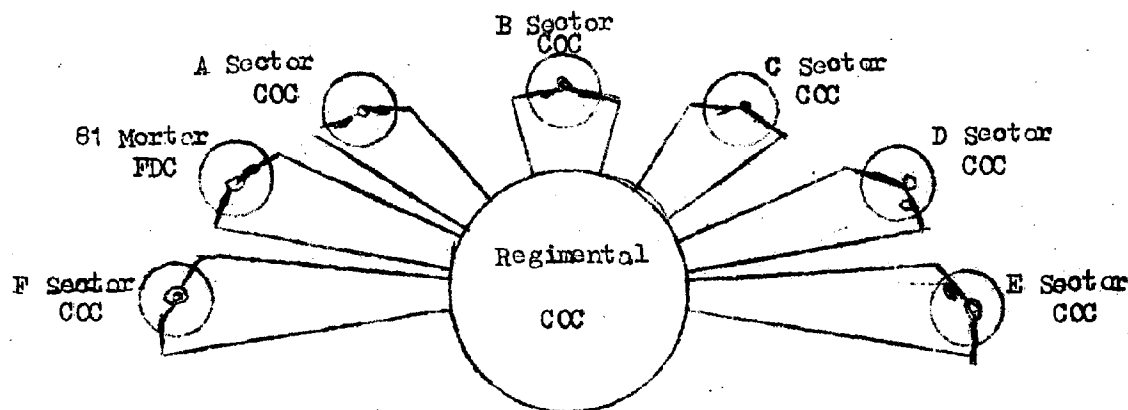

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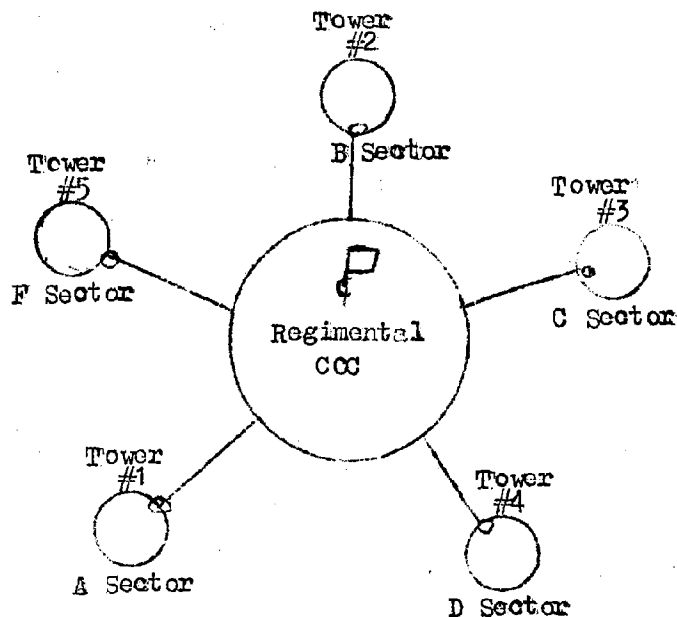
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Appendix 2 (Counter Mortar/Rocket Wire Net Diagram) to Annex F

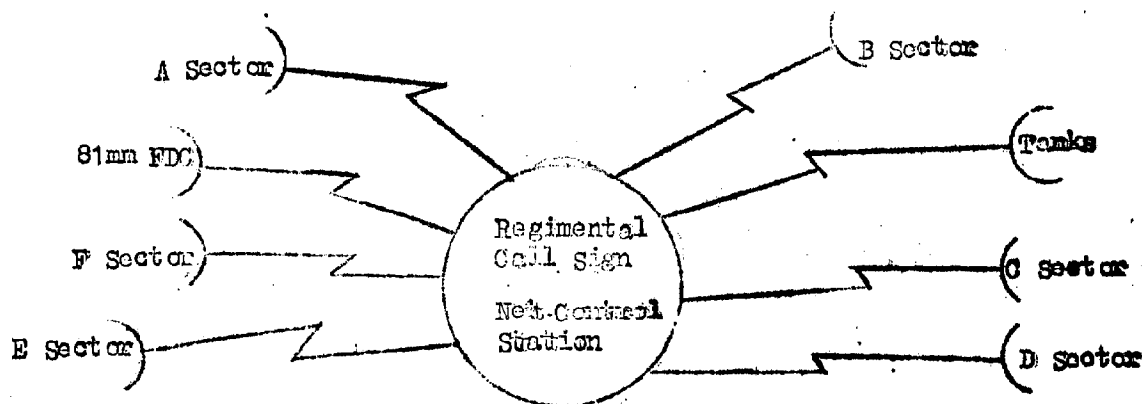

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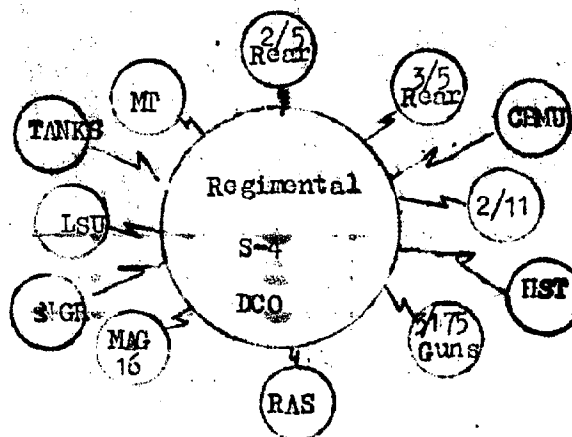

2. MISSION: 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines (Rein) (direct support of 5th Marine Regiment) provides artillery support for the defense of An Hoa Combat Base.

3. EXECUTION

a. Concept of Operations. Annex D (Concept of Operations).

b. Coordinating Instructions

(1) Requests by Sector Commanders to execute any portion of the plan will be forwarded to the 5th Marines FSCC by the most expeditious means available.

(2) Priority of fires will be determined by the 5th Marines FSCC.

(3) FSCC procedures remain normal. Requests to execute the plan will include the clearance status of the included target. Pre-clearance of 81mm mortar illumination grids will be effected to ensure rapid response to initial calls for illumination.

(4) Pre-clearance of previously utilized rocket and mortar firing sites will be effected to the maximum degree feasible.

(5) Directions to rocket and/or mortar firing sites, as reported by observation towers, will be plotted by the FSCC on a situation map depicting all previously utilized rocket and mortar firing sites. The resultant positions obtained by intersection, or estimation in the case of a single reported direction, will be compared with previously used firing sites and clearance procedures initiated as required. Cleared target grids will be passed to the FDC, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines. Clearance is not required

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prior to engaging active rocket and/or mortar sites.

4. ADMINISTRATION AND LOGISTICS. No change.

5. COMMAND AND COMMUNICATIONS/ELECTRONICS. No change.

1. General. An accurate and rapid means of detecting and reporting rocket and/or mortar firing positions must be established to ensure quick and accurate counter mortar/rocket fire. There are five observation towers utilized for reporting within the An Hoa Combat Base. Sector Commanders are responsible for the manning of the towers and training of personnel who man them.

2. Observation towers are assigned to sector commanders as follows:

Tower #1	A Sector (875474)	XO, 3rd Bn, 5th Marines
Tower #2	B Sector (873473)	CO, Hq Co, 5th Marines
Tower #3	C Sector (867472)	XO, 2nd Bn, 5th Marines
Tower #4	D Sector (878478)	CO, Base Augmentation Company
Tower #5	F Sector (876464)	XO, 2nd Bn, 5th Marines

3. Towers will be manned twenty-four (24) hours daily and primary responsibility for surveillance is designated in Appendix 1 of this annex.

4. Sector Commanders will ensure that towers under their cognizance are equipped with a permanently mounted, north-south oriented, 1:50,000 map board consisting of the applicable portions of AMS Map Sheets 6540 I, 6540 II, 6640 IV, and 6640 III of Series L7014, with the An Hoa Combat Base as the geographic center and a radius of 14,000 meters is included thereon. The map board will be covered with acetate on which is inscribed a compass rose with 400 mil increments indicated. A plastic pointer will also be affixed to the board such that its base pivots on the six place grid location of the tower in which it is used. The point should be long enough so that the watch personnel can rapidly sight along its axis and thereby obtain an accurate direction, in mils, to any observed enemy activity. Flashlights or other night lighting devices will be issued to watch personnel during the hours of darkness and binoculars will also be maintained in the tower at all times.

5. Sector Commanders will ensure that observation tower personnel are thoroughly familiar with their duties as outlined in paragraph 7 below; aware of the characteristics of rocket/mortar attacks; capable of using their orientation equipment rapidly and accurately and report their observation accurately and promptly utilizing the format specified in paragraph 7 below.

6. Frequent communications checks will be conducted between all towers and the Regimental COC and any communication failures will be reported immediately to the 5th Marines Communication Platoon.

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7. Duties of observation personnel are as follows:

a. Be alert for any activity which might indicate the establishment of rocket and/or mortar sites (e.g. men carrying tubes) or evidence of firing (e.g. flashes, vapor trails, smoke).

b. Observe the forward edge of defensive wire within sector of observation for indigenous personnel planting markers or tampering with the wire.

c. Ensure that a communication check is made daily between 0830H and 0930H to 5th Marines COC Watch Officer/Watch NCO. Communications checks will be made every hour on the half-hour beginning at 1830H until 0630H. Notify sector COC immediately by runner if communications with the 5th Marines COC is lost.

d. Report observations to the S-3 Watch Officer/Watch NCO via the land line using the following report format:

- (1) Nature of Activity - (e.g., "Firing Mortars")
- (2) Tower Identification - (e.g., "From Tower #1")
- (3) Direction of Activity - (e.g., "Direction 4840 mils")

e. Once the above report is made, continue to observe hostile activity and report any significant changes from the original report such as; a cessation of firing, change in firing positions and additional firing positions, etc.

f. The 5th Marines Watch Officer/Watch NCO will ensure that all rocket and/or mortar reports are forwarded rapidly to the FSCC Watch Officer.

g. The 5th Marines Communication Officer will ensure that reliable and rapid means of Voice communications are maintained between all towers and the Regimental COC.

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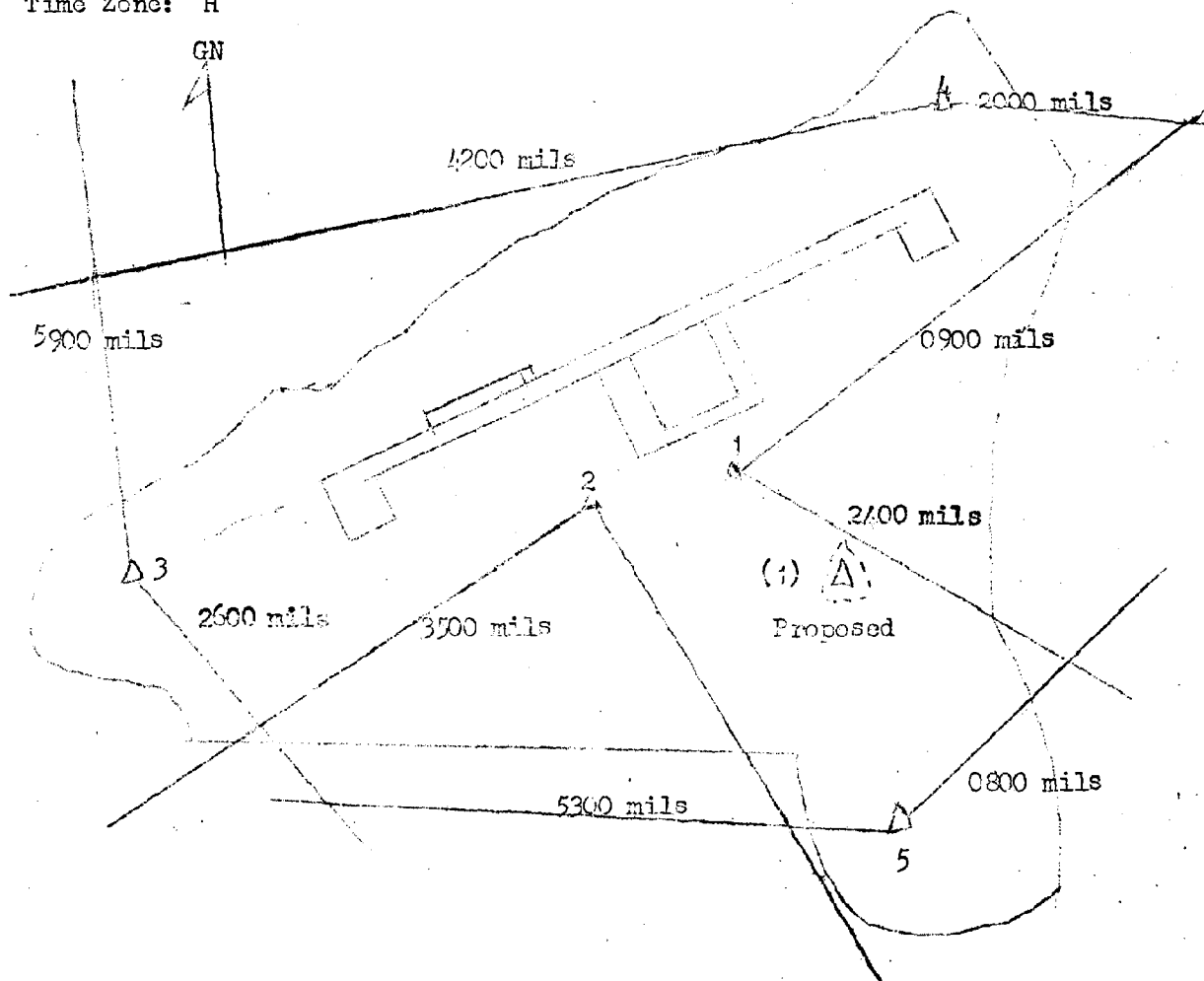

(2) Reaction force will be available for muster within 15 minutes.

(3) Uniform will be flak jacket, helmet, jungle kit, gas mask, and individual weapons with prescribed allowance of ammo for the alert watch and reaction force.

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c. Readiness Condition C. (Daylight Posture)

(1) Sectors A, B, C, D, E, and F each man a minimum of two observation posts.

(2) Sector D man 4 observation posts.

(3) Observation posts shall be rotated to avoid establishing a pattern.

(4) Uniform: as prescribed by sector Commanders based on current enemy threat.

3. Conditions of alert watch and uniforms are subject to change based on the current enemy threat and activity.

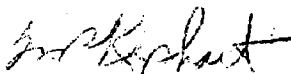

Appendix 1: Diagram of Security Post Locations

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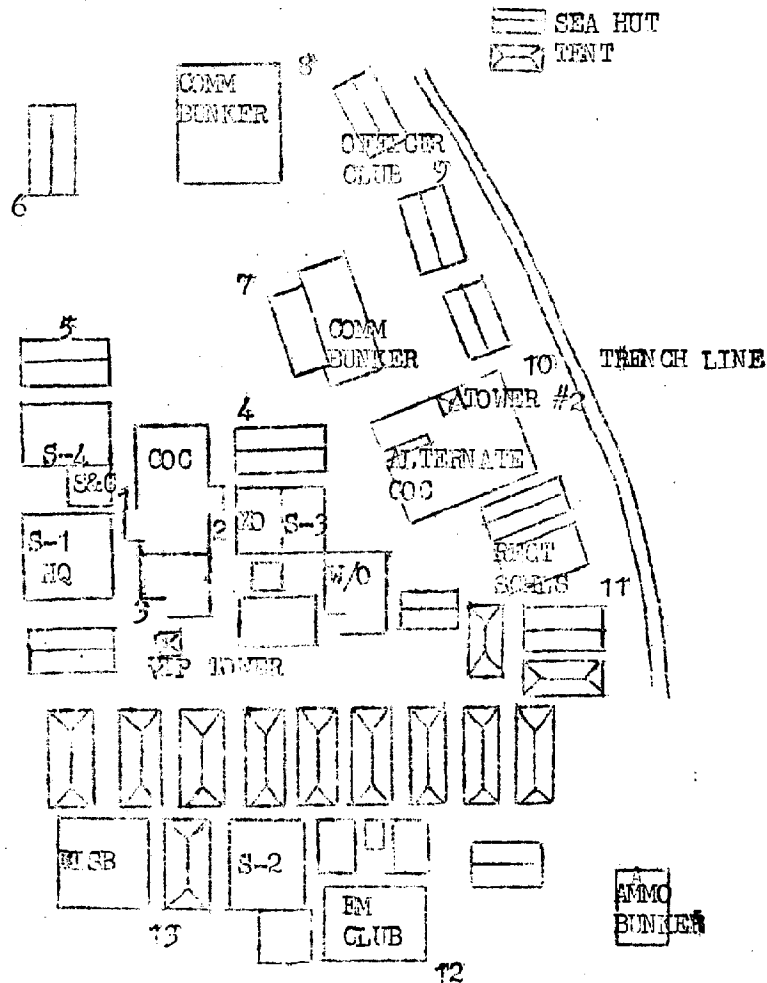

1. SITUATION

a. Enemy Forces

(1) Current INTSUMS and PERINTREPS.

(2) Enemy situation. The enemy has been directed to attack RVN installations and refugee camps with the primary mission of "liberating" the refugees and demonstrating to them that they are not safe under GVN control. The enemy has also been directed to attack combined-action units to show their ineffectiveness. Most attacks in the past have consisted of small squad size sapper attacks; however, the enemy possesses the capability of launching up to battalion size ground attacks supported by mortar and sapper attacks. Any enemy force with the primary mission of attacking CACO 29 would probably conduct his main attack against the unit with secondary infantry and mortar attacks directed on nearby Marine and Duc Duc District units that might be given the mission of reinforcing the unit.

(3) Enemy Order of Battle. See current OOB.

b. Friendly Forces

(1) Duc Duc District Headquarters located near An Hoa at AT664476 maintains two (2) RF companies and six (6) PF platoons in the vicinity of An Hoa. In addition, co-located with District Forces is Combined Action Company (CACO) 29 composed of Combined Action Platoons (CAP) 291 and 292.

(2) Second Battalion, 11th Marines is in direct support of the 5th Marines and is tasked with supporting operations involving the relief of CACO 29.

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2. MISSION. On order, in coordination and cooperation with Duc Duc District Forces, relieve/reinforce CACO 29.

3. EXECUTION

a. Concept of Operation. One platoon, Base Augmentation Company, 5th Marines will be assigned primary responsibility for the relief/reinforcement of CACO 29. 5th Marines will further task organize, as necessary, the required force to accomplish the mission. The relief/reinforcement will include one or more of the following actions:

(1) Reinforcement of CACO 29 through close and continuous artillery fires. See Annex A (Artillery Target List).

(2) Employment of platoon (reinforced) by overland forced march to relieve/reinforce CACO 29. See Annex B (CACO 29 Area of Operation).

b. Designated Platoon, An Hoa Base Augmentation Company, 5th Marines

(1) On order, deploy by overland forced march all or part of the forces available to reinforce CACO 29.

c. Coordinating Instructions

(1) Basic Task Organization unless otherwise directed.

(2) This plan will be executed following issuance of an oral frag order setting forth the existing situation, the support available, and directing the specific employment of forces as indicated in the concept of operations.

(3) Base Augmentation Company will continue accomplishing current assigned mission at reduced strength within An Hoa Combat Base.

(4) Preplanned artillery targets on call from 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines.

(5) No change in rules of engagement (See reference (b)).

(6) Platoon commander, tasked platoon, is directed to effect liaison with SA, Duc Duc District and CACO 29 commander in order to make preparations for implementation of this plan.

(7) Liaison/coordination team from Duc Duc District consisting of one (1) Vietnamese and one (1) U.S. Advisor with a Vietnamese interpreter will join tasked platoon at the 5th Marines Regimental COC prior to implementation of this plan.

(8) This plan is effective for planning on receipt and for execution on order.

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4. ADMINISTRATION/LOGISTICS

a. All captured enemy equipment will be processed through normal unit S-2 channels.

b. Administrative control remains with parent company. Notify parent company of all casualties, including non-battle, by the most expeditious means available.

5. COMMAND AND COMMUNICATIONS-ELECTRONICS

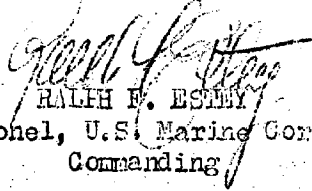

GENERAL

101. GENERAL.

1. DOCTRINAL APPLICABILITY. Tactical combat operations of the 5th Marines will be conducted in conformity with:

a. Applicable Naval Warfare Publications, Staff Manuals, Landing Force Manuals, Fleet Marine Force Manuals, Landing Force Bulletins and Departmental Instructions.

b. Current doctrine, orders and/or technical and tactical instructions from competent authority.

2. UNIT/ORGANIZATIONS SOP'S. Standing Operating Procedure for Operations prepared by subordinate units/organizations will be based on and conform with the policies and procedures contained herein.

3. NECD. Detailed instructions concerning Nuclear, Biological and Chemical Defense operations are contained in reference (c).

4. PSYCHOLOGICAL WARFARE. Detailed instructions concerning psychological warfare is contained in reference (b).

5. TOXIC CHEMICAL/BIOLOGICAL AGENTS. Detailed instructions concerning the employment of toxic chemical/biological agents will be promulgated by separate directives.

6. COMMUNICATIONS. Pertinent communications instructions and procedures are contained in references (a) and (d).

7. TANK-INFANTRY COORDINATION/ANTI-MECHANIZED OPERATIONS. Detailed instructions concerning Tank-Infantry Coordination/Antimechanized Operations are contained in reference (e).

102. OPERATION PLANS AND ORDERS. Reference (f) set forth the format and content of studies, plans, orders, and other combat documents and will be used as a guide in the preparation of such documents.

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1. NUMBERING. Commanding Officers will use the following numbering system on operational plans and orders.

a. Operation plans and orders issued in support of plans/orders of higher headquarters will bear the same basic number of the supported directive.

b. Operation orders which do not support a Regiment or Division plan/order will be assigned a number by Division Headquarters.

c. Code names for operations will be provided by Division Headquarters.

2. ANNEXES. Appropriate security classification, if different from that of the basic plan or order, will be listed for each annex. Appropriate notation will be made relative to subsequent publication or separate distribution of certain annexes.

103. OPERATION REPORTS AND RECORDS

1. GENERAL. Operational reports and records are necessary for the proper conduct and planning, analysis of operations and as the basis for the submission of similar reports and records by the Regiment to higher headquarters concerning Regimental activities. The maintenance of thorough, precise records, and the submission of timely, accurate reports of events occurring within the Regimental area of operations is a continuing requirement and can not be over stressed. When engaged in combat operations, or as directed, infantry battalions and attachments will submit or maintain the reports shown below.

2. REQUIRED REPORTS. References (g) and (h) contain a consolidated format for all required operational reports to include readiness reports, command chronology, operation overlay reports, SITREPS, HISTREPS, combat after action reports, spot reports and MAREB/FORSTAT Reports.

3. RECORDS. Normal operational and tactical records, journals, maps, and files will be maintained by all organizations in accordance with the provisions of references (f) and (g). These records will be kept available for examination by this Headquarters and for historical purposes.

104. LIAISON OFFICERS

1. Infantry battalion and attachments will provide a Liaison Officer to the Regimental Command Post when so directed. Liaison Officers will be exchanged between adjacent infantry battalions in the attack or while in the defense. Liaison Officers will comply with the following:

a. Deliver to the appropriate message center, any priority message(s) awaiting transmission to that Headquarters from this Headquarters, at the time of departure.

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- b. Report to the S-3 Section Watch Officer.
- c. Provide S-3 with up-to-date overlay of the current disposition of his parent organization.
- d. Ensure that the S-3 situation map reflects the current positions of his parent organization.
- e. Ensure that pertinent information is exchanged between Regiment and his parent organization.
- f. Be present and prepared to represent his organization at command briefings.
- g. Upon relief, carry out the following prior to return of his parent organization.

(1) Check out with the Regimental message center prior to departure and deliver any message(s) and/or documents destined for his parent organization.

(2) Prepare an overlay of the current Regimental situation for delivery to his parent organization.

105. TASK ORGANIZATIONS

1. Commanding Officers will use the following system in designating organizations and units in Task Organizations.
2. An organization or unit will be designated minus (-), if any of its organic organizations or units, one echelon lower, are detached.

EXAMPLE: 1st Bn, 5th Mar will be designated 1st Bn (-), 5th Mar when Co A, 1st Bn, 5th Mar is detached.

3. An organization or unit will be designated reinforced (Rein) when any organization, unit, or detachment is attached to the organization or unit.

EXAMPLE: 1st Bn, 5th Mar will be designated 1st Bn (Rein), 5th Mar when 1st Plt, Co B, 1st Engr Bn is attached.

The designation reinforced (Rein) will not be used to identify any organization or unit which has non-organic similar organizations or units attached unless such attachments increase the number of organizations or units over the standard Table of Organization structure.

EXAMPLE: 5th Marines with a HqCo and 3 Infantry Battalions assigned

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would be designated 5th Marines even though 2 of the Infantry Battalions were from other regiments. The Task Organization would be:

5th Marines

HqCo

1st Bn, 1st Mar

1st Bn, 5th Mar

1st Bn, 7th Mar

5th Marines with 4 Infantry Battalions assigned would be designated 5th Marines (Rein). The Task Organization would be:

5th Marines (Rein)

HqCo

1st Bn, 5th Mar

2nd Bn, 5th Mar

3rd Bn, 5th Mar

1st Bn, 1st Mar

4. All organizations and units assigned to the 5th Marine Regiment (Rein) will establish Task Organizations and designate organizations and units in conformance with this system.

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SECTION II

ORGANIZATION AND DUTIES OF THE OPERATIONS SECTION

Ref: (a) FMFM 3-1, Command and Staff Action
 (b) DivO 3480.1

201. ORGANIZATION AND DUTIES OF THE OPERATIONS SECTION

1. GENERAL. The principle operating agencies within the Operations Section of the COC are the S-3 Operations Officer, Fire Support Coordination Center personnel and Air Liaison personnel. In addition, the S-2 (Intelligence Center) and Communication Center are also situated within the COC.

2. RESPONSIBILITIES AND DUTIES

a. The Regimental Operations Section is responsible for the following staff functions:

(1) Those functions stated in reference (a), which relate to organizations, tactical operations, training, and psychological warfare.

(2) Maintenance of Staff Journal, operations records, maps, and files.

(3) Receipt and relay of spot and other operational report requirements to higher authority in accordance with reference (b).

(4) Review of subordinate unit operational reports/plans/orders when required.

3. COC WATCH SECTION

a. The S-3 Operations Watch Section will be organized for continual operations and will have as a minimum one (1) Watch Officer and one (1) Watch NCO located in the COC.

b. The Watch Officer is responsible to the S-3 Operations Officer for the COC watch and will:

(1) Keep himself continually abreast of the tactical situation as it develops.

(2) Be prepared to conduct on the spot briefs to the Regimental Commander or S-3 Officer as required.

(3) Ensure that all spot reports, journal logs, situation reports,

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and forecasts of operations are thoroughly reviewed for completeness, clarity, and accuracy of information. If the report is vague or incomplete, he will immediately contact the reporting unit and obtain the necessary information needed for a complete and concise report.

(4) Ensure that spot reports, sitreps, and forecasts of operations are promptly relayed to the Division COC as required by reference (b) and other current directives.

(5) Coordinate and control the defenses of the An Hoa Combat Base under the guidance of the Base Defense Coordinator.

c. The Watch NCO is responsible to the Watch Officer and assists him in the performance of his duties. The Watch NCO will also:

(1) Receive, type, and pass on spot reports, journal logs, and sitreps to the Division COC.

(2) Plot minor information on the tactical situation map of friendly unit locations and activities as received by the COC. When changes are made to the COC operations maps, the FSCC representative and the Air Liaison Officer/NCO will also be notified.

(3) Ensure that the COC is in a constant state of police.

4. ENEMY ATTACK. In the event of an enemy attack against the An Hoa Combat Base, both the primary and alternate COCs will be manned and will perform parallel functions to ensure continuity of command and control during the emergency. The off section of the COC watch will man the alternate COC under the supervision of the Assistant Operations Officer.

301. GENERAL

1. The coordinating agency for supporting arms at 5th Marines Headquarters will be the Fire Support Coordination Center (FSCC). The FSCC will function in planning and operational phases in accordance with references (a) through (h), and as set forth in specific operation plans and orders.
2. The FSCC will function under the general staff supervision of the Regimental S-3.
3. Responsibility for coordination of supporting arms rests with the infantry commander at all levels.
4. The FSCC is an integral part of the 5th Marines Command Post.

302. ARTILLERY OFFICER/FIRE SUPPORT COORDINATOR

1. The Liaison Officer from the assigned Direct Support Artillery Battalion is the 5th Marines Fire Support Coordinator (FSC). The FSC will function under the staff cognizance of the Regimental S-3.
2. The commander of the assigned Direct Support Artillery Battalion and/or the Artillery Liaison Officer will furnish technical advice and assistance to the Regimental Commander, Executive and Special Staff on all matters concerning artillery and fire support, including the preparation of studies, estimates, plans, orders, reports, and instructions.

303. COMPOSITION

1. The FSCC will be composed of the FSC, Naval Gunfire Liaison Officer and Regimental Air Liaison Officer and members of their respective liaison sections.
2. Representatives of supporting arms other than Air, Artillery, or Naval Gunfire may be members of the FSCC as appropriate.

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304. FUNCTIONING

1. Functioning of the FSCC and the execution of assigned duties are set forth in references (a) through (f).
2. Commanding Officers of infantry battalions will coordinate fires within their AO and will be prepared to operate a forward FSCC to coordinate supporting arms in operations outside of their own AO.

305. COORDINATION TECHNIQUES

1. PRINCIPLES OF FIRE SUPPORT COORDINATION. Plans for the fires of aircraft, artillery, and naval gunfire must be coordinated to ensure that these arms are economically employed with maximum effectiveness and the requisite degree of safety. Accordingly, coordination is achieved through application of the following principles:

- a. Unnecessary duplication of missions is avoided.
- b. Executed missions do not unduly endanger friendly forces.
- c. Interference by one means of support with the employment of another is reduced to a minimum.
- d. Each means of support is employed on missions best suited to its capabilities consistent with the situation, time available, and relative amounts of ammunition supply.
- e. Control of fires is established by the lowest echelon wherein adequate personnel and facilities are available.
- f. Final coordination of fires is accomplished at the lowest echelon able to effect complete coordination of the particular mission.

2. TARGET CLEARANCE

a. All supporting arms fires will be cleared in accordance with the provisions of references (c) and (f). Targets within the following distances of friendly units will require clearance from the units concerned.

(1) Artillery HE and WP

(2) Artillery Firecracker (ICM)

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(a) The burst grid requires same clearance as HE.

(b) The impact grid will be cleared within a 400 meter radius.

(3) Artillery and Mortar Illumination

(a) The point to be illuminated will be cleared in the same manner as for HE.

(b) The impact grid will be cleared using the following distances:

Mortars	200 meter radius
Howitzers	400 meter radius

(4) Artillery HC Smoke. The down range area to be cleared consists of a cone-shaped area with an apex at the shell casing grid, 30 degrees on each side of the direction of fire, extending 1500 meters from point of impact.

(5) 60mm and 81mm Mortar HE and WP. 400 meters

(6) Arclight. 3000 meters

(7) TPQ-10. 1500 meters

(8) Tactical Air Strike. 1000 meters

(9) Bacon. A rectangular area of the following dimensions around the target will be cleared with friendly units:

3000 meters in the direction of run in
2000 meters in the reciprocal of the direction of run in
1000 meters on either side of the run in direction

(10) Naval Gunfire. 1000 meters

b. Restricted Targets. An effort will be made to preserve religious, cultural, medical, and public utility installations with exceptions as noted in the Rules of Engagement.

c. Sav-a-Plane. The sav-a-plane is utilized to insure aircraft safety with respect to surface firing. Elements of the sav-a-plane are:

(1) Grid fired from

(2) Grid fired to

(3) Time starting

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- (4) Time ending
- (5) Maximum ordinate of trajectory in feet
- (6) Unit requesting
- (7) Description of target
- (8) Sav-a-plane alphabetic designator

3. AIR SENTRIES AND LOOKOUTS. Sentries are posted at artillery firing positions to command "check fire" when friendly aircraft are observed approaching the danger zone. Any person observing an unsafe condition that exists with artillery in respect to aircraft of friendly ground troops will command "check fire" by the most expedient means available.

4. RESTRICTIVE FIRE PLAN

a. A restrictive fire plan is issued when air and artillery/naval gunfire are employed simultaneously. The appropriate FSCC will promulgate the RFP. When the need is indicated, RFPs will be imposed on subordinate units. Restrictive fire plans should function so as to permit maximum use of all supporting arms. Extending a RFP into another unit's AO is discouraged.

b. A restrictive fire plan will be described by the following message format.

<u>Element</u> (Type of message)	<u>Information</u> Restrictive Fire Plan
A	Center line grids
B	Distance to either side of the center line (meters)
C	Maximum altitude (feet)
D	Minimum altitude (feet)
E	Time period effective

c. The FDCs of supporting artillery units will ensure that artillery fires do not pass through the air space enclosed by restrictive fire plans.

5. COORDINATION MEASURES. Standard coordination measures are described in chapter 2, section III of reference (a). Certain of these which are most applicable to regimental and smaller size unit operations are described below.

a. No-Fire Zone. An area circumscribed by a boundary in which no supporting arms fire will be delivered. Friendly forces may or may not be located within these zones.

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b. Precleared zone. An enclosed area into which supporting arms may fire during a specific time frame without obtaining further clearance. Conduct of supporting arms fires into a precleared zone will be in accordance with the Rules of Engagement. Limitations may or may not be imposed on the type of targets which may be attacked and the type of supporting arms fires which may be delivered into the precleared zone. A buffer zone of a distance appropriate to the type of supporting arms fires to be employed must be established on all sides of the precleared zone in order that targets may be engaged up to the boundary of the precleared zone without endangering adjacent units of populated areas.

c. Fire Coordination Line. A line established by a coordinating headquarters between two forces beyond which fire may not be delivered without coordination with the affected unit. A Fire Coordination Line is normally established to coordinate fires between two converging units.

d. No-Fire Line. A line short of which artillery or ships do not fire except on request of the supported commander, but beyond which they may fire at any time without danger to friendly troops.

e. Fire Support Coordination Line. This line takes the place of bomb lines and is a line short of which aircraft do not attack ground targets except on the request or approval of the appropriate ground commander, but beyond which they may attack targets without the requirement for specific clearance from ground commanders.

401. GENERAL.

1. The coordination of Naval Gunfire Support at the 5th Marines Headquarters will be effected by the Regimental Naval Gunfire Liaison Team within the Fire Support Coordination Center (FSCC). The Regimental Naval Gunfire Liaison Team will function in planning and operational phases in accordance with references (a) through (i) and as set forth in specific operation plans and orders.

2. The Regimental Naval Gunfire Liaison Team will function within the FSCC under the general supervision of the Regimental Fire Support Coordinator.

402. NAVAL GUNFIRE LIAISON OFFICER/ASSISTANT FIRE SUPPORT COORDINATOR.

1. The senior Naval Gunfire Liaison Officer of the Direct Support Artillery Battalion is the 5th Marines Naval Gunfire Liaison Officer (NGLO). The Regimental NGLO will function under the Fire Support Coordinator and under the staff cognizance of the Regimental S-3.

2. The Commanding Officer of the Direct Support Artillery Battalion and/or the Regimental NGLO will furnish the technical advice and assistance to the Regimental Commander, Executive and Special Staffs on matters concerning naval gunfire, including the preparation of studies, estimates, plans, orders, reports, and instructions.

403. REQUESTS FOR NAVAL GUNFIRE SUPPORT.

1. The Regimental NGLO will recommend the amount and type of naval gunfire support required for each operation and submit ship request via the FSCC channels to the Commander, Naval Support Task Unit (CTU 70.8). The format and lead time for the requests is in accordance with reference (f).

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2. The Regimental NGLO will recommend and request other naval support (i.e. Swift Boats) via FSCC channels. Directives establishing the rules of engagement for coastal surveillance units require that special authorization be established prior to providing fires in support of troops (except in the boat's own defense). Requests for service must include the authorization for a specified area under the control of the respective ground commander.

404. COORDINATION TECHNIQUES. Certain coordination techniques have been devised to facilitate the rapid attack of targets consistent with maximum safety. These techniques are set forth in detail in references (a), (b), (c) and (f).

405. COMMUNICATIONS. Communications will be established with higher headquarters and subordinate FSCCs as necessary to facilitate coordination of naval gunfire. Details concerning communications will be as set forth in references (j) and (k) as modified by appropriate operation plans and orders.

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SECTION V

AIR SUPPORT

501. GENERAL

1. References (a) through (i) provide guidance in the employment and coordination of air support.
2. This section provides additional pertinent guidance in air support procedures applicable to all units and personnel under the control of the 5th Marines, or operating in the AO assigned to the 5th Marines.
3. All personnel concerned with air support operations will thoroughly familiar with the basic principles contained in reference (a) pertaining to the selection, capabilities and limitations of the proper employment of air support. Maximum utilization of Air Liaison Officers (ALO's) and Forward Air Controllers (FAC's) in their primary duties toward this end is encouraged. ALO's and FAC's will be cross-trained in OF 03, under the direct supervision of the S-3, when not employed in their primary duties.

502. COMMAND

1. Command relations will be in accordance with reference (a), (b), and (c).
2. During operations employing a Marine Aircraft Wing, or elements thereof, the Wing Commander, or his designated representative, as the Landing Force TAC, controls and coordinates all air operations in the objective area for the Amphibious Task Force/Landing Force Commander through his TACC/TADC/TACC/DACC.

503. CONTROL, COORDINATION AND COMMUNICATIONS.

1. Procedures, techniques and employment of the Regiment's TACP's will be in accordance with references (c) and (g).

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2. Fire support coordination will be in accordance with reference (d) and Section III of this order.

3. Communications will be in accordance with references (a), (f), and communication-electronics orders for specific operations.

504. AIR SUPPORT REQUEST PRINCIPLES AND PROCEDURES

1. Principles contained in reference (a) governing selection of air support will be followed. Particular attention will be given the following principles:

a. Close Air Support (CAS) missions must be requested and/or approved by the responsible target area ground commander.

b. In requesting supporting fires, the ground commander considers artillery and naval gunfire and air, in that sequence.

c. Capabilities and limitations of supported aircraft contained in reference (a) will be considered in requesting air support.

2. Request for air support will be submitted to the DASC/Senior FSCC as far in advance as possible to facilitate proper planning and briefing.

3. Close Air Support requests will be submitted to the DASC/Senior FSCC on the TAR net utilizing the TAR form depicted in figure 6-4, reference (a), and figure 14, reference (g). Forms may be obtained from the Regimental Air Office.

4. Helicopter/fixed wing support requests will be submitted to DASC/Senior FSCC on the HR/TAR net utilizing the helicopter/fixed wing request form depicted in figure 6-5, reference (a). Forms may be obtained from the Regimental Air Officer.

5. The ultimate success of landing force operations is dependent on adequate and timely logistic support. References (h), (i), and (j) contain organizational and operational procedures for the Helicopter Support Team (HST). Request for aerial resupply will be submitted through the HST logistics net during tactical operations and via normal command channels at other times. Maximum utilization of HSTs will be made by unit on offensive actions.

6. Fixed wing tactical air movements will be conducted in accordance with references (k) and (l). Battalion or larger sized lift requirements for air movement will be submitted as early as possible to facilitate proper and orderly planning.

505. AIR SUPPORT PROCEDURES.

1. GENERAL

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a. In so far as the tactical situation permits, mutual briefings to encompass all aspects of a planned operation, with representatives of supported and supporting units in attendance, will be conducted prior to execution.

b. Communication procedures, in accordance with references (e) and (f) and pertinent OPLAN/OPORD Communication-Electronics instructions will be thoroughly reviewed and understood by all personnel participating in air support operations. Breakdowns in communications, particularly those involving air-ground units, can seriously jeopardize the outcome of an operation.

c. Damage assessment reports will be submitted by the supported unit to the Senior FSCC/DASC as soon as practicable following operations involving air support. Proper and prompt damage assessment information is vital in influencing and dictating future operations.

d. Post-action debriefing and critiques are vital and will include as many of the preaction briefing attendees as feasible. These post-action briefings do not obviate the requirement for written reports.

2. CLOSE AIR SUPPORT OPERATIONS

a. FAC's will conduct a reconnaissance of prospective target areas. Prior to the initiation of a CAS mission, pilots will be advised on all hazards to flight in the area and the minimum recovery altitude recommended.

b. In certain terrain situations, visibility forward of front lines may be restricted. In those situations, FAC's should consider the use of an observation aircraft. FAC(A)'s have proven quite successful.

c. Fixed wing aircraft, vice armed helicopters, will be requested to the maximum extent for landing zone preparatory fires, support of ground forces on the offense, and other suppressive fire requirements. Air support will be requested only if artillery or naval gunfire support are not available or tactically feasible.

3. ASST AND RADAR BEACONS

a. A large number of ASST drops (TQ-10's) are scheduled in the 5th Marines AO. The FACs also frequently employ the radar beacon. Battalions are encouraged to request TQ-10s and to continue to make beacon drops on lucrative targets in their AOs. Paragraph (b) explains a method of achieving greater accuracy in these air drops.

b. Inherent inaccuracies in maps and the difficulty in converting a target location to an accurate grid result in inefficient and sometimes ineffective use of air drops. An accurate target location can be obtained by utilizing artillery to adjust on the target and to report replot data. This replot data

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provides the FAC or ASST with an accurate eight place grid location of the target. The ASST enters this grid into its computer which provides much greater accuracy for their control drops. In the case of the FAC, he can use the grid obtained from artillery replot data to determine a direction and distance from his radar beacon to the target. The direct support artillery battalion can provide this direction and distance in miles and meters by entering the grid of the beacon location along with standard conversion factor are then used to convert the beacon/target bearing from miles to degrees and the distance from meters to feet.

4. HELICOPTERBORNE OPERATIONS.

a. Helicopterborne operations will be conducted in accordance with references (c) and (j) and specific operation orders.

b. Personnel accounting during helicopterborne operations will be conducted with maximum utilization of the helicopter team card. All personnel participating in helicopterborne operations will, whenever possible, be given a helicopter team card consisting of three parts, each part bearing the name, rank, serial number, organization, weight, and heli-team number of embarked personnel. One stub will be left with a responsible person at the pick-up zone until it is positively ascertained that all personnel are accounted for in the landing zone.

c. Helicopter landing zones are classified as either "safe" (ground troops standing up in zone) or "Hot". Helicopters will be called into landing zone only if the zone is safe. If a landing zone is "Hot", flak suppression fires (artillery, naval gunfire, air) must be utilized to sanitize the zone before helicopters are called in.

d. Normally, helicopter evacuation of casualties will be conducted at collection points not under enemy fire. Exceptions may be made as dictated by the situation.

e. Loading plans will be as flexible as possible in order to meet tactical requirements and to provide for unforeseen reductions in the supporting unit's lift capabilities due to unfavorable weather conditions, terrain, enemy action, and/or mechanical difficulties.

5. TACTICAL AIR MOVEMENTS. Tactical air movements involving other military services in support, Air Force area airlift forces or Military Air Command (MAC), will be conducted in accordance with references (k) and (l) and applicable joint services directives.

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SECTION VI

AIR DEFENSE

601. GENERAL

1. This section sets forth air defense (anti-air warfare defense) procedures which are applicable to all units and personnel under the control of the 5th Marines. It implements instructions contained in references (a) through (e).

2. Included in this section are warning procedures, and procedures to be followed in the preparation and conduct of defense against air attack. Measures for defense against nuclear attack are to be found in reference (f).

602. WARNING SIGNALS. The attack and alert warning signals set forth below are effective for combat operations.

603. WARNING PROCEDURES

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1. WARNING FROM HIGHER AUTHORITY

a. Upon receipt of warning from higher authority, the S-3 Watch Officer will disseminate the appropriate warning signal/alert condition to subordinate units by the most reliable and rapid means possible.

b. Subordinate commanders will assess the situation and in turn transmit the warning signal/alert condition to their subordinate units by the most expeditious means available.

2. AIR RAID WARNING MESSAGE. Warning messages will be issued in the following form and repeated at least three times:

- a. Originator
- b. "FLASH" "FLASH"
- c. Air Raid Alert Condition/Warning ("RED", "YELLOW", etc.)
- d. Local date/time group
- e. Area affected
- f. Number of aircraft (One A/C, Two A/C, Few A/C, Many A/C; etc.)
- g. "Acknowledge"

3. WARNING TO ROAD VEHICLES. Military police on traffic duty and personnel operating traffic check points will disseminate warning "RED". Vehicles will continue moving and increase normal interval to seventy-five yards. When warning "RED" occurs at night, blackout lights will be used and speed reduced to five miles per hour.

4. AIRCRAFT FLASH REPORT. Subordinate units sighting enemy or suspected enemy aircraft or who are being attacked by an enemy aircraft will:

a. Make an AIRCRAFT FLASH REPORT to Regiment by the most expeditious means available. This report will include originator's identification, time of sighting, location (grid coordinates), nature of the attack, number and type of aircraft, direction of flight and altitude.

b. Notify subordinate and adjacent units.

604. AIR DEFENSE MEASURES

1. ACTIVE AIR DEFENSE MEASURES. The landing force air defense system consists of the air and ground weapons sub-systems. The main element of these two sub-systems are the fighter aircraft and surface-to-air missile units. In addition, coordinated employment of active electronic counter measures (ECM) has a proper place in reducing the effectiveness of hostile air attack.

a. The primary active air defense systems in support of the 1st Marine

RegtO P3000.2

Division, including subordinate units, will be supplied by the Marine Aircraft Wing or task organized elements of the wing supporting Division operations.

b. Active air defense measures within the Division are limited to the employment of organic weapons against hostile aircraft. Regimental units will take under fire, only those aircraft which cannot be recognized as friendly, and are attacking friendly units or installations. Commanding Officers will control the employment of individual weapons against hostile aircraft attacking within range of such weapons.

2. PASSIVE DEFENSE MEASURES. Passive measures are designed to reduce the effects of hostile action. The importance of passive defensive means for minimizing the effects of hostile air action cannot be over emphasized. Passive measures fall within four broad categories; dispersion, shielding, damage control and deception. Passive air defense measures to be taken within the 5th Marines include, but are not limited to, the following:

a. DISPERSION. Dispersion of headquarters, supply installations, personnel and vehicles will be effected in order to minimize losses from any single air attack. Vehicles in convoy will maintain inter-vehicular distance of fifty yards minimum (unless there are overriding considerations) and employ air sentries. Provisional command groups will be prepared to operate from alternate command posts in the event normal command channels are rendered inoperative.

b. SHIELDING. Specific measures to be implemented will include the construction of shelters, fighting holes, revetments, trenches and the employment of personnel carriers. As feasible, command centers will be constructed for commanders and key staff members which will provide protection from all but direct hits by a conventional weapon.

c. DAMAGE CONTROL. Damage control measures will be preplanned and ready for application immediately following an air attack in order to prevent increased secondary effects. Specific measures include the designation and training of fire fighting teams, damage control teams, and damage assessment teams. Preparations must be made for early evacuation and medical aid. Provisions will be made for lateral communications between units, and plans will be developed to ensure restoration of communications as may be required. Immediately following an attack, determine and report the number of casualties, extent of damage, actions required to prevent further injury and damage, and actions required to restore combat effectiveness.

d. DECEPTION. Concealment, including camouflage, smoke, electro-magnetic emission control and illumination control are all measures designed to obscure or conceal the location or identity of a target from hostile visual, photographic and electronic observation. As the situation dictates, construction of dummy installations may be directed in order to cause the

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enemy to expend his air potential on fake targets. Within the 5th Marine Regiment, active and continuous camouflage measures will be practiced. The following provides guidance in regard to blackout discipline:

- (1) Normally a blackout line will be designated on all main supply routes within the Regimental area.
- (2) Complete blackout will be enforced forward of this line.
- (3) Limited blackout, to include only light required for the conduct of essential operations, will be practiced to the rear of this line.

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SECTION VII

CAMOUFLAGE

- Ref: (a) FM 5-20, Camouflage, Basic Principles and Field Camouflage
 (b) FM 5-21, Camouflage of Fixed Installations
 (c) FM 5-22, Camouflage Material

701. GENERAL. This section sets forth basic considerations for standard operating procedures concerning camouflage matters within this command. The camouflage security of our positions must be fully developed. It must be assumed that the enemy possesses the capability to observe our positions through normal ground and aerial observation. Detailed instructions are contained in references (a), (b), and (c).

702. PRINCIPLES OF CAMOUFLAGE. The three most important considerations in gaining concealment are; choice of position; camouflage discipline and construction.

1. CHOICE OF POSITION. The best choice is one where the background or natural cover absorbs the elements of the position with minimal changes. The terrain selected should accommodate the required layout installation, should, whenever possible, have concealed access routes and should avoid identifying landmarks. Complete concealment can often be gained solely by choice of position or by taking full advantage of natural cover and irregularities in the terrain.

2. CAMOUFLAGE DISCIPLINE. Camouflage discipline is the avoidance of activity which changes the appearance of an area to an extent that military objects can be identified by the enemy. Tracks, spoil, and debris are the most common violations of camouflage discipline. Light and sound considerations are also always important to camouflage discipline, particularly since potential enemy forces have a high altitude night photo capability.

3. CONSTRUCTION. When there is not enough material cover to conceal an installation, either natural or artificial materials must be used to supplement existing concealment.

a. Select natural materials which are similar to those at the site to insure naturalness in form and color. Do not denude the area around the position when gathering natural materials. The use of too much material conceals an area no better than too little.

b. Artificial materials must be capable of withstanding local weather conditions. They must be arranged to blend with their surroundings. As with natural materials, the use of artificial materials must be in balance with natural terrain.

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6. Camouflage is a continuous activity. An installation cannot be once camouflaged then forgotten. Seasonal changes and decay of natural materials require constant replacement.

703. CAMOUFLAGE METHODS. In conjunction with the three principles of camouflage, there are three fundamental ways of concealing installations and activities.

1. BLENDING. The object to be concealed by camouflage materials is so arranged that both the materials and the object seem part of the background without any changes in the natural appearance of the site.

2. HIDING. The identity of an activity or object is concealed with a screen, even though the screen itself may sometimes be seen. The aim is to prevent disclosure of the object by denying the enemy unrestricted observation.

3. DECEIVING. Consists of simulating objects or activities of military significance; or disguising them to appear to be of non-military significance. The aim is to deceive the enemy as to the identity, strength, intention, and degree of activity in the area.

704. RESPONSIBILITIES. The responsibility to ensure effective camouflage lies with both the individual and unit command. The business of concealment, camouflage construction and camouflage discipline is as much the normal business of a Marine as is firing the rifle. The unit commander is responsible for all camouflage matters within his command. This responsibility includes detailed instruction and training in position selection, camouflage discipline and the effective employment of materials and construction methods for concealment.

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SECTION VIII

DISABLEMENT AND DESTRUCTION OF MATERIAL

801. GENERAL

1. During the normal course of combat operations, there is always the possibility of material, including both equipment and supplies, falling into enemy hands. When the personnel attending such equipment are in danger of being captured by the enemy, every effort must be made to evacuate the personnel and render the material useless. Action may be taken merely to disable the material temporarily pending its recovery by friendly forces. When recovery is not feasible, it may be necessary to completely destroy the material to prevent its capture and use by the enemy.

2. It is the purpose of this section to establish a procedure for the above instances of disablement or destruction in this command.

3. Detailed information on disablement or destruction of materials are contained in appropriate Department of the Navy, Marine Corps and Department of the Army publications and directives.

802. DEFINITIONS

1. To disable material means to render the material immediately inoperative to the enemy. This action is taken primarily to permit the temporary evacuation of the personnel attending such material and permit the rapid recovery of the material and subsequent restoration to full operational readiness by friendly forces.

2. Destruction of material involves rendering all major components of the material useless to the enemy.

803. RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Disablement of material may be ordered by the immediate commander of the material without reference to any agency when in his opinion the circumstances warrant.

2. Destruction of material may be accomplished only on the following authority:

a. Infantry Battalion Commanding Officer.

b. When the immediate commander on the scene considers the situation as an extreme emergency. An "extreme" emergency may be considered to exist

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if the following conditions apply:

(1) Material is in imminent danger of falling into enemy hands and evacuation of such material is not possible.

(2) Defense of the material will result in probable death or capture of the man attending the material.

(3) The person responsible for the material involved has made every effort possible to contact his commander, and the loss of the material and/or the personnel responsible for the material is imminent

c. Specific instructions for the disablement and destruction of critical material will be promulgated in unit directives. Unit commanders will ensure knowledge of this subject through continuous training.

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SECTION IX

CONDUCT OF MOTOR TRANSPORT CONVOYS IN A GUERRILLA WARFARE ENVIRONMENT

901. GENERAL. Unusual transportation problems must be considered in providing transportation support to combat units in counter guerrilla operations. These problems arise primarily because of the large size of the operational areas, the difficult and underdeveloped nature of the area, and the lack of secure ground lines of communication.

902. BACKGROUND. Movement of troops or equipment in direct support of counter guerrilla operations may be made by organic transport, by vehicles of assigned or attached truck units, or by vehicles of transportation truck units committed on a mission basis.

903. DISCUSSION. Because of the pervasiveness of the enemy, special escort attachments may not be available to secure all motor movements; therefore, all convoys must be prepared to secure themselves. When a maneuver unit is designated to provide escort for a vehicle convoy, elements of the unit should provide escort through their respective areas of responsibility. Reconnaissance of the route immediately prior to the passage of the convoy is desirable. When a single unit is to provide escort through several units' areas of responsibility, close coordination must be achieved with those units to insure adequate fire support and availability of reinforcement from local units during passage of the convoy.

904. COUNTER-AMBUSH PROCEDURE. Since there seldom will be time for the issuance of orders after an ambush is discovered, the actions of the convoy and the security detachment are planned and when possible, rehearsed by drills prior to the commencement of the movement.

905. CONCEPT OF EMPLOYMENT. Attack upon the convoy will probably be initiated by a command detonated mine accompanied by a high volume of small arms fire from mid-range positions that afford the attackers excellent concealment. In case of a mandatory halt such as described above, the security elements and vehicle operators located in the killing zone will return fire immediately, thus establishing a base of fire. This security element should disembark only if the convoy cannot proceed. When this occurs command will shift from the convoy commander to security commander. Upon deployment of the entire security element, a reserve will be reconstituted from available driver, mechanic, and passenger personnel under the command of the senior officer present.

a. The first convoy control element, including the ~~convoy~~ and assistant convoy commander, discovering the attack will immediately advise the convoy commander. The convoy commander will be provided immediate information by the AO and supporting arms representatives as to respective capabilities to effectively direct supporting arms from their current positions.

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b. All vehicles caught in the killing zone of an ambush initially will attempt to drive through the ambush site if at all possible while troops embarked return maximum fire.

c. Once the convoy comes under attack and has to halt due to a road block, mined vehicle, etc., deployment of security personnel will be as directed by the security commander. Under no circumstances will the driver/assistant driver/gunner leave the area of his designated vehicle. The .50 caliber machine gun will be manned continuously in laying a heavy volume of fire on the ambush force.

d. Vehicles that arrive at, but have not entered the killing zone, will stop. Gunners will man their guns assisted by the driver. Other drivers and assistant drivers will dismount and take up defensive positions in the immediate vicinity of their vehicles.

e. .50 caliber machine gunners will ascertain that no friendly enveloping forces are in the fields of fire before any rounds are fired.

f. Enveloping personnel and local vehicles security personnel must be alert for anti-personnel mines and booby traps as they dismount from vehicles.

g. Vehicles which have passed through the killing zone of an ambush and have become separated from the remainder of the convoy will proceed a distance from the ambush site and stop. Personnel aboard these vehicles will immediately set up a defensive perimeter. Overall command will be the responsibility of the senior infantry/security man present. If no additional security other than drivers/assistant drivers are present, the senior Marine will assume command of the defenses and contact the convoy commander in the most expedient way possible.

906. HARDENING OF VEHICLES. Requirements for the hardening of 5th Marines vehicles traveling outside of the Danang Secure Area is specified in Installation Coordinator Instruction 11240.2.

907. TRAINING

a. Training in convoy organization, embarkation, and protection will be incorporated into officer/SNCO training programs for all subordinate units. Requests for instructor assistance will be forwarded to this Headquarters (Attn: S-4).

b. Procedures for driver training, testing and operators permits are contained in Regimental Order P11240.1.

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SECTION X

COMMAND POST DISPLACEMENT

Ref: (a) FFM 6-2 Marine Infantry Regiment
 (b) FFM 3-1 Command and Staff Action

1001. CONCEPT FOR DISPLACEMENT OF THE REGIMENTAL COMMAND POST

1. DEFINITIONS. A displacement of the Regimental Command Post will be determined forward, temporary or permanent.

a. Forward Command Post involves the immediate moving, without advance notice, of the Regimental Commander and selected members of his staff to co-locate for a brief period of time with an infantry battalion command post. The Regimental Command Group will afford effective control of one or more infantry battalions and coordination with other Free World Forces if they are participating.

b. Temporary Displacement of the Regimental Command Post involves moving, for a brief period of time, the Regimental Commander and sufficient members of his staff to afford effective control of one or more infantry battalions and to effect coordination with other Free World Forces if they are participating.

c. A Permanent Displacement involves the movement of the entire Regimental Staff and Headquarters Company from one location to another, either within or outside the current AO.

2. CONCEPT FOR THE FORWARD COMMAND POST. Upon determination by the Regimental Commander that the Forward Command Post will be established, members of his staff will immediately accomplish the following tasks and be prepared to displace within 60 minutes of notification:

a. All sections will complete and submit appendix (A) and (B) as soon as possible to the Headquarters Commandant.

b. S-3 will notify the infantry battalion of the intended collocation, estimated time of arrival, and approximate size of the Forward Command Post Party.

c. ALO will request the necessary helicopters to effect the displacement, if required.

d. Headquarters Commandant will:

(1) Provide adequate security for the Forward Command Post.

(2) Provide ALO with the number of personnel and weight and cube of

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supplies and equipment.

(3) Provide adequate tentage for the Forward Command Post.

c. Communications Officer will provide adequate communications means to provide for communications to Regimental Rear.

3. CONCEPT FOR TEMPORARY DISPLACEMENT. Activation of the Regimental staff for a temporary displacement will be made by the Regimental Commander. The location of the Regimental Command Post will be prescribed by the Regimental Commander based upon the recommendation of his S-1, S-3, and Communications Officer. The displacement will consist of two phases of movement for two groups of personnel as defined below:

a. Group I is the Advance Party and consists of personnel required to establish the basic facilities of a Regimental Command Post. The Advance Party consists of the S-1, Communications Officer, Headquarters Commandant, representative of the S-4, elements of the Security Platoon, and an advance communications element. The duties and responsibilities of the members of the Advance Party are contained in Chapter I, Section III of reference (a) and Chapter 3, Section I of reference (b).

b. Group II is termed Command Group "Alpha". This group consists of the Regimental Commander and selected members of his staff. Command Group "Alpha" moves when the new Command Post is reported operational and on order of the Commanding Officer.

4. CONCEPT FOR PERMANENT DISPLACEMENT. A permanent displacement will be effected in four phases, moving four groups of personnel, equipment, and supplies.

a. The Regimental Headquarters personnel, including equipment and supplies will be formed into four groups as follows:

(1) Group I is the Advance Party consisting of personnel as indicated in paragraph 1001.3a and equipment to establish the basic facilities of a Regimental Command Post. Duties and responsibilities of these individuals are as indicated in paragraph 1001.3a.

(2) Group II is termed Command Group "Alpha". This group consists of the Regimental Commander and those members of his staff as designated. This group will provide control and coordination of one or more infantry battalions and supporting units assigned. Command Group "Alpha" will displace when the new Command Post site is reported operational and on order of the Commanding Officer. If required, Command Group "Bravo" will assume command and control of the Regiment during the period Command Group "Alpha" is in transit.

(3) Group III is termed Command Group "Bravo" and consists of the Regimental Executive Officer and the remainder of the Regimental Headquarters, excluding those personnel to be employed in the closing party. Command Group "Bravo" will displace to the new Command Post on order. Upon arrival, it will assist Group I, Advance Party, in the rapid completion of the Command Post.

(4) Group IV, Closing Party, consists of a designated Officer-in-Charge and all remaining personnel of Headquarters Company not included in Group I, II, or III. The Supply Officer or Assistant S-4 will normally be designated as the Officer-in-Charge. Group IV, will displace to the new Command Post when facilities and the tactical situation permit. The Officer-in-Charge will, after all remaining personnel, supplies and equipment have been loaded, and prior to closing the old Command Post conduct an inspection of the entire area to insure a proper state of police.

a. Headquarters Company and the Battalions will send replacements to the Regimental classroom the day following their arrival for subject training.

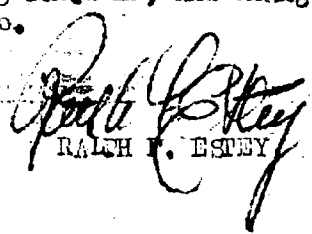
b. Each Battalion will appoint one training NCO, who will assist the Regimental S-3 in carrying out subject training.

Subj: Preparation for High Threat period 27 April - 10 May 1970

1. Purpose. To emphasize preparation for the forthcoming high threat period.

2. Background. Current intelligence reports indicate that the enemy will initiate limited offensive actions on FVMAF fixed installations during the period 27 April - 10 May 1970. An Hoa Combat Base is expected to receive mortar and rocket stand-off fire as well as ground attacks supported by mortars.

3. Action

a. Sector Commanders will accomplish the following actions by 2000H, 27 April 1970:

(1) Inspect ammunition supplies located in storage bunkers to determine adequacy of on-hand stock.

(2) Inspect protective wire and fighting positions. Replace/reinforce broken or weakened wire.

(3) Inspect the lay of automatic weapons to ensure that the maximum range of each weapon is acquired. Particular emphasis is to be placed on interlocking fields of fire. Ensure that each automatic rifle has its direction of fire defined by limit stakes in the event final protective fires become necessary.

(4) Inspect and ensure that all communication systems are operating properly.

(5) Conduct reaction drills and be prepared to participate in alert and reaction drills (announced and unannounced) initiated by the Installation Coordinator. Ensure that all personnel are aware of their duties and responsibilities during these drills.
