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PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

From 1 May to 21 May 1969 the First Battalion, Fifth Marines conducted offensive operations in the area adjacent to the Liberty Bridge cantonment. These operations were generally company size search and clear missions. In addition during this period the Battalion provided security for Liberty Bridge and conducted defensive operations of the cantonment at Phu Lan (6) and provided security for movement of friendly convoys. On 22 May 1969 the First Battalion was assigned the Arizona Area as their new Area of Operations. During a three day period, the Battalion moved by motor and foot march into the new AO and spent the remainder of the month in offensive operations to seek and destroy or capture all enemy personnel and material located within the AO.

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PART III

SEQUENTIAL LISTINGS OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTSA. TOPICS1. PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION

a. Strength. The Battalion's strength at the beginning of the month was 37 officers and 1142 enlisted. On the 15th of May, the strength had changed to 36 officers and 1132 enlisted. By the end of May, the strength was 35 officers and 1126 enlisted. At this time, there are 72 enlisted hospitalized. Joinings during the month were 1 officer and 149 enlisted.

b. Discipline, Law and Legal. 1 Special Court-Martial was convened during May. There is 1 CID investigation pending.

c. POW/Detainees. There were 81 detainees processed during the month.

d. Morale. Morale and fighting spirit continued to be excellent. Personnel who captured POW's received in-country R&R.

e. Postal. Postal service continued at the same degree of excellence.

f. Awards. During the month there were 4 Silver Stars, 11 Bronze Stars, 4 Navy Commendations, 1 Legion of Merit Medal and 18 Navy Achievements submitted for heroism and meritorious service.

g. Interior Management. Administrative procedures and proficiency continued to be excellent.

2. ENEMY, WEATHER AND TERRAIN

a. Enemy. During this reporting period, the enemy continued his probing and harrassing tactics with a limited offensive attack occurring at 2315, on 12 May 1969, in which he conducted a sapper assault supported by flames and rockets upon the Battalion CP/fire base at Phu Lac (6). This action resulted in 15 NVA KIA and 1 NVA POW along with numerous individual and crew served weapons captured. A continued decrease in the number of mine and booby trap incidents during this period was noted.

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b. Weather. During this period the weather was warm to hot during daylight hours and mild to cool at night.

c. Terrain. No change.

3. ORGANIZATION AND OPERATIONS

a. Organization. The organization of the Battalion consisted of the following units being detached from and other units under the operational control of the 1st Battalion during the following periods:

- (1) Company D, 1st Battalion, 5th Marines OPCON to 5th Marines from April through 081600H May 1969.
- (2) Company B, 1st Battalion, 5th Marines OPCON to 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines from 211600H to 221800H May 1969.
- (3) Company D, 1st Battalion, 5th Marines OPCON to 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines from 221800H to 251300H May 1969.
- (4) Company C, 1st Battalion, 5th Marines OPCON to 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines from 221800H to 231300H May 1969.
- (5) Company D, 1st Battalion, 5th Marines OPCON to 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines from 251300H May 1969 into the month of June 1969.
- (6) Company M, 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines OPCON to 1st Battalion, 5th Marines from 021000H to 061530H May 1969.
- (7) Company K, 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines OPCON to 1st Battalion, 5th Marines from 091715H to 121700H May 1969.
- (8) Companies F and G, 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines OPCON to 1st Battalion, 5th Marines from 221800H to 231600H May 1969.

b. Operations. Unnamed operations were run from 010001H - 221200H May 1969 in the eastern part of Duc Duc and Duy Xuyen District, Quang Nam Province of RVN. They were routine search and clear operations. From 221200H - 312400H May 1969, the Battalion was on search and destroy operations in the Arizona Territory. These operations in Arizona Territory continued into the month of June.

c. Supporting Arms

(1) Air. The Battalion continued to receive outstanding air support from both 1st MAW and USAF Squadrons. Although fixed wing support was slightly diminished toward the end of the month due to move from a fixed base to the field and a subsequent breakdown of the A-6 radar beacon, the overall level of support remained high and is expected to return to its normal level upon receipt of a functioning beacon. A detailed breakdown of air support rendered during the month follows:

(a) Fixed Wing. A total of 136 flights of fixed wing were flown in support of this Battalion. 32 TACA aircraft provided 43.2 hours of direct support. The Battalion received 15.0 hours of illumination from nine "Basketball" flareships and five

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"Spooky" gunships provided 7.3 hours of target coverage. The remainder of the fixed wing support consisted of; ground MAC controlled F-4's, A-4's and A-6's; A-6 beacon flights; and USAF F-4 "Night Owls". BDA was available for all but 21 of these flights, and a breakdown follows:

(2) Artillery: During the period 1 May to 31 May accurate, timely, and massive fire support was provided by D Battery 2/11, F Battery 2/11, E Battery 2/11 and A Battery 4/13. During this period a total of 5,726 rounds were fired in a total of 226 missions in support of 1/5. Surveillance is as follows:

D Battery 2/11 was in direct support of 1/5 from 1 May until 23 May when the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines relocated to a new AO. From 23 May until 31 May the Battalion received fires from the remaining batteries. The low correlation between surveillance and number of missions fired/rounds expended is due to the fact that 53 of the above missions were fired on S-2 targets with negative surveillance and the artillery fires were used extensively on preparation fires and surprise-firing device clearing missions.

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(3) Engineers. Excellent support was again provided by Company B, 1st Engineer Battalion. Engineers were employed primarily to destroy duds, booby traps, captured enemy ammunition, enemy bunkers/fortifications and to conduct daily mine sweeps of the road networks in the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines AO. Numerous mines and booby traps were detected by visual sightings and mine detecting equipment. Loss of lives, wheeled and tracked equipment was considerably reduced by the detailed searching efforts employed by the engineers.

(4) Shore Party (HST). HST's were provided by Company B, 1st Shore Party Battalion. These teams provided satisfactory support in coordinating and effecting helicopter resupply and Med-Evacs.

(5) Amtracs. A light section of the 4th Platoon, Company A, 3rd Amtrac Battalion was in direct support of the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines during this period. The LVT's provided excellent support in transporting troops and in providing security for convoys between An Hoa and Liberty Bridge.

(6) Tanks. A light section of the 2nd Platoon, Company B, 1st Tank Battalion was in direct support of the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines. Excellent results were achieved by using the tanks to support the daily MSR mine sweeps, providing direct fire support to the daytime OP's and were also used extensively as convoy security between An Hoa and Liberty Bridge, and at night were employed into the defensive networks of Liberty Bridge.

(7) Scout Snipers. Detachment Scout Sniper Platoon, Headquarters Company, 5th Marines continued to provide outstanding support for the Battalion, which resulted in 26 enemy kills during the month.

b. All companies during their period of bridge defense continued to have instructions and familiarization firing of all individual and crew served weapons, including the LAAW-72, hand grenades and claymore mines.

c. Replacement personnel received five (5) days training at 5th Marines Headquarters prior to being committed to the field.

d. The Battalion continued to utilize schools provided by higher schools in the DaNang area and Okinawa.

5. LOGISTICS. No serious problems have occurred during this period to impair the logistical support of the Battalion.

6. CIVIC ACTION. During the reporting period the Battalion assisted the people of My Loc (2) (915515) and the people of the Phu Da's (1 & 2) (868491 & 871481).

Personal sanitation was the primary objective in the My Loc (2) hamlet with emphasis on drinking and cooking water, bathing, and care of the water in wells. A total of 17 civilians were treated by corpsmen for illnesses. In the Phu Da (1 & 2) area three CARE tool kits and two boxes of toys were distributed to refugees. A total of 14 refugees from Loc Son hamlets were resettled in New Life Hamlet Tan My (874478). A serious incident occurred on 230700 May 1969 when 4 81mm mortar rounds exploded in Phu Da (1) hamlet (868491). The cause of the accident was a sight deflection error. One PF was killed; one child was killed; one Vietnamese woman was slightly injured and 2 Vietnamese children were slightly injured. There was also some injuries to live stock.

7. PSYCHOLOGICAL OPERATIONS. During the reporting period the Battalion has received little intelligence information from the elders. All intelligence information has been passed on to Battalion S-2 and counter-intelligence. The S-5 section has obtained a series of airdrop leaflets, hand bills and aerial broadcast tapes which are at the disposal of this Battalion.

The attitude of the people toward this Battalion remains in excellent standing.

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8. COMMUNICATIONS. During the month of May, communications were maintained in a satisfactory manner. No significant problems were encountered. In mid-May, the Battalion CP went into the field in the area of Football Island; communications were satisfactory. The entire Battalion moved from Phu Lac 6 area into the Arizona area. This was accomplished smoothly and excellent communications have been maintained throughout.
