NARRATIVE SUMMARY

From 1-31 August 1969 the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines participated in defensive operations in the area adjacent to Liberty Bridge cantonment. The Battalion supplied security for Liberty Bridge and provided security for friendly convoy movement along Liberty Road.

PART III

SEQUENTIAL LISTINGS OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTSA. TOPICS1. PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION

a. Strength. The Battalion's strength at the beginning of the month was 36 officers and 1122 enlisted. On 15 August, the strength had changed to 33 officers and 1105 enlisted. By the end of August, the strength was 33 officers and 1058 enlisted. At this time, there are no officers and 27 enlisted hospitalized. Joinings during the month were 3 officers and 33 enlisted.

b. Discipline, Law and Legal. 4 Summary Courts-Martial and 1 Special Court-Martial were convened during August. There are 1 Summary Court-Martial and 3 Special Courts-Martial still to be processed. During August, 5 informal investigations were completed. There are 5 informal investigations pending.

c. POW/Detainees. There were 12 detainees processed during this month. They were classed as follows:

d. Morale. Morale and fighting spirit continued to be excellent.

e. Postal. Postal service continued at the same degree of excellence.

f. Awards. During August, there were 3 Silver Stars, 27 Navy Commendations, and 42 Navy Achievements submitted for heroism and meritorious service.

g. Interior Management. Administrative procedures and proficiency continued to be excellent.

2. ENEMY, WEATHER AND TERRAIN

a. Enemy. This month there was an increase of contacts made with small groups of NVA/VC in the An Hoa Valley and the northern section of the AO. There has also been a significant increase of enemy utilization of crossing points along the river.

The level of SFD's has stayed about the same along the MSR with the heaviest concentration at (AT909505).

There has been a noticeable increase in other sophisticated trip wire devices, however many mortar rounds have been ~~detonated~~ or found prior to detonation with a pressure type device. Box-mines and larger ordnances, such as 105mm rounds have been found buried with a below ground-level trip-wire.

b. Weather. During the month of August the weather was typified by both high temperature and high humidity. There was no rain activity but there were periods of intense gusty winds.

c. Terrain. The An Hoa Valley consists mostly of active rice paddies with intermittent high ground. A dry condition prevails over the area.

3. ORGANIZATION AND OPERATIONS

a. Organization. The organization of the Battalion consisted of the following units being detached from the 1st Battalion and other units under the operational control of the 1st Battalion during the following periods:

(1) Company D, 1st Battalion, 5th Marines OPCON to 5th Marines from 170800H July 1969 to 140800H August 1969.

(2) Company A, 1st Battalion, 5th Marines OPCON to 5th Marines from 140800H to 292400H August 1969.

(3) One platoon of Company A, 1st Battalion, 5th Marines OPCON to III MAF from 161330H July 1969 to 121530H August 1969.

b. Operations. 1st Battalion, 5th Marines from 1-31 August 1969, participated in unnamed operations in the Liberty Bridge area to seek out and destroy and capture enemy forces, weapons, materials and positions as well as search and protect the area for US and ARVN installations. Also provided security for two unnamed ARVN operations.

~~SECRET~~c. Supporting Arms

(1) Air. During the month of August, the Battalion continued its policy of utilizing air support to the fullest possible extent. The resultant increased fire power contributed greatly to the success enjoyed by the Battalion in its present mission. A resume of air support provided follows:

(a) Fixed Wing. Fixed wing support for the month of August falls into three basic categories, i.e., Tactical Jets, AC-47's and TAC(A)'s. Twenty-four (24) "Hostage" tactical air controllers (Airborne) provided the Battalion with 24.1 hours on station in their mission of visual reconnaissance and fixed wing controllers. During an intensive ground attack, on the night of 31 August 1969, a "Spooky" AC-47 gunship delivered close-in devastating suppressive fires continually for 1.5 hours.

Three hundred and forty-two (342) jets, conducting day and night close air support and A-6 "Beacon" strikes, dropped 806.30 tons of ordnance on enemy positions. The bomb damage assessment attributed to these flights is summarized below.

(b) Rotary Wing. Helicopters were employed extensively for visual reconnaissance missions. There were also forty-one (41) med-evacs as reflected below:

(c) Significant Development. Coordinating closely with artillery, air strikes were made an integral part of interdiction fires as well as close in destructive fires. The A-6 "Beacon" strikes were found extremely effective in delivering massive fire power to remote targets. The Battalions constant and effective employment of air strikes served this command in good stead. In times of need, extra flights of air were diverted from other missions for our use.

(2) Artillery. During the month of August 1969 the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines received direct support and general support from the 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines. Direct support from D Battery from 1 August to 14 August, and general support from the 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines from 14 August to 31 August 1969. Some high points during the month were large enemy troop movements and grid situations by regiment within 1st Battalion, 5th Marines AO.

The exact number of rounds expended within 1st Battalion, 5th Marines AO by regiment would most likely double the total number of rounds fired by 1st Battalion, 5th Marines for the month of August. There was a total of 320 fire missions, 26 of which were contact missions, expending 12,934 HE rounds, 885 WP rounds and 346 illumination rounds. Included within the total number of HE rounds fired are H&I which accounted for 5,997 of the rounds fired. Surveillance is as follows:

(3) Engineers. Excellent support was again provided by Company B, 1st Engineer Battalion. Engineers were employed primarily to destroy roads, SED's, captured enemy ammunition, enemy bunkers and fortifications. Loss of lives, wheeled and tracked equipment was considerably reduced by the detailed searching efforts employed by the engineers.

(4) Shore Party (HST). HST's were provided by Company B, 1st Shore Party Battalion. These teams provided outstanding support in coordinating and effecting helicopter resupply and Med-Evacs.

(5) Amtrac. A light section of the 4th Platoon, Company A, 3rd Amtrac Battalion was in direct support of the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines. The LVT's provided excellent support in transporting troops and providing security for convoys between An Hoa and Liberty Bridge.

(6) Tanks. A light section of the 2nd Platoon, Company B, 1st Tank Battalion was in direct support of the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines. Excellent results were achieved by using tanks to support the daily MSR mine sweeps, providing direct fire support to the daytime OP's and were also used extensively as convoy security between An Hoa and Liberty Bridge, and at night were employed in the defensive networks of Liberty Bridge.

(7) Scout Snipers. Detachment Scout Sniper Platoon, Headquarters Company, 5th Marines continued to provide outstanding support for the Battalion, which resulted in 8 enemy kills during the month.

b. All companies during their period of bridge defense continued to have instructions and familiarization firing of all individual and crew served weapons, including the M-72 LAAW, hand grenades and claymore mines.

c. Replacement personnel received five (5) days training at 5th Marines Headquarters prior to being committed to the field.

d. The Battalion continued to utilize schools provided by higher headquarters in the DaNang area and Okinawa. During the month, 88 members of the Battalion attended schools in the DaNang area and Okinawa. The value of the schools is recognized; however, this had an adverse effect on the rifle company in the field strength.

5. LOGISTICS. Logistical efforts of the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines was accomplished by utilization of 11th Motor Transport Trucks for daily convoys to An Hoa which after off-loading returned to DaNang.

Requirements for 81mm ammunition and 106mm ammunition were met by coordination between LSU at An Hoa with ASP and 11th Motors in DaNang. The ammunition was dropped off at Phu Lac (6) before proceeding to An Hoa. Report requirements continue to be met in a timely, accurate and proficient manner.

6. CIVIC ACTION. During the reporting period the Battalion has worked with the people from Loc Hung hamlet and the Phu Lac area.

A total of 1,044 ammunition boxes were distributed to the Loc Hung hamlet for the purpose of building and/or repairing homes.

In preparation for a national holiday 12 Vietnamese men were allowed to fish the small lakes while 8 men harvested the lotus blossoms in the area. Operation plans are being processed for control of the people to be moved into New Life Hamlet. Progress is slowly being achieved.

7. PSYCHOLOGICAL OPERATIONS. During the reporting period the Battalion has received little intelligence information from the elders. All intelligence information has been passed on to Battalion S-2 and Counter-intelligence sections.

The attitude of the people toward this Battalion remains in excellent standing.

8. COMMUNICATIONS. During the month of August, the Battalion implemented a new code/authentication system on a test basis. Twenty-four (24) hours of instruction were used to ensure proper application of the code, and preliminary reports were satisfactory.

At the forward command post, two radio remoting devices were installed to protect radios and increase flexibility of communications.

An RT-524 was added to the radio shelf at the forward combat operations center; this radio, compatible with, but more powerful than the PRC-25, enables the Battalion to override several types of interference and reach distant stations.

Security measures in the message center were revised with the addition of warning signs, five (5) new sections of protective wire, and a rebuilt blast wall.

Communications in the Battalion remain at a high level of efficiency and readiness.
