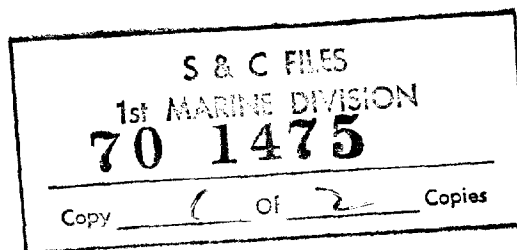

2. LOCATIONS. During the month of April the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines operated in the DaNang Southern Sector Defense Command and throughout the Division MAOR on Pacific Operations. The responsibilities of the Battalion required it to maintain units of various sizes in several different locations.

M&S Company, the Battalion CP, and one Rifle Platoon remained at the 1/5 cantonment (AF996726) until 27 April 1970. On 27 April, they moved to Hill 34 (AF989709). Their responsibilities consisted of cantonment security and upkeep of the Battalion.

One rifle company was maintained in the northern SSDC AO (AF920760) to prevent infiltration by the enemy into the DaNang vital area.

Two platoons operated throughout the month in the south-central portion of the SSDC AO (AF940720). This prevented enemy infiltration into the DaNang vital area from the south and the southwest.

A reinforced platoon was located at Can Do Bridge (AF998706) and another at Cobb Bridge (AF945704). They provided security for the two bridges.

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A platoon remained at the 1/5 cantonment (JG996726) for counterent security from 27-30 April 1970.

Delta Company was OPCON to 2/1 from 1-2 April for operations south of Marble Mountain.

One platoon Delta Company CPUCOM to 2/5 from 9-10 April for operations in the Arizona.

Bravo Company was CPUCOM to 2/5 from 5-16 April at Go Noi Island.

Alpha Company OPCOM to 2/7 from 24-25 April for operations north of the Son District Headquarters.

is in the previous month, 1st Battalion, 5th Marines activities in the north of April centered around the Pacific Operations. April's Pacific Operations generally went smoother than those of the previous month because many areas of coordination had been improved. Troops became more familiar with helicopter operations and with more rapid direction orientation. Coordination problems involving supporting arms were generally improved.

The month of April also brought about another move for the Battalion. This move involved moving the Battalion's CP from the 1st Tanks Cantonment to Hill 34. As a result of a tremendous effort on everyone's part, this move was successfully completed in approximately eight days, and the 1st Tanks Cantonment was ready to be turned over to Quang Da Special Zone, at some future date, an evidence of the Vietnamization process. One platoon from Bravo Company continued to maintain security of the 1st Tanks Cantonment until such time as Quang Da Special Zone actually take over the occupancy of the Cantonment. Renovation of the Battalion's new Cantonment area was begun immediately; and, although this renovation has not been completed as of yet, progress is being made daily.

Additional evidence of the Vietnamization process was seen on April 15th, when one platoon from the 379th Regional Forces Company, and one platoon from the 153rd Provisional Forces Company, Hien Duc District, began training in bridge security for the eventual assumption, about 1 May, of the responsibility for the security of Cobb Bridge.

The Battalion continued to send one platoon a week through a refresher training program and made maximum use of the Division Schools Training Team. With the large turnover in personnel in recent months, this training is necessary in order to maintain the unit's combat readiness and effectiveness.

Charlie Company continued to maintain a platoon on Cobb Bridge and Can Do Bridge, and another platoon working in the central part of the 350C's AC, until April 18th, when they were sent to An Hoa to become the 5th Lanes base defense augmentation company from 18-30 April. They were replaced on the bridges and in the central part of the AC by Bravo Company. Alpha Company and Delta Company continued to run the Pacific Operations and maintain security for the Dai La Pass Cantonment as well as operate with two platoons within the northern part of the 350C's AC.

April 1st saw Delta Company take part in a very profitable operation. The company was chopped CROCK to 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines for night-time operations in the rocket belt southwest of Marble Mountain. The operations proved valuable by displaying the feasibility of being able to reconstitute the Pacific Company from the field and insert it into a new area with a different mission without difficulty.

On the same day Bravo Company also conducted a Pacific Operation and one platoon was inserted into the abundant rice paddies south of Sherwood Forest. The unit deployed on line with two squads sweeping west and one squad sweeping north. The results were that four 140mm rockets and two launch

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sites were located along with two 500 lb. bombs, one 4.2 inch mortar round, and one 105mm projectile. The sweep also resulted in one enemy KIA.

From 5-16 April, Bravo Company participated in operations on Co Noi Island under the operational control of 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines. Two significant actions resulted in a total of 15 NVA/VC killed and five packs containing numerous medical supplies, clothing and documents along with several ChiCom grenades were captured.

The next successful Pacifier Operation commenced on April 6th. The operation commenced with an artillery prep and air strike on LZ in the vicinity of My Hiep (2). The air strike caused three secondary explosions believed to be booby traps. The 3rd Platoon, Delta Company was inserted in the LZ and formed up on line sweeping east to the Song Vu Gia. Small arms fire was received and several fleeing enemy were spotted from the air in a heavily bunkered area in the vicinity of O Gia. An air strike was conducted and Cobra gunships fired on board ordnance. The 2nd Platoon, Delta Company was inserted in the vicinity of My Phu and swept southwest. The operation resulted in three enemy killed, two packs, 200 AK-47 rounds, and assorted demolition gear captured.

On April 9th, Delta Company ran another successful Pacifier Operation. The 2nd Platoon was inserted into a LZ in the vicinity of Chau Phong. The platoon swept southeast with apparently negative results. However, while the command aircraft was investigating an area in advance of the sweep, six enemy were seen attempting to cross the river north of Alligator Lake. The aircraft made a low pass and the enemy were seen attempting to hide their packs at the river's edge. Cobra gunships delivered on board ordnance killing three enemy and wounding one. The 1st Platoon was landed in the vicinity of An Tam and the platoon swept south. The 2nd Platoon was landed in the vicinity of Le Nam and swept east and then south along the river. The wounded enemy was killed by small arms attempting to flee. Four or five additional enemy were spotted to the southeast. Cobra gunships again delivered on board ordnance killing two enemy. Packs, miscellaneous clothing, and NVA documents were captured.

On April 15th, Alpha Company assumed the role of the Pacifier Company and Pacifier Operations were continued throughout the Division's TAOR investigating possible rocket sites, caches, harbor sites, or responding to various tactical situations.

The Pacifier Operation of April 29th resulted in eleven enemy killed. The LZ in the vicinity of Phu Nam Tay was prepped by an air strike. While commencing insertion of 1st Platoon, Alpha Company, Recon OP West Orange reported spotting twenty-five enemy east of Alligator Lake. The 7th Marines were contacted about the target and when the enemy was seen moving along an old railroad berm, the 5th Marines were contacted and they confirmed that no friendly troops were in the area. Cobra gunships then delivered on board ordnance on the enemy killing ten. One platoon from Alpha Company was landed in a LZ vicinity Railroad Trestle near the Cay Khe Vinh Trinh River and commenced sweeping west. Small arms fire was exchanged resulting in one enemy killed. One M-60 machine gun, and one M-16 rifle, ammunition, ChiCom grenades, medical gear, and miscellaneous documents were captured. This operation proved to be the most successful Pacifier Operation of the month.

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PART III

SEMI-MONTHLY LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

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A. TOPICS

a. Strength. The Battalion's strength at the beginning of the month was 50 officers and 1207 enlisted. On the 15th of the month, the strength had changed to 46 officers and 1251 enlisted. By the end of the month, the strength was 49 officers and 1252 enlisted. At this time there are 17 enlisted men hospitalized.

b. Discipline, Law and Legal. 3 Summary Courts-Martial, 3 Special Courts-Martial were convened during April. During the same period, 22 Battalion and 18 Company Office Hours (NJP) were held. There were 2 investigations completed and 1 is still pending.

c. POW/Detainees. There were no detainees processed during this month.

d. Morale. Morale and fighting spirit continued to be excellent.

e. Postal. Postal service continued at the same degree of excellence.

f. Awards. During the month of April, there were 24 Navy Achievement medals, 13 Navy Commendation medals, 9 Bronze Star medals submitted for heroism and meritorious service.

2. ENEMY, WEATHER, AND TERRAIN

a. Enemy. Enemy activity in the SSBC was at a low level during the month of April with one booby trap found vicinity (AT949723). On 14 April, Hoa Cam Training Center received 3-122mm rockets. (Note. See current situation reports and intelligence summaries for Pacific Operations regarding enemy elements, contacts, etc.)

b. Weather. No change.

c. Terrain. No Change.

3. ORGANIZATION AND OPERATIONS

a. Organization. The organization of the Battalion remained the same throughout the month with MLS Company, Bravo Company and $\frac{1}{3}$ of Charlie Company located at the OP. One reinforced platoon from Charlie Company was on Cau Do Bridge and another reinforced platoon located at Cobb Bridge.

b. Operations. The Battalion ran twelve (12) Pacific Operations during the month of April with day and night activities.

SUPPORTING ARMS

(1) Air. This Battalion's air requirements were supplied mainly by the 1st MAW. The 7th Air Force contributed 1 Shadow and 1 Stinger during the month of April. The Battalion continued to work the Pacifier mission and the majority of the times listed below were acquired during Pacifiers.

(3) Significant Events

(a) Outstanding support by the Wing and MAG-16 on varied air requests was highlighted by immediate response to the Battalion and Division's demands during Pacifier Operations.

(4) Artillery. 1st Battalion, 5th Marines and attendant units of SSDC were supported by 1/11 and Foxtro 2/11 during the month of April. Due to concentration of friendlies in the SSDC AO and DeNang vital area, fire missions were largely restricted to illumination missions. The artillery liaison team attached to 1/5 consisted of 3 Forward Observer teams operating on company level and an F.S.O.C. which coordinated supporting arms for SSDC. Each Pacifier mission was supported by a F.O. team. Prep missions were fixed in support of Pacifiers by units of 11th Marines utilizing aerial observers. 81mm mortars were deployed at strategic positions in the AO providing additional illumination and HE support.

(5) Engineers. Engineer personnel provided extensive demolition support on each Pacifier Operation.

(6) Shore Party (HSE). HSE personnel were provided by Company B, 1st Shore Party Battalion and were primarily employed in coordinating and effecting Helicopter Medevacs, visual reconnaissance, and during the Pacific Operations.

b. The Battalion continued to utilize schools provided by higher headquarters in the DaNang area and Okinawa.

5. LOGISTICS. During the past month this Battalion moved from the 1st Tanks Cantonment to Hill 34. The move was completed in approximately 8 days.

1st Motor Transport Battalion is presently supporting the Battalion with one (1) platoon of 2½ ton trucks. These vehicles have been sufficient transportation requirements to meet daily household chores. Additional support is required on occasion in order to accomplish tactical movement of troops and equipment.

Renovation of the 1/5 Cantonment located at Hill 34 was begun on 21 April 1970. Although total renovation has not been completed as of yet, work has been continuing and progress is evident.

An additional potable water supply has become necessary at both Hill 34 (1/5 Cantonment) and the Dai La Pass Cantonment in order to supplement present water shortage. Approximately 6,000 gallons per day at each cantonment is being delivered. An additional supplement will be needed at Hill 34 as soon as the engineers set up a portable field shower unit since the present showers are inadequate to handle the number of personnel within the Battalion.

6. CIVIC ACTION. The Battalion started employing AMK workers on 3 April throughout the month, these workers released our own Marines from doing nominal work around our compound.

During the month, the 3-5 completed the deliverance of General Walt Scholarships to deserving school children at Hoa Vang grade school. Discontinuance of these Scholarships will happen in May.

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Coordination was made through G-5 for two cultural tours during the month. On these tours, Marines were given an opportunity to visit many interesting sights in and around DaNang.

Meetings were held with all village chiefs, hamlet chiefs, CAP unit leaders, and all Headquarters, Vietnamese and American in an effort to coordinate events to obtain better cooperation between all concerned. Coordination was made with all villages, hamlets, CAP's, PF's and RF's in accordance with both Civic Action aims and tactical considerations.

During the month of April, we had one serious incident where a girl was dragged through barbed wire by a 7th Engineers crane. Conciliation payment was made to family due to incident.

This month 8 club waitresses were fired for stealing from the club and consequently we hired an entire new staff at both clubs.

The Battalion's move required a great number of changes such as re-arrangement of the housemaids and such changes were conducted and completed.

Division G-5 held a Civic Action and PSYOP inspection on 29 April and S-5 was found satisfactory with no discrepancies. Several suggestions were made by G-5 personnel at this inspection such as the frequency of MedCaps and the Village Self-Help program and those suggestions are being adhered to and are now set up as solid projects for this Department.

7. PSYCHOLOGICAL OPERATIONS. NONE.

8. COMMUNICATIONS. Communications personnel continued to adjust to shifting locations and new missions during April. By the end of the month all sections had shops operating fully on Hill 34. Although several problems persisted, particularly with the maze of telephone cables on Hill 34, the communications system was completely installed by the 27th. Liaison personnel remained at the former Battalion Cantonment to assist ARVN communicators and generator operators. Increased emphasis was placed on communications security, and preparations for the use of secure voice equipment on the 81mm mortar COF net were completed. "Covering" the COF net will mean that commanders in the field can direct all supporting arms above the Company level over cipher circuits. Air and artillery already employ Nestor equipment and use it with increasing effectiveness. No significant problems were encountered during the month.
