

(4) Narrative Summary: Chargeable strengths remained stable. Presently no critical shortages exist in the enlisted ranks. Present critical shortages in the officer ranks are as follows: 1 Captain 0202 and 1 Captain 0402. After April officer states depart the Battalion will be 10 officers below manning level.

#### (5) Problem Areas:

- (a) Administrative supplies are still in short supply. The Battalion presently has no Bond Allotment Forms (NavCompt 545), which is hindering the Savings Bond program. Fitness reports, VA insurance forms for SGLI, ID cards, ID Tag blanks and chairs, and mimeograph paper are also needed.
- (b) Office machines, especially typewriters are in poor condition, and the time required to repair these machines is excessive.

#### b. Discipline, Law and Order

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#### c. Morale, PX and Postal Services:

- (1) Morale is considered excellent.
- (2) The Marine Corps Exchange located in An Hoa provides excellent service. The exchange was relocated into a large building, enabling the exchange to increase their stock and furnish a larger variety of items. All necessities are available.
- d. Chaplains Activities: Catholic and Protestant services were held during the month. Protestant Sunday Services totaled 9 with an attendance of 475. Eight Protestant Divine Services were conducted during the week with an attendance of 87. Holy Communion Services numbered 5 with attendance of 130. Catholic Sunday masses totaled 7 with an attendance of 316. The Chaplain held one lecture on religion in Vietnam with 40 personnel attending. Two visits were made to companies in the field. The Chaplain made hospital visits to 1st Medical Battalion and NSA in Danang. 84 professional counseling interviews were held during the month.

#### e. Intelligence:

(1) General. Routine intelligence processing during March was accomplished by processing intelligence from the 9th Marine Regiment, 2nd Battalion, 4th Marines, 1st CIT, 3rd ITT, Duc Duc District, 1st Marine Regiment, and the 1st Marine Division (G-2). Routine debriefings of patrol leaders were also used.

Patrol debriefing reports from the 1st Recon Battalion, were also used.

Dissemination of intelligence was by Spot Reports, Daily Intsums, Briefings, Telecon, SICR'S and a weekly intelligence summary.

Members of the S-2 section gave 8 hours of classes to the new arrivals in the Battalion. The classes included orientation of the 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines TAOR, handling FW's and captured material, documents, weapons and VC tactics. Classes of approximately 6 hours were given to the S-2 scouts, on map reading, communication procedures, compass, handling FW's, and reporting military information.

Liaison visits were made to III MAF (G-2), 1st Marine Division (G-2), and Duc Duc District Headquarters.

Two man scout teams were employed with the rifle companies 31 days of the month.





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The Kit Carson Scouts worked 25 days with rifle companies during the month.

Psychological operations during the month consisted of two leaflet drops and numerous face to face confrontations.

Briefings were held daily and as required. The briefings were given by the intelligence officer, and covered intelligence matters received.

(2) Reports. Spot Reports, Daily Intsums, Kit Carson Scout (Daily and Monthly), weekly special agent reports, psychological warfare report and the reward fund report were submitted.

The S-2 submitted a number of National Agency Checks, background investigations; and certificates of clearance.

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#### g. Special Operations:

- (1) Mutually supporting counter-rotating patrols saturated the area surrounding Phu Lzc (6) company outpost (AT 926527), were able to close with small bands of local VC and produce a good kill ratio.
- (2) At Nong Song Company Outpost (AT 81/383) the river barrier necessitated the employment of platoon patrol base, which allowed a wide coverage of terrain with maximum security.
- (3) Squad and Platoon sized daylight patrols around An Hoa Combat Base (AT 873472) provided an effective recon/security screen.
- (4) Ambush patrols and listening posts were established nightly adjacent to each combat base.
- (5) Engineer sweep teams and daily tank patrols were utilized along Liberty Road in order to prevent mining and sniping incidents.
- (6) Co H raided Giang Hoa (2) (AT 890520) on 4 March, supported by tanks and LVTP-51s.
- (7) Co H raided La Thap (1) (AT 945517) on 11 March, with LVTE-1's, tanks, and LVTP-5's.
- (8) Co F conducted County Frir 5-1/ in Phu Mhuan (3) on 13 March.
- (9) Co E conducted an amphibious recon of the Song Thu Bon (AT 866440) to (AT 868501) on 17 March, mounted aboard LVTP-51s.
- (10) Go F conducted a search and destroy operation in Hanh Tay (3) (AT 848482) with LVTE-1's and LVTP-5's, on 20 March.
- (11) Companies E, F, and the Battalion Command Group (-) conducted Operation New Castle, supported by LVTH-6's, LVTE-1's, LVTP-5's, tanks, and Ontos, beginning 22 March.
- (12) Co G conducted a company (-) search and destroy operation with a light section of Ontos in the western and of Antenna Valley on 29 March.

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#### h. Nuclear, Biological, Chemical Warfare and Defense:

- (1) CS Grenade M7A2 and CS-1 Grenade M25A2
  - (a) Used extensively to clear tunnels and bunkers.
  - (b) Used on one operation to contaminate enemy structures/ fortifications in order to deny him the use thereof.
- (2) The Bittalion plans to requisition and utilize chemical defolmiants, M-3 Riot Control Dispenser, Mighty Mite Blower (M-106), Launcher 35 MM cartridge (E-9), and the cluster, canister riot control CS (E-15-8).
- i. Command and Control: Lt. Col. M. C. Jackson, Jr. commanded the Battalion during the month of March. Beginning 1 March, 2nd Battalion 5th Marines Regiment, reverted ADCON to 5th Marine Regiment, and remained OFCON 1st Marine Division.

#### j. Close Combai:

- (1) Combat patrols from the Phu Lac (6) Company outpost, Nong Song Company outpost, and the An Hoa Combat Base made daily contact with the enemy engaging close combat on numerous occasions.
- (2) Units deployed on Operation New Castle engaged in close combat with NVA/VC troops from 23 March to 25 March 1967. (See enclosure After Action Report, Operation New Castle).

#### k. Fire Support:

- (1) Battery E, 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines stationed at An Hoa Combat Base, supported 2/5 units in the field during the month of March.
- (2) 1st Eight-Inch Howitzer Battery, in general support. 1st Marine Division, also provided artillery support during the month of March.
- (3) A detachment (two 4.2" mortars) from Battery W, 2nd Battalion, lith Marines, located at Nong Song Company outpost supported company operations and patrols in that area.

#### 1. Air Defense: None

- (1) Close Air Support: During the month of March the 1st Marine Division Air Wing provided close air support for 2/5 during Operation New Castle. Five flights of fixed wing air craft were utilized. Airborne observers controlled numerous strikes during 2/5's movement from the area of operations, across the Song Thu Bon. On seventeen occasions, Birddog aircraft were called upon for airborne control and surveillance. Illumination aircraft flew six missions for 2/5 during the month. Spooky aircraft were utilized twice by the Battalion.
- (2) Helicopter Support: All helicopter support was provided by 1st Marine Air Wing. Thirty-eight requests for resupply, medevacs, and administrative runs were filled during the month. On Operation New Castle UH-IE gunships, provided close support with excellent results.
- (3) All Aircraft support continued to be controlled by 2/5 forward air control teams with liaison through 2/5 FSCC. Airborne observers were instrumental in facilitating coordination between airborne and ground units.





m. <u>Logistics</u>: During the month of March, there was only one operation involving an S-4 representative in the field, Operation New Castle. No significant problems were encountered supporting the units in the field.

#### (1) Equipment:

- (a) The most significant problem area is still third echelon maintenance deadlined vehicles due to the back of spare parts.
- (b) It is expected in the near future that five housekeeping trucks will be permanently assigned to the Battalian. This will improve problems in this area. One vehicle will still be assigned to Nong Song. There is still a need for one additional vehicle and three, (3), ½ ton trailers.
- (c) Transport of supplies into An Hoa Combat Base has greatly improved due to the continuing flow of convoys from Da Nang.

#### (2) Supply:

- (a) There has been a critical shortage of 782 gear in the Battalion. This shortage has been to prove the short and by obtaining a priority 5 walk through on 782 gear. Canvas bunks are in short supply and have been on a number 12 priority request for some time.
- (b) During the month of March, Battalion Supply supported one operation within the TAOR. During this period supply reguisitioned 406 slit documents with 18 completions. Of the 406 documents submitted, 25 were 02 priority of which 3 were completed.
- (c) Since late March the Battalion has been resupplied with M-16 riflesto take the place of the M-14. All letter companies have been issued the M-16 except stragulers such as TAD personnel, hospital, emergency leave, R&R, etc. H&S Company is in the process of receiving their M-16 rifles new.
- (d) Supply Problem. Support of blank forms and stationary was unsatisfactory during this period.
  - (3) Construction: Construction has begun on the new messhall, the water tower and the new shower. Construction on these projects came almost to a standstill due to the lack of washed sand and crushed gravel, however with the resupply of approximately 50 cubic meters of sand and gravel, construction is continuing.
  - (a) The new PX building and seven, (7), new tropical huts have been completed since the last report was submitted.
  - (b) Construction and expansion of the An Hoa Airfield continues under the cognizance of the MCB. The new parking apron is nearly completed.

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#### n. Communications:

(1) Radio: Operation New Castle once again exemplified the versalitility and dependability of the AN/PRC-25. Not only were the units able to communicate between each other, but the Command Group also had communications with CORATE with only the basic unit.

#### (2) Antenna:

- (a) Tape and whip antenna still remain somewhat of a problem. UER forms have been submitted stating the inadequency of said item during normal courses of operation, antenna base sections are still in shortage.
- (b) Field expedient use of the antenna RC-292 for operations proved very beneficial. During February and March the basic unit of the RC-292 was taken on two operations. Utilizing bamboo poles to erect the antenna enabled the commander to have outstanding communications to wherever it was needed.
- (3) Radio Vehicles: Deadline of Radio Vehicles has been kept to a minimum. One of the MRC-1091s has been down for sometime due to a faulty fuel pump. Parts for all equipment has been placed on requistition.
- (4) Training: Various forms of informal training have been conducted throughout the month both on the Company level and the Battalian level. Formal training is now underway and progressing well.
- (5) RTD's: Upon inspection by Division, it has been determined to initiate a mix master program with Regiment to fluxuate the RTD's of the communications Plateon. A thorough study is underway at this time.
- (6) Message Center: A Program has been instituted to thoroughly train all message center personnel with off-line equipment and its entire system.
- (7) Technicians: The installation of the civilian source of 50 cycle electricity has been completed. With this installation of power 50% of the camp is on civilian and another 25% will be added to this source. The Techs have also assisted the unit in adjusting equipment for the 50% cycle civilian power.

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- (8) Wire: The wire section has continued the difficult task of re-wiring the base camp telephone wire system and the wire setup for the perimeter. Because of the shortages of telephone poles, the wire section has coordinated with the civilian personnel in welding canisters to route the wire.
- (9) Radio Voice Procedure: Distinct improvement has been noted especially during Operation New Castle. This has resulted from intensive training of all personnel concerned.

#### o. Civil Affairs/Civic Action:

(1) General: During this reporting period, the main activities in the civic action program have been medical and dental treatment for the Vietnamese. The people are treated at County Fairs, Medcap-Dencap activities, and at the Battalion Aid Station.

Because of the aforementioned activities the Vietnamese people are becoming more friendly and cooperative with the Marines of this Battalion. With the installation of the new Duc Duc District Chief, better relations are anticipated.

- (2) Medical Assistance: The Battalion BAS has done a fine job in assisting the Civic Action Program during this reporting period. The following is a total medical breakdown of the Vietnamese people treated:
  - (a) Xuyen Thu Village: 321 women, 313 men, 409 children, 1043 Total
  - (b) Xuyen Phu Village: 591 women, 467 men, 754 children, 1802 Total
  - (c) Combined Total: 2845
- (3) Personal Assistance. This months results are as follows:
  - (a) 2,000 pounds of rice
  - (b) 4,500 pounds of corn
  - (c) 43 bags of cornmeal

  - (d) 1,000 bars of soap (e) 1,460 sheets of tin
  - (f) 72 bags of cement (g) 40 mattocks

  - (h) 350 pound: bags of tools
  - 16 potato diggers
  - 9 axes



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- (4) Evacuation Assistance: This months results are as follows:

- (5) Public Improvement: Many projects for the Vietnamese have been started and completed during this reporting period. Some of these are; a new well at Thanh My (AT 870478); several refugee homes in the surrounding area, and providing a market place at Mau Chanh (2) (AT 888473). The midwife infirmary at Thanh My (AT 870478) continues to do an excellent and useful job.
- (6) County Fair Activities: A county fair was held at My Loc (2), My Loc Hamlet, Xuyen Hoa Village, Duy Xuyen District on 13, 14 and 15 March. The county fair was highly successful and another is planned for Mau Chanh (2), Mau Chanh Hamlet, Xuyen Phu Village, Duc Duc District, during the month of April.

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#### 3. Commander's Narrative of Significant Events.

#### 1 March - 10 March

During this period Co F improved the defensive configuration of Nong Song Outpost (AT 813383) by constructing well-fortified fighting positions, communications trenches, and wire obstacles. Night patrols, ambushes, and listening posts were conducted adjacent to and across the river from the Combat Base Camp. Company G provided security for the An Hoa Combat Base, escorted convoys along Liberty Road, and conducted security patrols in outlying areas. While in the capacity of maneuver element, Co H conducted two company-sized raids. Co E occupied Phu Lac (6) outpost on the south bank of the Song Thu Bon (AT 966527) and conducted daily combat patrols, night ambushes and listening posts as well as providing security for engineer sweep teams along Liberty Road. Continuous saturation patrolling accounted for a creditable number of kills during this period. Emphasis was placed on mutually supporting sand-sized patrols with maximum utilization of supporting arms organic to both Phu Lac (6) and the An Hoa Combat Base.

The night of 1 March, a group of VC attempted to cross the Song Thu Bon by boat east of the outpost and were taken under fire by an M-48 tank. Three VC KIA (Conf) resulted from the 90 MM fire. On 2 March a Company E squad combat patrol received fire from two entrenched VC near La Thap (1) (AT 942516). Return fire killed one VC. The Squad captured an NVA K-50 type submachine gun, a pack, and documents. Mines and booby traps continued to be a problem when on the morning of 3 March, five Marines of an ambush unit were wounded by what appeared to be an 81 MM mortar rigged as a mine. On 4 March, a Company E Squad combat patrol received fire from an estimated four VC near Phu Lac (2) (AT 927505). Return fire enabled a flanking fire team to move through the position, finding three VC KIA (Conf). Later on the same day, a squad combat patrol spotted twelve armed VC moving into tree-line and called artillery mission on them. Numerous blood trails and drag marks indicated eight VC KIA (Prob).

At 040900H Company H moved north from An Hoa Combat Base with tanks and IVTP-5's in an amphibious raid against Giang Hoa (2) (AT 890520). Tanks provided covering fire from the south bank of the Song Thu Bon while two platoons made an unopposed landing on the west side of the hamlet. A reinforced platoon landed on the east side, completing the encirclement. A VC attempting to flee was wounded and captured. Subsequent interrogation revealed useful information. A detailed search of the village produced a variety of VC equipment and documents which were forwarded to the Battalion S-2. No further contact was made until movement back across the river began at 041600H when two 60 MM mortar rounds impacted near the lead amtrack and sporadic small arms fire was received from the north bank. An artillery mission silenced the enemy fire and the company continued to An Hoa Combat Base.



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On the morning of seven March an electrically detonated mine exploded beneath an MCB-4 jeep leading a convoy northbound along Liberty Road (AT 908512). The jeep was extensively damaged and three Seabees killed. An afternoon road sweep discovered a large electrically rigged mine 1500 meters south of the previous mine incident. The mine was disarmed and forwarded to Battalion S-2.

At 081830H a Company G Squad (Rein) combat patrol vic (AT 933495) operating with an M-48 tank observed a VC with pack and rifle 1200 meters to the southeast. 90 MM fire destroyed the target (1 VC KIA CONF). The following day at 1100 a Company G Platoon (Rein) OP (AT 976501) observed five armed VC dressed in khaki and carrying packs and rifles, to the southeast. Tink fire directed from the OP accounted for three more confirmed kills.

#### 10 March - 22 March

On 10 March Company F was relieved at Nong Song by Company G and proceeded to An Hoz Combat Base to assume the mission of CP defense. On 11 March Company H conducted a raid on the hamlet of La Thap (1) (AT 945517) supported by tanks, Ontos, LVTP-5's and LVTP-1's with the mission of destroying this well-known center of VC activities. Psy-war personnel were attached in order to evacuate all non-combatants prior to the destruction. A search of the hamlet produced one PW and one VC KIA(Prob) by a Scout Sniper.

County Fair 5-14 began 0500 13 March as Company F encircled Phu Nhuan (3) (AT 904506) and began screening detainees. (See County Fair Wrap Up 5-14). On 16 March Company E was relieved at Phu Lac (6) by Company H, then proceeded to An Hoa Combat Base to assume the mission of maneuver company.

At 170800H Company E began a river reconnaissance aboard amtracs from (AT 856440) to (AT 868501), in advance of a planned Search and Destroy Operation in Hanh Tay (1) (AT 848482). Waterborne amtracks took light fire from the western bank of the Song Thu Bon, which was suppressed with small arms, and 106 MM recoilless rifles mounted on the vehicles. Reconnaissance discovered several favorable beaches for an amphibious assault.

Vigorous patrolling by Squad and Platoon sized units continued to produce a good kill ratio. At 1500 on 17 March, a Company H Platoon Combat patrol (AT 933507) received fire from an enemy Squad. A flanking movement through the position produced no sign of enemy casualties. Shortly thereafter approximately thirty armed VC carrying packs were sighted moving south through La Thap (2) (AT 940507). A 105 MM artillery mission impacted in the center of the unit, causing eight VC KIA (Prob).



At 200700H Company F began an amphibious raid into the Hanh Tay (2) area with LVTP-5's LVTE-1's, sweeping southwest after the river crossing at (AT 861493). No significant contact was made until the return river crossing was underway. At that time the waterborne elements came under sporadic small arms fire from the west bank of the Song Thu Ben. 106 MM recoilless rifle fire and small arms fire was returned. A unit deployed on the east bank provided continuous covering fire while the remainder of the company crossed without further incident. This raid was made as a prelude to Operation New Castle. Its main objective was to deceive the enemy as to our future plans since heretofore Marine units rarely reentered an area immediately after termination of an operation in that area. Operation New Castle began 220630H in Hanh Tay (2) area (See Enclosure - After Action Report Operation New Castle).

#### 23 March - 31 March 1967

During this period Companies E, F, and H continued Operation New Castle until its termination at 251800H. Company G maintained Nong Song outpost and conducted a two-day search and destroy operation in the Western End of Antenna Valley beginning at 290500H. (See Concept of Operation Company (-), Western End Antenna Valley). Attached to the company were two M-50 Al Ontos. Contact remained light throughout the operation as small bands of VC attempted to evade the advancing company. At 290730H, a point Squad (AT 850379) observed two VC vie (AT 858373) and took them under fire with small arms. A search of the area revealed a large blood trail and two packs. At 1000H a Squad of VC fired 40 small arms rounds at Company G lead elements (AT 878398) wounding two Marines. Fire was returned, but contact could not be reestablished. The enemy remained elusive avoiding decisive contact and at 311800H the operation was terminated.

On 27 March Company F became the first 2/5 unit to receive the new M-16 rifle. Indoctrination and FAM firing was completed by 29 March. On 30 March Company H was relieved at Phu Lac (6) by Company F and proceeded to An Hoa Combat Base. The following day Company H drew M-16's in preparation for the relief of Company G at Nong Song on 1 April. By 31 March all companies with the exception of Company G had been issued the M-16 rifle; Company E began a maximum effort to improve the defense of the An Hoa Combat Base, and all units both organic and attached, prepared for forthcoming operations in April.





a. Enemy Forces: Elements of the V-25 and R-20 Battalions are Known to regularly cross the Song Thu Bon between Phu Lac (6) (AT 927528) and Phu Da (1) (AT 866492). Both troops and supplies are thus carried between the Gordon and Tuscalcosa areas and eventually to Enemy units in the northern portion of the Danang TACR.
