(1) Catholic Services. A total of 4 Sunday Masses were conducted for 2/5 at An Hoa. The chaplain also held 20 masses for the Regiment and attached units. Total attendance was 962 and 962 received communion.

(2) Protestant Services. Four (4) Protestant Services were held for 2/5 at An Hoa by the Regimental Chaplain.

b. Weekday Services

(1) Catholic Services. A total of 22 weekday services were held for 2/5 at An Hoa and for the companies in the field. A total of 813 attended and 813 received communion.

c. Red Cross Cases. During the month of June, nine cases were referred to the Red Cross for action.

d. Counseling Interviews. The 2/5 chaplain interviewed 17 Marines during the month.

e. Memorial Services. During the month of June, three memorial services were held.

PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Activities for June 1970 showed a considerable decrease over the previous month. The Battalion continued to provide security for Liberty Road and Liberty Bridge Combat Outpost. Company size Reconnaissance in Force operations were conducted in the Arizona, Phu Nhuan, and Go Noi and Le Bac Island areas. Contacts and sightings decreased during the month as compared to the previous period with a resulting decrease in fire missions called. For the second consecutive month, Battalion (-) cordon and search operations were employed with excellent success. In addition a number of tank/infantry operations produced good results also. Since mines and boobytraps continued to plague the Battalion and accounted for most of the casualties, training emphasis was placed on preventive measures.

PART III

SEQUENTIAL LISTINGS OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

On 1 June, Foxtro Company was continuing to provide security for Liberty Bridge, while Golf Company was responsible for providing security for Liberty Road. Echo Company continued Reconnaissance in Force operations in the Arizona Area and Hotel Company conducted similar operations east of Liberty Road.

On 1 June, Echo Company, while in a night position, received six rounds of 60mm mortar fire and seven incoming M-79 rounds suffering negative casualties.

On 2 June, Hotel Company returned to An Hoa to become Regimental Reserve for the early June high threat period.

On 2 June, a tank/infantry operation was conducted by Golf Company in the Phu Nhuan area. During the sweep of a dense treeline, a 1000 pound rice cache was found.

On 3 June, while acting as a screening force in the Phu Nhuan area, Echo Company came upon a possible enemy base camp. The area was heavily boobytrapped and eleven explosive devices were found consisting primarily of 60mm and 81mm illumination canisters packed with C-4 and set with tripwires. Also found were 21 blasting caps and miscellaneous demolition materials. While in their night position, Echo Company received ten 61mm mortar rounds, one RPG and one 105mm round lob bomb resulting in negative casualties. That night an Echo Company night ambush killed two VC/NVA.

On the night of 3 June in anticipation of possible enemy action directed at Liberty Bridge during the early June high threat period, a practice emergency reinforcement, code word "Blackboard," was smoothly conducted at Liberty Bridge utilizing artillery and air support.

On 5 June, the Pacificer Company while OPCON to 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines, was employed east of Liberty Road in the Chau Phong area and resulted in 3 VC/NVA KIA and one POW taken.

On 5 June, a platoon from Hotel Company and an S-2 Scout team conducted a tank/infantry operation in the Phu Nhuan area with 4 tanks from Charlie Company, 1st Tank Battalion. Six detainees were taken of which four taken from a single spider hole were later classified as POW's. Additionally, seven boobytraps were found and destroyed and 1000 pounds of rice was also captured.

On 7 June, while set in a night position in the Phu Nhuan area, Echo Company received two lob bombs, only one of which detonated. The bomb that failed to detonate was later identified as a 500 pound bomb.

On 8 June, a tank/infantry operation employing Hotel and Echo Companies in conjunction with the Pacificer Company in the Phu Nhuan area resulted in eight VC/NVA KIA, two POW's and two detainees.

On 9 June, Hotel Company went to Go Noi Island to conduct Reconnaissance in Force while Echo Company returned to An Hoa to become the Regimental Reserve.

On 9 June, the Pacificer force, Bravo Company, 1st Battalion, 5th Marines, was assigned to the OPCON of the 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines and was inserted east of Liberty Road. The operation accounted for 2 VC/NVA KIA and two detainees.

On 11 June at 0255H, Liberty Bridge and Phu Loc (6) received four 60mm mortar rounds, eight B-40 rockets, and one lob bomb resulting in one PF casualty.

On 13 June, Hotel Company assumed security of Liberty Bridge, Foxrot Company rotated to Liberty Road positions and Golf Company returned to An Hoa for a one day stand down.

From 14 - 16 June, 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines (-) (Rein), consisting of Companies Echo and Golf, the Battalion Command Post and a National Police Field Force unit from Dai Loc District, conducted a cordon and search of the My Hiep (1) area of the Northern Arizona. Kilo Company, 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines was used as a blocking force north of the Vu Gia River. Just after first light the assault companies lifted into their cordon positions by helicopter. Within an hour and a half the cordon was established and a detailed, methodical search was conducted in the many hedgerows and dense bamboo thickets in the village area. Results of the 48 hour search were 3 VC/NVA KIA's and 22 FOW's. Weapons and ordnance captured included 4 AK-47's, 2 SKS's, one M-1 Carbine, two 9mm Pistols, 8 B-40 rockets and 10 Chinese Communist Grenades. Numerous documents of great intelligence value were also captured. Enemy personnel captured included four members of the Q83 VC Main Force Battalion and numerous other high ranking VC cadre of the Northern Arizona area which effectively destroyed the VC cadre structure of My Hiep Village.

On 18 June while in a night position Golf Company received two 105mm round lob bombs suffering negative casualties. A platoon of Fox Company also received a 500 pound lob bomb and suffered only minor casualties.

On 19 June, a tank/infantry operation was conducted by Echo Company in Thon Bon (1) of the Phu Huon area with 4 tanks from Charlie Company, 1st Tank Battalion, and a special S-2 search team. With the tanks first breaking down the vegetation and exploding enemy devices in the heavily boobytrapped area, the S-2 team searched the dense foliage for spider holes and tunnel complexes. The operation resulted in three enemy KIA's and eight captured. One AK-47, one Chinese Communist Grenade, three M-26 grenades, four NVA packs and numerous documents were captured. Additionally, American and Vietnamese currency in various denominations amounting to more than \$7,000 was found. Friendly casualties included one emergency medevac from a 105mm round boobytrap.

On 21 - 22 June, Golf Company was assigned OPCON to 1st Battalion, 5th Marines and participated in a Battalion (-) Pacifier operation in the Arizona Area resulting in 21 enemy killed.

On 23 - 25 June, Golf Company continued under OPCON of the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines and participated in a three company sweep North of the Thu Bon River east of Liberty Road. Elements of the 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines, the 51st ARVN Regiment and the 2nd ROK Marine Brigade also participated in the operation by providing blocking forces. The operation was ambitious but obtained few measurable results.

On 30 June, 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines (-) (Rein) consisting primarily of Echo and Golf Companies and a Battalion Command group conducted a cordon and search of Football Island. An Armed Propaganda Team from Duc Duc also took part in the operation. At 0630H, following fixed wing prep fires of the landing zone, the command and control helicopter and supporting helicopter gunships located approximately 20 VC/NVA with packs and weapons attempting to cross the river to

escape the cordon. Some of the enemy were swimming while the majority were crossing in a boat. The command and control helicopter immediately took them under fire and then directed the gunships to the target area. In echelons the Cobras directed devastating fire from miniguns and automatic grenade launchers on the helpless and floundering enemy and resulted in 15 VC/NVA killed. During the following 48 hours, personnel from the ITT, CIT, and the Armed Propaganda Team screened 300 civilians and a med-cap was conducted by the Battalion Medical personnel. As a result of the psyops broadcasts, one NVA chieu-hoi was received by Echo Company.

## A. TOPICS

### 1. Personnel and Administration

a. Strength. The Battalion strength at the beginning of June was 37 officers and 1089 enlisted. At the end of the month, the strength was 33 officers and 1050 enlisted. During the month the Battalion joined 4 officers and 79 enlisted and dropped 8 officers and 113 enlisted from the rolls. Casualties sustained by the Battalion during the month of June were as follows:

b. Discipline, Law and Order. During the month, the Battalion Legal Officer processed six Special Courts Martial, 12 Battalion Office Hours and 15 Company Office Hours. There are 12 Special Court Martials pending. Eleven Marines are confined in the III MAF Brig. One Marine was declared a deserter.

c. Postal. The Battalion Mail Room satisfactorily passed the CG technical inspection on 10 June 1970. No problems were experienced involving mail delivery during the month of June.

d. Awards. The Battalion processed 28 awards consisting of 8 Bronze Stars, 7 Navy Achievement Medals, 7 Vietnamese Crosses of Gallantry, and 6 Navy Commendation Medals. A total of 5 awards were received and 1 was presented while 4 were roaddressed and forwarded to the individual's new duty station.

### 2. Intelligence

a. Enemy. During the reporting period, enemy contacts resulted from both friendly and enemy initiated action. Enemy activity has been generally light and scattered with primary emphasis on logistical and reconnaissance operations. During the month four different Battalion operations were conducted; each lasted two to three days. Overall success was achieved by initiating surprise attacks on areas known to be heavily populated with VC/NVA troops and/or enemy sympathizers. Enemy personnel captured during these operations have provided information on the locations of enemy units in the Battalion AO. The friendly initiated contacts for the most part were with small groups of two to six enemy,

primarily local VC guerrillas. However, recent information extracted from POW's indicates that several NVA units are now operating in this AO.

b. Weather. Comparing this month to last month, rainfall has slightly increased. The average daytime temperature for the month was 95 degrees and the average low of 78 degrees was experienced during the hours of darkness. The weather did not constitute any problems for tactical operations.

c. Terrain. The terrain encountered in the AO for the reporting period was primarily lowland rice paddies, with patches of high ground covered with treelines and bushes.

### 3. Organization and Operations

a. The following units were attached or detached during the month of June.

(1) From 2 to 9 June Hotel Company was the Regimental Reserve and provided one squad to the 1st Reconnaissance Battalion on Hill 119.

(2) On 3 and 8 June the Pacific Company from 1st Battalion, 5th Marines was OPCON to 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines and was employed east of Liberty Road and in the Phu Nhuan area.

(3) On 9 June Echo Company returned to An Hoa and became the Regimental Reserve until 14 June. Echo Company was again designated the Regimental Reserve from 17 to 20 June.

(4) From 14 to 16 June a unit from the National Police Field Force of Dai Loc District was OPCON to 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines for operations in the Northern Arizona.

(5) On 21 June Golf Company was OPCON to 1st Battalion, 5th Marines until 22 June for an operation in the Northern Arizona.

(6) On 19 and 20 June a Regional Force company from Duc Duc was OPCON to 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines for a tank/infantry operation in the Phu Nhuan area.

(7) On 23 June Golf Company was OPCON to 1st Battalion, 5th Marines until 25 June for an operation north of the Thu Bon River across from Go Noi Island.

(8) On 30 June an Armed Propaganda Team was OPCON to 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines for an operation in the Football Island area of the Arizona.

(9) During the month of June numerous tank operations employing Charlie Company, 1st Tank Battalion, were conducted east and west of Liberty Road.

(1) Tactical Air Support. Air Support for the Battalion totaled 23 close air support missions. Helicopter gunships and aerial observer aircraft supported the Battalion on numerous occasions. Over 1,350 meters of tree line were destroyed along with 16 structures. A total of 374 bombs totaling 222 tons of ordnance were dropped on targets and resulted in 5 secondary explosions. Seventeen beacon flights were conducted during the month.

(2) Helicopter Support. A total of 46 Marines and 6 civilian casualties were evacuated during the month. The average time for emergency evacuation helicopters to arrive was 22 minutes. Priority evacuations averaged 28 minutes and routine evacuations averaged 2 hours and 30 minutes. Two company-size lifts into insecure zones were accomplished during the month.

(3) Artillery and 81mm Mortars. In June artillery expended 842 rounds on 63 fire missions, while 2,174 rounds were expended on intelligence targets. The 81mm mortars expended 5,924 rounds in direct support of battalion operations.

4. Schools and Training. During the month of June, 86 Marines attended Indoctrination Training. General Military Subjects Training was conducted every Saturday afternoon in the Battalion Rear at An Hoa. Rifle companies, when in the Battalion Rear area, took advantage of low activity periods for further training and indoctrination. Training was conducted in the following subject areas:

5. Logistics

a. General. During the month of June, the Battalion remained in a C-1 category both in equipment on hand and equipment readiness.

b. Administrative. There were no administrative problems during the month.

c. Cantonment Structures and Facilities. The lighting project was completed on Liberty Bridge. A new ammunition bunker was completed and replaced at Liberty Bridge.

d. Mess Operations and Facilities. The Food Service Team from Okinawa spent a week with the Battalion and provided useful assistance in mess management, food preparation and sanitation.

e. Transportation. There were no significant transportation problems during the month. The operational readiness rate improved steadily during the month from 75% to 88%.

f. Supply. The supply section continued to provide excellent support.

g. Medical. The BAS remained at the An Hoa Combat Base this reporting period. No major changes were made in the physical set up of the BAS. Present strength of the BAS is one Medical Officer and 60 hospital corpsmen.

a. Malaria: Two (2) cases were reported.

b. Veneral Diseases: 22 cases: 22GC.

c. Heat Casualties: Three (3) cases were reported.

d. Rabies: No cases were reported.

e. Routine Medical Complaints. Dermatitis - 143, Gastroenteritis - 363, Orthopedic - 25, Ear Disorders - 28, Cellulitis - 123, Eye Disorders - 12, FUO - 11, Miscellaneous Disorders - 304, URI - 20.

f. Statistics. A total number of 1057 patients were seen for an average of 35 per day.

7. Communications

a. Radio Transmission. With continued emphasis being placed on con-

munications security, violations have appreciably decreased. The implementation of the wheel code and its distribution to the squad level is expected to further reduce communication security violations.

b. Wire Communication. New 25 pair cable has replaced the slash wire, WD-1/TT, and is presently being laid in the cantonment.

c. Embarkation. A recent staff visit by Division inspectors found the cargo manifests and the majority of the mount out boxes to be in excellent shape. Replacements for boxes considered unserviceable have been placed on order.

8. Civic Action. All civic action operations have been transferred to the Regimental S-5.

9. Statistics for the period

a. Through contacts and fire missions 44 VC/NVA were killed.

b. During the month 64 people were detained and sent to ITT. ITT classified these detainees as 9 VC POW's, 3 NVA POW's, 19 Innocent Civilians, 15 Civil Defendants and 18 were unclassified as of the end of the period.
