PART II NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of October, 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines continued to conduct offensive operations within I Corps Tactical Zone with primary responsibility for security of Liberty Bridge and Liberty Road northeast of the An Hoa Combat Base in Quang Nam Province. In addition to the bridge and road security responsibilities, the Battalian conducted extensive rice denial operations throughout it's AOR to deprive the enemy of this vital commodity during the harvest season. Limited search and clear operations were also conducted along with extensive company and platoon patrol activities.

Security for Liberty Bridge presented a difficult problem during the period 6-12 October when the Thu Bon rose approximately 17 feet above normal during extremely heavy rains. The





bridge was covered by at least six feet of water and the security platoon on the north bank was extracted to high ground by lifeline. Four Marines were stranded on an isolated watchtower during the night of 5 October. Rescue attempts by helicopter saved three; however, one Marine was carried away by the current and not recovered.

As a result of flood conditions, convoy operations were halted due to bridge and road damage. The battalion provided a company for security of the An Hoa air approach forridor during this period to guard against enemy anti-aircraft action with the heavy utilization of aircraft resupply. LVT's played an exceptionally important role in the resupply of the battalion and in troop movements during these inclement weather periods.

For the most part, units of the battalion were deployed as follows:

a. One company providing security for Liberty Road south of 51 grid line.

b. One company providing security for Liberty Bridge, Northern Cantonment, engineer construction vehicles, and the daily resupply convoy.

c. One company providing security for battalion CP at Phu Lac (6) and Liberty Road above grid line 51. This company also provided sweep team security.

d. One company conducting search and clear operations within the battalion's AO.

PART III

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. Topics

- A. Strength. The Battalion began the month with a total strength of 40 Marine Off, 1,134 Enl, 3 USN Off, and 53 USN Enl. 3/5 now has a total on board strength of 39 Marine Off, 1,161 Enl, 3 USN Off, and 53 USN Enl.
- B. Morale. Morale and fighting spirit continued to be excellent.
- C. Postal. Postal service continued at the same degree of excellence.
- D. <u>Discipline</u>. During the reporting period, 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines held 3 Special Court Martials and 1 Summary Court Martial.
- E. Awards. There were 6 Bronze Star Medals, 28 Purple Heart Medals, 5 Navy Commendation Medals, and 6 Navy Achievement Medals awarded to the Battalion during the month of October.



F. Internal Management. Administration procedure and proficiency continued to be excellent.

G. Logistics. The overall logistics status for the battalion is satisfactory. Battalion S-4 has supported the battalion while in the field with resupplies on a daily basis.

H. Training.

- 1. Regimental Indoctrination School. During the month all new personnel reporting to 3/5 attended Troop Indoctrination School held by the 5th Marine Regiment for a five day period.

I. Operations

1. The battalion conducted or participated in the following search and clear/search and destroy operations during the reporting period:

a. 30ct69- Acting on intelligence report from 1st CIT, Company I conducted a pre-dawn cordon operation around Phu Nhuan (3), capturing two VC, four VCI, three VCS (females), one RPG-2 launcher, and numerous documents.


b. 130ct69- Battalion conducted a three company search and clear operation around Phu Nhuans (1), (2), (3), and My Loc (1) and (2). Company M in the sweep received RPG's and small arms fire from My Loc (1) but failed to make any other significant contacts. Eight VC were detained, one of which was on S-2 blacklist.

c. 19-230ct69- Company M conducted search and clear and rice demial operations in central and eastern portions of battalion's AO. Company M was attacked on 190ct69 with RPG's or mortar fire and automatic weapons fire. No other significant contacts except sporadic sniper fire. 800 lbs of rice were captured and several SFD's found.



d. 230ct69- Company K inserted ambush of Football Island crossing and captured one VC with Chicom granades and other gear. He was subsequently identified as a Corporal, 2nd Company, 3rd Platoon, 91st Sapper Battalion.

- e. 240ct69- Company & (Rein) conducted amphibous assult on Football Island by LVT. Results: five VC KIA, three VC KBA, three detainees, 32 boats and 20 bunkers destroyed with no friendly casualties. At had engine trouble and was absent from area for 22 minutes during which 15-20 VC were seen escaping to Arizona area.
- f. 25-270ct69- Company L helilifted to Hill 119 and began search and clear operations around Alligator Lake. Negative contact made and one 12 man bunker destroyed.
- g. 29-310ct69- Company I crossed the Song Thu Bon vicinity of Football Island, secured LZ Rose for helicopter insertion of 2nd Battalien, 5th Marines, then provided blocking force and conducted search and clear operations in northeastern Arizona. As of 310ct69, Company I results were one NVA KIA, two VC captured, one VCS detained, eight VC KBA, and miscellaneous documents captured with no USMC casualties.
- 2. From 1-180ct69, aggressive rice destruction/denial perations were conducted in the battalion's AO. A total of 167,125 square meters of rice were physically destroyed by hand cutting, use of det-cord explosives, and burning with gasoline. An additional 3700 rounds of threshed rice were captured. Use of daylong 81mm H&I fires effectively kept daytime harvest activity in much of the AO under control. Employment of the BC scope from Phu Lac (6) enhanced observation of harvest activity.
- 3. During this reporting period the battalion began the training and employment of organic recon teams which greatly enhanced intelligence gathering, particularly in the eastern portion of the AO.
- 4. Beginning in mid-October the battalion instituted a program of training and nightly application of ground surveilalance radar equipment to build proficiency in it's utilization. SID controlled ambushes were also employed with negative contact.
- 5. The battalion continued to employ the LVTE-1 in active anti-SFD operations which were considerably successful in destroying numerous booby traps within the AO.





J. Enemy, Weatcher, and Terrain

l. Enemy. During the reporting period, the enemy continued small scale harrassing attacks by fire, increased road mining and SFD activities. Vehicles on Route 540 north of Liberty Bridge detonated mines which resulted on 16 October in the deatch of several Vietnamese bus passangers and on 18 October in the death of three Marines and critical wounding of a forth, all from Company D, 7th Engineer Battalion. Along Liberty Road, one LVT was destroyed by a mine with four Marine WIA's on 11 October, and on 30 October a 2/5 vehicle with four personnel was ambushed with M-79's and automatic weapons fire resulting in one Marine DOW and three WIA. Other activity consisted of sporadic sniper fire.

- P. Supporting Units.
- 1. Engineers. Company B, 1st Enfineer Battalion supported 3/5 during the month of October 1969.
- 2. Shore Party (HST). HST's were provided by Company B, ist Shore Party Battalion.
- 3. Interpreters. Four Interpreters were employed by 3/5 during the reporting period.
- 4. Amtracks. There were seven Amtracks from the 4th Plt, Company A in An Hoa supporting 3/5 during the reporting period.
- 5. Tanks. 3/5 had two Tanks supporting it during the reporting period.
 - 6. <u>Kit Carson Scouts</u>. The battalion is now employing nine Kit Carson Scouts.
 - 7. Snipers. The battalich is now employing seven snipers.

Q. Civil Affairs.

- 1. Med Caps. There were 57 people treated during the reporting period.
- 2. Contributions. 50 lbs of wood was contributed to the villagers of Duc Duc for building purposes.

R. Communications

- 1. Supported battalicn operations with primary use of FM radio communications (AN/PRC-25, AN/PRC-88, AN/PRC-77, and KY-38). AN/PRC-41, AN/PRC-47, and AN/PRC-93's were also used.
- 2. Installed, operated, and maintained simplex covered teletype circuit from COC to COC via radio relay. Installed



and operated a simplex covered racic teletype circuit utilizing AN/PRC-25 radic and associated teletype and on-line cryptographic equipment between 5th Marines COC, 2nd Battalion, and 3rd Battalion's CP.

- 3. AN/PSR-1's and AN/PFS-6's were employed for security of Battalion Command Post.
- 4. Maintained landline communications within and between the Liberty Bridge Cantonments.
- 5. Monitored convoy control radio net when convoys from Danang or An Hoa were in the Liberty Bridge area.
- 6. Conducted a two day communications class for personnel of all four rifle companies. Subjects covered included: Basic communications procedures, message formats, AN/PSR-1, AN/PFS-6, AN/PRC-25, AN/FRC-88, AN/PRC-47, and AN/PRC-41.

S. Supporting Arms

The reli

- l. Air. During the reporting period, the 1st MAW provided air support for the 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines as follows:
- a. Helicopters flew 43 medevac missions to evacuate 14 emergency, 29 priority, and 14 routine casualties.
- b. Helicopter support was used in three troop lifts. The first on 11 October, the second on 19 October, and the third on 25 October.
 - c. Thirty-one aerial observation mission were flown during the reporting period.
- d. Fixed wing air support was used also 23 TAS which were all TACAN and FAC controlled. There were also 26 Beacon controlled air strikes.
- e. Fixed wing air support was also utilized through the use of 19 Basketball (flare ships) and one "Spcoky" gunship.
- 2. Artillery. Artillery support for the month of October was provided by the 2nd Battalion, 11th Parines. The total rounds fired for the month are as follows: 1,436 HE, 126 WP, and 764 Illumination rounds.
- Sixty-eight missions were observed, five unobserved, and three were contact missions.
- 3. 21's. There were 2,980 HE, 278 WP, and 441 Illumination rounds fired by 81's during the month of October.
- 1. Total fire missions were 348. Total rounds of H&I were 870.


