PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

3rd Battalion, 5th Marines reinforced with Company M (CUPP Company), 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines conducted Category II preemptive operations with primary emphasis on securing and pacification operations in a combined AO with the 51st ARVN Regiment in Quang Nam Province, Military Region I throughout the month of August 1970. The combined AO encompasses a portion of the territorial Districts of Dai Loc, Dien Ban, and Hoa Vang. The AO estension west of HILL 52, renewed on a monthly basis, was occupied by CIDC forces as well: as Reconnaissance Teams from the 1st Reconnaissance Battalion during the period.

The 51st ARVN Regiment maintained their CP at HILL 55 (AT 970621) with subordinate units conducting operations in 1st Marines, 5th Marines, and ROKMC TAORs. The 4th Battalion rotated with the 2nd Battalion and continued security operations along Routes #1D and #4 to the south and east of HILL 55 in support of MCB-62 road upgrading operations. Platoon size elements of Company D, 1st Battalion, 5th Marines were assigned operational control to the Battalion throughout the month and combined with elements of 4th Battalion, 51st ARVN to prevent enemy interdiction of this LOC.

Intelligence was gathered and disseminated early in August indicating that elements of the 38th NVA Regimental Headquarters were located within Base Area 112. Planning was initiated at Regimental level for a two battalion size operation. 3rd Battalion was designated to participate and planning commenced for a Battalion minus size operation named "Catawba Falls". Planning and prepatation continued during the month, however, the operation was postponed indefinitely due to nonevailability of supporting assets and scheduled realignment of forces within the Division TAOR in September. FSB Dagger vicinity (ZC 143412) was occupied on 26 August by 3rd Platoon, Company I and "D" Battery Forward (HQ and two pieces of artillery) in anticipation of echeloning artillery to support "Catawba Falls." This security mission will continue into the next reporting period.

On 2 August a combined operation took place in cooperation with Dai Loc District Territorial Forces. Company L established a cordon while Company I supported by 1st Platoon (-), Company C, 1st Tank Battalion combined forces with RF Company 117 to search the Wishbone Lake area vicinity (AT 8959). This operation resulted in finding a small cache of weapons, ammunition, and medical supplies. The most significant find was a M-60 machine gun.

Company L passed to operational control of 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines on 18 August for a period of five days to participate in a search and destroy operation in the southern An Bangs vicinity (AT 7946). One significant base camp area was destroyed and several individual weapons were captured during this operation.

Several operations oriented at exploiting intelligence were conducted by the Battalion during the period. On 11 August, Company L (-) conducted a helo assault into the Arizona to exploit information that 11 Provincial level VCI were harboring vicinity (AT 836489) and that a significant cache of B-40 rounds was located vicinity (AT 836503). This one day operation resulted in four detainee suspects and eight B-40 rounds destroyed. Company I conducted a helo assault on 22 August to exploit information that an unknown VC force located in Le Nam Hamlet vicinity (AT 9551) had committed atrocities against the local populace. Three NVA were KIA and two individual weapons, three packs, and assorted military equipment were policed form the battlefield. Subsequent inquiry of the local populace revealed no information regarding the alleged atrocities within the objective area.

Company M passed operational control from 2nd Battalion to 3rd Battalion on 25 August and conducted a helo assault on 26 August into an operational area vicinity (AT 9656) to destroy enemy forces staging in preparation for their "Winter Offensive." This operation resulted in the destruction of several large living bunkers within the operational area.

On 29 August, Company L conducted a company size help assault to preempt enemy LF and MF unit attempts to disrupt securing and pacification operations in the northeastern Battalion AO. This operation resulted in five NVA KIA and two NVA detainees.

During the period 29-30 August, the Battalian provided election security for RVN Senate elections by conducting extensive patrolling and ambushes on the periphery of Territorial Forces who provided close in security for polling areas and election: booths. Their were no enemy initiated incidents during the election period.

The Battalion continued to perform security missions for 3rd Platoon, lst Engineers mine sweep along Route #540 north to 5th Marines boundary and south to Liberty Bridge Combat Outpost. On valying days, security was provided for 1st Engineers mine sweep operations along Route #4 west of HILL 65 to HILL 52. Daily security was provided for 1st Engineers mine sweep between HILL 65 and HILL 37.

"B" Platoon, 3rd 8 inch HOW (SP) Battery, Force Artillery displaced from HILL 65 to An Hoa Combat Base on 30 August to support operations within 7th Marines TAOR.

Two "Blackboard" exercises were conducted by the Battalion during periods of high enemy threat in August. This preemptive employment of mortar, artillery, helo, and fixed wing ordnance against significant intelligence targets denied the enemy any capability of moving freely through the AO during the hours of darkness.

Security and pacification operations conducted by 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines CUPP Platoon and Company M (CUPP Company), 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines continued during the period with increased awareness on the part of Territorial Forces of the importance of aggressive security patrolling and ambushing to

deny the enemy any access to friendly GVN populace. Their were numerous occasions during the period where villagers willfully gave information of their own free will to members of GUPP.

1. TOPICS

a. Personnel and Administration

- (1) Strength. The Battalion began the month with a total strength of 38 Marine Officers, 1325 Marine Enlisted, 3 Navy Officers and 66 Navy Enlisted. 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines (Rein) now has a total on board strength of 41 Marine Officers, 1310 Marine Enlisted, 3 Navy Officers and 65 Navy Enlisted.
- (2) Morale. Morale and fighting spirit was and continues to be execllent. One hundred and five personnel participated in the out of country and eight personnel participated in the in-country R&R program at China Beach during the month. Catholic services were conducted by Chaplains from the 4th Battalion, 11th Marines each Sunday at HILL 65 and each Tuesday at HILL 37. Services were also held during the month at HILLS 52, and for the CUPP units in Loc Quang (V) on an intermittant basis. The Battalion Chaplain also conducted memorial services for four Marines killed in action.

- (3) Postal Services. Postal service during the month continued with efficiency especially considering the disposition of subordinate units within the Battalian TAOR. Mail delivery continues to be accomplished by a regurlarly assigned courier on a daily basis. First Marine Division Post Office provides a money order and package team every Wednesday from 1100 to 1430 at HILL 37.
- (4) Discipline. During the month there were 29 office hours and 1 courts martial.
- (5) Awards. There were 3 Bronze Star Medals, 22 Navy Commendation Medals, 11 Navy Achievement Medals, 39 Purple Heart Medals and 4 Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry Medals awarded to members of the Battalion during the reporting period.
- (6) Promotions. There were a total of 267 promotions during the month of August. The breakdown by rank is as follows:

(7) Internal Management

b. Enemy, Weather, and Terrain

(1) Enemy, During the past month an increase has been noted in the amount of booby trapping around HILL 52. Of the total number of incidents almost half were found within 1,000 meters of HILL 52. Typical pre-election activities were carried out by the enemy and were characterized by small standoff fire fights and Lob Bombing attempts on the night of the 29th.

c. Operations. Extensive combat patrols were conducted throughout the month to interdict enemy movement into the AO. Emphasis continued to be placed on screening operations on the periphery of secure or pacified areas in order to deny ingress and egress routes to the enemy.


d. Supporting Units/Agencies

- (1) Engineers. 1st and 3rd Platoons, Company B, 1st Engineer Battalion supported 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines during the reporting period. The primary mission continued to be the accomplishment of mine sweeps along LOC's within the AO. Also, fortification construction and improvement continued at a high priority of work.
- (2) Shore Party. HST support was provided by Company B, 1st Shore Party Battalion with teams located at HILLS 65, 55, 52, 37, and 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines CUPP Platoon.
- (3) Mine/Booby Trap Detection Teams. Seven (7) Mine/Booby Trap Detection Teams were employed by subordinate units of the Battalion contributing significantly to the reduction of casualties during the period.
- (4) Interpreters. Six (6) interpreters were employed by the Battalion and its subordinate elements during the period.
- (5) Snipers. Ten (10) snipers from 5th Marines Scout/Sniper Platoon supported subordinate elements of the Battalion during the period.
- (6) Ground Surveillance. Fifteen (15) strings of a combination of Mini-SIDs and MAGID-SIDs remained operational throughout the period and were monitored by a detachment of personnel from the G-2 Scamp Platoon.

e. Supporting Arms

(1) Air

(a) Support of the Battalion by the First Marine Air Wing was excellent during August 1970. Marine Air Group 16 medically evacuated a total of 146 personnel on 74 missions. These missions were broken downsas follows:



- (b) Helicopter gunships flew 23 missions including 7 troop lifts, and 2 surveillance missions. Ordnance was expended on 16 missions. Transport helicopters completed 10 troop lifts transporting 1145 personnel. In addition, a daily visual reconnaissance helicopter and a daily shuttle run was provided.
- (c) 0V-10 aircraft were utilized on 45 missions including 19 controlled air strikes, 15 covering troop movements and 7 visual reconniassance missions.
- (d) Fixed wing support flew 24 BEACON missions and 20 tactical air strikes giving excellent coverage.
- (e) One Basketball Flareship was used to provide approximately one hour of illumination.
- (2) Artillery. During the month of August, 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines, for the third consecutive month increased its utilization of Artillery fire support. The acquisition of areas bordering Go Noi Island, a long time enemy operating area, led to a substantial increase in the planning and firing of interdictory and intelligence missions directed against enemy infiltration routes. During the month 1,176 such targets were fired upon with an expenditure of 5755 rounds. The intensity of these fires contributed significantly toward reducing the level of enemy activity throughout the area of operation. During the same period forward observers attached to maneuver elements and the Battalions Artillery Limison Team controlled 59 observed missions, expending 701 rounds of artillery fire. In mid-august the 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines FSCC was tasked with maintaining close liaison with the 51st ARVN Regiment. All requests for fire within the 5th Marines area of operation were coordinated and cleared with the ARVN through the 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines FSCC channels. This innovation proved mutually beneficial to both Marine and ARVN units by insuring fastef coordinated clearance of requests for fire.

f. Training

- (2) Regimental Training. During the period 1 12 August 1970, all newly arrived persons attended Regimental Indoctrination School.
- (3) Battalion Training. On 12 August 1970 a Battalion Indoctrination School was organized to provide all newly arrived replacements with certain essential combat techniques unique to Vietnam and to inform them of those administrative rules and regulations which govern the action of individuals and the unusual conditions under which they must serve. Accordingly, a five day training syllabus was established for indoctrination training of replacement personnel. Eighty eight Marines attended the Pattalion Indoctrination School during the month of August. Also, the following courses of instruction were scheduled and completed at Battalion level by this command during August 1970.

g. Logistics

- (1) General. The movement of the rear CP from An Hoa to HILL 37 was completed at the beginning of August. Although the Battalion continued to operate with a split CP, the rear is now much closer and more accessible to both the Battalion Forward CP and 1st Marine Division Rear.
- (2) Helicopter Resupply. Although air operational commitments on a few occasions necessitated postponing helicopter resupply one day, the move and transition period did not interfere with the resupply schedule. At no time were any serious supply problems reported by units in the field. HILLS 55 and 52 continued to be resupplied once every 4 days. The H&S CUPP Platoon operating between HILLS 52 and 25, a platoon of Company K operating along the road between HILLS 52 and 25, and a M 3/1 CUPP Squad in the Chau Son area (AT 955603) continued to be resupplied once every two (2) days. Elements of Company I operating from . HILL 37 and the last week of the month, Company M operating from HILL 37 were resupplied daily by vehicle along Route #540. Helicopter resupply totals for the menth were 141,210 pounds delivered in 89 lifts averaging 1580 pounds each. Items that were unavailable or available in severly limited quantities included: incendiary grawdes, candles, pens, 5 gallon plastic water containers, padlocks, office supplies, lime, air mattresses, light bulbs, BA 1090 batteries for MK-15 Ordnance Detector, brooms, spray paint (particularly blue, yellow, and white) and fire buckets. HILL 65 and HILL 37 were resupplied daily from Force Logistic Command and a 1,000 gallon water tanker from Fig. was utilized approximately three (3) times a week to supply HILL 52 and H&C UNP Flatoon with water.

(3) Supply

- (a) During the month of August, Battalion Supply was relocated twice. Buring relocations a number of bulk storage boxes were damaged. Repair or replacement of all damaged boxes, which includes painting, tactical marking, and numbering is planned.
- (b) Warge quantities of excess and unserviceable 782 gear has been processed during the month.
- (c) Over fifty (50) Personal Effects cases have been processed this month. This includes messages and medevac cases. The files for personal

effects have been completely reorganized, insuring that each individual case has a personal file. This has been initiated in order that future cases can be processed more rapidly for turn-in.

- (d) During the month this unit received over 500 status cards, which have been screened and filed. Also 185 requisitions have been researched, screened and submitted to date. Approximately 200 documents were completed during the month.
- (e) The 1st Quarter Financial Management Technical Inspection hold by 1st Marine Division resulted in a Satisfactory Evaluation.
- (4) Ordnance. There were no major problems encountered in ordnance operations during the month.

(5) Motor Transport

- (a) During the month of August, drivers training school was conducted on the M151Al Jeep and the M274A2 Mule. Twelve (12) Marines were licensed upon completion of the M151Al course and three (3) were licensed for the M274A2 Mule.
- (b) Upon moving from An Hoa, motor pool assets within the Battalion were centralized on HILL 37, with the exception of six (6) M151Al Jeeps, one (1) M-37Bl Personnel Carrier and one (1) M-718 Jeep Ambulance which are located on HILL 65 to support the Forward Command Post. Five (5) M151Al Jeeps were turned in to Maintenance Battalion FLC and were Coded H. One (1) M151Al was Coded H as a result of enemy action (combat loss). Two (2) M151Al Jeeps were received from FLC. Maintenance Float for vehicles deadlined due to the non-availability of 3rd Echelon parts.

(6) Engineers Assistance

(7) Cantonment Improvement. The physical appearance of HILL 65 was improved in several ways during the month of August. These improvements were as follows:

All interior roads were graded and oiled.

Seventy percent of route #4 east between HILL 65 and HILL 37 was graded.

One thousand feet of road was graded.

A ramp for the Army searchlight Vehicle was built.

The HST bunker was rebuilt.

The Commanding Officer quarters received interior plumbing.

The COC was waterproofed.

A 100 KW generator was replaced twice.

The following improvements were made on HILL 37:

A 60' x 140' LZ was built.

Ten SEA-Huts were rewired and refurbished.

At present two (2) are on emergency leave, and one (1) is TAD to MCAS El Toro Cailfornia. One (1) corpsmen was killed in action and two (2) were wounded in action and medevaced out of country during August. One corpsmen is hospitalized for Vivax Malaria.

- (b) Sick Call. 882 patients were seen during the month of August. Approximately 400 of these were Vietnamese civilians. The distribution of the major types of problems among the military were as follows:
 - I Veneral Disease: 14 Cases, with one (1) confirmed cases of syphilis, and 13 confirmed cases of Gonorhea.
 - 2 Superficial fungal infections 7.
 - Superficial bacterial skin infections (cellulitis, abcesses, etc.) 32.
 - 4 Minor upper resportory infection and influenza 30
 - 5 Diarrhea (Intestinal parasites, food poisioning, viruses etc.) 38.

- 6 Fever of unknown origin 6.
- 7 Phychological and psychiatric . counseling 24.
- 8 Seperation Physicals 78.
- 9 Orthopedic complaints 36.
- 10 Prescriptions for glasses 16.

No heat casualty or immersion foot cases were seen. No cases of drug abuse were seen on a voluntary basis. There were approximately 42 prescriptions written.

- (c) Medcaps. The Battalion Aid Station conducts 2 medcaps each week in local villages and treats approximately 50 patients each visit.
- (d) Immunizations. Vigorous measures to keep health and immunizations up to date continued to be made. Two compaines have been brought up to date on shots. In addition personnel reporting in to the Battalion, and personnel going on R&R have been brought up to date. Biologicals have been obtained and all necessary immunizations should be completed in the near future.
- (e) Supply. In the last month there has been an improvement in the amount of time between requisitioning and delivery of medical supply items.
- (f) Field Sanitation and Preventive Medicine. Field sanitation inspections are being held twice weekly at MILLS 37, 65, and 55. Improvements in facilities and within the messhall are being made to eliminate flies.
- (g) Training. On the job training was conducted for Hospital Corpsmen by the Battalion Surgeon in accordance with BuMed directives.
- (h) Dental. 2 Denteurs each week are conducted in local villages and approximately 20 patients are treated each visit. An estimated 160 people were treated last month,
- (i) Miscellaneous. Appropriate end of tour awards and citations were administered through the BAS Office. Evaluations on all enlisted men were given, and general servicing of record books completed with recommendations for advancements in pay being made.

h. Communications

(1) Battalion operations continued to be supported by the use of FM radio equipment AN/PRC-25, AN/PRC-77 and KY-38. AN/PRC-41's and AN/PRC-93's were used by the Battalion TACP. Wire communications equipment con-

tinued to be the primary media of communications in support of the Rase Defense of HILL 65 and HILL 57,

- (2) The high turn over of experienced radio operators hampered the handling and processing of radio traffic in the COC. An estensive taining program and on the job training is rapidly alleviating this problem.
- (3) The movement of the rear CP from An Hoa to HILL 37 was accomplished without any significant communication difficulties. Difficulties were ancountered in maintaining radio relay communications with Regiment due to an unusually high rate of equipment failure with the AN/PRC-27 radio relay equipment.

i. Civic Action, Psychological Operation, and Industrial Relations

(1) Civic Action. The Civic Action Program continued to be oriented toward helping the Vietnamese help themselves. Supplies were very difficult to obtain through Marine sources but villages and hamlets were able to obtain supplies through their own GVN sources. (2) Phychological Operations

- (a) 15 aerial leaflet drops were made in the Battalion. The messages included Chieu Hoi information, and rewards for mines and booby traps. Aerial broadcasts included messages about the GVN, and themes promoting CAP and CUPP.
- (b) The armed propoganda team was used with limited success this month. They were used mainly in the hamlets where the VC were trying to coerce the people to go back to the Arizona Territory.

(3) Industrial Relations Activities. Presently, there are 20 AIK workers on HILL 65 and 20 on HILL 37. Under the appropriated fund system 5 people work at the messhall on HILL 65, 5 people on HILL 37, and one fund worker for motor transport on HILL 37. This month all appropriated fund workers received physical exams, shots, and X-Rays to bring their medical records up to date.
