PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of May, the Battalion continued to be heavily committed in support of III MAF units throughout I Corps. Two additional operations, Allen Brook and Mameluke Thrust were provided multi-channel support by the Radio Relay and Construction Company and the Communication Support Company. As of 31 May 1968, the Battalion had one Company, fifteen Radio Relay Teams and 5 General Communication Teams deployed throughout the I Corps Area.

The Communication Company remained in support of Task Force X-Ray during the month providing both Communications and logistic support to the Task Force. In addition, the Company provided maintenance support to the Communications Detachment at the Gia Le Combat Base.

The Radio Relay and Construction Company continued providing multi-channel Radio Relay support throughout the ICTZ. In addition, cable construction continued at an accelerated rate, taking advantage of good weather and relatively quiet tactical conditions. One major construction task, the laying of underground cable from Hill 55 to the Song Cau Do Bridge was delayed due to the lack of supporting equipment. Other cable tasks completed included the rehabilitation of the Freedom Hill Recreation Complex cable system, the cable system within the 1st Hospital Company cantonment and various tactical requirements.

Communication Support Company continued providing Area Communication Teams and Communications Detachments to the 1st and 3rd Marine Division including multi-channel radio (PCC-1) detachments in support of Operations Allen Brook and Mameluke Thrust. The Company also continued providing ground defense support to the Southern Sector Defense Command at the Song Cau Do Bridge.

The local security and ground defense mission assigned to the Battalion continued throughout the month. Several contacts were made with small groups and individual Viet Cong Forces with one V.C. killed by ambush and no Marine casualties for the month.

Civic Action activities continued with the major effort being placed on health and sanitation and also providing support as requested to rehabilitate the Yen Bac irrigation pump and water distribution system. During the month friendly artillery shells fell on Cam Hoa Hamlet during counter rocket fire resulting in considerable damage and some casualties. Although Solatium and Foreign claims were managed by the unit that did the firing, civic action personnel from the Battalion immediately went into Cam Hoa to provide assistance as needed to lessen the impact of this occurrence.

1. The following report covering the month of May, 1963 is submitted in accordance with references (a) and (b).

2. Supply Situation.

a. The overall supply situation is considered satisfactory. The 8 May rocket attack, during which a rocket exploded within the Supply/Electronic Maintenance building, resulted in the destruction of four AE/CAC-9s and five AE/CAC-75s and a quantity of bulk stored material, primarily expendable items. Supply records, except for some requisitions being processed, were kept virtually intact by timely firefighting action. Supply operations were interrupted for a period of two or three days while clean-up was in progress. Public Works response was immediate and repairs are now complete.

3. Critical Items.

a. Class items are listed in enclosures (1) through (3).

4. Significant Problem Areas.

a. Difficulties in obtaining an adequate supply of potable water continues to be a problem. Currently two M-35 trucks are employed full time for water portage, one for potable water, one for non-potable water. FIC supplies some potable water for mess hall use. However, water supply points have already started rationing water and future prospects are dim.

On 29 May 1968, the sanitation engineer employed by Public Works started a survey in response to Division's Work Order, FWD 235-68 of 6 March 1968. This is Public Works Order # 320-8-3642. It is planned that two wells in the 4/11 cantonment will be rehabilitated and a third well drilled in the 7th Communication cantonment. A 500 barrel tank is planned for the highest point of the complex, near the main gate, plus a four inch main with spurs to provide water to each group of buildings within the three cantonments. Planning and design for this system will take approximately three weeks. Many of the materials required for this project are in country. It is urgently requested that Division representatives maintain close liaison with Public Works to ensure that this project is accomplished as rapidly as possible.

b. A continuing problem exists in the area of excessive response time in filling requisitions, especially those for repair parts. Walk-through requisitions produce results for in stock items, but action for the same items on priority O2 and O5 requisitions take varying amounts of time from four to thirty or more days. It is realized that FIC is currently behind on its requisitions, but action should be taken to get needed requisitions filled in a more timely fashion.

c. Several items are especially needed by this unit. These include sixty-four gas masks, small utility covers and mess gear.

d. Because of the large amount of equipment which is on loan to and from other units, its accountability is a continuing source of agitation to commanders. Within the battalion, this problem is being somewhat alleviated by transferring equipment between companies when, by virtue of its assigned tasks, one company needs equipment which is in the hands of another company. It is suggested that a similar system could be implemented between battalions. When equipment will be needed on a long term basis by another unit, the owning unit loses the use of this equipment, weakening its ability to perform its mission in this area. Of course, if the unit using the equipment has a continuing need for the item, it should request a T/E change or special allowance. However, in the interim the owning unit should be permitted to invoice the equipment to the using unit and reorder it.

5. Maintenance Situation.

a. The 8 May rocket attack resulted in extensive damage to the Electronic Maintenance Shop and considerable damage to test equipment, secondary repairables and to components which had been inducted into the shop for maintenance.

Timely response to a request for assistance from Maintenance Battalion, First Force Service Regiment, resulted in replacement of some damaged components, repair of test equipment and rapid requisition action to replace destroyed items. Normal operation of the shop was not materially affected by damage to the facilities.

b. Motor Transport maintenance remains satisfactory. Six vehicles or 6.5% are in third echelon repair. Of these, two, an AM/MRC-83 and an AM/MRC-87, have been undergoing repairs since September, 1967 and another AM/MRC-83 has been evacuated since November, 1967. These items are at 3rd PR and status has been received on them recently. One vehicle or 1.1% is deadlined for second echelon parts.

6. Major Items of Equipment.

b. Major Items of Equipment, Communication: see enclosure (8)

7. Significant Maintenance Problems.

a. Tactical generator maintenance and supply is approaching a critical stage. Of the thirteen PU-482 generators this unit rates, two have been placed in a Code H status and reordered, and one has been sent to the FMF PAC generator rebuild program during the past month. An additional three are deadlined at third echelon facilities and one at second echelon. Of the remaining six, there is a semi-permanent commitment for a total of five: two at the Korean Marine Brigade Detachment, two at Communication Company, and one as camp power back up. Thus the unit has little reserve to replace any generator which may go down in the future. The PU-482 generators on hand have been in almost constant use for a period of two years and many are badly in need of rebuilding. Replacement assets are needed. (Enclosure 7)

To power the fifteen Radio Relay Sets AM/MRC-62 and six AM/MRC-63s on hand in the Radio Relay and Construction Company, two generators PU-347 or two of the substitute item, generator PE-75, are rated for each set. Additionally, twelve generators, PE-75 are rated as a separate allowance item. Of the total of fifty four generators rated only forty one are on hand. Of this number, twenty one are deadlined for a total of twenty generators available to power twenty one AM/MRC-62s and AM/MRC-63s. In effect, the radio relay capability of this Battalion is reduced approximately 50% due to non-availability of essential power source.

The power source for the Radio Relay AN/TRC-27 is the PU-270, which is rated two per radio relay set. Of the twenty-four PU-270s rated to power its twelve AN/TRC-27Bs, this unit has twenty two on hand and two on order. Of the twenty two on hand, eight are deadlined. Thus seven of the twelve on hand AN/TRC-27s can be powered.

The PU-549 and PU-587, primary sources of power for the Radio Set, AN/TSC-15 are another power problem. All of the seven PU-587s and five PU-549s on hand in the battalion are currently on deadline. The battalion administrative net is being powered by a PU-544.

b. This unit has requested a 18,000BTU air conditioner for its area communication center. This center provides message service to the Southern Sector Defense Command, which includes six major units. Without proper heat dissipation, best provided by air conditioning, the components for this vital communication link are in danger of failure. To provide the degree of reliability required, fixed-plant teletype is employed. This equipment is designed for a controlled temperature environment and, as hot weather continues, the probability of failure of this equipment increases.

8. Service Situation.

a. Service support from First Engineer Battalion and NSA Public Works has been excellent during this month. In addition to the repair to the damaged Butler Building previously mentioned, NSA completed work on a requested CO/XO quarters during the period. The First Engineer Battalion completed the helicopter pad, LE 469. Work is currently in progress on the BAS, OOC and ammunition bunkers. The two remaining outstanding work requests are the rewiring of the electrical system approved on 20 May 1967, PWB-57, and improvements to the Battalion's mess hall, submitted on 4 April 1968. No status has been received on this last request.

9. Significant Transportation Problems.

PART IINarrative Summary

Radio Relay and Construction Company continued to furnish personnel and equipment for Radio Relay shots previously established. In addition the Company deployed two AN/MRC-62's with operators to Division Comm. Company, also had one AN/MRC-62 with operators return from standby at Quang Tri, and two AN/TRC-27B's with operators returned from Radio Relay shots at Qua Viet and Quang Tri.
