PART II
NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During April 1969 a high percentage of personnel and equipment were deployed in operational communication commitments throughout I Corps. An increase in operational requirements combined with the security needs of the Battalion on Hill 34 presented the opportunity to continue using the Battalion's assets and personnel to their fullest extent. As total commitments increased, the amount of enlisted personnel on hand continued to decrease. Training in general military subjects, specialist training, use of infantry weapons, and upgrading of preventative maintenance were continued. Civic Action projects in Phong Bac and Yen Bac continued at a high rate.

On 15 April 1969 the operational and administrative control of the 7th Communication Battalion passed from the 1st Marine Division, FMF to the III Marine Amphibious Force. LtCol C. L. BRADY assumes command of the 5th/7th Communication Battalions, FMF, III Marine Amphibious Force. During the last week of April, elements of the Battalion began to depart cantonment to consolidate with the 5th Communication Battalion, FMF at China Beach.

Communication Company continued to support Task Force Hotel. The remainder of the company served in the perimeter security system and Hill 34 patrol forces, conducted preventative maintenance and continued training.

Communication Support Company continued with existing support for the 2nd ROK Marine Brigade and other communication commitments. ACT# 2 was deactivated on 20 April 1969. Security requirements remained the same until the last week in April when the company moved to China Beach.

Radio Relay and Construction Company continued to provide radio relay support throughout I Corps. The installation and maintenance of the telephone cable system within the 1st Marine Division TAOR progressed at a satisfactory rate. Due to the fire at ASP-1 on 27 April 1969, radio relay support and construction projects was greatly increased for the 1st Marine Division. Security commitments for the company remained the same.

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS1. Operations

2 April Battalion received visit from Assistant Chief of Staff (Div G-3), C.O. 1st Tank Battalion and C.O. 1st Recon Battalion, concerning take over of 7th Communication Battalion Cantonment.

3 April S-3 visited units on Hill 34 to coordinate security. LCpl M. L. OLIVER awarded Meritorious Mast.

4 April D&R FORSTAT cards submitted to Division. Change of status is reflected in reduction of personnel to manning level.

5 April Contact Team from Division gave presentation on Career Planning at Officer/SNCO School.

Sentry on Bunker #8 observed movement in perimeter wire. Reaction Squad swept area with no trace of enemy.

7 April Vietnamese male civilian injured outside of 4/11 Gate after colliding his motorcycle with 7th CommBn vehicle. Victim suffered lacerations to left leg and hand; treated at 7th CommBn BAS and transferred to 1st MedBn; prognosis good. SIR sent to Division.

Conducted training and firing of 60mm mortar to be used for illumination of TAOR.

10 April S-3 made visit to C.O.P. Three Fingers to survey outpost defense.

11 April S-1, S-3, S-4 liaison visit to III MAF.

Contact Team from Div G-5 gave presentation to Battalion on "Personal Response".

Radio Relay commitment for TET emergency communications reduced by Div CEO.

12 April C.O. held conference with Company Commanders and Staff Officers concerning movement of Battalion.

13 April Contact Team from Div G-5 gave presentation to Battalion on "Personal Response".

13 April Received emergency request from Div CEO to supply personnel and equipment to 7th Marines. Dispatched 2 MRC-62's and 6 people to Hill 55.

13 April S-3 to Division (RCC) to pick up MARES/FORSTAT cards.

14 April S-3 visit to III MAF. Complete deck of MARES/FORSTAT cards submitted.

14 April Tropical storm hit cantonment. Received heavy wind and rain for an hour. No significant damage.

15 April OPCON, ADCON of 7th CommBn passes from 1st Marine Division to III MAF. LtCol BRADY assumes command of 5th/7th CommBn, III MAF.

15 April Change of Command Ceremony at 5th CommBn Cantonment. LtCol BRADY receives 5th CommBn colors from LtCol HINES.

17 April Siren sounded for rocket attack from azimuth 2200 at 8000 meters. 100% of personnel on line.

18 April Battalion Commander's meeting with Company Commanders and Staff Officers of 5th and 7th CommBns.

18 April Sapper lecture and demonstration conducted for all Battalion personnel.

20 April Sounded siren for rocket attack from azimuth 2394 at 5000 meters. Six (6) rockets hit Danang area. 100% of personnel on line.

20 April Sounded siren for rocket attack from azimuth 4100 at 2000 meters. Five (5) rockets hit Danang area. 100% of personnel on line.

21 April Battalion NBC NCO conducted quarterly gas mask check for all battalion personnel.

24 April Sounded siren for rocket attack. 100% of personnel on line.

25 April Received visit from S-3 4th Bn, 11th Marines for coordination of Hill 34 security.

 Received visit from Executive Officer 1st Force Recon Company as a prospective new tenant of 7th CommBn Cantonment.

27 April Fire at ASP-1 ignites ordnance, causing shrapnel and ammunition to be strewn about area.

 Liaison made with Div CEO to set up Radio Relay (MRC-62) shot in the event that cables through ASP-1 are damaged. Arrangements for further back up communications are made.

 Explosions from ASP-1 intensify. Line communications for Division are severed. Trouble shooting crews are dispatched but are turned away as ASP-1 and Camp Monahan are being evacuated. Comm Spt Company evacuates area to move to 5th CommBn Cantonment. All units on Hill 34 take cover. All exit roads are blocked by fire.

 Liaison made with 3rd MP Bn for approximately 150 troops to be accommodated by 7th CommBn.

 One (1) man injured by flying lumber. Requested medical evacuation by helicopter. Contact made with medevac helo, but pilot refused mission as landing zone 469 was receiving shrapnel and shock waves from ordnance explosions.

 All personnel manned bunkers and trench lines due to flak danger.

 Division Damage Control Net established.

 Received report from Division that probability of enemy attack is high, due to loss of friendly communications from ASP-1 fire.

 Listening post spots troop movement 200 meters south of its position. Eleven (11) rounds 60mm mortar illumination fired. No contact.

28 April Cable splicers teams sent out to patch in remaining radio relay circuits.

Battalion training conducted in accordance with 1st Marine Division Order 1500.30C. A total of 102 hours were scheduled for the month of April. Fifteen (15) personnel were TAD to Division Schools.

Death certificate on water buffalo submitted to Claims Officer.

20 April

SSgt THURMAN returned to S-5 for duty from emergency leave.

S-5 held meeting with 1st Tanks S-5, Phong Bac Chief and Yen Bac Chief. 1st Tanks assumed responsibility of 7th CommBn CAAOR.

30 April

During the month of April 7th CommBn held three MedCaps in the Hamlet of Yen Bac. A total of 55 people were treated, 40 lbs of soap and 30 lbs of clothing were distributed. One boy was brought to BAS, three people were taken to Dental and one boy taken to Naval Hospital Ship for treatment. 7th CommBn Security Force continued to treat wells in Yen Bac.

During the month of April 7th CommBn held six MedCaps in the Hamlet of Phong Bac. A total of 125 people were treated, 60lbs of soap and 40 lbs of clothing were distributed. Nine people were treated at Dental and two children were taken to FLC Children's Hospital. S-5, also, continued to take construction materials to Phong Bac.

SECTION I - SUPPLY1. Overall Supply Situation

a. The overall supply situation continues to be marginal satisfactory. The lack of generators and the repair parts to maintain them continues to be the major problem in the supply system, due to the long lead time on requisitions. However, a collateral problem is the large number of documents induced into the system for an extended time and then are lost or cancelled. This requires resubmission and extends the already long lead time. Telephone construction material, such as cable and hardware have not been received in the last nine months and continues to hamper the telephone construction work.

Comments:

(1) There are three (3) AN/OGC-3's deadlined for NORIS, all of which are awaiting minor repair parts. There are 33 pending documents and some of these date back to October 1968. One set is deadlined for NORM due to mechanical adjustments. Presently this item is not critical as we still have three (3) operational and uncommitted.

(2) Three (3) AN/MRC-62's are deadlined NORIS awaiting DX for three (3) AM-632's from 1st FSR. Two (2) AN/MRC-62's are deadlined NORM 2nd echelon on two (2) TA-219's and one (1) R-125.

There is a serious shortage of power supplies for the MRC-62. Presently we have five (5) PE-75's deadlined; twenty-six (26) were on order, but have been cancelled as GMC is replacing the PE-75 with a new 3kW generator. Three (3) PU-347's are on deadline and we have two (2) on requisition plus three (3) PU-463's on order. The above remarks include the 14 PE-75's as T/R items and the power units for the MRC-63's also.

(3) One (1) AN/MRC-63 is deadlined NORIS due to three (3) transmitters T-235's on requisition Doc. #9037-2296 and #9025-3947. This is not critical due to having five (5) sets operational. For the power units see comment on the MRC-62.

(4) There are eight (8) AN/MRC-83's deadlined for NORIS. Four (4) of these sets are awaiting TRC-75's which are on requisition Doc. #8142-4441. Status received from FLC stated items shipped 8329, but have not been received. Tracer action initiated 9049. Four (4) of the other AN/MRC-83's are deadlined NORIS AND parts are on requisition as follows: Rx. V.O. #2051-69 pressure switch, S/A relay Doc. #9118-6268, 9118-6265; Rx. V.O. #1853-69 extruded pipe line and pressure switch Doc. #9092-6477, #9118-6259; Rx. V.O. #1856-69 latching relay Doc. #9104-6803; Rx. V.O. #1857-69 latching relay Doc. #9092-6474. One (1) set is deadlined NORM due to awaiting DX system item.

At this time this is not considered critical as we have 18 operational and uncommitted.

(5) One (1) AN/MRC-87 is deadlined for NORIS due to missing TRC-75 which is on requisition Doc. #8142-4441. Status received from FLC stated items shipped 8329, but have not been received. Tracer action initiated 9049. There are three (3) AN/MRC-124's coming in to replace the three (3) AN/MRC-87's that were Code H. These will be force fed according to CG MCAS Phila. message 262158Z Nov 1968.

(6) Two (2) AN/MRC-109's are deadlined for NORIS due to the RT-524's which are in for DX and also one (1) AN/MRC-109 deadlined NORIS due to one (1) R-442 which is in for DX. One (1) AN/MRC-109 is deadlined NORM 3rd echelon at 1st FSR for body work.

This is not considered critical at this time as we have six (6) operational ready and uncommitted.

(7) One (1) AN/PRC-47 is deadlined NORS due to a bad AN-3507 which is in for DL. Two (2) AN/PRC-47's are deadlined NORM 2nd echelon for minor repairs.

This is not a critical item at this time as we have ten (10) operational ready and uncommitted.

(8) Three (3) AN/TRC-27's are deadlined NORS due to Code H of PU-278's and one (1) TD-101 on requisition Doc #8163-5414. Five (5) AN/TRC-27's are deadlined NORM due to ten (10) PU-278's being deadlined at 1st FSR. This is a critical item as we have the four (4) remaining sets committed.

(9) There is one (1) AN/TRC-97E deadlined NORS for an A-33 drawer. One (1) TRC-97A is deadlined NORM 3rd echelon on FLSG Bn W.O. 4U-3718-9 for PU-346 generators. The van is operational. Three (3) TRC-97E's are deadlined NORM 2nd echelon for PU-670 generators. Two (2) vans are operational and one (1) van has a bad K-5 relay. Two (2) TRC-97E's are deadlined NORM 2nd echelon for PU-346 generators. One (1) van is operational.

(10) One (1) AN/TSC-15 is deadlined NORS awaiting parts which are on requisition. Three (3) AN/TSC-15's are deadlined NORM 2nd echelon. This is not a critical item at this time as we have five (5) operational and four (4) uncommitted.

(11) All twelve (12) AN/PCC-1's on deadline 2nd echelon NORS are awaiting parts for the control unit C-7673's. This set continually is in great demand for its use, but due to the lack of repair parts it is considered very critical.

(12) One (1) AN/VCC-1 deadlined NORS 3rd echelon due to a bad resistor within the C-7674. It is on requisition.

The shortage of small generators due to the lack of 3rd echelon maintenance support is a continuing major problem area. Presently, we have seventeen (17) generators at FSR. The majority of the PU-75's evacuated to FSR are often replaced by Code H letters and presently we have twenty-six (26) in that status.

Difficulty continues in the obtaining of maintenance publications for the PU-670 and AN/PCC-1.

Another major problem is the lack of AN/PRC-97 series repair parts.



Narrative Summary

Radio Relay and Construction Company continued to provide radio relay support throughout the III MAF TACR, and continued to install, maintain and repair the telephone cable system within the 1st Marine Division TACR and adjacent areas. Work and maintenance throughout the company progressed at a satisfactory rate. The company completed 1st MarDiv CEO Work Orders 54-68, 12-69, 13A-69, 15-69, and 16-69; 7th CommBn Work Orders 21-69, 30-69, 32-69, 33-69, 35-69, 36-69, and 41-69; and 5th/7th CommBns OpComm 180-69.

Personnel and equipment remained deployed in support of 2nd ROK Marine Brigade (Hoi An), Task Force Hotel (Vandegrift Combat Base), and 3rd MarDiv (Dong Ha). Personnel and equipment returned from Hill 34, Hill 244, and the Da Nang area when the previously established contingency communications systems were secured. Two AN/MRC-62 terminals and teams were deployed to 7th Marines in support of Operation OKLAHOMA HILLS. An AN/MRC-62 link was established between Hill 34 and the 5th CommBn cantonment during the 5th/7th CommBns consolidation period. A radio relay link was established between Hill 34 and Hill 244, first with AN/MRC-62's and later with AN/TRC-97E's, as a temporary replacement for cable damaged in the ASP-1 fire. Two AN/TRC-97 sets were transferred to Communication Company, 1st MarDiv; the remaining two sets will be transferred to MWCS, 1st MAW, probably during May. Radio relay operation continued to be somewhat hampered by shortages of operational equipment (notably generators and AN/TCC-3 terminals) and experienced personnel.

Cable construction and maintenance continued at a satisfactory rate. The installation of buried replacement cable between Hill 34 and the Song Cau Do Bridge was completed. Reference (b), a study recommending burial of much of the 1st MarDiv outside plant, specifically recommended burial of the aerial cables through ASP-1 and Camp Monahan because of their particular vulnerability; it is interesting to note that these cables were destroyed by the 27 April ASP-1 fire.
